David Reid's inspiring journey to the Hall of Fame



*One of the sport's
greatest bloodstock
agents has reached
the Harness Racing*

*Hall of Fame with a mixture of hard work,

Blows don't come more devastating than losing both your mother and your business partner in the span of just over a month. It was March of 2012 and, at the time, many in the industry predicted David Reid would either walk away from Preferred Equine or take on a new partner when Geoff Stein died of a heart attack at the age of 58 after going for a run.

Reid, while devastated, did neither.

What he did do is something which, in hindsight, is entirely within his character – he worked even harder and made Preferred even more successful.

Tonight (July 5), five years after Stein was posthumously inducted into the Harness Racing Hall of Fame, Reid will be reunited with him in the hallowed halls in Goshen, NY.

Going solo as the frontman of harness racing's most successful bloodstock agency wasn't about proving something to the industry or even himself, Reid said; it was more about keeping moving.

"I was partners with Geoff for 24 years," Reid said. "He was the only partner I had in business. He wasn't replaceable.

"So, we just rolled up our sleeves and kept going, because the foundation was built by both of us. It's just hard work and you carry forward with good support from your team members. I don't call them workers or employees.

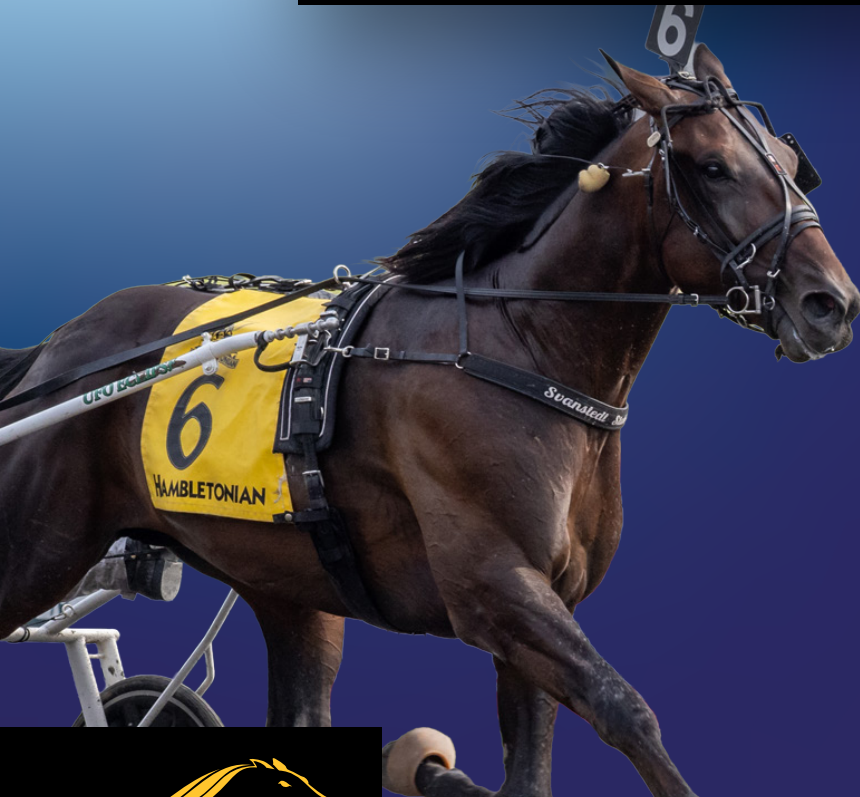

“As we said when Geoff passed away, ‘the guiding principles will lead us forward: Nothing has changed from a principle point of view, it’s just maybe picked up from a transactional point of view.

“I don’t remember losing a client. It’s a credit to the clients that had faith in our system, in our company... I’m just happy it worked out for everybody.”

Today, 38 years after Stein and Reid took over Preferred Equine in 1988 – and more than 14 years since Stein died – the numbers are staggering. Preferred has sold more than 29,000 horses lifetime for a combined gross of more than \$800 million.

Frank “The Elder” Antonacci of Lindy Farms, one of Preferred’s oldest friends and clients, said Preferred’s growth was remarkable, but not all that surprising. He remembers when the book on Preferred was that Stein was the laid-back, affable frontman and Reid was the extremely hard worker mostly behind the scenes. Turns out Reid could play either role.

“One unique thing about David is that when Geoff passed, David was able to really mold himself into being the front guy,” Antonacci said. “He’s a very talented guy and probably doesn’t get enough recognition for the talent he has, because he’s very unassuming. He can really do anything and he has a unique ability to get along with a lot of different crazy people, which there are in this business.

“You think of his list of clients... First of all, he had us, you know, [the Antonaccis] have a lot of different personalities. He had Joe Parisi, who was definitely a different personality. Michael Parisi, definitely a different personality. Jules Siegel, a different personality. Marvin Katz, a different personality. George Segal, a different personality. Jeff Snyder, a different personality, and he had the ability to kind of manage all of these guys.”

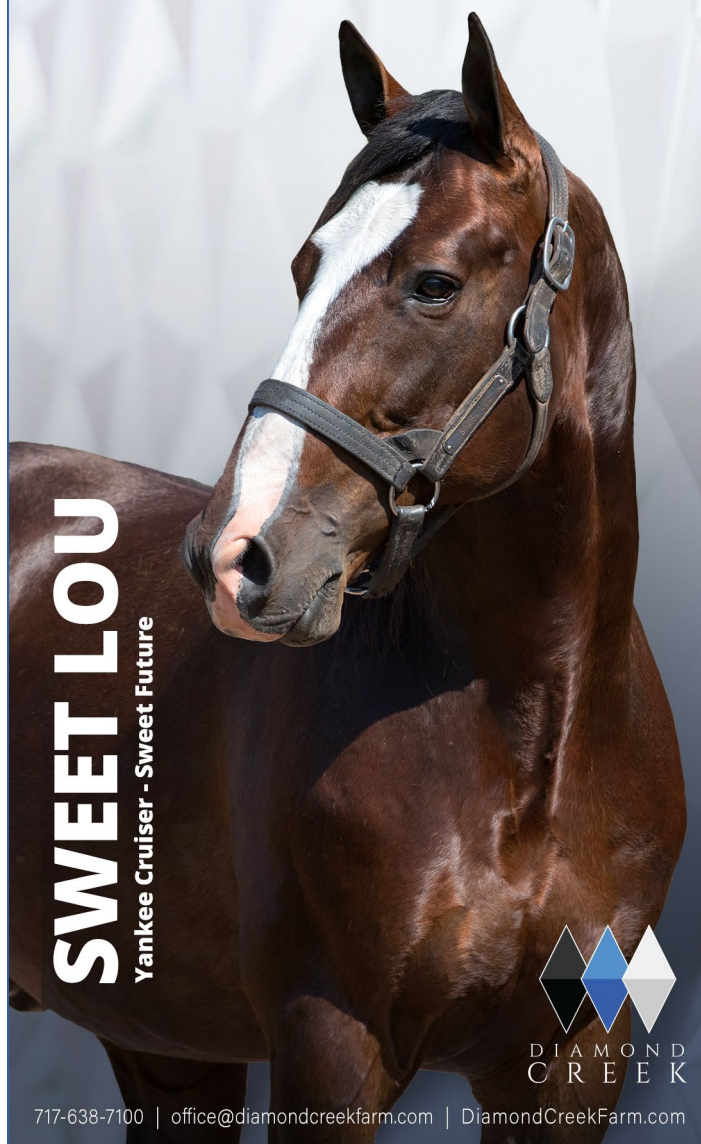

Some of that came from Reid's humble, but character-rich beginnings.

He grew up on a dairy farm in Aryle, NY, 30 minutes northeast of Saratoga Springs.

"My exposure to the horses was through Saratoga Harness," Reid said. "My family was friends with Harold Story and, at the time, he was a legend in the area. He raised that very good mare Scenic Regal... We used to go down to the harness track as a family, and that was my introduction to horse racing.

"And then The Meadowlands Racetrack – I had some uncles that used to be harness racing fans and, as a young kid, before I could drive, I would take some road trips down to The Meadowlands with my uncles and my brother."

Reid credits much of his work ethic to his family, but also some to his high school basketball coach, Mike Cronin.

"It was a discipline, a work ethic," Reid said. "[Cronin] would run hard practices... He just expected the best from me every day... He was the coach there for a long time after I left, but just a very influential guy, a hard-nosed guy."

It was Cronin that convinced Reid to pursue a degree at the State University of New York (SUNY) in Morrisville.

"During a field trip to one of the junior high schools down to the Goshen area, I was introduced to Pat Waldo and made that connection," Reid said. "I kept his contact and when I was getting ready to graduate high school, I contacted him again. He was building his farm in the Goshen area and he offered me a job.

"I went down there and started working with him in the summer of '83 and, at the time, he was the sales operation manager for the Garden State Horse Sales Company for Phil Tully. The first horse sale I attended would have been September at the New Jersey Classic at the Brendan Byrne Arena. I went from there down to Lexington with Phil Tully's operation, and then the Oktoberfest in New Jersey, and then to Harrisburg."

"After that, I would have taken some time to go back home for the winter, and that's when my basketball coach suggested that I look into going to SUNY in Morrisville. They had an animal science and a horse husbandry class and I pursued it. I started Morrisville in the summer of '84. While you're there, you do a lab and you take care of a racehorse at a breaking and training barn, and then the following summer you would race your racehorses at the County fair as part of the curriculum. My first drive, believe it or not, would have been at Goshen Historic Track... as an amateur. I missed the gate and started 20 lengths behind the field."

After graduation, Reid worked at Saratoga Standardbreds.

Around that time, at a Christmas party, Saratoga farm manager Jack Lake offered to pay for any employee that wanted to take the Dale Carnegie Public Speaking Course. Reid was the first one to take the farm up on the offer. Not only will that course come in handy for his Hall of Fame speech, more importantly, Reid met his wife Jeanette while taking the course. They have been

married 36 years and have twin daughters Brianna and Savina. Reid's time at Saratoga was fortuitous for another reason: It was when he first met Stein in the back of a pickup truck. It was one of those serendipitous, milestone moments Reid said he will never forget. Forty years later, three of the people in that pickup truck are in the Hall of Fame.

"[Stein] was an independent guy at the time and he was doing partnerships himself," Reid said. "He and Hal Jones came to Saratoga to do an appraisal on the Boardwalk Associates horses that had been transferred to Saratoga for a liquidation. And that's where I met Geoff Stein and Hal Jones. Then, later that year, Geoff would have joined Saratoga Standardbreds."

Not long after they first met, Stein gave Reid something of a test. Stein was selling a horse and he was going to have the potential buyer call Reid for an honest appraisal of that horse.

"His friend was Hans Enggren of Meadowbranch Farm," Reid said. "I told Hans about the horse and Geoff called me soon after and told me I must have done a good job because the guy bought the horse over the phone."

That horse was Park Avenue Joe, who won the 1989 Hambletonian in a dead heat with Lindy Farms' trotter Probe.

At the time Reid sold Park Avenue Joe to Enggren, Preferred Equine was part of Saratoga Standardbreds. In 1988, Reid and Stein joined forces to buy the company.

It's been an amazing ride ever since, with many highlights.

From 1993 through 2000, Reid and Stein ran the sales at The Meadowlands for the Garden State Horse Sales Company.

During that same time, Stein and Reid became part-owners of Moni Maker with the Antonacci family and others during the great trotter's 3-year-old season. She ended her career with record earnings of more than \$5.5 million and won a slew of North American and European stakes, including the Elitlopp in 1998 and the Prix d'Amérique in 1999.

"The trips to Europe were very impactful for Moni Maker to make the connections that we made," Reid said. "That led to being able to sell frozen semen to Europe and doing a lot of private transactions to Europe. So, that was instrumental."

As Moni Maker's career was winding down, Reid and Stein were approached by a group purchasing The Red Mile – the Antonaccis, Joe Thomson, George Segal, the Nigito family and Bill Perretti – to operate the Tattersalls Sale and to handle the dispersal of the famed Castleton Farms.

"I still have a letter today from [Castleton's John] Cashman, just thanking Geoff and myself for the way that the dispersal was handled at Tattersalls for the Castleton Farm," Reid said. "That's a legendary farm and company."

More than a quarter-century later, Reid said he's proud to still be associated with Tattersalls.

