Bolt The Duer Can't Take The Heats By Bill Finley

Bolt The Duer (Ponder) is the 2-1 morning line favorite for a division of the Bluegrass Series tonight at The Red Mile, but trainer Peter Foley has been forced to look back as much as he looked forward. That's because his controversial decision to pull Bolt The Duer from the Little Brown Jug after finishing second in the first heat is still a hot topic in harness racing circles. And it became even hotter after the connections of Check Me Out, also no fans of heats, announced they will compete only in the first heat of the Ken-

tucky Filly Futurity.

"Very much so,"
Foley replied when
asked if he still believed he made the
right decision. I can't
believe the amount of
people who have commended me for doing
such a thing. Jimmy
Takter came in and
said horses should;'t
have to go two trips,
they should be a thing

of the past. LInda Toscano came in and commended me and owners. I got texts from people thanking us for thinking of the horse.

"With more and more trainers making a stink about having to race two times or more on the same day, track managers may be forced to consider doing away with heat racing. Foley predicts that they will soon be a thing of the past.

"It's going to happen," he said. "It's the next thing that's going to happen. From the feedback I've gotten, a lot of people think it shouldn't be done to the horses. They go too fast these days and there are a lot who haven't survived it. Staffan Lind told me Celebrity Secret was never the same horse after the Futurity. People don't want to destroy their horses."

Foley suggests that the Jug elims should be held on the Tuesday before the final, a day that currently brings small crowds and little attention to the Delaware fair races.

"That way they could have three straight big days," he said.

Tonight, Bolt The Duer will return to a track where he has had nothing but success. He won three straight in the Kentucky Sire Stakes series this summer, including the \$250,000 final. He drew post three for tonight and regular driver Mark MacDonald again has the assignment.

The problem tonight won't be heats but it could be **Sweet Lou** (Yankee Cruiser). Still trying to land a major win this

year, he raced well in the Jug, winning an elim and finishing second in the final. Foley doesn't believe he'll have an edge over Sweet Lou because that one raced twice on Jug day.

"Every horse is different, so I have no idea what it might do to some of the others," he said.

The Bolt The Duer race is just one of many stakes on what is by far the best card thus far this year at the Red Mile.

The highlight of the card may be Race 11, another in the Bluegrass Series. The favorite will be the sensational 2-year-old pacing colt **Captaintreacherous** (Somebeachsomewhere), who hasn't started in a parimutuel race since winning the Sept. 1 Metro at Mohawk.

Tim Hauser, the co-owner of **Good Day Mate** (Christian Cullen, a racent winner of a \$200,000 Pennsylvania Sire Stakes championship race, knows his colt will have a tough assignment on his hands.

"I can't say we've seen the best of him yet, because we haven't seen the best of him yet," said Hauser, who is part of the Good Day Mate Partnership, which includes Fred Kruszelnicki, Chuck Pompey, Hauser Bros. Racing, J&T



Silva Stables, Kentuckiana Racing Stable and TLP Stable. "We drew a tough division. I didn't want to face Captaintreacherous yet, but we're going to have to. Maybe this week we'll see who he is. If not, it's coming. He's been babied all year, which is good because you want to keep him healthy."

Another race to keep any eye on is the 8th, a Bluegrass race for 3-year-old pacing fillies. **American Jewel** (American Ideal) is the 2-1 morning line favorite but has lost four of her last five. She will again face **Economy Terror** (Western Terror) who finished third in a Jugette elim and passed on the final.

In a split division of the race for 3-year-old pacing colts, **Pet Rock** (Rocknroll Hanover) will square off against **A Rocknroll Dance** (Rocknroll Hanover) in the seventh. Pet Rock was not eligible for the Jug but raced that day in an undercard event, obliterating his rivals to win a \$10,000 event by 16 1/4 lengths in 1:50.3.



Canadian Sale Cancelled



Taking A Shot Breeds Innovation

In 1998, Amazon.com founder Jeff Bezos made a trip to a Menlo Park, California garage. In that garage, which was a make-shift office and workshop, sat two kids who were trying to sell a new way to search the Internet. They were seeking seed money for their venture.

Bezos almost immediately obliged. He invested \$250,000 of his own money into the concept.

Those two kids were Sergey Brin and Larry Page and the concept they were working on was Google. This year, with Google's stock hovering around \$600 a share, that investment is worth about \$2 billion. Mr. Bezos, way back in 1998, paid 8 cents a share for his stock.

Why did he do it? In his own words he said:

"There was no business plan, but they had a vision. It was a customer-focused point of view."

He didn't know what was going to happen with search. He didn't know what his investment may be worth. He took a shot, because what they were building made sense.

That seed capital created a company; one who innovates and makes all of our lives a little more convenient, and at the same time opens doors for more innovation.



Harness racing, like seed capital investing, is for swashbucklers. It's a sport that has always been for those rugged individualists who yearn for risk, with a probability for a huge reward. We don't ask for special treatment or to work an eight hour

day with summers off and a cushy 401k. We're different.

