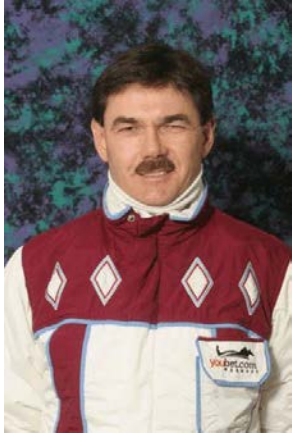

Injured In Spill, Campbell Unsure Of Return

Two days after he broke his knee and shoulder in a spill at Harrah's Chester, Hall of Fame driver John Campbell said he was yet to decide on his future, but would not rule out retirement.

Considered by many the greatest driver in the history of the sport, the 56-year-old Campbell went down in Monday's ninth at Chester when his mount **Tritech** (High Tech) fell over two horses that went down in front of him an instant earlier.

Campbell was also involved in a spill at Pocono Downs in April in which he was not seriously injured.

When asked if he had considered retirement after his latest accident, Campbell replied: "It certainly gives you pause and something to think about, especially this one. I haven't made any decisions but it's certainly

something to think about. I have to get healthy before I even think about anything."

Early yesterday, Campbell was still hospitalized in Chester but was trying to work out a transfer to the Hackensack University Medical Center where he could be evaluated by doctors who are more familiar with him. He is also hoping to have an MRI taken which will reveal whether or not he suffered any ligament damage. If he did, he will need surgery.

Campbell said he was uncertain when he will be able to return to driving, if that's the course he decides to take.

"Right now, the medication is controlling the pain," he said. "It's certainly better today than it was the first few days. The first few days were pretty bad."

With the field about a quarter-mile from the wire in the Chester race, **Somedancer Hanover** (SJ's Caviar), driven by David Miller fell to the track, triggering a chain reaction that involved Campbell and driver Brad Provost. Provost and Miller were not seriously injured.

"The one at Pocono a month ago and this one were just cases of unbelievable bad luck," Campbell said. "To have two horses fall in front of you...they just both fell down right in front of me and that's just uncanny bad luck. I was in the wrong place at the wrong time for me. The horse in front of me dropped so quickly. We were just trotting along and he gave no indications and then, boom, he dropped."

Nifty Norman In Hot Water at Tioga; Says He Will Be Cleared

The New York State Racing and Wagering Board is investigating an incident Sunday at Tioga Downs that necessitated the scratching of **Roadside Delight** (Bettor's Delight) prior to a division of the Empire Breeders Classic and led track officials to ban trainer Nifty Norman.

Norman told Harness Racing Update that he believes he did nothing wrong and expects to be fully exonerated.

According to an incident report issued by the NYSRWB and obtained by Harness Racing Update, Roadside

Delight was scratched due to a violation of detention barn rules. Specifically, the horse allegedly left the detention barn early to go to the paddock and once he arrived in the paddock he had a bulge on the left side of his neck, which investigators determined may have been from an injection.

The 3-year-old was examined by NYSRWB veterinarian Dr. Frederick Price and he notified Tioga officials of the incident. Tioga officials Jason Settlemoir and Jason Blum then notified Norman that he was banned from both Tioga and Vernon Downs.

Norman said he is scheduled to meet with Tioga owner Jeff Gural to discuss the incident and his status going forward. The NYSRWB has yet to take any action against Norman.

"It would be premature to discuss potential penalties because the investigation, which will include lab work, has just begun," Board spokesman Joe Mahoney said in an email.

Norman said the bulge on the horse's neck had nothing to do with anyone injecting an illegal substance prior to the race.

"The horse's bump that he has on his neck, which no one asked me to look at or asked me for an explanation, came from Saturday morning when my veterinarian gave the horse a jug of fluids," Norman said. "My veterinarian will write a sworn statement to that effect."

Norman said the colt left the detention barn early because it was not clear what the rules were covering when horses could move on to the paddock.



"As far as the detention barn goes, there was no set time of when the horse should leave the detention barn and there was no requirement as regards to how the horse should get from the

retention barn to the paddock," he said. "There were no rules set down and the supervision was anemic at best."

