the only mark against Papi Rob Hanover from the middle of summer to the Governor's Cup was a highly questionable DQ in the Breeders Crown that was handed to a beaten Tall Dark Stranger on a silver platter. After that fiasco, Papi went on to literally crush the competition in the Matron and Governor's Cup, just as he had crushed Tall Dark Stranger in the elimination to the Breeders Crown. Tall Dark Stranger only raced in one Grand Circuit stake in the U.S. All his other starts in stakes completion were in mostly indigenous races in Canada.

As for the rest of the voting, complaining wears thin, something must be changed to make the outcome more reality based. The fact that someone voted against Shartin N or Bettors Wish blows my mind and their privilege of voting should be rescinded immediately.

To remain somewhat politically correct I will end my award comments here and now but I will add, some left me scratching my head.

I got a lot of emails about the Driver of the Year selection, all of which were positive about Dexter Dunn. The consensus of my readers was that he was so dominant the second half of the season that they found themselves watching many races they ordinarily would not have cared about just to follow him and see the improvement he could create in a horses performance. Congratulations to Dexter he has done a tremendous job and has immediately created a huge fan base.

Please don't take anything away from Tim Tetrick. The new Hall of Famer had a spectacular year, as well.

Greg Houle asks: I am Canadian and would like your take on why Canadians are barred from racing in most U.S. tracks, because the tracks use conditions to exclude Canadian trainers and owners?

I am sorry Greg but this must be something someone told you that was quite misleading for sure. There are not now and never have been rules of exclusion for Canadian trainers or owners. One of my closest friends, Albert Hanna, came to Monticello to race every summer from St Bernard De La Cole in Canada. Michel Lachance, Herve Filion, Ron Waples, The Remmens. I could go on forever. I myself trained Hammerin Hank for NLH Stable of Montreal and raced in the U.S.

Just to make sure I wasn't mistaken in some aspect I asked Clay Horner of WEG to give me his thoughts on the question. His reply was "He is flat out wrong. Obviously there are immigration laws as they do in Canada as well, but Canadians aren't restricted by any track rules to my knowledge. I have heard that it is difficult to race in Pennsylvania but it certainly isn't a bar."

Pocono, Dover and Yonkers have been difficult in the past, but Canadians were not singled out, it was anyone the race secretary didn't want. Dover especially always protected Delaware horseman. One of Pocono's leading trainers is Rene Allard, a Canadian citizen, and his brother Simon is one of the leading drivers.

Please tell me of a particular occurrence that pertains to the exclusion of a Canadian and I promise I personally will look into it and unless it pertains to the law will try to have it rectified.

Tom Santoro asks: What is your take on Aaron Merriman?

Aaron Merriman is a superbly talented reinsman and a workaholic to boot. He has just won 1,000 races in 2019 for the third year in a row. Aaron is the Dave Palone of his generation. A kid with a ton of ability that doesn't want to globe hop for a living and likes to sleep in his own bed. In actuality, Aaron has it better than Dave did because the money available in Pennsylvania and Ohio is far greater

today than it was in the early Palone era. However there is no question that the driving colonies at The Meadows and the Ohio tracks are far more competitive today than in years past.

As far as Merriman numbers are concerned my editor pointed them out clearly [in last week's column that you may read here](#).

Michael Larsson asks: Why doesn't the Meadowlands do free live streaming to promote the sport? According to Jeff Gural and Jason Settlemoir, it is in the contract they have with RTN. However, to begin with, it really isn't necessary. Anyone living in the modern world has cable in their home and 99 per cent of the time TVG is on that cable, and it broadcasts every race at the Meadowlands, sometimes a bit late at most five or 10 minutes, but usually one or two. However, there is little amount of color. In order to get the full program with ongoing comments and race information there are many free outlets where you can see the races on a phone, tablet, or computer. I cannot tell you the sites to look for as they are all gambling sites and I do not want to show favoritism, but any one of your friends will give you the information needed to see the entire show for free anywhere there is WiFi. Add to that if you want to see the show on your big screen television it is easy to attach your phone or tablet to the big screen to view.

Phillip Deluca asks: Look back at the 2019 sales and tell me which one of the two million dollar yearlings you liked best?

Unfortunately there is no way I can answer that question definitively. I have three viewing criteria that combined give

me a thorough appraisal of a colt. Most important of which is how he performs in the paddock, then how he looks on the floor and lastly do I find any faults in his gait on his video. Due to the extreme value of her product, that being the colt Damien, his owner Elizabeth Caldwell of Cane Run Farm decided it was not worth the risk to have him run loose in the paddock and under the circumstances I really couldn't argue the point. Therefore, it is impossible to make a fair and complete evaluation.

That said, after reviewing my notes when I received this question I would lean to Maverick as my choice between the two. Let's say Damien would have been fabulous turned out in the paddock, his total number in my system would have come to 30 where Mavericks was 31 1/2. That was more than the \$100,000 difference in my book. They both are in fine hands so a year from now you can beat me up if I am wrong. It won't be the first time nor the last.

James Grosse asks: I have a yearling filly that is having a gagging reflex to the bit. She is fine jogging but when asked to slow down she makes a gurgling noise. Why not go bit less?

To begin with you are under some severe misconceptions. I am certain that a horse is unable to throw up. So I doubt if there is any possibility of a gag reflex. To make sure of the facts I called Dr. Richard Balmer DVM, and asked about the situation.

"The bit is a foot or more from the throat of the horse which would make gagging impossible aside from the fact that a horse has no gag reflex," he said.

