# Perfect Sting positive another example that drug cases need to be expedited

Delay isn't nefarious, but is still unacceptable. Commissions simply must resolve cases faster.

Joe Holloway told HRU there is a simple reason why a Class 3 positive test on his star pupil Perfect Sting wasn't made public until more than six months after the race in question.

When Perfect Sting tested positive for elevated levels of testosterone after the \$148,332 Pennsylvania Sire Stakes race on June 26 at The Meadows, Holloway immediately requested a split sample be tested. In Pennsylvania, fines and suspensions aren't announced until the results of the split sample test come back. The independent lab that tested the split sample was backed up and didn't complete the test until late December. After that split sample also revealed high levels of testosterone, the Pennsylvania State Horse Racing Commission immediately issued Holloway a \$500 fine and 15-day suspension that was announced on New Year's Eve.

That the announcement came 62 days after the pacer's final race, 30 days after his stallion book was announced full and closed for 2022 and 11 days after Perfect Sting was announced as the Dan Patch 3-Year-Old Pacing Colt of the Year is troublesome, but Holloway said the blame falls squarely on the lab testing the split sample.

"It's not Pennsylvania's fault. It's not Joe Holloway's fault. (The



split sample test results were) just backed up," Holloway said.

"Everybody is acting like there's some nefarious situation going on, you know, and it's not."

For the record, Holloway insists he didn't give Perfect Sting testosterone and has appealed the decision.

"It's a Class 3, it's 15 days and \$500 and if he was a gelding in my

barn and I'd given something that could raise the testosterone, you'd just take (the penalty) and be done with it... and it would be over with," Holloway said. "Most of these aren't going to be appealed – who's going to appeal a \$500 fine? Who's going to do it, unless it is the high-profile horse?"

As of Tuesday (Jan. 4), he had not been told when that appeal will be heard.

My issue isn't with the positive test as much as how long it took to get the split results so this could be announced. After all, a Class 3 positive is far less serious than Class 1 or 2 positives normally reserved for performance-enhancing, not therapeutic drugs. And, as Holloway said, we are talking about a \$500 fine and 15 days here, which gives you an idea that it's not a particularly serious offense.

But, in the interest of transparency, it would have been much better for the lab to have acted with more urgency so this could have been resolved and, potentially, dealt with while Perfect Sting was still racing and long before awards were voted on. To be clear, I don't think having this information would have changed many votes, nor stopped Holloway from being voted the Good Guy Award, but it's always better for people to be as informed as possible before making their choices.

And yes, I realize this is far from the first time positive tests cases have taken forever to resolve — and since this one has been appealed, it's still not resolved.

Just one month prior to the Perfect Sting positive being announced, the same Pennsylvania commission reported trainer Scott Di Domenico had been handed a \$10,000 fine and 120-day



suspension for a Class 4 ambroxol positive that dated back 13 months to a race at Harrah's Philadelphia on Nov. 1 of 2020 (the same day the trainer also received another ambroxol positive, his fourth such positive in 2020 for the drug used to treat inflammation of the bronchi).

Yes, the \$10,000, 120-day penalty — presumably for repeated offenses with a relatively minor therapeutic drug — was announced after Di Domenico dropped his appeal in the case. And yes, appeals often take forever to work themselves through the bureaucracy — but come on, *13 months* later?

The same Commissions that have constructed strict drug rules; the same Commissions that often test to picograms — one trillionth of a gram — *simply must* do better to get results faster even when it comes to split samples tested by independent labs. Commissions also need to have cases fairly adjudicated much faster, while maintaining due process.

It's not a big ask.

Other sports seem to have little problem getting timely drug testing results and having quick decisions and appeals for one simple reason: finding and quickly punishing those that break the rules is imperative to the other participants and the integrity of the game.

# Lack of quality caretaking help reaching a crisis point

Trainers Nancy Takter and Tom Fanning on the challenges in attracting and keeping good help.

From last week's Dazzling Dozen HRU Awards (full story here), one of the questions posed was what concerns you most about the future of sport. Some consistent responses included those around reduced attendance and participation, expanding competition and overall business model, though leading trainer Nancy Takter had a different response.

On her personal Facebook page this week, Takter posted the following: "It continues to amaze me that the biggest problem in harness racing is the one that no one mentions time and time again!!! THERE ARE NO WORKERS!! There are no new grooms, trainers, drivers, judges, racetrack staff, etc.! I have turned down so many horses in the last year because I can't staff the barn to train them! The sport will die because there are no people to work in it. Just scroll Facebook I'm sure you'll find a post of someone looking for a groom!"

To date, the post has elicited over 100 responses from those across the industry, debating reasons for the predicament.

It was a point worthy of a deeper discussion because unlike more common ways to measure industry health such as sizes of foal crops, sale prices, handle and so forth, having sufficient personnel in place across the industry isn't something that can be easily measured by hard and fast numbers. It's something that only those mired in the sports day-to-day can observe. For Takter, the issue is multi-faceted. Beginning with grooms directly, it's a matter of both quantity and quality.

"Back in the day, the grooms that worked in the barns cared about their horse and did everything for their horse," Takter said. "There are still those people left in the business, but they are few and far between. Before, your A-star grooms, if we needed to go back and water horses at 10 p.m. at night because it was 102 degrees all day and horses might not have enough water to get them through the night until we were there the next morning, it was never an issue, people went back and did that. Not many people are willing to do that nowadays. Had it not been for our Hispanic population that takes care of our horses right now we'd be in complete disarray. I think what it comes down to is that a lot of people that we have working in the industry with horses today are people that do this as a job because it's a job they can get, rather than doing it as their passion, which kind of used to be more of the case."

From the standpoint of quantity of workers, Takter said, "I feel like that if I go to Tony Alagna's barn or Linda's (Toscano) barn or they come to my barn, every person that works for me has worked for them at some point, so we're just rotating the same workers. It's the same group of people that end up circling the barns, and there's really no one else coming in. Tony, Linda, Ronnie (Burke) and I, we've had numerous discussions this summer because there's such a shortage of help right now and we don't want to steal from each other. Yes, we're competitors but we're also colleagues and most of us are friends. Ultimately, we need to figure out how to get more people involved."



Some comments in the string of replies to Takter's Facebook post painted the job as a groom as a dead-end position. But Takter sees it quite differently with the groom situation having far larger implications for the industry than just being able to fill the barn.

"I worked as a groom for 10 years and then became a trainer," she said. "There's a lot of people like Yannick Gingras, as an example. He groomed for his father and he first came to the U.S. as a trainer, not as a catch driver. Take John Campbell as another example. He started as a groom, became a trainer and then one of the greatest catch drivers ever, and now he's president of the Hambletonian Society. Additionally, we have numerous judges that used to be drivers or trainers or who worked their way up. If we don't have grooms, we're not going to have any drivers, trainers, future charters at tracks, identifiers, people to take samples and drug tests, we're not going to have paddock judges because nobody is going to wake up tomorrow and say that I want to be a paddock judge; nobody even knows that job exists. But our sport doesn't work without that position being filled."

