Crunch crushes in Canada; sets 1:47.2 stunner in Pepsi NA Cup

It was a race for the ages as Captain Crunch won the \$1 million race in Canadian record time for trainer Nancy Johansson and driver Scott Zeron.

It was the first Pepsi North America Cup victory for both trainer Nancy Johansson and driver Scott Zeron.

Captain Crunch and driver Scott Zeron delivered a stunning Canadian record 1:47.2 performance to win the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup on Saturday night at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Trainer Nancy Johansson is the daughter of trainer Jimmy Takter and captured her first Cup in her first try. The Cup is one of only a few marquee races that Takter did not capture in his Hall of Fame career.

Captain Crunch (Zeron) rebounded from a break in his elimination a week ago to deliver a stunning 1:47.2 Canadian record performance in the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup final.

"It feels good because now my dad technically, a little bit, has won it because they own a piece of Captain Crunch. So, you know what, if you can't do it as a trainer you may as well do it as an owner. He wasn't going to not get (the NA Cup), you know," Johansson said, laughing. "Seriously, it's probably more lucrative to do it as an owner than as a trainer. I'm only getting five per cent and he owns 10 per cent of the horse. Well, actually my mom does."

Christina Takter shares Captain Crunch with the 3 Brothers Stable, Rojan Stables and Caviart Farms. Captain Crunch is cared for by Anette Zackrisson in New Jersey and was paddocked at Mohawk by Ben Hollingsworth who was helped by Katie Remmerswaal. The colt, bred by Walnridge Farms Inc. and Sherri Meirs of Cream Ridge, NJ, was purchased for \$85,000 at the 2017 Standardbred Horse Sale Company auction in Harrisburg, PA.

"Obviously, it's very surreal to watch your horse race in a big race like this," Johansson said while frantically packing her bag in an effort to run for a flight home to New Jersey. "You kind of feel like everything goes in slow motion, but, at the same time, everything is going very quickly. It's very exhausting."

Captain Crunch and Zeron blasted off the wings of the gate from post-eight and claimed the top spot through a :26 opening-quarter. Bettors Wish overtook the lead quickly entering the backstretch before Workin Ona Mystery, the 7-5 favourite, surged up to take control at the half in :52.4.

Captain Crunch was removed by Zeron going into the far turn and confronted Workin Ona Mystery at three-quarters in 1:20.

In the stretch, Captain Crunch powered by to take the lead and held off a late push from Bettors Wish to win by three-quarters of a length in a track and Canadian record of 1:47.2. Workin Ona Mystery finished third. Aflame Hanover, the longest shot in the race at 136-1, finished fourth.

"It was not exactly the way I thought (it would go)," said Workin Ona Mystery's trainer Brian Brown. "I didn't expect to

be on the front. Timmy makes the decisions when the gate closes and I'm sure didn't expect to be there in :52.4, but it's just the way things work out. He has the green light and he makes all the decisions. I'm very proud of my horse, he was parked to the half in :52.4 and still got beat a-length-and-quarter.

"Hat's off to Captain Crunch after last week. Congratulations to Nancy, Scotty and Marcus (Johansson), they did a great job recovering. Congratulations to Bettors Wish and their connections. They both raced great. I'm still very proud of my horse."

Tetrick said Workin Ona Mystery, "raced his eye balls out. He just got strung out too far to the half. If I get there in :53.1 I think it's a totally different race He still got beat a length, but you know when we went that fast the back tier got to kind of drag out and that let Captain Crunch sit almost until going into the last turn. He's a great horse (Captain Crunch), going into it I thought he was the one to beat, and he got the better trip. If it would have worked the other way maybe I could have got there, but my colt raced as good as a horse could race.

"Always for those 3-year-old colts, it's a war. You know, it's a war, because the best will survive. And you know my colt is good, I'm very confident in him moving forward."

As for the winning driver, he was on top of the world.

"It feels unbelievable," said Zeron following his first Pepsi North America Cup victory. "This has been the end-all, be-all for me. It's completed my entire bucket list.

"We've got a lot of racing left to do, but I can't say enough about how amazing this animal is. I didn't want to be in that spot I was in in that race but at the same time he overcame it with just his greatness."

A son of 2013 Cup winner Captaintreacherous out of Sweet Paprika, Captain Crunch came into the final off a break in his elimination. The sophomore pacer broke in the first-turn after jumping a shadow, forcing him to grind out a fifth-place finish.

"The emotions went from very high, thinking we were very confident, to real low when he made that break, but he raced super after," said co-owner Buck Chaffee of Caviart Farms of Vienna, VA. "He raced on the outside the whole way. He raced tough and so we thought he was pretty good tonight. We thought he was in real good shape and he proved us right."

Johansson had last year's Breeders Crown champion prepped perfectly.

"It was just one of those things that happens," Johansson said of the eliminations. "I knew that the horse raced really well just to make it to the final so I really wasn't worried. I don't want to sound cocky or anything but I knew he was the best horse going into it and it was just up to him to show everybody."

Still, she wasn't taking any chances. She had her lucky boots shipped up from New Jersey just for Saturday's race.

Despite a rainy night, a strong crowd turned up to watch Captain Crunch (coming the wire) make history.

"These are VERY important boots," she said. "Those boots are worth a lot of money and I wore these when he won the Breeders Crown, the Governor's Cup and tonight. We got them shipped in from New Jersey today.

"The last eighth of a mile I must screamed his name like 30 times. My hands actually hurt but it was exciting to watch the race. Obviously he didn't get anything for free. He's just an amazing animal."

Captain Crunch now has three wins in four starts this season and has won nine of 14 career outings. He captured last year's Breeders Crown and Governor's Cup, sports impressive career earnings of \$1,188,960.

The clocking of 1:47.2 smashed the previous mark of 1:47.4, set by Cup winners Thinking Out Loud (2012) and Betting Line (2016).

Captain Crunch went off at odds of 4-1 and returned \$10.30, \$5.10 and \$3.30. A \$2 Exacta with Bettors Wish paid \$41.90. The \$1 Trifecta with Workin Ona Mystery in the third-slot returned \$59.70, while the \$1 Superfecta completed by Aflame Hanover paid \$721.80.

Tony Alagna-trainee Pilot Discretion soared by a pair of dueling leaders to remain unbeaten from six starts with a 1:52.4 mile in the \$247,000 Goodtimes Final on Saturday night at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Driver Andrew McCarthy positioned the son of Muscle Hill—Self Indulgent fifth as Swandre The Giant powered to the top approaching a :27.3 opening quarter. Knight Angel, starting from post 10, got stuck wide and progressed towards the leaders before stalling towards a :55.2 half.



Moving to the far turn, McCarthy then pulled off the pylons to race third over and fanned to the center of the track passing three-quarters in 1:24.3. From there Pilot Discretion slid past Swandre The Giant into the final sixteenth to win over pocket-popping Forbidden Trade. Super Schissel, catching cover fourth over, finished third.

"I was having a little trouble seeing up the back," McCarthy said after the race. "I was looking up to see whether Sylvain (Filion on Knight Angel) made it or not and I ended up third over but it worked out. This horse loves a target... you just have to remind him after he clears."

Owned by Robert LeBlanc, David Anderson and John Fodera — and cared for by Robert Dunlap on Saturday and Irene Petersson when in the U.S. — Pilot Discretion has now earned \$164,500 from his six starts—two as a freshman and four as a sophomore. The Hambletonian hopeful returned \$3.00 to win. Bred by Steve Stewart of Paris, KY and David Miller of Munfordville, KY, Pilot Discretion sold for \$100,000 at the 2017 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

"Six-for-six is pretty special," said Anderson. "Tony has done a wonderful job with him right from the get go and made a really smart call last year putting the horse away, while everyone else was beating each other up. He trained super all winter down in Florida. We've got a path set this year. I'm not sure he's the best horse out there, but he's yet to be beat.