Rick went on to say there are many fancy overcheck bits that if not used properly can pinch the horse's nostrils and cause a major breathing issue. Please also remember that a horse doesn't breathe through his mouth so nostril size is important in buying a colt.

Taking all this into consideration my feeling is that a tongue tie will most likely solve the problem. The filly is most likely balling her tongue up behind the bit. She may also have a problem displacing her palate or an entrapment, all of which can be determined quite easily by a veterinarian. I am sure you are correct about the noise, but the bit is not causing the problem. Just as a note, I am not 100 per cent sure but I do believe that it is against regulations to have a

horse race without a bit in his mouth. I have heard of trainers training colts with sore mouths without a bit but never have seen one race.

TOTAL ESTIMATED VALUE — \$6,000,000

STALLION NOMINATION FEE: Due and payable January 15, 2020, in the amount of the advertised stud fee for the 2020 breeding season (\$500 U.S. funds minimum) -- plus an additional surcharge as indicated below -- provided, however, that for first-year stallions placed in commercial service (which would not include test breedings) after January 15, the nomination must be paid within 60 days after the stallion first breeds a mare. In no event will any first-year stallion nomination fee be accepted after December 31, 2020. The Hambletonian Society reserves the right to determine the stallion nomination fee of those stallions whose 2020 service is advertised as private treaty, or if the amount of the fee is not advertised. This payment covers 2020 matings (foals of 2021).

In addition to the 2020 service fee, the amount of the stallion nomination fee must include a surcharge as follows:

a) For stallions that stand for a fee from US\$3,000 to \$5,999 (or \$3,951 CAD (Canadian Dollars) to \$7,900 CAD), an additional amount equal to 40% of 2020 service fee must be paid;

b) For stallions that stand for a fee from US\$6,000 to \$9,999 (or \$7,902 CAD to \$13,168 CAD), an additional amount equal to 75% of 2020 service fee must be paid;

c) For stallions that stand for a fee of US\$10,000 (\$13,170 CAD), or more, an additional amount equal to 200% of 2020 service fee must be paid.

For stallions that stand for a service fee of less than US\$3,000 (or \$3,951 CAD), no additional surcharge is necessary for nomination.

Note: For the purpose of determining the surcharge in other than U.S. funds, the November 1, 2019 exchange rate is used; a rate of \$1.317 CAD per US\$.

Stallion nominations for other than first-year stallions that are postmarked after January 15, 2020, but on or before December 31, 2020, will be accepted upon payment of an additional penalty amount equal to 50% of the above stallion nomination fee (including the above surcharge). Likewise, stallion nominations for first-year stallions that are postmarked after the above sixty-day deadline, but on or before December 31, 2020, will be accepted upon payment of an additional amount equal to 50% of the above stallion nomination fee (including the above surcharge).

Any payment on a stallion that does not commercially conceive a foal or breed a mare by any means during the entire 2020 breeding season may be refunded, provided, however, that it shall be the obligation of the stallion nominator to notify the Society in writing of any request for refund by December 31, 2020.

Moreover, if a nominated stallion does not breed more than twenty (20) mares in 2020 or produce more than fifteen (15) registered foals in 2021, up to 50% of the stallion nomination fee may be refunded, provided, however, that it shall be the obligation of the stallion nominator to notify the Society in writing of any request for adjustment by December 31, 2020 (mares bred) or by December 31, 2021 (registered foals). No stallion nomination fee will be reduced to less than \$500.00 U.S. funds.

Any payment on a North American stallion that has been nominated by January 15, 2020, and is subsequently exported prior to February 15, 2020 and that does not commercially breed a mare in North America by any means during the entire 2020 breeding season, may be refunded, provided, however, that it shall be the obligation of the stallion nominator to notify the Society in writing of any request for refund by December 31, 2020. With the exception of supplemental nominations or declarations as provided in the conditions, foals of 2021 by a stallion for which the above nomination fee has been refunded will be ineligible to the Breeders Crown unless an additional amount equal to the amount of the refund is paid.

Except as provided above, stallion nomination fees shall not be refunded.

Stallion payments may be made in the local currency of the nation in which the stallion stands, or in equivalent U.S. funds (\$500 U.S. funds minimum).

Conditions for nominating yearlings will be published in the U.S.T.A. Stakes & Futurities Nomination Book. Specific conditions for the races for which these foals are eligible will be published in the U.S.T.A. Stakes Guide in the year of the races. The Hambletonian Society reserves the right to add to, amend or delete the conditions of all or any part of the Breeders Crown program, without liability.

In 2020, 2-year-old, 3-year-old and open Breeders Crown events will be conducted under the conditions of Breeders Crown 2020. All of these races are closed with sustaining payments due in 2020, with the exception of supplemental nominations.

Ohlsson best in Europe

Swedish driver Ulf Ohlsson won the most races in Europe 2019, at least in races in the sulky. Ohlsson's 314 victories put him highest on the podium, even if France's Eric Raffin noted 345 wins during last year's program. Sixty of Raffin's victories came under saddle and he got help from 100 different trainers to be the best in France. Sébastien Guarato, Philippe Allaire and Jean-Michel Baudouin were the most important trainers for him in the chase for number one spot.

World champion driver Ricke Ebbinge from The Netherlands was best in his home country and ended 2019 with 76 victories.

In summary, European drivers are still not close to reaching the number of victories that North American drivers record year after year.

Bazire tops trainers

Jean-Michel Bazire dominated among the trainers in France and his winter meeting in Paris 2018/2019 was something extraordinary. Bazire's horses performed on top during the whole winter and the Prix d'Amérique victory with Belina Josselyn was in many ways significant for his season at the tracks. Several major stakes races were conquered by Bazire and his stable also suffered a tragedy when star trotter Aubrion du Gers (runner up in Elitloppet at Solvalla in

May) was killed in a training accident at Bazire's farm in July.

