Ten Questions That Will Be Answered Tonight at Pocono Downs

Pocono Downs will have what should be nothing less than a spectacular card of racing tonight as \$2 million will be up for grabs in six stakes races that drew many of the very best horses in the sport. At the end of the night we'll know not only who the winners are but the answers to many important questions.

1. How Good is Father Patrick? Since he's been beating

up on overmatched competition throughout the year and has been handled with kid gloves by trainer Jimmy Takter he simply hasn't faced a serious challenge in 2014. That will change in the Beal final as he'll have to beat stablemate Nuncio to get to the winner's circle, and that will be no easy task. Nuncio is the only horse to have ever beaten Father Patrick and he figures to get the better trip of the two since he drew Post 2 and Father Patrick drew the 8.

- 2. Is Foiled Again Finally Washed Up? Seeing how this isn't the first time that Foiled Again has gone through a slump it may be premature to stick a fork in him, even at age 10. Still, he has lost six straight and had no excuse when losing the final of the Levy series. He doesn't have to win tonight. In fact, it may be that no one can beat Sweet Lou. But he does need to show some life to justify Ron Burke's unwavering confidence in his ancient warrior.
- 3. Was Captaintreacherous' Loss Last Week A Fluke? Usually no one is going to get too upset when a horse loses an elimination race and loses by a nose. Then again, Captaintreacherous was beaten by a 29-1 shot in Domethatagain in the Ben Franklin elims and on paper his conqueror seemed to have little chance against The Captain. Like Foiled Again, Captaintreacherous doesn't have to win the race to earn respect, not out of the eight hole. But he needs to have a strong effort in order to convince everyone that he can be the No. 1 horse in his division this year.
- 4. Is Sebastian K Invincible? If they're ever going to beat this rocket out of Sweden tonight figures to the be the night. In his three starts this year Sebastian K has had the luxury of good draws on the one-mile track at the Meadowlands. Tonight in the Sun Invitational he shifts to a five-eighths mile track and must deal with the seven post and a competitor in Modern Family who looks like he's sitting on a monster effort. If Sebastian K wins tonight he is in every sense of the word a superstar.
- **5. How Many World Records Will Be Broken?** That's always a question any time class horses show up at Pocono

Downs, the fastest five-eighths mile track on the planet. The over-under is $3 \frac{1}{2}$.

- 6. Will the Hempt Winner Have the Goods to Beat JK Endofanera? Ron Burke did his competition a big favor by keeping North America Cup winner JK Endofanera on the sidelines for this one so that he can freshen him up for the Meadowlands Pace. The second and third-place finishers from the North America Cup are also sitting this one out. Whoever wins this race is going to have to look awfully good to frighten Burke.
- 7. Can Dancin Yankee Overcome The Loss of Super Trainer Josh Green? With all due respect to Amber Buter, she's got some huge shoes to fill having taken over for suspended trainer Josh Green. Green is the type that can get more out of a horse than would seem possible. Without Green pulling the strings can Dancin Yankee perform up to expectations in the USTA Invitational?
- 8. How Sweet is 'Lou?' How do you figure out this horse? At two, he looked like he was headed straight to the Hall of Fame. At three and four and through his first three starts this year he again looked like one of the biggest disappointments the sport has produced in a long time. But since May, when he was partnered with Ron Pierce, he's been a monster. If he wins tonight that may

9. Is It Time to Start Thinking Retirement for Arch Madness? While it's way, way too earlier to give up on



Will Arch Madness show signs of life tonight?

Foiled Again that may not be the case with Arch Madness, who goes in the Sun Invitational. Also 10, he is 0-for-6 this year while finishing in the money only once. In his last three starts he's lost by a

combined 22 lengths. Sure, he can probably still earn a decent amount of money this year, but he's too special to go out there every week and get embarrassed. Let's hope he's got something left in the tank and turns in a big effort tonight, but if not it might just be time to calls it quits.