Alagna said he was impressed with his charge.

"I always think it's amazing for any colt so lightly raced at two to come back and step right into this level," Alagna said after the race. "My owners and I talked about it all the way and we always hoped our first stake race would be the Goodtimes because it'd be a nice flow into the stakes

company without having to take on all the top colts like Greenshoe and Gimpanzee.

"I tell everybody, 'We hate that we didn't have anything in the North America Cup this year,' but I guess God wanted us to win The Goodtimes, instead."

With the Goodtimes win, Pilot Discretion has the potential to give Canadian-native Robert LeBlanc a shot at harness racing's biggest prize, the Hambletonian.

"I've watched the Goodtimes for years and years and to even be part of it was great," LeBlanc said after the race. "(The Hambletonian's) a bucket-list item. If you can have a horse that can compete in the Hambo... as an owner that's the ultimate thing."

The trainer said the colt has the Beal coming up at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono if he comes out of the Goodtimes healthy, but the focus is obvious.

"We're definitely going to focus on what we can do on the first Saturday in August," Alagna said of the Hambletonian. "If we have a horse that's a Hambo horse, that would be great for the partnership and for us, of course."

"She's been on the front probably the last 20 starts of her life and today when she raced from behind she was two fingers. She didn't go until I tipped her, but then she latched onto me like she wanted to fight the horses in front of her, so, yeah, she's wonderful."

Owned by Crawford Farms Racing, Brad Grant and Howard Taylor, Atlanta's 1:50.2 mile lowers the previous Canadian mark of 1:50.3 set last week by Hannelore Hanover in the elimination. The 4-year-old Chapter Seven—Hemi Blue Chip mare won her 16th race from 28 starts and has earned \$1,416,477. Ron Burke conditions the \$2.50 winner that was bred by Order By Stable of Sweden and purchased for \$60,000 at the 2016 Standardbred Horse Sales Company sale in Harrisburg, PA. Her caretaker is Margaret Gillon.

Hannelore Hanover was going for her fourth straight Armbro Flight victory and assistant trainer Mickey Burke, Jr. said he felt a little guilt about her stablemate breaking the streak.

"I love Hannelore and we've had her and I trained her back at the beginning of her 4-year-old year when she won her first... and I was here for most of her wins up here, so I have a real soft spot for her.

"That being said, it's nice having the next one, you know? (Atlanta) is special and she's nice – I warmed her up today and last week and she's just the nicest thing to go out with and go along with. She's got a great attitude and, obviously, a great talent."

Grant said he has no idea how good the 2018 Hambletonian winner can be.

"Yannick said it last week after the race in :51 flat... that he doesn't know how fast she can go and hopefully before the year is out, we're going to find out," Grant said. "I firmly believe that she could set records that are going to be tough to beat, but you never know.

"The good part is that every race is going to be an adventure because we don't know how good she is. We'll keep our fingers crossed."

Mickey Burke, Jr. said Atlanta is, "as push-button as they get. She's done everything we've asked of her and we don't see where her end is yet. (We were) a little worried (in the stretch). It's racing; horses will catch you when you don't think they are and it's a miserable night but she responded and raced on her toes."

Beating the boys in the 2018 Hambletonian, Atlanta has returned to the races to now mark herself as one of the best aged trotting mares currently racing.

"When she's racing against the older mares she's just unbelievable; a freak," Grant said after the race. "Most of her life she's raced close to the front or on the front, so to get her sitting for a bit and then cranking up like that is unbelievable."

Atlanta paid \$2.50 to win.

Asked whether Atlanta will tackle the boys again this year, Grant said he would leave that up to Burke and Gingras.

"I don't think she would ever misrepresent herself against the boys, but, again, that's something we'll decide as a group... we said we'd talk about everything together and agree on it.

"I'm just sorry that Michelle and Al Crawford and Howard Taylor couldn't be here tonight, but I enjoy representing them, so it's pretty good."



Sorella celebrates as Jimmy Freight wins Mohawk Gold Cup

Pacer who started in an Iowa cornfield found glory on North America Cup Night.

Driver Louis-Philippe Roy circled Jimmy Freight to the lead and held off a first-over bid from McWicked to coast to a 1:48.1 victory in the \$100,000 Mohawk Gold Cup on Saturday, June 15 at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

An Iowa bred, Ontario-sired horse owned by Adriano Sorella, Jimmy Freight paced a lifetime-best mile to collect his 19th victory while pushing his earnings to \$1,188,146. Richard Moreau trains the four-year-old son of Sportswriter—Allamerican Summer and returned \$11.90 to win. Lynn Cameron is Jimmy Freight's caretaker.

"He's a lot of fun," Sorella said. "Who would have thought? We picked this horse out of the cornfields of Iowa and... that's the running story that we keep saying. He's got a ton of fans that are people that maybe have small barns. (He's sort of an example that) hey, this could happen to anyone."

"I'm always trying to interact with people and making sure that they are excited and happy and he's got a following that way. I don't think maybe the horse gets as much credit, maybe, from some of the big writers, so it's a little bit disappointing, but maybe next week it might be different when we see that Hambo poll come out."

In Saturday's race, Nirvana Seelster took the lead while Jimmy Freight tucked into the pocket and forced 1-5 favorite McWicked into third approaching a :26.4 opening quarter. Jimmy Freight soon brushed to the top and braced for a first-over move from McWicked heading to a :54.4 half. McWicked gained slight ground on Jimmy Freight around the final turn and paced by his wheel past three-quarters in

1:21.2 but flattened out through the stretch as Jimmy Freight maintained his speed through the stretch. Nirvana Seelster slipped from the pocket to give chase for second while McWicked settled for third.

"My strategy was going to go with what McWicked did; having him right behind me," Roy said after the race. "I wanted him to come first up on me too. I know that (McWicked) is good that way too but that was the trip I imagined (I'd need) to beat him. It wasn't until the middle of the stretch I (thought) we were there. All the credit goes to

my horse. On the last turn he wanted to go by himself when he heard that horse coming — he was feeling so strong and never wanted that horse to come to his wheel.”

Jimmy Freight competed in the Mohawk Gold Cup last year as a 3-year-old.

“People thought we were crazy last year,” Sorella said. “Richard entered the horse as a 3-year-old racing in the Gold Cup against the older horses. They thought we were crazy,

but he was real good and he was third last year behind McWicked and Sintra, who was the winner.”

Sorella already had a huge party for the horsepeople set for today, but said that bash is going to be even bigger now.

“It’s going to be special,” he said. “Some people that are coming just said, ‘Wow, that party just got a lot better’ and, you know what, it was always going to be a big party but now it’s going to be special.

“I always try to do stuff for horsemen. My accountant thinks I’m crazy because I spend money and do crazy things and sometimes they are not too happy about it, but I just feel like... in horse racing, this is what we live for. I’m not going to forget this and sometimes I just want to share it with the staff and horsepeople around. Sometimes they don’t directly work with our barn, but they are people that have helped us out and maybe gone to pick up a horse for us or helped me out bringing stuff to the barn for the party... just friends. It’s a close-knit group and everybody seems to enjoy each other’s company so we’re taking one day out of the whole year to celebrate and Jimmy paid for it tonight, so I’m happy about that part. Whatever happens (at the party), we’re going to have a real good time.”

Trainer Tony Alagna had a big night winning both the Goodtimes and Fan Hanover.