Bazire's stable made 948 starts in 2019 and 219 of them ended in the winner's circle. His horses earned approximately \$7,950,958 in 927 attempts.

Timo Nurmos was the best trainer in Sweden in 2019. From 757 starts, he had 210 wins and \$3,890,326 in earnings, which was enough to keep runner up Robert Bergh in safe distance on the list.

Bilibili tops in Prix du Calvados

The \$145,000 Prix du Calvados was held for monté trotters in Paris on Sunday (Jan. 5) and Bilibili, last year's winner of the \$723,000 Prix de Cornulier (the biggest racing under saddle race in the world), showed great condition when he claimed the victory in mile rate of 1:57.2 over 1.7 miles.

Alexandre Abrivard sat in the saddle and the duo had to travel a pretty tough road before the victory was sealed. Bilibili traveled three wide almost all the race, but still, he had power to catch leader Bilooka du Boscaill in time before the wire.

Bilibili pushed his lifetime earnings to over \$1,650,000 and he will be the one to chase when \$723,000 Prix de Cornulier is scheduled at Vincennes on Sunday Jan. 19, the week before Prix d'Amérique.

Elitloppet winner tries Paris

The last of four B-races ahead of Prix d'Amérique later this month is scheduled in Paris on Sunday, Jan. 12. The \$121,800 Prix de Belgique has attracted 15 trotters and among them, last year's winner of Elitloppet, Dijon, will make his first attempt in the preparation races before the main gig happening on Jan. 26.

Dijon made two starts in France after the big victory at Solvalla in May last year and the 7-year-old son of Ganymede hasn't raced since the end of July, 2019. The established quick front runner is more used to autostart than the French volt system nowadays and Sunday's start might be an indicator that trainer and driver Romain Derieux are really aiming for the PdA 2020.

Undefeated super mare quits

Five-year-old Norwegian-bred Hillary B.R. (Muscle Hill) made 15 starts in her racing career, and won all of them. The Geir Vegard Gundersen-trained mare was in many ways the new star in Norwegian harness racing business, but unfortunately, an injury stopped her from continuing racing.

"I was very optimistic regarding her injury that she got last year and I really had a hope on that she would be back at the tracks. But now I'm not that optimistic anymore," said Geir Vegard Gundersen to Norwegian media tgn.no last week.

Hillary B.R. was undefeated in 15 starts and won the highest staked races in Norway as a 3-, and 4-year-old. She earned \$440,000 and noted a record of 1:52.2 over the mile. Her first partner as a broodmare will probably be a French stallion.

"The fact that Hillary B.R. is 5-year-old is positive for her new career," said owner Arne Sandbaek Jr to tgn.no.

Sandbaek said he hopes that he can pair Hillary B.R. with either Ready Cash, or his son Face Time Bourbon.

The growth of TheStable.ca is one of the most positive ventures in Canadian harness racing and its development has also inspired other fractional groups to emerge across the country. In Prince Edward Island, for example, at least six new fractional ownership groups have been formed bringing new owners into the game.

While growing the ownership base in Canada, TheStable.ca

employs over 40 staff, and complements their racing efforts with Open House events, fundraisers, and trips to major races. Last summer they initiated and hosted Summer School Workshops – *Barn Basics for Beginners*, and *Barn and Track* for people who had basic experience with horses but wanted more hands on experience.

TheStable.ca had its very first on site Open House at Tomiko Training Centre on Dec. 10, 2016, breaking new ground and featuring horses training on the track in sets of four captured by drone camera for an in-house and streaming video show, complete with commentary and interviews. Hundreds of people attended that event and since that time, they have hosted an additional six Open House events (Spring Showcase and Christmas Open Houses) to showcase their yearlings and horses for sale.

TheStable.ca has also made an important impact in its community, supporting charitable causes, and local events. The Open Houses always have a charitable component and in past years, they have raised monies for the Ontario Standardbred Adoption Society, Standardbred Retirement Fund, and the Guelph Food Bank. At the 2017 Open House event, clients and guests of TheStable.ca raised \$2,300 and donated 2750 kg of food for the Guelph Food Bank!

MacDonald was recognized for his efforts in promoting fractional ownership when he was selected as The I Love Canadian Harness Racing Fan Club's Ambassador of the Year for 2016 and in early 2017, he was honored by the Standardbred Breeders of Ontario Association with its 2016 Lloyd Chisholm Achievement Award, recognizing a member of the harness racing community for their ongoing

meritorious service.

Standardbred Canada established the Cam Fella Award in 1997, and fittingly its namesake was the first recipient acknowledging Cam's unparalleled contributions to the sport of harness racing. A national committee of 16 representing the standardbred community vote by secret ballot to determine the Cam Fella Award winner. A winner must receive 75 per cent of the Yes votes to win.

Canadian-owned, trained and driven, Cam Fella was an outstanding racehorse in the early 1980s, winning 56 races, over \$2 million in purse money and two consecutive Horse of the Year titles in North America. As a stallion, 'Cam' sired numerous world champions and horses with earnings in excess of \$107 million. In early 1997, Cam Fella was diagnosed with testicular cancer and was retired from breeding. He died in May of 2001 at the Kentucky Horse Park, where he had lived for several years and served as an outstanding ambassador of the standardbred breed.

The creation of the Cam Fella Award was the harness racing industry's way of ensuring that Cam's contribution to the sport is never forgotten.

won 12 of 19 starts with 4 seconds, earning \$791,482. Major wins included the Monument Circle Pace, Indiana Sires Stakes final and the Tattersalls Pace.

