First thoughts on harness racing's first graded stakes list

The list is a good start, but improvements should be made for future years.

Earlier this week, the much-anticipated list of graded stake races in harness racing was unveiled for 2025. An idea that was in the works for decades, harness racing will now join the rest of the international racing community in having stakes races graded to signify each race's importance.

For the inaugural list, grading for the stake races were determined nearly exclusively by purse amount. And while purse amounts are certainly a way to provide standardization for the committee as a baseline, using that as an overly simplistic criteria alone, doesn't show a complete picture of all stakes.

Where my own mind starts is figuring out the purpose of grading the stakes races. If it's to assign more value to a horse either in future race sales or in breeding through winning races at the highest graded levels – which I believe is the intent – then there needs to be added importance to races based on historical nature and corresponding prestige. One only has to glance over the graded stakes list for a minute and it's apparent where races that have clear sire-making significance are rated lower than others with far less post-race meaning.

An easy example of this can be seen in the open pace division. Here, the William Haughton Memorial hosted at The Meadowlands since 1994 is listed as a G2. Unquestionably, and even more-so when compared to where other stakes in the division have been designated, the Haughton is a signature race for open pacers and should have G1 status. The list of winners in the stake is a who's-who of the very best open pacers over the last 30 years and was further highlighted when it was the race of the year in 2022 when Bulldog Hanover broke the 1:46

time barrier. But, presumably, because the purse of the race has dropped from its high of \$702,000 in 2010 to last year's purse of \$428,000 it's not listed as a G1.

The Haughton as a G2 places it on par with all other G2 stakes listed in the open pace division, including for example, the Aria Invitational, a newer race hosted at Yonkers as part of the Yonkers International Trot undercard. There's just no comparison of top to bottom between the horses in that race and the horses in not only the Haughton, but other G2 and G3 designated

races throughout the division. It's not meant to disparage horses who have competed in the Aria, as nice horses have won it the past two years, and I'll take it a step further by including the G1-rated Borgata series in this point too – not only is the competition lesser quality but these simply aren't races that will increase a horse's value the same way that winning against true summertime FFA horses in 1:47 will do.

There are similar misses that could be debated throughout all the other divisions and I won't belabor the point and go through every one, but here are just a couple of others that stood out to me right off the bat.

In the older trotting mare division, there are only seven total graded stakes in all and the only other G1 in addition to the Breeders Crown is the Dayton Oaks. It's been running for three years now with a purse of \$250,000 and was won the last two years by Jiggy Jog S. I guess you could argue if the race at Dayton carries a true G1 significance, but the larger issue is when comparing it to the Six Pack stake in the division which is a G3. Like the Dayton Oaks, the Six Pack has been won the last two years by Jiggy Jog S and was won before that by Bella Bellini and prior to that Atlanta. The list goes on all the way back to Buck I St Pat in 2009. Clearly, the Six Pack carries just as much significance if not more than the Dayton Oaks. But purely because of purse mechanisms, one is incorrectly rated two grades higher than the other. As an aside, the list reveals how few stakes opportunities there are for older mare trotters.

Additionally, there are inconsistencies throughout the list. In some divisions, the Matron stakes at Dover is considered a G3 and in some cases it's considered a G2. Same thing with the FanDuel Championships. In two divisions it's a G2 and in two other divisions it's a G3 (those races should all be at absolute minimum a G2, by the way).

What also makes little sense is how races were distributed by grade within each division. Meaning, neither the 2-year-old open pacers or 2-year-old open trotters have any G2's whatsoever – how is that possible? It's either G1 or G3, and I think that points out another shortcoming of using purses only where if you're a 2-year-old male there are zero G2s to race in. I can suggest at least one easy fix. In the 2-year-old open trot, the William Wellwood should be a G2 and not a G1. This race in recent years has served as a precursor to the Mohawk Million which is correctly a G1, but it would make more sense for the Wellwood to be a G2 to start to have the races distributed more evenly across the grades.

Despite what I think should be a downgrade to the Wellwood, races in the list at Woodbine Mohawk Park, along with The Meadowlands are understated across the board. Winning major stakes at these tracks carry more significance than their current graded designations.

If there is a direct suggestion that I'd offer to the committee, it would be to go deeper in future evaluations. Respectfully, it requires no harness racing knowledge to categorize races by purse amounts, as was done here – anyone could have done

that. A highly-credentialed group makes up the committee, and subsequent revisions to the grading system should leverage their industry expertise and take into account the historical nature of the races based on the quality of horses who have competed in and won each of the stakes.

Lastly, what the list does do is formally kill the notion of a harness racing Triple Crown. On the trotting side, one of the three races is listed as a G2. One the pacing side, two out of the three Triple Crown races are listed as only G2s, with only the Little Brown Jug listed as the sole G1.

I've written here in the past on how harness racing's Triple Crowns have lost relevance and any real meaning, and this list proves that. But now that there is a formal grading system, perhaps this can be the beginning of a brand-new triple crown system and an opportunity to re-invent what it looks like. One that consists exclusively of agreed upon G1s, that are coordinated together and will provide real incentives for horses to pursue a complete triple crown accomplishment.

