## **Bolt The Duer bolts to Dan Patch Pace triumph** *By Dean A. Hoffman*

Trainer Pete Foley's Dan Patch Pace plans for Bolt The Duer were upset before the race when he learned that the pacer's regular pilot Mark MacDonald wouldn't be able to make it to Hoosier Park, so local reinsman Sam Widger got the call from Foley.

And Bolt The Duer (Ponder) got the winning call from track announcer Steve Cross as he zoomed past his rivals in the stretch to win the \$200,000 event in 149.3.

"Pete told me before the race that he was an easy horse to drive, just two fingers," said Widger after the race. "He did say that sometimes you have to chase him a bit. He said his best game wasn't on the front end. He was best when stalking horses.

"I was surprised that more horses weren't leaving out of there," continued Widger, who had Bolt The Duer in front off the gate before yielding to Up The Credit before the quarter in :26 seconds.

"I wasn't really happy with that nine horse [Up The Credit] in front of me, but I didn't want to brush my horse, so I just waited. When another horse gapped off a bit in the stretch I got out and the horse did the rest. He just drug me right to the wire."

Bolt The Duer triumphed by 1-1/2 lengths over Fred And Ginger (Real Artist) and last year's Dan Patch winner Rockin Cam (Cambest). A Rocknroll Dance finished fourth.

Hurrikane King Cole, a narrow favorite over Bolt The Duer in the betting, left from post one and sat fourth most of the mile, but faded to finish ninth, beaten more than 17 lengths.

After the race, when trainer Foley was asked about the plans for Bolt The Duer, he said, "It's a long season, so we'll just play it by ear, pick our spots, and carry on."

The race featured four millionaires, including A Rocknroll Dance, a winner of more than \$1.9 million. The other millionaires were Bolt The Duer, Up The Credit, and Aracache Hanover. Ironically, they got post positions 7-8-9-10.

Pre-race speculation centered on....well, just about everyone.

Before the race, racing secretary Kevin Mack told me, "You can make a very good case for six, seven or maybe eight horses winning the Dan Patch, but, frankly, it wouldn't surprise me to see any of the ten win."

Another Indiana racing official disagreed, saying that he could make a legitimate case for any of the ten invitees.

That made Kevin Mack happy, of course, because he was the man who made the calls to owners and trainers to put together the Dan Patch field.

The program selections were Hurrikane Kingcole, Rockincam. Bolt The Duer, and A Rocknroll Dance.

Ace handicapper Tom Kelley picked Bolt The Duer on the top of his ticket followed by Hurrikane King Cole and Aracache Hanover. At post time, the bettors agreed with Kelley's top two picks.

Up The Credit was coming off two wins at Woodbine, the most recent in 1:48.3, and he got the driving services of Trace Tetrick, always a top driver at Hoosier. Alas, Up The Credit also got the outside post nine with all that speed inside of him.

Prior to the post parade, the crowd was serenaded by a track employee singing "Back Home in Indiana." They take their pacers very seriously in the Hoosier State.

Two secondary features at Hoosier on Saturday night were won with 1:51 miles by Mykindachip (Art's Chip) in the \$30,000 Greg Haston Memorial and Night Pro (Pro Bono Best) in a \$30,000 leg of the Indiana Gold Sires Stakes. Both were given by Jason Dillander. Night Pro remained unbeaten in seven career starts and he coasted to victory spoiling Nitro's perfect season of five wins in five starts.

Hoosier Park was alive and jammed with racing fans and families despite the unseasonably chilly weather and the light rain that began falling during the program. The track pulled out all the stops to entertain its guests with a live band, helicopter rides, ziplining, bungee jumping, magicians and more.

The atmosphere was alive and energetic with a remarkable of youngsters at the track with parents. Hoosier Park has an adjacent casino, of course, but it's obvious that the people who run Hoosier Park genuinely like racing.

"Having only harness racing at Hoosier and the Thoroughbred racing at Indiana Downs is going to help Indiana a lot," said Tim Konkle, longtime Indiana racing official. "Going back and forth between the breeds was confusing to the fans."



### SWEDISH DIARY

**STOCKHOLM**–Sweden must be the best place on the planet to get good Swedish Fish. At least one would think. They're terrible here.

You start eating them and the first two or three taste fine,



even good. Then they throw you a curveball. Every fourth or fifth fish tastes terrible. Some are bitter, some are salty, some have a bad aftertaste. They must be for serious Swedish Fish connoisseurs and not for Americans, or for the unsophisticated Swedish Fish lover.

They just stink, and, I'm sorry, I'm really disappointed about that. It would be like coming to China and finding out they have awful egg rolls or something.

I'm afraid to tell people here, but I don't like ABBA. Not at all. But I fear that if I told anyone that I might get hurt. They can't get enough of local heroes Agnetha, Benny, Bjorn and Anni-Frid here. The new ABBA Museum is all the rage, with signs and billboards everywhere. One of my guides showed

me Benny's house and on a tourist tour I took around Stockholm on a boat they showed off Bjorn's house like it was Graceland. Benny owns thoroughbreds and the thoroughbred people are very proud of that.

I figured out how to turn on the lights in the hotel room but other things are still giving me fits. I bought one of those cheap cell phones Saturday morning so that I could be in contact with the outside world and couldn't even get

## Source Of Pride, Sir Cary's Z Tam Win Elims For Art Rooney Pace

YONKERS, NY, Saturday, May 25, 2013--Yonkers Raceway Saturday night hosted a pair of \$40,000 eliminations for the Art Rooney Pace. All told, a dozen 3-year-old pacers--nine colts and three geldings--tried to wedge their way into next Saturday night's \$275,000 final.

