Four wishes for harness racing in 2022

Some reasonable solutions for improving the game.

A new year is upon us and I have rubbed my magic genie bottle to make my four wishes for harness racing. Please allow me to share them with you.

1. The Big Three, The Grand Slam, ah, call it whatever you'd like...

Did you hear the news? Fox Sports **signed an 8 year deal** (worth a reported \$5 million per year) to broadcast the Belmont Stakes, which includes the entire Belmont Festival of Racing week. There's a gambling component, too: Fox and NYRA Bets are building a wagering brand together.

Thoroughbred racing's Triple Crown is a gift that keeps on giving. Not only does it drive revenue, it's a conduit for new fans. In addition, as the Fox Sports news proves, it helps sell gambling platforms to these new potential bettors. In the sports gambling



space, linking to a brand is like butter on toast.

No, this is not another tired yearn for a harness racing Triple Crown, because smart people tell me creating a new one is some sort of unsolvable finger puzzle. But it is a wish; a wish for the sport to get together and create a series. It can be any set

of races that the sport can, if successful over the next decade, market. This should not be that hard, right?

2. Waiting for the Pylon to fall

Let's play harness racing Final Jeopardy.

The answer is, "This confuses everyone." The question that all of us get correct is, "What is the pylon rule?"

Did the horse go inside two or more pylons without gaining an advantage, or was it three or more? Was it on the straight or on the turn? Was there a full moon? All of these questions have to be answered, usually accompanied with a 10-minute inquiry of tape winding and rewinding as a bewildered fan base looks on, wondering what the rule is in the first place.

In every sport in the Universe leaving the field of play is a bad thing. If a receiver in football steps out of bounds he's out of bounds. It doesn't matter if he was trying to avoid a photographer, wanted to grab a snow cone, or was sent there by space aliens. If a ball lands foul we don't ask if the ball meant to, or if it was pulled there by some sort of Newtonian force we didn't understand in high school physics. It's just foul. Fans accept this and the rule works as well as any rule can work.

For this sport I'd love to see the same thing. Unless someone is avoiding an accident, or is pushed inside pylons, the horse and driver are disqualified if they leave the field of play. Let's make everyone's lives less miserable.

3. Wednesday night stakes racing

God of Racing Niatross (that's my God, yours can be Greyhound or Rambling Willie, or whomever), who made it a rule that stakes cards have to be raced only on Friday or Saturday nights? I get the Big M or Woodbine Mohawk Park wants a weekend event, but for smaller tracks with their signature cards, why bother racing against these bearcats?

I'd love to see at least one of these stakes days raced on a Tuesday or Wednesday. We'd all be focused on them, and we'd get to see big name horses, drivers and trainers ply their trade. On a dead night, the races would be on TVG, no doubt, as well.

Let's spread the word about harness racing when people need something to watch.

4. Don't let your eyes glaze over – Lower the juice!

This is the way the harness handle world usually works. A track with no on-track handle sells its signal to the bet takers for a 3 per cent or 4 per cent fee, but they charge 25 per cent takeout. So, we have the bet taker earning 22 per cent and the track receiving 3 per cent. And then the tracks complain about it.

Why not just lower the takeout? With 95 per cent of handle coming from off-track, what is there to lose?

If you're a smaller or slots track, charge 10 per cent across the board, the bet taker still takes the signal – they don't care much, your handle is not \$10 million a day anyway – and you have a chance to attract some new dollars to your pools. You at least give yourself a shot to grow.

Charging huge takeout when the vast majority goes to someone else is truly one of harness racing's great mysteries.

Those are my four wishes for 2022. Perhaps I will be asking for the same four things in 2023, but, hey, I gave it a go. Happy New Year everyone.





Should we test intact male horses for testosterone?

Should racing commissions test intact male horses for testosterone? The Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC) doesn't think it should.

On Dec. 31, it was reported on the USTA's fines and suspensions list that stallion Perfect Sting had tested positive for high levels of testosterone after a Pennsylvania Sires Stakes race on June 26 at The Meadows. The split sample confirmed high levels of testosterone (full story here).

On Thursday (Jan. 7), the Paulick Report (**full story here**) published a story by Ray Paulick quoting RMTC executive director and chief operating officer Dr. Mary Scollay.