"I had to come into the race with confidence," Dunn said after the race. "She hasn't done anything wrong on the campaign she's had so far, so I sort of knew the way she was doing her runs before tonight she still had something left. Obviously (when) you go up against a great filly like Warrawee (Ubeaut) you don't know. It probably wasn't until the last hundred feet I might have a chance to get past Yannick (Gingras on Warrawee Ubeaut), so I waited to come out a little bit to keep my momentum up and I still didn't know... but she dug in."

Alagna said when he saw Dunn angle out Treacherous Reign he thought he had the race won.

"She gave Dexter enough of a feeling to angle off of the mare's back, so I figured she had a shot," Alagna said. "He kept driving forward and it worked out."

"Last year when we started out at Pennsylvania she actually beat Warrawee Ubeaut at The Meadows. It wasn't out of her realm that I thought she could talent wise. We over raced her; she was tired (and) we put her away. The good thing about her is you can forgive and forget. She's come back great this year and has just been rock solid."

Sent off as the 1-5 favorite, Shartin N strolled to the lead and faced little challenge when winning the \$330,000 Roses Are Red final in 1:49 on Saturday night at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Driver Tim Tetrick sent the 6-year-old Tintin In America—Bagdarin mare to the top while Caviart Ally sat second into a :25.4 opening quarter. Tequila Monday sat third into the backstretch with Seaswift Joy N stalking fourth before getting flushed first over by Shartin N's stablemate Bettor Joy N.

"Twenty-five is pretty tough for the first quarter," Tetrick said. "I got a good breather and my mare let me do that. I didn't want to get too much action and then have to be first up. She's very quick off the car and she proved that tonight."

Shartin N continued on the front uncontested into a :54.4 half and passed three-quarters in 1:22.2 with Seaswift Joy N not advancing wide of pocket-sitter Caviart Ally. Through the stretch Shartin N kept course and cruised to a length-and-a-quarter victory over Tequila Monday sliding through the cones for second and Caviart Ally chasing in third.

"I had a spot where I wanted to go in and get control, and she does the rest," Tetrick said. "She's pretty easy to drive now; she'll let me relax on the lead and she just keeps going until somebody comes up on her she really likes to fight."

Looney-King (with Tetrick) said Shartin N is like getting "some kind of great reward" after a lifetime in the business.

"She's great, every time I sit behind her she wins. She keeps putting money in the bank and it's great that I get to do it for such good friends as the Kings. I'm glad for them because they do such a good job with her."

Now compiling \$1,726,155 in earnings, Shartin N collected her 34th victory. The Jim King Jr. trainee races for owners Richard Poillucci, Joann Looney-King and Tim Tetrick LLC. She paid \$2.50 to win.

"I'm 73 and done this most all of my life, it's just a great reward and, you know my mom and dad they spent their life in the business, my husband spent his life, and it's like we're getting some kind of great reward," said Looney-King who won the 2015 Pepsi North America Cup with Wakizashi Hanover. "I've always dreamed of having a good horse like her and dreams do come true."

"She'll go home and she'll have a couple weeks just kind of lolly gagging around and I think her next race is at The Meadowlands, I forget which one it was, but she is hopefully on target for all her Grand Circuit starts and we're looking forward to finishing off big."

"She has a 70-year-old female caretaker, Kate Moore, and Kate knows her ins and her outs and does everything to her. She's very easy. She gets out first thing in the morning, she comes in, she gets ready, she jogs, and then she likes to stand and look out her window and Kate does her up and does her feet. We kind of wait on her all day. If there's a pile in her stall I'm running in there to get it you know, like trying to keep the flies down all the time, two or three fans on her."

Four in a row for Propulsion

Propulsion traveled to northern Sweden on Saturday to race in the land of the midnight sun and came away the victor for the fourth consecutive year in the \$190,000 Norrbottens Stora Pris in Boden.

The 8-year-old son of Muscle Hill first visited Boden (about 600 miles (10 hours) north of Stockholm) in 2016 and enchanted the spectators in his first year among Europe's elite trotters.

The last two years have fortified Propulsion's popularity at this particular racetrack and Saturday he chased his fourth victory in Norrbottens Stora Pris.

The fans had their reasons to hope for a change in the result list. Makethemark, third in the Elitlopp this year, trained by Petri Salmela from Boden, had a lot of support from the big crowd of more than 10,000. But Propulsion was back in business for real after his uneven performance in Elitloppet, where he finished fourth and Örjan Kihlström could note that he and his horse were in front after 500 meters of the race. Robert Bergh and Muscle Hustle opened quickly for the lead, but Bergh was not interested in that position and Propulsion easily took the front. From that position he was allowed to keep an abnormally (for this kind of race) slow pace, which meant that Propulsion's worst enemy Makethemark had to do the job on the outside while the leader had plenty of power to use in the race's last 5/8 of a mile.

Propulsion flew in the home stretch and Kihlström never had to use the extra gears to win Norrbottens Stora Pris for the fourth year in a row. The mile rate was 1:55.2 over 1.3 miles and Makethemark followed strongly for second place while Muscle Hustle took the bronze medal.

"Propulsion is Propulsion and one can never doubt him. He had a bad day at Solvalla three weeks ago and many people have asked me if anything is wrong with the horse. But I've felt that he's been as good as he can be in training and to win this race four years in a row is just something special. My hands are shaking and tonight I'm going to think about this wonderful horse," said trainer Daniel Redén after the race.

Kihlström was full of admiration when he spoke to Swedish television.

"It's hard to find the right word to describe this horse. I mean... he wasn't good in Elitloppet a few weeks ago, but still he finished fourth and that says a lot about what kind of horse Propulsion is," said Kihlström.

Impressive performance in Finland

The \$225,000 Kymi Grand Prix in Kuopola, Finland was held on Saturday afternoon and Joakim Lövgren's Racing Mange (Orlando Vici) was at his best and impressed the harness racing fans.

Elitloppet contender Next Direction opened quickly for the lead and Racing Mange didn't find position first over until after almost a half mile into the race. The 6-year-old Orlando Vici son had to struggle three wide for 700 meters when Björn Goop, driver of Orlando Chief, decided to let Racing Mange take position outside the leader.

Opponents tried to attack three wide at the back stretch, but in the last turn, trainer/driver Lövgren seemed pretty happy about what he felt in Racing Mange. Regardless of the heavy trip, the duo left their challengers and hit the wire in mile rate 1:55.2 over 1.3 miles.

"This is incredible. Racing Mange got a tough trip and did his best performance in his career so far. I thought about the tactics during this week and remembered that it was hard to sit far back in the field at this track. Racing Mange is in his best condition and managed to accelerate from start and in the end," said Lövgren.

Next Direction finished second and Handsome Brad third.

Between Indiana and Maryland, horsemen Clark Jr. and Reeser bond over Savannah's Lucy

The trotting filly is making waves on the Indiana Sires Stakes circuit.

Horsemen Bobby Reeser and Bill Clark Jr. share a common thread in that they are each long-time harness racing devotees with roots intertwined in east coast venues both past and present. Despite their familiarity with the industry on the eastern seaboard, neither man had much more than an awareness of the other. Everything changed last summer with a phone call centered on the interest in an Indiana-sired trotting filly. Shortly thereafter, Reeser would take on the training duties for freshman Savannah's Lucy, a Guccio lass that Clark and his wife, Deb, purchased via onGait.com.

"I didn't know them really well, but I knew of them. They are from back home," Reeser explained of the connection with the Clarks. "They called me last year when they found the horse on the Internet. They said, 'We want to buy this

filly, would you go look at her and make sure everything looks okay with her?'"

