Arguing Gural is Inconsistent With His Edicts, Chris Oakes' Attorney Fighting to Get Trainer's Horses Cleared to Race at Meadowlands By Bill Finley

The owners of the mares Classic Martine and Frau Blucher have been informed that their horses will not be allowed to participate in any races at tracks owned by Jeff Gural unless they remove the horse from Chris Oakes' stable. The ownership groups, which, in both cases, include Oakes' wife Sue, have refused to do so.

Up until this year, Oakes was banned from overnight races at the Gural tracks but was allowed to participate in



races that involved staking payments. But when Oakes was hit with a positive for the Class 3 drug Tripelennamine late last year by the Pennsylvania Harness Commission Gural extended the ban to all races.

Trainer Chris Oakes wants to be able to race at the Meadowlands

Howard Taylor, the attorney representing Oakes and his owners,

is basing his argument for a reversal of the decision on his belief that Gural makes up his rules as he goes along. He said two examples of that are his decision to allow Bob Bongiorno to race at the Meadowlands and the fact that Oakes-trainee Luck Be Withyou has been allowed to compete in the Graduate Series at the Gural-owned tracks, which are Vernon Downs, Tioga Downs and the Meadowlands.

"The inconsistency is unbelievable," Taylor said. "These are two great mares and he won't let them race. How do you pick and choose what horses can race and which ones cannot? Could it be that Jeff owns a horse in that class?"

Gural was the co-owner of top trotting mare Perfect Alliance, who has since been retired.

Gural countered that the only reason Luck Be Withyou, who is owned by John Craig, was allowed to race in the Graduate is because the racing office mistakenly accepted the entry.

"My race office people just missed it," Gural said. "I picked it up and asked the racing office what happened. They said that they had just made a mistake, just missed it. I thought it would look foolish to go back and tell the owner that he had to change trainers after we had already allowed Chris Oakes to race the horse. I basically made a decision that we screwed up and once we screwed up the best thing to do was to move on and allow that horse to race. I'm sorry we made a mistake and allowed the first horse to race but that doesn't mean I have to allow all the horses to race."

Taylor also argued that trainer Bob Bongiorno, who also had a positive in Pennsylvania, was being treated differently than Oakes. Gural has not banned Bongiorno, saying that he will not take any action against the trainer while his case is on appeal to the Pennsylvania commission. Oakes' suspension, Taylor notes, is also under appeal.

"I find it curious that Mr. Gural would then take this position with Chris Oakes that he has stated," Taylor wrote in a letter to attorney Marvin Newberg, who is representing Gural in the matter. "Mr. Oakes has also filed an appeal in Pennsylvania for a positive that is equally benign to that issued to Mr. Bongiorno. It is clear that either Mr. Bongiorno IS receiving special treatment, or in the alternative that Mr. Oakes is being singled out for reasons not made clear."

"I have taken a lot of criticism about the the Bongiorno case," Gural admitted. "I met with Boingiorno and I asked (investigator) Brice (Cote) to investigate, as well, and we came to the conclusion that we would wait until after the appeal has run its course to make a decision. It's interesting how much criticism I have received and maybe that's because his daughter works for us and his son drives at our

tracks, and I understand that. I can assure your Mr. Bongiorno is not going to get any special treatment and if he loses his appeal he can expect not to be allowed to participate at the Meadowlands for a while."

With there being few lucrative opportunities out there for older trotting mares, the Gural ban could prove to be costly for the Oakes horses. They will not be allowed to compete in such rich races as the Aug. 8, \$175,000 Fresh Yankee at the Meadowlands, the Aug. 21, \$175,000 Muscle Hill at Vernon Downs and the TVG series races.

Taylor said he would do whatever it takes to get the two Oakes trotters cleared to race at Gural's tracks.

"I believe that I do have grounds for a lawsuit as Chris has been allowed to race pay-ins at all Gural tracks," Taylor said. "I don't believe that Gural can justify his position in court and am willing to test the waters."

Gural continues to argue that the sport must clean up its act in order to prosper and pointed to the case of Traceur Hanover to help make his point. After the horse won a Breeders Crown race last year at the Meadowlands he tested positive for cobalt for trainer Corey Johnson. Since the incident the horse was turned over to trainer Normand Bardier Jr. and has been unplaced in all three starts this year.