David McDuffee, the owner of Roadside Delight, came to his trainers defense and also said sloppy supervision at the Tioga detention barn was at the root of the problem.

"They had a guard there whose responsibility was to see that horses don't leave," he said. "He is the one who OK'ed the horse to go. Then he comes running after him five minutes latter and says you have to come back. He shouldn't have let him go in the first place. Unfortunately, instead of picking on someone who has had a questionable past they jumped on a situation that was probably 99 percent caused by their own inadequacies up there. I have had 150 telephone calls from people who said that detention barn is a joke. It is like going in and out for a shopping center."

McDuffee said he believes Norman is an honest trainer.

"I have been in the horse business for 40 years and I have never had any violation of any type in 40 years," he said. "I can tell you I have been with Richard Norman for seven or eight years and during that period of time Richard Norman has never had a single positive test. We talk about the need to clean this business up every day because there is nothing more important to me than a level playing field."

McDuffee said a blood test was taken on the horse and he will "bet his life" that it comes back negative.

A week before the incident, Roadside Delight won an elimination race for the EBC and would have been one of the favorites in the finals.

Badlands Hanover-2011 Book Full and Closed (Press release from Winbak Farm)

The Badlands Hanover Syndicate and Winbak Farm of Canada has announced the 2011 book of Badlands Hanover is full and closed. The son of Western Hanover stands in Ontario for \$6,000.

Badlands Hanover retired to stud as the fastest 2-year-old pacer ever and a world champion. At two, he won the elimination and final of the Breeders Crown, Niatross, Bluegrass Stakes, Keystone Classic, and a leg of the Pennsylvania Sires Stakes. At 4, he won the elimination and final of the Maryland Governor's Cup.

Badlands has now sired winners of \$37M, including three millionaires, 2008 three-year-old pacing filly of the year Tug River Princess, world champion Badlands Nitro, and Hoosier Cup Champion Mr. Wiggles. Badlands also

sired the 2010 Adios and Oliver Wendell Holmes winner, Delmarvalous.

"For the third straight year, Badlands Hanover has bred a full book of top quality mares. This year was no exception with the likes of French Panicure (p,4,1:49.4s, \$997,902), Cami Whitestockings (p,4,1:50.3M, \$537,388), and The Patriot (p,2,1:53.4s, \$395,185), just to name a few," said Larry Drysdale, general manager of Winbak Farm of Canada.

Badlands Hanover has 332 offspring who have been in 2:00 or faster (47.63%) and 164 of his offspring have marks of 1:55 or better. He is also the sire of 107 \$100,000 winners.

"Badlands Hanover's first Ontario yearlings will hit the sales ring this fall and the breeders are raving about them," said Drysdale.

Before standing in Ontario, Badlands Hanover stood in Delaware and sired 39 out of a possible 52 Delaware Stakes Breeders Final Champions since 2004.

A 'Monumental' Accomplishment In Illinois

After collectively pleading and pushing for nearly two decades standardbred and thoroughbred track owners, horsemen and breeders in Illinois finally have succeeded in getting legislation passed that will permit slot machines at the state's racetracks.

"We've been working on this thing for 18 years," said Phil Langley, director of racing at Balmoral Park and Maywood Park, said in the wake of the passage of a gigantic Illinois gambling expansion bill. "You probably can build a wall with all the bills from over the years. I've got copies of. They are piled four-feet high."

Senate Bill 744 was approved by the Senate by a 30-27 vote on Tuesday after being approved by the House of Representatives 65-50 on Monday.

"We still need to work for the governor's signature but obviously completing the first two stages of this was monumental," the Illinois Harness Horsemen's Association president, Dave McCaffrey, and executive director, Anthony Somone, said in a joint statement. "We passed a major, controversial gaming bill that will save our industry in Illinois."

Gov. Pat Quinn has 60 days to decide whether he will sign the bill, veto it or partially veto it by removing certain portions.

Before the bill was passed, the governor expressed his displeasure with its scope, calling it "top heavy" and predicting it would make Illinois "the Las Vegas of the Midwest."