Reeser obliged and made the trip to Luckiana Farm in Goshen, IN. Savannah's Lucy had been consigned to the Hoosier Classic sale the previous fall. The filly was out of the Enjoy Lavec mare Seductive Lady, already a productive dam with Indiana Sires Stakes champion Russell Mania, a winner of just over \$260,000, to her credit. Hammered down as a no sale for \$14,000, Savannah's Lucy returned to Luckiana Farm, where Aaron Stutzman would put her in training for the 2018 campaign.

The filly would successfully qualify at Harrah's Hoosier Park and make four starts for Stutzman. Savannah's Lucy captured a \$20,000 Indiana Sires Stakes consolation early on, winning at odds of 47-1 and stopping the clock in 1:58.1. Clark, who had stepped away from the business for a spell but had the itch to return to the sport, found her listing on onGait.com.

"I've been out of the business for a couple years and I happened to see her. I had been looking on onGait because I bought another trotter about a month before her," said Clark, a resident of Salisbury, MD. "I watched the video and it caught my eye. I didn't know anybody in Indiana, but by luck,

a friend of mine knew that Bobby had been racing there. I knew Bobby from way back.”

Clark placed the call and set things into motion. A decision hinged on Reeser’s feedback, and the veteran trainer provided the reinforcement they needed.

“She was very level headed and she stood really good, and the main thing after that was soundness,” Reeser said. “I couldn’t find much wrong with her at all. She was really very sound for a 2-year-old.”

When Savannah’s Lucy lined up to battle in the \$85,000 ISS final last June 31 at Hoosier Park, she did so campaigning for the first time out of the Reeser barn. The trotter would register a runner-up performance in an ISS elimination and qualify for two \$85,000 finals, but sickness kept her from showing her true potential. She would finish just out of the top 10 in points and miss the \$220,000 Super Final.

“The biggest problem we had is that she would get sick a lot. Every time we thought we had her really good to go a nice race she would come up sick, but she was making a little bit of money,” the trainer said.

Although she missed a chance at a big payday, Savannah’s Lucy finished out the season on a high note, winning a \$20,000 contest for ISS eligible fillies. Driven by Todd Warren, the freshman closed out the mile with a :28.4 final quarter, trotting clear of the field by four lengths to stop the clock in 1:57.3. In that mid-October contest Reeser witnessed the performance he knew his charge was capable of demonstrating. The filly finished the year on the board in six of 13 starts with just shy of \$38,000 in earnings.

Over the winter, Savannah’s Lucy “grew up better than my other two fillies” in the Reeser barn and the conditioner brought her back without hobbles because she was perfect without them. One of the characteristics that the trotter displayed last year was the tendency to get nervous, grab a little more, and cut her air off. For that reason, Reeser and Warren opted to race her conservatively early on. In her first six starts of 2019, Savannah’s Lucy registered a runner-up effort and four third-place performances.

“She did everything that I asked for. I knew we had to race her off the back and make sure she was breathing okay,” Reeser said. “Todd always does what I ask of him. We didn’t want to do anything as far as leaving the first several starts. We raced her in hand and from the back and she kept getting stronger and better.”

The strategy changed in the opening round of Indiana Sires Stakes action for sophomore fillies. With two \$48,000 divisions carded, Reeser’s filly drew away from some of the

better fillies, slotted in post six in the nine-horse field. This time the trainer instructed Warren to “get a spot” and the veteran driver did just that, slipping into third when the gate folded. Warren was able to sit with Savannah’s Lucy through a :56.2 opening half, and when he asked the filly, she moved first up and charged home in :28.2 to beat favored Swanind Fastlane by nearly two lengths in a lifetime best 1:55.

Under the old sires stakes format, that mile would have earned Savannah’s Lucy a spot in the next week’s \$85,000 final with a chance to compete for valuable points towards the Super Final. With the revised program, money for each round is divided based on the number of horses entered, with points doled out over each division. Reeser likes the new formula, and his charge immediately benefitted with her first seasonal win.

“I like the new program. I like it the way it is because you can miss the real good ones sometimes,” he said. “Everybody has more of a chance in this new program to make money. It is not all directed at the very best horses. I just think it’s way better for everybody.”

For Clark and his wife, the new program structure helps them in getting a quicker return on their investment. Their filly has already earned \$33,545 in 2019 with a good chunk of valuable ISS points. Savannah’s Lucy will attempt to build on her tally Wednesday, June 19 at Hoosier Park in the second round of sires stakes action. She has drawn into the second of two \$47,500 contests, again avoiding some of the tougher competition in the group. It is all part of the racing luck in which Clark, a former trainer and owner with Maryland and New Jersey champions to his credit, is well versed.

“She should be right there with them. I don’t think she’s really trotted to her ability yet, but that will be coming I’m sure,” he stated. “She’s got the speed, there’s no doubt about it. She likes to come home, and that’s where the money’s at. She can trot those last quarters.”

The experience with Savannah’s Lucy has led the Clarks to double down on Indiana, partnering last fall with Reeser on six babies. A few of them will soon qualify, and the couple are excited to see how Year Two of their Indiana adventure plays out.

“We’re happy in Indiana,” Clark said. “It takes a lot of luck with the business, but Bobby has had some luck there, so we’ve decided we’ll go right with them.”

In regards to Father's Day, will anyone match Stars Pride?

Will Chapter Seven or Muscle Hill ever duplicate what Stars Pride did?

It's going to be a very tall order.

Stars Pride, a \$2,950 yearling who was the 1950 Hambletonian runnerup, sired eight Hambletonian winners and twice went back to back in the Hambletonian with a colt and a filly, three times overall winning consecutively including a three straight run in the mid-1960s. He sired four straight Triple Crown winners (1964-1968-1969-1972), 10 Kentucky Futurity winners and a Horse of the Year at age 28 in 1975 (Savoir).

Hambletonian winners by Stars Pride:

1958 – Emilys Pride (filly)
1959 – Diller Hanover
1964 – Ayres
1965 – Egyptian Candor
1966 – Kerry Way (filly)
1968 – Nevele Pride
1969 – Lindys Pride
1972 – Super Bowl

He was 30 when one of his progeny hit the board for the final time in the Hambletonian with a third with Native Starlight in 1977.

His offspring were 1-2 in the Hambletonian in 1958 with Emilys Pride and Little Rocky, did so again in 1965 with Egyptian Candor and Armbrus Flight, and was an astounding 1-2-3 in 1966 with Kerry Way, Polaris and Shatter Way.

In 1971, his progeny were second and third with Savoir and A Cs Orion, with Savoir later being named HOY.

Comparing any stallion to Stars Pride, especially in a Triple Crown season, can be foolhardy. Plus, both Muscle Hill and Chapter Seven have a Horse of the Year trophy on their mantel and no HOY has ever sired a HOY on the trotting side.

Happy BD, Art Major

Speaking of sires, happy 20th birthday to Art Major (June

11, 1999). The sire of the Pace and Jug winner Courtly Choice, as well as the 2014 HOY J K She'salady was a later foal, but so was his former stablemate McArdle, who was born a week earlier 20 years back and is the defending HOY sire with McWicked. Art Major was the sport's leading earner of 2002 (\$1,562,779) despite not competing in either the North America Cup or the Meadowlands Pace.

29 starts at 2

Starting 29 times as a 2-year-old is a huge deal, but it happened in 1967 when Nevele Pride went 26-for-29 to earn the Horse of the Year title, something he would repeat the next two seasons. Keystone Spartan actually started 30 times in his 2-year-old season in 1967. Oh, how times have changed.

Hambletonian and the number 9

The trending in years ending in "9" is significant. Consider that the last two years ending in "9" saw world records, not only Hambletonian bests but world bests – 1999 Self Possessed (1:51.3) and 2009 Muscle Hill (1:50.1, tied Donato Hanover).