"Nobody is commenting on Traceur Hanover," Gural said. "He was the 2-year-old Breeders Crown champion when he tested positive for cobalt after winning that race and with a new trainer and, I assume not using cobalt and whatever else they might have been using, seems to be a pretty mediocre horse. Our position is the correct one. It's not fair that this horse won the Breeders Crown and, now, mysteriously is uncompetitive.

"People can say whatever they want. The reality is I can't fill our races. It would be a lot easier to let the drug guys race and a lot of people say I should. It's costing me a lot of money to have these short fields, but I feel that any owner who feels it's ok to put God knows what in their horses in order to win a race has no place in this sport."

No Jug for Wakizashi Hanover

Currently regarded as the top 3-year-old male pacer in North America after his win in the North America Cup,

Wakizashi Hanover will not compete in the Little Brown Jug, reports one of his co-owners, Bruce Kennedy. The Dragon Again gelding was not staked to the Jug but North America Cup winners are allowed to supplement into the field for the cost of \$45,000. "If we were lightly

staked we'd probably

entertain the idea of going to the Jug," Kennedy said. "But we're going to follow through with the original schedule we set for him, which is pretty grueling. We appreciate their offer and their interest.

"The \$45,000 price didn't have anything to do with it. The boys said we made the decision for a reason and the reason hasn't changed. We love the Jug and the hype around it and the competitive aspect of it. We love all that. We don't frown on the half-mile track. That has nothing to do with it. We just picked our events and the Jug wasn't on the original list. We're happy with the way our schedule works for this horse and wee want to stick with it. We don't want to overdue things with this horse."

The good news for the Jug is that 123 horse remain eligible for the Sept. 24 race, a 19.4 percent increase over last year. Top names among those who are eligible include Artspeak, the 2015 Art Rooney Memorial champ In The Arsenal, Go Daddy Go, Lost For Words and Yankee Bounty.

Another top name who is not eligible is that of North America Cup second-place finisher Wiggle It Jiggleit.

We appreciate the understanding of our horsemen with this situation which should be seen as a positive as everyone associated with Plainridge Park Casino benefits from this successful opening."

Plainridge will also adjust post times for the Wednesday July 1st and Thursday July 2nd cards to 11:00 A.M.

Racing Commission Establishes New PA Classic Races, Boosts Purses for Sire Stakes Finals Press Release

Pennsylvania invests an additional \$1.6 million in harness racing industry

Harrisburg, PA – A \$1.6 million investment in



Pennsylvania's harness racing industry will boost purses that strengthen breeding programs and establish a prestigious stakes race, Agriculture Secretary Russell Redding announced today.

"Harness racing is a unique agritourism experience," said

Redding. "From the sport's tracks and fans to its breeding and training operations, it's an industry that provides an important \$92 million boost to our economy - and national bragging rights for our top horses, drivers and trainers."


The racing industry supports multiple facets of Pennsylvania's economy including agriculture, Redding added, as owners purchase goods from agribusinesses like hay and feed suppliers, equipment dealers and construction contractors. The industry attracts specialists like farriers and veterinarians and supports other local businesses. Pennsylvania's tracks, casinos and off-track wagering facilities offer multiple employment opportunities because of racing, from the horse barns to the betting halls. Harness racing also takes place at 15 agricultural fairs across Pennsylvania.

One half of these monies will be used to increase purses in the 2015 Pennsylvania Sire Stakes finals and consolation races. The Sire Stakes program rewards breeders of Pennsylvania-bred and Pennsylvania-owned stallions and broodmares. Each of the eight finals races will receive an additional \$90,000 in purse money, generating a total of \$350,000 for each race. The eight consolation races will receive an additional \$10,000 apiece for purse money, bringing the total for each of these eight contested trotting and pacing races to \$60,000.

"With this commitment, Pennsylvania makes our sire stakes finals and consolations the top races of their kind in the country," said Harness Racing Commission Chairman Jonathan Newman. "They're part of North America's top harness horse breeding program - all based here in Pennsylvania."

The other \$800,000 is earmarked for the newly-established 2016 Pennsylvania Classic for three-year-old pacers. The pair of Pennsylvania Classic races will be open to Pennsylvania-sired three-year-old pacing colts and fillies nationwide. Purses are an estimated

\$700,000 for the colt race and \$350,000 for the filly race. Pennsylvania's three harness racing tracks – The Meadows in Washington, Washington County; Harrah's Philadelphia in Chester, Delaware County; and Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs in Wilkes-Barre, Luzerne County – must submit advertising and promotional proposals for the opportunity to host the inaugural event. The commission will review the submissions and select the site for the 2016 event.

