Stan Bergstein, Idol and Icon, Is Dead at 87

Never has one man ever contributed such an amazing array of talents to the benefit of harness racing.

Never has one man earned so much respect and admiration in harness racing.



Never has one man labored so long and hard for the betterment of harness racing.

Harness racing lost its most respected voice when Stan Bergstein died on Wednesday morning at age 87. He had been in declining health recently, but was working and thinking ahead up to the very end. That was Stan Bergstein.

In 1996, when Delvin Miller died, it was Stan Bergstein who was selected to give his eulogy in a moving memorial service at The Red Mile. His eloquence did full justice to Miller's career as

Bergstein called the man from Meadow Lands "our idol and our icon."

The words---idol and icon---also fit Stan Bergstein. When Hoof Beats magazine conducted a poll in 1999 to determine the most influential people in the sport in the Twentieth Century, Delvin Miller's name was in the top 10 along with E. Roland Harriman and other legends. The only person then alive on the list was Stan Bergstein.

Listing all of Bergstein's accomplishments and honors would require a book. He was far more than just the executive vice-president of Harness Tracks of America for a half-century. He was also a writer, race secretary, announcer, historian, art and book collector, auctioneer, TV host, dinner speaker, and on and on.

Stan Bergstein not only did just about everything, he did it well. He didn't tolerate second-rate efforts.

That's what made him such a stern taskmaster for the assistants he trained at Harness Tracks of America over many decades. They all worked hard because Stan saw to it that they did so, but Stan worked harder than all of them. Like Delvin Miller, many of Bergstein's associates went on to prominent roles in harness racing.

His reputation extended far beyond harness racing. He was the one person whose voice was respected in the larger horse world, as he wrote a column in the Daily Racing Form.

Joe Hirsch, a legendary writer in the Thoroughbred game, said years ago about Bergstein, "Stan is really unique in sports. I don't think any sport has a figure tocompare to Stan. He's played so many roles in harness and he's made so many contributions."

Chris McErlean, vice-president and general manager of the Meadowlands a decade ago, said, "A few years back, I recall at an industry meeting that someone said that the biggest mistake the Thoroughbred industry ever made was not having Stan Bergstein join its ranks....Stan's commentary and insights are right on, regardless of the breed or business. Anyone should look with interest as to where he points as it's almost always in the right direction."

Bergstein's reputation also crossed oceans. When I began to travel to foreign tracks a quarter-century ago, invariably an official or horseman would say, "Please give my best wishes to Stan Bergstein."

Everyone knew Stan, and he seemed to know everyone. A few years ago, Bergstein was honored by the equine journalists of North America when he received the Equine Industry Vision Award from American Horse Publications. He was the first and only person from the Standardbred world to be considered for such an award. It seemed tailor-made for him because no one had more vision or brought more innovations to racing than Stan Bergstein. (**Continued, page 2**)

Horse racing has never been particularly hospitable to new ideas, but Stan's ideas had so much merit that they overcame all objections. Without stan Bergstein, it's fair to say there would be no Experimental Handicap Ratings, no John Hervey Awards, no USTA Stakes Guide, HTA Art Auction, no HTA-Hanover Shoe Farms caretakers awards, no Harness Racing Congress and on and on and on.

In the past two decades, Bergstein has been harness racing's Mr. Integrity, an unwavering voice to restore integrity to racing. That didn't always endear him to some fractions in the business. I can assure you that Stan Bergstein never lost a minute of sleep worrying about the criticism that integrity in racing was a quaint old custom. There were far more people who admired him for taking a stand in favor of harsh penalties to clean up the game.

Stan Bergstein always occupied the high ground. I happened to speak to Howard Beissinger, the Hall of Fame horseman, yesterday morning. Never a man to mince words or sugarcoat his sentiments, Beissinger said, "I knew Stan Bergstein for about 60 years. Everyone who knew Stan liked and respected him, except the crooks." Stan could have retired many years ago and enjoyed the Arizona sunsets. That simply wasn't his style. He loved harness racing too much and wanted to see it enjoy a renaissance. Like a courageous old war horse, Stan Bergstein just never gave up.