Due to a cracked pastern suffered in the spring, 4-year-old **Always B Miki** had only four starts in 2015 but won them all, including the Breeders Crown and American-National.

It was as a 5-year-old that **Always B Miki** would make harness racing history. On October 9, 2016, he became the fastest Standardbred ever, winning the Allerage at The Red Mile in 1:46, shattering the one-mile race standard of 1:46.4, and shaving one fifth off the 23-year-old record of Cambest set in a 1993 time trial. **Always B Miki** is the only harness horse in history with four 1:47 or faster victories. Other wins that year included the Breeders Crown, Ben Franklin, William Haughton Memorial, TVG Free-For-All, Jim Ewart Memorial, and Hoosier Park Pacing Derby.

Always B Miki was voted 2016 Dan Patch Horse of the Year, 2016 Dan Patch Pacer of the Year and 2016 Dan Patch Older Pacing Horse of the Year.

BEE A MAGICIAN

Bee A Magician was the leading money-winning 2-year-old trotter of 2012 with \$766,652 in earnings and a 13-10-1-1 record, including wins in the Peaceful Way and Ontario Sire Stakes Gold Super Final. She was voted 2012 O'Brien Two-Year-Old Trotting Filly of the Year.

Three-year-old **Bee A Magician** was undefeated in 17 starts. She set the world record 1:51 mile for three-year-old fillies and was the year's leading money-winning trotter with \$1,547,304 in earnings, a single-season record for standardbred mares. Major victories included the Breeders Crown, Hambletonian Oaks, Elegant Image, Delvin Miller Memorial, Moni Maker and Simcoe Stakes. **Bee A Magician** was voted 2013 Dan Patch and O'Brien Horse of the Year, Dan Patch Trotter of the Year, and Dan Patch and O'Brien Three-Year-Old Trotting Filly of the Year.

As a 4-year-old, **Bee A Magician** earned \$421,314 while finishing on the board in 12 of 17 starts, including a victory in the 2014 Breeders Crown Open Mare Trot. In 2015, **Bee A Magician** would claim the title of top money-winning aged standardbred of the year, garnering \$980,845. With 10 wins

and five seconds in 18 starts, including victories in the Maple Leaf Trot and Armbro Flight, **Bee A Magician** was voted 2015 Dan Patch and O'Brien Older Trotting Mare of the Year.

Bee A Magician ended her racing career in 2016, earning \$339,750 with four wins, including the Yonkers Invitational Trot and the Mack Lobell Elitlopp Playoff.

Three-year-old **Sweet Lou** earned \$1,082,176 in 2012, finishing on the board in 15 of 20 starts. His major win was the Tattersalls Pace. In the following year, four-year-old **Sweet Lou** earned \$348,638 in 23 starts, including a victory in the Meadowlands Maturity.

Sweet Lou will also be inducted into the Harness Racing Living Horse Hall of Fame next July.

In 2014, 5-year-old **Sweet Lou** won 11 of 19 starts including a 10-win streak with 6 consecutive sub-1:48 times. Victories included the Ben Franklin in a world record 1:47f he shares with 2016 Horse of the Year Always B Miki and which still stands as the fastest Standardbred mile on a five-eighths mile track, William Haughton Memorial, U.S. Pacing Championship, Dan Patch Invitational and the Roll With Joe. **Sweet Lou** wrapped up his racing career by winning the \$500,000 TVG Pace. In addition to earning \$1,361,433, **Sweet Lou** was voted 2014 Dan Patch Pacer of the Year and Dan Patch Older Pacing Horse of the Year.

Polan named Fair Island Farm Caretaker of the Year

Courtney Polan, who works in the Norm Parker Stable based at The Meadows, has been named the recipient of the 2019 Caretaker of the Year Award sponsored by Fair Island Farm in conjunction with the U.S. Harness Writers Association (USHWA).

Polan, 27, has worked for Parker since October, 2014, joining the stable after a two-year stint working for Tim Pinske.

"This is amazing," said Polan, a Pennsylvania native who turned to harness racing after graduating with a degree in biology from Thiel College in Greenville, PA.

Polan, who owns a retired standardbred and quarter horse, currently takes care of eight horses in the Parker Stable, including the 2019 Meadows Horse of the Year Wild Wild Western.

Wild Wild Western is owned in part by Jacobs Creek Racing's Jeff Weaver, who nominated Polan for the Fair Island Caretaker of the Year Award.

"I have observed just how special Courtney is at developing a unique relationship with all of her charges," wrote Weaver. "Each horse garners her attention as though she was all theirs. Each receives full care, unique and individual attention and even, when called for, discipline."

Polan said one word in the dictionary describes her strength as a caretaker: Caring.

"I care. I care a lot," said Polan. "My biggest thing is that sometimes I care too much. I just love all of them. I don't have human kids yet, so they are my kids."

All caretakers in North America were eligible for the award, with nomination letters submitted detailing the skills and special qualities of the nominee.

A seven-member panel – all of whom were former caretakers themselves – selected Polan as the winner.

McClure reflects on memorable 2019 season

Sometime down the road when driver Bob McClure wants to reminisce about 2019, he knows what it will involve.

"A lot of replays," McClure said.

Get your popcorn ready.

McClure enjoyed numerous highlights in 2019, topped by his win with Forbidden Trade in the \$1 million Hambletonian Stakes final last August at The Meadowlands.

