Winning never gets old for 91-year-old Bill Megens

The nonagenarian still breeds, trains, and, sometimes, drives his own.

Steering a near 1,000-pound racehorse from a suspended position through frigid temperatures isn't how most 91-year-olds spend their evenings, but as you might have already quessed, Bill Megens is not your typical nonagenarian.

The incomparable Guelph, ON-based horseman made headlines on Dec. 20 when he piloted his homebred trotter Willy Strike to victory in race 6 at The Raceway at Western Fair District.

Leaving from post 5, the son of Alarm Detector—Market Strike got away second through the opening quarter, maintaining his position at the half. The pair was still second but on the move at three-quarters, and at the stretch call remained a length-and-a-half behind the leader, even-money favorite HA Code Red.

A valiant final push ultimately proved proper for Megens and the bay gelding, 88 years his junior. They crossed the finish line in 2:06 for a guarter-length triumph.

As the 4-1 third choice, Willy Strike paid \$10.60.

"He might not be the fastest but he's a really nice horse," said Megens. "He's got four white legs, and a lot of people like him. I thought he might be in a little tough, but he got lucky, and we won.

"That's driving... keep turning to the left."

An eye-catching horse and an ordinary philosophy earned Megens his first trip to the winner's circle since Oct. 12, 2021, and his 1,190th across some 5,800 lifetime starts.

But the head-turning score, which occurred in his 21st start of 2024, came as somewhat of a surprise to Megens.

It wasn't because he didn't have faith in his plucky youngster. Instead, he envisioned getting across the finish line first with another one of his homebreds, He Will.

"I thought I could win with my other horse [He Will]," said Megens, who drove the 4-year-old son of Muscle Mass—Juliet later that night in race 11. An encouraging string of training sessions had Megens convinced the bay trotter was ready for a return to the oval following a series of difficult stretches that required prolonged shutdowns.

However, the effective workouts didn't translate for He Will, who after a strong start faltered to eighth of eight.

Despite the unfortunate nightcap, Megens stood as the talk of the town around Western Fair.

"It's truly remarkable to watch Bill come to the track and do his thing," said Greg Blanchard, director of equine programming at Western Fair. "I think everyone gets some motivation from seeing a guy like him still getting to do what he loves. He is such a well-liked guy, and I think everyone is enjoying this ride along with him.

"It's something we may never see again."

Perhaps not, but betting against William John Megens, Jr. wouldn't be a wise allocation of funds.

The extraordinary feat was merely the latest chapter in a long list of storybook moments that transcend far beyond traditional wins and losses.

Megens' story traces back to 1950, the year he and his brother John moved to Canada from The Netherlands.

Just 16-years-old at the time, Bill got his start in the horse racing industry at his father's northern Ontario farm.

While he knew at a young age that working with horses was what he was meant to do, the bright-eyed teenager spent the following years building a resume as diverse as they come.

"I worked on the farm, and then in the winter time, my father sent us down to Toronto to make a little extra money to help the family out," said Bill. "I worked in a furniture store, did a bit of construction, and then I went back to the farm."

In the fall of '51, Bill's brother John got a job on a construction site making around \$40 per week. During that same time, Bill was making \$30 per week working at the now defunct Dufferin Park.

Both Megens boys would send \$100 home at the end of each month. This left Bill with a net monthly income of around \$20, or less than \$1 a day.

But he was doing what he loved working with the horses at Dufferin Park, and it paid enough to buy milk and Rice Krispies.

After a few more stints between the family farm and Dufferin Park, Bill's racing career took him to Blue Bonnets in Montreal and Thorncliffe Park in Toronto.

He even matched John in making \$40 a week.

Despite all that, Bill made the decision to step away from the horse racing industry. He didn't foresee a sustainable future in the game, especially with night racing being a foreign concept at that time.

"I quit the horses and did, you name it," said Bill. "I went into the landscaping business, then I had a butcher shop in Orillia for a while, and I sold that. Then I ended up with a dairy farm. I milked 40-some-odd cows up in Beaverton [ON]."

His next stop did not involve another career change, but instead, a career revival.

A timely visit from his brother-in-law, who himself was a horse racing fan, was all it took for Bill to give his true passion a second shot at Greenwood Raceway in Toronto.