"These races will be among the top pacing events in the country and a source of pride for the commonwealth," Newman added. "These two races represent some of the highest purses in North America. I'm looking forward to working with one of our state's tracks to host our first-ever Pennsylvania Classics."

The added purse monies for these races are from the Pennsylvania Standardbred Breeders Development Fund, established by Act 71 of 2004, which directs a portion of slot revenue to incentivize raising, training and owning Standardbreds in Pennsylvania. This investment within the state's equine industry provides funding that is distributed to the owners of Pennsylvania stallions and broodmares who produce top-level horses that race worldwide.

Mr Picolit Ready for US Debut

Story and picture by Ken Weingartner, USTA Sebastian K does not make his 2015 racing debut for another 11 days, but trainer Ake Svanstedt has another

Swedish-born stakes-winner ready to go Friday at the

Meadowlands Racetrack. Mr Picolit, an 8-year-old male trotter who won the 2013 Copenhagen Cup, gets his first start in North America on Friday when he faces five rivals in the third round of the TVG Free For All Series for older trotters at the Big M.

He will start from post six with Svanstedt at the lines. The remainder of the field, in post order, is DW's NY

Yank, Melady's Monet, Master Of Law, Obrigado, and Flanagan Memory.

Mr Picolit, who is owned by Hans Gunnar Heed's Stall Musse Inc. and has earned \$533,949 (U.S.) in his career,

He is a son of 2001 Hambletonian winner Scarlet Knight, out of the mare Good Enough. Mr Picolit will become only the second Scarlet Knight-sired horse to ever race in North America, joining mare Oblige As, who won two of five starts in Canada in 2010.

"He feels good," Svanstedt said on Tuesday about Mr Picolit. "I think he can do a good race. I think he can race fast."

In Europe, Svanstedt said, Mr Picolit was best at distances greater than one mile, particularly 1-1/4 miles, which was the distance of the Copenhagen Cup. Svanstedt drove and trained Mr Picolit prior to moving his family and stable to the U.S. in the winter of 2013.

"In Sweden he did the best races at one mile and a quarter," Svanstedt said. "But he's fast too. If they go fast the whole race, it's good for him because he's a strong horse. In Sweden they go fast the first quarter, then (ease) up, and then go fast the last quarter. So at a mile, it was sometimes too fast for him in the last quarter."

Svanstedt hopes Mr Picolit has the ability to compete with the top trotters in North America, including his stablemate Sebastian K.

"We'll see on Friday," Svanstedt said. "He feels good when I train him so I hope he's going to do a good race. I'm excited."

Last year, Sebastian K won eight of 13 races and earned \$663,853 on his way to receiving the Dan Patch Award for best older male trotter. He trotted the fastest mile in history when he won in 1:49 at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono, which is where he will make his seasonal debut on July 4.

"He feels good; he feels even better than last year," Svanstedt said. "It is so nice to drive him. Everything he does is so easy."

SRF Takes the 4 and More

The Standardbred Retirement Foundation (SRF) was able to help keep the four Standardbreds and one more from shipping to the Canadian slaughterhouses, thanks to the help of good people.

Maclittlebullpass, West River Quota, Triple T Tara and Mattnipulator were all paid for and shipped to quarantine, Yankee Slammer was sent to a veterinary clinic for more extensive care. "Mattnipulator, 11 years old, was found in poor condition in an Amishman's barn and efforts were successful to include him. They all are marked with cuts scrapes and bites from being shipped through several sales and auctions and penned together. They are worn down, hungry, and thirsty as the shipper noted there was a deceased horse in the pen blocking access to water, a horse that was so bloated he may have been there for several days.

Their feet are long, cracking and all have heavy road shoes. Tara has an eye issue, 2 others have raw open wounds, Mattnipulator and Tara are in the worst shape and Yankee is yet to be seen by someone from SRF but is presently in good care. "The poor condition of these horses was not anticipated and help is still needed to provide what may be long term care. With their senior ages and unknown medical issues, it is unlikely they will be adopted," notes Tammy Hollock, of SRF. One hundred thirty seven are under SRF's full care; sponsors will be needed to help these to live out their lives.