Another argument made by more than a handful of responses to the social media post was that the worker shortage is caused by employment competition from corporations such as Amazon and other chains such as Walmart. It's a point that Takter strongly disagrees with.

"This is a problem in Europe, too, and all over the world, and it's that not many people want to do a manual labor job. Take this Wednesday, the weather was s - - - all day, miserable and cold and windy and everyone's covered in mud. People today would rather sit inside and be warm. Obviously, times change and society changes, but I don't think you're solving the issue with money, because I throw money at people to work. I have grooms that make \$850 a week to take four or five horses, that's a good paycheck. And they're making paddocks and bonuses on top of that. At some points during the summer, they're clearing over \$1,000 a week. One of my best friends is a high school teacher. She makes \$42,000 a year and has a PhD in education, and I have grooms that are making \$65,000."

Tom Fanning is a veteran trainer that, like Takter, is stabled in New Jersey. His comments echo those of Takter's on acknowledgement of help in the barns being harder to come by over the years. He also takes issue on the topic of the groom's pay.

"The grooms make good money. In New Jersey, at Gaitway, if you're a groom there you can make \$800 to \$900 a week," Fanning said.

Providing a comparable example to Takter, he goes on to say, "I have an owner who has a big landscaping company and for his crews to make that money a week, they're working over 50 back-breaking hours. Years ago, at Gaitway, there were a lot of grooms that were local people from the Freehold borough, they worked at the track and at that time the money wasn't that good for grooms, but I think that's changed now."

It may not yet be something that all barns do, but Takter is one example of providing grooms with more complete compensation

packages than what's traditionally been offered in the position.

"Everybody that works for me is on the books," said Takter. "I don't have anybody that I pay cash. Everything gets paid on the books, and everything is done the way it's supposed to be done. And I don't think that everyone realizes what the value of that is, because God forbid somebody does get hurt in the barn, I'm not going to say, 'You're on your own, good luck.' I have workers comp that covers that, and you're paying into your social security. If you're a full-time groom and you're on somebody's payroll in New Jersey you can get healthcare with dental, and we have really good healthcare here. But a lot of them just don't take advantage of it. I pay all my grooms that want to be on the SBOA insurance every month, but then I have people that don't even want insurance. I don't know what the answer is, but I really don't think the argument that if we paid people more or if we offered 401k's or offered health insurance all of the sudden, we'd have this influx of workers in our business."

Taking it a step further, Takter also supports the idea of what would amount essentially to an industry human resource department. A group or department could consist of trainers, caretaker representatives, and would provide standard protocol that all trainers are able to follow. For instance, as barns today are dealing with employees out with COVID, each trainer is determining on their own if they're paying those staff for sick days or not.

Another thing that both Takter and Fanning agree on is changing times are a focal reason for staff being harder to come by.

"Our industry is more of an agricultural one, but society overall has become less of that and there's less people growing up around horses and coming off farms," said Fanning. "You were either born into it or you knew someone who was in it, or you liked horses and that's how you got involved."

Similarly, Takter said, "I think it's unfortunate, but I also think that we as an industry haven't fostered people's interest and their love for the horse, which is something we've lost."

The disconnect in not being able to bring new workers into the industry closely parallels other more well-known issues of similar participation decline. How to improve it is obviously the question, but there should be little doubt that as the industry goes, so goes being able to find resources to work in it.

# Big M promises to be less of a drag

If you're going to The Meadowlands this weekend, it will be less of a drag, and if you can't make it there in person, no worries, their new website is good to go.

With 15 races both tonight (Jan. 7) and Saturday night this weekend, The Meadowlands will experiment with a shorter drag time before each race in an effort to provide a better experience to its customers, employees and horsepeople.

The normal eight-minute drag will be cut in half in an effort to shorten the length of time needed to wrap up the card by a reasonable hour. By doing so, The Big M can monitor in real time the effect, if any, the shortened drag has on wagering.


In addition, the countdown clock, which normally starts 60 seconds prior to off time, will instead start at three minutes to remind everyone to get their bets in and not get shut out.

First race post is 6:20 p.m. and a Thursday press release from the track said that the horses should be behind the gate and rolling at that time.

Heading into the two nightly \$50,000 guaranteed Pick 4 wagers (races 6-9 and 10-13) there may be a little time added to allow for extra betting.

Also, with their customer experience in mind, on Jan. 1, **www. playmeadowlands.com** got a clean, modern facelift and most importantly, it got smarter.





When The Big M website was last updated nearly 17 years ago, there were cell phones, but not smart ones. The old site no longer communicated perfectly with today's technology.

"So, if you opened something up on your tablet or phone, you had to scroll over to see the entire page," said Meadowlands' director of marketing and event operations, Rachel Ryan. "This new site is responsive, as it conforms to whatever size you're viewing on. Plus, it's more intuitive as all websites have to be now."

Motivate Design canvassed Big M customers and some non-racing customers and asked them a number of questions about what they wanted to see on the website. Then the Meadowlands team took that info and finalized the look they wanted.

For the first time, The Meadowlands' event calendar can now be easily added to your Google calendar or iCalendar.

The event calendar lists Monday as the first day of the week, and although that's not typical, it's easy to get used to.

"We're using WordPress for the back end and the calendar was a widget and so with all the tasks we're requiring of the calendar this one kind of fit in best," said Ryan. "So, I'm not saying it won't change, but in the immediate future there's no plans to change it."

As with any upgrade, it'll take time to work out all the kinks, but the info that the fans need, with the exception of the chart archive, is still there.

In the past, The Meadowlands set itself apart from other tracks by providing a chart archive that stretched back over a decade.

"When it was originally designed 17 years ago, it was just supposed to be a temporary offering where we'd go back a couple of years," said Ryan, who worked on the previous upgrade. "So right now, we're just working with the USTA [United States Trotting Association]. That coding is very labor intensive and

we're working out the details of how our servers are going to talk to each other. We have all intentions of bringing the chart archive back."

Results are also a work in progress, because even though all the information is there, the charts currently appearing in post-position order instead of order of finish.

Unlike some other tracks that just link out to the USTA website for results, The Meadowlands prefers to provide their fans with additional information, including scratches, changes and driver choices.

"I do expect some growing pains and there to be some issues or display issues," said Ryan. "[Customers are] welcomed to email me directly with any issues they see and we'll see if we can make those changes or adjustments."

Even though people rarely like change, the enhancements made present content in an uncluttered and easy-to-read format which should be appealing to most once they give it a chance.

Ryan, who has already walked customers through clearing their cache, setting up new bookmarks and finding whatever information they needed, says the feedback received so far has been extremely positive.

"It's going to take a little getting used to, but then after a couple of weeks, you're going to prefer this way better than what you were getting before," said Ryan.

# Young trainer Brandon Mongiello achieves his goal at Freehold

Brandon Mongiello is a man of his word.

Before he sent out his first horse in 2021, the 29-year-old standardbred trainer set a specific goal for himself, one he was committed to seeing come to fruition.