The graded stakes list was a needed addition to harness racing and while imperfect in its first go-around, hopefully it will be able to evolve and serve the industry well.

First-ever harness racing Graded Stakes list for 2025 announced

For the first time ever, harness racing in the U.S. and Canada will have a schedule of Graded and Restricted Graded Stakes races in 2025. The list of Grade 1, 2 and 3 was announced Monday (Jan. 6).

During the inaugural year of the program, there will be a total of 171 Graded Stakes, including 47 Grade 1, 47 Grade 2 and 77 Grade 3 races.

Graded Stakes for the harness racing industry had been a topic of discussion for more than 20 years when, at the request of the major sales companies and breeders, with the U.S. Trotting Association supporting the project, a Graded Stakes committee was created in 2023 to address it.

“It is gratifying to see the industry come together to promote and clarify the relative quality of the sport’s most visible and coveted races,” said Mike Tanner, chief executive officer of the USTA. “The program gives both horsemen and fans a standard against which comparisons can be made, which is a good thing. The Association is proud to help facilitate the Graded Stakes committee’s important mission.”

The purpose of the committee was to provide those breeders, owners, trainers, and standardbred horsemen a reliable guide to the relative quality of standardbreds by identifying the U.S. and Canadian races whose recent renewals consistently attract the highest quality of competition.

The Graded Stakes committee consists of 11 members that is comprised of eight representatives selected by the USTA, two from Standardbred Canada and one from the Hambletonian Society. Of the eight from the USTA, three will be racetrack representatives, two breeders, two from sales companies, and one at-large member.

The original committee established grades using purses and a points calculation system from the prior four years (2021-24) and then adjusting for the 2025 races.

Three-year terms for committee members will be staggered with a limit of three terms. Terms commence on the date of the USTA board of directors annual meeting and expire Aug. 1 of the committee member’s third year.

The chair of the committee, currently USTA vice chairperson Mark Loewe, is selected by the full committee and serves a two-year term.

The original committee members were scheduled to serve their terms until 2027 through a staggered process. In addition to Loewe, the current members are David Reid, Mike Klau, Mark McKelvie, Steve Jones, Rich Mattei, Seth Rosenfeld, Steve Stewart, Chris Antonacci, Darryl Kaplan, and Pete Szymanski.

To be considered for committee membership, one must have previously served as a guest observer for at least one grading session.

From 2025 on, Graded Stakes will be included in yearling sales catalog pedigree pages. The grades displayed will begin with the 2021 racing season.

GRADED STAKES REQUIREMENTS

While there are exceptions at the discretion of the committee, following are the purse levels necessary for grading consideration:

Male

Grade 1 – \$350,000 and up

Grade 2 – \$175,000 – \$349,999

Grade 3 – \$75,000 – \$174,499

Female

Grade 1 – \$250,000 and up

Grade 2 – \$125,000 – \$249,999

Grade 3 – \$75,000 – \$124,999

In addition, invitational races with a minimum purse of \$100,000 can be considered for grading.

RESTRICTED RACES

State or province restricted races, which exclude horses based upon stallion residency or mare foaling location that meet purse requirements are also eligible for a second tier of grading.

Initially, only Sire Stakes finals can be graded with other restricted stakes races that are not Sire Stakes finals being given consideration for grading at a later date.

Restricted race finals purse values regardless of sex are as follows:

R3 – \$75,000 – \$149,999

R2 – \$150,000 – \$224,999

R1 – \$225,000 – and up

The sky's the limit for Rising Star winner Brett Beckwith

Driver Brett Beckwith being named Dan Patch Rising Star Award winner for 2024 came as little surprise, especially since he finished second in the voting the previous year, just one tally behind 2023 recipient Jay Hochstetler.

One person who saw the writing on the wall was Hall of Famer Wally Hennessey.

"When I saw Brett Beckwith – which was a no brainer for him to get the Rising Star – I texted him right away, and I said to him, 'I don't know what the plan is, but it would be an honor for me to sit at the table with you that night,'" Hennessey said.

Hennessey is close to Beckwith's family, especially his dad, Mark.

"Mark's family to me," Hennessey said. "I've driven tons of horses for Mark, but it's not a business relationship, it's a friendship. So, I've known Brett Beckwith since he came out of the cradle."

Hennessey talked about watching Brett grow up.

“As a young boy, he’d ride the golf cart around delivering egg sandwiches from the kitchen, at eight or 10 years old, and he’d drop by me and say, ‘You want your egg sandwich today, Wally?’ and I said, ‘I don’t really want one,’ but he wanted me to get one because I always gave him a \$5 tip,” Hennessey said with a laugh.

Hennessey, who owned the first horse Brett ever jogged, said there’s a lot to like about the young horseman, who turns 22 on Jan. 22.

“First off, the greatest quality he has is his respect and just who he is with people,” Hennessey said. “Those are his biggest attributes. That’s going to take him a long way. But a lot of people have that and don’t have much talent. He has talent and he has horsemanship. He has the whole package. I can’t sing his praises high enough, I really can’t.

