Brad Forward Moving Forward In His Life And Career

It has been more than six months since he returned to actively racing since he was fully exonerated for an offence that nearly ruined his career and his life, and it has been anything but easy for Brad Forward, the onetime

dash-winning driver in Canada.

Forward has battled injuries and a ban by the biggest racing organization in Ontario to let him drive on its tracks, but he is taking it day by day, hoping to return to the glory days before everything fell apart.

"It's great being back doing what you love to do," he told Harness Racing Update in an exclusive interview. "To be away from it for so long, it seems like your life was just stripped from you. I look at it completely different now that I'm back driving. I love driving. I always did. I'm pretty happy to

get my life back. This was my life. This was all I ever did. To have it stripped from me just tore me apart."

The 41-year-old native Newfoundlander led Canada drivers in wins in 2008 with 582 and placed in the top-10 in earnings with a career-best \$3.9 million, doing it almost exclusively on the B circuit. It had been the third consecutive year he topped \$3 million in earnings.

He kept up the pace the following season with 516 wins, placing second to Jody Jamieson, who recorded a Canadian record 787 victories, and again eclipsed the \$3 million mark. He also represented Canada in the World Driving Championships in Norway. He also led all drivers in the Ontario Sires Stakes program for the second consecutive year. He finished runnerup to Jamieson in the voting for Canada's top driver award.

"I was really on top of my game," he said. "It's hard to explain when you are. It's almost like you can't make a wrong move. To be nominated for an O'Brien Award is just unbelievable."

He had won more than 4,000 races and in excess of \$24 million in purses when his career came to a grinding halt early in September, 2010 when he and two other drivers, Gene Piroski and Kevin Wallis, were fined and suspended

after an investigation by the Ontario Racing Commission. The drivers were alleged to have conspired to affect the outcome of races at Windsor Raceway. Forward, leading the nation in wins that year, received a five-year suspension and a \$5,000 fine. Plroski received 10 years and a \$100,000 fine, while Wallis received 12 years and a \$100,000 fine.

In the aftermath of the suspension, Forward returned home to Newfoundland and didn't leave his room for two months, refusing to speak to people, even the ones who reached out to him to offer support. His marriage fell apart and he lapsed into a deep depression and required medication.

"To me it was just devastation from what (the ORC) did," he said. "It was like, 'who's going to believe me? Nobody's going to believe me.' They're going to think 'here you are, you've been convicted of something, you cheated.' So I just walked away from it. Everything just seemed to get worse and worse. There were times I thought I was never going to get out of this slump that I was in. I really didn't. I just expected the worse for everything. I just didn't have that get-up-and-go anymore."

In 2005, he received a suspension from the ORC for testing positive and had to spend time in rehab. He turned



his life around and focused on his career. And then five years later he had to face the prospect of losing it all, or at least having it shut down for several years.

"There were some dark days," he said. "I just couldn't deal with what was going on in my life between losing my family, losing my career. Everything I always wanted to do was drive horses and here I had that taken away from me."

Forward's brother, Scott, did his best to lift his spirits, telling him God works in mysterious ways.

"I was thinking it is funny the way it works. I don't understand," Forward said. "I know if I did something wrong, by all means. But I know I'm a good person. I know what I had done in my career. I admitted to my faults. I knew the things they accused me of were not true. It didn't happen. But here you are getting accused of something by high people. I felt like I was at a losing point."

His three daughters - Katelyn, 17, Melissa, 14, and Jessica, 10 - meant the world to him, so he had to refocus. He worked two jobs to make money and gradually started to put his life back in order.

The ORC cleared Piroski and Wallis six months after the original charges, but it took six months longer for Forward to be exonerated. It wasn't until the fall that he received his license to race again. By that point, he had almost considered quitting.

"I owe my Mom and Dad a lot," he recalled. "They said, 'This is what you always wanted. This is what you were good at. Go back and do it. You're miserable here.' It took some encouragement from them. It was tough. It really was. It's just the way I am. I felt everybody's going to look at me and I'm going to have trouble getting drives. I was really doubting myself. I knocked myself. I was my worst enemy. Everybody else had faith in me and believed in me."

His emotional ties to his children actually made him return home when he attempted to leave to return to Ontario.

"I hated to leave," he said. "I'm very soft. I broke down. I was in tears. I'm really close with my kids. Having to leave them was the hardest thing. Not too many people know this."