For the year, McClure won 229 races and a career-best \$4.67 million in purses despite missing a month in the spring because of a broken pelvis. He ranked third on the money list among Canadian drivers and saw his earnings increase for the sixth consecutive year.

He is a finalist, for the third time, for Canada's Driver of the Year. The winner will be announced Feb. 1 at the O'Brien Awards in Ontario.

"Third time's a charm, hopefully," said McClure, who is up against defending champ Louis-Philippe Roy.

Regardless of that result, McClure needs to clear space for a trophy. In December, the 29-year-old was named the U.S. Harness Writers Association's Rising Star. He will receive his award Feb. 23 at the Dan Patch Awards banquet at Rosen Shingle Creek in Orlando, FL.

McClure is the first Canadian to receive the honor since Scott Zeron in 2012.

"It was certainly a shock and I'm really grateful," McClure said of the honor. "It shows the significance of the Hambletonian, how much weight it carries with the voters. It's pretty neat to follow in the footsteps of other Canadians who have won that award."

McClure drove three O'Brien Award finalists in 2019: Forbidden Trade, older female trotter Emoticon Hanover, and 2-year-old male trotter Port Perry. All three horses were trained by Luc Blais and owned by Determination stable.

There was no question that Forbidden Trade's upset of Greenshoe in the Hambletonian, harness racing's premier race for 3-year-old trotters, led the list of memorable moments for McClure.

"I'd say that's the highlight of anybody's career if you're lucky enough to win it," McClure said.

In addition to winning the Hambletonian, Forbidden Trade and McClure captured the Ontario Sire Stakes championship and were second in the Yonkers Trot and Goodtimes Stakes.

Emoticon Hanover, who retired at the conclusion of her 6-year-old season in 2019, went out a winner with McClure when she won a preferred trot at Woodbine Mohawk Park in December. Port Perry was a two-time winner on the Ontario Sire Stakes circuit and finished second in the series final.

McClure also had multiple OSS victories with 3-year-old female pacer Powerful Chris, 2-year-old male trotter Threefiftytwo, and 2-year-old female pacer Off The Press. Other winners in the series with McClure were 3-year-old male pacer Best In Show, 2-year-old male pacer Examiner Hanover, and 2-year-old female pacer P L Notorious.

“The OSS here is a really great program,” McClure said. “I was the leading money-winner in it, so that shows you drove a lot of nice horses all the way across the whole Ontario circuit. I think that was the biggest part of the year for me. Between Forbidden Trade, Powerful Chris, a whole bunch of real nice (OSS) Gold horses I was lucky enough to drive, I think that’s what made the summer so fun.”

Powerful Chris provided McClure with another memorable night, although not in a win. She finished third, beaten only a neck, in the Fan Hanover Stakes at odds of 54-1. The filly is owned in part by McClure’s grandfather, John.

“That was pretty special,” McClure said. “He never had a horse in a race like that before, so to be that close with some of the top fillies in North America was a lot of fun. It was close to home.”

McClure, who led Canadian drivers in wins in 2016 and

2017, made the move from Canada’s “B” tracks to the main stage of the Woodbine-Mohawk circuit in December 2017.

“Things have happened a lot faster than I think anybody could have predicted,” McClure said. “Obviously, it’s beyond exceeded my expectations. I was lucky enough to pick up Determination, which was a huge boost. They have a lot of quality horses and every time they go to the track they’re going with a shot. It really puts your name out there, puts you on the map. I would attribute a lot of it to that.”

So, what does McClure do in 2020 for an encore?

“I just try to keep improving every year, year to year,” he said. “That’s my biggest goal. I think that will be tough to do this year, to top last year, but I’m excited.”


Entering the penultimate night of racing at Yonkers in the 2019 season, Jason Bartlett led George Brennan in the driver standings 423 wins to 420. The Dec. 16 program saw the drivers combine for six wins on the 11-race program and at the end of the night, Jason Bartlett extended his margin to four, leading with 427 victories.

However, Bartlett would be absent from the closing night program, Tues. Dec. 17 as he departed on a family vacation, never anticipating the driving title would be decided on the final night of a 2,657-race season. To that point, the two drivers had never spoken about the dash title. However, as Bartlett left the drivers’ room, the pair acknowledged their rivalry for the first time.

“Okay, I got you by four. Win four tomorrow and we’ll just end in a tie,” Bartlett told Brennan.

“Okay. Done,” Brennan responded.

The tongue-in-cheek exchange proved prophetic as the closing night program unfolded. Brennan won four of the first 10 races, tying the standings at 427 apiece. After each

victory, the Yonkers TV department displayed the standings on the track's simulcast feed and track announcer John Hernan narrated the update for the viewers.

"Yonkers had it on TV the last few nights. They were keeping count for us," Brennan said. "It was very exciting. I've been leading driver before, but this was the most exciting driving race I've been involved in. It was a lot of fun."

Brennan drove Lord Of Misrule from post three in the 11th race, the final heat of the season. Leading trainer Scott Di Domenico sent out the 8-year-old gelding who chased only his second seasonal win in his 31st start of the year.

"Bruce Saunders said to me, 'Do you like your chances in the last race?'" Brennan said. "I said, 'Well, he's 1-for-30 for the year. That says it all right there.'"

Lord Of Misrule raced along in third throughout, but lost ground in the stretch and finished fourth, seven lengths behind a 1:53.4 score by Knocking Around.

"(Lord Of Misrule) ended up getting a perfect trip, he sat third, I never had to pull him, but they went a really good mile in 1:53.4 and 1:53.4 kind of stretches him out in the summer anymore," Brennan said of the \$545,485-earner. "It was going to have to work out, it was going to have to line up perfectly for him. And it actually did and I didn't have enough horsepower."