"Night racing, purses were a little better, and I ended up selling my dairy farm and my cows and everything else," said Bill. "I got a few horses and headed down to Toronto. That's how I got back in. "I had one owner that bought a couple of horses, and that helped. After that, I tried to make a living."

By that time, Bill and his wife Antionette had seven children, and he felt racing only at Garden City Raceway in St. Catherines wasn't going to cut it.

After persevering through a few bouts of bad luck, Bill got his break with champion trotter Snegem Flight.

Bill coined the 'Snegem' moniker, his last name spelled backwards, as a way of making sure the names he chose weren't already taken.

"I got really lucky with him," said Bill. "The [Ontario] Sire Stakes just started that year [1974] when he was a 2-year-old. He was 2-Year-Old Trotter of the Year and 3-Year-Old Trotter of the Year. As a 3-year-old, I represented Canada in the [Roosevelt] International at Yonkers with him."

The enduring horseman's streak of good fortune continued with a yearling he renamed Snegem Telstar.

With Bill at the helm, Snegem Flight dead-heated with juggernaut Noble Art in a 1977 Grand Circuit tilt at Blue Bonnets to set a track and Canadian record time of 2:04.

"We got really lucky," said Bill. "They all said I got an angel looking after me."

Over the course of his decorated career, Bill received several accolades from the Ontario Jockey Club for his driving and training accomplishments.

Most importantly, he's doing it his way.

"It's a different game today," said Bill. "People are buying yearlings for \$800,000 and stuff like that. I'm just doing it the old way. I raise my own, train my own, and sometimes drive my own. But that's people like me, a thing of the past, unless you have a good job beside you, or some good owners to pay the bills.

"I got my own bills and my own help. I feed the horses and all that. It gets a little tough, but I think I'm doing alright for my age."

Alright may be a severe understatement, but the modest horseman's love for the game remains as potent as it did 75 years ago.


At age 91, Bill has no plans of calling it quits anytime soon. He learned that lesson once before.

While he does intend to shorten his stable in the spring — he currently spends 10-14 hours each day taking care of 10 horses — don't confuse it for anything other than a simple downsizing.

"I just want to keep a few, cut down a little bit, and hopefully, have a couple half-decent horses and pay their bill," he said. "That's all."

For anyone wondering if he also intends to drive the horses he keeps, Bill quickly replied, "Oh yeah."

James MacDonald on another spectacular year

The leading driver at Woodbine Mohawk Park is a favorite for a fourth consecutive Driver of the Year Award in Canada and was a finalist to Dexter Dunn for the top reinsman award in the U.S.

James MacDonald was the only other driver up against Dexter Dunn for 2024 U.S. Driver of the Year on the USHWA Dan Patch ballot. Although, ultimately, Dunn ended up capturing his fifth North American driving title, MacDonald had the unique distinction of also making the ballot as a top-three finalist in the W.R. Haughton Good Guy Award category as well.

"First off, to be on the ballot with Dexter this year was really special to me," said MacDonald. "Obviously, I wasn't going to win, but just to be recognized at that level is a real honor, and one I'm

very proud of. Also, the Good Guy Award [nomination] was an absolute shock. It would have been nice to win, but just to be regarded in that conversation is something I'm very proud of."

Known for positive interactions with fans of all ages and media, MacDonald was nominated for the Good Guy Award by three USHWA chapters (Canada, Keystone, and Monticello-Goshen). The 2024 award was won by Art Zubrod and Leah Cheverie of Fair Island Farm.

At the upcoming O'Brien Awards, MacDonald will defend his Canadian driving crown. He and Louis-Philippe Roy are the two finalists for Canada's 2024 Keith Waples Driver of the Year Award, with the result to be announced at the Feb. 8 awards banquet. MacDonald has won the last three consecutive Canadian driving titles, a feat last achieved by Doug Brown, who did it twice (1989-91 and 1993-96).

On Dec. 23, MacDonald recorded another historic triple, becoming the first driver to reach 400 wins in three straight years at Mohawk. No other Woodbine circuit driver had surpassed 400 wins since James' brother, Mark MacDonald, achieved the rare milestone.