"Stallions can have seasonal highs and lows for testosterone levels," Dr. Scollay said. "That's why RMTC does not recommend a threshold level for testosterone."

The Paulick Report story also suggested Pennsylvania may be one of the few regions that "has a threshold level for testosterone for intact male horses."

Perfect Sting's trainer Joe Holloway told HRU he did not give Perfect Sting testosterone and, apart from requesting the split sample test as soon as he was informed of the positive — approximately 10 days after the race — he also opted to have a hair follicle test done to determine if the studdy pacer had naturally high levels of testosterone.

"We pulled hair follicles on Dr. Tobin's recommendation and he

gave me the name of a guy in England who's at the forefront in that field. We sent the hair to them and that's not back yet," Holloway said Tuesday (Jan. 4).

"We haven't heard from them. Dr. Tobin has emailed the guy. My vet has emailed the guy. We've called the guy. Dr. Tobin said, 'Maybe I shouldn't have recommended him,' but he's the best and he's just way backed up. So, Dr. Tobin does get him on the phone and he says that they've been so jammed up with Covid, 'Do you still want them to do the test?' That week, the split sample came back in December and it was high and we're going to have to have a hearing. So, we say, 'Yes, we really need (the hair follicle) results.' He said, 'I'll move it to the front of the line."

Holloway stressed he doesn't know how it relates to testosterone levels, but Perfect Sting has long been, "a handful in the paddock... Then, when we test-bred him, he was off the charts. He's pretty virile."

Whether that led to a high testosterone level or something else is yet to be determined by the Pennsylvania State Horse Racing Commission when the appeal of Holloway's 15-day suspension and \$500 fine is heard.







Brownie points

Celebrating the tremendous career of Doug Brown.

Consider these facts:

Doug Brown was the leading driver on the then Ontario Jockey Club each year from 1988 through 1997.

Doug Brown received the O'Brien Award for leading driver in Canada seven of the first eight times the award was offered.

Doug Brown steered horses have won 8,512 races and \$87,838,888.

Brownie was the driver of the first sub-1.50 winning horse ever in Canada with Ball And Chain.

Despite those feats and many more, one has the feeling that when it comes to great drivers, Brownie does not always get his due

Sure, he was installed in the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame in 2006. This scribe, for one, feels even then that it was an honor somewhat overdue.

Now at the age of 66, Brown is doing what he always has done, although with less horsepower at his disposal. He is training two young trotters that he feels should give a good accounting of themselves once the 2022 racing season gets rolling.

When Brown is asked about his illustrious career, the first response you get is that as outstanding as his career has been, it would have been much less so if not for the friendship and loyalty of his dear friend and fellow Hall of Famer Stew Firlotte.

It was with Firlotte that Brown had amazing success with such greats as Town Pro, Historic, Brees Brief, His Mattjesty and Mattduff, among many others.

Brown even got to race Ralph Hanover once when his regular driver and the horse's part owner Ron Waples had to be at a horse sale. Ralph Hanover won the stakes event at the much-missed Blue Bonnets.

Brown's journey in harness racing began at the tender age of 8

when his father allowed him to jog and sometimes even train some of the horses in the stable.

Brown drove his first race at Kawartha Downs and won it at the age of 17 behind a horse named Out Ahead.

That began a career that led him to drivers championships at Kawartha, Belleville and then his favorite track ever, Greenwood.

You started driving at the smaller Ontario tracks and then progressed to the big time on the then Ontario Jockey Club tracks — Greenwood, Garden City and Mohawk. In the interim, you drove in stakes races at virtually every major racetrack throughout North America. Which was your favorite?

"That would have to be Greenwood and not by just a little bit. As with most good things in this life of ours, we didn't really appreciate it for how good a place it was to race until we didn't have it any more. We drivers would sometimes complain about having to take our horses through the throngs of people who would sometimes verbally harass us from the paddock located right in the middle of the grandstand, mostly in a joking manner, but sometimes cutting to the core. Little did I realize how much I and the entire sport would miss these same people when they were nowhere near us. It came to light the very first night we raced at Woodbine. An integral part of the racing experience was missing, never to be regained."



You have driven numerous good to great horses. Which one was your favorite?