The last four Hambletonians ending in "9" the winner was sired by a Hambletonian winner.

2009 – Muscle Hill MUSCLES YANKEE 1998
1999 – Self Possessed VICTORY DREAM 1994 (first crop)
1989 – Park Avenue Joe SPEEDY SOMOLLI 1978. Of course this was the only dead heat Hambletonian year with 2019 marking the 30th anniversary.
1979 Legend Hanover SUPER BOWL 1972

The last six Hambletonians ending in "9" saw a Hall Of Fame driver in the winner's circle.

2009 – Brian Sears (Muscle Hill)
1999 – Mike Lachance (Self Possessed)
1989 – Ron Waples (Park Avenue Joe)
1979 – George Sholty (Legend Hanover)
1969 – Howard Beissinger (Lindys Pride)

Ron Pierce having shoulder surgery

He'll be 63 on June 21, and the third leading money-winning driver in the sports history is scheduled to have another surgery, this time on his left shoulder.

"I'm having a consultation on the 12th," Pierce revealed in a recent conversation from Montana with his family, "It's been something that has bothered me for a while and flared up big time. There are two tendon tears and some cartilage damage."

You miss driving at all Ron? "Not especially, the grind was a lot. Sometimes I can remember being at 12 different tracks in a week. It can get old all the traveling and different hotel rooms."

Number of the week

In 1964, Yonkers Raceway averaged 25,400 fans per night. Just down the road, and going for their fifth straight World Series (which they made) and 12th in 14 years, the New York Yankees averaged 16,110 fans per night. That's 9,290 more harness fans per night.

Swede facts

Between 2014-2018 a million-dollar trotting event has been captured by a Swedish trainer – all five of which raced in or won the Hambletonian, but none as the favorite.

In 2014, Trixton won Hambletonian as the second choice \$10.60 for Jimmy Takter (Father Patrick favored).

In 2015, Pinkman won the Hambletonian as the second choice \$5.60 for Takter (Mission Brief favored).

In 2016, Resolve won the Yonkers International for Ake Svanstedt (two years earlier was fifth in the Hambletonian final at 48.90-1 as the 7th choice).

In 2017, Perfect Spirit won the Hambletonian for Svanstedt and paid \$17.00 as the 4th choice. (Devious Man placed second as the 2-1 lukewarm choice).

In 2018, Cruzado Dela Noche won the Yonkers International Trot for Marcus Melander. Back in 2015, he was

last in his Hambletonian elim at 16.80-1 as the fifth choice. (Mission Brief \$3.60-won this elimination)

The women of the USTA

There is nothing that compares to the highs, lows, excitement and drama of harness racing. But what would it be like if there were no rules to abide for the horsemen, the racing officials and the racetracks? Although the rules are determined by state commissions, the United States Trotting Association (USTA) rules do apply and are enforced by the USTA for most state and county fairs.

Whether you would like to own or are already a proud parent of a racehorse, you must first become a member of the USTA.

The USTA is located in Westerville, OH. It licenses officials, drivers, trainers, racing officials and owners, maintains racing and breeding records, registers horses for racing and breeding and helps promote the sport the best way possible.

The USTA was created in 1939. From its humble beginnings in a small office located under the grandstand at Historic Track in Goshen, NY, the USTA has emerged as a major national sport.

Presently, there are some 18,000 registered members with the USTA. That adds up to a lot of hard work for the women who work there — especially those in Membership Services.

Seven women work in that department. Over the four decades that I've been involved in the business, I've had to call the USTA many, many times; especially the numerous times I relentlessly called to see if a name I chose for one of my foals was already taken or if I was lucky enough to get it. I can honestly say that whomever I talked to was nothing but helpful and courteous.

The women's jobs in Membership Services range from answering questions, researching names for foals, foreign registration, Embryo Transfer recording, DNA, race line production for sales, Pathway database and registering driving colors.

One woman in particular named **Barbara Brooks** was and will always be a legend there for she worked at the USTA for 62 years. On December 30, 2016, Brooks retired with honors.

Sandy Van Horne a 38-year veteran, has worked in membership services, as well as specializing in race line production for sales, and extensive knowledge of our Pathway Database.

Another long-term employee is **Phyllis Spradlin** who has been there for 32 years. Spradlin is in charge of membership, as well as contributing to creation of all USTA service forms.

If you need to talk to someone about horse DNA or registering a foreign horse, you would ask to speak with **Karen Williams** who has employed there a lengthy 21 years.

Next is **Jayme Laing** who has called the USTA her second home for a dozen years. Her main job is overseeing Embryo Transfer recording, curating content for Member Services Social Media outreach, and managing the Electronic Record Keeping Database.

Aimee Hock, who has also been at the USTA for 12 years was promoted to Assistant Registrar in January 2017. Her job responsibilities are several. Besides helping out in member service duties, Aimee specializes in foreign registration and exports.

Three years ago, **Melissa Brinkerhoff** joined the team and is presently the unofficial receptionist who greets people as they walk in, directing deliveries, and also helps out in member services.

Last but not least is the latest addition, **Kim Schneider**. Schneider is the person you call when you have questions about driving color registration. She has been employed with the USTA for 2 ½ years.

I asked Hock if she found it difficult working under one roof with six other women in closed quarters. I have always heard that two women can't live harmoniously under the same roof, so seven would be the pictograph for war.

"No, we have all become more like a family. We work closely together and rely on one another immensely. We have our expertise and niche and over the years we have embraced our strengths and developed a strong, solid team. We also realize that some days you just have to have a sense of humor and have fun," she said, laughing.

The USTA even goes as far as sending their female superstars to various horse sales where they set up a mobile USTA office to accommodate their members on the spot.

Thanks to all the dedicated women at the USTA who diligently work to assist and please the members of our harness racing family.

Defeating the takeout gorilla

We have to address the thousand pound gorilla in the room. To pin the beast down and make him cry “Monkey’s Uncle” we have to wrestle him with a grip no one cares to try.

Oh monstrous Gorilla in the room, thy name is “takeout.”

I have stayed quiet in print and in person about the issue of takeout because I wanted to experience the breadth of opinion before I took a stance or, to describe my reaction more accurately, ignored the issue.

The takeout gorilla, as far as I am concerned, is all fear and no fight. To the point, I firmly believe that tracks could thrive with their betting audience by keeping takeout at the levels everyone complains about with one simple stipulation – they must display how it helps their customers.

I am unconvinced that takeout is a major reason why betting is down from whatever period in the past is documented, or that reducing it drastically will suddenly boost handles across the proverbial boards. I do not deny that some people playing pari-mutuels complain about it but I await evidence that bettors have fled the wagering platforms to seek other realms of risk.

Complaining is, after all, a characteristic of all horseplayers. They live to explain losses with a litany of “if, and, or but” rationalizations. Takeout is a sensitive issue mostly because it takes from winnings. Nothing pisses off someone winning money than the act of sharing it with anyone by decree. Horseplayers are sore losers in the first place, so suck up the toughest part of their income to attain and you have an angry mob.

But their anger is moot. Opponents of takeout also complain about the weather but never do anything about it. Bettors keep on betting. They almost need the issue of takeout to fuel more complaining, which, whether tracks like it or not, is a way that bettors release stress.

However, track administrations should turn the tables on the takeout issue so that there can be no accusations that a track is “milking” them.

It is time for some alternative action.