"It's a long run to be affiliated with a sales company that has operated on the highest level and has increased sales and has

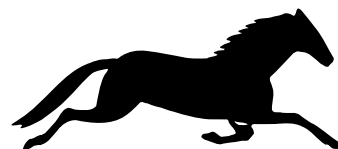

produced record world champions and Hambletonian winners and Meadowlands Pace winners and so on,” Reid said.

In 2005, the Tattersalls Sale merged with the Kentucky Standardbred Sales Company (KYSS) to form the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

Reid became the sale’s co-manager with the late Randy Manges, formerly of the KYSS.

The sale has grown exponentially since the merger to become one of the most important yearling auctions in the sport.

“Putting together those two sale companies, it was really a shotgun marriage,” Antonacci said. “It was as contentious as you think it was. It took a long time to put a lot together. Both sides had to kind of eat a little crow, but I believe David probably had the most patience in all the relationships, because... he had to get along with Randy and now he’s got to get along with [current co-manager] Bruce [Brinkerhoff], so he’s shown tremendous amount of patience and understanding to the other side, but it seems to work.”

Antonacci said Reid’s ability to work well with almost anyone has proven valuable.

“[My mom] would have said, ‘How did a kid from a dairy farm in Argyle, New York have a horse like Moni Maker, and a horse like No Nay Never that won in England that allowed him to meet the Queen, and then he ended up in the Hall of Fame?’ It’s been quite a journey.”

“There’s been many different partnerships break up throughout the years that David’s navigated,” Antonacci said. “Those people continue to do business with him, so that shows you how fair he was to all the sides.”

In 2003, Reid and Stein, the Antonaccis and some other friends ventured into selling thoroughbreds.

“We would have met [thoroughbred trainer] Wesley Ward in about 2009 in Saratoga, and we would have raced our first thoroughbred in 2010,” Reid said. “Geoff always thought that we should have looked into the thoroughbred agency business sooner than we did, because he thought that we could have been successful because we had experience running horse sales, auction crews, consigning.”

What came next was a truly royal experience.

“In 2012, we bought No Nay Never in the fall,” Reid said. “He won [the Grade 2 Norfolk Stakes] in Royal Ascot in June of ’13. [Antonacci] had to fly back to [the U.S.] go to a friend’s wedding and I stayed. That afternoon, Wesley and myself met and sat with the Queen for 15 minutes and talked about horses.”

Today, No Nay Never stands at famed Coolmore Stud in Ireland, commanding a stud fee of £100,000.

In 2012, Reid also became a director with the Hambletonian Society. He also has been a trustee of the Harness Racing Museum & Hall of Fame since 2014, has worked with the Harness Horse Youth Foundation, and was the first president of the Standardbred Transition Alliance.

Today, Reid is also a successful stallion syndicate manager. In 2017, he became the syndication manager for Walner, one of the sport’s greatest trotting stallions.

“[Walner’s owner Ken Jacobs] approached me to help him with the sale of Walner, which subsequently turned into sales syndication that involved Frank Antonacci, George Siegel, Marvin Katz, for the initial big investors to get that syndicate started,” Reid said. “He was a great horse and, from a Preferred point of view, we’re very proud of being able to manage this stallion.”

Proving that, despite all the other industry pursuits, Reid is still a man that is, first and foremost, incredibly skilled at selling horses.

“We haven’t even talked about David’s ability as a horseman,” Antonacci said. “He’s got a great eye for a horse, and I think he’s got a great, great eye to see the potential in the horse. He’s the whole package.”

At this year’s Standardbred Horse Sales Company’s auction in Harrisburg, PA, Preferred Equine set an all-time consignor record of over \$31 million, \$25 million of which came from the Mixed Sale. Preferred was responsible for over 41 per cent of the sale’s total gross of just shy of \$75 million.

“I’ve been lucky all my life – lucky from the family I had, to growing up the way I did,” Reid said. “Some people wouldn’t say

When Dr. John “Tad” Egloff, 84, is inducted into the Harness Racing Hall of Fame in Goshen, NY, this evening (July 5), there will be many friends and family members in attendance to wish him well. Unfortunately, one who will not be there is Egloff’s good friend of 50 years, John Kopas, who is recovering from a recent, unexpected medical procedure.

When asked what he thought made Egloff so good at what he does, Kopas said, “Well, that’s quite a question. He’s obviously a brilliant veterinarian. There’s no question about that. And he, I’m sure, is one of the better experts on bloodlines, and the other thing you’ve got to throw in is how hard he worked all his life.”

Then Kopas added with a laugh, “I love the expression that he uses every now and then when you say he’s done well for himself, he’ll say, ‘Yeah, I managed to out dumb a few people.’”

When I got accepted to veterinary school was also when I got married, and my wife dropped out of college to help put me through college. So, one thing I will say, probably to anybody, is that she’s been the biggest influence over me.”

Standardbreds were not on the self-effacing Egloff’s radar when he started his career, or even before that growing up. Louisiana and Texas were not known to be hotbeds of harness racing. However, he did have talent when it came to horses.

“I grew up with a ranch background with horses and cattle,” Egloff said. “My father was a cattleman and I had an uncle who had a ranch, which is where I spent most of my time.”

At Northwestern State College, Egloff helped start the rodeo club and was also part of that group when he went to Texas A&M.

“I competed in rodeos until I got accepted into vet school... At that point I quit riding bulls and bucking horses, but I still roped,” Egloff said. “When I got accepted to veterinary school was also when I got married, and my wife dropped out of college to help put me through college. So, one thing I will say, probably to anybody, is that she’s been the biggest influence over me... We ended up in Pennsylvania, and I have become a huge fan of Adams County, PA, and Pennsylvania in general, and I now love the standardbred horse.”

Prior to his move to the Keystone State, Egloff spent some time down south in the Bluegrass and beyond.

“When I graduated from veterinary school, I had an opportunity to go to Hager, Davis and McGee [Veterinarian Services] in Lexington, and Dr. Bill McGee kind of took me under his wing... We did Frank Ervin’s work, and so I went with him to Mr. Ervin’s

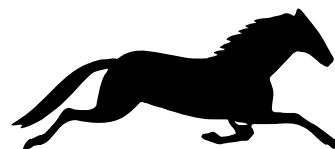

barn, and at that time he had Bret Hanover and Kerry Way, the great filly that won that Hambletonian. So that was my first exposure to standardbreds.”

Seeing races at The Red Mile were responsible for putting Egloff on his harness racing Hall of Fame path.

“Alan Leavitt from Lana Lobell Farms called Dr. McGee looking for a veterinarian and Dr. McGee recommended me, and he called me, and I turned him down,” Egloff said. “He called me again, and I turned him down. And I was talking to one of my good friends, Dr. Johnny Griggs, and I said, ‘This guy from Pennsylvania keeps calling me. They want to hire me on a standardbred farm, and I don’t want to go to Pennsylvania, and I’ve never worked much with standardbreds.’ And Dr. Griggs said, ‘Would you go for a price?’ And I said, ‘Well, yeah, I guess I’d go for a price.’ And he said, ‘Next time he calls, tell him what it is.’

“So, the next time he called, I told him what it was, and he said, ‘I’ll have a plane pick you up Monday.’”

Egloff said he went to Lana Lobell with no intention of staying, and when the breeding season was over, he got another call from McGee.

“He said he had a job for me down south,” Egloff said. “I said, ‘Where down south?’ He said, ‘Way down south, Australia.’ And so, I asked him, ‘When do I have to let you know?’ And he said, ‘Pretty quick, because breeding season here ends, and theirs starts.’ So, I turned to my wife, Judy, and I said, ‘How long would it take us to get ready to go to Australia?’ She said, ‘I can start packing now.’ Ten days later with a 2-year-old and a 4-month-old baby, we landed in Sydney.”

After spending that breeding season Down Under, Egloff returned to the U.S. and was enticed back to Lana Lobell, and again received a call from McGee. This time his mentor wanted him to return to Kentucky and Hager, Davis and McGee. But Egloff liked Pennsylvania and decided it was time to venture out on his own, thus the founding of Vieux Carre Farms, the naming of which he gives credit to his wife.

"It was totally her idea, because I said nobody would be able to pronounce it," Egloff said with a laugh. "She said, 'Well, you brought me up north! She's from New Orleans, and she didn't want to give up her southern heritage, so she usually gets what she wants."

"I'd always wanted to start a farm of my own. Being at Lana Lobell, I think it was about 11 years, was great, because I got to meet all the major players in harness racing. I got to be friends with people like Billy Haughton and Jack Kopas. I got to meet all the top trainers, because they always came to look at the yearlings at Lana Lobell every year, so I got to know those guys, I got to know them really well."

Haughton's ability to spot what he wanted quickly in a yearling is well known, but Egloff said he wasn't the only one.

"[Haughton] really was terrific about everything, and he was one of those guys who, I think, made everybody that knew him feel like they were his best friends," Egloff said. "I mean, his personality was something, but I think the quickest guy to show yearlings to, for me, was Jack Kopas. He was the greatest. Jack never went over their knees, ankles, and all that stuff. He either liked them or he didn't like them, and he had an awful lot of success buying yearlings that weren't extremely high priced and turning them into great horses."

When told about the kind words Egloff had for his late dad, Kopas said, "The feeling was mutual. My father had a lot of respect for him as well, and so do I."

"When I decided to go out on my own, he was the first one to send me a horse to train, and I'll always be very grateful that he gave me that opportunity."

When asked if he thought Egloff had an advantage owning a breeding farm and also being a veterinarian, Kopas said, "It's obvious with all the success he had that the combination of the two probably helped, but I don't think there's ever been a better veterinarian as far as fertility goes."

"I know plenty of examples of people that sent him mares that they had been unable to get in foal for two or three years, and Doc would get them in foal."

"I believe when he was there at Lana Lobell for years, I think that 75 per cent of the mares they bred got in foal, and that's pretty phenomenal."

According to Kopas, Egloff was also excellent at diagnosing lameness.

"That's another thing a lot of people don't realize about him, he wasn't a one-trick pony," Kopas said. "I've had him diagnose horses over the phone for me. I'd tell him what the symptoms were, or what they were exhibiting, and he could come up with a solution, without even seeing the horse."

"I had a good filly by the name of Delinquent Account. I trained her when she was a 2- and 3-year-old and I was having some issues with her and none of the vets up here [in Canada] could come up with what the problem seemed to be. And I got a hold

of Dr. Egloff, and he diagnosed her over the phone. He told me what I needed to do, and we got it done, and she went on and was a pretty good mare.”

In addition to singing Egloff’s praises, Kopas also had a couple of funny stories to share.

“When I was still with my father, we were training at Ben White Raceway in Florida, and we had a virus go through the barn, and the colts and fillies couldn’t shake it,” Kopas said. “So, dad got hold of Doc, and he was telling him what was going on, and Doc said, ‘Well, get your vet to get you some Bactrim, it’s an oral solution, and give them that.’ My father said, ‘How much should I give them?’ In typical Egloff fashion, he said, ‘Well, you know when you take the top off a bottle and it goes glug, glug, glug? Give them two glugs.’

“But one of my favorite stories about Dr. Egloff involved George Hempt. Doc had said for years that if he ever had a 2-year-old colt get a record better than two minutes, he’d shave his beard off. And Doc and George owned a colt together, Pence Time, and he won at The Meadows. George was there with Doc that night and told him that he had the razor ready, but they just missed [breaking 2 minutes].

“A year later, I was racing Champagne Happy at Buffalo Raceway. Doc owned him with my father and Peter Rhulen and I won a New York Sire Stakes with him in [1]:58. And when I got back to the hotel, I called Doc and I said, ‘Get the razor out.’

“He’s a wonderful man in his profession, and a wonderful man in life, and I value his friendship, and always will.”

Marvin Katz: Challenge accepted



More than 60 years after tagging along with his father to Greenwood Raceway, standardbred breeder, owner, philanthropist and now Hall of Famer Marvin Katz still has a white hot passion for harness racing.

If there is one thing that motivates Marvin Katz, it's a challenge. It's a word that defines his career as a Toronto real estate developer, as one of harness racing's elite owners and breeders, and as the man that created the Breeders Crown Charity Challenge that has raised \$2.4 million over seven years.

Tonight (July 5), Katz will officially be inducted into the Harness Racing Hall of Fame in Goshen, NY. But he wants you to know it hasn't all been million-dollar races and seven-figure horses.