My Mom, My Mentor, My Friend By Heather Vitale

(It was an emotional win for the family of Joann Looney King in the Pepsi North America Cup. A pioneering female in the sport who doesn't get many opportunities with top horses, she has done a terrific job with Wakizashi Hanover. A \$23,000 yearling buy, he is now arguably the top 3-yearold male pacer in the sport after his win over Wiggle It Jiggleit, a horse many thought was invincible. For her daughter, television personality and harness racing champion Heather Vitale, the win only added to the immense appreciation she has for her mother. Here is their story:)

Perception is a funny thing. It's just amazing how it changes as we get older. We live our lives questioning what our parents did and judging their decisions, but the minute we're put in the same situation, we do exactly the same thing as them.

I'm a 70's baby and while I was growing up it wasn't really common for households to have a mom who was also juggling a career, and it definitely wasn't the norm to have a mom who drove and

When you're a kid, you believe the world should revolve around your existence. It's hard to see the sacrifices

others are making for you, when hitting the mall on Friday night is the only thing you can think about. When I was younger, I couldn't understand why I was the only one of my friends doing their homework in the grandstand of the Meadowlands every night. This was so long ago that you had to be 12 years old to get in the gate. I was only 9 or 10 but I practiced my lie so convincingly they let me through.

When I would visit the hospital after a race accident whether it was a broken pelvis or a shattered elbow - and hear things like "it could've been so much worse" it was hard to grasp why my mom would continue to drive horses.

Once there was a time when a judge scratched my mother from the program at the last minute because a woman driving at his track was "a frivolous whim." I couldn't help but wonder was all this heartbreak worth it?

When my sister Susan and I would stand at the fence during a post parade, it wasn't uncommon for us to hear people yell stuff like "go back to the kitchen" at my mother. It really made me angry but, honestly, I think more at her than anyone. You know, because I was just a kid. I wanted my mom just to be like other moms.

In fact, one time I screamed at her, "Why can't you just have cookies for me when I get off the bus!" (Truth be known it wasn't something other kids' moms were doing. It's something I saw on a commercial. But, that didn't matter. When you're a kid and you want to make your parents feel badly, you say what seems required at the time.) The next day there they were ... freshly-baked chocolate chip cookies as I walked through the door.

She was dealing with what society didn't have a name for back then but is so familiar with today - Mommy Guilt. The difficult task of raising well-rounded children, while pursuing your own ventures in the workplace. She was trying her best to "bring home the bacon and fry it up in a pan." She actually was doing a great job. My sister and I were in sports, had lots of friends and took awesome vacations. But, that's not what I was focusing on. I had a kid mentality and the behavior to go with it. Meanwhile, she was throwing on a cape every morning juggling the love for her two daughters and the love for her career. Back then I didn't understand how hard she was trying to make it all balance, but these days I do.

I've got two kids of my own now, Wyatt (13) and Trey (7), and do I ever see things in a different light! The pursuit of being Super Woman is no easy task and, unlike my mom, I live in a day and age where it's common for a woman to be a mommy, as well as a business professional. So, knowing what I do today and going on to see my mother win the North America Cup with Wakizashi Hanover was totally surreal. Even as I write this days later, it still seems dream-like. My mom is 69 and I've watched her train horses my entire life. Just like me, she started going to the track when she was a little girl with my grandparents, Elmer and Helen Looney. When a childhood dream, becomes a reality, it can literally be unbelievable.

At Mohawk that night my mom wore my grandfather's ring, my son, Wyatt, wore his colors and I carried his handkerchief with me. So when my mom says, "This win is for my father," she's announcing that to the world with all the love in her heart.

However, it's also a win for the working moms, isn't it? It's a victory for the ladies who are trying to be present with their children and help their kiddos pursue goals, while they themselves are chasing dreams. It's for the moms who question themselves on a daily basis, if they are making the right decision by starting that business or taking that new job.

As I've gotten older and starting walking in my mom's shoes, I've become a very proud daughter. I'm having to make the same kinds of decisions she did and yes, my perspective is certainly different nowadays from when I was roller skating and playing with my Rubik's cube. While moms out there struggle constantly with work schedules and getting their kids to karate practice on time, there's peace in knowing that studies show happier moms whether they're in the workforce or not - raise happier kids. Period. Women often joke, "I'm turning into my mother!" However, most of us know deep down that's not such a bad thing, is it?
