New York Racing Board Suspends, Fines 16 Trainers

The New York State Racing and Wagering Board has come down hard on 16 trainers, including such prominent names as Mark Kesmodel and Chris Oakes, who had horses test positive for the prohibited substance Oxymetazoline earlier this year.



Between March 21 and April 1, 28 horses tested positive for the drug ay Yonkers, Monticello and Saratoga. Oxymetazoline is a nasal decongestant and a component of the over-the-counter drug Afrin. As a bonchial dilator, Oxymetazoline allows horses to breathe more easily.

"These trainers used a prohibited substance but were caught by the Racing and Wagering Board's investigators and laboratory personnel, who promptly detected the drug," Board Chairman John D. Sabini said in a statement. "We will continue to employ resources to be one step ahead of those who try to

cheat in the sport of horse racing in New York state."

The Board gave the stiffest suspension to those who had more than one positive. Trainer Joe Anderson, who had five positives for Oxymetazoline, received the most severe penalty, a 2-year suspension and a \$5,000 fine.

Two of the suspended trainers reached yesterday argued that the penalties were far too severe.

"You get 15 days for the same positive in some other places," Kesmodel said. "That part of it seems to be unfair to me. It's only a Class IV drug, so I never imagined this would be such a big issue. The punishment is just too severe."

Kesmodel was handed a 105-day suspension and a \$1,000 fine.

Richard Banca, who was suspended 90 days and fined \$1,000, also believed the punishment did not fit the crime.

"This is definitely too severe for the class of positive that this is," Banca said. "I don't understand how they came up with this. I didn't know what to expect, but I know that Pennsylvania suspended people for 12 or 14 days for the same thing. I got six months, reduced to three. That's not even close. How does one state give out a 12-day suspension and another gives out three months? I don't understand it."

All but seven of the positives occurred at Yonkers Raceway and the list includes some prominent horses. The Kesmodel-trained **Anndrovette** (Riverboat King), a leading contender for a 2011 Dan Patch Award and a Breeders Crown winner, tested positive after an April 1 leg of the Blue Chip Matchmaker and the Don Campbell-trained **Chancey Lady** (Camluck) after a March 25 leg of the Matchmaker.

Circumstantial evidence suggests the drug did in fact enhance the performance of many of these horses. Of the 28 who tested positive, 21 won their races.

The NYSRWB is still reviewing the case of trainer April Aldrich. The suspended trainers have no recourse to appeal at this point and the suspensions have begun.

Meadowlands Racetrack will kick off its 2012 harness meet on Friday, January 6.



Post time is 7 p.m. for the season opener, which also marks the start of the meet-long Free Fridays promotion in which guests receive free admission and

Vernon Concludes Season With Upswing in Handle

Vernon, NY --- Vernon Downs recently concluded its 58th season of live racing with impressive increases in wagering handle, bucking nationwide trends.

Live on-track handle increased 4 percent over 2010 while export handle went up a staggering 35 percent.

"We're very pleased with the successful 2011 meet and would like to thank our customers and horsemen for their



support throughout the year," said Jason M. Settlemoir, Regional Vice President of Racing and Simulcast. "Our substantial increase in live and export handle shows the continued growth of a quality racing product that has been well-received both on-track and throughout North American simul-

cast facilities and advanced deposit wagering platforms."

Racing Secretary Scott Warren was instrumental in putting together full, competitive races throughout the 90-day season, his first at the Central New York oval.

An all-time track record performance by **San Pail** in the \$218,000 Credit Winner Open Trot topped the list of impressive stakes performances during the meet. The 7-year-old, likely Horse of the Year, posted a 1:51.1 win over former champion **Lucky Jim** for co-owner/trainer Rodney Hughes and partner Glenn Van Camp.

Other stakes highlights of the season included a track record win by **See You At Peelers**, her 19th straight win during her much celebrated 22-race winning streak.

Kenneth Sommer's **Action-Broadway** won the meet's premier mare trot, the Muscle Hill, in 1:54.2. **Gym Tan Laundry** broke the track record for 2-year-old gelding trotters with his 1:55.3 score in the \$200,500 Kindergarten Classic for the Adam Victor & Son Stable and **Lady Andi** took the \$182,500 filly division in 1:57.3 for trainer Larry Rathbone.

Racing returns to Vernon Downs in April 2012, pending regulatory approval.

Meadowlands Racing Secretary Peter Koch reports that the Perretti Farms Matchmaker will not be part fo the 2012 stakes schedule.


"They sold off the broodmares and with their situation, both they and the Meadowlands thought this was the best thing to do," Koch said.

Miscreants Beware: Horsemen Must Apply To Race at Meadowlands

The Meadowlands announced yesterday that all horsemen who want to compete at the 2012 meet must apply to do so. Applications are due by Dec. 15.

"The integrity of the racing product at the Meadowlands is something everyone here is going to take very seriously," new general manager Mike Newlin said. "I don't know exactly where the line in the sand is going to be drawn as far as what people may have done in the past, but Jeff Gural is firm in his belief that we present absolutely 100 percent clean racing."

It is generally recognized that private owners have more leeway to ban "evil doers" than state run racetracks do. The Meadowlands is now under the control of Jeff Gural, who has been firm with rule-breakers at the two other tracks he owns, Tioga and Vernon Downs.

As an addendum to Joe Fitzgerald's recollections of the superfecta scandal we-meaning a group of every night regulars had long since learned that a good number of races each night were basically unplayable for a variety of reasons. Therefore, to pass the time we'd often pool together to see if we could pick who would finish last since we weren't actually betting the race.

After dozens of these ventures we discovered that picking the last place finisher was as hard if not more difficult than tabbing the actual the race winner. One reason being that on the half mile track, the last placed horse on the final turn is actually 4th on the rail and through the centrifugal motion of the final turn is often 5th two or three lengths off the lead entering the stretch.

Somebody is blocked. Somebody is three or four wide and the first over contender is often tiring from his overland ordeal.

Back then, the tracks weren't nearly as speed favoring as they are today and so often it was the unused horse that never left the rail who wound up earning a check for part of the purse.

That said, it was alleged that the syndicate had won 48 out of those 50 superfectas played by wheeling all combinations of six of the eight contenders thereby eliminating the remaining two who in their estimation could not possibly finish higher than fourth.

However, based on our little gamesmanship in handicapping for last place, our group which included several master handicappers would categorically suggest such a feat to be mathematically impossible. That is unless you had absolute confidence that your two eliminated horses would not be finishing in the first four positions.