Create ways to sensationalize on the gorilla, so to speak; feature special gimmicks that distract from the takeout of your specific track. Here are some suggestions to put track administrations on the right path:

Award bettors who wager – win or lose – specific amounts on designated programs. Simple rules should apply. Anyone betting X amount – whether the tickets win or lose – gets a rebate of X per cent. The special nights could be called something like “Takeout Take-Back” nights. Advertisements from the track announcer should broadcast between each race and around the raceway there should be posters with boldly printed one-liners for the deal. Some could read:

BEAT THE TAKEOUT ON TAKEOUT TAKE-BACK NIGHTS AT (TRACK)

TAKEOUT TAKE-BACK NIGHTS ARE YOUR BEST BET

TAKEOUT TAKE-BACK NIGHTS ARE BETTING-CROWD PLEASERS

New players will be educated on the matter of takeout with a positive spin. They will begin betting pari-mutuels with an entirely different perspective of a necessary track function and realize that the track cares enough about it to keep bettors in action.

Transparency is a key to racetracks. Ignoring takeout rates looks bad to bettors. “Why hide the rates? Are they that bad?” Bettors will ask. Own up, tracks, post the rates, and use your email list to remind bettors where the track takeout rate stands in comparison to other tracks.

With all the tracks where betting is available via simulcasts at raceways and over the Internet, I have never heard from one bettor who complains about takeout that he or she checked takeout rates so as to play only at the lowest takeout rate tracks. That is, after all, a sound and mature way to deal with the problem. Sound and mature, however, do not usually describe any type of horseplayer casually or professionally playing.

In my history of part- and full-time betting, which covers decades, the only bettors that made conversation about takeout to me were the high rollers. Not all of them were professional bettors, that is, not all of the big-bankroll guys played the horses to pay the bills. Still, they were conscious of what they could have won before takeout. A few of them found other ways to wager, legally and illegally. Others viewed the takeout rates to be a “professional hazard” that must be tolerated, so they built in to their expenses what losses it would incur. In other words, those who bet a lot and often dealt with takeout like any professional deals with business expenses.

Still, some complained.

It is always best to display takeout rates and make their function work for business. The closer you become to your track’s customers, the more they will trust your outfit and be comfortable placing their money into your hands.

Evidence of a Crime

This is a true story with supporting documentation.

I recently took a break from doing nothing to read the New York Times on my iPad. An article caught my attention, 'What Happens to a Magazine Deferred?' by Jennifer Finney Boylan. Jennifer wrote about a short-lived magazine named The American Bystander. How short-lived? After much fanfare, hype, work, and investment of money, the magazine had a run of exactly one issue.

This short run is nothing remarkable, print magazines were always a tough business and are becoming as rare as sold out racetrack grandstands. What is remarkable is that after a hiatus of 36 years, the humor/satirical publication has new life as The New Bystander.

A quote in her story is so cool that I am having t-shirts printed. "The value of a dream shouldn't always be measured by whether or not it came true."

Her story about the magazine venture, sent me digging through the bottom drawer of my desk searching for evidence of a crime from the year 2005. This evidence took place pre-Internet and was on something called paper. This was a cold case, but I cracked it.

This is what happened. Life was careening along. Traditional writing gigs in baseball, harness horse racing, movie reviews, and an upscale history magazine kept me occupied and out of too much trouble. Alas, I longed to write some off-beat humor.

My traditional editors were not thrilled when I slipped a pun or wisecrack into a story, especially horse racing editors. Obviously, these editors sensed that many gamblers and horse owners are involved in a rather serious game. Each day they are in the process of losing races and hemorrhaging money. They are interested in second dams, hoof fungus, purses, and race conditions. Ergo, the tolerance level for bad puns, satire and frivolity is low.

Humor is a tricky business. Some folks believe Jerry Lewis was a hoot, some of us would prefer solitary confinement to a festival of his films. Others prefer upscale amusement ala

The Big Lebowski, Animal House, EG Wodehouse, or Dave Barry. Selling humor was, and still remains, a difficult niche. Nevertheless, I made a quick pitch.

I do not remember how the print publication that craved content with a comedic bent came to my attention. I do not remember what induced me to submit to their slush pile. I did not even remember the name of the publication – until I found the evidence, wrinkled and fading, in the bottom of my desk drawer – ESPREE.

What I do remember is that the editor replied immediately and enthusiastically to my three samples, he (or maybe she?) published one of my pieces, mailed me a hefty payment, and asked for more content on a regular basis. I was very, very excited. In horse terms, this was like having your homebred colt grow into a champion.

Two weeks later, the editor followed up with a note that the magazine was folding.

My reaction to this news was much like raising, training and staking a trotter that wins its first couple of sires' stakes races, and then the budding champion injures a leg on the stroll to the paddock, and never races again. I speak from both experiences.

The takeaway is this – every day, dreams are murdered, but this does not mean they die. Time heals. I can actually sort of laugh at them today. They were great adventures – very brief adventures, but what the hell, "The value of a dream shouldn't always be measured by whether or not it came true."

All we can do is to keep pitching and racing, dreaming the dreams.



Bruce Ranger records 9,000th career victory with win at Bangor

Bruce Ranger entered Friday night (June 14) only one win away from 9,000 career victories. After the first of his eight scheduled races for the night, Ranger achieved the milestone with Anderlecht crossing the finish line with a time of 1:57.

"This was an exciting night," said Michael Hopkins, manager of racing operations at Hollywood Casino Hotel & Raceway. "9,000 wins is quite an accomplishment and he's only the fourth racer to do it in the history of the sport in this state. There's a lot to be said not only for his talent, but for his durability and consistency over the years. This is not an easy milestone to achieve."

Ranger achieved his first win in Skowhegan in 1979 and has been racing in Bangor since the 1980s. He ranks fourth on the list of career victories for Maine drivers behind William Parker, Jr., Walter Case, Jr. and George Brennan. He achieved his 8,500th win in May of 2013 at Pompano Park track in South Florida. He walked away from racing in June of 2015 before returning to the track last year. In all, Ranger won four races Friday night, finishing the evening with 9,003 career victories.

The 136th season of racing at historic Bangor Raceway got underway in May with racing every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday through July 19. All post times are set for 5 p.m. Thursday, July 4 will feature a special Independence Day race card at 6:30 p.m. Following fair season, racing will resume for a 3-date stint in September, and with a regular schedule resuming Tuesday, October 8.

Simulcast wagering will be available at the track on days with live racing at the Win, Play & Show Lounge under the grandstand. All races at Hollywood Casino, Hotel & Raceway will be simulcast throughout the country. The permanent simulcast wagering Race Book remains at Hollywood Casino's main facility at 500 Main Street in downtown Bangor. On days with live racing at Bangor Raceway, racing fans will have the option of simulcast wagering either at

Hollywood Casino or at the track.

Admission to the grandstand is free. Race programs will be sold at the track starting the day before racing for \$1 each.

Melander freshman colts impress at Breakfast With The Babies

The North America Cup day edition of Breakfast With The Babies (BWTB), sponsored by Jules Siegel's Fashion Farms, came an hour early at 9:00 am Saturday morning.

Trainer Marcus Melander flaunted his imposing freshman trotting power this morning, winning five of the six colt races while finishing 1-2 in races eight through eleven.

Trotting colts got underway in the seventh race where the camera could not separate a closing **Hellbent For AM** (Sears) and mile cutter **Legion Of Honor** (Andy McCarthy) as they crossed the wire, resulting in a dead heat in 1:56 / :27.3. Hellbent For AM is an Anders Strom via Courant Inc homebred trained in the Melander barn while Legion Of Honor was a \$150,000 LSYS purchase by Mario Mazza from breeders Steve Stewart and John Carver with Lucas Wallin doing the training. Just as impressive as the top two was the :27 flat closing kick displayed by third-place finisher Real Cool Sam (D. Miller), a Fashion Farm homebred.