James, the 2017 World Driving Champion, also brought home the 2024 National Driving Championship title on July 5 at Quebec's Hippodrome 3R, and will represent Canada at the 2025 World Driving Championships in New Zealand.


James told HRU that he never expected such an extended run of success at Canada's top track.

"Absolutely not. I've always just tried to do my best and win as much as possible. I think I started the same as every other driver, thinking I was likely never going to be good enough to make a job of this," he said with a laugh.

In a 2014 interview, James said that when he was growing up in PEI, harness racing was less important to him than it was to two of his brothers.

"I didn't have as much interest in it as Mark and Anthony, but when I graduated high school, Anthony was swamped so I went up [to Ontario] and worked with him," James said.

The 38-year-old horseman has risen far in the decade since his 1,000th driving win, back on June 22, 2014 at Georgian Downs with pacer Brocks Fortune. As of New Year's Day 2025, James

was nearing his 4,000th win, with 3,954 victories in 28,048 career drives.

"I definitely could have never dreamed of having the success I've had," he said. "Like I said earlier, I've always tried to show up with a good attitude and do the best I could. That being said, it's been a very fun ride."

In 2024, that "ride" included top horses like Meadowlands and Cane Pace winner Legendary Hanover (p, 3, 1:46.2m; \$1,088,681); Its A Love Thing (p, 3, 1:48.2s; \$1,044,535), who matched the Canadian and Mohawk track record for 3-year-old pacing fillies in the Fan Hanover final; Chantilly (p, 2, 1:50.2s; \$560,315), the Eternal Camnation, Shes A Great Lady, and Ontario Sires Stakes Gold champion; Willys Home Run (3, 1:53s; \$704,064), winner of two 2024 OSS Gold legs and Super Final for 3-year-old filly trotters; and Monalishi (2,1:52.2s; \$413,280), who won the Peaceful Way final, Champlain Stake, and an OSS Gold leg for James.

All are 2024 O'Brien Award top-2 finalists.

"All of them were standouts at some point of the season for myself and their connections," said the Guelph, ON horseman. "It was a fun ride seeing these horses compete on the biggest stages in harness racing. Obviously, Legendary Hanover doing what he did was special. The way people talked about him and the excitement he brought to the track every time was something I will never forget."

Legendary Hanover has been driven by James in every start of his career but one. The Anthony Beaton trainee was voted Canada's 2-Year-Old Pacing Colt of the Year in 2023. At 3, Legendary Hanover brought James his first Meadowlands Pace win, as well as his first winning drive in a leg of the Pacing Triple Crown.

Looking back at his best-ever year by earnings and Grand Circuit victories, Mohawk's leading 2024 reinsman narrowed down his favorite moments to three: "Winning the Meadowlands Pace, definitely getting my first two Breeders Crowns [3-Year-Old Filly Trot with Lady Landia and Open Pace with Coach Stefanos], and, finally, getting to be the regular pilot of Chantilly."

As he **previously addressed in HRU**, James' impressive American results last year have not changed his mind about being based at Mohawk.

"As far as wanting to drive more in the U.S.A., it's always a lot of fun to travel around and drive great horses, but I love my life and my home in Canada," James said. "We are lucky to have one of the greatest tracks in the world to race at all year round. The purses here are great, and the Ontario Sires Stakes program is one of the best in the world. Hopefully in 2025 I'm blessed to have the opportunity to drive some really great horses all over North America."

There have been recent shifts in the Woodbine Mohawk Park driving colony, including extended absences by Doug McNair and the suspended Sylvain Filion, but James said it was still business as usual for him.

"As far as finding a difference in racing at Mohawk currently, I don't," he said. "It's the same track, just new people. You need to find their tendencies, and try and find a way to put your horse in the best spot possible. Anytime you're missing world-class drivers, it changes things, but it's still the same goal, find a way to win."

With his 39th birthday coming up Jan. 10, James said his hopes for the New Year involve driving specific horses, rather than chasing statistics or awards.