10. Will Ron Burke Win in the Double Digits? That may be unlikely but not impossible. He has 20 horses entered on the card and will take part in 14 of the 16 races. He's got four in the Ben Franklin alone. Fifteen of his horses are 5-1 or less in the morning line.

BRETT STURMAN'S POCONO STAKES ANALYSIS

Race 9, \$300,000 James Lynch Final

The Lynch final for sophomore fillies kicks off the first of the four major stakes tonight and perhaps is the most wide open of them all. GALLIE BYTHE BEACH was much improved last week in her third start of the year and has a history going back to last year's Breeders Crown elimination win of doing good work over this track. Runner up to Precocious Beauty in last year's She's A Great Lady, this one set a quick clip in a solid front end try; guaranteed to take plenty of action off the 12/1 programmed line. UFFIZI HANOVER shined here when she took the Crown final last October and wasn't bad last week although she was clearly second best that night. She now moves all the way inside after having to be used early last week; the likely favorite for Takter and Miller. FANCY DESIRE blasted an overmatched field last week when Napolitano took her right down the road in 1:49; that's the second straight time she's gone a 1:49 mile with that driver in the bike. Chance for Nap to deliver a big stakes win. WEEPER was the other fast elimination winner last week and is almost guaranteed to be showing speed; may not have the easiest road to the top from out here. Selections: 7-4-1-8

Race 10, \$500,000 Max Hempt Final

MCWICKED heads the glamour division in tonight's Hempt final as squarely the one to beat for the team of trainer Casie

Coleman as driver Dave Miller. This one went a tough trip a couple races back in the North America Cup final at Mohawk before blowing the doors off his competition here last week in 1:48; looms a warranted short priced favorite.

LIMELIGHT BEACH had struggled in his first four starts of the year to find that

fast 2-year-old form from last year and his try from last week looked like a breakout performance. This one loses DM as expected to the top choice but gains Sears in the process; not out of the question to land a share if a few things break his way. SOMETIMES SAID tired a bit late last week after a first over journey but gave the top choice a good run three back in his NA Cup elimination; Campbell shines in big money situations like this. AT PRESS TIME and ALL BETS OFF were both elimination winners for Burke; Kakaley sticks with the latter and the former picks up Gingras. Both stablemates are capable should they be able to pull off similar pocket trips. Tetrick opts for STEVENSVILLE over ALLSTAR PARTNER; although the Butenschoen trainee picks up Callahan who regarded this one highly back in May. Selections: 3-9-4-5

Race 11, \$500,000 Ben Franklin Final

SWEET LOU has become quite a story in recent weeks as he's gone through a resurgence at age 5 that is reminiscent of the horse we all thought this one was going to be three years ago as a 2-year-old. Since returning in May and teaming up with a new driver in Pierce, this Burke trainee has been flat out monstrous and there probably isn't anyone in the FFA ranks right now that can touch him. If there's talk of a sub 1:50 mile earlier in the night from trotter Sebastian K, then there's a very real possibility that this one could crack in the 1:47 barrier on the pace. Interestingly enough it was about this time last year that Yannick Gingras actually opted for the top choice over fan favorite FOILED AGAIN and now the 10-year old is seeking his first win since April. The sport's poster child CAPTAINTREACHEROUS had a defeat pinned on him last week by an Allard pocket sitting longshot DOMETHATAGAIN but prior to that was super in his seasonal bow at the Meadowlands. He always puts up a gritty performance over this oval and will need all that plus the Tetrick magic from post 8. BOLT THE DUER was no match for the winner last week but always merits some consideration; SUNSHINE BEACH is yet to show anything in two starts this year and may be doomed by the post. Selections: 4-8-6-3