"Even though he wasn't the best, my favorite would have to be Sherman Almahurst. He was as game a horse as ever lived. He always gave it his all and always dug in. He had to be the best horse his sire Royce produced.

"In terms of the best, undoubtedly, Town Pro would be the one. She was simply an incredible filly. She was great at both 2 and 3 and very good at 4.

"I've jokingly said that if they opened her up, they would likely find a pair of testicles there. She was that tough. I've never driven one as gritty and resilient as she was.

"There were others of course, many others. Historic was one of them. He was just a little guy, but could he ever fly. He had a long striding gait and covered a lot of ground.

"I once got to drive Ralph Hanover while Ronnie Waples had to be somewhere else. What a machine he was. Others I got to drive, some regularly and others that I just picked up along the way,

were Precious Bunny, Chairmanoftheboard, Lord Stormont, Lime Time, Brees Brief, Anniecrombie, His Mattjesty, Digger Almahurst, Mattduff, Ball and Chain and Teagarden Hanover. There were others of course, that don't immediately come to mind."

You mentioned that Stew Firlotte had a great influence on your success. Tell us about your special relationship with him.

"We were the closest friends for over 35 years. I look back and think of how loyal and how much of a dear friend he was to me. I know it for a fact that he lost horses to train, because owners wanted him to use someone else to drive their horses. I told him to use someone else, if his only other option was to lose the horses. Stew wouldn't hear anything of it. He said that if they didn't have enough faith in both him and me, then he didn't need them in his stable."

Author's note: This from a previous owner in the Firlotte Stable: "Here's an example of Brownie's commitment to Stew. The first good horse we had with Stew was a Matts Scooter colt by the name of Mattduff. He was a fast and precocious colt, but he wasn't the soundest. Stew had him sounder than he had been all year and was prepping him for the Matron to be held at Pompano in early December. The week prior to the race Pompano carded a Saturday evening 2-year-old overnight with a purse of \$3,000. When told the colt was in to race, Doug booked off all his substantial weekend drives at home and flew to Pompano to race in a \$3,000 race, because he felt that his friend needed him there."





Harness Racing Update

Here's a story from Stew's wife Joanne: "We were racing a filly named Poinsetta in a minor stakes event at Peterborough. Doug was probably around 18 or 19, I guess. Stew asked Brownie to drive the filly for him. Doug said yes and won the race with her. Little did we realize that this caused some discord in the Brown household. Doug's dad Stan had one in the same race. Dad was not happy with his son picking our filly over his. This filly led to Ralph Hanover. We earned enough money with Poinsetta to buy Royal Goldie, whose biggest claim to fame was that she once beat Fan Hanover. With Royal Goldie's money we bought A.M Playgirl. She then earned enough money so that we could afford to buy Ralph Hanover for \$65,000, I believe. Ronnie Waples was one of the owners of Ralph, so he drove him, but all of the others were driven by Brownie."

Were there any other trainers with whom you were especially close?

"Two that come immediately come to mind are Joe Stutzman and Bill Robinson. Joe was a pleasure to drive for. He would generally just hand me the lines and wish me good luck. Regardless of how we did, he wouldn't say much afterwards. If I drove bad, he knew it and I knew it, so why bother rehashing it.

"Bill Robinson was always great to drive for. He was decades ahead of his time. His horses were always ready to go out do battle and often win. I've heard much criticism leveled at him because he rarely sat behind one. Bill could see more about his horses from his office than I could sitting behind one."

Let's talk about some of the better drivers you've driven against.

Keith Waples – "He was the granddaddy of us all. If you watched him, did some of the things that he did and had a reasonable amount of talent, you would do well. He was very kind to horses. Very rarely would he hit one."

Ronnie Waples — "Ronnie was very much like his cousin, Keith. But why wouldn't he be? He came out working for and with Keith. He was probably the hardest worker I've known in all my years in the sport. He was a man in perpetual motion, never slowing down. Everything he did, he did well."

Ron Feagan — "As great a driver and natural talent as I've ever seen. His loss at such a young age was shocking to everybody. Why that happened is something we will never know."

Mike Lachance — "He could make a horse go fast. He has a great mind and used it both on and off the racetrack."