We see it at every yearling sale on the planet. It happens with the Cancelliere brothers who swing for the fences on a brother to Donato for the price of a Massachusetts beach house. It happens with a couple of bettors who decide to take their superfecta winnings from last week to buy that Shadow Play yearling out of a mare they made a score on in 2006. It happens with little guys like me, who showed up at a sale with no trainer, and saw a horse I witnessed race a couple of weeks earlier not drawing bids at \$5,000, so I put my hand up and bought him, never seeing the horse or even knowing how I get him from the sale to a stall. It happens with you too, almost every day.

It's how we're built. It's what we do.

I had a recent discussion about the "Racing Development and Sustainability Plan" which was structured and tabled in Ontario a few years ago. The plan, which was created to buffer the loss of slots revenue should it be discontinued, asked for 5% of purses to be squirreled away and used for eight or ten previously studied and reviewed planks. These included items like new betting concepts, betting exchanges, pick 6 tickets in corner stores, and a few other pro-growth ideas that were new, fresh and innovative. Each idea, like Google's, was "customer-focused".

I remember when it was constructed; I thought it would be a slam dunk. Almost all of these issues were complained about by those in the sport, and 5% of slots-fueled purses seemed like a drop in the bucket. After all, if you nailed a 5th place at Grand River Raceway, instead of cashing a \$250 purse check it would now be about \$238. It didn't seem like it was an earth-shattering ask.

In the end it was rejected by us, the participants. It was "too risky", "too vague", "there was no business plan", "we don't know how much each plank would cost" and various other gripes were put forth to kill it.

Why do we have a love of risk, and hard work, and "taking a shot" when we throw \$20,000 at an unraced weanling, but we can't give up a paltry 5% of slot-purse money to do something planned to gain new customers and new markets?

I wish I knew, because I think it's one of the biggest problems in horse racing.

When we take a shot, we innovate, and when we innovate it opens doors. When we don't innovate we stagnate and there are no doors to open.

I've often wondered of late: What if the RDSP in Ontario passed in 2010?

If the plan passed 'go', one of the main items - a betting exchange - might be up and running, with the participants of harness racing as its owner. It might be helping with the bottom line, but it could be more than that, too.

As everyone knows, all slots revenue is being (tentatively, there is a final report due next month) removed from Ontario racetracks in March of next year. The government has been looking for ways to appease racing, because the new gaming policy has pulled the rug right out from under it. Right now there is really no conduit for them to fund racing with some sort of bridge financing or restitution, as there are very few avenues that make sense. Currently, what's being batted around is a \$50M severance package to be paid over three years.

However, as a part of this new gaming policy, the government itself has laid the foundation to pass sports betting in the Province, which could be a huge business for them. If a harness betting exchange was now running, with an existing fan base patronizing it, it is probable, or at least somewhat likely, that Ontario racing could ask the government this simple question today:

"Since you took slots away, how about allowing us to offer sports betting on our exchange?"

To allow for some pay back, or to allow the government to save face, a right of first refusal, or exclusivity may have been granted for sports betting via the medium. This would be a boon for the sport in Ontario. If others came in and tried to offer sports betting the same way, they'd likely have to go through racing. As Betfair has proven, betting games on an exchange brings in plenty of dollars, too. Those dollars could run into the many millions per year, and they could be used for harness racing purses. The Ontario Sires Stakes may be funded by this exchange each year alone, instead of everyone wondering what a sires stake purse will even look like in three years.

The above is purely hypothetical of course, and it may have never occurred even if the RDSP was passed. But it shows that racing could be another example illustrating what many other businesses prove each day: If you are innovating and trying new things, it can spawn growth and uncover new comparative advantages and revenues; sometimes from unexpected places.

This maxim could be applied to all other ideas, like a V75 type bet in corner stores, new bets in new markets, scheduling, the list is almost endless.

In my opinion, harness racing needs to look at all ideas. It needs to fund working committees of professionals to bring these ideas to the fore. It needs to bring our swash-buckling nature from the yearling sales floor to the board-rooms to shake up the business and destroy the status-quo. If so, we will at the very least be trying things that can help us learn and move the sport forward.

What we are currently doing, and our culture of saying

'no' to any change is simply not working.

I Luv The Nitelife caps double for Sears, Tetrick also posts Grand Circuit double By Nicole Russo

LEXINGTON, Ky. - Drivers Brian Sears and Tim Tetrick each captured a pair of six-figure Grand Circuit events Friday night at the Red Mile, including victories with record-setting fillies I Luv The Nitelife (Rocknroll Hanover) and Nikki Beach (Somebeachsomewhere) in their respective divisions of the Lindy Farms Bluegrass Series for two-year-old pacing fillies.

Major Athens (Andover Hall), driven by Sears, and Punxsutawney (Glidemaster), driven by Tetrick, each captured divisions of the evening's co-feature, the Walnut Hill Limited Bluegrass Series for two-year-old trotting colts and geldings.



I Luv The Nitelife, who paced the fastest mile ever by a two-year-old filly (1:50.1) last month at Mohawk, capped an early double for Sears with a game victory.