Race 12, \$500,000 Earl Beal Final FATHER PATRICK may soon get his chance to square off

against his upstart stablemate Trixton but in the meanwhile he looms the heavy favorite once again to beat many overmatched rivals in the Beal final for Yannick and Takter. While not necessarily flashy, this one has won his four starts on the year by 25 lengths and was an easy twolength winner in his elimination last week. He overcame post 9 last fall to win his Crown elimination so the post shouldn't matter much; his near flawless record should roll on. NUNCIO has chased the top choice throughout much of his year and he is responsible for that horse's lone career defeat. This one is unbeaten on the year since landing in the Takter barn over the winter and JC should have him in a striking position; chance to win if good enough. DATSYUK has burst onto the scene as an immensely talented colt in his own right; Explosive Matter gelding has now been second in his last pair to the top two standouts. He exits a game try and even with trainer/driver Charlie Norris behind the lines this one still might be good enough to pull off the upset. HARPER BLUE CHIP chased Father Patrick around the Pocono oval last week and if nothing else should at least be securing another good early position.

Bargain Basement Filly Looks to Win Again

Surely Alexander Rice Jr. is a genius. How else would you explain how he bought a stakes caliber filly at the yearling sales for a mere \$3,500?

"How'd I do it? Just got lucky, I guess," he said, shooting down our theory. "We always go to the sales looking for bargains and she was on our list. We looked her over and she was strong on the dam's side so we liked the pedigree. We never thought we'd get her for \$3,500 but when the hammer fell we had her."

Since the daughter of Art Official was bought for \$3,500 at Harrisburg she's done little wrong, winning six times and earning \$109,483. Her most important win to date came last week when she won an elimination for this race.

"We were tickled to death, but it was not like we didn't think she belonged," Rice said. "We raced against Uffizi Hanover a couple weeks prior in historic and she finished right with her."

Though beaten last week Uffizi Hanover will no doubt be the favorite as her overall resume is the best among any in this field.

"I think she will be better this week," said Uffizi Hanover's driver Dave Miller, "She had the outside last week and I decided to leave with her and she got used a little bit early. That's really not her style. This week, if I can get away close I think I'll be in good shape. She surprises us all the time."

Speedy Allstar Partner Among Those Who Can Win Wide-Open Hempt

His horse hasn't won all year but trainer John Butenschoen will come into the \$500,000 Hempt with a bit of confidence. That's the kind of race it is.

The 3-year-old male pacing division lacked a leader for most of the year and then when it found one in JK Endofanera that horse went to the sidelines for tonight's event. What's left is a wide-open group of horses, most of them trying to prove they have what it takes to win a race of this caliber.

Allstar Partner had a solid 2-year-old season but has

struggled this year, banking just \$33,414.

"I think we have a good shot in this race," Butenschoen said. "The horse has been really hampered by a bunch of bad luck this year. I his first five starts he drew the eight hole four out of five and last week he drew the seven.

"This is a wide open event. Unfortunately our horse doesn't have the money on his card we'd like. We're still looking for first win and it would be nice to get that here, especially for \$500,000. He beat lot of these horses last year at two; they just came back a little stronger. We still have a quality horse, a horse we like."

It may take some doing to defeat McWicked. He won al elimination race for the North America Cup and then finished fourth in the final after having a tough trip. He bounced right back to win a Hempt elim by 5 3/4 lengths.

Just when you thought you had heard the last of the Jeff Gural-Brian Sears fight a new chapter has unveiled itself. While doing his simulcast presentation last Saturday from Pocono Downs, George (The King) Anthony brought up Sears' banishment from the Meadowlands and made it

known that he thought track owner Jeff Gural was being unfair.

Gural responded to Anthony with a short but strong email that more or less told him to mind his own business. Anthony followed suit by sending Gural the following e-mail Dear Jeffrey,

I thought you were in Colorado on Saturday at a reunion so I was quite surprised that you were tuned in to the Pocono pre-race show. I would like you to know that my words spoken on the program were

representations of how I felt as a horsemen in response to you banning Brian Sears from participating at the Meadowlands. Had you not issued a rather public presentation of his banning without supporting reasoning there would have been no need for me to put forth anything on Saturday night.

