BEST ADVICE

KEN MIDDLETON, JR.: Go back and watch replays from last week and zero in on horses that experienced troubled trips. Sometimes you can find some bargain prices on horses that underachieved because of a bad drive or a bad trip.

CHAD ROZEMA: Let the board do the talking, play horses with odds that are considerably lower than their morning line offering.

JASON PORTUONDO: Take a good look at these equine athletes, you can often pick winners with your eyes.

MARK MCKELVIE: Pace yourself. It's a long night on and off the track. Enjoy it!

DERICK GIWNER: Don't put all of your focus on last week's performances.

DAVE BROWER: Take a shot somewhere! The favorites don't win every race, so if you find one that you like at square odds, then go ahead, bet, and root! Get excited, and get lucky! You never know when you're walking around lucky!

GORDON WATERSTONE: I love playing Pick-3s and with a 20-cent minimum. You can take a chance and use longshots you might normally not play, especially if you single a horse in one of the legs, play multiple numbers in the other legs and don't be afraid to throw in a big price.

MICHAEL CARTER: It's a long night, pick your spots and balance your budget to last the whole evening. Ticket construction is key.

LONG BOMB

KEN MIDDLETON, JR.: RACE 10 - 9 STONEBRIDGE SOUL

CHAD ROZEMA: RACE 4 – 1 ISITFRIDAYYET. Won last time at this level, post relief could be the key.

JASON PORTUONDO: RACE 12 – 5 BETTOR JOY N. Her teammate is clearly the one to beat, but if she gets some pace to chase, watch out!

MARK MCKELVIE: RACE 11 - 7 BEST IN SHOW

DERICK GIWNER: RACE 12 – 5 BETTOR JOY N has yet to show her bottom in North America.

DAVE BROWER: I think we will get a price in RACE 4 with 2

AMERICAN HUSTLE and Bob McClure. Sharp Florida shipper was
deceptively good in his Mohawk return and gets a better post to
flaunt his speed this time, not come from behind.

GORDON WATERSTONE: RACE 2 – 4 CAVIART ROCKLAND. Was taken back to last in the NA Cup elim and never had a chance as he never had room and appeared to have pace. Picks up a new driver in Yannick Gingras tonight.

MICHAEL CARTER: RACE 2 – 4 CAVIART ROCKLAND picks up Gingras for the first time this season. He fired off a :25.4 final quarter in his elimination for the North America Cup. I think he could bounce back against this group.

GORDON WATERSTONE: RACE 12-

4 SHARTIN N. The winner of this race last year, she has been dominating the division for awhile now. Although she'll probably be challenged more than usual in here, she's proven up to the task.

MICHAEL CARTER: RACE 12 – 4 SHARTIN N
has been on top of her game with only one defeat
in 2019. She has proved week after week why
she is the best in her division.

\$20 TO WAGER

KEN MIDDLETON, JR.: If there's a crazy amount of money bet on any horse to show, pick another horse in that race and bet your \$20 to show hoping the other horse has a bad night.

CHAD ROZEMA: Let it ride on a Pick-3 starting in RACE 8 (2, 2, 4).

JASON PORTUONDO: I would use the \$20 and pool it together with a few friends and box some trifectas... maybe play some lucky numbers.

MARK MCKELVIE: Take a shot at the multi-leg wagers (Pick-4, Pick-5) and use the \$0.20 option. Your \$20 will go further than you think. DERICK GIWNER: \$10 to win on RACE 3 – 4 FORBIDDEN TRADE and RACE 11 – 8 CAPTAIN CRUNCH

DAVE BROWER: In RACE 9, the Mohawk Gold Cup, 2 MCWICKED is probably still the best pacer on the planet! Key him on top in a pair of \$10 exactors with 7 PHYSICALLYINCLINED and 9 FILIBUSTER HANOVER underneath. We might triple our money.

GORDON WATERSTONE: Play a \$10 exacta box with 3 HANNELORE HANOVER and 4 ATLANTA in RACE 6 - Armbro Flight. On paper these two stand out in here and should be one-two in some fashion.

MICHAEL CARTER: \$20 win on RACE 2

- 4 CAVIART ROCKLAND. It would be easy to pick a short price, but why not take a stab at a horse who will most likely provide some midrange value.

