BEST ADVICE

GARNET BARNSDALE: Look for subtle changes from last week to tonight that can lead to improvement and winners at good prices. For example, a horse moving from post 8 to post 6 might not seem like much but consider: Post 8 yields 7.5% winners, post 6 yields 23.4% winners.

DAVE BROWER: Pick out a driver that you think will have a good night! Whether it's an American pilot, or a home-guy, go ahead. Nights like this are made for stars, and somebody usually steps up to the plate and delivers.

DERICK GIWNER: You can't make money betting too many options. Pick a horse to win or key in exotic wagers and take a stand.

ASHLEY MAILLOUX: Don't feel like you must bet every single race. Pick and choose your spots where you're confident or find value and enjoy watching the other races!

MARK MCKELVIE: It might sound cheesy but trust your gut. Those feelings usually pay off.

KEN MIDDLETON, JR.: Dig deep in your pockets to play tonight's Jackpot Hi 5 – the pool is going to be incredible!

GABE PREWITT: Don't show up with a locked-in mindset. These stakes nights inevitably provide some real overlay opportunities. Scan the board prior to the big races and you may find one or more horses getting off at a big number that you give a major chance.

MONIQUE VAG: Watch as many replays as you possibly can. Visually seeing performances can help you rank horses more accurately and find some hidden horses who can outrace their odds at huge prices! There's so much money in the exotics and betting longshots to hit the board.

LOCK OF THE NIGHT

GARNET BARNSDALE: **RACE 4** – 5 SINTRA returns to a 7-day cycle after missing five weeks between starts and he drops to a class where he is supposed to win by the length of the tote board. Look for a big effort here.

DAVE BROWER: **RACE 4** – 5 SINTRA How can he possibly lose to a field like this? Yes, he needed that last start and will be A-1 ready to "put on a show" tonight for his faithful Canadian fans. Jody J all the way!

DERICK GIWNER: **RACE 7** – 4 FAST AS THE WIND dominated his elimination and is still improving.

ASHLEY MAILLOUX: **RACE 5** – 3 JIMMY FREIGHT - The hometown hero has been on quite the roll since his return to the races.

MARK MCKELVIE: **RACE 10** – 2 TEST OF FAITH.

KEN MIDDLETON, JR.: **RACE 10** – 2 TEST OF FAITH.

GABE PREWITT: **RACE 4** – 5 SINTRA. Now or never spot for the classy veteran, should beat these off memory alone.

MONIQUE VAG: **RACE 10** – 2 TEST OF FAITH.

LONGBOMB PICK

GARNET BARNSDALE: **RACE 8** – 6 SEA SILK is sure to be an overlay in here and I thought she was excellent last week in the elimination when she was handled conservatively. She draws the best post and she is sure to be in striking range at the 3/4 pole tonight.

DAVE BROWER: **RACE 6** – 6 SOMEWHEREINVERONA: A very "unlucky" horse for the most part. One night he'll get his due. I do see some pace in this somewhat smaller field and that helps his rallying chances at a decent price.

DERICK GIWNER: **RACE 9** – 2 NEXT LEVEL STUFF was a victim of circumstance last time. Ready to peak as a 5-year-old?

ASHLEY MAILLOUX: **RACE 6** – 7 LEGION SEELSTER - I'm not sure what price he'll actually be, but his last two are better than they appear.

MARK MCKELVIE: **RACE 9** – 9 HERCULISA

KEN MIDDLETON, JR: **RACE 11** – 8 KOLBY TWO STEP

GABE PREWITT: **RACE 8** – 6 SEA SILK

MONIQUE VAG: **RACE 7** – 9 WORLD AT WAR DEO

GARNET BARNSDALE: Bet \$20 win on Pretender in the **GOODTIMES FINAL**. He is sure to offer a good price and driver Yannick Gingras will give him a good chance to win this Grand Circuit event.

DAVE BROWER: In the **10TH**, a \$10 Exactor box seem in order for 2 TEST OF FAITH and 3 LYONS SENTINEL. They are FAR and away the best two in here and should give us a good battle down the lane. We won't get rich.

DERICK GIWNER: **RACE 8** – \$6 Exacta Box 3-5; \$8 win 5

ASHLEY MAILLOUX: **RACE 6** – \$10 WP 7 LEGION SEELSTER

MARK MCKELVIE: With a Jackpot Hi-5 mandatory payout and over \$500K in the carryover, waiting for Race 13 is logical. But let's have fun, \$10 Win-Place on 7 LINEDRIVE HANOVER in RACE 5.

