

The Captain and the \$5 Million Horse Top Huge Night at Pocono

WILKES-BARRE, Pa.–Yannick Gingras said his horse "kicked ass." He was talking, of course, about the remarkable Foiled Again (Dragon Again). But the wonderful 9-year-old gelding wasn't the only horse last night at Pocono Downs who did some butt whooping. It was that kind of night, where the card was loaded with rich races and superstar horses and most of them delivered, and did so with style.

The horse who refuses to slow down, Foiled Again went over the \$5 million mark in earnings when he won the \$500,000 Ben Franklin by a nose over Pet Rock. But that might not have been the biggest performance of the night. Captaintreacherous (Somebeachsomewhere) was parked the entire mile from the nine post yet overcame his difficult journey to win he \$500,000 Max Hempt Memorial by a neck over Vegas Vacation. I Luv The Nitelife (Rocknroll Hanover) lived up to her top billing when winning the James Lynch by 1 ½ lengths and Jimmy Takter ruled the day when he finished first and third in Earl Beal Memorial as Corky (Muscles Yankee) got the victory and Dontyouforgetit was third.

The weather to begin the night was close to perfect and the track was lightning fast. But that all changed when a downpour hit Central Pennsylvania about 15 minutes before the Lynch, the first of the major stakes on the night. For the four major stakes the track was listed as sloppy.

Largely because he was winning all his races by necks and noses this year some were wondering if maybe Captaintreacherous was overhyped. Coming into the Hempt Final he had won his last three starts by a neck, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ and three-quarters of a length. But last night's race figured to present him with a huge challenge. Not only was the field stocked with talent but The Captain drew the nine post for the assignment.

Driven by Tim Tetrick, he appeared ready to gun from off the gate, but Tetrick sensed that that would only land him in trouble. Instead he waited to go, moved three-wide into the first turn and then picked up cover behind Word Power. With Tetrick having

maneuvered his mount into striking position, he made a three-wide move on the far turn, but seemed to be spinning his wheels. Suddenly, he kicked into another gear and shot by the leader, Sunfire Blue Chip. Vegas Vacation, who has now been beaten by Captaintreacherous in his last three starts, finished second.

"At the eighth pole I was worried," Tetrick admitted. "At

I super happy with that. I trust this horse. Maybe it's my fault he doesn't win by many because I trust him and put him in spots where I try to use as little of the horse as I can. He's always given it to me. Whenever he does win he's doing his job."

Though Captaintreacherous once again won by a narrow margin this was nothing less than an electric win by the son of Somebeachsomewhere, who was hung out the entire mile.

"I know we've never seen this horse's bottom and tonight off the last turn here he comes again," winning trainer Tony Alagna said. "This horse just does not want to quit. He has the will to win.

Definitely, this was one of his best races ever. To do what he did on this track the way it was after the downpour, if that's not the equivalent of a mile in 47 I don't know what is. It was a monster mile."

Captaintreacherous paid \$4.80 and his time was 1:49.2. "This horse is just unbelievable," said Myron Bell, the racing manager for the ownership group. "What this horse is doing is for everyone in harness racing who dreams of having that great horse."

Alagna said the Meadowlands Pace will be next and he said he hoped eliminations will not be necessary.

It's hard to imagine that anything could have topped the Hempt, but Foiled Again did his very best to do just that.

Coming into the Franklin elims Foiled Again had lost five straight, a possible sign that time had finally caught up with him. But he rebounded to win the elims for this race and drew well to get the four post.

The race unfolded with Foiled Again sitting fifth early. He lost his cover when Razzle Dazzle vaulted to the lead. The old pro kept grinding away, got past Razzle Dazzle in deep stretch and had enough left in the tank to hold off Pet Rock.

It was his 70th career win and improved his earnings to\$5,170,444. He is the first North American-based standardbred to go over the \$5 million mark in earnings.

"He gives me thrills, I can tell you that," winning driver Yannick Gingras said. "What a horse.

He's just unbelievable. Every year over the last five years we write him of. I wrote him off myself. I took off him three weeks ago (to drive Sweet Lou in the Molson). At this point, I just want him to get the recognition he deserves. A lot of people say he's a small track horse, this, that, and maybe there's a little bit of truth to that but at the end of the day he's not the fastest horse but he outlasts every single one of them."