“And then the other thing is, for his age, we’re talking a kid 21 years old, how grounded he is at that young of an age. You know, here he is, a young boy, and he’s already investing back into the business with horses. I mean, he’s investing his money back into the business... as a kid at 21, that’s quite a package.”

Brett’s star has risen pretty far pretty fast, but not without a certain amount of sacrifice as the young reinsman acknowledged he sometimes feels there’s not enough free time in his life right now.

“Yup, a lot of times, but when I do have down time, I end up just wishing I was racing anyway,” Brett said.

The Saratoga County, NY, resident, whose first full year of driving was in 2021, racked up the miles on and off the track in 2024, making for a career year where he finished third nationally in dash wins behind Aaron Merriman and Jason Bartlett.

“I mean, that was a fun run,” Brett said of finishing third. “I was really trying to try to grab the second spot, because I knew keeping up with Merriman was almost going to be statistically impossible. I give him all the credit in the world. No one understands that kind of schedule that he puts through year in, year out for the last 10 years. It’s unbelievable. But I was really

trying to catch Jason. I kept reminding him that I was going to catch him, but unfortunately, I didn’t get the chance to.”

Brett also won his first driving title at Saratoga Raceway, and a title at Plainridge that ended in a tie with veteran reinsman Bruce Ranger. Brett may have finished 12th in the standings at The Meadowlands, but he had fewer starts than all but one driver above him.

According to Brett, racing at The Meadowlands is a bit of a family tradition.

“Well, it was always a place that my mom’s side of the family raced, like my grandfather Jerry [Silverman] and then my uncle Richie [Silverman],” Brett said. “So, when I was like 16 or so and I went to the races, and I saw my grandfather watch a couple of his horses there, and just watched the races, it made me change my perspective maybe on that track as a whole.

“At the end of the day, it’s still where almost 80 per cent of Grand Circuit events are held. And if you ever want to be a Grand Circuit driver, you have to know how to drive that track.”

Brett said his views of wanting to be a Grand Circuit driver have changed a little from last year to this year.

“Last year, I’d always say to myself that the end all, be all goal is to be a Grand Circuit driver,” Brett said. “And now, in the last year or so, it’s made me realize that if it’s going to happen, it’s going to happen, and if it doesn’t, it doesn’t. You can still make a good living doing anything, as long as you love it. But I mean, hopefully, it happens one day, but if it doesn’t, I’m still content with my life the way it is now.”

According to Brett, racing at The Meadowlands puts him in a better position to, hopefully, at some point, get those Grand Circuit drives.

“I tell everyone, at the end of the day, when I race at Saratoga and Plainridge, there are only so many people watching those tracks,” Brett said. “They may see on the USTA or Facebook that you won four or five races, which is good and it’s good publicity, but at the end of the day, people see you at The Meadowlands. Even when someone’s at home eating dinner with their family, they have it on RTN, if they’re at a party or some big gathering, it’s on the TV, and it’s always The Meadowlands. So, you know, no matter what time of the year it is, it’s always a pretty watched track and a pretty heavily bet track, so people are watching you, and you just get more recognition. One win at The Meadowlands is almost equivalent to three or four wins somewhere else.”

Brett said that there are many to thank for helping him get to where he is today.

“I’d be a dummy to not say both of my parents, my mom and my dad,” Brett said. “I mean, they’re literally one of the biggest reasons I am where I am today. In my opinion, if you don’t have a great support system and great parents behind you, it’s hard to make it very far.”

In terms of support, Brett also mentioned his friend, Carl, who is not in the business, but gives him a chance to vent if needed, as well as Saratoga trainer Gary Levine and the aforementioned Hennessey.

“Gary Levine always called me when I was on my way home from racing, whether it’s at midnight or 3 a.m.” Brett said. “He was always keeping me up and awake, and he helps me, he helps me a lot.”

“[Wally’s] been someone who’s been there from the beginning to where my career is now. I’ve actually gotten a chance to go to dinner a pretty good amount with him this summer, and he’s just always a great person to talk to. And he’s always great for advice.”

“I’ve been fortunate enough to have a great support system by me pretty much all the time, but it’s taken me almost until really this year, to fully learn how to turn the page a lot better than I used to. And I used to get really upset with myself, never at anyone else, but I was always constantly upset with myself after a race, and I’ve gotten slightly better, as I’ve developed as a driver. But I mean, at the end of the day, people wouldn’t put you in pressure situations if you weren’t good enough to handle them.”

Hennessey said that Brett is wise beyond his years.

“First off, the greatest quality [Beckwith] has is his respect and just who he is with people. Those are his biggest attributes. That’s going to take him a long way. But a lot of people have that and don’t have much talent. He has talent and he has horsemanship. He has the whole package. I can’t sing his praises high enough.”

“Everybody always wonders, how does a racehorse like a Foiled Again or a Moni Maker ever become what they are?” Hennessey said. “They were born that way. You know what I mean? You can’t make those kinds of horses; they were born that way. Well, Brett Beckwith was born to do what he’s doing now. A lot of us were born that way but at his stage of his game, where he is and where I was [at that age], it was two separate universes.”