Tonight, Canadian Marvin Katz will be enshrined in the Harness Racing Hall of Fame.

“Part of coming up with the phrase the Breeders Crown Charity Challenge, the word ‘challenge’ resonated to me, because it was a challenge,” Katz said in February mere hours before being feted at the Dan Patch Awards in Orlando, FL as part of the Hall of Fame class of 2026. “To be in the business for decades is challenging, and you have to accept that there are going to be challenges, and you have to be able to work your way through that. It’s part of the sport. Anybody who’s in the sport will acknowledge that it can be very challenging.”

Katz’s passion for the sport was first stoked tagging along with his father to Greenwood Raceway on the shores of Lake Ontario in downtown Toronto in the days when the dearly departed track was packed.

“It could reach as much as 20,000 [people] and you couldn’t get a seat anywhere,” Katz said. “You had to pay to enter the building. You had to pay to buy a program. I forget the amount, I was young, but you already spent three, four or five dollars before you ever placed a bet and you couldn’t get a seat. It was common that you got shut out of the betting windows... It was exciting. I enjoyed it.

“Like every Canadian kid, I was a big fan of hockey and all the other sports... but I had a passion for [harness racing] almost right away and it created a fire in me that I wanted to be part of it if the opportunity presented itself, and it has.”

More than 60 years later, that fire is still roaring.

"I've been asked to own a thoroughbred a number of times and I've never owned a thoroughbred... I just love harness racing," Katz said. "My love, my passion, is harness racing."

Katz was in his 20s when he bought his first standardbred. Though, it was the better part of 25 years before Katz had his first huge success – winning the 1997 Meadowlands Pace with Dream Away with partners Al Libfeld and Sam Goldband.

"In the early years, I became involved with [the sport] because of my dad," Katz said. "As I got into my late 20s, early 30s, I was able to buy a horse, a cheap horse. The first horse I ever owned was J.M. Lassie. I paid \$14,000 for her and ended up getting back about \$10-12,000, so it wasn't too bad."

Katz then met trainer Doug Arthur, who picked out the owner's second and third horses.

"Both of them turned out to be very good stakes horses – regional, but they had nice careers – and I was able to sell them afterwards for good money. So it was off to a good start. But, unfortunately, that momentum didn't continue. And shortly thereafter, Al [Libfeld] became involved and Sam Goldband. I was in the business for about 10 years before they became a part of it."

Even adding good partners, it was far from an overnight success for Katz.

"It was difficult," Katz said. "There were times when I said to myself, 'I've had enough of this,' like anybody.

"The early years were a struggle... I was younger, and my career wasn't where it evolved to, eventually. So, all those things combined made it tough sledding. I recall one time sitting at The Red Mile in the grandstand, way up in the grandstand, thinking to myself, 'What do I have to do to have a horse to be able to race here?' Forget winning, just be able to race there. Now, of course, I look back at that and that was a challenge."

There's that word again.

Katz said everything finally clicked into place when he met the late bloodstock expert Bart Glass.

"The seminal change was with Bart, because Bart began to explain to myself and Al the value of breeding," Katz said. "And quite frankly, it was Al who tweaked to the breeding side of it before I did, to his credit. I was still more focused on racing, but slowly, we both began to be mentored by Bart... and learned quite a bit about it, and began to be enamored with it, and decided that was a route that we could take.

"I've been so blessed to have [owned] Captaintreacherous and Father Patrick and Tall Dark Stranger and Bar Hopping and Kissin In The Sand – great immortal horses, without question, many of them Horse of the Year and Hall of Fame horses. However, breeding and racing All The Time and Ariana G who won the Breeders Crown, won the Oaks two consecutive years, two full sisters. To have bred them, I don't think it's ever been done before, and I wonder if it'll ever be done again. I think that's an accomplishment. That is the pinnacle, because we bought

the mare [Cantab It All], we bred her, raised the foals. It was everything. It was every aspect of it involved. And to stand at the pinnacle of the sport like that with two full sisters, that's an astounding accomplishment... The beauty of being involved in breeding any type of livestock is the unknown and the promise each foal holds when it is born. That's part of the intoxicating attraction of it."

There have been 11 million-dollar standardbreds sold at auction in history and Katz has sold five of them – including the most expensive of all time: Amazing Catch, purchased for \$1.85 million at the 2024 Standardbred Horse Sales Company Mixed Sale in Harrisburg, PA as part of a dispersal of stock Katz owned jointly with Libfeld.

Katz and Libfeld also bred the sport's first million-dollar yearling, Maverick, who sold for \$1.1 million at the 2019 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

The former partners also bred and sold three horses for seven-figures apiece at the 2025 Harrisburg Mixed Sale: mares French Café (\$1 million) and French Champagne (\$1.15 million) and weanling Parisian Charm (\$1 million). Katz purchased all three bringing an end to his long-time partnership with Libfeld, a fellow Torontonionian.

"Obviously, Al and I have separated, and I'm saddened because we were great friends for decades, and we traveled a big part of this journey together," Katz said. "But, we had our own minds, and it was really time. He wanted his course of action, and I wanted mine. We have different personalities, and it was just time for us to do that. So, thankfully, it's behind both of us, and clearly I wish him nothing but the best, and I certainly hope that my program continues to grow."

As for his charitable efforts via the Breeders Crown Charity Challenge, Katz said it's something harness racing needs to embrace with more frequency and energy.

"I could assure you that all large scale development construction companies in Toronto are engaged in philanthropic activities," Katz said. "All industries, be it technology, Coca Cola, Amazon and everyone else, they give back to their communities because it's the right thing to do. I think horse racing, and harness racing specifically, has to understand that we are part of these communities, and we have to be committed to giving back to them. I don't want to sound like I'm preaching, but I think it's good business and the right thing to do."

In terms of breeding and racing world class horses, the partnership dispersal with Libfeld only launched a new chapter.

Katz has purchased the former property of famed Brittany Farms in Versailles, KY and renamed it Clear Creek at Brittany Farms.

"I have a great team around me – Perry Soderberg, Bobby Brady, Jimmy Glass," Katz said. "They've been part of our group for a long time, and they're some of the best people in the industry. It's consistent with doing my development business. I try to surround myself with top-flight people and carefully listen

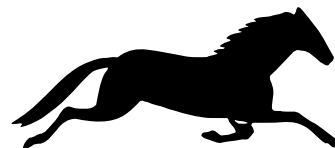

to their input and then make what I hope are good business decisions going forward. As far as my breeding program, we’re going to breed 55 mares this year.

“[Former Brittany farm managers] Dale Hogan and Patty Hogan stayed on operating the farm. [Brittany owner] George [Segal] still has a large presence in it. That’s still a home base for a large part of his operation. George and I have become very good friends. We’ve had lunches and dinners together and so forth. So it’s a friendship that’s evolved and grown over the years.

“There have been more millionaires and more Breeders Crown winners come off that [property] than anywhere in the world. I don’t see that’s going to change. It’s the same feeding program, same piece of dirt, everything’s the same. And of course, we sell with Bobby Brady at Kentuckiana. I think it’s a superb situation.”

None of it happened overnight.

“It’s been a long journey started back at Greenwood Raceway as a young boy going with my dad,” Katz said, promising to honor his father in Goshen.

He won’t, for one second, forget where he came from and how it shaped where he ended up.

Michael Kimelman is by no means a one-trick pony

His blue-chip harness racing résumé extends far beyond a successful New York breeding farm.

It is rather fitting that Michael Kimelman has fashioned a blue-chip harness racing résumé. When the man whose name has become synonymous with standardbred success is officially inducted into the Harness Racing Hall of Fame in Goshen, NY on July 5, it will recognize

a lifetime of contributions to the sport, including those made through Blue Chip Farms.

“As far as the most exciting thing about this [Hall of Fame induction], I would say that it is all the guys who are in there were my buddies, guys who were my friends in racing,” Kimelman said. “So, I’m excited to join them.”

Elected in the Veterans category, which allows the U.S. Harness Writers Association’s Hall of Fame screening committee to directly elect one longtime distinguished contributor who has reduced their day-to-day involvement in the sport, Kimelman joins an elite group of industry leaders.

The significance of the honor is not lost on him.

“I am very grateful,” Kimelman said. “I love the sport and it means so much to be part of something that is very special.”

Kimelman’s journey into harness racing began through an investment opportunity presented to his late father, Oscar Kimelman, himself a Hall of Fame Immortal. Oscar, along with sons Michael and Ted, quickly developed a passion for the sport and purchased a 600-acre property in Wallkill, NY, that would become Blue Chip Farms, home to some of the sport’s greatest stallions, including Most Happy Fella and Bettors Delight.

Michael forged an early connection to Most Happy Fella through horse ownership.

“When I bought my first horse, Meadow Tarport – my dad and I bought two-thirds of a horse for \$20,000 – the first race she’s in, the horse that was second was a horse called Laughing Girl, who was the dam of arguably the greatest pacing sire who ever lived, certainly the one who put Blue Chip Farms on the map and put the New York Sires Stakes on the map,” he said.

Michael has a seemingly endless list of superlatives for Most Happy Fella.

It’s easy to understand why he would.

Foaled in 1967 in Kentucky, the son of Meadow Skipper out of the Good Time mare Laughing Girl won the 1970 Triple Crown and was voted Pacer of the Year.

“He was just outstanding,” Michael said.

Most Happy Fella stood as a star stallion at Blue Chip Farms in New York. At his passing in 1983, his offspring had earned over \$55 million. His most famous progeny was the great Cam Fella.

“He had a stud fee of \$40,000,” Michael said. “We didn’t have limits in those days, so he bred more mares than any stallion in the country. The good thing was that anyone who had the money could breed a mare to him. It wasn’t controlled by a handful of breeding farms – everybody could breed to Most Happy Fella. He was such a great producer that anyone who never had a great horse would get one because they had an inexpensive mare and got a home run.”

Michael also scored another major victory when he convinced Hall of Fame farm manager Bill Brown to join Blue Chip Farms,

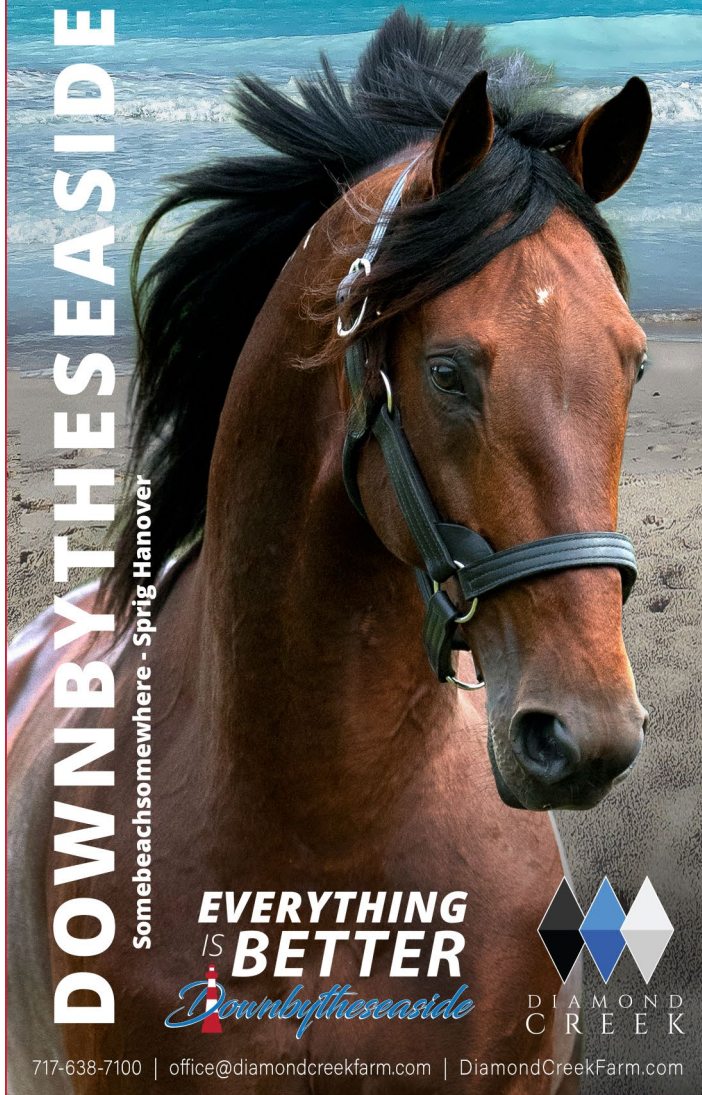

Tonight, Michael Kimelman Sr. will be enshrined in the Harness Racing Hall of Fame.

further cementing the operation's reputation as one of North America's premier breeding farms.