On Dec. 31, Mongiello reached his objective, topping the table at Freehold over the summer/fall meet, his first such crown, courtesy of 18 wins.

"I set out to be leading trainer at Freehold. I really wanted to get that done. That was one of the major things I wanted to do."

Mission accomplished for the man who got his introduction to racing through friends in the sport.

His foray into the game came on the ownership side.

"Vinny and Robert Ginsburg are friends with my brother," said Mongiello. "They went to high school together. Robert took my number down and one day he gave me a call. Soon after that,

I got into owning horses. I liked that part of it so much that I eventually got into the training side of things.

"What made me optimistic about pursuing racing as a career was that I was going to school and I earned my business degree, and that made me curious about owning racehorses and seeing how I could develop that. I had always wanted to own horses as a kid and it was a dream of mine."

Eventually, Mongiello, who calls Manalapan, NJ home, also turned his focus to training standardbreds.

In 2016, his first year as a licensed trainer, he didn't post a topthree finish from 12 starts.

The following campaign, however, proved to be a harbinger of things to come.

In 77 starts, he posted six wins and recorded 26 top-three results.

"My first training win came with Rockinwiththebest, at Freehold. Joe Bongiorno drove him. He cut out the mile and won it on the front end. It was obviously a big moment, something that you always thing about it. So, when it happened, it was great to finally get it out of the way."

After a 20-win season in 2018, Mongiello began to make heads turn. Three years ago, he posted a career-best 35 wins. In 2020, he sent out 30 winners in 72 less starts. This past year, he notched 27 triumphs along with 132 top-three efforts.

A big reason for those successes, he noted, were due to a plan to compete almost exclusively at Freehold.

Consider it a wise business decision.

"I felt with the horses that I had, it made the most sense to race there, rather than going to places such as The Meadowlands, Yonkers or Chester. I wanted to enter as many horses as I could at Freehold. I looked at everything and realized that made the most sense."

Rockinwiththebest, a now 9-year-old son of Rockin Image, has been one of Mongiello's most notable performers.

He owns the bay gelding, who was bred by DM Stables LLC and William Rufenacht.

"I claimed him in March 2018 for \$5,000. He made me \$60,000 the first year and \$50,000 the next year. He was the one who enabled me to go out and buy other horses. He wound up getting claimed for \$17,000 at Chester after I initially claimed him and I wound up claiming back for that price. He's like my pet. I will never let him go and I will never put him in a claimer again."

Mongiello's favorite moment of 2021 came when he won the Italian Heritage Race.

The race, which featured drivers of Italian descent, saw Frankie Boy, trained and owned by Mongiello, take home top prize.

### **Harness Racing Update**

Driven by Vinnie Ginsburg, the gelded son of Artistic Fella, led every step of the way, carving out a final quarter in :29.0 to secure a 4 ¼-length victory.

"Vinnie, being one of my best friends, it was a pretty cool moment. And with my colors being red and green, like the Italian flag, I thought that was really cool too. I would say that would be my favorite win of the year."

Mongiello's stable, currently home to 16 horses, is likely to expand this year and beyond.

Armed with a competitive group of pacers and trotters, he's looking to make 2022 his best season to date.

"I want to try to extend beyond Freehold and race horses at The Meadowlands and Yonkers."

His overall racing blueprint will stay the same.

"I like to find that balance between racing, training, and spending time with my family and friends. It's important to be able to do that. You do need that time away from the racetrack to unwind and reenergize. There's always something to do with racing, entries, finding drivers, things like that. So, any chance you have to maybe just let your mind focus on other things in your life, you grab that opportunity."

The biggest challenge Mongiello has contended with, careerwise, has been managing that 16-horse stable.

Having that business degree has helped him keep pace with

the hectic demands he faces each day.

"Managing the stable, having a lot of horses, there are so many details, big and small, that go into it. Shoeing, shipping, equipment – there are a lot of layers to being a trainer. You can prepare for so many things, but there will always be some sort of curveball that comes your way."

In spite of the hurdles, Mongiello, who lists Joe Bongiorno, Brett Beckwith, Vinnie Ginsburg and Luke Hanners as his favorite drivers, has found a winning formula for his craft.

"I really don't turn over the horses a lot. I try and keep them sound and healthy and race them where they can best compete. I would like to add more horses, better horses, and go from there."

After achieving his top goal in 2021, Mongiello will look to do the same this year, albeit with a different objective in mind.

"I think it comes down to finding horses that can compete at The Meadowlands and Yonkers. I'd like to have horses that race in the upper claimers or upper conditions. But even if you have a goal, you have to really be able to adapt, and react. That's an approach you need to have in this sport. But, it's always good to set goals and then go chase them."

Mongiello certainly knows a thing a two or about that.

The most unusual year in Illinois harness racing since pari-mutuel betting on the sport was inaugurated at Maywood Park in 1946 will begin tonight (Jan. 7) at Hawthorne Race Course.

For the first time since thoroughbred racing was restored at Hawthorne in the 1922 after being banned in 1905, Chicago is a one-track town.

The decision of corporate overlord Churchill Downs, Inc. (CDI) to discontinue racing at Arlington International Racecourse following the 2021 meeting and sell the property to the Chicago Bears for redevelopment left Hawthorne as the only track in the metropolitan area.

As a consequence, the harness horses and thoroughbreds will be time-sharing.

After the winter harness meeting ends on March 20 the thoroughbreds will take over the track for an April 2-June 25 meeting.

Then, the standardbreds will reclaim it and race from July 2-Sept. 11.

On Sept. 23 the thoroughbreds will return for a meeting that runs through Dec. 31.

The only other track in Illinois with an extended meeting is Fairmount Park in downstate Collinsville, which will hold thoroughbred racing from April 19-Sept. 24.

The status quo is a far cry from the 1970s when there were sometimes seven racetracks in the Chicago metropolitan area — Maywood, Hawthorne, Arlington, Washington Park, Sportsman's Park, Balmoral Park and Aurora Downs — plus three others elsewhere in Illinois: Fairmount, Cahokia Downs and East Moline Downs (later known as Quad City Downs).

Except for Maywood all of them at one time or another conducted both standardbred and thoroughbred racing.

Over the years, fires, bankruptcies, attrition and corporate obsession with maximizing revenue took their toll.

Dick Duchossois rebuilt Arlington following the 1985 fire into what *Architectural Digest* has hailed as "the world's most beautiful racetrack." What he wanted to do when he merged it with the parent company of America's iconic racetrack in 2000 was perpetuate his legacy. The merger gave him 25 per cent interest in the parent company, making him by far the biggest shareholder, and three seats on the board of directors. Within a few years his holdings had increased to about 28 per cent.

But, rather than preserving Duchossois' beloved track, unwittingly his merger of Arlington with CDI ultimately inflicted incalculable damage on both thoroughbred and harness racing in Illinois.



Duchossois was 78 at the time of the merger and during the ensuing years, much to the quiet chagrin of the CDI hierarchy, he continued to operate Arlington as he always had, emphasizing high quality first and foremost rather than putting paramount importance on the bottom line as the other CDI tracks were doing.