Forward, the most accomplished horsemen in a long line of family members and relatives, drove some of his brother's horses back home to prepare himself for his return. On December 1, 2012, 16 months after the ORC laid its charges, Forward returned to racing, driving at Georgian Downs in Barrie, Ontario. In his fourth of seven drives, he won his first race. Later that day, he drove in seven races at Flamboro Downs in Dundas and won his second race.

"To get those couple wins was phenomenal," he said. "It was very exciting because it's a struggle. I was thinking 'I don't got it. I think I've lost it.' It just didn't feel right being out for so long. Being off that long you've got it all in your head, but getting back out there physically it took awhile and even now I'm not to where I was when I left it in 2010. You don't realize how sharp some of these drivers are. It's coming back, but I'm not where I was."

Six weeks into his return, he suffered a broken ankle in a racing mishap that sidelined him for three months and left him wondering again about his circumstances. Not long after his return, he found himself in another accident, this time breaking a rib. But he refused to take time off.

On May 19, he won six consecutive races and seven

overall at Rideau-Carleton Raceway in Ottawa. A week later, he won five races on a card. He used to repeatedly win in bunches.

"Now it's like a snowball," he said. "Things are rolling together good. I'm getting good drives. I'm getting live mounts (from) good trainers. The horsemen were totally behind me. I'd be lost without them. I really would. Without them I wouldn't have anything. I'm very grateful for that. They've always supported me. When I did come back, just to see the support I got was phenomenal. When I was coming back, some of the trainers called me and (listed him) to drive. Once you showed up at the tracks, eventually more and more trainers starting (hiring him). It was just a matter of showing up and I just picked up as I went along."

In 505 races this year, he had 92 wins, 61 seconds and 63 thirds and purse earnings of \$428,139. He is hoping for bigger and better things, but has some challenges ahead. Woodbine Entertainment Group, which owns and operates Woodbine and Mohawk, is refusing to allow him to drive at those tracks, despite trainers listing him for races. A WEG spokesman did not want to comment on the matter.

So Forward is racing at B tracks, sometimes twice in a day, including Rideau-Carleton, which is a five-hour drive from where he is residing. His cousin, trainer Gary McDonald, who is based at Rideau-Carleton, told him he'd let him drive all his horses when he returned.



Mohawk, winning by nine lengths in 1:57.1 "We weren't looking to go any faster," trainer Dustin Jones said. "We were just looking to get some work into him. He went to the half in 59.3 and finished the last half in 57.3 and the last quarter in 28 and he wasn't even blowing afterwards." Jones said the colt will have one more qualifier before he goes in his first pari-mutuel race of the year. Jones is hoping the Mohawk racing department will put together a race that Wheeling N Dealing is eligible for during the first week in July. After that, he will either go in the Dancer at the Meadowlands or in a July 18 Pennsylvania Sire Stakes race at Chester. "Whether he goes to the Dancer or to Chester, we're going to play it by ear," Jones said. "Right now everything is good, everything is right where we want it to be. He's in great shape, is eating good and stayed healthy all winter." Murmur Hanover, who was third in last year's Breeders Crown, appeared in the same Wednesday qualifier at Mohawk, finishing a well-beaten third. He crossed the wire 10 1/4 lengths behind Wheeling N Dealin. He's been moved into the barn of trainer Normand Bardier Jr....He just cracked HRU's Top 12 on the Road to the Hambletonian, but keep an eye out for E L Rocket, who goes in a C-1 trot Friday night at the Meadowlands. The Credit Winner colt made his first start for trainer Ron Burke last Friday and the improvement was off the charts. He won a non-winners of two at the Meadowlands in a sparkling 1:53.2. The prior trainer is Riina Rekila... As expected, the \$225,276 Goodtimes at Mohawk had virtually no bearing on the Hambletonian picture.

None of the top three finishers, **Flanagan Memory**, **Toocool Forschool** or **Gotta Secret** are Hambletonian eligible...There will likely be a game of musical drivers after the Beal elims Saturday at Pocono as Tim Tetrick may have to choose between top contenders **Smilin Eli** and **Royalty For Life**. Dave Miller has **Jurgen Hanover** and **Corky** and Yannick Gingras is the driver of both **High Bridge** and **Dontyouforgetit**.