There is a Pick-5 wager (races 1-5, guaranteed at \$100,000) and an All-Stakes Pick-4 (races 9-12, guaranteed at \$100,000) on tonight's card.

SELECTIONS: 2-3-4-8

- 2 SWANDRE THE GIANT was narrowly defeated last week after being stung to the opening quarter. If he is anything close to what his 2-year-old season showed, he will be tough to beat.
- ② PILOT DISGRETION looks to leave this race undefeated and if the effort he put in last week is repeated he could be a force to be reckoned with here.
- 4 FORBIDDEN TRADE looked sharp in victory last week as a \$10 winner. This is a very versatile colt who should not be overlooked.
- 8 SOUTHWIND AVENGER draws a little tough this week, but this gelding can race from just about anywhere. He has speed and can close from off the pace. Possesses the consistency factor I like.



CHAD ROZEMA

SELECTIONS: 3-5-4-8

- ® PILOT DISCRETION didn't have the easiest of trips in his elimination and still crushed his foes to remain undefeated through five lifetime starts. His versatility will serve him well in his first rich final and that's why I'm all in on the superstar in the making.
- 5 SUPER SCHISSEL started slower than expected in his elim after a brief bobble leaving but he fought hard right to the wire to qualify. He tackled the best during his rookie season and will challenge for the exacta from this much improved post.
- 4 FORBIDDEN TRADE was expertly driven by McClure last week and Canada's 2yo trotting champ did the rest when called upon down the lane. He's more than just an OSS star and will get stronger as the season goes on. I'll tab him for the top 3.
- 8 SOUTHWIND AVENGER was used multiple times last week and hung tough to remain runner-up behind the fastest elim winner. He's no stranger to the big stage and has the versatility to overcome this poor draw. In the mix for another good share.

SELECTIONS: 4 - 3 - 6 - 9

- 4 ATLANTA was unbelievably impressive last week, spinning off under wraps with a monster mile. Since the Burke Brigade monsters were able to get good posts, it seems they have a hammerlock on this one.
- S HANNILORE HANOMER "found" her top form again with a blistering effort in the fastest trotted mile in Canadian history. I know she's back, but I can't quite put her in the stablemate's category right now. She controls the gate, before releasing her stablemate.
- 6 TOP EXPECTATIONS is the wild card in here. She's got the speed to push the Burke finalists, and it's just not in Dube's nature to take back in a race like this. There WILL be a hole for her into turn one when they all blast out.
- 9 PLUNGE BLUE CHIP had a very good comebacker, but really seems up against it from a devastating post. She can leave, but she's a much better finisher. I just don't see how she can work out any decent trip from the nine-box.



JASON PORTUONDO

SELECTIONS: 4-3-9-10

- 4 ATLANTA barely broke a sweat in her elimination last week and should have plenty of petrol left for tonight's finale. I think she is poised to dethrone the champ and remain perfect for the new barn... on top.
- ❸ HANNIELORE HANNER showed us she's back to her old self setting a track and Canadian record in the second elim. The threetime defending Queen of this race is clearly a solid threat to my top choice.
- 9 PLUNGE BLUE CHIP needed her latest from a fitness standpoint and should improve in her second start of 2019. This filly is a cut below the top two and post 9 makes it even tougher, but she can still get a share.
- 10 EMOTICON HANOVER was off her game a week ago, but is a bounce back candidate for the final. Her dreaded draw adds to the degree of difficulty, however she's no slouch and could play a significant role with some racing luck.

- 9 FILIBUSTER HANOVER reunites with Yannick Gingras, who finished second with him three starts back. He's a price-play option for the exacta.
- 8 THINKBIG DREAMBIG has been in some poor positions and that has led to just one win on the season. Nancy Johansson trainee is talented.
- গু আমাসা দিয়েন্ডালৈ has been making a good living but can't seem to get over the hump in 2019. As the likely second choice behind McWicked, I'll lean to better values.