But as Duchossois grew older (he turned 100 on Oct. 7) he and his family began selling their stock and in 2017 he left the CDI board of directors. Today, the family has only a 6.8 share and no seats on the board.

CDI chief executive officer Bill Carstanjen is calling the shots at Arlington and his corporation has evolved into an entity whose main focus is on casino gambling.

In 2019, CDI bought a 62 per cent interest in Rivers Casino, the biggest money-maker of the 10 casinos operating in Illinois.

A massive 2019 Illinois gambling expansion bill gave Arlington and Hawthorne what they and horsemen had lobbied long and hard for — the right to conduct casino gambling at the track with a portion of the proceeds flowing into purse accounts.

But, in an abrupt and unexpected about face, CDI declined the opportunity to make Arlington a racino. Given its longstanding push for a racino, Illinois racing insiders were at first stunned but then, after CDI announced that it was taking bids for the sale and redevelopment of Arlington, the real motive became clear.

Rivers Casino is a 20-minute drive from Arlington and eliminating the racetrack not only would prevent it from having a competing casino it also would wipe out nearby thoroughbred racing competition for gambling dollars.

Illinois Racing Board member Alan Henry asserted that "the shuttering of Arlington Park will be nothing less than a brutal clear-cut through the entire sport... the fault for this deformed calendar —most of it — belongs to Churchill Downs, Inc."

So now Hawthorne during its harness meeting will embark on the first attempt to try to repair some of the devastation that CDI has wrought.

Although Hawthorne has received permission from the Illinois Gaming Board to become a racino and has begun construction work the project is proceeding slowly. It's uncertain when the casino will open and start contributing to the harness and thoroughbred purse accounts.

The 2019 legislation also calls for a harness racino to be built in one of six townships in south suburban Chicago, but plans to have one in Tinley Park conducting casino gambling and a race meeting in December 2020 fell through. In the interim there have been no further attempts to pursue a south suburban racino.

# **76 RACE PROGRAMS ON TAP**

The Hawthorne meetings offer a combined total of 76 race programs. They stand in stark contrast to the situation that existed in 1995 when the track had day/night doubleheaders galore during the winter and its cards combined with those at Maywood, Balmoral and Sportsman's to give the Chicago sulky circuit 516 programs.

There will be racing on Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights through Jan. 30. Thursday night will be added starting Feb. 3 and continuing for the duration of the meeting. Post times will be 3:10 p.m. The weekly calendar will be similar during the summer meeting, except for 7:10 p.m. post times.

The 2021 thoroughbred meeting didn't end until Dec. 26, requiring a relatively quick changeover for the racing surface, but on Jan. 3 Hawthorne was able to hold 11 qualifying races involving 73 horses. Among them was Rndmnunpredictable, 8-length winner of the \$97,500 Erwin F. Dygert Memorial for 3-year-old male trotters, which was part of the Night of Champions extravaganza for Illinois-breds held on Sept. 25, second last night of the 2021 meeting that began on May 7.

Rndmunpredictable's driver, Casey Leonard, is back in quest of his seventh consecutive driver title and his father, Terry Leonard, will be in pursuit of his second straight trainer title and fourth in five years.

On opening night racing secretary Robin Schadt has put together eight races, and in the \$13,700 fourth race for aged pacers Terry and Casey and owner Jim Ballinger will be represented by Fox Valley Gemini, the most accomplished horse in Illinois by virtue of his victories on the Night of Champions five years in a row.

Also competing in the seven-horse race will be Fox Valley Ren and He'zzz A Wise Guy, who finished second and third behind Fox Valley Gemini in the \$64,000 Robert S. Molaro Memorial on the Night of Champions.

"He didn't fare very well at Hoosier," Casey said, critiquing Fox Valley Gemini's four out-of-the-money efforts in open company that followed the Molaro. "He's in tough so we'll see."

After the summer Hawthorne meeting ended, the Leonards raced at Harrah's Hoosier Park and Casino until late in that meeting that ended Dec. 4. They then returned to their training base, the family farm outside Harvard in north central Illinois.

Following a couple weeks of vacation the horses resumed training on the farm in preparation for the Hawthorne winter meeting.

"We have 25 (in training) right now," Casey said. "They should be ready to go."

The Wilfong family also figures to be making an impact at Hawthorne. The stable is based in Indiana near Hoosier and is headed by Brett Wilfong, a prominent trainer, breeder and owner. Working closely with him are his son, Kyle, who was second in the 2021 Hawthorne driver standings, and Kyle's partner, Nicole

Agosti, who as a trainer had 19 triumphs, 13 seconds and 13 thirds in 89 starts at the summer meeting.

"I'll stay here in Anderson and Kyle and Nicole will be staying at Hawthorne," Brett said. "Nicole will be the trainer (of record). We've got 15 we're prepping to race and seven or eight 2-year-olds. Probably about 10 will stay at Hawthorne. If we're not happy with the track condition we'll train them in Indiana and ship them up on the weekends."

The year's first measurable snowfall came on Sunday but on Monday the sky was clear and the qualifiers went smoothly.

"The track was pretty good for this time of year," veteran trainer Jim Eaton said. "I was pleasantly surprised."

Eaton plans to race between eight and 10 horses at the meeting. His training base is Sawgrass Farm, which is located not far from the former site of Balmoral.

"Since Hawthorne closed (in September) I've raced my better ones in Indiana and Ohio," he said. "We'll do that again after this meeting ends and then come back in the summer."

With no important races involving North America's top horses on the calendar since Balmoral and Maywood closed in 2015, the marquee event of the year in Illinois harness racing again will be the Night of Champions for Illinois-breds, tentatively scheduled for the final Saturday of the summer meeting.

Highlighting the winter season will be six Winter Series races for pacers and six for trotters. Trainers will have both state-bred and open company options.

Each of the winter series races will offer two legs along with a series final. The purse for each of the legs will be \$12,000 and the series final will have a \$24,000 purse. The top 10 money-winning horses in the legs will qualify for the final.

Even though racing at Hawthorne will be disjointed the 76 programs scheduled are 13 more than the number raced at last summer's meeting.

This year horsemen also will have at least 10 additional opportunities at the Springfield State Fairgrounds after the winter and summer meetings.

"Nothing is set in stone but we're planning on four race days from mid-to-late June and six more the last two weeks of September and the first two weeks of October to give 2-year-olds more opportunities later in the year," explained Tim Norman, bureau chief of County Fairs and Horse Racing in Illinois. "The races will be funded by the Hawthorne purse account but there won't be any pari-mutuel betting.

"There will be betting as usual at the State Fairs — at Springfield on Aug. 12, 13, 17 and 18 and at Du Quoin on Aug. 26 and 27."

# 500th Triple Crown race coming in 2022

Thoroughbred racing has 446 of them-and it won't be until the 2039 Belmont Stakes that they reach 500 Triple Crown races in total (146 editions of the Preakness-, 147 of the Kentucky Derby and 153 of the Belmont). But this year, the fifth Triple Crown race held will mark 500 for the sport of standardbred racing.