KEN MIDDLETON, JR.: I'd bet that \$20 to win on **RACE 6** – 4 SOUTHBEACH HANOVER. You can thank me later!

GABE PREWITT: We might as well try to run it into something decent, take a cold \$20 6-3 exacta in **RACE 8**.

RACE 5 \$100,000 MOHAWK GOLD CUP



MARK MCKELVIE

SELECTIONS: 7 - 4 - 6 - 3

- 7 LINEDRIVE HANOVER** — has shown that he's a special talent and I'm expecting he'll shine tonight. I don't see him getting things as rough as his last start and this could be a statement performance.
- 4 ALLYWAG HANOVER** — The reigning Canadian Pacing Derby champion should be well prepared for tonight. He'll be very tough to beat, but let's see if we can get one by him.
- 6 LITTLE ROCKET MAN** — The Indiana star made a rare trip out of the Hoosier state and turned in a solid performance last week. He's quick and a legit threat.
- 3 JIMMY FREIGHT** — He's been the king of the free-for-all/preferred here in recent months. I expect another big effort, but his race last Saturday leaves me wondering if there is much in the tank for this challenge.



ASHLEY MAILLOUX

SELECTIONS: 3 - 4 - 5 - 6

- 3 JIMMY FREIGHT** — local hero has proven that a two-year layoff is no problem. He's been better than ever. In 2022, he's won 10 races including the Camluck Classic and finished second in the Battle of Lake Erie. Tough to knock!
- 4 ALLYWAG HANOVER** — has only raced once in 2022, but let's not forget the talent he's displayed throughout his career. It may take him a few starts to get into the winner's circle, but his resume alone makes him a major player.
- 5 WORKIN ONA MYSTERY** — came up big last time out in the Commadore Barry at Harrah's Philly, beating Nicholas Beach. Draws well in here and certainly capable of a share.
- 6 LITTLE ROCKET MAN** — paced pretty well in the free-for-all last week with a back panel of :26.3. He was racing at Hoosier so it's a confident booster to see him race well locally and that Gingras stays in the bike.

RACE 7 \$251,000 GOODTIMES



GARNET BARNSDALE

SELECTIONS: 7 - 4 - 5 - 6

- 7 PRETENDER** — was in a long first-over grind last week that wasn't the ideal trip. He moves off the tricky rail to the post with third highest percentage of trotting winners and trainer Takter excels at peaking for finals; call to upset.
- 4 FAST AS THE WIND** — dominated in his elimination last week, beating the choice in the process and he is clearly the horse to beat off that strong performance and the one the week before when he was a good second to older millionaire JL Cruze.
- 5 TWIN B ARCHIE** — tripped out to win his elimination, but he is classy and fast and clearly in with an excellent shot as the local hope in this race.
- 6 SOUTHWIND DOMINO** — flies home every race and he will probably be the value horse for Exacta, Trifecta and Superfecta bets here. There are worse horses you could throw \$2 to win on tonight.



DAVE BROWER

SELECTIONS: 7 - 4 - 6 - 5

- 7 PRETENDER** — has turned out to be a much better trotter than I expected. I feel he will benefit from that first trip over the Mohawk surface and I like his price option a lot better than Fast As The Wind. But, they both can win.
- 4 FAST AS THE WIND** — has turned up nicely for the Alagna Armada, and is a deserving favorite in here. Does have a slight post edge over top pick, but these races rarely go the way you expect. The "Dexter" factor.
- 6 SOUTHWIND DOMINO** — impressed me over his last few. He just tries hard! And, there's a lot to say for that. I wish I owned him. Always gets a piece, and it will be no different on Saturday. Grinds into it late.
- 5 TWIN B ARCHIE** — is another that has really ramped up his game for Scott McEneny. Overachieving, I would say? Love the mid-pack post for him. That sets him up for a good stalking trip, no matter what.

RACE 8 \$401,000 FAN HANOVER



KEN MIDDLETON JR.