With the final race complete, Brennan had four on the card as promised and shared the driving title with Bartlett.

"I just went about my business and that's how it ended," Brennan said. "It's a lot of work, a lot of dedication, good clients. It means a lot."

Bartlett enjoyed a lead from January through June as he focused solely on racing at the Hilltop. However, as New York Sire Stakes season ramped up through the late spring and summer, Bartlett's time was divided while Brennan stayed put at Yonkers. Bartlett and Brennan flip-flopped on the lead in July, but by September Brennan seized command with a double-digit advantage.

The race narrowed again in late fall, as Brennan's margin shrunk to eight wins by Nov. 1. By December, the drivers were in a tug of war. Brennan was sure his scheduled vacation in December would crush his chances.

"He was creeping back up there pretty quickly," Brennan

said. "But then, I honestly didn't think it was going to be close when I was taking four days off in December. I thought he would have a comfortable lead after that. I got lucky, got some good mounts, good post positions, and things worked out."

Brennan's approach to the contest, much like his opponent's, was to block out the race as much as possible.

"You can't really think about it. You just have to go about your business and try to stay safe and win races," Brennan said. "There was something going on with the driving title, but in a sense, it's secondary because you still have to get the job done, you still have to get the most amount of money for your owners and trainers you're driving for. That's the number one priority there."

Considering memorable horses or victories on the season, Brennan zeroed in on DW's NY Yank. The 11-year-old Dilbert Hanover gelding has earned 58 wins and \$1.5 million in 200 starts. His most recent score came with Brennan in the second race Closing Night, a \$17,000 overnight in which DW's NY Yank aired by 2 easy lengths. It was the pair's 82nd start and 25th win together.

"Some horses I really enjoy driving. Some of those old horses for Burke, like DW's NY Yank, he's one of my favorites. I enjoy driving those older horses like that," Brennan said. "I've been driving him now since he was 4 years old. He tries hard. He's definitely not what he was anymore, but he's just a lot of fun to drive. He's tailor-made for a half-mile track."

Although the spotlight was on the drivers for the final few weeks of the racing season, Brennan pointed out that the drivers only comprise a small piece of the puzzle and expressed gratitude for the other hardworking individuals who hand over the lines for two minutes each week.

"I just want to thank all the trainers and owners and caretakers that look after and train the horses, because I can't do it without them. A big thank you to them," Brennan said.

U.S. harness racing wagering and purses up in 2019

Total handle, purses, wagering per race and per betting interest in the United States all increased while the number of race days decreased slightly in 2019 compared to 2018.

Total wagering increased by \$48,525,862 (3.53 per cent) from \$1,376,360,696 in 2018 to \$1,424,886,558 in 2019.

On average, the amount bet per race in 2019 was \$39,991, a 4.54 per cent increase from \$38,253 the year before, and the average wagered per betting interest increased from \$4,850 to \$5,008 in 2019, a 3.26 per cent gain.

Total purses distributed in 2019 were \$439,546,019, which was a \$10,125,350 (2.36 per cent) increase from the \$429,420,669 in 2018.

Each of the above economic indicators showed increases despite a 1.33 per cent decrease of 46 race days to 3,424 in 2019 compared to 3,470 in 2018.

Western Fair sets all-time handle record, nearly reaches \$800,000

The 2019 season at The Raceway at Western Fair District in London, ON concluded with the highest all-sources handle for a single card in the history of The Raceway.

Patrons pushed \$794,720 through the windows on New Year's Eve over the 10-race card, with an average just shy of \$80,000 wagered per race, also a record. The previous record

handle was \$765,685 over 16 races.

"New Year's Eve's record handle was a fantastic end to 2019, and a great way to cap off our fall meet," said director of racing Rob Lumsden. "The Raceway would like to thank our horseplayers, horsepeople and dedicated Raceway team for all of their support. We look forward to continuing the momentum with all of your support in 2020 and beyond."

The records didn't stop there.

The month of December produced the highest wagering month ever at The Raceway.

The 13 cards produced an "all-sources" betting total of \$5,841,958.02, a 67 per cent increase over 2018's gross total of \$3,496,890. Ten of the 13 cards reached over \$400,000 in wagering.

The Raceway is also pleased to announce that wagering numbers were up significantly since the fall meet began.

The 2019 fall meet, which began on Oct. 4, featured 38 race cards and an "all-sources" betting total of \$12,659,149.09, a 22.1 per cent increase over 2018.

The average per-race handle of \$31,334.53 showed a 23.3 per cent increase over the 2018 average of \$25,403.79.

The track's schedule for this meet is now four days per week: Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays with a 6:15 p.m. first-race post time and Fridays beginning at 6:55 p.m.

Amount bet on Big M races up significantly, wagering on imported signals declines

The Meadowlands 2019 handle was a mixed bag. The amount bet on Meadowlands races was up significantly while the wagering on imported signals at the facility continued to decline.

The amount wagered on The Meadowlands exported signal swelled to \$216,983,907 over 90 dates for an average of \$2.4 million, a 26 per cent increase over the 2018 total of \$172,445,226 (86 dates / average \$2 million) resulting in a revenue gain of slightly less than \$2 million year over year.

Per race handle was up six per cent at \$186,573 vs \$175,071.

The 2019 handle on Meadowlands live races bet in the building was at \$17,554,967 (average \$195,055), a seven per cent increase over the 2018 figure.

It is clear that the catalyst was increased purses, spurred by a \$6 million supplement endowed to The Meadowlands by New Jersey legislators, resulting in more horses to race and in turn more races and fuller fields.

