Garcia-Herrera Ready to Get Back in Action, But Not at the Meadowlands

Trainer Gilbert Garcia-Herrera has yet to start a horse in 2013, but don't read anything into that. When Yonkers closed for its annual holiday break late last year, Garcia-Herrera shut down his stable to return to his native Guatemala and tend to his mother, Rufina. She is suffering from diabetes and recently had to have her leg amputated.

Having returned to the U.S., Garcia-Herrera said he will likely start entering horses again next week. Because he owns the majority of his own stock he does not have to answer to owners who might have wanted to race their horses while he was away.

Garcia-Herrera competes mainly at Yonkers, but has made the occasional foray to the Meadowlands in recent years, last winning a race there on June 22. But he was

told by Meadowlands racing secretary Peter Koch that he will not be permitted to race at the New Jersey track this year.

"I have no idea why Peter told me I can't race there," Garcia-Herrera said. "It really doesn't hurt me that much because the racing there is tough and I've never done that good there."

Garcia-Herrera is friendly with Lou Pena and the two have enjoyed a business relationship in the past. When Pena was briefly banned at Yonkers in 2011 many of the horses that had been racing under his name were turned over to Garcia-Herrera. Since, he has had to deal with allegations that he is a "beard" for Pena.

Both got their starts in racing in California.


"Yes, that's probably it, that I am friendly with Louie," Garcia-Herrera said when pressed on the Meadowlands ban. "I have a lot cleaner record than a lot of guys who are allowed to race at the Meadowlands. I haven't had a positive of any kind in a long, long time. They're basing this on pure assumption.

"Louie and I are friends, but we were also fierce competitors when we raced in California. They just assumed that I was working for Louie, but look at the USTA records and you'll see I own most of these horses myself and he has nothing to do with them.

"I understand that it is a privilege to race at any track. But I don't understand why that privilege is being denied to me at the Meadowlands."

Garcia-Herrera had a handful of minor positives when racing in California, but his record has been spotless since he came East in 2010.

Garcia-Herrera was a dominant force at Yonkers last year, winning 125 races from 327 starters (38.2) percent. He was the leading trainer there for the year.





Marcus Miller Looking to Head East

"Around March, that's when Chester and Pocono open up and I'll make the move back east and see where I land," said Miller, the son of trainer Erv Miller. "If things are going good enough at the Meadowlands I'll stay here as much as I can. Dad is going to race a bunch of young horses in Pennsylvania this spring, so that might be a good spot for me, too. I'm just going to see what happens. In March, Marcus Miller is about I'll leave Chicago and see where I end up."

In his few visits to the East Coast tracks Miller has liked what he's


seen.

"The East Coast is a totally different world, and that's not just because of the horses," he said. "The horses are better and a lot of people are making money, so the people are friendlier. A lot of good things happen when you race here. I think I am ready to take this step. I also think it will help me personally as a driver to drive with these guys. That forces you to be a good driver."

The support of the Erv Miller stable would go a long way toward helping Miller be successful, but he said he has gotten no promises from his father.

"We haven't had that conversation yet," he said. "It will kind of depend on where I am at. The stable is so spread out you can't drive them all. I am hoping to drive as many as I can, at least as many as he and the owners will allow. If I get them to the winner's circle I don't think that will be a problem."

Miller also knows that he will have to make a name for himself and not just be "Erv Miller's son."

"I already went through that once in Chicago and was able to get past that there," the driver said. "I know I will have to do that again. It's kind of a double-edged sword. You get your name on the sheet, you get live horses to drive, and that's a key. You cannot become a successful driver without live horses. But at the same time, you have to show people you can do it with the ones that aren't the favorites. It helps to win with some long shots and it helps to be personable in the paddock. That's when people are likely to give you a chance."

The first sale of the 2013 season will be held Monday, January 21 in the Meadowlands race paddock, and will get underway promptly at 12:00 noon.



Pierce Wins Seven at Dover

Dover, DE --- Hall of Fame driver Ron Pierce drove seven winners, while Dancin Yankee and Mustang Art were the winners of the \$35,000 Preferred and \$30,000 Delaware Special features on an overcast night at Dover Downs on Thursday (Jan. 17).

Trainer Josh Green conditioned four winners after three wins the previous night. Owners Ken Wood, Bill Dittmar and Steve laquinta and trainer Eric Ell had three wins.