"I'm chomping at the bit to get behind Chantilly again," he said. "She's shown flashes of something very special in 2024. Hasty Bid [4, 1:50.2m; \$524,353], since the time he stepped foot on the racetrack, has given [my wife] Paige and me one thrill after another. We're hoping 2025 will be no different. - 1b. "I feel like there weren't many days this year that I wasn't on the track, I was watching Captain Albano and Sig Sauer. Just watching the careers they've had from 2 to 3, when I was working for Noel last year [in 2023] or even at the beginning of this winter [in 2024], I was still working for him, it was just really cool to see them progress and turn into the horses they became."
- 2. "I don't think I made any specific ones. I just think I went into this year hoping to progress my driving career just in general. You know, you always want to do better than the year before. I never set a specific goal, like 'I want to reach so and so amount of wins or so and so purses,' I think I just wanted to try to do better than I did before."
- 3. "I wouldn't say anything specific. Obviously, like this year, I'd try to do better and just try to make the most of all the opportunities I can get. For 2025, I mean, I don't think I'll win a Hambo, but, of course, those types of things are goals down the road, but for 2025 I'd say just to try to keep progressing and just keep doing my best to try to do better."





There has never been a season like it.

Now that 2024 has come and gone, the biggest decision of the year still awaits.

Who will be crowned Australian Harness Horse of the Year in the most fascinating, divisive and talent-crammed vote of all time?

There are three genuine contenders.

In any "normal" year, either Leap To Fame, Just Believe or Keayang Zahara would be unbeatable.

They are all champions in their own way.

Leap To Fame is one of the absolute greatest pacers Australasia has ever seen, Just Believe sits in the all-time top three Down Under trotters (with Maori's Idol and Lyell Creek), while there has never been a 3-year-old trotter anything near Keayang Zahara in this part of the world.

Let's take an in-depth look at the three contenders:

Sadly, a niggling throat infection sidelined him from chasing more glamour time in the Victoria and Hunter Cups as well as denying him a defense of his crown in the NSW Inter Dominion.

I wish he'd be able to go to NZ for the first time for that NZ Cup in November.

He ranks in the best three or four pacers Down Under has ever produced and still has lots of time to build on that given he's only just turned 6.

It'll be great to see him back defending his Hunter Cup title on Feb. 1 at Melton.

JUST BELIEVE

9-year-old gelding trotter. Orlando Vici—Heavens Above

2024 Record: 18 starts, 15 wins, three seconds

2024 Prize money: \$997,092

2024 Major wins: New Zealand Dominion Trot, NZ Rowe Cup,

TAB Trot

What an absolute marvel.

At an age when most horses are retired or waning, Just Believe took things to another level.

[Leap To Fame] is surely the favorite to go back-to-back in this [Horse of the Year] award.

LEAP TO FAME

6-year-old horse pacer. Bettors Delight—Lettucereason

2024 Record: 16 starts, 15 wins, one second

2024 Prize money: \$1,451,428

2024 Major wins: Hunter Cup, Miracle Mile and Blacks A Fake

He is surely the favorite to go back-to-back in this award.

It almost seems unthinkable to suggest he may not win it given his deeds in 2024 where he raced 16 times for 15 wins and a second.

He became only the second horse to complete the Triple Crown – Inter Dominion (late 2023), Hunter Cup (February) and Miracle Mile (March). Then he added the Blacks A Fake.



And all this in the year after his daunting and grueling Swedish trip in mid to late 2023.

Apart from his narrow and fantastic defeat (second) in the Great Southern Star, he won all the mega races he chased.

Traditionally it's been hard for Aussies to go to New Zealand and win, let alone dominate, but that's exactly what Just Believe did.

He won the inaugural TAB Trot and added NZ's two biggest trotting races, the Rowe Cup and Dominion Trot.

Sadly, the year ended with an injury and uncertainty over his racing future.

Let's hope we see him back and firing, but, if not, he's well and truly stamped himself as a legend of trotting in this part of the world.



KEAYANG ZAHARA

What a mighty stayer this fella is.

One Aussie-trained pacer had won the iconic New Zealand Cup since 1985 before this guy won in 2023 and then successfully defended the crown last November.

That's special.

Amazingly, Swayzee is the older half-brother to Leap To Fame and he's been his arch-rival and only major foe for the past 18 months.

They've been like Nadal and Federer to tennis in their prime.

Yes, he's only beaten him once, but Swayzee hasn't had many opportunities to get a better spot in running than Leap To Fame.

