The Moni Maker Legacy

A total of \$5.58 million in earnings and 67 wins are the



tangible things you can discuss about Moni Maker, the great trotting mare who passed away Friday morning at age 21 after complications from colic surgery. But the legacy she left behind when she departed the earth is what will always live on.

Perhaps no race horse of any breed has traveled more throughout their career than Moni Maker did. She logged enough miles to be a multi-time over platinum frequent flier, making appearances in North America, Scandinavia, France, Italy, and even Australia. She showed tremendous heart and will on a weekly basis, and even when her heart let her down once (an irregular

heartbeat in a race at the Meadowlands in 1999), she bounced back from that to win in her next start.

In addition to her own success, Moni Maker was a star maker for her human connections. While she was developed by trainer Bill Andrews, Jimmy Takter took over her training as a four-year-old. Takter began training in North America in 1992, and although he enjoyed success with the likes of Gleam and Jailhouse Rock, it was Moni Maker who gave him his big boost beginning in 1996, putting him in the upper echelon of trainers. Takter, who has been frequently quoted to this day as saying Moni Maker was the best horse he ever trained, would go on to win the Hambletonian in 1997 with Malabar Man and didn't look back, eventually joining Moni Maker in the Hall of Fame.

"It was a heck of a good journey with her, something nobody else experienced like we did," Takter said yesterday. "She was a dream horse. The whole group of us, the owners and me, Wally (Hennessey, her driver), we owe everything to this girl. She made it look very easy for us."

Wally Hennessey came to the United States from the Canadian Maritimes in the mid 80's, enjoying a modest amount of success driving in Florida and New York. He began to drive Moni Maker for Andrews when she was a two-year-old, and that connection allowed him to keep the drive when she went to the Takter barn. Moni Maker would go on to take Hennessey to the winner's circle in the Elitlopp, the Trot Mondial, and a host of other prestigious races

throughout the world, making him a star and an in-demand catch driver for powerful trainers. Hennessey, who is still active, is also in the United States Hall of Fame, and he has been elected into the next class of the Canadian Hall of Fame.


Moni Maker was also a rare Standardbred cross-over star, bringing attention from the mainstream sports world when she broke the under saddle world record at The Red Mile in 2000. She was ridden on that day by Belmont Stakes-winning jockey Julie Krone, giving the moment an extra boost.

Since her retirement she has lived at Lindy Farms near Hartford, Connecticut. She survived a disaster in 2011, when a fast-falling snowstorm caused the roof of the barn she was in to collapse.

She hasn't come close to producing another Moni Maker as a broodmare, which was probably too much to ask. Only one of her foals (Can't Have My Moni) has earned more than \$100,000. But there's still hope as at the time of her passing a recipient mare was carrying her Muscle Hill foal.

In closing, one can't help but notice the same day Moni Maker passed away, Bee A Magician, who is the closest thing we've seen to Moni Maker since she left the track in

2000, was entered to qualify for the first time this year. Moni Maker has left behind some large shoes for Bee A Magician to fill, however. Bee A Magician did something Moni Maker couldn't do as a three-year-old, finishing out a perfect season (Moni Maker suffered one defeat, a second-place finish in the Breeders Crown), but asking her to replicate Moni Maker's overseas success and cross-over appeal may be something she can never match, though. Only time will tell.

The Curtain Will Come Down Tonight on Hazel Park

Some time around 11 o'clock tonight nine pacers will make their way around the Hazel Park oval, there'll be a winner, a winner's circle photo and the lucky horseplayers will go to the windows to cash. And then it will be over.

Operating harness racing concurrently since 1953, Hazel will be converted to a thoroughbred track shortly after tonight's races are concluded. It was an economic move in Michigan, a state where both the thoroughbred and harness industries are struggling mightily. In an effort to survive, thoroughbred horsemen have agreed to a system whereby horses must pay to enter a race. The standardbred horsemen have refused to do so, and therefore are being pushed aside.

"It's hard to think we're not ever going to race there again," said veteran trainer Keith Crawford. "I've raced

there my entire career, since 1966. There have been a lot of good memories but the last few years haven't been the greatest. That's just the way the business has gone."

Hazel Park was originally intended to be an auto racing track but the first owners ran out of money. It was

taken over by owners who saw horse racing as the best use for the facility, and Hazel began operating with a thoroughbred meet in 1949. It has been exclusively a standardbred track since 1985.

Before harness racing started to slip in popularity and the track became surrounded by casinos, it was a big success. It recorded a record attendance of 15,372 in 1975. Another milestone occurred in 1988 when a record \$2.00 payoff at any harness track was recorded when the "Twin-Super" wager (selecting in exact order, the first four finishers in two races) paid \$1,243,053.