The U.S. Harness Writers had earlier decided to dedicate its annual 2012 conference and Dan Patch Banquet in honor of Bergstein's immeasurable contributions. Discussions are now underway to heap additional honors on harness racing's departed idol and icon by putting his name on a major award.



Bergstein was a member of America's "greatest generation" and he was among the brave soldiers who hit Omaha Beach on D-Day in 1944. When I was planning my first trip to Normandy a few years ago, he told me to be sure to visit the American cemetery at Coleville-sur-Mer with

the graves of almost 10,000 soldiers.

Stan had visited that cemetery. Some of those resting beneath the sod were his buddies who never made it off the beach. He told me simply, "It will make you proud to be an American."

When Stan lost his lovely wife June in the summer of 2010, he was understandably devastated but he took solace in his work and his writing. He worked as long as his health allowed, game right to the finish line.

They simply don't come any better than Stan Bergstein, and harness racing was lucky to have been blessed by his talents.

Fusco's Suspension On Hold

Trainer Carmine Fusco isn't going anywhere–at least in the immediate future.

Having lost an important round in court last week and faced with finally having to serve a five-year suspension for drug violation that goes all the way back to 2006 at Yonkers, Fusco won another reprieve yesterday as his lawyer, Marvin Newberg, announced that he was taking the case to the New York State Court Of Appeals. With that development, a New York State Racing and Wagering Board source confirmed that Fusco will be allowed to continue training while his case continues through the court system.

"We are going to make a motion for permission to appeal to the Court of Appeals," Newberg said. "There are a lot of issues in this case that I think are unique. Hopefully the Court of Appeals will entertain this."

The Court of Appeals does not have to accept Fusco's appeal, and if it does not he will have exhausted all legal challenges and will have to begin his suspension. Newberg estimated that it will take between two and three months before a decision is reached concerning whether or not the court will take the case. If Fusco's appeal is heard it is unclear how long the matter will continue to drag on.

Last week, the New York State Racing and Wagering Board's decision to ban Fusco for five years was upheld by the New York State Supreme Court, Appellate Division, Third Department. The case began in 2006 when a Fusco-trained horse named Chevie Pride tested positive for clenbuterol at Yonkers and subsequent evidence led investigators to believe it had also been treated on five occasions with three other banned drugs.

"The days of trainers trying to skirt rules, putting equine health at risk and cheating the betting public are over," Racing and Wagering Chairman John D. Sabini said following last week's ruling in favor of the NYSRWB. "The Board applauds the court's decision, which affirms that individuals who repeatedly cheat should be appropriately penalized. This is another message that New York's racing industry will not tolerate those who violate the rules."

"He came out of the race super and we shipped him back to New Jersey," trainer Tom Cancelliere said. "He gets everything he needs and is as sound as can be. He'll be leaving for Chicago for The American National and that will be it for the season. As a gelding, he will be coming back again next year."

Has he earned a championship?

"That is tough," the trainer said. "I've got three majors. We Will See has four. Foiled Again is so tough. I have to go out and get a fourth big win."

Bettterthancheddar (Bettor's Delight)

"He came out of the race very, very good and he's heading to Chicago for The American National and The Windy City," trainer Casie Coleman said. Then he will be shut down and brought back next year as a 4 year-old."

Coleman is hoping a sweep in Chicago is enough to get divisional honors.

"We definitely haven't sewn up divisional honors yet," she said. "It has been a wide open division all season. I think anyone of five can be named divisional champion. For all these horses the next few starts will determine who is the division leader. Hopefully, we win the next two and complete our case."

Cedar Dove (Andover Hall)

"She seems good and came out of good," trainer Noel Daley said. The Matron Sunday at Dover is next and, hopefully, the following week for the final. That's it for the year. The plan is to bring her back next year." (Continued, page 4)

Next year, we'll pay her into most of the Grand Circuit stuff, like the Matchmaker at The Meadowlands."

Monkey On MY Wheel (Mach Three)

Monkey On My Wheel will make her final appearance of the season in the \$300,000 OSS Super Final, but will return next season.

"That's the plan," trainer Travis Umphrey said. "One more race then she will get some well deserved time off. She seems to be maturing as the year goes on, so that only helps when looking forward to next year."

