A Young Star (Captaintreacherous), And Old Star (Foiled Again) Highlight Action at Pocono

A sophomore pacing colt and an old, hard-knocking gelded pacer will be among the star-studded cast racing on the \$2 million Sun Stakes card on Saturday at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs.

Captaintreacherous (Somebeachsomewher e), a sensational three-year-old on the cusp of greatness, and Foiled Again (Dragon Again), a nine-year-old whose limits know no bounds, will each try to add to their reputations in separate races.

Captaintreacherous heads the \$500,000

Max C. Hempt for three-year-olds, looking to win his fifth race in as many starts this season. Last year's champion two-year-old pacing colt in the U.S. and Canada, Captaintreacherous is looking for his second major stakes win this year. He won the \$1 million North America Cup with a mark of 1:48.3, parked with cover for a good part of the race but tipping out in the stretch and finishing strongly. He came back a week later to win his elimination, albeit by only a neck after leading by 1½ lengths at the top of the stretch, with regular driver Tim Tetrick.

"He got a nice first half and was able to spread together back-to-back quarters in 26 and change," trainer Tony Alagna told Harness Racing Update. "He finished up his mile very well. He's a horse that doesn't get interested until another horse comes back at him. Tim said to me in the winner's circle 'he's going to win photo (finishes) a lot of times because he gets very relaxed on the front end.' That's one of those things that makes him a good horse - his versatility and how he relaxes on the front."

The Hempt final has a field of nine and Captaintreacherous drew furthest out, which will present a challenge.

"It's definitely not an ideal starting point," Alagna said.
"The horse is in good shape, I've got Tim driving him, so we're just going to hope for the best."

The son of Somebeachsomewhere out of the Artsplace mare Worldly Treasure sold for \$250,000 as a yearling and there were high hopes for him. He won eight of 10 races last year, losing by less than a combined length in his two losses. That he has come back and raced with such authority are indications he is reproducing his famous father's ability.

"I think the horse is definitely up to every challenge and my job training him is just to keep him healthy and happy and in good shape going into every race and let the horse and Tim Tetrick do what they need to get it done," Alagna said. "I think our horse comes into this race in good shape and I don't worry about the fact he's undefeated this year. It doesn't mean anything to me. People put a lot into it. I just want the horse to show up and perform at his best. Pressure is a funny word. I couldn't train this horse for a better group of owners (Captaintreacherous Racing of Versailles, Kentucky). They understand the rigors of racing week in and week out. There's going to come a point when he's going to get beat, but it's not going to be the end of the world for any of us because of what a truly great horse he is."

Captaintreacherous is the 5-2 morning-line favorite, followed by Vegas Vacation, whom he beat by a neck in his elimination, at 7-2. Vegas Vacation, who leaves from post seven, went into the N.A. Cup with great hopes after winning his elimination race to record his fourth victory in as many starts this year, but finished a disappointing seventh in the final. Brian Sears, who drove the horse in several races last year, replaced Scott Zeron in last week's

elimination. The horse is trained and partly-owned by Casie Coleman.

"I think in this division any horse can step up on a given night," Alagna said. "These are all quality horses or they wouldn't have made the final. Any of those horses given the right trip can step up and win the race and it wouldn't be a complete shock. It's a quality bunch of colts that our horse is racing against."

Foiled Again is the favorite at 5-2 in the \$500,000 Ben Franklin and has a chance to eclipse the \$5 million in career earnings, which no other pacer in history has done. He is less than \$56,000 shy of the mark.

"That's one of our goals - to get him over the \$5 million," trainer/part-owner Ron Burke said. "We're excited to give him a chance and hopefully he'll do it. Give him a shot and see how it goes."

In winning one of the three elimination races for the final, Foiled Again stopped the clock in 1:48 flat, setting a world record for older pacing geldings on a five-eighths mile track. He also set a speed mark with the time.

"He got a perfect trip, but he also responded off of it," Burke said. "We couldn't have been happier with him. Anything he does is unbelievable. He just keeps getting better and better."

Foiled Again, voted last year's best older male pacer in the U.S. for the second consecutive time, is looking for his 70th career win in his 181st start.

Betterthancheddar is second at 3-1 and has the eight hole in the field of nine. He finished third by three-quarters of a length in his elimination race. It was only his third start of the year. The five-year-old did well last year, winning nine of 11 and more than \$800,000. He is also trained and part-owned by Coleman.