Swayzee won seven of his 10 starts in 2024 and ran second in the other three. Two of those seconds were to Leap To Fame.

We can't wait to see them come together again, but we may have to wait a while.

Swayzee will skip the Hunter Cup and the sprinting style of the Miracle Mile isn't his go.

It could be the next Inter Dominion at Albion Park in July before the siblings lock horns again.

DON HUGO

5-year-old horse pacer. Art Major—Cinco Amigos

2024 Record: 16 starts, eight wins, five placings

2024 Prize money: \$1,423,885

2024 Major wins: TAB Eureka and Inter Dominion final

What a finish to the year this guy had.

Emerged from relative obscurity to win the world's richest harness race, the \$2.1 million TAB Eureka, at Menangle in September.

Just a couple of months earlier, he didn't get a run in the Group 1 Blacks A Fake itself (won by Leap To Fame) and only contested the consolation.

Some felt the TAB Eureka was a bit of 'soft win' given Don Hugo led, dictated and zipped home to beat his rivals.

But the then 4-year-old silenced his critics in the most emphatic fashion when he won two heats of the NSW Inter Dominion and won a titanic final in November/December.

For the second year in its history, the TAB Eureka delivered the Inter Dominion winner. Leap To Fame ran second in the inaugural running in 2023 and dominated the Brisbane Inter Dominion series a few weeks later.

Don Hugo is a proper horse, but as trainer/driver Luke McCarthy rightly points out, the bar will go up when he locks horns with the likes of Leap To Fame and Swayzee in the biggest races of 2024.

McCarthy said, "I don't know if he can beat them, but I know he just keeps getting better and it'll be fun seeing where we stack up."

That could come as soon as the Group 1 Hunter Cup on Feb. 1 where Leap To Fame is headed.

At the very least, Don Hugo is going to add some much needed depth to our marquee pacing features in 2025.

THE VERDICT:

I suspect the majority will go with Leap To Fame, but I'm voting for Just Believe. I just give a lot of extra weight to the fact he traveled to New Zealand twice and was so dominant over there.







Defending Prix d'Amérique champ Idao de Tillard has qualified for this year's race

Idao de Tillard (Severino), last year's Prix d'Amérique champion, entered the \$125,000 Prix de Bourgogne with some question marks surrounding him. The entries prior to Sunday's (Dec. 29) task hadn't told the fans that Idao de Tillard was back in the same shape as he showed last year, but after a perfect trip in a high pace event, Thierry Duvaldestin's champion sprinted to an easy win in a mile rate of 1:52.1 over 2,100 meters.

The race went on perfectly for Idao de Tillard as leader Don Fanucci Zet came to the three-quarters-of-a-mile marker in 1:21.2. The Swedish hope in the event could obviously not keep up the speed when strong horses like Go On Boy and Emeraude de Bais pushed for the lead just before the last turn.

Unfortunately, Emeraude de Bais went off-stride on the lead in the turn and driver Pierre-Yves Verva did not succeed in getting his horse out of the way. Instead, Emeraude de Bais became an obstacle for pretty much all of the horses that raced on the inside, including Don Fanucci Zet, who still followed quite easily behind the new leader.

Replay here.

Go On Boy and Idao de Tillard were the two big names that qualified for the big race in the end of this month and the fact that particularly these two managed to grab their spots in Prix d'Amérique, respectively, means that the field is shaping up and suddenly looks much stronger than before the Prix de Bourgogne. Idao de Tillard and Go On Boy both have star qualities and will be among the favorites in the big Grand Prix.

Another new name qualified for the PdA. Justin Bold finished strongly from a bad post as third and already qualified, while Hokkaido Jiel finished fourth.

BAZIRE'S STABLE IN THE FIRING LINE AFTER POSITIVE DOPING TESTS

Four horses in Nicolas Bazire's and his father Jean-Michel's stable have tested positive for Glycopyrrolate, an

antispasmodic substance and Jean-Michel wrote about the news in his own column in French media Paris-Turf on Jan. 1.

"The veterinarian has made it clear to me that it may be related to respiratory tract treatment," wrote Jean-Michel in Paris-Turf. "Now, samples have been taken from the stable on shavings, hay, stable box-disinfectant, in order to try to find the origin of these positive tests. It is bizarre, but it will be a suspension."

