So What Do You Think of Åke Svanstedt Now? By Bill Finley

WRIGHTSTOWN, NJ–When trainer Åke Svanstedt sent Sebastian K into the May 10 eliminations at the Meadowlands for the Cutler off one qualifier, and at that a slow one, it seemed that everyone was skeptical. How could a horse possibly be ready for such a tough assignment off one pokey qualifier (1:56.2)? With any other trainer that might have been a reasonable question. But not with Svandstedt.



Sebastian K could not have been any more ready. Not only did he win the race but equaled a world record (1:50.1) in doing so. In the process

Horses training at Legends Farm

Svanstedt made a statement, at least to the American harness racing industry. He does things his way and his way works.

When Svanstedt decided to pack his bags and leave Sweden, where he was the sport's No. 1 trainer, for the U.S. he immediately said he was going to bring his training methods with him. Though racing in a new country where many aspects of the sport are different than they are in Sweden he had enough confidence in himself and what he does that he didn't feel the need to adapt.

"I understand why people were skeptical here," he said. "I am sure they still are skeptical."

So how do you get a horse ready for a world record performance with what looked to be, at least on paper, hardly any preparation? The answer is that what showed up in the past performance program that night doesn't come close to telling the story of what Svandstedt does and how he gets a horse ready for a race.

He doesn't believe in training horses fast or building up their speed. Rather, his program is designed to build up strength and if that can be accomplished he believes the speed will take care of itself.

"It is about strength," he said. "We train the horses to be strong. If you can make them strong they can carry their speed a long way. You don't need to train for speed if they are strong enough."

The work is done at Svanstedt's Legends Farm in Wrightstown, New. Jersey. (He trains in the winter in Vero Beach, Florida). At Legends Farm he uses two tracks, one a traditional oval with a stone dust surface. The other is a straight course that is sandy and deep, more like a thoroughbred training track and unlike anything else at any

U.S. training center or racetrack. That is where the real work is done.

"Sebastian K only went around the round track twice before he qualified," Svanstedt said. "Everything else he did was on the straight track. The straight track here is very soft, deep sand. Over it, the joints and everything else get strong and there is less chance they will get injured. We will warm them up on the round track. But when we are serious about training them they go to the straight track."

Svanstedt says that there are also advantages to using the track because it does not have turns. He believes that when horses go around turns they have to put more weight on their front knees to negotiate the turns and that can be hard on the knees and lead to injury.

Because about 75 percent of Svanstedt's horses are 2-year-olds, none of which have yet to qualify, we'll know far more about him and how good he really is by the end of the summer. But he is certainly off to a very good start. Having also won the Cutler final, Sebastian K is the top ranked horse in the sport and, going into Thursday, Svanstedt's stable was 5 for 13, good for 38 percent. Svandstedt's other big win came with Heaven's Door in a \$100,000 New Jersey Sire Stakes race

He's not afraid to share his secrets, which include far

Sebastian K raced barefoot in both the Cutler and the Cutler elims, a common method Svandstedt uses. He will not go barefoot with all horses or on all tracks. He understands that there can be a need to protect a horse's feet, but he also believes that if you can get away with racing a barefoot horse you will have an advantage.

"The horse is more natural gaited without shoes," he said. He also lets all of his horses spend the vast majority of their time outside in paddocks. Each of his 53 horses has their own paddock and that's where they are every minute of



the day when they are not eating or training.

"The idea is to let horses be horses," his assistant, Bernie Noren, said. "They are out there all day if they can except when they are training. After training they eat and go to their paddock. The

horse is able to feel more like a horse instead of looking at four walls 23 hours a day."

Svanstedt was known as an innovator in Sweden, as well. In time, some trainers copied his methods. He doesn't think that will happen in the U.S.

"They never seem to change anything in racing here," he said. "They train the same way they always have.

Greyhound, he trained same way modern horse does." None of which is to say Svanstedt believes he has all the answers. He says he still needs to hone his driving skills

here because he has little experience driving on one-mile tracks. Most tracks in Sweden are five-eighths of a mile in circumference.

"I must learn the tempo of the races on the mile tracks, the big tracks here," he said.

It's helped that some trainers are starting to use him as a catch driver. He's 7 for 29 as a driver and two of his wins came for trainer Ron Burke.

"I never even spoke to (Burke)," he said. "He just put me down to drive."