“To be honest with you, I don’t think anybody could have foreseen this, or predicted it, or even had any inclination that this rise that he’s on could have possibly risen like a meteor that quick. And this is what a guy that’s been in the business my whole life is going to tell you. I don’t think you’ve seen anything yet. That’s my opinion. Hey, listen, the sky’s the limit. You’ve heard that saying before, the sky’s the limit, but the sky is definitely the limit for this kid.”

Some fun Hambletonian facts to start the new year

With only 30 weeks until the 100th Hambletonian, it's never too early to start sharing some facts.

THREE IS A MAGIC NUMBER

Any guesses who was the only driver to make \$1 million in the Hambletonian from just his first three drives? Ray Schnittker, who was third with Armbro Plato (1997) for \$125,333, fourth with Armbro Trick (2000) for \$128,400, and \$750,000 for winning with Deweycheatumnhowe (2008), for a total of \$1,003,733.

SWEET 16

John Campbell has a unique trio here. He's been on the board 16 times in the Hambletonian (6-5-5), led North America in earnings 16 times, and led the Meadowlands driver standings 16 times. All all-time bests.

NOT ALL ABOARD

Brian Sears, who made his Hambletonian debut in 2003, had not been on the board prior to 2009 with his record-setting Muscle Hill score. He had three fourth-place finishes.

UNDER/OVER

Only Mike Lachance has won a Meadowlands Hambletonian paying less than \$3 (Self Possessed in 1999 paid \$2.80) and more than \$50 (Amigo Hall paid \$57 in 2003).

TWO-TIMERS

Caretakers doubling up in the Hambletonian: Charlie Coleman with Ayres (1964) and Timothy T (1970), and Randy Beekman with Mack Lobell (1987) and Park Avenue Joe (1989). An honorable

mention to Shelly Grieco with Market Share (2012) who helped out with Marion Marauder just four years later.

I WASNT THERE

Three huge impact stallions in the Hambletonian did not participate in it themselves: Balanced Image (1981), Valley Victory (1989), and Walner (2017). All three were aiming for the big dance and raced within a month of the Hambletonian.

MILLER TIME?

Is this the year David Miller breaks through in the Hambletonian? Is this the year, his final one racing regularly at The Meadowlands, that he achieves Hambletonian glory and sets the all-time money mark?

HAUL OF A GUY

In 2008, Ray Schnittker also finished third, in the Deweycheatumnhowe year, with Make It Happen (driven by Dan Dube). It was \$930,000 combined for his stable. That total remains the high-water mark for any trainer in any trotting event.

WON AND DONE

Bonefish remains the only Hambletonian winner (1975), never to race again.

NO PRESSURE

Shiaway St Pat won the first Meadowlands Hambletonian in 1981. The only Grand Circuit stake he was eligible for. He returned to The Meadowlands April 6, 1988 at age 10 and actually led the post parade that year for the Hambletonian won by Armbro Goal.

TWENTY SOMETHING HAUGHTON FAMILY STYLE

Peter debuted at 22 finishing fifth with Quick Pay, Tommy at 23 was second with Final Score and dad Billy at 26, was 18th with Crossbow in 1949.

THE OLD 1-2

Only Bob McClure can say the following, "I was first [Forbidden Trade in 2019] and second [Highland Kismet in 2024] in my first two Hambletonian drives."

GEHRIG, DIMAGGIO, TETRICK?

READY FOR CASH

Sire Ready Cash made quite a splash as a newcomer to this event with a second and third in 2020 with Ready For Moni and Back Of The Neck, respectively.

APTLY NAMED

Manchego or should we say Man-chego. Her 1:50 flat Hambletonian Oaks score in 2018 was a full second faster than any of the boys did in the Hambletonian that day. Mets Hall was second to Atlanta timed in 1:51 flat.

BAD SANDWICH

Scott Zeron won the 2016 and 2018 Hambletonians with Marion Marauder and Atlanta. In between? A squeeze play in the first turn as the 5-2 second choice losing all chance with International Moni.

YOU ALWAYS REMEMBER YOUR FIRST TIME

Three straight years saw a first-time driver in the classic win it: Trevor Ritchie with Yankee Paco (2000), Stefan Melander with Scarlet Knight (2001) and Eric Ledford with Chip Chip Hooray (2002).

BACK-TO-BACK

Pine Chip was Trotter of the Year back-to-back in 1993-94, and then sired Hambletonian winners Scarlet Knight and Chip Chip Hooray, back-to-back in 2001-02.

THREE DIMENSIONAL

Per Eriksson won the Hambletonian with Giant Victory (1991) and Alf Palema (1992). What has gotten kind of lost is that he also trained the 1993 winner, American Winner, as a 2-year-old, meaning in 1992 there were two Hambletonian winners in his barn at the same time!

Italy's Golden Gio upsets in Paris

Saturday's (Jan. 4) \$125,000 Prix Maurice de Gheest for 3-year-old colts ended with a stakes record set by an Italian-bred horse.