By the time I spoke the Internet, twitter and Facebook were already having a field day commenting on you, but even more damaging, putting out accusations of "theoretical" misdeeds of Brian Sears. The fact is that when the Chairman of the Meadowlands issues a statement there is a large segment of the harness industry that believes what you are saying to be 100% accurate. There were many Internet postings that suggested that you had to have something on Sears.

In a country where the legal system allows you to be innocent until proven guilty, Sears never got a trial or even a hearing. Public opinion spread news rapid-fire and with it one man's reputation was smeared.

What I said as a horsemen was in defense of Brian Sears and his reputation, period.

I respect what you are trying to do with the Meadowlands and the hours and money that you have invested. At the same time you have to respect the rights of others, including myself when it comes to freedom of speech. I'm not always happy with the things you have to say, but this is America and you have your rights as I do.

Furthermore, I have reviewed the video tape many times which can be made available upon your request, we could meet in person, sit down together, view and talk about it. There was in no way shape or form, any intent to poke fun at anybody, as you stated in your recent letter. Sunshine Meadows to Host \$50,000 Race

Delray Beach, FL -- Harness racing "county fair style" is coming to Palm Beach County in Florida this September as the Sunshine Meadows Equestrian Village in Delray Beach will host two days of Sunshine Stakes racing on their one mile racetrack.

The elite equine training facility has reached an agreement with the Florida Standardbred Breeders and



Owners Association (FSBOA) to hold races for two and three-year-old state-bred trotters and pacers on Saturday, September 13 and Saturday, September 20.

Rain dates will be on the following Sunday.

"We are very excited that Sunshine Meadows has agreed to

host the two days of stakes races," said FSBOA executive director Joe Pennacchio. "We estimate that there will be in excess of \$50,000 in purse money over the two days of racing. It will be exciting as the management team at Sunshine Meadows is committed to making the two race days a county fair type atmosphere centered on the live racing."

Post time each day for the racing is set at 11:00 am. It is estimated that there will be from 10 to 11 races on each program.

"We are very excited about hosting these races," said Brandon Mills, general manager at Sunshine Meadows Equestrian Village. "It is an opportunity to show our great facility to the general public and to have a fun community event for everyone to attend."

There will be free parking and admission for the races. People are encouraged to bring their own lawn chairs as there is no grandstand or seating, only beautifully manicured lawns to watch from.

Parents and grandparents can bring the children as there will be pony rides, face painting and other children activities plus plenty of food vendors, arts and crafts and equine product displays.

"We are working to make this a very special event," Mills said. "Something that people can look forward to attending every year. So many people drive by and see our signs on

Josh Green Hit With 120-Day Suspension

Top trainer Josh Green has been suspended 120 days and fined \$4,000 by the Delaware Racing Commission after a horse of his tested positive for clenbuterol. The horse involved is Milky way Hanover who tested positive following a May 18 race at Harrington. Green has 48 days to appeal the ruling.

Trainer Andrew Glassmeyer may also be about to take a forced vacation. He's been suspended one-year and fined \$5,000 by the Pennsylvania Harness Commission after a horse he trained tested positive for the drug methylhexanamine following an April 25 race at Chester.

Bee A Magician, Royalty For Life, JK Endofanera Among Meadowlands Qualifier Winners

The stars were out yesterday morning at the Meadowlands as Horse of the Year Bee A Magician, Hambletonian winner Royalty Foe Life and North America Cup winner JK Endofanera were all winners during qualifying races at the Meadowlands.

Gearing up for the July 5 Meadowlands Maturity, Royalty For Life won by 5 ½ lengths in 1:53.2 for his new driver Dave Miller. In the July 5 he's expected to meet Bee A Magician, who won her qualifier by 15 3/4 lengths in 1:53.1. JK Endofanera, who is Meadowlands Pace bound, won in 1:51.