Cancelliere Brothers Sending Out Big Guns in Meadowlands Baby Races

Sweet Talkin Clyde (Well Said), the most expensive yearling bought at auction by brothers John and Tom Cancelliere is among the horses to watch on the Saturday morning card of qualifiers at the Meadowlands. The colt is a half-brother to Sweet Lou and the Cancelliere's star, Bettor Sweet. He was purchased at Harrisburg for \$325,000. John Campbell has the driving assignment.

The Cancellieres will also send out another prospect in the colt Parnu Hanover (Somebeachsomewhere). He costs \$140,000 at Harrisburg and is a half-brother to Panther Hanover and the Cancellieres' promising Power Pack Hanover. The stable also has a Rocknroll Hanover colt named Frankandjoanne that will be making its debut in qualifiers.

There are 11 baby races on the card and they will be

followed by three races for older horses. Those races will include and appearance by Dan Patch Award winner Check Me Out, who will be making her second qualifier this year. She won last week at Pocono in 1:54.2.

Ontario Racing Industry Transition Panel Releases Plan, Calls For Government Funding to Be Linked to Handle, Eliminating Harness Racing at Woodbine

The latest missive from the Horse Racing Industry Transition Panel was released Friday with the group issuing a report called "Toward A Sustainable Future—A Draft Plan For Horse Racing in Ontario." Though only a precursor to a yet-to-be-released final plan, it spells out the direction Ontario racing will go in the future, one that consists of less racing, fewer tracks, a much different sire stakes program and government funding linked to how much is bet on live racing in the province.

The panel concludes that the Slots at Racetracks Program led the industry to stop caring about its core customers and the quality of the racing product. It continually scolds the industry for losing its focus when it came to racing, saying "the industry became disconnected from

its customers and had little incentive to face the challenge of a changing entertainment market by investing in a better consumer experience." In another section of the report, the panel asserts "The industry has lost its way. The focus has shifted to producing more, not better, races and racehorses."

In an attempt to right the ship, the panel wants to incentivize tracks to refocus on racing and make their products more appealing to the fans. To do so, future government subsidies will be based on a dollar-for-dollar match with the industry commission on pari-mutuel wagering. The more that is bet, the more the government will give the industry. "The government will invest in success as defined by the marketplace," the report reads. "It will not subsidize failure as SARP did by supporting racing that does not attract customers."

Other key elements of the report include:

- (*) A central body called Ontario Live Racing will be created. With divisions for each breed that races in the province, thoroughbreds, quarter horses and standardbreds, the OLR will have control over all industry revenues and distribute them for purses to the three breeds based on their share of the live wagering conducted in the province. The OLR will also be responsible for branding and marketing Ontario racing and run all off-track wagering in Ontario. It will also establish the racing schedules at Ontario tracks,
- (*) A standardbred racing circuit will be created in which quality racing is emphasized. It will revolve around five racetracks, Mohawk, Flamboro, Georgian Downs, Western Fair, Grand River. Standardbred racing at Woodbine will be discontinued.

"The panel has sympathy for those in the standardbred industry who prefer Mohawk as the anchor for the circuit," the panel wrote. "Many feel Mohawk creates a more exciting venue for standardbred live-racing fans."

(*) A downsizing or elimination of the Ontario Sire Stakes program: The panel argued that the sire stakes program has encouraged breeders to focus on B level horses that are able to make big money in restricted races. It wants breeders to instead produce horses that can win major open races across North America.

"It might be worthwhile to consider new breeder incentives that would focus on successful results in unrestricted competition," reads the report. "For example, incentive awards could be presented to breeders of Ontario horses that perform well in international races."

(*) The OLG will not act as a competitor of the racetracks. Rather, it will have a role in off-track wagering and will be in charge of coming up with new forms of revenues for racing, like sports betting and lottery games with racing themes.

"If you look back at where we were a year ago, in my opinion the industry was essentially dead," said Brian Tropea, the general manager of the Ontario Harness Horse Association. "Through this work I think the industry is still going to be significantly and negatively impacted. But it has given us the tools to at least regrow it."

Outreach at Tracks: A Little Effort Can Yield Big Rewards

All too often, if a person comes to a track not understanding what's going on, he leaves the same way. That's because racing seldom does much to welcome the newcomer and make him feel comfortable and help him understand the nuances of betting and racing.

It's simple outreach and it shouldn't be that hard. It's particularly important at tracks with racinos. A slots player may realize that there is a racetrack connected to the racino and may want to

check out what's going on. Is there a kiosk devoted to informing racing newcomers? Is there a New Fans Guide?