125 Kentucky Futurities (missed four from 1942-1945)

96 Hambletonians

76 Jugs

67 Cane Pace editions

66 Yonkers Trots

65 Messengers

Some notes on the Triple Crown through the years include:

- 1. It's now 16 years since the last Horse of the Year won a Crown 2006 Glidemaster.
- 2. The longest length of time from a driver's first to a driver's last Triple Crown race win is 32 years John Campbell, who won the 1982 Jug with Merger and then the 2014 Kentucky Futurity with Nuncio.
- 3. Billy Haughton won the Jug 30 years apart with Quick Chief (driving and training) in 1955 and Nihilator (training) in 1985.
- 4. In thoroughbred racing, Woody Stephens won the 1952 Preakness and the 1986 Belmont 34 years from first to last; Blue Man to Danzig Connection.
- 5. Fillies have had a great history in the standardbred Triple Crown almost exclusively on the trotting side. Twenty-five of the first 49 Kentucky Futurity winners were fillies (36 of 125 overall good for 29 per cent). Only two fillies won the Yonkers Trot (2-for-66), but both were named Horse of the Year and they did it back to back 1995 C R Kay Suzie and 1996 Continentalvictory.
- 6. Trainers and drivers today are all but extinct in the pacing Triple Crown events. The following is the last time it has happened: 1990 Jug Ray Remmen and Beach Towel; 1988 Messenger Yves Filion and Runnymede Lobell; 1982 Cane Pace Pat Crowe and Cam Fella.

# Other numbers

Bruce Nickells will be 94 on July 5, the oldest living Hall of Famer. On any list of dominance you will see Nickells' name. Consider that the first three pacing females to surpass \$1.5 million lifetime were all trained by Nickells — Follow My Star, Miss Easy and Immortality.

In 75 years of HOY balloting, only once have the top two come from the very same division  $-\,102\text{-}32$  in the final tally in 2016 when Always B Miki and Wiggle It Jiggleit did this in the incredibly deep Older Pacer category.

Think the \$300 and change was tight between Tim Tetrick and Dexter Dunn at year's end in 2021? It sure was. It was reminiscent of 1981 when Eddie Davis had 404 wins to Herve Filion's 403 — and in the money dept in 1979, John Campbell won the first of his record 16 titles-barely, with \$3,308,984 to Filion's \$3,304,876.

Jan. 28 is 40 years since the sport lost maybe its most influential sire ever Meadow Skipper.

Ray Remmen will be 75 on May 28.

Trond Smedshammer will be 55 on March 22.

# Dad proves to be a 'Wise' guy

A little more than five years ago, John Filomeno approached his father, Donald, and suggested they partner on a racehorse. Donald had been involved in harness racing since the mid-1960s as an owner and trainer of his own small stable, but he was now 76 and John figured it would be a great way for dad and son to spend more time together.

Donald agreed, but said he had a better idea. He suggested the two men partner on the soon-to-be-born first foal out of the family's homebred pacing mare Gimmeazzzmooch. John, who had helped at his father's stable in his younger days but halted his involvement for more than two decades while raising four children with his wife Cherise, went along with the idea despite it being a riskier proposition financially.

"There is a lot of cash laid out before you even know if you have anything," John said. "But that's what he wanted. He gave me pretty much everything I wanted my whole life, so I agreed to do it. There are a lot of things in life that I didn't listen to my father about. It's a good thing I listened to him about this one."

Good thing because that foal, He'zzz A Wise Sky, has grown up to be an Illinois star.

He'zzz A Wise Sky, a now 5-year-old son of stallion Yankee Skyscaper, has won 22 of 50 races and earned \$319,531. At age 3 in 2020, he was named Illinois Horse of the Year. In 2021, he was honored as the state's best older male pacer.

Tonight (Jan. 7), he returns to begin his 2022 campaign by racing in the open at Hawthorne Race Course, where he is the 5-2 morning-line favorite with Kyle Wilfong in the sulky.

"I've been around horses a long time, but I've never been around a horse that is this caliber with this much heart," said John, who in the last year has taken over the bulk of the training duties from his father. "He's our pride and joy."

It was a difficult start, though. He'zzz A Wise Sky saw his career nearly derailed before it began at age 2 when he was found to be suffering from the neurological disease equine protozoal myeloencephalitis (EPM). John sent the colt to the University of Illinois for the diagnosis and a subsequent treatment program enabled the horse to recover in time to begin racing in August of that season.

He'zzz A Wise Sky raced seven times at 2, winning his final five starts, including the Illinois Conceived and Foaled (ICF) Governor's Cup and the Incredible Finale championship. At 3, he won three preliminary legs and the final of the Robert F. Carey Jr. Memorial as well as three other ICF events and opens at Hawthorne and Hoosier Park.

Last year, he captured the Gregg Haston Memorial Invitational at Hoosier and was a five-time open winner at Hawthorne.

For his career, he has hit the board a total of 41 times and missed a paycheck only three times in his 50 races.

"I tell people there is one thing this horse can't do; he can't read a program," John said. "It doesn't matter who he races against, he gives you everything he's got every start. I can't say enough about him. Just to race in this kind of company, it's unbelievable. It's unbelievable that our little homebred colt goes out there and hangs with them.

"If you walked up to him, you would think he's a 12-year-old gelding. He just does everything right, everything you ask him to do. He can get a little demanding — he reminds you if you don't feed him quick enough, or don't give him a treat quick enough — but he's earned it. He doesn't owe us a thing. We owe him."

John is working with a 10-horse stable now, with Donald still offering a helping hand as he approaches age 82.

"I was doing the barn work and he was doing most of the jogging until this past year," John said. "He just can't move like he wants. It's a little tough getting in and out of the jog cart. But he still shows up every once in a while to jog. He'll get out there. He's like a kid in a candy store when he sits behind one of the horses."


And while the ownership of He'zzz A Wise Sky started as a partnership of father and son, it expanded in 2019 to include John's wife, his mother Joann, his brother-in-law David L. Miller, and his sister-in-law Toni Presto. They race as Triple ZZZ Stable and also own all three of He'zzz A Wise Sky's siblings as well as dam Gimmeazzzmooch, whose name inspired the group's moniker.

"The horse has just brought everybody closer," John said. "We always had good relationships with each other, but now there is a common theme with what's going on with the horses. What was my father's and mother's dream and passion for all those years has now become a big thing for the whole family.

"All because my father had a better idea."

# **Cushing on life with 'Vic'**

From the beginning, Roadshow Vic was special. The trotter, born in 2007, was the first, and ultimately only, foal out of the mare Vic's Lady as well as the final horse bred by Maine's Neal Tranten. In fact, Tranten, then in his mid-70s, was ready to give up the breeding side of the sport before being convinced by long-time friend and racing partner Mike Cushing to give it another go because of Cushing's fondness for Vic's Lady.

"She was so tough and deserved a shot at being a mom," said Cushing, who drove and trained the mare for owner Tranten. "Neal was up in years and wasn't going to raise any more, but I talked him into one last horse. We raised Vic together and we owned him together until just before Neal passed away (in 2017). He's been a really special horse."