The Melander stable began the 1-2 binge in race 8 when **Maesteraemon** (Sears) out kicked Speed Ball Swagger (Mattias Melander) for a 2:01.1 / :28 win. Mahomes (Tetrick) scrambled up for third. The winner is another SRF Stable colt, this one an Andover Hall that cost \$170,000 at the Standardbred Horse Sale (SHS) and is a Hanover bred.

Melander came right back with **Capricornus** (Tetrick) to win in 1:58.2, taking over from stablemate Hollywood Story (Sears) on the way to the 1:00.3 half then moved away from his chief rival under his own power with a :27.3 final quarter. The \$110,000 Cantab Hall scion was a Harrisburg yearling purchase is a Windsong Stable bred now owned by JJ Stable.

Sears drove **Expectations** to a 1:57.2 / :27.3 score next, taking over early and finishing in hand over Hell Patrol (Tetrick) and Chaptiama (Trond Smedshammer). Expectations is another son of Muscle Hill, bred by Dunroven Stud and sold in Lexington for \$110,000 to Vicky Trotting.

The domination continued with **Back Of The Neck** (Mattias

Melander) leading all the way to an easy 1:58 / :28.2 win over Hopeyousteponalego (Marcus Schoen) and Swiss House On Fire (Svanstedt). Back Of The Neck is a son of Ready Cash, bred by Order By Stable and still shows Order By as owner despite having sold for \$150,000 last fall at Harrisburg.

Ake Svanstedt finally put the Melander reign of terror to rest by winning the last of the trotting colt races with the very sharp looking Chapter Seven colt Third Shift. They tracked Melander trainee Gerard (M. Schoen) throughout slow fractions before blasting by in a 27.4 end to the 2:01 mile. Julia Trix Treasure (Gingras) closed it up to be second. The winner was a \$235,000 Harrisburg yearling purchase by Melby Gard Inc from breeder Winbak Farms.

The day's opener featured several top bred filly trotters and a pair of expensive, impressive Muscle Hills finished one-two. **Bellareina Dolce** (Brian Sears) took over past the quarter, rated the middle half then dug in when challenged by Impressive Fashion (Dave Miller) as they sprinted home in lock-step through a :27.4 end to the 2:00 mile. Oblivion (Tim Tetrack) was a handy third. Lennart Agren owns the winner via his SRF Stable, a \$400,000 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale (LSYS) buy from breeder David McDuffee and she is trained by Marcus Melander.

Yannick Gingras saved ground all the way then found room at the rail late for **Queen Of The Hill** to eke out a narrow 1:58.4 / :27.1 win over a wide and charging Dramatra (Scoot Zeron). Dip Me Hanover (Tetrack) was a good third. Queen Of The Hill is an Explosive Matter filly that Al Libfeld paid \$110,000 (LSYS) for to secure from breeders Paymaq Racing, Lou Willinger and JC Bafia. She is trained in the Per Engblom stable.

Gingras took the exact same path to victory in the next race, guiding **Becky Lindy** to a ground-saving 1:59.3 / :28.2 score, making it two straight for the driver/trainer duo of Gingras and Engblom. They sat tight in the pocket behind the fractions set by Context (Jan Johnson) before wearing that game rival down very late to get up. Beautiful Mrs A (Marcus Miller) was third in a purposeful trip. Lindy Farms bred the winner, a \$35,000 LSYS purchase by Christina Takter and John Fielding.

Julia Beauty AM made it a hat trick for Per and Yannick, coming wide from well back to track down the leaders late in the stretch and get a narrow win over Common Sense S (Svanstedt) in 2:00.2 with her final quarter in 27.3. Musclesandmascara (Dexter Dunn) rallied late for third. Julia Racing owns the Muscle Hill filly, an \$85,000 LSYS yearling bred by AM Bloodstock.

Senorita Rita (Zeron) gave the crowd a thrill with an impressive gate-to-wire 1:57.4 win, trotting home in :27.1 under no urging. Shishito (Tetrack) actually gained in the stretch to get up for the place over Seventimesalady (Ake Svanstedt). Ken Jacobs paid \$285,000 (LSYS) for Senorita Rita, a Chapter Seven lass bred by Our Horse Cents Stable and Hall of Famer Linda Toscano is the trainer.

Caviart Ava was a winner for Andy McCarthy in a front end effort this morning, finishing her 1:58.4 mile with a :28.1 last quarter with something left. Electrapedia (Svanstedt) got up to be second over Mission US (Mattias Melander). The Trixton filly is a Caviart Farms homebred, trained by Nancy Johansson.

The pacers came around after a training break and Tony Alagna fillies finished 1-2 in 1:57.2 / :27.3 with **Never Ever Forget** (Dexter Dunn) closing to get up over the inside horses and holding off Reflect With Me (McCarthy) who lost ground early, breaking while leading before the :59.2 half before making a nice recovery. Both fillies are by Captaintreacherous, the winner an \$85,000 Lexington purchase by Alagna & In The Gym, VJ Stable, Donovan and Sbrocco from AM Bloodstock.

Alagna sent out **Lady Lou** (McCarthy) to win the 14th after leading all the way in 1:54 with a :27 end to hold Baby You're the Best (D. Miller) and Rocknificent (Tetrack) at bay while becoming the fastest freshman filly pacer of 2019. The daughter of Sweet Lou was bred by Robert Hamather and went through the Harrisburg sale for \$55,000 to Brad Grant.

Capt Midnight (McCarthy) became the fastest freshman pacing colt of the season for Tony Alagna when he won the 15th race in 1:52.3 / :26.3 from the pocket over a stubborn Freedom Warrior (Tetrack) with Captain Nemo (Dunn) third. The Captaintreacherous colt is a Hanover bred and was a \$350,000 Harrisburg yearling purchase by Marvin Katz, Ken Jacobs, Brad Grant and Captain Midnight Racing.

Genius Man (Marcus Miller) took the last baby race of the day with an impressive gate to wire 1:54.4 / :26.4 win, holding sway over Force N Fury (Dunn) and He Refuses To Lose (Matt Kreuger). The winner is an Art Major colt was an \$87,000 Lexington purchase by Ron Michelon and Daniel Plouffe from breeder Winbak Farms.

PA-sired sophomore trotting colts impressive in Philly

A preview of next week's Beal Trot eliminations at Pocono and the big jewel, the Hambletonian at The Meadowlands on Aug. 3, was certainly on display during competition among Pennsylvania-sired 3-year-old trotting colts at Harrah's Philadelphia on Friday afternoon (June 14). Three divisions of the third preliminary round for the Sire Stakes and four sections of Stallion Series action produced many impressive winners.

Fastest of all, and the only horse to record two wins in the Sire Stakes division this year, was **Osterc**, 2018's PA Sire Stakes champion and a winner in 1:52.2 to lower his lifetime mark by 2 $\frac{3}{5}$ seconds and miss Googoo Gaagaa's divisional track record by a single tick.

The Cantab Hall colt out of Oh Oh Hereshecomes, a half-sister to millionaire The Wall, was used hard by driver Yannick Gingras to clear to the lead past a :27 quarter, but from there he remained in control, going to the half in :56.1 and the three-quarters in 1:24. The Christina Takter / Goran Falk homebred, a Hambletonian eligible, then kept favored Marseille at bay by 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ lengths.

Hambletonian-eligible **Summit In Sight**, who lost a three-race winning streak in his last start when he was parked the mile in finishing second, pulled the pocket on pacesetting favorite Goes Down Smooth after fractions of :27.3 and :57, was up to challenge towards the 1:25.1 three-quarters, then wore down the leader by 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ lengths while equaling his lifetime mark of 1:53.