Luc Ouellette — "Much like his uncle Mike Lachance, he could make one really go."

John Campbell — "Undoubtedly the greatest driver ever. All you have to do is look at the numbers. Nobody is even close. A pleasure to be around both on and off the racetrack."

Bill O'Donnell — "For a period of time, maybe five to eight years, he was as good a driver as anybody who ever sat behind a horse. He always treated horses well with the respect that they

deserve."

Bill Wellwood — "As great an all-round horseman as ever lived."

Trevor Ritchie — "Very good driver. Extremely patient. He could rate a horse as well as anybody."

Steve Condren — "My chief rival during all my years racing on the OJC and WEG. We were the best of friends and golfing buddies off the racetrack and fierce rivals on it. He was very smart and his horses benefitted from his wisdom."

Wally Hennessey — "I became friends with Wally and his brother Dan when I spent my winters training in Florida. Wally is still one of the top drivers around anywhere."

What was the greatest thrill you experienced in harness racing?

"Undoubtedly that would be my installation in the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame. It was something I dreamed of, but never really expected. It's the greatest thing that one who participated in harness racing could possibly enjoy. It was both thrilling and humbling."

Your name is sometimes associated with that of Bobby Orr.

"Before we go any further, I will unequivocally state that Bobby Orr was the greatest hockey player to ever play the game. Although his numbers

are very good, they might not be as good as some others. Nevertheless, he revolutionized the game. We grew up together in Oshawa when Bobby first started playing junior hockey for the Oshawa Generals at the age of 14! Even at that age, he was still always the best player on the ice. I used to sponsor a charity golf tournament and Bobby would usually show up to help us raise money for a good cause."

Did you ever think of taking your whip and colors to the States and pursuing your craft there, as so many other Canadian horsemen have done?

"It never even crossed my mind. Why would it have? I was riding a gravy train for many years and doing just fine up here. For a period of 10 to 15 years, life was great. I had all that I wanted. Then, of course the government came around and changed things taking all the slot money from us. At the time, I thought that we would likely get a haircut, but they came around and chopped our collective heads off. The WEG tracks managed to survive, but that was the death knoll for all of the B tracks in Ontario. Of the few smaller tracks still racing, there is no way that the horsemen racing there can possibly make a decent living."

Where do you see us and where are we going?

"If you have the quality of horses that can race at Mohawk, you still have a decent chance of making a good living. There are so many more options for the fans, both gambling related and not. In addition to the casinos and lotteries, you now have sports gambling on the horizon. I expect that might eat into our revenue pool, as well. I'm sorry to come across as being so glum, but I'm afraid that is the reality of our times.

"All and all, I am so thankful that I came around when I did. I've been blessed to have been around so many great people and have been privileged to drive great horses at the best of times and against the best of competition. It has been a great ride. I wouldn't change it for the world."

Before we end, tell us a little about your family and how you are working your way through COVID-19.

"As far as COVID is concerned, it probably hasn't hurt us more than most others. It certainly hurt racing when we were forced to shut down.

"We are careful and follow the rules and recommendations. My wife Nancy and I have been married for 38 years. We have two children a daughter Kristal and a son Kyle. Kristal has two sons. Her family lives in Calgary, and unfortunately we don't get to see them often enough."

At the risk of sounding maudlin, maybe the worst part of getting old is not only the realization that the grim reaper is keeping his eye

on you, but maybe even more so, the fact that he keeps eliminating your friends and the people dearest to you.

In the last two weeks the sport has lost two of its greatest fans and supporters — both dear friends of mine from my Montreal days — each going back well over half a century.

Conny Leber is perhaps the better known of the two. He has owned horses for the last 60 or more years. He loved to play in the big leagues and had much success with horses such as Sunshine Beach and Safe Arrival.

Eddie Schneerer had been my friend since our high school days at Northmount High in its first graduating class of 1958. Actually, Schneerer was involved in harness racing slightly before me. He and I were part owners of the first horse that each of us ever owned a part of, a tiny Good Time pacer by the name of Auction Time. At one time, Schneerer actually aspired to become a trainer. However, good sense took over and he established one of Canada's premier art moving companies. However, he never stopped going to the races, betting on horses and reading all about harness racing. In recent years, he became a significant owner in some of the horses in Anthony MacDonald's The Stable. Even though Schneerer owned small positions in many, he cheered them on as though he owned the horses all by themselves.