Is trainer Ron Burke surprised that Foiled Again is still going so strong at this age?

"If it were any other horse but him I would say yes," he said. "But not this horse. Every week, the performance is better than the previous week. Nothing he does surprises me."

The Haughton at the Meadowlands, a track that has traditionally tripped up Foiled Again, will be next.

Already the richest pacer in history, Foiled Again's next

milestone will come if he can pass Varenne as the richest standardbred in history.

The betting public had it down to two horses in the Earl Beal. Smilin Eli was the favorite at 11-10 and Royalty For Life was next at 9-5. But it was a bad night for both. For the second straight week Royalty For Life broke stride. This time he never recovered and finished last. And Smilin Eli just didn't have it, finishing fifth in a disappointing effort.

That paved the way for Corky to spring the mild upset. Sent off at 7-1 he defeated71-1 shot Picture This by a length and won in 1:54.3. Dave Miller was the winning driver.

With Smilin Eli and last year's champion Wheeling N Deain getting most of the attention among the Hambletonian-bound trotters, Corky has largely flown under the radar, but he's a consistent hard-trying horse who has never been off the board.

"I always knew he had something like this in him," Jimmy Takter said "He's never been off the board; he's very consistent, He's just a good hors and he's coming around the right way."

"He's getting better all the time," Miller said. "Tonight was another step. We'll keep our fingers crossed and hope he can hold on another month (for the Hambletonian)."

The big disappointment in the race was Smilin Éli, who came in undefeated. He got a dream trip, leading through soft fractions, but had absolutely nothing when the field came to him.

"He's got to be sick or he bled or something," Tetrick said. "He left the gate good, I asked him to go to front and he went right to it and got cheap, cheap fractions. He just had no answer."



I Luv The Nitelife kicked things off in the stakes races portion of the card. Trained by Chris Ryder and driven by Tetrick, she couldn't be any better right now. The Lynch was her fourth straight win as she continues to show that she has no equal in her division.

Having drawn the eight post, Tetrick needed to work out a trip, and he did. She sat the pocket as Shebestingin took control, found racing room in the stretch and drew clear to win by 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ lengths in 1:50.

"She's doing it well within herself," Ryder said. "She's dominating now. My job is just to keep her going and I expect her to keep doing the same."

The filly is owned by Richard and Joanne Young, who had a distaff star last year in Put On A Show. It looks like they've done it again.

"You don't expect this to happen again," Richard Young said. "I went 20 years without anything really special and all of a sudden we've had Put On A Show, a couple of other nice ones and now this horse." The night started off with a bang as the Takter-trained Uncle Peter (Cantab Hall) set a world record by winning a \$25,000 Preferred in 1:50.3. That bested the all age record on a five-eighths tracks, previously held by Googoo Gaagaa by one-fifth of a second. He beat Arch Madness by a halflength.

"I have been on him all year, all his life," Takter said, "He's just a phenomenal great horse. Every time we had him fit he got sick. He almost died twice as 2-year-old. As a 3-year-old after the Hambletonian he had diarrhea two months. There's just been a lot of weird stuff with this horse. For him to get a world record tonight is an unbelievable feeling."



Yonkers Looks to Mix Things Up

Hoping to find a remedy from the constant parade of lowpriced winners, Yonkers management has made some changes to its racing menu, including another experiment with mile-and-a-sixteenth races. The track has primarily been carding one race a night at the extra distance.

"We've done this a few times in the past," Yonkers General Manager Bob Galterio said. "Normally, it meets horsemen opposition, so we end up stopping it. This time, the horsemen came to us and said, 'look, let's do anything we can do to try to mix up these races a little bit. Let's try to get the prices up a little bit to be more competitive with some of the other tracks. Let's try to make the races more competitive. Let's try to get rid of some of these 3-5 shots that we're seeing.' So we're doing that."

For a time, all races except stakes at Yonkers were contested at a mile-and-a-sixteenth, but the track stopped the experiment after it didn't move handle.

"I think once everyone got used to it, it turned out to be the exact same (handle-wise)," Galterio said. "It didn't make any difference. That's why we're going to try it this way. It's not all going to be a mile and a sixteenth. We're not going to have one class that's going to race 1 1/16th every week. We're going to share the wealth of the pain, if you will, and see what happens."