The card included seven 2-year-old races and as usual they were dominated by Jimmy Takter, who won three. Takter may have still another star on his hands in baby race winner Canepa Hanover, a son of Cantab Hall by 18 3/4 lengths in 1:56.1.

French Laundry & Saturday Mornings Win NJSS Openers for 2yo Trotters

MANALAPAN, NJ – June 27, 2014 – French Laundry took the rest of the field to the cleaners, coasting to a five and three-quarter length victory in the \$39,000 opening round of the New Jersey Sires Stakes for two-year-old trotting colts and geldings, the first race on Friday, June 27, 2014 at the Meadowlands.

The Muscles Yankee colt, out of the Hambletonian Oaks winner Creamy Mimi, trotted the mile in 1:56 flat, equaling the stakes record set by Yankee Glide in 1996.

The 3-5 favorite, under a confident hand-drive by Yannick Gingras, won his pari-mutuel debut, paying \$3.20, following up on a two-for-two record in baby races. The Jimmy Takter

trainee was a \$115,000 Lexington Selected Sale purchase by Christina Takter of East Windsor, NJ and Ontario-based John Fielding, Jim Fielding, Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld.

In the battle for second, True Blue [Muscle Hill], with Tim Tetrick driving, got up and Broken Record [Muscles Yankee], with Ron Pierce, held on for third by nine lengths.

Saturday Mornings, driven by David Miller, collected top money in the \$38,500 New Jersey Sire Stakes for two-year-old trotting fillies in the fifth race.

It was a wire-to-wire effort for 6/5 Saturday Mornings [\$4.40] who trotted the mile in 1:57.2, finishing a length and three-quarters ahead of Demons N Diamonds. Southwind Cartier was third by two and three-quarter lengths.

Trained by Joe Holloway, Saturday Mornings was a \$32,000 Lexington Selected Sale yearling purchase for Bluestone Farms of Hopewell, NJ.

Mission Brief, the 4/5 favorite broke early and finished last.

All seven of the starters were daughters of Muscle Hill.

NJSS Pacing Divisions to Stacia Hanover, Dealt a Winner, Cashaway & Weapons Dealer by Carol Hodes (SBOANJ)

Stacia Hanover by Western Ideal popped out of the pocket in the stretch and out-sprinted the pacesetter The Show Returns for a half- length victory in the \$25,500 first

division of the New Jersey Sire Stakes for two-year-old pacing fillies in the third race.

Driven by Scott Zeron and trained by Steve Elliott, Stacia Hanover paced the mile in 1:59.1, with a last quarter in 25.4 seconds, after The Show Returns [Rocknroll Hanover], with Brian Sears driving, cut slow, unpressured fractions.

Rocknroll Allnight [Rocknroll Hanover], rough in the stretch, survived an inquiry, finishing third by nine lengths.

Stacia Hanover, sent off at 3-5, paid \$3.20. She was a \$35,000 Harrisburg Sale purchase for David Van Duse of Madison, OH and Michael Cimaglio of Lyndhurst, OH.

In the second \$25,500 filly pacing division, the 11th race. 3-5 Cashaway [\$3.40] held off challenges from Ideal Nuggets [Western Ideal] and Smart Zone [Rocknroll Hanover] to win in 1:55 flat.

Tim Tetrick guided Cashaway, a daughter of Western Ideal out of the proven producer CPA, to the neck victory with a half-length to Smart Zone in third.

Dealt A Winner [\$8.20] paced a New Jersey Sire Stakes record for two-year-old geldings when he stopped the clock in 1:52.4 in the ninth race, the \$27,000 first division for pacing colts and geldings.

David Miller brushed the Cam's Card Shark gelding from sixth to the lead down the backstretch, taking command from Western Pioneer, the 4/5 favorite, and would not be caught, winning by a length and a quarter.

Mr Censi [Cam's Card Shark] was four and a half lengths back in third.

Brett Miller was in the sulky for the victory.