However, Quinn never has threatened to veto the legislation and many consider that significant because he reiterated his plans to veto a bill allowing Commonwealth Edison to raise electricity rates by 2.5% through 2014. In addition to legalizing slot machines at the tracks, Senate Bill 744 approves five new casinos, permits slot machines at Chicago's O'Hare and Midway Airports and extends the harness meeting at Springfield's Illinois State Fairgrounds from 10 days to from three to nine months with slots operating during the meeting.

The nine riverboat casinos currently operating and the 10th that is scheduled to open later this year will be allowed to increase their number of positions. Chicago's newly-elected mayor, Rahm Emanuel, urged legislators to pass the bill that will give the city its first casino and he also is expected to make an appeal to his fellow Democrat, Gov. Quinn, to sign it as soon as possible.

"If he'd sign it tomorrow we could have temporary stuff done in from 9-10 months and a full-fledged facility ready by the middle of 2012," Langley said. "If we only did \$100 a machine we'd get \$12.5 million dollars, enough to increase purses by 50%. All the boats around Chicago (in Illinois and Indiana) are handling \$500-\$600 a machine and Elgin (the Grand Victoria riverboat) handles \$740.

"If we got \$400 a machine, which is not beyond the realm of possibility, we'd be making \$100,000 a day for purses. Over 365 days that's \$36.5 million. If you add the \$15 million that you make by racing we'd be at \$50 million in purses, depending on how many days we'd race."

The law stipulates a combined total of 310 racing days at Balmoral and Maywood but there is some wiggle room. The IHHA can agree to race fewer days and the Illinois Racing Board also is allowed to modify the schedule. Currently, the standardbred schedule has Balmoral racing three days and Maywood two for 12 months a year.

"The reason we stretch our schedule now is because you've got to scratch for every dime you can get," Langley said. "With our present horse population with 310 days we'd need some new people coming in. My guess is we'll wind up with a schedule where we'll be able to pay \$200,000 a day in purses—250 days would be a good schedule. There's also some sentiment not to race year-around."

If purses soar from the present \$50,000 daily to \$200,000 daily Illinois breeders' awards will correspondingly increase three-fold.

A provision of the bill also stipulates that 17% of the purse money has to be used for Illinois-bred stakes or overnight stakes races.

"We'll have an Illinois-bred stake of from \$20,000 to \$200,000 every day instead of just once in awhile," Langley said. "If Illinois owners win an open race higher than \$10,000 claiming they now get a 12% bonus; under the new law it goes up to a 25% bonus."

The law also provides for the return of the million dollar bonus for Illinois-bred 2-year-old pacers and trotters—both fillies and males—who win three designated races in their

respective divisions.

"It was very popular with the horsemen and the fans and it went on for several years—until we didn't have enough money to fund it," Langley recalled.

Foiled Again Named Horse of the Month

Victories in two of the month's richest and most important races earned Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Brussemi and JJK Stables' **Foiled Again** (Dragon Again) honors as the May Horse of the Month from the U.S. Trotting Association.

The month, however, began on a down note for the Ron Burke-trained son of Dragon Again when he was nipped in a \$70,000 Open at Harrah's Chester. But his next three starts, all in added-money races, showed that the setback was a fluke.

His next start, the \$246,000 Graduate, raced at Meadowlands Racetrack under the direction of regular driver Yannick Gingras, resulted in a 1:49.3 victory, accomplished from off the pace and from the first-over position

That was followed by a trip to Canada, where he first won a \$20,600 elimination for the Molson Pace at Western Fair Raceway and followed that, one week later, with another stunning victory in the \$306,000 Molson Pace Final. In both races he prompted the pace early before seizing victory, both times by three lengths. The latter was timed in 1:51.3, two-fifths of a second off the stakes standard, and gave him his first Molson win in three attempts.

Foiled Again currently is the top-rated performer in the sport, has won seven of 10 and \$471,200 this year, and has won \$2.48 million in six brilliant seasons on-track.

She advanced steadily to down Lady's Night, the 2-5 favorite, by 1-3/4 lengths, with Mynah Hanover third. Her time erased the 1:57.2 stakes record Apple Plush established in 2010.