"I'm going to keep going there for as long as I can because I'm not going to forget what the people have done for me," he said. "Growing up I didn't have any education. All I did was work construction and work at my family's restaurant, but in my heart all I ever wanted to do was drive and I couldn't believe my dream came true and then it got taken away

"Now I'm back again and I'm determined no one's ever going to take it away again. I'm not to the point of where I was, but I can feel it every day. I'm coming back to the driver that I was. The night I had five wins it brought tears to my eyes. I was extremely happy.

"I lost faith in everything," he added in reference to what happened to him following the suspension. "I lost faith not just in myself and the system, but I lost faith in God. I lost total faith. It's good to have that back. It really is. Without that you're a cold person. The people around me helped get it back for me. I'm very fortunate my kids are healthy, my family is healthy and things could be a lot worse. I think it made me a stronger person and I understand things a lot more. I pray every day."

"They scoped him and said he's pretty much healed," Hans said. "About all he needs now is two more weeks."



Racehorse Drug Testing Gets A Boost From Multiple Donations To Penn Vet's New Bolton Center

Three prominent horsemen's organizations have provided over \$700,000 in equipment and supplies for research that is already well underway.

Kennett Square, PA—Advanced equipment and supplies recently donated by leading horsemen's organizations have given the New Bolton Center at the University of Pennsylvania School of Veterinary Medicine a powerful forensic research tool for the development of innovative racehorse drug testing protocols.

The Pennsylvania Harness Horsemen's Association (PHHA), a trade group that represents industry participants at eastern Pennsylvania's harness racing tracks, donated approximately \$470,000 to purchase a mass spectrometer. This state-of-the-art equipment is highly sensitive, allowing staffers to research protein-based drugs and

peptides, and develop methods to better detect, identify and characterize medications that can enhance performance

and/or cause potential harm to the health, welfare and safety of equine athletes. It is capable of analyzing changes in proteins that may be related to the administration of drugs and shock wave therapy.

"Plain and simple, we want a clean sport," said Sam Beegle, president of the PHHA. "This grant is part of our ongoing investments to ensure a level playing field, and keep horses healthy and safe."

In addition, two other prominent horsemen's organizations will provide hundreds of thousands of dollars in software, supplies and accessories for the research project. The Meadows Standardbred Owners Association (MSOA), which represents horsemen at The Meadows Racetrack & Casino near Pittsburgh, and the Pennsylvania Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, which provides services for horsemen at both Penn National in Grantville and Presque Isle Downs in Erie, have so far contributed over \$250,000 for the same goal.

New Bolton Center's Dr. Lawrence Soma said that while instances of positive drug tests are relatively low, the forensic laboratory can only test for known substances. "It's a moving target because new medications are constantly coming into use. These gifts are an essential part of our efforts to stay ahead of the curve."

In just a few short months since the equipment has been in use, researchers have made significant progress on multiple fronts. For example, studies are near completion to determine if the hemoglobin of the equine is altered by



the administration of Inositol tripyrophosphate (ITTP), which can make oxygen more readily available to working muscles and potentially enhance performance. Research is also well underway into detecting the prohibited use of non-drug therapies and naturally-occurring substances.

Racehorses are tested for prohibited substances under the Peterson. "These decreases will impact horse racing and authority of the Pennsylvania Harness and Horse Racing Commissions, which also employ a team of on-site investigators at each state racetrack. Samples are sent to the Equine Toxicology and Research Laboratory (PETRL) under the direction of Dr. Cornelius Uboh for analysis. Positive test results are reported to the Commissions for enforcement. Repeat offenses and certain types of infractions can result in an individual being banned from competition.

The cooperative program between New Bolton Center and PETRL has been ongoing for many years. It brings together veterinarians, chemists, molecular biologists and technicians engaged in an advanced drug research and state-of-the-art forensic program.

Collaboration between the New Bolton Center and PHHA dates back to the 1980s. Previous gifts have contributed to the development of a pre-race cardiovascular monitoring protocol, development of new drug testing protocols and a comprehensive set of guidelines for administering therapeutic medications to equine athletes.

"We're very pleased to contribute," said Richard Gillock, president of the MSOA. "The importance of these efforts for our sport cannot be overstated.'

Slots Revenue at Pa Racetrack Casinos Falls 2.8 Percent in May

Fund that supports live horse racing and breeding in Pennsylvania will take in about \$16 million less than last year

HARRISBURG, **PA** – Warmer temperatures and the beginning of the summer race season were not enough to stave off the continued downward trend in racetrack casino slots revenues as another 2.8 percent decline was reported for the month of May, compared to the same month in 2012. The decrease in slots revenue caused funding for the state's Race Horse Development Fund -- which supports live horseracing and breeding in the state -- to decrease by approximately \$650,000 for the month of May compared to last vear.

