# When Will The Meadowlands Get Slots? We Have Questions. Jeff Gural Has Answers

In yesterday's HRU our Dean Towers concluded that harness racing's best chance for future success lies in the Meadowlands getting slots. Will it happen? And when? We touched base with Meadowlands owner Jeff Gural to get the latest on the Big M's efforts to get slots.

**HRU**: Do you believe you are any closer to getting slots today as opposed to when you took over the track?

**JG**: The only thing that has happened that is good is that we guessed right that Atlantic City would continue to decline and that it would not be possible for the state, no matter what they did, to revitalize Atlantic City. Truthfully, I don't think anybody expected Revel to be such a complete flop, but that hasn't hurt, either.

**HRU:** Have you had any discussions lately with Governor Christie or any other politicians about the Meadowlands getting slots?

JG: I really haven't talked to anyone in a while. I think I made it clear that we would pay the Pennsylvania tax rate which would give the state \$350 million. On the other hand Christie had said he wanted to give Atlantic City five years so I don't want to make a big issue out of it. He's also said this is the third year. My guess is that he is going to get reelected, and I would hope he comes to the grand opening of the new building, which will be beautiful, and sees that I kept my commitment so far as what I promised to do. My guess is we'll have the Super Bowl and shortly thereafter, hopefully, he can get the Xanadu project of the ground. If all those things fall into place hopefully they'll take another look at this. But I can't say we are any closer. Then again, I think we'd be a lot worse off if Atlantic City was coming back.

**HRU**: What has to happen for the tide to change and for New Jersey politicians to green light a casino at the Meadowlands?

JG: What has to happen is they have to come to grips with the fact it would be nice to have \$350 million. I don't believe that they care about horse racing. It's similar to Ontario, where they don't care about horse racing, even if they say they care. If the horsemen continue to treat this money as a sense of entitlement without making any effort to revitalize the sport we're doomed anyway. It's not going to matter whether I get slots at the Meadowlands or not. It will be good for Jeff Gural and my investors, but it's not going to save harness racing. As others have pointed out the breeders are getting killed. Sooner or later that's going to show up. In a way maybe that's a good thing because we have too much racing.


**HRU**: If and when you get slots how will the money be divided up? With the thoroughbreds, the standardbreds and the casinos it appears there are a lot of players that will be involved.

**JG**: One possibility would be to give some of the money to Atlantic City to subsidize air transportation to Atlantic City. That's one area where there could be some growth if they could attract people from the Southern states in the Bible Belt where there'll never be casinos. That could be an area of growth for them. As far as the thoroughbreds go we have an agreement with them where any money we get would be shared with the thoroughbreds.

**HRU**: If casino gaming is ever expanded in New Jersey outside of Atlantic City there's always the possibility that slots could wind up most anywhere. Do you worry that in addition to a casino at the Meadowlands there might, say, also be one on the Jersey side of the Lincoln Tunnel?

JG: The Meadowlands would be the best location for a casino in the country. I think it would be a lot harder to get the law changed to allow changes to allow a lot of casinos in New Jersey. It's hard enough as it is to get laws changed to get one. So I would think they would object to a proliferation of casinos. The Meadowlands is such a centrally located facility in Northern New Jersey it could handle the Northern New Jersey business itself.

**HRU**: How successful might a casino at the Meadowlands be and what would a casino mean for purses?

JG: If you look at Aqueduct, I think a casino at the Meadowlands would do as well as the one at Aqueduct. They're doing between \$700 and \$800 million in business. I know the horsemen don't agree with me but I think it would be difficult to get more than 5 percent for purses. If we were to get 5 percent that would give us between \$35 and \$40 million, which we would split with the thoroughbreds. If I had another \$20 million to use for purses that would make it a lot easier, it would make a big difference. One thing we have seen which is somewhat surprising is that the public really doesn't care that much about quality of the racing or the drivers. If you look at the product we put out most of the races are evenly matched and handle stayed high even though for the last few weeks Tetrick and Gingras left and Sears left before that. I don't think that has affected us. We have C-1 and C-2 races on a weekend and our competitors have better racing and bigger purses yet the public has chosen to bet on our product. We're doing \$3 million and everyone else is doing between \$300,000 an \$700,000. It's fairly obvious the public prefers our product.

**HRU**: If you got slots and all that extra money would you expand the racing schedule or would you keep pretty much the same schedule only with better purses?

**JG:** That would be my choice, to not expand the schedule. I don't think the horsemen would be thrilled with that. But I think the industry would be better served if that's what we did. If the best horses raced at the Meadowlands I think it would be good for the industry. I am pretty optimistic. I think the quality of the racing will be really good.

**HRU**: So we won't see a return of the days when the track was open nine months a year, racing five night a week?

JG: I think that would be a big mistake. I am not saying we wouldn't race three days a week, add Thursdays or Sundays, But there aren't going to be enough horses anyway. So it doesn't matter what I think. If what I am reading is accurate in Canada they bred 5,000 mares two years ago and this year will they will breed 1,000. That's a difference of 4,000 mares. Some will be bred here in the US but not 4,000. Everybody writes about the coming horses shortage and nobody does much about it so far as reducing race dates other than Canada and New Jersey, where we don't have any choice. I don't know why having16 races in front of 20 people is a good thing. That's beyond me.