Roadshow Vic, who entered retirement when he turned 15 on Jan. 1, concluded his career with 59 wins in 302 races and \$323,323 in purses. A son of stallion Roadshow Hall, he hit the board a total of 169 times and was the Maine Standardbred Breeders Stakes champion at age 2 in 2009. In his final start on Dec. 31 at First Tracks Cumberland, he bested fellow 14-year-old rival Beer League in a match race with Cushing in the sulky.

Cushing, a winner of nearly 1,400 career races who drove only four times in the previous three years while focusing on the family's training stable with wife Charlene, sat behind Roadshow Vic in three of his 28 starts in 2021.

"I thought I would drive him a couple times this year as a lastride type of thing," said Cushing, who was Roadshow Vic's nearly exclusive driver for the trotter's first seven years of racing. "As long as I've done this, if I've had one horse that's stuck out that I would say is my pet, he is it."

As happy as Cushing was to enjoy a few more races with Roadshow Vic, he was even more delighted to see Charlene, who trained the horse throughout his career, get a driving win with him at last October's Fryeburg Fair.

"My wife doesn't drive much anymore, and she only drove Vic a few times in his career, but she had never won with him,"

Cushing said. "At Fryeburg, Vic got the job done for her. That was pretty cool. I've been all over the East Coast and there aren't many places that you get a live attendance like you get at the Fryeburg Fair. That was great."

Roadshow Vic had his share of ailments and issues over the years, but always impressed Cushing with his toughness and desire.

"Despite his imperfections, he would go about his business in a race as a complete professional," Cushing said. "From day one, he was easy to drive. He has a little bit of autopilot in him. If he needed to be steadied to get through a rough patch, he would slow himself down or gather himself up. It was like he could drive himself.

"He rose to the occasion for me I don't know how many times. It just seemed that when it was time, he carried the load for me. Heading to the races without him at least two or three times a month is going to be strange."

What also will be strange is the silence in the barn when Roadshow Vic is not there.

"From the beginning, he's been a spoiled brat in the barn," Cushing said with a laugh. "He demands food steady. He bangs his door, just hits it enough with his foot — bang, bang, bang — all day long. As soon as he is low on hay, bang. Just to let you know, hey, I'm getting a little short over here.

"People would say they couldn't put up with that, but the few times when we turned him out, we would joke that it was too quiet in the barn. He's something else."

Roadshow Vic might be retired from racing, but Cushing said the gelding would not be found simply standing around in a field. His next adventure could come with one of Charlene's co-workers, who will look to retrain the trotter for dressage competitions. Charlene, in addition to working with the horses, is a nurse.

"Vic is a personable horse and he's very amenable to whatever you want to do," Cushing said. "I can't imagine he will fail at it, but if for any reason it doesn't work out, he's always got a place here with us. He's a workmanlike horse. He wouldn't be happy out in a paddock in retirement. He needs a job, or he will not be happy.

"Who knows, if he's still here in April or May, he might be guiding around my 2-year-olds, coaching them a little bit. He would be thrilled to do that.

"He's just a cool horse. He really is."



# Tony Morgan elected to Ohio Hall of Fame

**Tony Morgan**, the second winningest driver in the history of harness racing, has been elected as the 48th member of the Ohio Harness Racing Hall of Fame by a vote of the members of the Ohio Chapter of the United States Harness Writers Association.

Morgan, 63, finished the year with 16,932 career wins which is second on the all-time list to Dave Palone and with \$138.2 million in career earnings.

He was born in Troy, OH and began his career at the tender age of 13 when he drove in an amateur race at his hometown fairgrounds.

His first trip to the winner's circle came on May 13, 1973, when he piloted Peachakona to victory in a matinee race at Celina, OH.

Morgan emerged in the early '90s as one of the top drivers on the Chicago racing circuit and for three consecutive campaigns (1995-97), he was the leading dash-winning driver in North America.

In 1996, his total of 853 wins broke the all-time single-season record set by Walter Case Jr.

Morgan shifted his base of operations to the state of Delaware in the fall of 2006. That year, he became the second driver in the history of the sport to pass the 1,000-win plateau for a single year and captured his fourth North American dash crown. He added a fifth victory title in 2008 when he piloted 961 winners.

He was the recipient of the Driver of the Year trophy from Harness Tracks of America four times (1996, 1997, 2002 and 2006).

Morgan will be honored at the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association's annual banquet on Jan. 15 at the Polaris Hilton in Columbus.

The Ohio Chapter of USHWA will also honor **Steve Carter** as the recipient of the Winner's Circle Award for the Ohioan who has achieved outstanding accomplishments in the past year; **Justin Irvine** as the Peter Haughton Memorial Award winner as the young Ohioan who is an "up-and-coming" star among harness horsemen; **Richard Neville** into the Immortal Hall of

Fame; Aquatic Yankee into the Standardbred Hall of Fame; and **Dr. Dan Wilson** as the winner of the Rambling Willie Award for the Ohioan who has done the most for harness racing over the past two decades.

Carter recorded 56 training wins and \$1.4 million in earnings this season. He was the conditioner of the world champion Charlie May, who made Ohio proud by winning the Matron, the Bluegrass and the Milstein Memorial. He was also gracious in the narrow defeats in the Breeders Crown, Messenger Final, Ohio Sire Stake Final and the Meadowlands Pace.

Irvine is a 20-year-old resident of Aurora, Ohio. He enjoyed a terrific 2021 season with 118 wins and over \$650,000 in purse earnings and a .248 driver's rating.

Neville was a well-known farrier of 60 years. The list of luminaries Neville shared his skills with are long and impressive with the likes of Hall of Famers Delvin Miller, Stanley Dancer, Howard Beissinger, George Sholty, Gene Riegle and Joe O'Brien. While the number of equine stars he shod are too numerous to list, it includes Albatross, Super Bowl, Delmonica Hanover, Most Happy Fella, Sonsam, French Chef, Happy Motoring and Western Hanover – earning a nickname of "Shoer to the Stars." He passed away at the age of 75 on March 24, 2020.

Aquatic Yankee is the daughter of Cambest and Yankee Attraction. During her four-year racing career, she recorded 26 wins in her 80 career starts and earned more than \$750,000. As a broodmare, Aquatic Yankee has produced five foals that have earned \$200,000 or more. She is the dam of Sectionline Bigry, the two-time aged pacer of the year in Ohio and earner of nearly \$700,000.

Dr. Wilson graduated from the Ohio State University school of Veterinary Medicine in 1975. He focused his practice on Northfield Park and the standardbred industry in Northeast Ohio. He was awarded the Ohio Veterinarian Medical Association Distinguished Service Award in 2002 and was enshrined into the Northfield Park Wall of Fame in 2014. Dr. Wilson retired in the summer of 2021.

# Omicron variant closes Ontario casinos, but races go on

The spread of the Omicron variant of COVID-19 has forced the Ontario government to close all 28 of its casinos through at least Jan. 26. Yet, live harness racing continues at three Ontario locations — Woodbine Mohawk Park, The Raceway at The Western Fair District and Flamboro Downs.