The number of races (1163 / 12.9 per card) increased by 15 per cent, up 178 over 2018 (985 / 11.5). The number of

horses that raced at The Meadowlands in 2019 was 10,330 (up nearly 20 per cent over 2018) for an average field size of 8.88 vs 2018 totals of 8,307 horses or 8.43 per race.

However, the wagering on imported signals continues to trend downward. The 2019 total bet on imports of \$127,579,985 was nine per cent lower than 2018 over a like number of dates. Unfortunately, that nine per cent dip offset the gains made on the Meadowlands live races.

The import decline is largely as a result of better convenience. Each passing year, a larger percentage of the simulcast wagering is drawn to the various Advance Deposit Wagering (ADW) platforms and other remote options rather than traveling to The Meadowlands to bet on the races.

The Meadowlands has been granted 92 race dates for 2020 featuring nearly \$14 million in stakes purses. This season will present differently with live racing continuing through Sept. 19 then dark until the Fall/Winter meet begins on Nov. 27.

2020 is off to a promising beginning with the first \$3 million handle card already in the books. It is our hope that the trend on live will continue to grow.

Northfield's 'Flying Turns' (1964-1968, 1979-1981 and 1987). However, his success did not end in Cleveland. He has a flock of Windsor Raceway championships, as well as being a chart-topper at Raceway Park, Wolverine Raceway and Scioto Downs.

Bookmyer, 78, is synonymous with notable horses such as Adios Skipper, Bench Mark, Durango Kid, Hambooger, Kissing Almahurst, Spastic, Set The Trap, Silent Syd and Waycount Hanover.

According to official records of the USTA, Bookmyer drove 3,316 winners with earnings over \$8.4 million. Included in his win tally are five Ohio Sire Stakes Championships with Beacon-Star (1990), Set The Trap (1986), Good Motor (1978), Hambooger (1984) and It's A Date (1985).

Bookmyer will be honored at the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association banquet in Columbus, OH on Jan. 18.

He has been president and director of the Maine Standardbred Owners Association, and a Director of the Maine Harness Horsemen's Association.

Don's service to harness racing also extends to the national and North American level. He is the vice-chairman of the United States Trotting Association and is District chairman for District 9 (New England). Marean's service has previously been recognized with the Distinguished Service Award for the Maine Harness Horsemen's Association and with an Appreciation Award from Harness Horsemen International.

"Don serves as the vanguard of harness racing in the great state of Maine," Shawn Wiles said in making the announcement. "He has fought long and hard in Maine politics for many years to protect the interests of our sport and its horsemen throughout the state."

Sorella is a high-powered marketing executive who has enjoyed success at the uppermost levels of North American harness racing, starting with Little Brown Jug winner Vegas Vacation. His most recent success has been Jimmy Freight, who is going to stud in 2020 after winning \$1.3 million, being a major factor in the Ontario Sire Stakes, and then progressing to high competitiveness against the fastest pacers in the sport.

Jimmy Freight also gives a good example of Sorella's ability to cross-leverage to harness racing's advantage – Sorella used Facebook and other cutting-edge technologies to create quite a Jimmy Freight Fan Club, with seasoned and new fans alike following the horse. The humanitarian side of Sorella showed when he was one of the leaders after Classy Lane Stables suffered a horrendous fire in 2016, in which 43 horses perished, helping to raise funds for horsemen whose

careers were literally wiped out by the devastation.

USHWA President Wiles notes: "Adriano's skill set of being social media-savvy, combined with his promotional prowess and outside-the-box thinking, showcases our great sport in a refreshing and positive light, geared to the general audience and perhaps even more importantly showcasing the sport to our younger fan base."

Marean and Sorella will be honored at USHWA's annual Dan Patch Awards Banquet, celebrating the best and brightest of harness racing in the past year. Meadowlands 2020 stakes information

The Meadowlands is releasing pertinent information on its 2020 stakes which will offer total purses in the neighborhood of \$14 million.

The marquee Grand Circuit stakes for older horses will have an important change in the racing conditions. The number of top money-winning horses in 2019-2020 accepted for those events will decrease from 12 to 11 and the distance will be kept to one mile regardless of the number of starters.

The races affected by this change are the Arthur Cutler, John Cashman and Dr. John Steele Memorials on the trot and the WR Houghton and Sam McKee Memorial FFA paces, Golden Girls and Lady Liberty FFA mare paces and Mistletoe Shalee for 3-year-old filly pacers.

The Kindergarten Classic Series for freshman trotters and pacers will also race five legs for an increased purse of \$20,000 each, all at The Meadowlands starting in July with the \$250,000e finals set for Sept. 18.

The Reynolds and Tompkins-Geers Grand Circuit stakes for 2-year-olds have been moved from Tioga Downs to The Meadowlands in 2020. The dates for the freshman New Jersey Sires Stakes have been moved to later in the summer with the finals set for Aug. 21.

The Tompkins-Geers pacing stakes for 3-year-old pacing colts and fillies will also be raced at The Meadowlands and have been placed to provide a start between the Meadowlands Pace and Cane Pace.

The popular Miss Versatility series for older mare trotters will offer five \$40,000 legs this season. The stakes series will launch at Woodbine Mohawk Park in late May then shift to The Meadowlands for the other four legs from July through September. The \$100,000e finals will again be on Jug Day at the Delaware, Ohio County Fair.

The Meadowlands Standardbred Championship Meet will close on Sept. 19 due to the Fall Thoroughbred Meet taking over use of the main track from Oct. 2 through Nov. 21. The standardbreds will return on Nov. 27 with the TVG Championships and Freshman Fall Final Four slated for Saturday, Nov. 28 on a night boasting \$3 million in purses.