Phil Stommen, the executive director of the Michigan Harness Horsemen's Association says the problems in his state go beyond the closing of Hazel Park.

"During the meet things have been relatively upbeat but the situation we find ourselves in has not been lost on anybody," he said. "People are trying to keep their chins up and looking ahead to what might come down the road. There is lot of uncertainty and a fair share of frustration but overall the horsemen are a resilient bunch."

Michigan racing will resume with the fair season in July, but the purses at those tracks aren't enough for anyone to pay the bills. Things will get a little bit better when Sports Creek opens in November, but it's clear that there are not enough racing dates in Michigan or enough in purse money for anyone to make a decent living. Stommen said there is some hope that Jackson Raceway will re-open and

add a few more dates to the harness calendar.

"Now that Hazel is closing, I'll probably ship to some of the out of state tracks," Crawford said. "I've got a farm here. I just can't up and leave. It's like I'm in prison. I'm stuck here." Hazel Park will be back June 29—with thoroughbreds.

Ban Over, Morrill Return to Pocono

Apparently, Pocono Downs and driver Jim Morrill Jr. Have

kissed and made up. The driver's ban has been lifted and he will return to the Central Pennsylvania track today.

When the meet started trainers were told by the racing secretary's office that Morrill was not allowed to drive. At the time, Morrill said he had not had any discussions with management and had no idea why he was not allowed to race at Pocono.

Pocono management has declined to discuss the matter and Morrill did not return phone calls yesterday.

To take advantage of Kentucky Derby Day Pocono will run a

doubleheader starting at 11 this morning. From the 24 races carded, Morrill has 16 drives.

He's Watching Returns

TORONTO, May 2 – He's Watching, a top contender for this year's \$1 million North America Cup on June 14 at Mohawk, made his seasonal debut this morning at Mohawk Racetrack in a qualifying session.

With regular pilot Jim Morrill, Jr. in the bike, He's Watching was a wrapped-up winner in 1:53.2.

Morrill Jr, and the speedy pacer laid parked on the outside at the opening quarter in 1:29.1, before reaching for command.

He's Watching then paced past the half in :57.2 and three-quarters in 1:25, before kicking home in :27.2 to seal the win.

"I was very happy with him this morning," trainer and co-owner David Menary said following the qualifier. "That's right about where we wanted to go. I'm going to give him a week off, qualify him once more then make a decision to race in either the (Art) Rooney or Somebeachsomewhere as his first race."

The son of American Ideal went undefeated last season in eight starts and set two world records and six track records along with \$291,722 in earnings.

Just a mere \$3,000 yearling purchase, He's Watching is also owned by Brad Gray, Michael Guerriero and Muscara Racing Trust.

He recorded his 1:50 speed badge last season at Vernon Downs.

East Rutherford, NJ---Live racing on Derby weekend at the Meadowlands began with the \$36,016 John Simpson Memorial for 3-year-old filly pacers. The Grand Circuit stakes drew just four entrants and launched the Friday card as a non-betting affair at 6:50 p.m.

Despite the poor turnout, the four fillies were well-matched and each had a significant role to play in the contesting of the race itself. The early pace was surprisingly spirited with the Ron Burke-trained pair aggressively driven away from the gate. JK Molly was sent for the front by David Miller and stablemate Surfside Sexy, unable to find refuge, was forced to press on for Yannick Gingras, resulting in a 26.1 opener.

Once clear, Gingras slowed the pace through a 59.2 middle half before encountering Rockingcam Park and Tim Tetrick on the final bend. In the sprint for home, Rockingcam Park put Surfside Sexy away, then had to contend with a late rally from Ken Doll J to hang on by an inch for the 1:53.2 win.

Rockingcam Park Stable, B&E Corbeil and J&T Silva Stables share ownership of the Rocknroll Hanover-Cameron D Art filly. Ronnie Coyne is her trainer.

MANALAPAN, NJ – May 2, 2014 – A pair of New Jersey-sired fillies, a \$200,000-earner and a first time starter, took the \$33,075 divisions of the Lady Suffolk on Friday, May 2, 2014 at Freehold Raceway.

Cee Bee Yes [\$2.20, \$2.20, \$2.10], a daughter of Muscles Yankee, coasted to a seven and a half length victory in the second division, the ninth race, in 2:00.3

At two, Cee Bee Yes collected four wins, three seconds and two thirds from 11 starts for earnings of \$198,880. The Julie Miller trainee opened her 2014 campaign in the Lady Suffolk with an easy wire-to-wire tally under command of driver Jason Bartlett. Pinking of You was second and Mistresswithmuscle was 20 lengths back in third.