"What a great person and great horseman," Michael said of Brown. "We were very lucky to have had him at our farm."

Despite the demands of running a successful Wall Street investment firm, Kimelman and Baird, at the time, he served as president of Blue Chip from 1970 to 2001, before Michael's partner and friend Thomas Grossman took over the reins of the farm.

Yet, Michael is by no means a one-trick pony when it comes to his long list of contributions to racing.

His impact on the industry extended well beyond standout pacers and trotters.

Michael was also part of a small but determined group, one that included longtime friend Norman Woolworth (the man who co-bred Most Happy Fella, along with David Johnston of Stoner Creek Stud), that led the way in strengthening ties between North American and European breeders and owners, which led to top European standardbreds racing in North America. The establishment of French wagering on the Hambletonian was also a part of the success of Michael's group.

A famous, century-old French bistro in Paris would become an important venue for furthering the connection between the two groups.

"I found this little bistro named L'Ami Louis," Michael said. "Today, it might be the most famous bistro in the world – it only seats

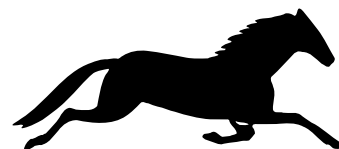

52 people. They close it one Sunday after the Prix d'Amérique – if you wanted to entertain people from Sweden, Italy, France and other places, everyone went to that race – for a party that the Hambletonian Society hosts. The Europeans treat us at the track and then we treat them at the bistro.”

Michael also has a deep admiration and respect for the Canadian racing scene.

“Dr. Glen Brown and what he did with the breeding operation (ABC Farms, later known as Armbro Farms) in Ontario was world-class,” Michael said of the highly prominent veterinarian, breeder, and executive, who is regarded as one of the most influential figures in Canadian harness racing. “They supported Blue Chip so much over the years and were stakeholders in Most Happy Fella.”

Michael has been equally impactful on the sport in his home state.

He was appointed by the New York State Senate Majority to the Board of the Agriculture and New York State Horse Breeding Development Fund. The fund, also known as the Sire Stakes Fund, administers the premier New York Sire Stakes racing program.

Michael served as an active trustee for several years, voting on critical annual purse allocations, racing schedules, and administrative policy updates. He officially stepped down from his role as a trustee of the Fund in June 2018.

“As soon as we bought Blue Chip Farms, they told me to go to Albany and the lobbyists will set you up, to meet all the important politicians,” Michael said. “I got up there and fired the lobbyists and I became the lobbyist. I took pictures of Blue Chip Farms and showed what we had done.

“I said, ‘If you put more money into this program, you will turn a lot of apple orchards and cattle farms into breeding farms. And you will make a huge difference in the agricultural scene in New York.’ And they agreed. They tied some of it to OTB, but the long and short of it was that two or three years later, our purses were phenomenal, and there was a huge influx of breeding farms in New York.”

Michael has also served on the board of the Hambletonian Society since 1987; he is today first vice president as well as a member of the Society’s executive committee and Breeders Crown committee, in the latter role setting up a key rights fee structure that has enabled the event to maintain its status as one of the standardbred racing’s marquee fixtures.

“I have been associated with the industry for a long time, and it is something that is truly special to me,” Michael said. “I have been very fortunate in so many ways, including the chance to work with so many great people.”

Communicators Hall of Fame welcomes Taylor, Giwner



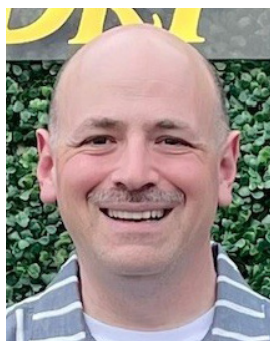

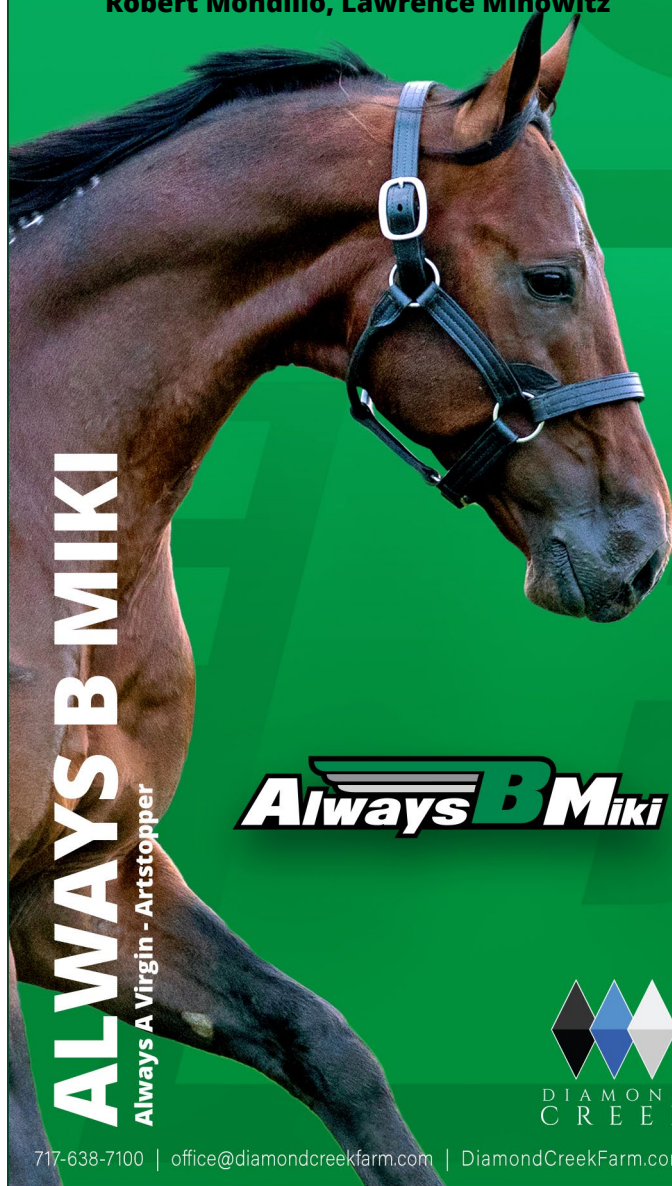

My Hall of Fame life with Ellen Taylor

I wrestled with what to write about Ellen Taylor on her Communicators Hall of Fame induction weekend.

First, I wanted to avoid any overlap from her introduction which I will handle tonight (July 5).

It wasn't until Monday (June 29) when, after running it by a few, that common sense seized the day.

"Why don't you tell us how you two got together and the journey from then to now?" someone suggested. I wish I had thought of that.

Ellen and I have been together 13 years plus and live in Anderson, IN three miles from Hoosier Park. We have been here since January 2019. Before that it was quite a bit of that long distance thing from New Jersey for me.

I've known of Ellen and the Harness Horse Youth Foundation for years. I'm not sure if I ever met her mother Margot, she passed away 1994, but we figure I more than likely did in various winner's circles and HHYF events at the track. Still, I hadn't really met/gotten to know Ellen.

February 2003 in Florida for the Horse of the Year banquet would be the perfect storm I thought. The main reason I was going was because Stanley Dancer was close by and wanted to see me win my Dan Patch Award, more than likely knowing this was going to be his final public appearance. Around dinnertime the night before the festivities I heard

an announcement over the loudspeaker that the USHWA congregation was to meet poolside at 8:30.

I'll just wander over plop down and go from there I thought. Ellen's roommate was sick and, well, this was *not* the time.

Fast forward to 2009, the January horse sale in The Meadowlands paddock. I had promised two people a large, actually basketball-sized, Mrs. Heyden's famous chocolate chip cookies. Neither showed. In my world you never returned anything that mom made. She took that personally. So, I set out to find two new recipients for these gifts. The first one gone in a flash. As I stood perusing the room, I saw Ellen standing, actually leaning, on a corner stanchion. Perfect. So, I brought it over, happy to do it, with no strings attached. I loved the work she did with the kids, even from a distance. All good.

Let's jump to Sept. 7, 2012, when Steve Wolf informs me that Sam McKee and I will go into the Communicators Hall the following July. We made it! Now it starts getting a little, shall we say, off the rails. In November 2012 an ex-girlfriend reads about the HOF and says she will have my "outfit approval." OK. January comes and another ex-girlfriend announces she's going as my date. I said, "But I thought you had gotten married?" She said, "I did."

February in Florida was a lot of fun with a ton going on, and I will never forget me, Ashley, and Trysta Tetrick – she was just a 1-year-old then – going into the pool for the very first time. Anyway, I inquire a couple times "Has anyone seen Ellen Taylor?" Nope.

Stan Bergstein told me that the best of the bunch of roses was always surrounded by the stickiest thorns. Like this?

Once again, I had a handful of air. But because of that being a full slate kind of year for me, it didn't register that much. April saw me go to PEI for an honorary dinner.

May 2013, I get a pack of Harness Hero cards from HHYF/ Ellen. Heck, I'm in it. My very own card. How cool! Ellen sent a gracious note with it. (No, no, no, not an apology, come on now).

I call her on June 10, and this is exactly what I said to myself before she picked up, "I don't know if she's married with three

kids, but I am going to talk to her and find out!" We have not missed a single day since.

Then I had two things to resolve. First, what about Hall of Fame night? My table is already full. Will Ellen understand? Did you ever try to un-invite someone to your own Hall of Fame ceremony? Luckily Ellen (kind of) understood. And I did mention her in my speech.

Fast forward a few months as I'm now meeting Ellen's family at a few functions and Ellen's dad is going into the Indiana Racing Hall of Fame. Richard Taylor was a quiet man. He didn't say much because he didn't have to. He had a presence for sure. After six to eight months or so when he sensed this might be it for his daughter, he decided to call someone on the East Coast who would very likely know me.

Let me pause half a moment and come right back to this, because in the years from approximately 2010-13 or so two trainers I got along with famously – Jimmy Takter and Doug Ackerman – both enter the fray. Completely separate from the other, they both often referred to me as their "best friend." Yes, me. Hey, who am I to question two Hall of Fame luminaries such as these two? Even though they were likely pulling my leg quite a bit, they both said it a bunch of times. I was quite honored to be honest with you.

Now, back to Richard Taylor. He as a father did his due diligence. Remember it was not only father-daughter, but they worked side by side with the horses forever. So now Richard makes the call to the person he trusts the most. The person who absolutely will give it to him straight. He must of course look out for his daughter's best interests. He does make the call. To his BFF, Doug Ackerman.

Anthony MacDonald says his wife Amy helps keep TheStable stable

I last [wrote about Anthony MacDonald](#) on May 14, 2023. At that time TheStable.ca was about to embark on its most successful racing year ever. Each year that the enterprise has been in business has seen an improvement in its racing fortunes over those of the previous year.

As this column is being formulated, it brings to mind the great Frank Sinatra/Count Basie song The Best is Yet To Come or another great hit, You Ain't Seen Nothing Yet.

We are just in early July and it appears as though TheStable's group of 2-year-olds are by a considerable distance, its greatest group ever. As of this past Wednesday (July 1), they number the homebred Lou Armstrong, a strong favorite for last night's \$150,000 Next Generations colt trot at Scioto and Dublins Ferani an entrant in the \$150,000 filly event of the Next Generations; Atomix Hanover a winner in 1.52.3f in an overnight at The Meadows last Saturday, two strong candidates in the first legs of The Kindergarten Series at The Meadowlands, the trotting colt Super Way and the trotting filly Exquis, Dame Hanover, a good second in the Stallion Series on Wednesday, plus numerous other 2-year-olds, now beginning or about to begin their racing careers.

These, plus significant entrants in races in just about every jurisdiction where breeding incentive races take place. This year's crop of freshmen includes eligibles in Kentucky, Michigan, Minnesota, New Jersey, New York, and Ontario.

We last discussed TheStable back in May of 2023 what has changed since then?