As for his early success as trainer, some owners are starting to take notice. He recently picked up Muscle Network who defeated Nuncio in last year's Valley Victory at and could be a force in the 3-year-old trotting ranks. He also picked up Your So Vain, who

was among the better 3-year-old male trotters in training last year.

But he's not necessarily looking for any other new horses as he only has 55 stalls at his New Jersey farm. But he doesn't rule out expanding in the future.

Svanstedt is not lacking in confidence. What he did in Sweden, unusual or not, worked, so much so that he

climbed the ladder to become the sport's best trainer there. Not lacking in confidence, he doesn't see why the story won't be the same here.

Hambletonian Winning Trainer Peck Arrested

Greg Peck, who trained 2009 Hambletonian winnerMuscle Hill, was recently arrested by the Upper Providence (Pa.) Police Department. The story was first reported by theharnessedge.com

Peck was arrested May 28 and spent a brief period in the Montgomery County Correctional Facility in Norristown, Pennsylvania. He has since been released.

Peck was arrested on charges of forgery and counterfeiting and the complainant was Dr. Jennifer Schranz. Peck has trained some horses for Schranz and the two were also briefly involved romantically.

Peck has started six horses this year but has not won a race since 2012. He won 50 races in 2009 with his stable earning \$3,434,740. On the same day he won the Hambletonian he won the Peter Haughton Memorial with Holiday Road.

New York's Racinos Have a Solid Year Overall, But Some Harness Tracks See Declines

Including thoroughbred racetracks, New York's racinos had a big year in the 2013-2014 fiscal year. The Video Lottery Gaming Machines recorded a record of \$1.9 billion in net win during the year, a 4.8 percent increase over the prior fiscal year.



As for the state's harness tracks, here is the rundown: --Net win for Batavia Downs Gaming totaled \$47.1 million, an increase of \$2 million or 4.4

percent, largely attributable to an

October 2013 expansion of the

gaming floor.

--Empire City Casino at Yonkers Raceway achieved annual net win of \$547.2 million, an increase of \$1.9 million or 0.3 percent.

--Saratoga Casino and Raceway, the oldest of the state's Video Lottery Gaming facilities, realized an annual net win of \$158.9 million, an increase of \$200,000 or 0.1 percent.

--The net win at Monticello was \$61.3 million, a 3.4 percent decline.

--Buffalo Raceway saw a severe decline. The net win for the 2013-2014 fiscal year was 72.8 million, a 10.2 percent decline

--Vernon Downs' numbers were almost identical from one year to the other. The "win" in the 2013-2014 fiscal year was \$43.3 million, off marginally from the \$43.6 million figure posted the year before.

-There was also a decline at Tioga, where net win was \$58.1 million versus \$61 million the year before. Th decline was 4.8 percent.

Washington, PA --- Under wraps for most of the mile, juvenile champ Shake It Cerry remained undefeated in 2014 with a 1:55.3 romp in Wednesday's (June 4) \$93,860 Currier & Ives at The Meadows.

The event for 3-year-old filly trotters was conducted over three divisions, with Lifetime Pursuit and Broadway Socks taking the other splits. Ron Pierce and trainer Jimmy Takter teamed for a C&I double with Shake It Cerry and Lifetime Pursuit.

Shake It Cerry rolled to a 2-3/4 length victory in her Currier & Ives division.

On paper, the first division looked like a one-horse race. It was, as the 1-9 Shake It Cerry cruised to victory -- her seventh straight and third in as many starts this year -defeating the pocket-sitting Take The Money by 2-3/4 lengths. Jessie's Song was third.

Although the outcome never was in doubt, Pierce wanted to make sure the champ went enough to get something from the race.

"I hope I went fast enough with her for that," Pierce said. "If she needs to go faster her next race, I'm sure Jimmy will train her a little more. I couldn't be more happy with her. The whole mile, I was just 'Whoa, Cerry. Whoa, Cerry. Whoa, sweetie' -- even in the lane. The more easy ones we can get into her now, the better she'll be in the long run."

Solveig's Racing Partners own the daughter of Donato Hanover-Solveig, who vaulted over \$900,000 in career earnings.

Sweet Lou dug in late, staving off Heston Blue Chip to prevail by 1-3/4 lengths. Bolt the Duer stayed on to be third, while Word Power (Jim Morrill, Jr.) sustained a wide bid off a third-over trip to take fourth.