Golden Gio (Face Time Bourbon), trained by Marco Smorgon and driven by Matthieu Abrivard, could rest in position third over pretty much the whole race and when Abrivard asked for more speed at the top of the stretch, Golden Gio easily disarmed the opponents in front of him.

A mile rate of 1:57.3 over 1.3 miles meant a new stakes record and Golden Gio is a future hope for Ecurie Bivans, well known owners behind horses like Vivid Wise As, Face Time Bourbon and Frank Gio.

The fillies battled in the \$125,000 Prix Gelinotte on Sunday (Jan. 5) afternoon and Jean-Michel Bazire gave a perfect trip

to **Melba du Gers** (Prodigious), who could profit on a journey behind leading favorite Magic America. Racing room appeared in the stretch and Melba du Gers sprinted to a safe win in a mile rate of 2:00.4 over 1.3 miles.

Ecurie Bivans' success continued when earlier mentioned 4-year-old **Frank Gio** (Face Time Bourbon) held strong finisher Lombok Jiel behind him in the finish in \$125,000 Prix Charles Tiercelin for 4-year-olds. Frank Gio was pushed to the front position with a half mile to go and driver Matthieu Abrivard concentrated on not giving racing room to pocket sitter Lombok Jiel too early and his tactics proved to be right. Frank Gio won in a mile rate of 1:59.4 over 1.6 miles.

Favorite **Jack Tonic** (Charly du Noyer) kept his chasers behind him in Sunday's \$100,000 Prix de Lille and Thierry Duvaldestin's trotter has fought against some of the very best horses in the French J-crop throughout his career. It looks like he can hold on and develop even more among older competitors during the winter.

More France, but this time in the southern part, in Cagnes-sur-Mer, where the \$125,000 Prix de la Cote d'Azur was held on Thursday (Jan. 9). Nine-year-old gelding **Gino Viva** (Sun Ceravin) did a great job capturing the win for Gabriele Gelormini. Gino Viva attacked three-wide at the backstretch and landed first over with a half mile to go. Already at the end of the last turn, before the long homestretch in Cagnes-sur-Mer, Gino Viva got the advantage of the race and he danced to a safe win in a mile rate of 2:00.2 over 1.7 miles.

Ampia Mede Sm, Don Fanucci Zet, Inmarosa and Happy And Lucky are the horses in the Prix de Belgique that are next in line for entering the Prix d'Amérique by earnings.

Michigan no longer offering advance deposit wagering on horse racing

There's a lot of things you can bet on in the online realm across the state of Michigan. As of Jan. 1, horse racing isn't among them.

In the Great Lakes State, you can play casino games on your computer or mobile device. You can wager on a multitude of sports from the NFL, NBA, MLB, NHL and NCAA, to European soccer, and niche sports such as rugby, volleyball and even surfing.

However, the only way you can now bet on horse racing in Michigan is by visiting a licensed horse racing site in person.

It's the latest blow to the state, which has offered legalized wagering on horse racing since 1933, but seems to be on a collision course to wipe the sport out across Michigan.

The Michigan Gaming Control Board (MGCB), which licenses mobile horse racing betting apps across the state, informed all of the U.S. sites offering advance deposit wagering on the sport that they could no longer take bets from Michigan residents as of the start of the new year. That's because MGCB regulations require that any ADW wagering must be connected to live racing in the state.

As of last year, there are no active live racing meets being conducted in Michigan. Northville Downs in Northville, MI, ceased to offer live harness racing in February of last year. That was the last track operating in the state.

It's been a sad and steady decline in the sport across a state where horse racing was once a thriving industry. There hasn't been any live thoroughbred racing in Michigan since a meet was held at Hazel Park Raceway in 2018.

Hazel Park was also the standard bearer for standardbred racing in the state for decades. Operating a summer schedule opposite of Windsor Raceway across the border in Ontario, the two tracks kept the top horses and horsepeople racing around the calendar year.

Today, neither track is in existence. Windsor Raceway closed in 2012, six years prior to Hazel Park shuttering its doors. As well,

Sports Creek Raceway (2015) and Mount Pleasant Meadows (2013) were other Michigan racetracks that ceased operations of live meets over the past 12 years.

NORTHVILLE REVIVAL OFFERS GLIMMER OF HOPE

There is a chance that ADW could be returning to the state of Michigan later this year. On Oct. 30, the operators of Northville Downs were granted a conditional permit from the MGCB to operate 30 days of live harness racing later this year.

The tentative race dates would cover from Tuesday (April 29), through Wednesday (June 25) and Tuesday (Aug. 12) through Wednesday (Sept. 17). Live racing is to be held two days per week, on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, with not less than eight live horse races programmed per race date and with no more than 16 live horse races per race day.

The race dates are to be conducted at the Hastings Fairgrounds and will require several upgrades and benchmarks to be met by the facility in order for the meet to go forward. The MGCB hasn't officially issued the license to Hastings at this point. If they do go ahead with licensing, it would make it possible for ADW accounts to again be accessible for wagering in Michigan.

Michigan Harness Horsemen's Association representatives met with MGCB officials on Dec. 23 and Brett Boyd, president of the MHHA, provided an update from that meeting.