"In terms of actual change, not all that much. Our people are pretty much the same. Of course, we still have my wife Amy and I overseeing it all.

"In Ohio, where the greatest part of the operation is situated, Jason McGinnis is the main man. Jason will also be going to supervise in New York and New Jersey, where Amy is currently holding down the fort.

"Back in 2023, we were still headquartered in Ontario.

"In Ontario, Dominick Gladu and Harry Poulton are still our two main trainers, with my baby brother James as our 'dollar a year' man.

"Tim Twaddle remains our person in charge in Pennsylvania.

"Cathy and Eric Patalan run things for us in Kentucky.

"I kind of float around driving the horses where I feel I can be useful and in situations where I can't be there, making use of the best drivers available.

"Before I go any further, I believe I need to make note of Amy's importance to the organization. In short, she is the rock and the foundation of TheStable.ca.

"People sometimes ask me 'How do you do it? How do you manage 100 or more horses?' The simple answer is, I don't. Much more than me, it's Amy who does. When we were first beginning, it was Amy who urged me to risk everything to embark on the dream that we both shared.

"In addition to being the best wife and mother to our three kids, her involvement in TheStable is always as big as necessity asks

it to be. An example is this week’s Kindergarten races at The Meadowlands. She drove to New Jersey with the horses and took and supervised Super Way and Exquis there...

“She will oversee all of the horses we race in the upcoming New York Sires Stakes, plus anything else that might come up where she can be of help.

“Regarding our clients, we have somewhere around 900 fractional owners from 15 different countries involved. A majority of those have been with us from at or near the beginning. Most of our losses as far as owners are concerned have sadly been due to death. I look upon our operation as a big family. We delight together in all our successes and we also share in the disappointments.”

From the outside looking in, it seems to me that in terms of your yearling shopping you have raised your level of involvement. It seems that you are more inclined to go for that home run horse at a sometimes-higher price rather than looking for that diamond in the rough at a more manageable number. Is that the case?

“Yes and no. In instances where we spend more than we have done in the past, it is because our financial status has allowed us to do so. Even in our formative years, we would step out at a significant price if we felt the horse in question was a good buy and good value for what we were spending. Of course, in all cases, we needed to have the means to pay for what we were buying. In every situation, our guiding motivation is value. We probably bid on more than a hundred yearlings each in Lexington and Harrisburg. I’d guess that we probably end up buying 10 per cent or less of what we bid on.

“This past year, we bought three Day 1 Yearlings in Lexington and four at Harrisburg. All seven of those horses have already

or are soon to have raced. At least three of them are now what I consider to be stakes horses.

“I like to think that we have improved the quality of our shopping. When we first embarked on this voyage, neither Amy nor I had a whole lot of experience in buying or training yearlings. As with most encounters in life, we have learned from experience. I’d like to believe that we are better shoppers than we were before. Are we perfect? Far from it. Is there a perfect shopper? I don’t believe so. If there is, I haven’t yet met him.”

In addition to your strong group of 2-year-olds and your always good group of overnight horses, it appears as though you have one of the very best 3-year-old trotters in the country.

“We bought Jailbird Jog in Lexington in 2023. We gave \$52,000 for her. That’s more than our average price for a yearling. We looked at her and immediately liked her. She is one of those hybrids combining trotting and pacing blood that have had a great deal of success in recent years.

“In her case, she is by Tactical Landing, a sire who we like a lot and with who we have had lots of success and out of an unraced SJ’s Caviar mare who is a full sister to the great European champion Don Fanucci Zet.

“Where the pacing blood comes in is that her dam, Miss Don Fanucci is out of another unraced mare, this one by the pacer Western Terror.

“From that point on, the family is one entirely of pacers.

“She was a lovely filly and she trotted well in her video. So, we took a shot.

“She was a very good 2-year-old. We only raced her six times. She won three of them, took a record of 1.51.4 and earned \$182,500. Thus far this year, she has already won the Oak Grove Oaks and has earned over \$100,000. If all goes well, we are looking forward to starting her in this year’s Hambletonian Oaks.”

In addition to managing a stable of over 100 horses, you and Amy are the parents of three precocious youngsters, Ava 15, Oliver 12, and Adeline 7. How do you manage to get enough time to give all that is needed to do justice to your parental duties and the needs of your large stable?

“It’s not always easy, but we have found, for our family, the best method has been to combine the two responsibilities and in various areas to compartmentalize them. I’d like to think that we never shirk our responsibilities in either, but in the very few, if any, times where push comes to shove, that we act in a manner, where the needs of our kids become foremost.

“This week Amy is in New York and New Jersey and I’ve been racing horses in Ohio and Pennsylvania. I drive between Northfield, The Meadows, and the fairs. When I’m driving, the kids are usually in the car with me. If I’m on the road, Amy has the kids with her. Oliver is a pretty good baseball player. I try to get to most of his games. Last Friday evening was an open racing night for me, so the family took in a Guardians game in Cleveland. On Monday I was racing at the Marion Fair and the kids came along and enjoyed the fun, both at the fair and the racing.”

Nightlife In dominates after surviving tough Sprintermästaren eliminations

Four talented elimination winners advanced to Thursday's (July 2) \$240,000 Sprintermästaren final at Halmstad, but when the dust settled it was Nightlife In who proved he was in a league of his own.

The draw favored the elimination winners, with the four heat victors receiving the inside post positions for the championship. David Persson's **Nightlife In** (Day Or Night In), however, was the last of those four to choose a post, yet still landed in the ideal spot and made the most of it.

The opening elimination produced perhaps the most eye-catching performance of the afternoon. **Variegated** (Chapter Seven), trained by Daniel Redén, rallied from fourth-over despite moderate fractions and unleashed a sustained three-wide move over the final three-eighths to score in 1:54.4. It was the colt's first victory since arriving in Sweden.

Mon Amour d'Aurcy controlled the pace early with Gangster Vendil applying pressure first-over. The leader began to tire entering the stretch and eventually made a break after drifting down toward the pylons. Gangster Vendil briefly inherited the lead before Variegated powered past late.

"He's a big horse and perhaps needed a few races before finding his best form," driver Örjan Kihlström said. "Daniel felt he would race well today, and he certainly did."

The second elimination belonged to Nightlife In, who once again displayed his trademark determination. Mellby Narrow blasted to the front for Daniel Wäjersten but surrendered the lead turning for home as Carl Johan Jepson angled Nightlife In to the outside. The son of Day Or Night In wore down the leader and prevailed in 1:54.0.

"He's always been a talented horse, and I was very pleased with his effort," Jepson said.

"It's always easy to say afterward, but we knew we had [Nightlife In] in top form. He toyed with them today [in the Sprintermästaren final]. I've had a feeling all day this could happen. What a horse we have."

The third elimination featured one of the afternoon's biggest disappointments when heavily favored Blank made an early break after being forced to steady four-wide into the first turn, ending his chances almost immediately.

After Ghirardelli yielded the lead to Mountcastle, the pace became demanding enough that the pacesetter weakened turning for home. That opened the door for **Lion Express** (Readly Express), who advanced first-over and proved best in 1:53.4. Nicolai Hanover closed strongly for second ahead of Ghirardelli.

Italian standout **Golden Boy** (Maharajah) made the final elimination look easy. Once Ivanisevic broke at the start, Alessandro Gocciadoro sent his colt directly to the front, dictated the pace throughout, and coasted home in 1:54.3. Urban Profile rallied well for second, while Moonshot finished third but failed to qualify for the final on earnings.

"He raced very well, and more importantly he left the gate better than usual," Gocciadoro said. "He's definitely one of the better horses in the final."

The championship itself turned into a tactical affair.

Variegated fired off the rail but had no answer for Nightlife In's superior early speed into the first turn. Once Jepson secured the lead, Lion Express settled first-over and the pace slowed dramatically through the middle stages – similar to the filly division final held earlier on the card.

That left late-closing contenders Golden Boy and Wise Guy with difficult assignments after launching from third- and fourth-over, respectively, down the backstretch.

Neither could threaten the leader.

Nightlife In drew away impressively through the lane to capture the Sprintermästaren final in 1:54.1, giving trainer Persson one of the biggest victories of his career.

“It’s always easy to say afterward, but we knew we had the horse in top form,” Persson said. “He toyed with them today. I’ve had a feeling all day this could happen. What a horse we have.” Jepson, who also won the prestigious event a year ago with Far Wise As, admitted this victory carried special meaning.

“This is an incredible feeling,” he said. “I’m proud of everyone who has worked with this horse. Things hadn’t gone perfectly leading into today, but we purposely waited to race him barefoot because we believed this was the right spot. He left the gate sharply, felt terrific throughout, and fought all the way to the wire. I actually threw my whip in celebration for the first time in my career. It’s hard not to get emotional. This means a lot to both David and me.”

Variegated finished a solid second after enjoying a perfect pocket trip behind the winner, while Golden Boy rallied for third ahead of Wise Guy.

GOURMET D’ARC GIVES HAGOORT AND BAKKER THIRD STOSPRINTERN CROWN IN FIVE YEARS

The combination of Paul Hagoort and Robin Bakker has become synonymous with success in the \$200,000 Stosprintern, and on Thursday (July 2) at Halmstad they captured the prestigious event for the third time in five years as **Gourmet d’Arc** delivered a determined first-over victory.

The complexion of the race changed before the wings folded when one of the favorites, Milady Josselyn, got out of position behind the gate and made a break prior to the start.

That allowed Mimosa To Martini (Gimpanzee), driven by Mats E. Djuse, to protect the rail and control the pace. Djuse was able to back the tempo down significantly after the opening quarter, and midway through the mile the field remained in single file as the leader enjoyed a comfortable breather before the pace intensified entering the final turn.

Meanwhile, Bakker had moved Gourmet d’Arc (Six Pack) first-over after less than a quarter-mile and patiently stalked the pacesetter without applying sustained pressure until the final bend.

Turning for home, the race became a two-horse battle.

Gourmet d’Arc gradually wore down the game leader through the stretch to score convincingly in 1:53.3, recording her 10th victory from just 14 lifetime starts.

“The third one!” Bakker said with a smile after the race. “I’m so happy for the owners. Things haven’t gone our way in previous finals with her, so we changed the preparation this time. I could see Mats didn’t have much horse left entering the final turn, and I never even had to pull the ear plugs.”

Mimosa To Martini held well for second, while Princessofthedawn (Maharajah), trained by André Eklundh, finished third.

The victory further strengthened Hagoort and Bakker’s remarkable recent record in the Stosprintern. They previously won the race with Chebba Mil in 2022 and Julia Sisu in 2023, making Gourmet d’Arc their third champion in the last five editions.

EUROPEAN STARS HEADLINE ULF THORESEN GRAND INTERNATIONAL

Some of Europe’s biggest trotting stars will be in action today (July 5) at Jarlsberg as the Norwegian oval hosts the \$162,500 Ulf Thoresen Grand International, one of Scandinavia’s premier summer events.

Leading the field is Don Fanucci Zet (Hard Livin), who makes his first start since finishing fifth in the final of Sweden’s prestigious Elitlopp at the end of May. Trainer Daniel Redén also sends Kentucky River (Father Patrick), giving his stable a formidable two-horse entry in the international feature.

The Redén duo will face a deep field that includes Daim Brodda (Readly Express), Betting Pacer (Maharajah), Italian standout Executiv Ek (Face Time Bourbon), and Danish star Get A Wish (Wishing Stone).

Today’s Jarlsberg card is packed with quality races, but the Ulf Thoresen Grand International is unquestionably the centerpiece.

The race honors legendary Norwegian reinsman Thoresen, who passed away in July 1992 at the age of 42. Widely regarded as one of the greatest drivers in harness racing history, Thoresen captured the World Driving Championship four times and enjoyed an unforgettable 1986 season, winning both the Hambletonian with Nuclear Kosmos and the International Trot at Roosevelt Raceway with Habib.

Odds-and-ends handicapping is the guide to cashing for profit, Part 1

The doctor looked me square in the face and said, “You have to get an operation. More like a procedure. But you have to go under.”

“Are there any problems usually connected to this kind of surgery?” I said.

“Just one. Pancreatitis.”

“Not a good one. But tell me what are the chances I get it during this particular procedure?”

“Fourteen per cent.”

“Well that is 6-1 odds.”

“If you say so.”

“Yes. It means 86-1 I do not get pancreatitis. Make my appointment, please.”