Among the four positive samples, Liza Josselyn is included and any kind of news like this is bad for the industry.

It was not many weeks ago that Levino Bello claimed a group 1-race in Paris while the 3-year-old (now 4-year-old) was suspended from racing after a **positive doping test in Italy in November**.

All horses in the Bazire case have tested positive during the winter meeting in Paris and what the outcome will be in this story is hard to say at this point.

More news from the Bazire stable and this one is more uplifting. Jushua Tree, by many considered as the best horse in the French J-crop, might be back on track for the \$125,000 Prix de Belgique on Jan. 12. It was earlier said that Jushua Tree would miss the rest of the meeting in Paris, but around Christmas time, Jean-Michel announced that his horse may be ready for the really big races very soon.

Tetrick with three straight Philadelphia double driving crowns

Tim Tetrick did the "driving championship double" by posting the highest win total and best UDR at Harrah's Philadelphia for the third consecutive season, but an old rival made things interesting in the first category as the southeast Pennsylvania track closed out its 2024 season with a twilight Tuesday (Dec. 31) card.

Tetrick, who took down his 10th sulky win crown at Philly, last drove at Harrah's on Dec. 20, and when he left, he was 19 victories ahead. But familiar foe George Napolitano, Jr., who himself has eight Philly top spots for win, came on with a furious late rush, winning 17 times over the last handful of cards, including four times on Tuesday, coming up shy by a 177-175 margin.

Harrah's has raced 19 seasons now; Cat Manzi was leading driver in the opening year of 2006, and no one with initials other than "TT" or "GN" has since led the year's win totals, a remarkable streak of consistency.

Tetrick also added his 11th Philly UDR championship to his collection, posting a fine "batting average" of .382.

The Philadelphia-area weather turned nasty mid-card Tuesday despite remaining in the 50-degree range, and the features, late in the card, were thus denied the chance to show peak speed.

But the two feature winners figured out that the front end might be tough to overhaul, and that proved the case.

The \$15,000 fast-class feature pace was taken by the Always A Virgin gelding **Virgo**, who covered the mile in a quick 1:50.2 considering the conditions. Now showing a 7 4-3-0 recent record while taking his 1:49 mark in the initial victory, Virgo has the invaluable asset of being able to leave the gate quickly. From post 3 driver Jim Pantaleano had no other thought than the front end, rolling on to sharp fractions of :26.1,:54.2, and 1:22.3. Moment Is Here looked to be a major danger in the stretch, but Virgo had enough to put in a :27.4 final quarter and held off the pocket sitter by a neck for trainer Darren Taneyhill and the partnership of Mark Jakubik and Jason Darling.

The \$13,000 sub-feature pace saw the Irish-bred, Robert Cleary-trained **Oakwood Paddy IR** make two moves to control the pace for driver Brett Beckwith, then withstood extended grinding pressure from Be Dazzled Lou A to win by a length in 1:51.3, coming his back half in :55. The Foreclosure N gelding, 21-for-54 lifetime, is owned by Robert Corrigan and Ruari McNulty.

Live racing is scheduled to resume at Harrah's Philadelphia on April 11, 2025.

Big M handle tops \$3 million per card again

It was another banner year from a business perspective at The Meadowlands, as for the third time in the last four years, average daily wagering at the industry's handle leader topped \$3 million.

"It's our goal to wager \$3 million on any given card," said track chief operating officer/general manager Jason Settlemoir. "Whether it's Meadowlands Pace Night or an ordinary winter Saturday night, that's the bar we always try to clear, and we were fortunate enough to do that a majority of the time during 2024."

Over the course of the year, betting bettered the \$3-million mark on 46 occasions at the mile oval, meaning wagering exceeded that lofty plateau 52 per cent of the time.

After \$2,894,453 was wagered on Saturday's (Dec. 28) 14-race card, action for the 88 programs contested during 2024 totaled \$264,427,375, an average per card of \$3,004,856.

Many of harness racing's biggest programs during the course of any year take place at The Meadowlands, and, not surprisingly, the biggest day on the harness racing calendar resulted in its biggest day at the windows, as an industry-best \$7.4 million was put in play on Hambletonian Day five months ago.