“ [The MGCB] did advise the [Michigan Harness Horsemen’s Association] that at this point in time they did not anticipate that they are going to issue the track license for Hastings prior to Jan. 1 2025. We are still optimistic about this application and we are partnering with Northville Downs.”

“They did advise the MHA that at this point in time they did not anticipate that they are going to issue the track license for Hastings prior to Jan. 1 2025,” Boyd said in a video post on Facebook. “We are still optimistic about this application and we are partnering with Northville Downs.”

Boyd also indicated that the MHA had presented to the MGCB letters of support from the USTA and from ADW operators such as Twin Spires.

“We are hopeful we can get that track license in early January and continue our mission to race next summer at the Hastings Fairground,” Boyd said.

ONLINE WAGERING ON HORSE RACING BLOSSOMING ACROSS USA

The Michigan shutdown is coming at a time when ADW opportunities for race fans are growing exponentially in the USA.

There were already several traditional ADW sites operating and offering their services to Michigan horse bettors. They include Twin Spires, NYRA Bets, XpressBet, DRF Bets and TVG.

Since legal and regulated online sports betting was introduced to Michigan in 2021, these sites haven’t been permitted to offer wagering on horse racing on their sports betting sites. However, several of the major players in the U.S. online sports betting market have since introduced their own versions of ADWs.

The first was FanDuel Racing, which is owned by Entain, the same company that operates TVG. DraftKings launched DK Horse in partnership with Twin Spires. Then NYRA Bets partnered with BetMGM Horse Racing. The latest addition to this group was Bet365 Racing, which launched an ADW horse racing app in November.

Trainer Ryan Berry receives early Christmas gift via first driving win

Ryan Berry will remember his first driving win, one that was most unexpected, for a long time.

Ten days before Christmas, the 38-year-old horseman from Oxford, ME, was at Cumberland Raceway, ready to send out a pair of pacers, Easteriffic, and Juneparker, in the fourth and fifth race, respectively.

That he knew.

What he wasn't aware of was that by the time he headed home from the half-mile oval, he would experience a career first.

Leading up to the third race, a Maine Amateur Driving Club pace with a purse of \$5,714, one of the horses was without a driver.

Then, came an offer for Berry.

"It was kind of lucky, I guess you could say, that I was able to get the drive," Berry said.

When asked if he would take the reins of JK Lucky Charms for the eight-horse dash, the 35-year-old quickly accepted.

His only instruction from the horse's trainer was to get to the front early.

If he could manage that, the 7-year-old gelding might make every pole a winning one.

"The big thing was to put him on top," Berry said. "The trainer said, 'If you get him there, he should be able to do the rest from there.'"

With mission in mind, Berry put the bay's nose on the gate – from post 2 – and waited for the starter car to pick up speed.

The pair blasted to the lead and found themselves on top by 1¼ lengths through an opening panel in :28.2. After their advantage dwindled to a quarter-of-a-length after a half in :59.4, Berry and JK Lucky Charms were 2¼ lengths clear of their closest pursuer through three-quarters in 1:28.3.

And that's when it hit Berry.

"It was kind of like a dream – this is actually going to happen," he said. "I got around the last turn and I couldn't hear anyone coming and I couldn't see anyone coming. It was a good feeling."

JK Lucky Charms crossed the line 7¼ lengths ahead of his nearest rival, pacing the mile in 1:59.2.

Trained by Allison MacDonald for owner Amy Weeks, the son of Sweet Lou – Bet On Luck earned his ninth win on the campaign. He paid \$12.60 for the victory.

One race later, Berry watched his Juneparker, with Nic Graffam in the sulky, take the lion's share of the \$8,571 purse.

I mainly race on the Maine circuit, so to expand that would be nice. I also got a new owner at the end of the year. They gave me a horse, so hopefully, everything takes off in 2025. ”

“It was a night I won’t ever forget,” Berry said. “My phone never stopped going off after the driving win. Between messages on Facebook, people calling or texting, it was great. I am grateful for all the support.”

That long list includes Cassi Martin.

“I probably wouldn’t be driving as much as I have this year if it wasn’t for Cassi, who owns a riding farm, Life’s a Ride, that I help out at,” Berry said. “All the girls who ride there have been encouraging me to drive more.

“Initially, I got my driving license so that if one of the horses I train got stuck with a bad post or needed a certain trip, I could be the one to drive.”

While those scenarios didn’t come to be, Berry soon discovered the more he drove, the more he enjoyed it.

After a combined nine drives over 2022 and 2023, that number grew to 17 in 2024.

“I got more confidence this past year and that made it even more enjoyable to drive,” he said.

Berry also had a big year in his training role, one that began in 2010.

He posted 23 wins – four short of tying his personal-best mark – and recorded a career-high \$158,766 in purse earnings.

“I was proud to get that first driving win and the closing week at Cumberland was very good to me – we ended the year with a bang,” Berry said. “We won three races over the last three cards, and I had another driving win [Velocity Sub Z, on Dec. 22].”

Beyond the successes of his stable, Berry learned some valuable lessons along the way.