"Although the declines in revenue for May was slightly lower than previous months, we have seen steady declines for the Race Horse Development Fund in 10 of the past 11 months," said Pete Peterson, spokesperson for the Pennsylvania Equine Coalition. "This downward trend is very real and has major repercussions for horse racing in the state of Pennsylvania as competition from neighboring states continues to eat away at overall revenue."

The Pennsylvania Equine Coalition projects that funds to the Race Horse Development Fund – which are based on the performance of slots revenue at the state's racetrack casinos – will fall approximately \$15 million short of the Governor's revised FY 2013-14 budget projections, and \$26

million short of initial projections made by the Governor during the state budgeting process in February.

"It is clear that competition from neighboring states is negatively impacting revenues for Pennsylvania's racetrack casinos and will continue to do so," said breeding industry in Pennsylvania, forcing cuts in purses and breeders incentives. Given the hit we are already taking from increased competition, the budget proposal to divert \$31 million from the fund could drive small businesses out of Pennsylvania to other states that offer more attractive purses and incentives."

The Pennsylvania legislature legalized casino gaming in the state as part of an effort to save and revitalize the horse racing and breeding industry, and it succeeded. According to the Department of Agriculture, as a result of casino gaming, the economic impact of the racing industry in Pennsylvania more than quadrupled and employment tripled from 13,870 to more than 41,100.

Pennsylvania has been a success story, a model for other states," continued Peterson. "Recent wins by PA-bred horses during the Kentucky Derby weekend have caused the racing industry to take notice of the tremendous strides made in Pennsylvania. With every win in the national racing spotlight, our state attracts new interest by owners, trainers and breeders looking to find the most favorable conditions to grow and prosper. If the RHDF becomes a pool of money that can be dipped into by state government to fund other government programs, going to invest in Pennsylvania. That in turn will have a ripple effect on the farmers who produce feed, veterinarians and others who care for the horses, and small businesses that sell supplies. Horse racing is in an industry that needs to be nurtured in Pennsylvania, because it is the horses themselves that are the economic engines and job creators."

son of Revenue, will step up to the starting line in the tenth race on Friday night (June 21) at the Meadowlands, facing nine others in the \$50,000 TVG/Meadowlands Free For All Trot.

Points will be earned in the event, along with other designated races, to determine who advances to the

\$500,000 final on Nov. 30 at the Meadowlands.

Market Share, driven by Tim Tetrick and trained by Linda Toscano, won the 2012 Hambletonian on his way to 3-year-old Trotting Colt of the Year honors. This will be his

second start of the year. He won his 2013 debut on May 31 in 1:51.1.

Coupled in the wagering with Wishing Stone, the winner of last month's Maxie Lee at Harrah's Philadelphia, Market Share is rated the 8-5 favorite from post eight. Lifetime, Market Share has 16 wins, five seconds and three thirds from 26 starts for a bankroll of \$2,052,655.

There are no soft spots in the line-up which also includes the Jimmy Takter-trained duo of Uncle Peter and Guccio, Cutler winner Sevruga, Undercover Strike, Big Sky Storm, Knows Nothing, Another Amaretto and Arch Madness, recently returned from finishing second in the Elitlopp in Sweden.

The Friday night card also includes a pair of \$22,700 finals -- the Flower Child for trotters and the Cathedra Dot Com for pacing mares -- and a semi-final of the Summer Survivor Series.

For fans of camel and ostrich racing, those events will be presented between live harness races on Saturday (June 22).



Pennsylvania Horsemen Want to Clean Up Their Game

Adhering to a code of Omerta that is part of the racetrack culture, honest horsemen have traditionally had very little to say about dishonest horsemen. Nor have they done much of anything to help clean up the game. Which is inexplicable. When a horse hopped up on something a lot stronger than hay, oats and water wins a race the guys who play by the rules and finished second or worse are literally robbed. When the game is not on the level no one—not gamblers, not track management, not drivers—is harmed more than honest trainers and owners.