Isaac Waxman trains for Brenda Waxman of Dundas, Ontario and Aaron Waxman of Burlington, Ontario, who acquired the White Birch Farm-bred colt for \$10,000 at the Harrisburg Sale.

Wishing Stone, back in training after a busy breeding season, won his 2014 debut in Friday night's sixth race classified trot.

Wishing Stone stood as a stallion at Deo Volente Farms in New Jersey, fulfilling contracts for 331 doses of frozen semen overseas as well as being bred to some 30 mares in

North America.

The double-millionaire scored a half-length victory over Undercover Strike in 1:52.4. Yannick Gingras was at the lines of the Ron Burke trainee who campaigns for the Wishing Stone Syndicate of Flemington, NJ.

Seven-year-old Wishing Stone picked up his 22nd career victory in 70 starts.

The Ms. Hot To Trot Competition was well-received as usual, and those that came out to the track were just as interested in putting some money through the windows as on track handle yielded gains of nearly 10-percent.

HAMBURG, NY -Murder He Wrote registered a giant shocker at Buffalo Raceway Friday night as he rallied in deep stretch to pull off the \$92.50 upset in the \$60,200 first division of the New York Sire Stakes for 3-year-old pacing colts and geldings. Murder He

Wrote went the mile in 1:53.4, the fastest time of the season at the Hamburg half-mile oval.

In the second \$60,200 division, things were much calmer as Western Conquest (Brent Holland) held off I'm All Heart (Matt Kakaley) by a neck in 1:53.4, the same as the first leg. The track record will remain for the time being of 1:52.3 set by Steelehead Hanover in 2012.

Former Western New York regular Jeff Gregory was extremely pleased in getting Murder He Wrote to the finish line first. "It was a special win tonight because Linda Toscano owns and bred this horse. He is a home bred."

Moliere Hanover (Jim Morrill Jr.) put up the grueling fractions of 27.2, 56.0 and 1:24.4. Those times were a perfect recipe for the the closers. Murder He Wrote showed the best kick in the stretch and beat a hard-charging Neat (Holland) by a neck. Moliere Hanover was extremely game and held on for third.

The 2-3-6 trifecta combination returned \$3738.50 for a mere buck.

Murder He Wrote (Kenneth J-JK Dancing Queen) is owned by the Camelot Stable. It was his second victory of the season and pushed his earnings to \$43,010 and \$97,845 lifetime.

In the second division, Western Conquest (\$5.90) managed to grab the top just before the guarter marker and re-inherited the lead past the half as the first over Ideal Cowboy made a brief bobble. After that, it was a matter of battling any challengers in the stretch and I'm All Heart (Kakaley) tried but came up a mere neck short.

"They were really smoking into the first turn," Holland

said of the start with Western Conquest. "Coming down the stretch, he really hung in there and was really fast and good tonight."

Owned by Tanah Merah Farms and trained by Erv Miller, Western Conquest (American Ideal-Aries Conquest) has now won three times in seven starts in 2014, bankrolling \$98,300 and \$152,313 in his career.

In the Excelsior A Series worth \$12,500 each, Cabbie's Delight (Morrill) took the first leg in 1:55.2 and returned \$2.20 while Goldin Parachute (Kakaley) used the passing lane late to post a 1:56.2 win. The victory was worth \$13.60 to his backers.

The Excelsior B Series, which had a purse of \$6,500 each, saw American Force (Gregory) cover the mile in 1:57.1 and return \$10.60 while in the second leg, Mark MacDonald steered Diabando to a \$7.30 victory in 1:57.1.

It was home sweet home for Lutetium as he returned to Buffalo Raceway after a two-week journey to Vernon and Tioga Downs and went wire-to-wire again for driver Kevin Cummings in the \$10,500 Open Trot. Lutetium went the mile in 1:58 and returned \$4.10. He is owned by Colleen Girdlestone and trained by Mark Laidlaw.