Taking this a step further, I think racing should regularly offer handicapping seminars for bettors and owners seminars. No one is born knowing how to box a trifecta. They might understand the infield fly rule because baseball is the American pastime, but what do they understand a superfecta? Handicapping seminars can help.

Racing also needs to help people take the step from being a fan to becoming an owner. I've always believed that there are people sitting in the clubhouse or grandstand every night who would like to become a horse owner, but they never take the first step because no one tells them what the first step should be. They might know how to buy a hot dog and a Coke or a program or a \$2 win ticket, but how can they buy a horse? It's apparently a well-kept secret and most people might assume you have to be a gazillionaire to own a racehorse.

Owners seminars can change that perception. They can bring new blood into racing and stem the exodus of owners from the business. About 25 years ago, USTA membership was right around 50,000. Today it is somewhere near 17,000. Can we stem that decline?

Owners seminars come in various forms. I've been in some that lasted two hours; others take up a four hours; some are slated to be day-long sessions.

While I tend to favor the shorter seminars, I firmly believe that there is no such thing as a bad owners seminar. Any outreach to the public is good. If 50 people attend and two of them become horse owners, it's worthwhile. If 10 people attend and one or two become owners, it's worthwhile. It's all good. The cost is negligible and the benefits are many.

I've participated in many owners seminars and I've always been straightforward with attendees about the costs and risks of horse ownership. To be anything less than candid is misleading. But we've also emphasized the many unmatched joys of horse ownership.

And once a year is not enough for an owners seminar. What if you slate it for September 14 and a prospect has a conflict? Should he have to wait another year to learn? No. These should be done regularly by associations or tracks. Recently I spoke to a group of Thoroughbred owners about conducting such outreach efforts to owners and one man said, "We need more fans and bettors, not owners."

I reminded him that owners are certainly fans and bettors. too. In fact, owners can be the best recruiters to convert people into fans of racing.

In addition to seminars to bring in new owners, racing also needs to educate bettors. What can turn off potential fans faster than glancing at a racing program with all of its indecipherable symbols and numbers. What does all that stuff mean? It's reads like an Amtrak schedule, as another person once wrote. I know how to read a past performance line, but this isn't a widely-held skill. Some tracks do well with program comments or expert analysis on TV monitors, but why not do more? Why not have some introductory handicapping sessions for fans? Why not have some intermediate or advanced handicapping sessions? Why not free tip sheets?

Why not have a trainer or driver participate in these seminars so that fans can ask questions of the people who handle the horses? If a guy bets big on a horse and the driver races it in a conservative style and gets beat, the bettor is none too happy. But what if the driver could explain that his horse was rough-gaited and an aggressive drive might have resulted in a break?

Reaching out to the public is never a bad thing. Racing needs more owners and bettors. Let's take the initiative to welcome them and educate them. Not just once a year or every other year, but on a regular basis. Again, it's not rocket science. Any outreach to the public is better than no outreach at all.

All we've got to lose is the sport that we all value.

I LUV THE NITELIFE heads the Lynch as the sports best 3-year-old filly and the recent Fan Hanover champion is squarely the one to beat despite drawing the second farthest outside post. Ryder trainee has been dominant in almost every start this year and last weeks elimination win was effortless despite being used early into a :26 flat opening quarter. She begins what could be a big night for Tetrick. CHARISMA HANOVER tasted defeat last week for the first time this year and for the first time with Burke. She exits a daunting trip in her elimination where she held pretty well despite it; any smooth journey gives an upset chance. SHEBESTINGIN has won 8 of her 10 career starts and has been second in the other two; no question about the strategy for Miller and Holloway. Demands front end respect. MS CALIA J FRA has blossomed into a top filly since the barn change to Elliott earlier in the year; all she does is find ways to win.

SOMWHEREOVRARAINBOW seeks to regain that 2-year-old Crown champion form; tough to disregard Teague and the daughter of Rainbow Blue in a race like this. JERSEYLICIOUS started the season 8 for 8 but has since gone 0 for 5.

On the 3-year-old colt side, WORD POWER went down in defeat for the first time in his young career last week in what was a rather hurculean try. Reunited with Callahan, this one endured a first over trip which saw him pace a third quarter on the rim in :25 and change. Provided that race didn't sting him, the colt by Western Ideal now draws inside all of his main rivals and should have every chance to shine if good enough. VEGAS VACATION rebounded from his try in the North America Cup to just miss last week in 1:48:4. Obviously the change to Sears was huge, and this one paced a back half in about :53 flat in trying to catch the big favorite. Will be ready tonight for Coleman.