After two qualifying wins and his first start in nearly three months, Josh Green-trained Dancin Yankee affirmed that he was ready to return to fast-class racing as Corey Callahan piloted the 5-year-old son of Yankee

Cruiser-Dancewiththebest to a 1:50.1 victory in the \$35,000 Preferred.

Owned by Bob Briley and Baron Racing Stable, Dancin Yankee, who won nearly a quarter-million dollars last season, fought off gritty Stolen Car and Pierce in a tenacious stretch battle to win by a head. Mainland Key N came on to finish third for Ross Wolfenden. Dancin Yankee has now won \$424,462 in his career.

The Delaware Special was also decided by the photo finish camera as Mustang Art, reined by Pierce, had just enough to outlast Nova Artist and Allan Davis in a 1:51 mile. Toby Lynch left hard with Sunshine Superman to exhaust Rusty's All In (Callahan) after a :26.4 opening panel. Sunshine Superman had enough left to finish third.

Adventure Bound became the fourth of seven winners for Pierce. Trained by Ell for owners Wood, Dittmar and laquinta, the altered son of Camluck-Unchained Speed stormed home in 1:51.2 to win the \$23,000 Open Pace. Im Fulla Luck N (Callahan) was runner-up with All Week (Wolfenden) the show finisher.



Movie Review - Amazing Racer



Amazing Racer (2012) - Available at Walmart, and On Demand (distribution to open up later). Starring Julianne Michelle, Claire Forlani, Louis Gossett Jr, Eric Roberts and Daryl Hannah. Also features Michael Madsen, Jason Gedrick, Charles Durning, and Steve Guttenberg. (92 minutes) Rated PG for thematic elements and some mild language.

I have been looking forward to this film since it was first announced in the late 2000's, then known as Shannon's Rainbow. Legal issues held up the release of the movie and it has finally been released in the video market as Amazing Racer. So it was with delight that I got to sit down this afternoon and watch Amazing Racer as it has been a long time since I have seen a movie with a harness racing backdrop, the last one being a 1978 television movie on the ABC Network called Leave Yesterday Behind starring Carrie Fisher and the late John Ritter.

So what did I think of the movie? My feelings are mixed. Let me say up front I am thankful this movie went direct to video and bypassed the local cinema. More about this later.

While there were some lesser known actors in the film, the movie did have some veterans such as Daryl Hannah, Eric Roberts, and Lou Gossett Jr, someone I haven't seen in movies in a long time and was a welcome addition. However, I thought all the actors and actresses did an admirable job in the movie.

In general, this film is what I expected. A story of a teenage girl dealt a cruel blow in life, meeting her mother for the first time and how they managed to get over the problems they both have to become a family and live happily ever after. Of course, this was all done with a harness racing back story. In some ways, the interaction of the girl and horse reminded me somewhat of Casey's Shadow, a 1978 film starring Walter Matthau and Alexis Smith. I don't think I will be letting the cat out of the bag when I mention the movie ends when Shannon's horse wins the big race.

For those involved in harness racing, they will likely enjoy the film after accepting there has been some artistic license taken to make the film fit time constraints. Speaking as someone who has been around racing, I think there could have been some more story development; for example, why does the Eric Roberts character dislike the boyfriend of the mother so intensely? What was the back story about Louis Gossett Jr's character and why did Eric Robert's character hate him so much? Developing this part of the story could have allowed the elimination of certain other scenes in the film. For those involved in harness racing, I would rate the movie three out of five stars.

Earlier, I mentioned I was glad the movie didn't go into general release. If this movie was meant to introduce the sport of harness racing to those not familiar with it, I suspect it may have backfired with some. Even for me, seeing the horse deliberately abused then sent to be put down out

of spite made me uneasy. In addition, hearing the whip being used in the abuse scene (must confess I don't recall seeing the whipping) was something which could have been done without. Less objectionable was the scene where someone attempted to tamper with Rainbow. Fortunately, at the end justice is done to the malefactors which shows some accountability for their actions.

I realize some of these scenes were included to add spice to the movie, but in my opinion, a movie like this would more likely turn people away from harness racing than attract new interest in the sport. To make sure I was not being over sensitive I asked someone who watched the movie with me (not involved in the sport) what they thought of it and they too were uneasy over some of the disturbing scenes. Even in a movie, showing horse abuse is not the way to attract new fans. It would have been much better if the story was developed further and these objectionable scenes left out. For those who have never seen a harness race before, I would rate the movie only one and a half stars.

All in all, those involved in harness racing will be satisfied, but if the industry was looking for a film to promote the sport, that mark has been badly missed; it may have done more harm than good.