Racing at Mohawk is closed to regular patrons, but owners with a horse racing can watch races from the tarmac, but must make reservations. The grandstand is closed and there will be no food services offered, but owners may use washrooms, purchase programs or place bets.

The Ontario government halted horse racing during its previous COVID-19 lockdown from April 2 to June 11 of 2021, but Woodbine CEO Jim Lawson lobbied hard to have horse racing continue because it is a safe, outdoor activity.

# Brian Zendt passes \$30 million in career purses at The Meadows

With three victories Thursday (Jan. 6) at Hollywood Casino at The Meadows, Brian Zendt soared past \$30 million in career purses.

Zendt, 46, recorded his initial win in the sport in 1995 and has amassed 3,117 career victories. He enjoyed an especially productive stretch from 2011-2014 when he topped \$2 million in purses each year.

Zendt got the milestone cash with Manofmanymuscles, who hadn't visited the winners' circle since 2020. Lisa Dunn owns and trains the 5-year-old gelding trotter.

Live racing at The Meadows continues today (Jan. 7) when the 10-race program features a pair of carryovers — \$1,206.26 in the Jackpot Pick 5 (race 4), \$649,30 in the final-race Super Hi-5. First post is 12:45 PM.

# **More Ohio awards**

**Gulf Shores** started his freshman year rolling off six straight wins including the \$300,000 Ohio Sires Stakes Finals on his way to winning the Ohio Triple Crown and being named the Ohio 2-Year-Old Pacing Colt of the Year.

Trainer Brian Brown said Gulf Shores is talented, but also has a desire to win. "He was willing to do whatever you wanted to do. You could leave or you could race him from behind." Brown says Gulf Shores was not perfect every start as he raced at times with stomach ulcers and a little bit of soreness. "When it was time to go behind the starting gate you would not know anything was wrong with the horse."

Gulf Shores, the son of Downbytheseaside out of Western Drag, finished the campaign winning six of ten starts and finishing second in three others. His other wins included the Ohio State Fair Stakes and the Ohio Breeders Championship, which along with the Ohio Sire Stakes comprise the Ohio Triple Crown.

Owned by Country Club Acres, Inc., Diamond Creek Racing, Wingfield Bros, LLC., Gulf Shores earned \$493,967 in 2021.

The Mighty Hill's freshman campaign took him from an Ohio

county fair track to winning the Ohio Sires Stakes, setting a world record, and being named the 2021 Ohio 2-Year-Old Trotting Colt of the Year.

The Mighty Hill, son of What The Hill, won five of eight starts in 2021 for trainer Chris Beaver and the ownership group of Beaver, Donald Robinson and VIP Internet Stable LLC, earning \$270,375. He was bred by Nathan Miller of Middlefield, Ohio.

The Mighty Hill started the season in the Buckeye Stallion Series and had a mid-season start at the Union County Fair.

Trainer Chris Beaver says they started him in the Buckeye Stallion Series because he wasn't training with his top horses. "He seemed out of rhythm and a little bit sore all winter, he wasn't doing anything impressive." Beaver says when they got The Mighty Hill ready to race, he was gritty and wanted to do it.

The Mighty Hill's final win of the season came in the Ohio Sire Stakes, winning in 1:55.4, and setting a world record for geldings on a half-mile track.

For the second straight year, Ohio's 2-Year-Old Pacing Filly of the Year made sure there was no doubt who the best freshman filly was, setting a world record and winning the Ohio Triple Crown. **Sea Silk** dominated her competition on the way to being named the 2021 Ohio 2-Year-Old Pacing Filly of the Year.

The daughter of Downbytheseaside out of Silk Purse, Sea Silk won nine of 11 races for trainer Ron Burke and owners Burke Racing Stable, Knox Services, Weaver Bruscemi LLC, and Hatfield Stables, earning \$584,092 in 2021.

Sea Silk captured the Ohio Triple Crown by winning the \$300,000 Ohio Sire Stakes final, the Ohio Fair Stakes, and the Ohio Breeders Championship. She set a world record at MGM Northfield Park in the Sire Stakes finals winning in 1:51.1 becoming the fastest two-year-old in history on a half-mile track.

Chris Page was behind Sea Silk for all of her starts and said he was confident every time he drove her. "She is big for a two-year-old pacing filly with a quick turn of foot and could go from zero to a hundred in two steps." Page said she is a big horse with a big gait and that's a lethal combination against other fillies.

**Steve Gibson** of Mechanicsburg, OH has been named the OHHA's Outstanding Groom for 2021.

Gibson works for and was nominated by trainer Kim Dailey.

Dailey said Gibson is dedicated, dependable and willing to do anything that is needed. "Steve is almost always the first person in the barn every day and the last out. He knows each of his horses on a personal level no matter their earnings."

Gibson is the last of the Bill Dailey Stable grooms and Dailey says he has become more than an employee. "He has stuck next to our family during very uncertain times. He has seen the barn full at 80 horse and down to eight. No reward can repay him for his loyalty."

Gibson was introduced to the sport of harness racing at an early age by his father and stepfather. He sat behind his first horse

when he was nine years old and has made it his livelihood. The longest he has been away from racehorses has been three weeks.

Gibson said he enjoys being around the horses. "I like watching the babies grow and get to the racetrack. It doesn't matter if they are a claimer or a Sires Stakes horse, I don't treat them any differently." Gibson says he appreciates the Dailey family for nominating him. "Even to be nominated means a lot. I really appreciate it."

**Case Bateson** of Rudolph, OH has been named the recipient of the 2021 Terry Holton Youth Award.

Bateson began helping his father in the barn when he was 10 years old. While in high school, he spent his summers helping in the Jeff Brewer barn and now works full time as an assistant trainer and caretaker.

Bateson began his driving career in 2021 and logged 42 starts, winning seven times. He won his first race at the Fayette County Fairgrounds in Washington Court House, Ohio with Rock N Randy V

Bateson said he feels blessed and honored to receive the award. "There have been greats that have received this award in the past and I feel honored to have my name next to theirs."

Bateson says is looking forward to a career in harness racing.

"I am hoping to make a living as a driver and win many races."

The award, in its 19th year, is named for Terry Holton, a 2005 inductee into the Ohio Harness Racing Hall of Fame. Holton of Newark, Ohio, was the winner of over 1,700 races in his career. He overcame many obstacles in his life, the biggest may have been overcoming pancreatic cancer.

The Terry Holton Youth Award is awarded to a youth between the ages of 13 and 19 who has actively participated in harness racing during 2021 as a driver, trainer, groom, breeder, race office/publicity assistant, track maintenance crew, or has provided outstanding service to harness racing.

All of the above people and horses will be honored at the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association (OHHA) Annual Awards Banquet Jan. 15 at the Hilton Columbus-Polaris in Columbus, OH. # Dayton records best season ever; handle up 14.6 per cent

With an overall all-sources handle of \$27,313,164, Hollywood Dayton Raceway enjoyed its best season ever. The 2021 figure at the recently-concluded 70-day meet represented a 14.6 per cent increase over the 2020 number.