The Muscle Hill colt out of Bluff, whose dam Blur was a \$1 million winner, now has four victories in six seasonal outings for Stroy Inc. and Andy Miller Stable Inc., trainer Julie Miller, and driver Andy Miller. Like Osterc, Summit In Sight is also eligible to the Beal, with that race's eliminations being drawn Monday.

They were four across in a seven-horse field for most of the other Sires section, with **Guaranteed** three-wide most of the way to the :28.3 quarter. The Muscle Hill colt then yielded the lead to Kate's Massive, who had been four-wide much of the early battle, and the double Stallion Series winner took the field to the half of :57.2, then shook off the uncovered bid of Capt Chaps Hanover to the 1:25 three-quarters. But the wearying usage finally got to Kate's Massive, with Guaranteed coming on in the stretch to take the lead, then hold off Macmorris Hanover by $\frac{3}{4}$ of a length in 1:55.1, with Kate's Massive third.

Linda Toscano conditions the colt, unraced at two and now

three-for-six, for Michael and William Pozefsky and Myron Ekstein; she knows a bit about the preparatory road for the Hambletonian, and might be finding herself on it again.

In the Stallion Series, the team of driver Andrew McCarthy, trainer Lucas Wallin, and owner Mario Mazza produced two winners, with the faster victor being **Sheer Muscle**, a Muscle Hill colt out of the mare Sheer Glide, the first foal out of the $\frac{3}{4}$ sister to Flex The Muscle (\$900G+).

In only his third lifetime start, Sheer Muscle worked to the lead past a :28.3 quarter, then produce midrace splits of 57.1 and 1:24.4, holding his composure while rivals broke nearby, then went off to a 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ length victory over Foreverhillreign in 1:54, a lifetime mark. This colt was also kept eligible to the Hambletonian and the Beal despite a single winning start at two, and he is beginning to show the ability justifying his being paid in.

Team McCarthy/Wallin/Mazza came back to win a second Stallion Series section as the Muscle Hill colt **Rock My Muscles** laid off a contested pace that saw a different leader approaching the quarter (:28.1), half (:57.3), and three-quarters (1:25.4), coming on in the lane to overtake the first-over favorite Amador by 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ lengths while writing himself a new mark of 1:55.1. Rock My Muscles notched his first win of the season, and the strong mile may have started to alter the planning of trainer Wallin and owner Mazza for the Hambletonian eligible.

Tioga Downs will play host to three divisions of the New York Sire Stakes (NYSS) for 3-year-old pacing colts and geldings today, Father's Day (June 16).

Hickfromfrenchlick (Mark MacDonald) is the 5-2 morning line favorite in the first division (\$38,900). The 3-year-old colt by So Surreal is owned by trainer Ray Schnittker along with NolaMaura Racing, and Thomas Spatorico. He has two wins this season including a leg of the NYSS at Monticello. He has won six times in 10 career starts.

The second morning line choice at 3-1 is Respect Our Flag (Joe Bongiorno). Trained by Jennifer Bongiorno for owners Barbara Bongiorno Stable, Bill Lambos, and Dionisios Liberatos. The 3-year-old gelding by Roll With Joe has two wins this season and four career victories.

The second division (\$38,200) features the 9-5 morning

line favorite Reining Deo (Jim Morrill Jr.). The 3-year-old colt by Rock N Roll Heaven is owned by trainer Brett Pelling, Brian Gordon, and Deo Volente Farms. He has three seconds and a third in four starts this season. He has three career victories.

The second morning line choice is Buddy Hill (Jason Bartlett) at 2-1. The 3-year-old colt by Roll With Joe is owned by Tom Hill and trained by Marcus Melander. He is still searching for his first win as a sophomore. He finished a respectable fourth in the Art Rooney Pace final (\$300,000) his last time out at Yonkers.

In the third division (\$38,900) the morning line favorite at 2-1 is American Mercury (Tyler Buter). The 3-year-old gelding by American Ideal is trained by Chris Oakes for owners Crawford Farms Racing, Northfork Racing Stable, Chuck Pompey, and Scott Bice. He has NYSS wins at Yonkers and Saratoga this season. The gelding owns five career victories.

The 5-2 second choice in the last division is the Linda Toscano trained Major March (Jason Bartlett). The 3-year-old colt by Art Major is owned by the Bay Pond Racing Stable. His two wins this season includes a NYSS win at Monticello. He has won three races in his career.

Tioga Downs will also welcome the Wiener Dog races.

There will be three heats of 10 dachshunds per heat. The top three finishers from each heat will qualify for the finals. The fastest wiener dog in the finals will win a \$500 wagering voucher. Second place is good for a \$200 wagering voucher. The third place finisher gets a \$100 wagering voucher.

The 13 race Father's day card starts at 1:00 p.m.

Gural skeptical about USTA statement

In Friday's issue you published a statement by the USTA opposing the Horse Racing Integrity Act of 2019. With all the turmoil at Santa Anita, I think it's fairly obvious that the public is going to demand that the Feds take over monitoring the sport. What I found most amazing in the statement issued by the USTA was the second to last paragraph where they said that test results prove that doping is not a problem. They went on to say that the anti-doping and drug testing program conducting by U.S. racing regulatory bodies showed that 99.71 per cent of standardbred horses were racing without illegal medication. This is coming from the USTA so if you believe that statistic then you should be very happy with the position they have taken. While I recognize that Lasix is an issue, in my discussions with the sponsors I believe they are willing to at least listen to our argument about the fact that our horses race far more often than thoroughbreds and as a result the rules for Lasix may have to be different. I am working very hard to identify the culprits and what chemicals are being used but having the USTA say it is not a problem shows a total disregard for our customers, the horses and the honest people trying to make a living in the sport they love.

What's up with TrackMaster Ratings?

Without warning or explanation, "Trackmaster Rating" (TMR) has crept into the harness racing vernacular.

TMR is now being used at some racetracks (e.g.

Meadowlands, Plain Ridge) as a basis for numerically ranking horses and serves a similar role to the now largely defunct alphabetical A, B, C classified racing system. The main difference being that the A, B, C system was governed by the local racing secretary and used to write races among horses of roughly similar current ability. Though subjective, classified racing was steeped in logic and easily understood. Conversely, TMR, which appears logarithmic in nature, has the trappings of an arcane system whose sum of its individual parts is incomprehensible.

Examples from the 10-June-2019 Plainridge Park race card:

Race 1 – As the horses were warming up, TMR rankings for Class, Pace and Power (whatever that means) flashed intermittently on the screen. Confusingly, #6 (Holy Grail N) was assigned TMR scores of 79, 80 and 79.2 respectively and yet his composite TMR was shown as 73.18 in the program (wait... what???). #5 (Southwind Terror) was assigned scores of 80, 76 and 74.8. Somehow, this equated to a TMR of 81.29. Since nowhere on the broadcast or program is TMR explained, one can only surmise that it's either absurdly abstract or utterly nonsensical.

Race 9 – #2 (Twelve), who will go off at 2-1, had won 3 of his last 4 (two of the wins coming at what clearly appears to be a higher class than today's tilt) and has a TMR of 73.01. Meanwhile, #8 (Stellas Phella), who will go off at 20-1, is 0-16 in 2019, 1-52 over the last 2 years and has been dull in all recent starts, including a listless rail-trip 4th at this level in last, yet he has a TMR of 77.06 (the highest in the race!)...Hello?

Don't bettors and horsemen deserve an explanation of how these figures are calculated?

With transparency being the underpinning of the information age, how about a Q&A with TrackMaster, or an interview with a race secretary or horseman whose racing opportunities are now being dictated by the TMR rating system? If there's genius behind it, great, tell us all about it. If it's deeply flawed and without merit, it should be exposed for what it is.