Penny wise and a pound foolish

First, a few end-of-year observations. The pedigrees in our year-ling sale catalogs could be so much better if they included a paragraph devoted to the yearling's sire. He is far more important than the few extra lines gained re the third or fourth dam that it shouldn't even be an open question.

Going a little further on this subject, I've learned long ago that, when selling a yearling, the sire is essential in catching the buyer's interest, and then the dam sets the buyer's price range.

If you're lucky enough to be selling a yearling by Walner or Downbytheseaside, you want the pedigree page to extol all the virtues and accomplishments of these horses as sires. To scrimp on them is, indeed, penny wise and pound foolish.

Another point I see in the owner's statement for many older horses, either broodmares or racehorses, is that the horse is being sold as "part of an annual reduction." To me, this says, in bold face caps, what you've got here is a cull. Annual reduction or not, you never sell your best horses unless you're going out of business. I believe someone long ago liked the sound of that phrase, even if it did the opposite of enhancing the horse being sold, and it's hung around ever since.

Personally, if I have to give a reason for selling a horse, I like to go back to the sign in front of a restaurant in Hanover, PA when I was growing up there. It said: "If you don't stop here and eat, we'll both starve to death."

Looking back, in my early days in this business, Stanley Dancer and Billy Haughton played major roles in my life. Haughton, because he was the biggest yearling buyer in the sport, and also a fellow USTA director from District 8A. How District 8A came to be, was thanks to two long-time directors from upstate New York: Dr. Harry Zweig and Dr. Albert Miller.

Although I didn't beat either of them, I gave them a scare when

I had the temerity to run against them for a USTA directorship. Peter Rhulen, a great guy and one of my best friends, represented me in the vote counting. He soon had his sleeves rolled up and sweat on his face as the counting went on for hours and hours.


Like I said, both Zweig and Miller beat me, but to make sure I didn't come after them again, they went to Columbus and divided New York into two new districts.

District 8A included all of New York City and Westchester County. Everything north of Westchester remained in District 8. Since I lived in the city and Haughton lived on Long Island, we wound up spending a lot of time together on USTA business.

And being with Haughton was an education unto itself. Let me just say that Haughton lived life to the fullest in every aspect of a man's life. As I've said before, he was one of those rare people who almost glittered. The only comparison I can make is to the wedding reception in Palm Beach in 1958 when I screwed up my courage and introduced myself to John F. Kennedy. There actually was an aura around him.

But Dancer was a totally different deal. He had none of Billy's glitter, but he was much better at taking care of his material concerns. He was the trainer of Noble Victory when he became the first million-dollar standardbred when I syndicated him for K.D. Owen.

That was between his 3 and 4-year-old seasons, and it got off to a bad start. Noble lost his first two starts to Armbro Flight, and then

717-638-7100 office@diamondcreekfarm.com in his next start, in the \$100,000 Realization, Joe O'Brien ran into Noble with Armbro Flight, and they both finished out of the money.

At that point, Dancer made a radical change by the training standard of that day, and he stopped training Noble between races. The result was seven straight free-for-all wins, and in each one he set a new track record. Then Dancer took him to the DuQuoin, where Noble set a new world record for trotters when he won in 1:55.3.

Shortly thereafter, Ken Owen and I retired Noble to the stud at my farm, Lana Lobell Farms.

When I syndicated Noble Victory, and you must remember in those days a full book was 60 mares, I included two free breedings for Dancer.

That fall, Mr. and Mrs. Rex Larkin dispersed their breeding farm, Poplar Hill, at the fall sale in Lexington. It wasn't a particularly happy event because right after they consigned all their breeding stock to the sale, both of the Larkins perished when their commercial flight crashed on take-off from the Cincinnati airport.

Every mare the Larkins owned was a pacer, with one small exception. That was a pacing bred mare who trotted named Flashy Princess. She was by Cardinal Prince, a pacer, who was a successful racehorse and sire in his day. He was also a beautiful chestnut horse, and Flashy Princess got her color and good looks from him. But unlike her sire, she trotted to a 3-year-old record of 2:04 and earned a very respectable \$17,380.