The southwest Ohio track broke its all-time daily handle record on Dec. 23 when \$850,522 was wagered on the Hollywood Dayton program. Six of the top 12 handles in the eight year history at Dayton were recorded in 2021.

"We had a really excellent meet," said director of racing Jason Bluhm. "We made some changes prior to the meet and they all seemed to help."

Major changes included sending the simulcast signal in High Definition (HD), which led to regularly being on TVG, which in turn allowed new viewers to get introduced to the Dayton product.

Additionally, the track moved to a new regular post time with a new betting format. The 4 p.m. post time allowed horsemen to finish their morning barn duties before heading to the track, and put the simulcast of the races in an opportune position with less competition.

Hollywood Dayton followed the lead of its Ohio summer racing partner by adding 100 per cent carryover provisions to many of its popular exotic wagers, which was received well by the patrons.

The racetrack itself was in top shape the entire season under the supervision of new track superintendent Jimmy Shelton. A total of nine new track records were set and two others tied, attesting to the fine job done by the entire track crew.

"Brisk VLT business in our Hollywood Casino contributed to the highest purse structure in our eight-year history," Bluhm said. "All in all, we couldn't have asked for much more."

Racing will resume at Hollywood Dayton on the day after The Little Brown Jug in Delaware in September. The highlight of the 2022 meet will undoubtedly be on Saturday, Oct. 2, when the track will play host to Ohio Super Night for the first time in its history. In addition to showcasing the eight \$300,000 Ohio Sires Stakes Championships, the track will present four \$250,000 Dayton Derbies, one for each sex and gait, which are now included in the lucrative TVG series hosted by the Meadowlands. These races annually attract the finest older harness horses in North America to Hollywood Dayton.

# 2022 Yonkers meet kicks off Monday

The 240-day 2022 meet at Yonkers Raceway is set to begin on Monday night (Jan. 10) with an 11-race program. First race post time is now at 6:55 p.m., a change from 7:15 p.m. in prior years.

Monday night's program is headlined by the \$39,000 Open Handicap Pace in the ninth event on the card. Save Me A Dance (post two, Jordan Stratton/Travis Alexander), a 1:48.4 winner in a series final at the Meadowlands on December 18, is the 2-1 morning line favorite and takes on the likes of multiple stakes winner No Lou Zing (post eight, Scott Zeron/Nancy Takter, 20-1).

Yonkers Raceway's stakes action in 2022 begins in March and features the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series for pacing mares and the MGM Borgata Pacing Series for free-for-allers commencing on the 18th and 21st, respectively. Preliminary round action in both of those events continues into April, with the finals set for Monday, April 25.

Grand Circuit action at Yonkers will also happen in May with the Reynolds Stakes for 3-year-old pacers of both sexes, and then the eliminations for the MGM Grand Messenger Stakes, MGM Yonkers Trot, Park MGM Filly Pace, and New York New York Mile for filly trotters will be on the marquee for Friday, June 24. The finals of those events for sophomores will go behind the gate on Friday, July 1, with the Open races guaranteed at \$300,000 each. Two-year-old pacers will also invade Yonkers in July for the MGM Springfield, with eliminations on the 8th and the final on the 15th.

No date has been set yet, but the \$1 million Yonkers International Trot will be back on the calendar in 2022 as well. The Aria Invitational Pace and the Robert Miecuna Invitational Trot, which are the undercard features of the Yonkers International Trot, will each go for a purse of \$500,000.

Other stakes events slated to occur at Yonkers this year include the MGM Rewards Ladies Pacing Series and MGM Rewards Gents Pacing Series in March, and the John Brennan Trotting Series in April. The New York Sire Stakes circuit will also visit Yonkers through the season, but those dates have not been announced as of yet.

To start 2022, Yonkers will operate on a Monday-Friday racing schedule, but beginning in May, Wednesday will switch to a dark day and Saturday will become a live racing night. That format remains in place until October when Saturdays are removed and the Monday-Friday schedule resumes.

# Big M to start 2022 with pair of 15-race programs

The year 2021 may have been challenging for society, but business at The Meadowlands was extraordinary while providing horseplayers a diversion from the pandemic.

Tonight (Jan. 7), The Big M will kick off what it hopes to be another big year with the first of two 15-race programs that get underway at 6:20 p.m. Racing will be conducted on a Friday-Saturday basis for the next 31 weeks. In addition, there will

be racing on three Thursdays during that span (June 30, July 7 and Aug. 4).

"Winter is normally a good time for us with some of the closer tracks dark for the next few months," said track chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemoir. "Our entry box got great support from horsemen wanting to get their horses raced, so much so that we are able to present 30 races this first weekend of 2022."

The action should be sizable to start the year, if the final program of 2021 is any indication. Last Friday (Dec. 31), wagering on the 14-race card totaled \$2.97 million, which nudged action for the year just past the \$276-million mark for the 92 racing programs, meaning that the mile oval's average handle per card was a remarkable \$3 million.

"We all know how tough 2021 was on all of us," said Settlemoir. "But we were grateful to be able to conduct our races and be as successful as we were while keeping our horsemen, staff, and customers safe. Moving forward, with Covid numbers on the rise, we will be taking some precautions to keep our co-workers and quests safe and healthy for the New Year."

Until further notice, face masks must be worn by staff and guests, regardless of vaccination status, in the grandstand as well as the FanDuel Sportsbook.

DID YOU SEE THAT POOL? A carryover of \$38,923.56 led to \$231,849.96 in "new money" being poured into the pot for a grand total of \$270,773 in the 20-cent Pick-5 that took place on the final night of racing in 2021 (Dec. 31).

There was big-time excitement after driver Johnathan Ahle guided 57-1 shot Galactic Galleon N to victory lane in the second race GSY Final, and by the time the will pays were posted before the start of the fifth race, there were three possibilities of single-ticket winners walking away with better than \$230,000.

The big payoff wasn't to be, but those who cashed did not complain, as those with winning tickets walked away with \$27,565.46. There were no winning favorites, but other than Ahle's knockout punch, no winners paid less than \$10.60 or more than \$13.60.

Twenty-cent Pick-6 players also got in on the fun, as a modest carryover of a little more than \$6,000 led to a total pool of better than \$39,000. With a 50-1 bomb raising the payout, there was only one winning ticket, which was good for \$34,157.

The 20-cent Survivor Pick-7 came back a healthy \$7,015, despite the single winner needing only five correct selections on his or her ticket.

"We know that full fields, big pools and low takeouts certainly bring more people to play The Meadowlands," said Settlemoir.

"Add a marvelous New Year's Eve party that culminated with a big fireworks display as midnight drew near and it ended up being the perfect nightcap to a great 2021 season."

SPEAKING OF LOW TAKEOUTS: The Meadowlands is the industry's handle leader, and much of the reason why is that many of the bets the mile oval offers feature a low takeout of 15 per cent.