I came out of the procedure successfully and without pancreatitis. It confirmed again that the odds-to-percentage chart I use when handicapping every horse race, I play or pass, represents the essence of handicapping. It is not a system or a gimmick that picks winners; it is a mathematic tool that tests the breadth of my expertise in any situation. My surgeon used it. Scientists use it. Astrophysicists use it. And on and on. Even if they do not invest in pari-mutuel wagering.

The percentage side of the two-column chart defines its value in odds. Both columns need to be memorized so a bettor can handicap a pari-mutuel race by definition. Forget the morning line. It does not qualify as a strong tool because it lists odds that are skewed because the percentages add to more than 100 per cent. Accuracy counts. One-hundred per cent is the correct percentage to any odds line made for any outcome.

I explained in my [previous Among Ourselves column](#) that every act we take part in as we move through life is measured – handicapped – to express its chances of success. We think success or failure that suggests a 50-50 chance for each result. Translated to odds it means one-to-one. Even odds. But chances for success doing anything is not always 50-50.

Learning to use the odds-to-percentage chart became essential to long-run profiting at pari-mutuel racing because – believe it or not and you better believe it – the majority of players contributing to wagering pools are weighed down by the tropes of betting on horse races.

My surgeon knew the exact percentages of getting pancreatitis was 14 per cent, based on solid data. By trusting it I was able to see the odds were on my side because 86 plus 14 equals 100. Whamo. My chances of no complications were excellent. The odds were on my side.

Learning to establish how you measure the chances for any outcome is the one tool few to none use when handicapping horse races. Professional players cannot persist in gambling – no less make a profit – without learning to make an accurate personal odds line (POL). Not that a POL will always be a perfect measure. But it beats picking one winner out of any sized field of horses in a race. It represents your total opinion to make the most money while wagering against all the other folks betting into a wagering pool.

Learning to use the odds-to-percentage chart became essential to long-run profiting at pari-mutuel racing because – believe it or not and you better believe it – the majority of players contributing to wagering pools are weighed down by the tropes of betting on horse races. They wager with strange mixtures of opinion and unaffected information which they can rarely explain with any objective evidence:

“I like the 3,” said bettor A.

“Why?” said bettor B.

“Almost won last time out. Better post here. Good driver.”

“What about the 6?”

“I would never like the 6.”

“Why not?”

“I don’t like how he looks in the warm-up.”

“What about his class? Isn’t he stepping down in class?”

“So what?”

This is only the handicapping part of tossing a profit for anyone. The other element is money management. The two are married in the evidence of math... Their bond enjoys the gifts of collecting money our fellow bettors add to the wagering pools they stuff with a passion driven by ego and a fair shake of luck.

“I like that. What about the 8?”

“Never bet the outside post.”

“Trainer is doing well.”

“I bet his trainer twice and lost both times. So coming out of an outside post is death warmed over, you know?”

There are countless conversations like that between bettors and even though others may be based upon a great deal of knowledge and experience it is rare they meet a professional level; when the player has interpreted a choice to bet with odds to play that demand a bet or – dare I say it – pass the bet because a horse does not offer the odds worth the bet.

Many times I spent a 10-race card making only two bets and losing both with no regret because the same handicapping decision in the past brought me profits by betting or passing. I learned to reduce my opinions on any wager I made based on the odds I demanded; not on the driver or the trainer or the morning line or the post position or what the public handicappers explained in the program or on their podcasts.

This is only the handicapping part of tossing a profit for anyone. The other element is money management. The two are married in the evidence of math. Not in astrology or any other magical theories. Their bond enjoys the gifts of collecting money our fellow bettors add to the wagering pools they stuff with a passion driven by ego and a fair shake of luck.

A lesson from the ages

Modern harness races are distant relatives of the chariot races in the Circus Maximus. For more than a thousand years, the ancient races were part sporting event, part political theater, and part religious festival.

Racing at the Circus Maximus was chaotic, dangerous, and sometimes corrupt. There were riots, cheating, politics, and occasional violence. Yet for more than a thousand years, Romans could not get enough of it. The fans were rabid. The teams at the horse races became tribal identities. Fans talked incessantly about racing and wore their hearts on the sleeves of their togas and tunics.

What can we learn from these people and their favorite sport from long ago that applies to present-day harness racing? If you think nothing, I disagree. The Romans were very much like you and me - human nature does not change with the centuries. The Romans built an Empire filled with inventions, innovations, arts, and construction projects that still exist.

What were the principles of chariot racing in the Roman Empire that gave it such incredible power and longevity? Besides the fact that chariot drivers stood and harness horse drivers sit, what is different from our racing?

The biggest difference between Roman racing and modern harness racing isn't speed, equipment, gambling, or attendance. The key difference is that Roman fans supported teams. In ancient Rome, the racing factions – Blues, Greens, Reds, and Whites – gave fans an identity. People didn't root for a random driver or a random race; they belonged to a faction. They cheered for and against sporting foes. Their passion was passed down through generations. That sense of allegiance created an emotional connection that extended beyond any single race.

Without that kind of team identity, harness racing feels fragmented. Fans occasionally follow individual horses or drivers for short periods, but they do not feel that same loyalty. If modern racing could foster a greater sense of belonging – whether through teams, syndicates, or communities – a deeper engagement would help us grow and remain viable.

When we click on our devices tonight, we have several harness races available. Unless we own one of the horses in the race or have an attachment to one of the owners of the horse, who cares? It's pretty simple: when people feel they're part of something, they care more. Harness racing asks people to care about random races and horses they don't own, then make a wager.

Today's sport promotes races more than people. People follow people. Horses are wonderful creatures, but they barely move the needle of mass engagement. Even if you agree with this thesis, your reaction will be – "That's not how this sport works," or "Nice idea that cannot be done."

Mention teams in harness racing, and eyes immediately begin to roll.

Why?

You can create teams at any level, for almost everything, and the experience will be improved. The LA Dodgers are a team in a league. I just watched 8-year-old girls play for their team in

a community softball league. Do you want to bowl alone, golf alone, or watch your favorite football team scrimmage against teammates?

Teams can be created for harness racing. You do not even need to modify the current structure of racing one iota or pay a dime to attempt to create a team dynamic in our sport.

Shooting from the hip, I will create one for our sport in five minutes.

On April 1, the operator of this business plan, Chauncey T, has been working behind the scenes and has his ducks in a row for his product launch.

Chauncey found eight owners who will purchase multiple yearlings at next year's auctions that will hopefully race in the 2027 season, and he gave them a call. Let's name a couple of the big-deal, high-rolling owners - Franklin L. Jasper, Reginald M. Buxton. The owners pay nothing. Risk nothing. They don't need to do much. They play for fun, pride, and maybe a cheesy trophy.

In March, as the 2-year-olds were in training, Chauncey asked the eight participating owners to select a dozen of their 2-year-olds to represent him in the new league. It does not matter what staking plan the owners have in mind, what trainers they have in mind, or where they are racing. The league is all about totaling purse money earned by the 12 nominated young horses.

These owners are saying to the other seven owners - my dozen selected horses will earn (in total) more than your dozen selected horses during calendar year 2027. Period. Simple.

Chauncey names the league the WMD (Watch My Dust) League.

The owners use subheadings for their dozen horses - BUX for Buxton horses, JAS for Jasper horses, etc.

The team rosters, consisting of a dozen 2-year-olds in training, are posted on April 1.

Wagering on the teams closes in 30 days, on May 1. The wagering is very simple. There are no fluctuating odds. None of the 96 horses can be replaced. No new horses can enter. There is no takeout in this model. Chauncey makes his money on the interest for holding the pot for six months.

In an eight-team league, a \$1,000 supporter of the champion would collect \$6,000, while a supporter of the runner-up would still receive \$2,000 - twice his original investment. That is an

attractive payoff structure that gives wagerers a reason to follow a team all season. As a player, you can use any method to choose your team. You can carefully study the yet-to-race 96 horses, choose a favorite color or name, use a dartboard or Ouija board - who cares? You just chose your team and wager what you want.

Would Trey play? Heck yes, I'd play. This league would be a massive improvement over losing a grand by daily paper cuts with high takeouts over a long season. I would not need to watch or wager on a single race that I don't care a hoot about.

Here is the real benefit for our sport.

Anyone can download a free app. The app on your phone has the running scoreboard. Every time it dings or buzzes, that is your signal that in five minutes, a WMD race is going to post. This can be one of your dozen stables of horses, or it can be any one of the 80 opposing horses in the league. Ding ding ding. Buzz, buzz, buzz. You have something to watch and cheer for or against all season long.

I tell my pals about my team of horses. They start to follow my team. They put an app on their phone to check in on league races and standings. What a great way to learn the sport. What a great way to have fun. How many things can you name that a team dynamic would spice up the games: t-shirts, team songs, parties, chat rooms, memes, blah blah.

Now, how difficult was it to create a team concept? I could devise five more in an hour.

How much fun would that be to play?

What does it matter if a dozen or a million people pick a team and get an app?

Who loses?

Teams rule. The Romans understood that two thousand years ago. Fans want heroes, rivals, and bragging rights. Harness racing already has magnificent horses, courageous drivers, and generations of tradition.

What we need are teams.

Brandon Blvd dominant in Pace elimination

Forgoing a bye to the \$810,000 Grade 1 Meadowlands Pace final, **Brandon Blvd** served notice to his nine rivals in the lone \$50,000 elimination of the midsummer classic for 3-year-old pacers on Saturday (July 4) at The Meadowlands, delivering a devastating 1:47.3 win.

Dexter Dunn floated Brandon Blvd forward off the gate before settling him in fourth on approach to the first turn. Meanwhile, Obliterate (driven by Patrick Ryder) pushed clear of Ubrute (Yannick Gingras) and Bookie J (Jason Bartlett) before yielding control to Ubrute at the end of a :27.1 quarter. As soon as Ubrute took over, Bartlett had Bookie J out and moving from third with Brandon Blvd following a live tow to the lead up the backstretch.

Brandon Blvd accelerated to seize the top spot through a :53.3 half mile and cleared to the pegs on approach to the far turn before bracing for a second move from Obliterate, who had been shuffled to fourth up the backstretch. Obliterate gained into a joint second to offer mild pressure to Brandon Blvd at the 1:21.2 three-quarter station, but the son of Downbytheseaside—Alexis Faith shook away effortlessly upon cornering for home and capped his career-best 1:47.3 mile with a :26.1 sprint home that saw Dunn take him under a strong rein through the final 70 yards.

Sweet Lovin Lou (Scott Zeron) mounted a four-wide rally around stalled cover to take second, 1½ lengths in arrears; Ubrute split foes to save third after being compromised by traffic off the far turn.

“His lungs are his biggest attribute,” said Andrew Harris, who trains 10-time winner Brandon Blvd for Punisher 11 Stable. “He can carry his speed a long way and let Dex do what he wants to do.”

Harris, who together with William Pollock and Bruce

Areman comprises the Punisher 11 partnership, opted to forgo a bye to the Pace final with his star colt after having not raced since he overcame post 10 to record a second-place finish behind Odds On Mr Mamba in the Grade 1 Pepsi North America Cup, on June 13, for two reasons: to give his horse a needed start, and to try to avoid getting stuck with another unfavorable post in the final. And, by virtue of his elimination win, Brandon Blvd was guaranteed to draw a post between 1 and 6.

“We had a bad post at the North America Cup,” said Pollock. “We’re trying to make sure that doesn’t happen here, and he accomplished that.”

“Brandon is probably the best horse we’ve ever had. We’re very confident in him.”

As the 1-5 favorite, Brandon Blvd paid \$2.60 to win.

In addition to the top three finishers, Gentleman’s Club, Bookie J, Toby Ornot Toby and Azrael Blue Chip qualified for next week’s Meadowlands Pace final after finishing fourth through seventh, respectively. They will join the trio of Al Papi, Lindy Dragonwater, and Melillo, whose connections all accepted byes. The post draw for the final is as follows:

Bourbonista S trots track record in Six Pack; Lexus Kody equals track record in JL Cruze

Dexter Dunn drove **Bourbonista S** to the fastest trotting mile by an older mare at The Meadowlands in winning the \$129,400 Grade 3 Six Pack Open Trot on Saturday (July 4), a night that also saw **Lexus Kody** equal a track record with his win in the \$131,250 Grade 3 JL Cruze.