SELECTIONS: 6 - 2 - 3 - 1

- 6 SEA SILK** — fired home in :26.1 to finish a fast-closing third in last week's elim after starting the year with back-to-back wins. She's as talented as anyone in this star-studded field of fillies. I'll give her a slight edge.
- 2 PROHIBITION LEGAL** — put up a good fight to be second in her elimination one week ago, and there's no reason to think she'll regress tonight. The inside post gives her plenty of tactical options.
- 3 TREACHEROUS DRAGON** — totes a four-race winning streak into tonight's final for trainer Brett Pelling who could be in store for a very big night. The filly is one of many worthy of garnering top billing in this spot.
- 1 WICKEDLY INNOCENT** — rallied from a very tough spot last week and came up just a neck short from finding her way to victory lane. She's a high-speed lass who gives Pelling a solid 1-2 punch.



DERICK GIWNER

SELECTIONS: 3 - 5 - 6 - 1

- 3 TREACHEROUS DRAGON** — has looked like the best 3YO pacing filly every time she has stepped on the track this year. It would take a brutal trip to take her down, but this is a talented field.
- 5 LYONS SERENITY** — took a ton of air as the first one to move in her elimination and held very well. Sweet Lou filly seems ready to peak tonight at what should be a fair price; don't ignore her.
- 6 SEA SILK** — was raced to just make the final last week out of necessity from an outside post and finished powerfully late in that elimination. She has ability but may offer lower than warranted odds.
- 1 WICKEDLY INNOCENT** — got her first real taste of upper-level stakes foes and raced well in defeat. She'll likely need a trip to win but the talent is there.

RACE 9 \$211,000 ARMBRO FLIGHT



MONIQUE VAG

SELECTIONS: 3 - 7 - 1 - 6

- 3 BELLA BELLINI** — was dominant last year, and only finished off the board once. She got hot late sweeping the Breeders' Crown elim ad final along with the Matron. Her last victory this year was the definition of impressive, rallying home in :25.4.
- 7 ATLANTA** — Can never discount this mare who always shows up with the big money on the line. It took a monstrous final quarter out of our top pick to track her down late in her most recent. She's a must use underneath in exotics.
- 1 WHEN DOVESCRY** — Last year's Armbro Flight winner comes in winless on the year thus far but two of her starts versus boys. She returns to WMP where she flaunts two big stakes wins and has never been worse than third.
- 6 HP MAMA B** — fresh off a new lifetime best score against the boys versus a quality field here on Monday night. She's fit, seemingly getting even better, and has that homefield advantage racing right in her back yard.



GABE PREWITT

SELECTIONS: 3 - 7 - 2 - 10

- 3 BELLA BELLINI** — She has made the very difficult transition from 3 to 4, seemingly improving with every single start.
- 7 ATLANTA** - Ultra-consistent, shows up week after week.
- 2 NEXT LEVEL STUFF** — Versatile mare draws a perfect post, should be able to track early and take dead aim late.
- 10 HEY LIVVY** — More than holding her own against top shelf mares at Yonkers, and I like the one start over the track against male rivals.

\$351,000 ROSES ARE RED



KEN MIDDLETON JR.

SELECTIONS: 2 – 3 – 1 – 4

- 2 **TEST OF FAITH** — won with the greatest of ease last week after a three-week break. Not many are better than Pelling when it comes to peaking them just in time for the big ones. She's a scary specimen.
- 3 **LYONS SENTINEL** — stormed home in :26 to stop the tele-timer in 1:50.1 last week to extend her winning streak to two-in-a-row for trainer King. Her speed and skill makes her the biggest threat to knock off my top choice.
- 1 **SO MUCH MORE** — is the local hopeful with the best chance of playing giant killer. She has the speed and the skill needed to let them know she's there. I can see her rounding out the Trifecta ticket.
- 4 **LIT DE ROSE** — found late clearance last week and managed to take home one of the final spots to tonight's main event for mares. She's a longshot to consider underneath on some exotic tickets.



ASHLEY MAILLOUX

SELECTIONS: 3 – 2 – 6 – 8

- 3 **LYONS SENTINEL** — This classy mare won 10 starts in 2021, including the TVG Mares and in 2022, she's won two races. She looked good in the elimination last weekend and draws perfectly for the final.
- 2 **TEST OF FAITH** — The 2021 Horse of the Year has been simply sensational – she won 14 starts last year while amassing over \$1 million in purse earnings. She was in command in her final and her final panels are some of the strongest in the field.
- 6 **FIRE START HANOVER** — Last year, she finished third in the Breeders Crown final. Since then, she's been winless but raced quite well two starts back in the Graduate at Woodbine Mohawk Park. In her elimination, she paced home nicely to finish fourth.
- 8 **KOBES GIGI** — Indiana-invader Kobes Gigi was second in her elimination behind Lyons Sentinel last week. She's a consistent type who finds herself in deeper waters and with an outside draw, but encouraging to see Yannick Gingras in the bike.