While that would be peanuts today, it took a good horse to win \$17,000 in the early '50's. Although she went through the Tattersalls sale as a barren mare, Flashy Princess had already produced several respectable trotters.

Dancer, who played every aspect of our game deftly, grabbed Flashy Princess for \$900. He used one of his two free rights to breed her to Noble Victory, and the result was a filly named Egyptian Jody 2, 2:04.1 (\$54,156).

That filly's name alone was somewhat fraught. At the time, Dancer was married to his first wife, Rachel, but a few years later the filly's namesake became the second Mrs. Stanley Dancer.

But her name apart, Egyptian Jody became a foundation mare for a chain of top trotters. They include the Hambletonian winner Harmonious, and my favorite underrated stallion, Uncle Peter, who himself won over a million dollars.

Finally, with all my talk about how to advertise your horse, it would be wise to remember what Dr. Samuel Johnson wrote in 1759: Promise, large promise, is the soul of an advertisement.

And he certainly said nothing about an annual reduction sale.



Jazzy Perrine – an early talent in France

The 3-year-old fillies battled over 1.6 miles in the \$135,000 Prix Gelinotte at Vincennes on Saturday afternoon (Jan. 8) and Tomas Malmqvist-trained **Jazzy Perrine** (Django Riff) proved to be best for driver Eric Raffin.

Jazzy Perrine was served a cover trip while Jocosa and Danish Melody fought for the front position throughout the race. Jazzy Perrine attacked far outside over the stretch and the trotter finished impressively. Vincennes was quite sloppy track on Saturday afternoon after heavy rain and the mile rate for Jazzy Perrine was a moderate 2:04.3.

This was Jazzy Perrine's third win in eight starts and, so far, she has never been outside the top two spots in a race. It appears she will be a horse for the biggest 3-year-old battles this spring, at least when it comes to races for fillies.

The 3-year-old colts race at Vincennes this afternoon (Jan. 9) when the \$135,000 Prix Maurice de Gheest is on the menu.

The \$135,000 Prix Emile Riotteau for trotters racing under saddle was held at Vincennes on Saturday and the winner of the race secured a spot in the biggest monté race in the world,



the \$792,000 Prix de Corniluer which is scheduled for Jan. 23 at Vincennes.

The winner in Saturday's race impressed a lot. Joel Hallaistrained **Hirondelle du Rib** (Rolling d'Heripre) had to face a three-wide trip during the race's first mile and when jockey Jean Loic Claude Dersoir hit the lead with his horse in the last turn, Hirondelle du Rib showed that she will be a serious factor in the big race in two weeks.

Hirondelle du Rib held the opponents behind her over the stretch and she recorded a mile rate of 1:58.3 over 1.6 miles.

Joel Hallais' mare is well merited and she claimed the trophy in the \$225,000 Prix President Republique in 2021.

Today's (Jan. 9) Vincennes card contains another qualification race ahead of Prix de Cornulier. The \$170,000 Prix du Calvados attracts eight monté horses where Bilibili is the most merited among them. Jerry Riordan tries racing under saddle with his Zarenne Fas and the top three in Sunday's race claim their spots in the Prix de Cornulier.

The Paris winter meeting is definitely in focus right now and big races continue to be on the race cards every week.

Ruth and me and Dan Patch

Call me Ishmael.

But if you do, you are ridiculous because my name is Alex. My online creative writing instructor suggested I always use an attention-getting first sentence. The instructor uses the name Ruth but is probably from India and may have a name like Gayathri, mother of Vedas. Or Ruth could be Svetlana, a member of a Russian cyber gang. Who knows these days?

This whole thing started when I searched the web for "humorous opening lines for tinder first dates." I clicked on one of those provocative, clickbait pop-ups that can send you down a wormhole for hours. Several confusing clicks later, I discovered that I paid \$29.99 (plus a PayPal fee) for an online interactive course titled "Join a Personalized Creative Class in Writing of Fourteen Lessons."

Honestly, I did not want to take the course, but canceling payment on the Internet is a process only slightly less straightforward than reaching a living technical assistant at Amazon or capturing an extraterrestrial being. It was worth more than \$29.99 to avoid cancellation chaos. Who knows? Perhaps I could become the next Ring Lardner, a famous writer listed on the clickbait homepage. I am unfamiliar with his writing, but Ring is an evocative name.