Free Yearlings...No Kidding

In an effort to attract new owners to the sport, VIP Stable is going to give away a percentage of four pacing yearlings it has recently purchased. On a first-come-first-serve basis. 25 new owners will be wel-

comed into the VIP family and each one will be given 1 % ownership of each of the four yearlings at no charge.

"Like Frank Antonacci did with his Bourbon Slush Stable, we're trying to bring some more people into the game," said VIP's Managing Partner Ed O'Connor. "This



will be similar but also different. Twenty-five folks will own 1 percent of all four horses. Essentially, we'll be giving away a whole horse. Everybody realizes we need to get new blood into the game. It's not a hard sell to try to get people to help us. It's getting the new people that is hard."

The partnership group will not race under the VIP name but will be called Inner Circle Stable.

The four horses are filly American Shuttle (American Ideal), colt Fox Valley Leo (Yankee Skyscraper), filly Fox Valley Cibola (Yankee Skyscraper) and colt McAriat (Mcardle)

American Shuttle (\$6,500) and Fox Valley Leo (\$6,000) were bought earlier this year at yearling sales. (Continued, page 5)

The new owners will have to pay monthly bills for training costs and other expenses. O'Connor said the bills will be about \$89 per month while the horses are training down and \$129 per month thereafter.

If more than 25 people come forward to join Inner Circle O'Connor said they may extend the offer to more horses.

"Giving things away is nota good way to make a profit, but if we can peel off another quarter of two or three horses, sure, we would love to do that," he said.

Stan Bergstein's Legacy

There are probably 500 people in harness racing—or maybe 5,000—who knew Stan Bergstein better than I so I won't dare write about him here as though we were particularly close. Stan was very kind to me, as he was to a great many people, and he leaves a legacy in harness racing that will endure for a long time. Think about all of the current leaders in the sport today—and think of how many had strong ties to Stan.

For me, I will never forget the public support he gave me last year, and again earlier this year, when I was trying to rally support for the development of a test for ITPP, the new horse doping drug that is allegedly being used all over North America. Some people agreed with my ranting about the subject. Some people disagreed with it. But once Stan chimed in on my behalf, and more importantly on behalf of the crusade, everyone certainly took the matter seriously.

The same was true of his comments more recently on the controversy surrounding Crys Dream and the Hambletonian. He was an outspoken critic, for example, of the federal lawsuit filed by the filly's owners—the one in which the plaintiffs, who are some of the most prominent owners in the sport, are seeking damages from the New Jersey Racing Commission. To my knowledge, the suit is still pending, a ticking time bomb in our sport.

Stan said the suit has "dangerous implications" and he's exactly right. "If it were to succeed," he wrote in The Daily Racing Form back in August, "it could wreck the efforts of both commissions to battle illegal actions. But it could go even further than that, inspiring lawyers and owners elsewhere to challenge reciprocity in general." It's so hard to find people in our sport willing to speak out like that on touchy subjects—trust me, I know—but Stan was willing to do it right up until the end of his long life.

We didn't always see eye to eye. I thought Stan could have and should have done more to promote the nomination of Irving Liverman to the Hall of Fame. And I thought that he was often too close to some of the cronies in the industry who are opposed to the vital change our sport needs if it is going to thrive into the future. I always believed that Stan could have been a sturdier bridge between the generations fighting for control of the industry's direction. But, still, he was a sturdier bridge than most. And he did more than most to make it all work.

A lot of people will be talking over the next few days and weeks and months about Stan's legacy to the sport. I hope he will be remembered for his stand on integrity and I hope the industry does something serious now about linking him forever to that cause. How about an endowment-- the Bergstein Fund—designed to study ways in which racing jurisdictions can better enforce their rules. How about a scholarship, the Bergstein Scholarship, given to post-graduate students willing to take a hard look at the ways in which racing states can better configure their laws to enhance integrity at the track? Stan gave virtually his whole life to our sport. I hope we can figure out a way to give something back in his memory.

Finally, I think it's worth saying that there was something extraordinarily special about Stan's marriage, and about his relationship with his wife, June, who passed away in June 2010. I don't believe that Stan ever fully recovered from that loss—who can blame him? They were married for 60 years!—and I would like to think that if Bergstein never did a single thing for harness racing I would still have admired him for being such a devoted husband for all those years. It is truly the end of an era.