DAVE BROWER

SELECTIONS: 2 - 7 - 9 - 3

- 2 MCWICKED Have you seen this horse race over the past two seasons? If not, you better jar your memory. Barring unforeseen issues, he just wins, no matter the track, no matter the competition. Impossible to play against from inside post.
- 7 PHYSICALLYINCLINED is our choice to complete a "maybe value" exacta! He's razor sharp right now. He packs plenty of speed, IF Jonathan wants to use it. Might be able to tuck up turn one and then shake loose late with a burst at decent odds.
- 9 FILIBUSTER HANOVER has had ZERO luck so far this year. And I guess that's normal once the 4-year-olds tackle the free-for-allers. Yes, this post stinks, but I guarantee that Yannick won't be grabbing lines behind the gate! It's a send to push the issue.
- JIMMY FRECHT had a really nice race in the Battle of Lake Erie, but he's just been "chasing" so far this year. As a 4YO, like Filibuster, it ain't easy trying these older foes. I see him leaving, but I also see him getting shuffled. Will need some luck.

It will be very tough to beat her, but I think we'll see these fillies mix it up and this talented lady come up just short with an incredible effort.
- 1 TALL DRINK HANOVER knows what it takes to win big races at Mohawk Park. She was fantastic in last year's Shes A Great Lady and all-time has five wins in seven starts here.
- 9 STONEBRIDGE SOUL finished her rookie season with a Grand Circuit victory and has had an under-the-radar stellar start to her sophomore campaign. She'll be flying at the end.



MICHAEL CARTER

SELECTIONS: 4-3-1-5

- 4 WARRAWEE UBEAUT has done nothing wrong since returning to the racetrack on May 3. She seems to be getting better with each start and will be tough here.
- TREAGHEROUS REIGN is unbeaten in three starts to kick off her 3-year-old season. The Captains have been very good this year and she is a leading example of what a great sire he has been.
- 1 TALL DRINK HANOVER was closing in the elimination and just could not get to Warrawee Ubeaut who was tough in the stretch. She put in an impressive final ¼ and is worth a look underneath.
- **5 TRILLIONS HANOVER** has only missed the board once since kicking off her 2019 racing season. She has a big closing kick that could allow her to be forwardly placed at the end of the mile.

SELECTIONS: 2 - 4 - 10 - 8

- 2 DE LOS CIELOS DEO stumbled out of the blocks to start the year, but trainer Burke turned up his hearing in a June 1 prep at The Big M. He showed breathtaking speed in last week's elimination. His versatility combined with his savage speed makes him the one to beat.
- 4 WORKIN ONA MYSTERY is one loss shy of being a perfect '10' for trainer Brown, who will be on the lookout for another Cup title.

 Tetrick quarter pole-moved him to the lead last week, and the colt was well within himself when he stopped the clock in 1:49.
- 10 STAG PARTY was dealt a serious stomach punch at Tuesday's post position draw. He raced tough in his elimination after coming first over and finishing a brave third for trainer Coleman, who tapped Sears on the shoulder when Miller opted for my top pick.
- 8 CAPTAIN CRUNCH appeared to spook from the shadow cast by the starting gate last week, and it nearly spelled disaster. He regained his composure and managed to nab the fifth – and final – spot for tonight's rich tilt. He's capable of rebounding.



GORDON WATERSTONE

SELECTIONS: 2-4-8-3

- 2 DE LOS CIELOS DEO After a bumpy start to the year, he seems to have suddenly turned it around. He was flying late in the elimination for David Miller, who opted to keep the drive, and that means something.
- 4 WORKIN ONA MYSTERY After an impressive elim win from post 9 he will likely be the betting favorite from this spot. Trainer Brian Brown said despite the colt's big victory he wasn't 100 per cent and after some treatment this week he expects him to be even better. If so he'll be tough to beat.
- 8 CAPTAIN CRUNCH made a break for the first time in his 13-start career in the elimination, but still managed to hold onto fifth and a spot in the final. He will certainly be out to make amends here, but in a tough spot from the outside.
- ② BETTIONS WISH hasn't done anything wrong yet this year but he'll have his work cut out for him as the trip he's been getting every week doesn't seem likely here.