Technically, Ruth did not speak to me. We chatted by typing in a square box at the bottom right corner of the screen. As expected, my classes were boilerplate, not much more than a High School PowerPoint presentation. I didn't expect a personal phone conversation, but I hoped for a zoom meeting. Ruth did not even have a photo next to her chatbox, nor did she get my name correct. Her first message that popped up in my box:

Ruth Wrote..."Good afternoon Alexo."

Alex-o? Correcting my teacher on the first day didn't feel polite. I didn't want to disrupt the class, so I let it slide and responded with good humor.

Alexo wrote - "Let's rock, make me a famous author."

My wit did not draw a cyber chuckle. Instead, another message.

Ruth wrote – "We are waiting for additional classmates to join our session. Your lesson will begin in four minutes."

While watching the countdown clock, one of us lost our hookup. I think it was Ruth because I was eating a sandwich and didn't touch anything. I could not reconnect in the allotted sign-in time. I either skipped, was dismissed, or possibly expelled from my first online class.

The second lesson, technically my first lesson, was an improvement. In this session, we Steven King wannabees found a list of attention-grabbing first sentences and powerful adverbs posted on the screen.

Toward the end of our 20-minute session, students were assigned a topic for the "How to do Assignment Writing" section of the course. Where our work would be "edited by a professional."

Ruth wrote - "That is an interesting question. Thank you for asking."

Alexo wrote — "It is not a question. It is a request. Drop the o or I will speak to your supervisor or track you down in whatever cyberspace bunker you are hiding in and..."

Charlie May, Gabbys C Note honored in Ohio

Charlie May's sophomore season will be one that his fans and owner Don Tiger will not soon forget. The reigning 2-Year-Old Ohio Pacer of the Year did not disappoint as he captured the title as the top 3-year-old pacer in Ohio.

Regarded as one of the top 3-year-old pacers in the county, the son of McCardle, hit the board in 17 of 22 starts, winning 10 races and earning \$879,400 for owner and breeder Don Tiger. Charlie May's lifetime earnings now top \$1.2 million.

Charlie May's wins included three legs of the Ohio Sire Stakes, the Carl Milstein Memorial at MGM Northfield Park, the Ohio State Fair Stakes, the Ohio Breeders Championship, and the Matron Stakes at Dover Downs. He also crossed the finishing line first in the Meadowlands Pace but was placed last for interference which is under appeal.

"It was a great year," said Tiger who had hopes that Charlie May could duplicate his 2-year-old season. "Like a good baseball or football team you get your core guys back and you think you are going to be OK. We knew the cards we had, and we thought he would accomplish what we did."

Gabbys C Note was money in the bank in 2021, hitting the board in six of seven races on the way to being named the Ohio 2-Year-Old Trotting Filly of the Year.

Trained by Chris Beaver and owned by Beaver, his mom Johanna, who is also the breeder, and Steven Zeehandelar, Gabbys C Note won five races and earned \$243,150.

The daughter of Triumphant Caviar out of Gabby's Creditcard, Gabbys C Note capped off a four-race winning streak by easily winning the \$300,000 Ohio Sires Stakes Final by three lengths.

Aaron Merriman drove Gabbys C Note to victory in the Sire Stakes Finals and says she was a mature two-year-old, "She's bigger and more talented than other fillies. I knew she was something special when I sat behind her."

Gingras starts year off right, wins five at Big M

Yannick Gingras had yet another successful year in 2021, as his horses earned \$11.2 million to rank the 42-year-old driver third in the national standings, and Friday night (Jan. 7) at The Meadowlands, he got his 2022 off to a superb start by winning five times on the initial card of the year at the mile oval.

The Quebec native got his night going in the sixth race, scoring with 4-5 favorite She's Nun Bettor N from post 10 despite extremely chilly and windy conditions (the real feel temperature was 15 degrees). His second victory came two races later when he guided 2-1 public choice Muscle Jack to victory lane, winning again from the 10 hole.

"[Muscle Jack] raced well. I was a little worried about him because at Yonkers he was a complete lunatic," said Gingras. "He was actually pretty good to drive, he was trotting through the stretch pretty well."