Bourbonista S pushed for the lead and cleared control from Miracle Maven passing a :27.2 first quarter. Bravo Angel S, among the early firers, floated to the middle of the pack out of post 8 and marched forward when parked to grab the lead from Bourbonista S before scorching the clock in :53.4.

Bravo Angel S cruised on the lead rounding the final turn while Bourbonista S loomed from the pocket past a blistering 1:21.4 three-quarters. Bourbonista S surged to the top to power home snugly by 3¼ lengths and clock a finish in 1:48.4, eclipsing the previous track record for older trotting mares of 1:49.2 set in 2024 by Jiggy Jog S. Warrawee Michelle closed late for second and longshot R Dutchess finished third.

“She’s developed mentally, too,” trainer Marcus Melander said after the race. “She’s in a good spot right now. Since we pulled the shoes two starts back here in the mud, she’s been getting

better and better. She was racing barefoot in Sweden a couple of times even when she was third behind Allegiant, who won the Elitlopp. So, it’s not a surprise that she was, I mean, maybe this good, but she’s a year older now and she’s just getting better and better.”

Bourbonista S, the 5-year-old Face Time Bourbon–Affinity

Kronos mare, has now made \$250,878 and won eight times from 28 starts, for owners Deo Volente Farms LLC and Panamera Racing. She paid \$7.80 to win.

Earlier on the card, Lexus Kody and Yannick Gingras controlled the \$131,250 Grade 3 JL Cruze Open Trot at The Meadowlands with a track-record equalling 1:49.4 win.

The 2025 Dan Patch Trotter of the Year trained by Ron Burke was sent off the strong favorite in the seven-horse field, taking the lead from the early speed of Sir Pinocchio with Aetos Kronos S sitting third and Osceola next as driver Yannick Gingras brought the 8-year-old son of Archangel to the first panel in :27.4. Lexus Kody led the field to the half in :55 as action soon brewed from off the speed with Up Your Deo making an outside move to be the main challenger for the leader. Through three-quarters in 1:23, Up Your Deo confronted Lexus Kody in a hard drive down the stretch, but Lexus Kody was best at the wire by a neck. Aetos Kronos S

landed the show spot.

“Last time [at Mohawk] we weren’t quite sure where he was at – figured he needed some racing,” Gingras said after the race. “I was happily surprised; he was really, really good, then tonight I was definitely expecting it. I think he’s back on his game and that’s when he got sharp last year. He’s game no matter which way; he doesn’t need a trip. He’s just a class horse. Down the stretch, Ake’s horse wouldn’t go away and it was definitely a good battle to the wire. Four or five pylons to go, I knew I had him beat then, but it took a battle.”

Lexus Kody, who matched the track record for older trotting geldings that he established on Hambletonian Day in 2024, is owned by Burke Racing Stables, Weaver Brusceci, and Phil Collura. He won for the second time this season from four starts and for the 39th time from 94 starts, earning \$2,018,433. He paid \$2.60 to win.

On To Norway scores stakes record in Graduate Trot; Captain Optimistic scorches Graduate Pace

The sizzling heat on a steamy Saturday night (July 4) at The Meadowlands bubbled into electric miles in the pair of \$230,000 Grade 2 Stan Bergstein Graduate Series finals with **On To Norway** torching a stakes record in winning the Graduate Trot and **Captain Optimistic** barreling to equal the all-age North American season's record in the Graduate Pace.

On To Norway seized vindication from defeat with a 1:48.3 stakes-record mile to make his first return to the winner's circle since the end of his 27-race win streak.

Driver Yannick Gingras sent the Ron Burke pupil forward out of post 9 and found a seat in fourth as Walspea sped to the lead in a :26.3 first quarter. Gingras idled up the backstretch as Walspea maintained sharp speed to a :53.4 half until Mr Mouton edged off the pylons from third to take a shot in the last turn. Walspea remained on the muscle through the last turn as Mr Mouton stalled, prompting Gingras to duck to the pylons as the field straggled to three-quarters in 1:21.1. Despite the quick fractions, Walspea stayed game in the stretch as pocket-popping Meshuggah rolled

off-stride with favorite Super Chapter closing over the top from third over, but On To Norway emerged from his inside seam to split rivals late and strike the winning blow by a neck. Super Chapter settled for second with Walspea finishing third and Mr Mouton taking fourth.

“Tonight, he was sharp,” Gingras said after the race. “I didn’t think he was quite as good last time, but the first time I drove him he was pretty aggressive in the post parade. Last time I raced him he was pretty nice and I was like ‘Maybe he’s not quite himself.’ Tonight, he was definitely full of himself in the post parade and he delivered. I thought I had it like 50 yards to the wire. I felt pretty confident there.”

Winning his 32nd race from 39 starts, On To Norway has now earned \$840,131. His 1:48.3 mile bests the track record for 4-year-old trotting geldings that he established on June 12 this year when winning a Graduate Series prelim in 1:49.3. The mark also lowers the all-age North American trotting record by Homicide Hunter of 1:48.4 set in 2018 and beats the previous stakes record of 1:49.1 set in 2019 when Atlanta won the Graduate Trot. Ron Burke trains the 4-year-old gelding by Muscle Massive—One Class Act for owners Burke Racing Stable LLC, Frank Baldachino, Black And White Stable, and Michael Rosenthal. He paid \$9.40 to win.

Captain Optimistic continued in his comeback season from the breeding shed with a front-stepping win in the Graduate Series Pace to equal the fastest mile paced in North America this season.

Leaving from post 5, driver Scott Zeron sent the Nancy Takter trainee to the top through a :26.2 first quarter and stayed on the motor for the rest of the mile. Go Go Grasshopper, parked from the start, tried to push up the rim to a :53.3 half but Captain Optimistic chugged along with speed that spun his rivals wheels as he opened his advantage to three-quarters in 1:19.4. Captain Optimistic charged through the lane under steady Zeron encouragement to post a 3¼-length win in a lifetime-best 1:46.3 mile, equaling the North American season’s mark set one race prior by Ervin Hanover in the Dave Brower Memorial. Prince Hal Hanover sat third at the pylons around the track and grabbed second from pocket-chaser Swingtown while Sugar Man stormed down the center of the track for fourth.

“He’s matured a lot, I think that’s mostly what’s been the difference this year,” Takter said after the race. “He obviously grew up, filled out, and got stronger. He was always a big boy and I think just getting stronger and being able to carry his speed has helped him a lot. The horse has been super all year – he’s bred mares this spring – and he’s just shown up in top form. Hopefully a lot of mares got in foal and hopefully those owners that bred their mares to him are going to be real excited in the spring next year when they have a baby by him.”

A 4-year-old stallion by Captaintreacherous—Cinamony, Captain Optimistic won his third race from five starts this season and his 15th race from 36 starts in his career, earning \$1,302,257. He’s owned by the Captain Optimistic Syndicate and paid \$7.40 to win.

Ervin Hanover wins Brower; Ryder mares one-two in Perfect Sting

A mid-race give-and-go proved the winning strategy for Pollack Racing's **Ervin Hanover**, who powered to a 1:46.3 score in the Grade 3 \$168,100 Dave Brower Memorial on Saturday (July 4).

Ervin Hanover and driver Dexter Dunn were unhurried in the race's early stages, stalking from fourth as Crack Shot (driven by Doug McNair) and Bythemissal (Yannick Gingras) tussled through a :26.1 first quarter. Reaching the backstretch, Bythemissal yielded control to Crack Shot, and Ervin Hanover continued up to a brief lead off Crack Shot's cover before ceding control to Ken Hanover (Tim Tetrick) just past the :53.2 half.

On the far turn, Ken Hanover and Ervin Hanover continued one-two as Oakwood Ardan IR (James MacDonald) attempted in vain to gain ground on the outside through a punishing :26.2 third quarter. Dunn popped the pocket with Ervin Hanover off the corner for home, and the 6-year-old Captaintreacherous—Eloquent Grace entire struck the front in mid-stretch and drew off on his own to win by 2 lengths.

Oakwood Ardan IR stayed on well in the breeze to save second; Coaches Corner (Jason Bartlett) lunged off Oakwood Ardan IR's cover to narrowly miss the runner-up spot. Ken Hanover faded late after giving way and finished fourth.

"He's just in top form; I think he's as good as he's ever been," said trainer Dave Menary of Ervin Hanover, who recorded his first-ever Meadowlands win after failing to convert in his first eight starts over the one-mile oval. "Hopefully his next eight starts [at The Meadowlands] are better than his last eight starts."

Now three-for-three this season after also winning an open pace and the Grade 3 Mohawk Gold Cup at Woodbine Mohawk Park, Ervin Hanover has won 29 of his 78 career starts and earned \$1,440,033 to date.

“I think he’s as sharp as he’s ever been,” Menary said. “We tried to start him a little later and keep the traveling down [this season] until now, and so far, it’s paid off.”

As the 4-5 public choice, Ervin Hanover paid \$3.60 to win.

In the \$153,200 Grade 3 Perfect Sting, for pacing mares, **Miki And Minnie** sustained a long first-over grind to upend Chris Ryder stablemate and 2024 Dan Patch Horse of the Year Twin B Joe Fresh in a thrilling stretch duel and lower her lifetime mark to 1:48 amid a sudden downpour.

James MacDonald activated Miki And Minnie out of midfield up the backstretch not long after Twin B Joe Fresh (Dunn) brushed from fourth to first well after a :26.2 first quarter, and the 4-year-old Always B Miki—That’s The Ticket mare steadily ground forward to push the pace after a :53.4 half. The Ryder trainees matched strides to three-quarters in

1:21.1 and left their tiring pocket foe Prolific Fire (McNair) in their wake through the stretch. Twin B Joe Fresh fought gamely, but Miki And Minnie found enough to strike the front in the final yards of a :26.4 final-quarter duel and prevail by a hard-earned neck. Unreasonable (Todd McCarthy) emerged out of traffic in upper stretch and rallied to nab Louies Girl N (Bartlett) for third, another 2¾ lengths behind.

“I didn’t know what to think,” said Ryder of the duel between his distaff dynamos. “Miki And Minnie always finds the wire; she’s not the quickest horse, but she can go a mile. It was a great stretch battle and one had to get there first, but it didn’t surprise me that Miki And Minnie got there first. They’re two terrific mares; they’re beautiful to have.”

Now a 23-time winner from 31 starts with \$2,184,230 in the bank for the partnership of Craig Henderson, Robert Mondillo, and Lawrence Minowitz, Miki And Minnie has won four of five races this season, including the Grade 1 Roses Are Red. Sent off the odds-on favorite, Miki And Minnie paid \$3 to win.

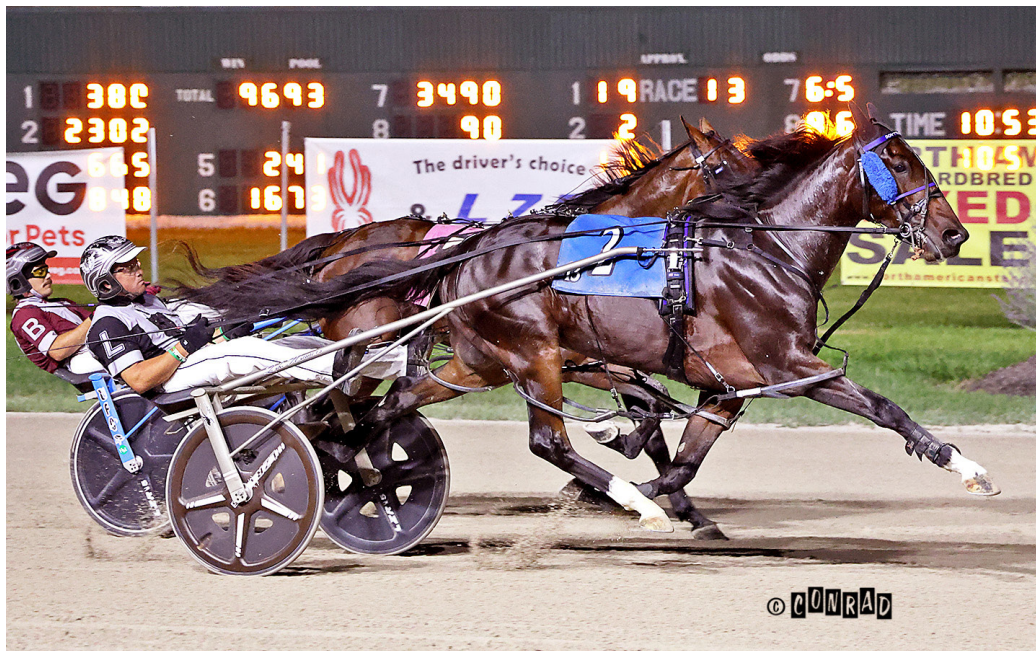
All four divisions of the Next Generation for freshmen Ohio sired horses on Saturday (July 4) at Eldorado Scioto Downs were tightly contested, creating exciting races for those trackside and who joined to watch via the simulcast show or on Fox Sports.