Yonkers has also unveiled the Jackpot Next Door claiming series in which many of the races have more than eight starters.

"We're going to do 9 and 10-horse fields in the series to shake things up a little bit," Galterio said.

The series has been very popular at the claims box. Yonkers Raceway Friday night debuted its " On Friday, the seven "Jackpot" races (five for lads, two for lasses) not only offered overstuffed fields--trailers in all but one of the groupings--but an SRO crowd of folks with checks genuflecting at the feet of official "claims meister" Bob (OUTP) Miecuna. The tally showed a total of 139 claims entered on 25 different horses...including a stunning 29 on a single entrant (No Real Surprise) in the sixth race. Local owner/trainer Peter Younger won the 29-way shake.

On an unrelated note, Gaterio said former Yonkers training king Lou Pena, who was recently reinstated, has yet to attempt to enter a horse at the track. He has primarily been racing at Pocono Downs. It is unclear whether or not his entries will be accepted at Yonkers.

Trixton, Takter Have Big Morning at the Meadowlands

Trixton (Muscle Hill), the most expensive yearling trotter sold at auction last year at \$360,000, won his second straight qualifier yesterday morning at the Meadowlands. Trained by Jimmy Takter and driven by Yannick Gingras, the colt won by 1 3/4 lengths in 2:00. He went the last quarter in 28.1

On what is becoming an on-going story during Meadowlands baby races, Hall of Fame trainer Takter had a big morning. He won three straight races for trotters, connecting with Scream And Shout (Muscles Yankee), Flacco (Muscles Yankee) and Trixton.

On the pacing side, Linda Toscano held a hot hand, winning three races. She picked up wins with Murder He Wrote (Kenneth J), Winds Of Change (American Ideal) and Avalanche Hanover (Somebeachsomewhere). Winds Of Change is definitely one to keep an eye on as he won by three lengths in 1:55. He is a Brittany Farms, Val D'Or Farms homebred.

Here is how the Meadowlands' intrepid reporter Nick Salvi described the Avalanche Hanover race: "The best race of the day was the last of the two year olds where a couple of really nice colts hooked up for the length of the stretch. Stay Up Late is an Artiscape colt that cost West Winds Stable and Christine Calhoun \$67,000, while Avalanche Hanover (Somebeachsomewhere) was a \$200,000 buy for Brittany, Katz, Goldband, Libfeld, Sbrocco and Gural. This pair reached the three sixteenth's pole together and paced in tandem through the 27.3 end to a 1:58.3 mile with Avalanche getting the nod."

Another to watch is Put On A Display (Somebeachsomewhere), a \$175,000 Lexington purchase who is trained by Chris Ryder. With Tim Tetrick driving, the filly won in 1:54.3. It was the fastest time on the morning. She is owned by Richard and Joanne Young of Put On A Show fame.

In the ninth race on the card Sweet Talkin Clyde (Well Said), a \$325,000 yearling purchase, finished fourth.

Closing out the day was Check Me Out (Donato Hanover) who went her second qualifier of the season in anticipation of her return to the racing wars. She was a 1:54.3 winner with a 55.4 final half and 27.4 last quarter for Tetrick.

There were 14 baby races yesterday morning at Mohawk. For A Better Time (Bettor's Delight) had the fastest clocking, winning his mile in 1:56 for the team of Casie Coleman and Scott Zeron

Case Applies For License in Kentucky

Driver Walter Case Jr. has taken his fight to get reinstated to Kentucky, his lawyer, Howard Taylor, told Harness Racing Update. Though there would be only limited opportunities for Case to compete in that state, getting a Kentucky license could open the door for other states to accept him.



"I think if I can get him a license somewhere other states will fall right in line," Taylor said. "I am going to push hard in Kentucky, and I am hopeful."

Taylor had hoped to get Case licensed in Pennsylvania, but was rebuffed by the commission there. He has taken the Pennsylvania case to the court system and has not given up on getting licensed in that state.

"The people in Pennsylvania told me to wait a year and try again," Taylor said. "That wasn't

nearly good enough. Walter is not getting any younger and I don't want these opportunities to be wasted. That's why I went to the courts there. I am waiting to hear from them."

Paul Fontaine Weighs In On Drug Testing

I was pleased to read your recent article regarding the effort at the University of Pennsylvania School of Veterinary Medicine headed by Dr. Lawrence Soma.