Here's the sanctioned summary: First elim--New York Sire Stakes champion Doctor Butch (Tim Tetrick), the lone \$30,000 supplemental entrant into this event, was put in play early from post position No. 4. He stepped around pole-squatting Source of Power (Dave Miller) well before a :27.3 opening quarter-mile.

After a :56.2 half, Bet the Moon (George Brennan) took out of fourth, engaging the 2-5 favorite toward the 1:25 three-quarters, while second-choice Mach it So (Brian Sears) conducting his business from second-over.

Doctor Butch gruelingly disposed of Bet the Moon, taking a length lead into the lane, However, he first start of the season was not going to be his first win of the season. It was Source of Power going in and going by in 1:53.2. The margin was a length-and-a-quarter over Mach It So, with "Butch" fading to third and Bet the Moon fourth.

That quartet earned berths into the final.

For Source of Pride, a son of American Ideal trained by Jimmy Takter for co-owners (breeder) Brittany Farms, Louie Camara, Al Libfeld, Marvin Katz, he returned \$11.40 (third choice) for his third win in four seasonal starts. The exacta paid \$39.80, with the triple (three

wagering choices in descending order) returning \$89.

Second elim--They left Sir Cary's Zam (Pat Lachance) his

own devices from post No. 3, and he made 'em pay.

Taking over from Good Day Mate (Jason Bartlett) right at the 28-second opening quarter, the 7-5 choice was able to rate a 30-second next interval (:58 half), effectively ended much of the suspense. A funky-gaited Sunfire Blue Chip (Yannick Gingras) pressed the issue down the backside, but was dismissed soon after the 1:25.4 three-quarters. Sire Cary's Z Tam had a couple of lengths in and out of the final

turn, then held off a flying-from-last Lonewolf Currier (Sears) by a head in 1:54.1.

Good Day Mate and "Sunfire" were third and fourth, respectively, securing their seats for the final.

For Sir Cary's Z Tam, a statebred son of Bettor's Delight co-owned (and trained) by his driver, along with M& M Harness Racing and Ira Rosenblum, he returned \$4.90 for his second (consecutive) win in four seasonal starts. The exacta paid \$12.20, with the triple returning \$79.

Next Saturday night also includes the \$117,060 Lismore Pace for 3-year-old fillies. Both stakes draws take place Tuesday afternoon.

Saturday night's \$46,000 Open Handicap Pace was won by all-age track-record holder Sapphire City (Bartlett, \$23.60) in a down-the-road 1:50.4, fastest local mile of the season and matching the all-age standard (Electric Oui) for aged geldings. Foiled Again (Gingras) demanded a rare mulligan after a never-in-it sixth as the 4-5 choice.

The Raceway's five-night-per-week live schedule continues, with first post every Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday at 7:10 PM (note live racing is on hiatus June 2-13). Evening simulcasting accompanies all live programs, with afternoon simulcasting available around the NYRA schedule.

## **Cutler Combatants Battle Again in Maxie Lee** *By Lucas Marquardt*

When last seen Sevruga (Sjs Caviar), Wishing Stone (Conway Hall) and Modern Family (Cantab Hall) were noses apart at the wire of a thrilling Cutler Memorial at the Meadowlands, which went to Sevruga. The three, along with Guccio, were part of a scintillating race in which it was nearly impossible to separate the quartet at the wire.

Today at Chester, the first, second and fourth-place finishers from the Cutler return in the Maxie Lee, with only Guccio passing this one. His place in the lineup will be taken by stablemate Uncle Peter (Cantab Hall).

Sevruga scored a mild upset last out, leading throughout

to just hold on and win by a nose at 7-1 for Julie and Andy Miller. He'll try to flaunt his speed this time from post seven. but will likely have to battle early with long shot He's Spooky, sure to leave from the four post. Sevruga is the 5-2 morning line favorite.

Uncle Peter, trained by Jimmy Takter, is likely to take action at the betting windows. He was 0 for 3 on the year before winning last out at Chester in a winners-over.

"I think he'll race well," co-owner John Fielding said. "He seems to have gotten over all his sicknesses and stuff that he had last year. His last few starts have been great. He looked fantastic last week and we expect him to keep going."

The Chester card also includes the \$250,000 Betsy Ross for pacing mares. Anndrovette (Riverboat King) never turns in a bad race and looks like the one to beat here for trainer P.J. Fraley and driver Tim Tetrick. She'll face Economy Terror. Now four, Economy Terror (Western Terror) is trying to regain the form that led her to a Dan Patch Award in 2011. She was just 5 for 15 last year.

"It was a financially successful year, but it wasn't exactly what we were hoping for," said co-owner Howard Taylor, an attorney and restaurateur from Philadelphia. "I'm hoping she steps up and regains the stature she had at [age] 2. She's a thrill to own. She's a great mare and maybe a little underappreciated in her career."

#### **Market Share Wins Another Meadowlands** Qualifier

The 2012 Hambletonian winner Market Share (Revenue S) took another positive step on the way to his 4-year-old debut, winning a qualifier yesterday at the Meadowlands. With Tim Tetrick driving, Market Share won by a head in 1:56. Trainer Linda Toscano has said that the Maple Leaf Trot at Mohawk is her first major goal of the year.

Market Share went in 1:54.4 in his qualifier the week before, but the track was listed as "good" yesterday morning at the Meadowlands.

Other notable winners included To Dream On (Credit Winner), who by 15 lengths in 1:56.3 and Pet Rock (Rocknroll Hanover) an eight-length winner in 1:50.2