“You learn that you have to take the good with the bad,” he said. “It takes some time to grasp that, but it’s important to understand it. One race, you can be on a real high and the next race, you can feel very low.

“One of my favorite horses, Spaghetti Eddie, was pulled up in a race at Cumberland and we had to put him down. That was tough. You love the horses, so when that happens, it’s very tough to take. You just have to find a way forward.”

Which is precisely what Berry has done.

With a new standardbred season on the horizon this spring, the horseman will tend to his four racing mares and two other racehorses over the winter and prep them for their upcoming campaigns.

One of his stable stars is a veteran campaigner, a trotter with 301 career starts to his name.

Warrawee Preferred, a son of Federal Flex (ON) –Warrawee Kate, has been under the tutelage of Berry since April 2022.

The hard-knocking bay gelding, bred at Warrawee Farm in Rockwood, ON, has nearly \$380,000 in career purse earnings.

For Berry, the horse, who he also owns, is a source of inspiration.

“He got hurt near the end of the year, but I just started jogging him,” he said. “He tries every time. It doesn’t matter if he has a tough post or what the odds say, he is always trying. Those are the ones who always pull through for you.”

Berry will also work on a game plan for himself.

“I would like to drive some more and get better at it,” he said. “I would like to get some higher-class horses to train and maybe travel with them. I mainly race on the Maine circuit, so to expand that would be nice. I also got a new owner at the end of the year. They gave me a horse, so hopefully, everything takes off in 2025.”

Outside of the barn life, Berry opts for another type of horsepower to fuel his competitive side.

“My brother races stock cars, so I try to be there every Saturday night for him, to support him,” Berry said. “It’s a nice way to take my mind off racing for a little while. But I still like that rush of adrenaline you get from watching others compete.”

In a few months’ time, Berry will be back on track, literally, looking to build off a strong 2024.

At some point, he will recall the words of advice he was given when he started out.

“I can’t remember who told me, but someone said that if I put in the work and put in the time, the horses will typically pan out in the end,” he said.

Even the ones Berry never expected to sit behind.

Donald “Skip” Hoovler selected for Ohio Harness Hall of Fame

Donald ‘Skip’ Hoovler, a long-time owner known for his relentless dedication to the sport, has been elected as the 51st member of the Ohio Harness Racing Hall of Fame by a vote of the members of the Ohio Chapter of the United States Harness Writers Association.

He became involved in harness racing in 1968, and races mostly homebreds in the Ohio Stakes program. Among his top horses were Medoland Sam (\$231,120), Medoland Big Sam (\$309,423), Medoland Miracle (\$289,633), Northmedo Tam (\$128,722) and Northmedo Mission (\$322,178).

Hoovler’s greatest accomplishment in harness racing has come away from racetracks and breeding sheds. He has given selflessly of his time for the betterment of the sport in the Buckeye State. He serves as the United States Trotting Association’s chairperson for District 1, is a former president and current board member of the Ohio Harness Horsemen’s Association (OHHA), director of OHHA’s PACER (Political Action Committee for Equine Racing) committee and a member of the Little Brown Jug Society.

Hoovler graduated from Ohio University in 1965, where he was an All-American linebacker. Upon graduation, he played professionally for the New York Jets and Houston Oilers.

He is a financial advisor and owns Hoovler Financial and Insurance Services in Pataskala, OH, where he resides with his wife, Tammy, who is an avid horsewoman. They have three children and eight grandchildren with daughter Amy as successor and partner of Hoovler Financial and Insurance Services.

Hoovler will be honored at the Ohio Harness Horsemen’s Association’s annual banquet on Saturday (Jan. 18) at the Hilton Airport in Columbus.

LaVerne Hill elected as Ohio Hall of Fame Immortal

LaVerne Hill, a former vice-president and owner of Scioto Downs and known by many as the “First Lady of Harness Racing,” has been elected to the Ohio Harness Racing Hall of Fame as an immortal by the members of the Ohio Chapter of the United States Harness Writers Association.

Hill and her late husband Charlie founded and operated “Ohio’s Showplace of Racing,” Scioto Downs for 48 years and owned Hill Farms, one of the state’s finest breeding facilities which stood the great Falcon Almahurst.

She previously served as president of the Mid-American Racing Association, president and CEO of Mara Enterprises, a director of Harness Tracks of America, a member of the Little Brown Jug Society and as a director of the United States Trotting Association.

Both Charlie (1985) and LaVerne (2001) won Harness Tracks of America’s prestigious Messenger Award, the first husband and wife so honored.

LaVerne was also presented with the Sulky Sweeties Good Guy award, the U.S. Harness Writers’ Presidents Award, HTA’s Good Gal Award and the Social Service Award from the Ohio Harness Horsemen’s Association.

In 2001, LaVerne was the honoree for the Delaware County Fair’s Lady Pace. Three years later, she donated the funds needed to finance the construction of the Jugette Barn at Delaware, a memorial to her late husband. She was elected to the Little Brown Jug Wall of Fame in 2005.

LaVerne passed away in October 2013.

Bartlett's brush with Big M history falls two winners short

There were just three races to go on the Saturday (Jan. 4) night card at The Meadowlands, and the red-hot Jason Bartlett had already driven six of the first 11 winners on the program.