Cee Bee Yes picked up an additional \$16,537 for James Allen of Vincentown, NJ and Douglas Allen of Southampton, NJ.

Fastdownthehill, by Muscle Hill, was unraced at two and made the most of her maiden venture with a length and a half victory over Suegrabbitnrun. Bella's Spunkin was third by three and a quarter.

Donna Marshall trains Fastdownthehill who was driven to victory in 2:01 flat by Jim Marshall III,

The filly races in the names of Richard and Regina Beinhauer of Venetia, PA and TLP Stable of Kearny, NJ.

The Lady Suffolk, restricted to three-year-old trotting fillies, debuted in 1960 and has been contested at Freehold since 1992.

Next Stop Europe for Uncle Peter

In a key prep that will likely set him up for a go in the May 25 Elitlopp in Sweden, Uncle Peter handled a tough assignment last night at the Meadowlands, beating a good group of trotters in a \$30,000 A-2/FFA event. Dave Miller drove for Jimmy Takter and the final time was 1:52.1.

Takter had said prior to the race that with a good effort Uncle Peter would be on his way to Denmark for the Copenhagen Cup and then on to Sweden for the Elitlopp. Sevruga finished second.

Miller drove a patient race allowing Uncle Peter to settle into sixth behind opening fractions of 26.2 and 54.4. He followed the cover of Arch Madness, came out for the drive and then outsprinted the rest to the wire.

Making his 10-year-old debut Arch Madness was still in contention in upper stretch but faded to finish fourth.

Bandolito may just be the hottest horse in the sport, but no one knows how good he is. Likely, that question will be answered tonight at Pocono Downs in the Van Rose Memorial.

Bandolito, who is by Ponder, has been a monster in his last three starts, winning all three. In his April 3 win at Dover he went in 1:48, the fastest time this year in North America.

"I'm as impressed by him as everyone one else is," said driver-trainer Daryl Bier. "This is all new to me because we had no idea he could be this good. He just put his head down and goes. We're in awe of him."

Bier said he had an eye on this race for a long time, but never imagined it would come up as tough as it did. There's three millionaires in the field in Golden Receiver, Sweet Lou and Warrawee Needy as well as horses in razor sharp form like Dancin Yankee, Dovuto Hanover and Abelard Hanover. Bandolito has post six and is 12-1 in the morning line.

"I am amazed the field that (racing secretary) Rick Kane got together for it," Bier said. "I really didn't think it would be this tough. He got some field."

But the good news for Bier is that if Bandolito can win this one he will know that he has a horse capable of competing in rich Grand Circuit races.

"If he wins this, yes, I am going to look at those races," he said. "We'll probably go light with him this year and stake him to everything next year If think he can beat these horses. He's got the speed. Now, whether he has the stamina to race week in and week out with these types of animals is a different thing. We'll have to wait and see. I have never had one with gears like him. He can just go so fast."

Sarcastic Man looked much the best when this group met a week earlier in the Dexter Cup elims, but that doesn't mean he'll be a cinch in the \$115,370 final today. Far from it. The son of Tom Ridge, who is owned by Robert Key and trained by Gail Wrubel, drew the eight post. The eight post is winning just 3.4

percent after 378 races at Freehold.

"Let's see if we can repeat it," Key said. "I like the way Ron (Pierce) is driving this horse, but he's going to have a tough

time from (post eight). He's going to have to be Superman to win from there."

Because of the post, Sarcastic Man has been downgraded to second choice in the line at 7-2. The favorite is Sumatra, whose 3-1 designation has everything to do with him having drawn the one post. A Muscles Yankee colt trained by Tom Fanning, he was third, 1 /4 lengths behind Sumatra, in the elims.

King City is another who should be a factor. He was second in the elim and drew well for the final with the four post. George Brennan will drive.

Most of the horses in the Dexter fall into the same category. They are horses who haven't proven a lot but have potential and the winning connections can start thinking about bigger and better things with a win here.

ODDS ON EQUULEUS makes his 4-year-old debut tonight off a shocking sophomore campaign that saw him go winless in 15 starts (although he still banked over a quarter million on the year) following a 2-year-old season that saw him play second fiddle to Captaintreacherous. This one recently qualified last week to just miss against fellow FFA star Sweet Lou and this doesn't seem like the most difficult spot for him to catch first win since 2012. BLATANTLY BEST has a had a rough go of it in recent weeks as the back to back beaten favorite; post presents some issues but he still remains sharp. URGENT ACTION makes his second start back; is classy enough to go with these if fit. TOBAGO CAYS makes his third start back and did have late pace to offer last week; SIR CARY'S Z TAM qualified a distant second to Warrawee Needy.