The filly was unhurried early, sitting well back as an eager Miss Madi M took the group through opening splits of :28.2 and :57.1. Belle Boyd surged up around the far turn to assume command through three quarters in 1:25.3.

I Luv The Nitelife was still more than three lengths behind in midstretch. The filly rallied furiously in the final yards to win by a head, stopping the clock in 1:52.4 for the mile. "She did what she had to do," trainer Chris Ryder said. "It's tremendous. She's on a roll right now."

Belle Boyd held second by another head over a game Miss Madi M.

I Luv The Nitelife, owned by Richard and Joanne Young, has now won four of her last five starts, with the only loss in that span coming by a head in the Champlain following a troubled trip.

Nikki Beach, arriving at Red Mile off a record-setting victory, kept her own momentum going with her divisional win.

The speedy South Pacific, winner of three of four career starts, bounced out to pace the field and still led by open lengths with an eighth of a mile to go. But Nikki Beach and

Tetrick rallied down the center to surge past late, finishing in 1:53.2

Wherethegirlsare bested South Pacific for the place as fillies from the first crop of Somebeachsomewhere swept the trifecta.

Nikki Beach, trained by Tony Alagna, was coming off a track-record setting victory (1:52.1) in the Kentuckiana in Indiana in her most recent outing. Friday's victory gave the filly five wins from nine career starts.

"She's been a pleasure right from the get-go," Brittany Farms racing manager Myron Bell said. "She got a little sick on us about two months ago, but now she continues to get better with a vengeance."

Ritascape (Artiscape) also won her division Friday, wearing down UF Dragon's Queen to win by a neck in 1:52.2 Driven by Jody Jamieson for trainer Homer Hochstetler, Ritascape has won four of six starts.

Major Athens opened the evening's action with his victory, handing favored Mystical Dew his first career defeat. Here's Johnny took the field through the early going, posting fractions of :29.3 and :58.3. Meanwhile, Tyler Smith had his hands full with a headstrong Mystical Dew, attempting to get the Kentucky Stallion Series winner, typically forwardly-placed, to settle.

Mystical Dew took over from Here's Johnny around the far turn, and appeared home free after a rallying San Donato broke stride in upper stretch. But Major Athens, in the clear on the outside, and Pine Credit, who found a seam between horses, rallied in the final yards, with four horses hitting the wire together.

Major Athens prevailed by a head over Mystical Dew, stopping the clock in 1:56.3. Pine Credit edged Here's Johnny for third.

Major Athens, who has won seven of 10 career starts, races as a homebred for Thomas Brice and Charles Receski. The duo also campaigned his dam, the Self Posessed mare Miss Athens.

"We were going to sell her when her racing career was over," Receski said. "But we weren't going to get enough money for her, so we decided to breed her."

Punxsutawney and Tetrick toppled another favorite in their division, avenging a loss to Hall of Muscles.

Deadliest Catch took the lead from Hall of Muscles - who wilted in the lane despite setting soft early fractions - in upper stretch, but was quickly confronted by Punxsutawney, who was moving strongest of all in the middle of the track. The colt surged by for the win in 1:57.2.

Trained by John Butenschoen, Punxsutawney earned his second win in eight starts.

All Laid Out (Yankee Glide) posted an upset in his division for owner-trainer Noel Daley and driver James Rattray.

My Man Can led into the stretch of the race, with favored Fashion Blizzard, the New York Stallion Series final win-

ner, looking for room along the inside. All Laid Out trotted by both for a narrow win, finishing in 1:57.1 for his second win in four starts.

Creatine (Andover Hall), second to All Laid Out in a Kindergarten division last out, further flattered that rival with a victory in his division. The colt, unhurried early by Mike LaChance, rallied past Broadway Prince in the stretch to win in 1:57.1. The Bob Stewart trainee has now won three of six starts.

Creatine was the second winner on the evening for sire Andover Hall, who earlier was represented by Major Athens.

Pricey purchase Detour Hanover remains unbeaten

LEXINGTIN, Ky. - Detour Hanover (Andover Hall), the most expensive Standardbred yearling ever purchased at public auction, remained unbeaten in his young career with an authoritative victory in a \$10,000 late closer event for two-year-old trotting colts and geldings Friday night at the Red Mile.

Detour Hanover, owned by John Cancelliere and trained by his brother, Thomas, was an \$825,000 purchase at Harrisburg last year. The colt, out of the Donerail mare D Train, is a full brother to champion trotter and young sire Donato Hanover.

With driver David Miller in the sulky, Detour Hanover quickly took the lead and paced the field through early fractions of :29.1 and :58.2. Kostas De Via made a bid from the back of the pack entering the far turn, but Miller let his colt out a notch to maintain a comfortable advantage through three quarters in 1:28.3. The outcome was never seriously in doubt down the lane, as Detour Hanover continued on to win by a handy length in 1:58.3. Southwind Metallic rallied for second, with Recon another length back in third.

Bred by Hanover Shoe Farms of Pennsylvania, Detour Hanover improved to two-for-two after narrowly winning his debut Sept. 11 at Pocono Downs.