Which is why it is so refreshing to see that three horsemen's associations, two of which represent harness horsemen, have gotten together and donated \$700,000 for the Pennsylvania drug testing lab to purchase equipment. The Pennsylvania authorities used the money to buy a machine that will make it easier for them to detect illegal substances in horses and catch someone when they use shockwave therapy within seven days of a race, which is prohibited.

"Plain and simple, we want a clean sport," said Sam Beegle, president of the PHHA. "This grant is part of our ongoing investments to ensure a level playing field, and keep horses healthy and safe."

The PHHA (Pennsylvania Harness Horsemen's Association) donated \$470,000 for the machine and the rest of the money came from the Meadows Standardbred Owners Association and the group representing thoroughbred horsemen at Penn National and Presque Isle Downs.

What's particularly interesting about the new equipment, a

mass spectrometer, is that the machine is a tool that could prove to be invaluable and make it much harder to get away with illegal doping. Racing's game of cops and robbers is too often won by the robbers because there are always new drugs out there that are, for a number of reasons, undetectable.

In Pennsylvania they are working on a new paradigm. Because they know standard blood and urine tests will not catch a lot of what is out there they are developing methods to detect changes in the horse's bodies that can only be caused by the use of illegal substances. Drugs do



more than make a horse race faster; they can cause changes in the horse's DNA or the proteins in the body. Human sports, and in particular bicycling, are using similar methods to catch cheaters. Find these changes in the bodies of the horse or the Tour de France rider and you have, for all practical purposes, found the use of illegal drugs.

The machine donated by Pennsylvania horsemen is being used for just this purpose. They have a ways to go before perfecting their work, but thanks to the horsemen the scientist working in the Pennsylvania lab have a tool at their disposal that could represent a major breakthrough in the fight to level the playing field.

"If you don't have any imagination, if you don't say listen we are going to try this, it is an approach and it may take two or there years to go down this path the you risk never making the sort of advances we need to make," said Dr. Lawrence Soma, who, along with Dr. Cornelius Uboh, heads the equine drug testing program in Pennsylvania.

There's not a drug testing lab in the country that wouldn't want or doesn't need this particular equipment. Because equine drug testing is a low priority for most states most labs don't have the money to buy such sophisticated equipment. If not for the horsemen's associations, Pennsylvania wouldn't have, either.

The irony is that while Pennsylvania has gone to the trouble to have arguably the best drug testing lab in the country it's the same state that is far too lenient when it comes to licensing miscreants. Unless you're Walter Case Jr., who has never cheated in a race in his life, you cannot not get licensed in Pennsylvania, no matter how egregious your offenses might have been.

That's another issue the harness horsemen in the state should attack, convincing the commission and racetrack managements to keep out those who have lost the right to participate in the sport. They owe that to the vast majority of their memberships, people who work hard and play the game right. But that's a complaint for another day.

The PHHA and MSOA stepped up, came up with a lot of money and has helped it easier for every honest guy in the game to win races. They have taken up a cause that every honest person in harness racing should rally around, and they are to be commended.

Race 8, N/W 2 Trot

RARING TO GO S jogged here two back to begin her sophomore campaign and won over this track last year as a 2-year-old in 1:55:4. This one broke last out in her Elegantimage elimination but that 1:53 mile clocking might have been a bit too quick for her anyway. A square priced threat for top trotting barn. AMALFI COAST broke in all three of her recent NJSS engagements here which isn't good, but on her best she can go with these. Should still be respected from out of the Sylvester barn. MISS STEELE is an obvious short priced threat for Andy and Julie as the class of the field; sneaks in here under the NW 3 condition for fillies. KEGLAR HANOVER went a good looking qualifier here two back; I could see him taking some action.

Race 9. F&M B/2-B/1 Pace

BULLET POINT has fired in nearly every start since arriving in these parts a couple months ago from Canada and has proven herself to be a serious threat against these types. This one showed speed in her recent Yonkers Open won by Krispy Apple and any number of her miles here from May would be good enough. ABROKENART HANOVER picks up Gingras after an arduous trip last out; likely to be leaving early. MAJOR LOOK drops after racing against the FFA mares but I'll note she failed in similar spots here many times in May; P4 will pay out well if this one doesn't win. ODDS ON AVENTURE was a sneaky play last week in these pages and ran a good second at 13/1; now makes her second start back while drawing well. HULA'S Z TAM has class from the

SEVRUGA was overlooked here in the Cutler final and will rightfully so offer another similar square price should he manage to step up and surprise once again.