Race 8, C-2 Pace

SOMEPLACE SPECIAL delivered his best mile last week for Silva since arriving here and is now Callahan's choice of three. There's no question he's been good in his last two, and his first over try through a :54 and change half from last week may be good enough at a price. RELENTLESS DREAMER was left with an impossible task last out but was flying as usual at this level; a competitive field could result in a favorable setup for this one. STORMIN RUSLTER got the trip and the check last week; YG will have him in another good striking position from the inside. PEMBROKE DEWEY came up with the best mile we've seen from him in at least a year but now gets slammed with post 10; that's almost too bad. YOU BET YOUR GLASS was able to steal away once again through fast fractions and finally last; gets a new driver now in Tetrick.

Race 9. C-1 Pace

TWINCREEKS JESSE garned some tote respect in multiple March races here against "A" type foes and never really disgraced himself. This is a serious drop from that type of competition and those recent lines from Yonkers and Philly would be good enough; likely to be DM's choice of a few. MY TEMUDJIN N is an intriguing import for Harder. 7-year-old Christian Cullen gelding qualified twice against top foes; money earned down-under doesn't look comparably bad. ROAR makes his second start back for

Toscano and is slated for a big driver change and MYSTERIOUS MOMENT has had success here in the past against these types. POWER OF TARA N has generally faced better over the last couple years and may appreciate the move to the big track.

Race 10, C-2 Pace

KOSTAS WINE drops out of the Weiss series where he was involved in a 1:49:3 mile and the winner of that race came back to win next out in 1:48:3! Trainer Ford is exiting a decent past weekend also and this one seems hard to look past from the rail. STALLONE BLUE CHIP drops back to the bottom level which makes him a contender on that fact alone; closed in :26:2 the last time he was in a C-2. THAT'S JUSTICE gets Callahan back and that duo combined for a win against similar here two back. I really thought DUE WEST HANOVER would have been better last week; much tougher call now. BOLERO ANDREW drops while picking up Zeron. NATHANIEL B drops and while DM opts to #1, at the least the fact Barrett listed him to drive is a positive sign.

WILDER SWEEPS 4 PA STALLION SERIES SPLITS AT THE MEADOWS

WASHINGTON, PA, May 2, 2014 — The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania probably won't rename the PA Stallion Series to honor Mike Wilder, but the state might want to consider it after the driver's performance Friday at The Meadows. Wilder swept all four divisions of an \$80,000 stallion series stake for 3-year-old filly pacers, winning behind Eiffel Tower, Marathon Day, Eloquent Velocity and McVita Bella.

"I've never swept a whole stake like that," said Wilder, who also captured an overnight event. "I liked three of the four for sure. I didn't know about winning, but I was really confident in them. Everything just fell into place. I was in the right place at the right time."

Fastest winner in the stake was Eiffel Tower, who moved first over to the lead and held off the late charge of Real Drama to defeat her by a head in 1:53.2. Americangirlfriend was third.

"I was driving her and having no luck at all," said Dean Collins, who trains the homebred daughter of The Panderosa-C'est Tout for Glenda Collins and Janine Zito. "Mike gets along with her really well. He drove her last year and did really well. She's always showed that she has some ability. She showed it today, and I was tickled to death."

Fresh off her maiden-breaker, Marathon Day overtook the 2-5 favorite, Stucklikeglue, in the stretch and scored in a career-best 1:54. Stucklikeglue saved place, 3/4 lengths back, with Dragtontina third.

"The trip was perfect for us." Wilder said. "She's a nice-sized, strong filly. She has a great attitude. She really picked the bit up. When it came time to fight, she was readv."

Nifty Norman conditions Marathon Day, a daughter of Well Said-Sandlark Hanover, for Paul Marino.

In the \$18,000 Winners Over \$10,000 Life/Preferred Handicap Pace, Windsong Jack coasted to a front-end victory in 1:52 for Dave Palone, trainer Ron Burke and owners Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi LLC and Stable 45. I'm Feelin Good was a ground-saving second, 1-3/4 lengths in arrears, with Dedi's Dragon third. The 4-year-old Santanna Blue Chip-Milliondollarsmile gelding extended his career bankroll to \$470,278.

Palone and Brian Zendt each piloted three winners on the 15-race card.