SELECTIONS: 4-2-1-5

- 4 SHARTIN N The Queen of the division is an easy pick here. Just as the scenario in last Saturday's prep, Tetrick will let things settle early before moving to the front. From there she'll have it her own way and it'll be clear sailing for the victory.
- 2 CAVIART ALLY In great tactical position from post 2, should be at or near the lead early before Shartin N takes control. A great trip should be carved out here to garner runner-up honors in what could be a tight finish. Won the Milton final last September here in 1:48.3.
- 1 TEQUILA MONDAY Did not race in the prep, instead tuned up at Pocono with a victory. Another with tactical speed from an inside post and that should work to her advantage to keep her close throughout and in the money for a nice spot on the ticket.
- 5 BETTOR JOY N Stablemate to Shartin N came flying home late in the prep. Expect the same strategy here. With sensible fractions likely in front it won't be easy to close, she will be the closest of the ones trying to rally to get there late.



DERICK GIWNER

SELECTIONS: 5 - 4 - 2 - 3

- 5 BETTOR JOY N seemingly never goes a bad mile and even last week when she missed the top four, she was charging home. We really haven't had the chance to see how good she really is from my perspective.
- **4 SHARTIN N** is in a class by herself right now and deserves to be the likely 2-5 favorite she'll offer on race day. I'm merely hoping that with the big money on the line someone will make her work so hard that an upset is possible.
- 2 CAVIART ALLY has been super but just isn't Shartin N. She'll be second choice here and that makes her an undesirable play, though a capable one if the favorite falters.
- YOUANEMYCANDYCIRL got back on the right track with a solid uncovered mile in last week's prep. I do believe she is moving in the right direction, but I'm not sure the trip will work out for her here.

Lather Up captures 35th Pepsi North America Cup

MILTON, ONTARIO – Lather Up proved he was a step above his competition by capturing the 35th edition of the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup on Saturday, June 16, 2018 at Woodbine Mohawk Park

Trained by Clyde Francis, Lather Up and driver Montrell Teague powered forward from the beginning and took no prisoners en route to a four-length score in 1:48.1.

"It's a sensational feeling," said coowner and breeder Gary Iles. "To come away with a win, it doesn't get any better than this."

The win was sweet redemption for trainer Francis and driver Teague after they came up just short in the 2015 edition with Wiggle It Jiggleit.

Lather Up fired from post-four to the early lead, but was overtaken at the opening-quarter (:26.3) by Done Well and driver Tim Tetrick. Teague wasted little time retaking the lead in the second quarter and had his charge showing the way through a :54.1 opening-half.

"I definitely wanted to retake," said Teague. "(Tetrick) could have went on and taken a bigger fraction for the half, but I was trying to go back to the front and back the half down as much as I could."

Nutcracker Sweet and driver David Miller were first-up rounding the far turn, supplying cover for a perfectly placed second-over Stay Hungry and driver Doug McNair.

Lather Up reached three-quarters in a sizzling 1:21.3 to lead into the lane. Two-hole sitter Done Well and an off-cover Stay Hungry fired their best shot in the stretch, but were no match for the

4-5 mutuel favourite.

Lather Up powered home in :26.3 for the

biggest victory of his career. Done Well finished second, while Lost In Time and driver Scott Zeron rallied from eighth, placed fourth-over at three-quarters, to grab third. Stay Hungry finished fourth.

"It didn't go the way I thought it was going to be," said Teague. "I thought everyone was going to be a lot more aggressive for a million-dollar race and I would come off cover, but there was only about three of them left out there and I was one of them."

Owned and bred by Gary and Barbara Iles, Lather Up's beginning comes from a semen mix-up during breeding season and a near-death experience during birth. The true underdog is sired by-then Ohio stallion Im Gorgeous, who has since

returned to racing.

Winning trainer Francis is part of the George Teague Stable operation which won the Pepsi North America Cup in 2006 with Total Truth.

Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Lather Up went on to finish his three-year-old season with 11 wins and \$1 million earned in 18 starts. Now a four-year-old, Lather Up has made a strong return to the track in 2019, winning three of four starts.

A \$2 win ticket on Lather Up in the 2018 Pepsi North America Cup returned \$3.20. The \$2 Exacta with Done Well returned \$17.20, while the Trifecta with Lost In Time paid \$133.20. A \$1 winning-Superfecta (Stay Hungry) returned \$220.15.