The genesis of this focus on research "geared towards drugs we know little about their detection and effects on the horse, instead of those that the industry has been working on for which laboratories have method for their detection for the past 25-30 years" (Dr. Soma) came from the Board of Directors meeting of the USTA in March of 2012.

Integrity has been my main focus for many years as a 35 year director of the USTA and past chairman and a 15 year director of HTA and its current president. Having prompted discussion at our 2012 meeting with the able encouragement of Jason Settlemoir, and urged by Jeff Gural, I was appointed chairman by President Langley of an ad hoc committee to study how the industry could best approach the challenge of catching the new drugs/chemicals going undetected with our current limited research capabilities.

It seemed a daunting task at the time, but with an able committee, we soon focused on finding a laboratory and a director who would welcome the challenge if given the tools he needed.

Dr. Soma answered the call and embraced our concept with enthusiasm. A budget for new sophisticated equipment and the required personnel was presented by Dr. Soma, and the horsemen's associations in Pennsylvania, as eloquently laid out in your article, jumped in with incredible vigor and generosity.

USTA accepted the proposal as well and pledged a significant sum of money to pool with the very large commitment from Pennsylvania's horsemen's associations and as quickly as the turn of the year, the project was off and running.

What the committee, the horsemen and Dr. Soma have been incredibly in unison from the outset about, was that we did not want to repeat the focus of the past, that being testing literally thousands of samples to detect substances with which we were already quite familiar.

Now, we are developing the ability to test for and detect the "new" drugs and identifying these culprits will lead our industry hopefully to a brighter day when the integrity of races will be universally accepted.

Thanks for bringing our fans up to date on this major effort.

I totally agree with Dean Towers's suggestion of an open draw in stakes finals. I've been saying this for years and I'm amazed that it hasn't been changed. This is the ultimate no-brainer. The Meadowlands Pace and Hambletonian also let the elimination winners pick their posts and since this rule has been put in place most of the finals in these two prestigious events have been boring, with inside speed horses dominating. Are we trying to intentionally destroy the sport?

The Kentucky Derby has the biggest handle of any race in North America and it has an open draw. What else do you need to know? And the reason harness racing does it this way is to make the eliminations better? Isn't the Final more important? Doesn't the Final attract a bigger audience? We can't afford to keep shooting ourselves in the foot like this. If the people who make these decisions don't understand the business of racing, and the fact that we let the winners pick their posts is proof that they don't, replace them. Bob Pandolfo

Inflated Payoffs are Misleading

Why is it that racing managements feel the need to report "inflated" exotic mutual payoffs ? Let's look at an example: for the evening of June 21, 2013, at Pocono Downs, the USTA web site reported that the race, super payout was \$21,327 and the 10 cent payout was \$1,066. If you continue reading along that same line, you see a column that reads "pool" and on the same line of superfecta, the pool reads \$3,046. This is how the reported line reads, if I can squeeze the reported line, onto one line.

Numbers/payouts.

Pool \$3,046

3-4-8-9 \$21,327-10cent\$1,066 Sorry, it needed 2 lines.

Reviewing one more time, if the pool has \$3,046 how do we get a payout of \$21,327 ?

Another example is, if you watch racing from Yonkers notice that after each race they provide, for viewing, the pool totals. One night this past winter they showed that the super payout was (approximately) \$84,000, but the super pool total was only (approximately) \$11,000.

Please keep in mind that this (possible) false advertising, is reported and documented by multiple, t-bred and s-bred racing organizations

Here are a few intangibles: After calling a few different mutual departments and asking why this phenomenon is happening, the answer was always "everybody's doing it." And also, "we" as patrons needed to take into consideration that if a 10-cent mutual payout is \$1,000 then, hypothetically the 2 dollar payout should be \$20,000. Talk about cloud-di-fy-ing the issue.

And after calling USTA their answer was "we print what the racetrack sends us."

In the defense of horse racing, it must be noted that having to compete with the lottery and any other gambling venues that to promote windfall payouts, well it must be, to say it gently, challenging. And I guess they feel that this tactic is the best way to advertise.

Unfortunately, the viewing public does not take into consideration how difficult it is to compete within the gaming community. They only judge, and then say, "there's another black eye for horse racing" Nicholas Cantarella