Win No. 3 came with the Jeff Cullipher-trained Birdman as the 3-5 favorite, giving Cullipher – the leading dash-winning trainer at the 2021 Winter-Spring-Championship Meeting at The Big M – his 1,000th career victory.

Flirty Forty took the 12th race as the 2-1 public choice to give "The Green Hornet" his fourth score of the evening before he capped his big night with his biggest price, guiding 7-1 chance Manhattanup No Ice to victory lane in the 15th and final.

"I had some power tonight and they were ready to race," said Gingras. "I'm looking forward to staying healthy and having a good 2022."

Gingras, who finished second to Dexter Dunn during 2021 in The Big M standings in dash wins with 116, upped his lifetime win total to 7,991 after his big night, leaving him just nine short of the 8,000-win plateau.

ANOTHER BIG PICK-5: After closing out 2021 with a big payout, shrewd 20-cent Pick-5 players hit big again Friday night.

On New Year's Eve, bettors were thinking big as a carryover led to a total pool of over \$270,000 and a payout of \$27,565. Friday night, the pool may have been nowhere as large (\$42,530), but

after driver Joe Bongiorno scored with 20-1 chance Itty Bitty after going a brutal first-over trip in the fifth race, those with winning tickets walked away with \$14,121.

A LITTLE MORE: Mark Ford recorded a training triple after completing a sweep of the Late Double (\$122.20)... There were no winning tickets sold in the 20-cent Pick-6, creating a carryover of \$4,540. Those with five correct cashed in for \$252.28... Free past performances for every race of every Meadowlands card are available by going to www.playmeadowlands.com ... All-source handle totaled \$2,797,927.

Déjà Vu all over again and again!

If you recall I have provided articles with one of Yogi's most famous tenets as a headline regarding our regulator's problematic protocols. Although well read, the article obviously has had little if any positive effect on our problematic regulators, hence this 2022 update. The predominant regulating agencies brawny opposition to the Horseracing Integrity & Safety Authority (HISA) have time and again provided prima facie evidence that the HISA is an undeniable requisite if we are to survive.

Many owners, trainers, drivers, racetrack owners and I imagine colleagues from all facets of horse racing are beyond belief regarding regulators continued unethical deviations from specified violation protocols. Unfortunately, the commissions charged with upholding our integrity are guilty of contributing to racings poor public perception. There are several regulatory incidents available for review but let's focus on Pennsylvania's contribution to racing potential demise.

Perfect Sting, the leading purse champion and Dan Patch award winner, tested positive for a steroid in June of this year. The violation was published six months after the race and after the voting for 2021 awards were complete. The commission's faulty handling of Perfect Sting's steroid positive is just another example of the PHRC's lack of character and effort. I do not care how many split samples were submitted it does not take six months to confirm test results.

Another commission faux pas occurred in 2016 at Pennsylvania's Chester facility; there was a Class 1 drug positive in a \$250,000 Sire Stakes. The race was on Sept. 11 with the positive reported to the PHRC the following week. Then, it disappeared for eight months until Spring 2017. It then disappeared again for another eight months. The presiding judge was notified by the newly christened PHRC executive director to bury the violation. He refused and was fired at the conclusion of the Chester meet. The requisite penalty and purse redistribution also disappeared... permanently.

The industry is aware of the potential unethical bellwethers contributing to these decisions. These individuals focus on their personal agendas first and the best interest of harness racing second.

Withdrawal times not based on reality

I read your article on Perfect Sting (full story here) and was not surprised about the ridiculous amount of time it took to get the results reported. The bigger issue for me is that the regulators of the allowable medications and the withdrawal times are not based on any reality. The ARCI (Association of Racing Commissioners International) seems to be setting trainers up for failure. They tell you what is allowed and when I read the fines and suspensions every week most of the trainers get a positive test on allowable medications.

You mention picograms as a measurement of medication and state how little it takes to get a positive test. My question is, do these low almost non-existent levels have any performance benefits? I had the privilege of speaking with Dr. Sams who worked for the ARCI helping to set up the allowable medications and withdrawal times and what he told me about how the ARCI setting levels without the use of the science was shocking.