The glamour boys were the last division raced with **Don'ttruckwithme** winning in 1:52.2. It was the second straight Next Generation win for breeder Judy Roegner and broodmare Age Of Consent, as l'llbetyourboots won the 2025 division in 1:52.

Initially getting away third, Don'ttruckwithme was not content to sit and after getting a little rough gaited, driver Chris Lems moved him to the top by the :27.2 opening quarter. As the field straightened to go down the stretch for the first time, Atlee Bender continued to move Atlantic Ivey, who had yet to see a pylon, on from fourth and took the lead before the :56.1 half. North Rim (Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.) made a first over bid heading to the 1:25.2 third-quarter but couldn't get past the pacesetter. As the field straightened out down the stretch, Lems angled Don'ttruckwithme and the pair posted a :26.4 last quarter to win by a half-length. Atlantic Ivey was second, with North Rim third.

“I was a little surprised, scoring down he was plenty aggressive; he had an ear hood on so I was prepared for the worst,” said Lems. “But actually, in the race, he drove really nicely. He left, let a couple go, re-moved, let another one go; I couldn’t ask for much more.”

It was the first start, and win, in the Next Generation for trainer Daren Harvey. A \$37,000 Ohio Selected Yearling Sale purchase from Roegner by Wayne Mast, Eden Acres Farmstead, and Kirk Nichols, Don’ttruckwithme prepped for Saturday’s event with two qualifiers, the most recent being a 1:56.2 victory. Don’ttruckwithme is a gelding by Catch The Fire and his dam, Age Of Consent, is by Real Desire.

Don’ttruckwithme went off as the 2-1 second favorite and paid \$6.80 to win.

Another trainer, Vernon Beachy, won his first Next Generation race when trotting filly **Made For More** won the first of the Next Generation races on the card in 1:56.4.

Lolly and Ronnie Gillespie set the early fractions of :28.4 and :59.1 as Ronnie Wrenn, Jr. was content getting Made For More away third. The pair came first up down the backside and as the field hit the 1:28.2 third quarter, Made For More was just a half-length off the lead. Coming down the stretch, Made For More continued to advance, winning by a half-length over a fast-closing Kissme Ifyoucan (Austin Hanners); Dublins Ferani (Anthony MacDonald), who got the pocket trip, finished third.

Made For More is owned by breeder John Schlabach and is by Long Tom out of the Chapter Seven mare Obsessed Blue Chip. The filly prepped for the Next Generation by winning two qualifiers in 2:03 and 2:02.3.

“She did that really easy tonight actually,” said Wrenn, Jr. “She handled it well with a lot of fireworks going on, first time racing at night. You’re not sure what to expect with a 2-year-old filly, but she handled it well and raced great.”

Made For More went off at 8-1 and paid \$19.80 to win.

Wrenn, Jr. made it a habit of getting away third and making a move down the backside when he took the very next Next Generation, for 2-year-old filly pacers, in 1:52.3. Tempting

Flames and Tony Hall were the first to make the lead but yielded early to Breadnbuttez (Brett Miller) as the field headed towards the :27.3 opening quarter. Breadnbuttez continued to lead at the :57.3 half but Wrenn, Jr. had **Real Classy** on the move and on top by the 1:25 third quarter. Tempting Flames came up the passing lane to make a bid for the lead but fell just a quarter length short; Breadnbuttez held on for third.

Real Classy, a homebred for Burke Racing, Weaver Brusceci, Knox Services, and Let It Ride Stables, gave trainer Ron Burke his 10th Next Generation win. The Downbytheseaside filly out of the Real Desire mare Real Diva prepped for the race with a couple qualifiers, her most recent winning in 1:58.2, coming home in :27.4.

Real Classy went off at 7-1 and paid \$17.40 to win.

Trainer Chris Beaver got his second Next Generation win with **Commanders Moni** when Mike Wilder steered the colt trotter to victory in 1:55.1. Getting away third, Wilder watched as Lou Armstrong (MacDonald) set early fractions of :28 and :57.2. Walks The Fire (Wrenn, Jr.) put the pressure on and the duo on top battled it out down the backside. Wilder continued to sit third along the rail and by the 1:25 third quarter, pulled to make his bid and won by two lengths over Satan's Fury (Lems); Sweet T's Ranger (Chris Page) was fourth placed third due to Lou Armstrong being placed back for going inside multiple pylons.

"He makes my job real easy," said Wilder after the race. "I had a good idea if he had to go there, I thought he might [go in 1:55.1]. He trotted a :28.1 backside [in his last start] that particular day and he felt like he was going in 30 seconds, so I knew the motor was in there."

Commander's Moni was a \$20,000 purchase at the Fall Blooded Horse Sale from Midland Acres. By Ready for Moni out of the CR Commando mare Kelsey's Commando, the colt is owned by Commanders Moni Stable, Mark Schwartz, and Mark Robinson.

Commanders Moni went off at 10-1 and paid \$22.40 to win.

The first leg of the Ohio Sires Stakes was historically over the 4th of July weekend, but when the Next Generation was started, in 2020 for pacers and 2021 for trotters, it became the first outing for Ohio-sired 2-year-olds. This year the first leg of the OHSS for 2-year-old trotters will be held July 11 at Scioto and for 2-year-old pacers, the colts will race on July 12 and fillies on July 13 at Northfield Park.

The 91-day 2026 Eldorado Scioto Downs regular season runs through Sept. 19. Races are held Tuesday-Saturday, with a special holiday card on Labor Day instead of the Tuesday card that week. The track will then re-open for the Breeders Crown, with eliminations held Oct. 16-17 and the finals Oct. 23-24. Burke sweeps Pennsylvania Sire Stakes with trio of 2-year-old pacing fillies at The Meadows

High temperatures were matched only by the high expectations for the 2-year-old pacing fillies competing in three \$43,000 Pennsylvania Sire Stakes (PASS) divisions, known as the Sand Tart, and three Stallion Series divisions Friday evening (July 3) at Hollywood Casino at The Meadows.

Trainer Ron Burke swept all three PASS races in impressive fashion.

The sweep began with **Miss Chavious**. Driven by Yannick Gingras, the daughter of Tall Dark Stranger raced patiently in fourth through the early stages before advancing heading to the five-eighths. There, Miss Chavious picked up cover from Schnapps Hanover through the final turn before unleashing a wrapped-up :27.4 final quarter to score in 1:52.2. The filly is owned and bred by W. Donovan, Craig Henderson, Joe Sbrocco, and Libby and Parnell.

A second-over trip and a powerful closing quarter were also the winning formula for **My Taylor Swift** and Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.

in the second PASS division. Following an opening half in :57, Wrenn, Jr. found cover for the daughter of Captaintreacherous and followed it through three-quarters in 1:25.4 before a determined :26.4 final quarter carried her to a 1:52.4 victory. My Taylor Swift is owned by Burke Racing Stable LLC, Weaver Brusceci LLC, Phillip Collura, and James Zito.

Iwillalwayslouveu's victory in the third PASS division was never in doubt. Starting from post 2, Wrenn, Jr. sent the homebred daughter of Sweet Lou to the lead and controlled the pace throughout. After reaching the half in :57.3, Iwillalwayslouveu finished with back-to-back :27.4 quarters to draw away by a wrapped length in 1:53.1. Burke Racing Stable LLC and Weaver Brusceci share ownership of the 2-year-old filly.

The fastest Stallion Series division of the evening was captured by **Loyal To The End** and driver Andrew McCarthy in 1:52.1. Trained by Noel Daley, the daughter of Captaintreacherous made an uncovered move down the backstretch to challenge the leader before sprinting home in :27.1 to win her division. Loyal To The End is owned by Let It Ride Stables Inc., Jesmeral Stable, Hutchison Stable LLC, and CT Stables LLC.

Aesta, whose name fittingly means "Summer Heat" in Latin, sat a comfortable pocket trip to avoid swift early fractions before taking command at the five-eighths and drawing away to a four-length victory in her Stallion Series division. Driven by Yannick Gingras for trainer Steve LeBlanc, Aesta paced the mile in 1:54 for owner Glen Dyke of Delaware.

Treacherous Taps and Dave Palone enjoyed the easiest journey of the Stallion Series divisions, winning in 1:54.3. Palone placed the Joe Bongiorno trainee on the lead from the outset, and the pair never looked back, finishing three lengths in front for owners Let It Ride Stables Inc., Jesmeral Stable, and CT Stables LLC.

For the evening, Wrenn, Jr. and Burke each recorded three victories, while sire Captaintreacherous produced three winning 2-year-olds.

Starting from the outside post 6, Aces And Cinches went straight to business winning the four-way calvary charge to the first turn to cross over to the cones before the quarter in a wicked :25.4. Dancingdreamer (Marcus Miller) got away second, followed by Door Dash (Kevin Lambright) in third.

The post time favorite Swiss Lights (Trace Tetrick) took this opportunity towards the turn to swing to the outside climbing up the field from fourth just after the field reached the half in a blistering :53.3 Aces And Cinches held onto his lead to the three-quarters in 1:21.4 followed by Dancingdreamer with Swiss Lights to his outside. Down the homestretch, Aces And Cinches found the open freeway keeping his foot on the pedal pacing through the wire in 1:48.1. Swiss Light got up for second as Dancingdreamer held on to third, each 4½ lengths back of the winner.

Aces And Cinches is owned by Burke Racing Stable LLC, Weaver BrusceMI LLC, Frank Baldachino, and Michael Rosenthal. The 3-year-old Odds On Equuleus colt was bred by Alpine Stables. Aces And Cinches doubled his lifetime earnings to \$93,400 for his second win of the season. Aces And Cinches paid \$11 to win. The 1:48.1 clocking matched the fastest mile of the season thus far at Harrah's Hoosier Park, posted initially by Rip Wheeler on May 29.

Using his vast experience, the 10-year-old double-millionaire **Little Rocket Man** driven by Kyle Wilfong for trainer Ken Rucker steamrolled the \$22,000 open pace at Hoosier Park earlier on the Friday card.

Getting off to a fast start in post 5, Little Rocket Man was cleared for liftoff out of the gate beating the seven-horse field to the rail through the first turn in :26.1. Pacing single file, Little Rocket Man remained the leader at the halfway point in :55 tightly followed by Combustion (Marcus Miller), Crooked Smile (Jordan Ross), and the post time favorite M-M-s Bud.

M-M-s Bud took on the challenge by going first over as Little Rocket Man led the pacers to the third-quarter turn in 1:22.4 with M-M-s Bud on his heels. Powering down the stretch, Little Rocket Man fended off the M-M-s Bud challenge getting home to the wire in 1:49.3. Leave It To Leo (Atlee Bender) rallied for second, while M-M-s Bud ended up third.

The Rockin Image gelding Little Rocket Man is owned by Russell Beeman and Jack Freeman. Little Rocket Man scored his seventh win of the season increasing his lifetime earnings to \$2,054,744. Little Rocket Man paid \$5.40 to win.

When I learned that Sarah Svanstedt, my trainer and friend, had been seriously injured at Mohawk I naturally reached out. When I was finally able to speak to her, I was shocked to learn how this accident was handled.

I can tell you that if anyone in charge of running any of the three racetracks I own left a horseman unconscious for 15 minutes while they were trying to rein in a lose horse, that person would be fired the next day. She could have died while waiting 15 minutes for the ambulance crew to come and for [Woodbine] to acknowledge that was the policy and that they were reviewing it is a disgrace. Luckily, despite the lack of concern on the part of management, she did survive and is going to make a full recovery. No horseman should ever be left unconscious on a racetrack without an ambulance getting there as fast as possible. At a bare minimum she deserves an apology.