In The Arsenal back at Leatherstocking in New York

In The Arsenal p,2,1:49.4; 3,1:49.1, the 8-year-old, million-dollar winning fast son of American Ideal, will stand his second season at Leatherstocking Equine in New York. His stud fee remains at \$2,500.

Returning breeders from 2019, whose mares produced a live foal in 2020 by In The Arsenal, will be eligible to book the same mare, or another mare, at a discounted rate of \$2,000.

In addition, at the conclusion of the 2020 breeding season, the syndicate will hold a Facebook live drawing to pick one successful breeder where the stud fee will be free for one lucky person, drawn by lot.

In The Arsenal earned \$1,035,898 racing against some of the fastest pacers on the planet, capturing 18 wins lifetime, finding victory in a nearly a third of all his starts.

Well-known for his blistering speed at two, winning a leg of the Bluegrass at the Red Mile in 1:49.4 as a freshman, he also won the Lawrence Sheppard Memorial at Yonkers. In fact, in a span of five weeks, he won both his 2-year-old stakes at Lexington, the Historic at Chester, and the Matron at Dover.

This was followed by a brutal 10-hole brush to the lead and cutting the :26.3, :54.3, 1:23 fractions in his Breeders Crown elimination, beaten just a length for third in 1:50.3. The following week, In The Arsenal finished second in the Breeders Crown Final, again from post 10, despite being interfered with in the early going.

In The Arsenal was then immersed in one of the toughest group of 3-year-old pacing colts in recent memory. Not only was he born the same year as 2015 Horse of the Year Wiggle It Jiggle, but In The Arsenal also competed against Freaky Feet Pete, Artspeak, Dude's The Man, Lost For Words, Dealt A Winner and Wakizashi Hanover.

In The Arsenal defeated several of the aforementioned pacing colts winning his elimination of the Meadowlands Pace in 1:49.1, stepping away from the field with an incredible :25.3 last quarter.

Several weeks prior he won an elim. and Final of the Art Rooney at Yonkers, his elimination of the North America Cup at Mohawk, as well as a div. of the Bluegrass at the Red Mile in October. Despite locking bridles with some of the gamest individuals of the decade, In The Arsenal still finished the season with over half a million in earnings and was 1-2-3 in 11 of 17 starts in 2015, with seven wins.

Bill Bercury earns UTRS title at The Meadows

New Year's morning in Slippery Rock, southwestern Pennsylvania. The weak early light barely picks up the two figures approaching a barn. Horsenappers? Holiday revelers hung over and lost?

The barn door bursts open, and Bill Bercury and his wife Renee shower their horses with treats, then serenade them with a chorus of "Happy Birthday."

Most in the standardbred game know that all horses are assigned a birthday of Jan. 1, but how many horsemen and horsewomen go out of their way to celebrate that day with their horses? The Bercurys do, and that affection and concern may be one of the reasons for their enduring success.

Their success never was more evident than in 2019, when Bill Bercury topped all trainers (in the Less Than 300 Starts category) with an eye-popping .580 Universal Trainer Rating (UTR). Andrew Adamczyk was second at .524; no one else topped .500. In 123 starts, the Bercury stable rolled up 51 wins and earned \$617,870, an average of more than \$5,023 per start.

The Bercurys' program is to purchase proven equine commodities — "We buy damn nice horses," Bill says — pay fair market value for them and train them to even greater heights. They're limited by stall space to six horses, but each was outstanding in 2019 performing at The Meadows and sometimes Northfield Park. The Bercurys' six-pack includes:

- Touchamatic, Older Pacing Mare of the Year at The Meadows and winner of 18 of 36 starts last year. "A big part of our success was having her lead the pack," Bercury says.
- Barn Girl, an 8-year-old trotting mare who's won exactly half her 132 lifetime starts and \$860,478.
- Carolina Beach, a consistent Preferred pacer who banked nearly \$150,000 in 2019.
- Major Nemesis, a terror at Northfield before being

shelved with an injury.

- Blue Ivy, at 4, the youngest of the contingent and perhaps the one with the most upward potential. The filly pacer closed the year with a five-race winning streak and \$131,537 in seasonal earnings.

- Wind Of The North, a 10-year-old trotting millionaire who missed 10 months with an injury. He's set to qualify Thursday.

Bercury credits his assistant, Mike McDowell, with getting the most from that talented bunch.

"He's very good with the horses, and he's very good about noticing the things that are bothering them. He never says, 'Don't worry about it, it's nothing.' He takes care of it."

Bercury also cites the impact of Aaron Merriman, who was aboard for most of the Bercury stable's starts en route to his third consecutive thousand-win season — a harness racing first.

"We have the best driver in the sport driving our horses — how many points is that worth?"

But perhaps the most important factor in the Bercurys' success is that, while they're savvy business owners, they treat their horses with compassion.

"As long as you operate in a dignified manner, your horses learn to trust other horses, and they learn to trust you," Bercury says. "As long as you don't violate that trust, they become comfortable with you. That's so important to the horse's attitude."

Other western Pennsylvania horsemen fared well in the UTR Fewer Than 300 Starts category, as Robert Rougeaux III ranked 8 at .432 while Mike Palone checked in at 21 with a .397 UTR. As for the year just begun, Bercury is realistic about his chances of successfully defending his title.

"Let's face it, .580 is nosebleed territory, and you can't expect to be there every year," he says. "But I expect to have an outstanding year."

The 2020 season at The Meadows kicks off Monday with a 13-race card that begins at 1:05 PM.