CAPTAINTREACHEROUS faces the toughest test of his career tonight and will need his absolute best to beat a field loaded with talent from the outside post 9. This one hasn't been particularly flashy so far in 2013, but he remains unbeaten on the year and paces his fastest when he needs to. I correctly backed this one in these pages two weeks ago at Mohawk but he'll need some Tetrick magic to reach from out here at the short price. SUNFIRE BLUE CHIP paced the fastest elimination win last week in 1:48:3 for Burke but faces an entirely different crew tonight. MARTINI HANVOER could be a sneaky play from the rail and should take action off his 8/1 programmed line. He had no shot in the Cup final and had tough trips prior to and after that race; picks up Morrill.

Tetrick drove both ROYALTY FOR LIFE and SMILIN ELI last week and he opts for the latter in tonight's rich final for 3-year-old trotters. SMILIN ELI is the early favorite amongst many to capture this years Hambletonian the first Saturday in August and no one has yet been able to seriously threaten the Muscles Yankee sophomore in four lifetime starts. DON'TYOUFORGETIT goes for the top connections of Takter/Gingras and this one trotted to the fastest Beal elimination win last week in 1:52:1; he'll be given every chance tonight if good enough. CORKY is the "other" Takter entry in here and despite a nice looking win last week was no match for #9 in any number of races in New Jersey last month. Who knows where that mile last week from FICO came from; it's remarkable what Pierce can get out of a horse sometimes and I wouldn't be so quick to dismiss entirely. -Brett Sturman

Race 7, B-2/B-1/A-1 Pace

VOICE OF TRUTH went a big first over mile a couple back at Philly when he won in 1:49:2 and probably possesses the class edge on this field. Despite only winning twice on the year, this one has finished first or second 11 times from 21 starts and is versatile enough to do it either way. Carlson opts to the sharp Burke-trained ALED HANOVER so we get Lachance instead which should work just as well. What can you say about LETTHEROCKBEGIN; if he's as good tonight as he was last week I guess you'd have to include him. I might be inclined to let him beat me on the repeat if he can, however. MCCELLAND extis a fast mile at Pocono and two back was in against tougher here; not the easiest horse to gauge but he is capable. PANESTHETIC had excuses in his last pair; I'd like a price with Takter aboard.

Race 8, C-2/C-1 Pace

SIR ZIGGY'S Z TAM was bet all the way down to even money last week and delivered on that promise accordingly. This one does step up slightly, but he was used throughout in his most recent and any repeat of that try would give him a big chance against these. TYLER HANOVER sported some good late pace last week and he does have some class to him; will be garner more attraction tonight. ROCKNROLL JEWEL has been very consistent this year and that effort against Bolero Andrew from two back rates favorably; short priced contender but no cinch. HE'S A BEACHBOY and KAUFMAN HANOVER both step up off wins but seem up against it from out here. THANKS FOR STOPPIN squandered a good chance last week and I'm now done with BOBJACKS ANGLE A. With that said, I'm sure he'll jump up and win.

Race 9, N/W 3 Pace

I can't guarantee this 12/1 programmed line on ROCHAHOLIC holding up but this Burke 3-year-old deserves a look from the rail on the driver change to Carlson. He's been overmatched in a number of his recent races and his try in NJSS competition five races back against a couple of the top sophomores hint at some ability. Worth including. HIGHLAND TERRIFIC closed in :26:4 in his recent qualifier and is noteworthy as Cat's pick over #4. SOUTHWIND TERROR towed along to a fast mile last out at Mohawk but was suspect prior to that in May. LETS ROCK TOGETHER lands an ideal post to rally from and HE'S A SHORE TAN could be any type from Balmoral.

Race 10, C-2

MR COOLIE gets a seemingly generous bottom level classification and as a bonus lands the inside starting slot while trying his fifth different track in six starts. Ford trainee has been involved in multiple sub 1:50 miles of late and the winner of his most recent at Saratoga would crush these. PRINCE SHARKA is always a threat when dropping back down to this level; only missed by four lengths against Urgent Action two back. ART OF ILLUSION drops from facing tougher at Yonkers; was caught in a 1:49 4/5 mile when last seen here. FREDDY DAY HANOVER will likely take some support but has disappointed more often than not.

The Plays