RACE 11
\$1 MILLION PEPSI NORTH AMERICA CUP

SELECTIONS: 5 – 7 – 4 – 8

- 5 **PEBBLE BEACH** — is the horse to beat and I don't think they will. He's shown great speed since his rookie season and his maturity has been evident through three starts this year. This is the race to take him to superstar status.
- 7 **NIGHT HAWK** — good runner-up effort to my top choice last week and I think they'll be one-two again. Lightly raced and never had a bad start. I think he's got another gear and could be a great showdown.
- 4 **BEACH GLASS** — he's not his father, but he's pretty good. That said, I don't think we get a repeat of Somebeachsomewhere's 2008 Cup. Took advantage of drawing the easier of the two eliminations. I think he'll continue to get strong, just not enough for tonight to be his night.
- 8 **KOLBY TWO STEP** — just like last year's winner, 'Kolby' could bring another Cup to a small town in Ontario. He's been carefully handled all along and finished up well in his two starts this season. Should be waiting in the wings to finish strong.

SELECTIONS: 7 – 5 – 6 – 10

- 7 **NIGHT HAWK** — Lightly-raced colt has been razor sharp. Hoping he gets a target to track tonight in a reversal of trips.
- 5 **PEBBLE BEACH** — I have loved this guy since his first baby races. He has stamped himself as the one to beat.
- 6 **ARLO HANOVER** — The only knock would be D Miller opting off for the stablemate, but this guy will be airborne late if the pace is lively.
- 10 **MAD MAX HANOVER** — Talented colt lands tricky post, forced to blast early?

DESPERATE MAN WINS CUP 38

Desperate Man, driven by Trevor Henry, stormed home to win the 38th Pepsi North America Cup on Saturday, September 11, 2021 at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The thrilling victory proved once again that anything can happen in horse racing. Owned and trained by Kathy and John Cecchin of Arthur, ON, Desperate Man's tremendous heart has made him one of the most lucrative wedding gifts a couple has received.

Purchased for \$20,000 as a yearling, Kathy and John added their daughter, Nikki, and her husband, Paul Davies, as owners of Desperate Man after offering the newlyweds the option between help with the down payment for a new house, or part ownership in an unraced horse.

Taking the riskier of the two options, Nikki and Paul's gamble led them to the winner's circle of Canada's richest pacing race.

Entering the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup final off a hard-charging second-place effort in his elimination, Desperate Man went one better in his biggest moment.

Heavy favourite Bulldog Hanover took early control in the \$1 million race, leading nine rivals through a sensible opening quarter-mile of :27.3. Rockyroad Hanover sat second followed by Whichwaytothebeach and Perfect Sting, while Henry had Desperate Man positioned in fifth.

There was little change as Bulldog Hanover continued to call the shots by the half in :55.1, with Henry making sure he kept Desperate Man in touch with the leader, tipping to the outside and following the cover of Perfect Sting.

Desperate Man continued to pick up steam and pick off his rivals one by one, as the field began the turn for home.

Mid-way down the stretch, Desperate Man exploded on the scene, striking the front and going on to post a three-quarter length triumph in a time of 1:49.3, carving out a final quarter in :27.1. Perfect Sting finished second, Whichwaytothebeach was third, and Bulldog Hanover was fourth.

"I had to get away better than what I did last week. I had to have him forwardly placed," said driver Henry in the winner's circle. "He's a little tricky behind the car. Tonight, I said we've got to have him closer, so you know, if he makes a mistake, he makes a mistake. But we've got to have him closer."

Henry, long-time friends with the Cecchins, was thrilled to hoist the Cup trophy for the first-time.

"It feels great. These people deserve it:

They've been in the business a long time, had some hard times, and got lucky to get this horse. You know, I started at the bottom and now I won the biggest one, so it's been great."

Even in the madness of celebrating a victory in one of the sport's biggest races, John Cecchin remained modest in his expectations for his superstar horse.

"The game plan is, he's a Saturday night horse for two or three years, and after that we'll buy him a saddle and ride him."

The Cecchins and Davies families have continued to enjoy great success since the Pepsi North America Cup victory. Desperate Man concluded his 2021 season by winning the Ontario Sires Stakes Super Final and was named Canadian Horse of the Year at the 2021 O'Brien Awards.