These are the top five handles on a single card during 2024 at The Meadowlands:

- 1. \$7,427,223 (Aug. 3, Hambletonian Day)
- 2. \$5,136,129 (July 13, Meadowlands Pace Night)
- 3. \$4,356,475 (Oct. 26, Breeders Crown finals Night II)
- 4. \$3,870,638 (May 4, Kentucky Derby Day)
- 5. \$3,779,096 (Jan. 27)

Breeders Crown weekend (Oct. 25-26) was a record-setter.

Since the four races on Friday and eight on Saturday format went into existence, The Meadowlands total handle of \$7,372,478 in 2021 had stood as the standard.

But this year, when you add Friday's (Breeders Crown finals – Night I) total of \$3,369,424 to Saturday's action, you get the new mark of \$7,725,899.

2024 BY THE NUMBERS: Dave Miller was the leading driver at The Big M during 2024 with 106 wins. He was followed by Dexter Dunn (98), Todd McCarthy (86), Andy McCarthy (82) and Yannick Gingras (78).

With a record six Breeders Crown wins and five more scores on Fall Final Four/FanDuel Championships Night, it's no surprise that Dunn was the leading money-earning driver with \$5.9 million.

Ron Burke was the leading trainer with 60 victories. He was followed by Nancy Takter (46), Jeff Cullipher (40), Ake Svanstedt (35) and Per Engblom (33).

Svanstedt led in money-earnings with \$3.568 million, slightly more than runner-up Burke, who accrued \$3.560 million.

Post-position 5 once again was the best starting berth at The Big M, winning 15.3 per cent of the time. Next was post 6 (14.7), post 7 (11.9), post 1 (11.6) and post 3 (11.3).

Amy Hollar voted 2024 Rambling Willie honoree

The Ohio Chapter of the United States Harness Writers Association has selected Amy Hollar to receive the prestigious Rambling Willie Award recognizing the Ohioan who has done the most for harness racing over the past two decades. The popular and indefatigable Cuyahoga Falls resident has been MGM Northfield Park's Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association track representative since 2001, serving under five OHHA general managers.

Hollar, 56, was born in Bellefontaine, OH, to a family with deep harness racing roots. Grandfather Ken Harvey, who conducted a pony ride around Ohio fairs in the late '60s and early '70s, gravitated to standardbreds and opened his own stable with the support of the entire clan. Hollar's mother Melanie earned her driver-trainer license in 1979. Amy and her two younger sisters, Jenny and Stacy, helped dad Tony operate the family farm.

"Pa was a 'girl dad' before anyone knew what that meant," Amy said. "He made sure his girls knew they were just as smart as any boy while ma made sure we had clean hands in public and could curl our eyelashes."

Besides Scioto Downs, the family stable often competed at Raceway Park. Previously a drama major at Kent State, Amy transferred to the University of Toledo in the early 1990's, met her future husband Calvin, switched her major to journalism, hired on as the OHHA track representative in 1991, and married Calvin on Sept. 26, 1992, in the Raceway winner's circle followed by a reception in the sold-out clubhouse.

Hollar's 24-year stint at Northfield has been a remarkable balancing act in terms of productivity, hard won respect, and sheer stamina. While raising a family of three — sons Carson and Aaron and daughter Toni Dale — she continues to work mornings several hours in the barn with Calvin, aka "Buck," and makes herself available to horsemen all day and night long. And not only at Northfield. Horsemen at all three seasonal downstate tracks know they can count on her to coordinate catch drives, ship-in stalls and other details related to the Route 8 oval's year-round series and stakes events.

Amy's energy, organizational skills and captivating presence in post-race ceremonies brings to mind the old adage "the hostess with the mostest" — herding excited owners and connections for the photograph, blanketing the horse, giving hugs while distributing bling and mementos, and safely exiting everyone from the winner's circle multiple times a night to stay on a tight schedule.

While Amy works for the horsemen and represents their interests with tenacity and effectiveness, she has earned the deep respect of both Northfield management and state regulatory authorities. Her long and successful efforts to maintain Ohio's status as The Heart of It All in the nation's standardbred industry is why she has earned the 2024 Rambling Willie Award.