He didn't have a drive in the 13th race, so if he were going to tie The Big M record of eight winners on a single program, he would have to be victorious in both the 12th and 14th dashes. He obviously had a shot, since both horses were morning-line second choices.

Bartlett's Sweet Jeff IR was bet down to 3-5 in the 12th – no doubt in part due to how the night was going for the 43-year-old pilot – but after making the lead early then sitting off a backstretch duel, the odds-on favorite struggled, failing to keep up in the pocket before finishing last in the field of 10.

"I knew in the post parade he would be really good or really bad," said Bartlett. "He was very keen the week before. I kind of had to walk him down the backside the other night. Something bad had to be going on with him for him to race that bad."

Bugaboo Lou was the even-money second choice to 4-5 favorite Bobcat Bay in the finale, but "Bobcat" kept "Bugaboo" safely at bay after a stretch duel to keep Bartlett's win total at a half-dozen.

"He's a good horse who hasn't been great recently," said Bartlett. "I knew with his back class, I still thought he had a decent shot.

He got a good trip and raced a lot better than he has been lately." So, the 13-time Yonkers Raceway driving champion finished with six victories.

Good stuff.

Only once during 2024 did a driver win six on a Big M card, with Dexter Dunn turning the trick on Hambletonian Day. Dunn's six-bagger came on a 16-race card, Bartlett's on a 14.

"I was aware of how many wins I had," said Bartlett, who is just 34 victories shy of 11,000 lifetime. "And I knew how many shots I had left. I didn't find out until after the races what the track record was when my wife, Kristen, told me.

"I kind of just take it race by race. When I get in the bike for the 14th race, it's about the 14th race."

Bartlett has been enjoying his Saturday soirees at the mile oval. And so have his fans.

On Dec. 7, the native of Maine won five times, becoming just the second driver during 2024 at The Big M to win five on a card twice (Yannick Gingras was the other) before taking four walks down victory lane on Dec. 28.

"I love the competition," said Bartlett, who intends to continue his Saturday visits to East Rutherford. "Saturday nights at The Meadowlands worked out pretty well for me last year. I've never won more than eight races on a card [at Yonkers]. I've done it five or six times. Maybe I can do it at The Meadowlands."

SUPER STATS: Last year, Bartlett finished second in North America in dash wins with 633 (Aaron Merriman led with 874, his 10th straight national crown) and third in money-earnings with \$12.6 million (Dunn, \$16.6 million; Gingras, \$14.5 million).

For three consecutive years, beginning in 2022, Bartlett won over 600 races and earned in excess of \$10 million.

EIGHT IS ENOUGH: The Meadowlands record of eight wins on a card is shared by Mike Lachance (July 14, 1995) and Brett Miller (Dec. 16, 2016).

7-7-7 FOR DUNN: The last three times a driver won seven races on a Big M card, Dexter Dunn was the man in the bike, accomplishing the feat on Jan. 11, 2020, June 18, 2021 and July 23, 2021.

Page and Burke take Kaltenbach honors

For the sixth straight year, driver Chris Page and trainer Ron Burke captured Ohio's Kaltenbach titles.

The Jerry Kaltenbach Memorial Trophies were established in 1988 and are awarded annually to the driver and trainer who have earned the most dollars competing in Ohio Sires Stakes (OSS) events in a single season.

Page claims the most Kaltenbach awards amongst drivers, notching his ninth title this year. Page started in 71 OSS events, winning 27 races, finishing second nine times, and adding five third-place finishes to earn \$1,431,350.

Brett Miller finished second with 13 wins, 12 second-place finishes, and four third-place finishes in 58 starts. Miller's earnings topped \$1,190,850. Aaron Merriman finished third having a record of 10-13-11 in 78 races and \$978,750 in earnings.

A total of 58 drivers participated in the 2024 OSS events with 45 garnering at least one purse check. Fifteen had earnings over \$100,000 or more, with nine amassing earnings over \$300,000.

The Kaltenbach title was the seventh for Burke who had 111 starts in the 2024 Ohio Sires Stakes legs, championships, and consolations. His total money earned from these OSS events was \$1,979,700

Burke finished with 34 wins, 11 second-place finishes, and nine third-place finishes.

Virgil Morgan, Jr. finished second with \$1,267,100 in earnings and a 12-12-3 record from 51 starts. Chris Beaver finished third. He had earnings of \$634,050 with a record of 3-12-10 in 47 starts.

A total of 95 trainers participated in 2024 OSS events with 19 earning over \$100,000.

In the 36 years the Kaltenbach trophies have been awarded, Page leads all drivers with nine trophies followed by David Miller with seven. David Hawk and Brett Miller have three each. On the training side, Burke has captured the title seven times, Morgan six, and Jim Dailey won the award four times. Only two horsemen have won the Kaltenbach in both the training and driving categories – Sam "Chip" Noble, III and Dave Rankin.

OHHA Terry Holton Youth Award presented to Braiden Rhoades

Braiden Rhoades of Garrettsville, OH, has been named the recipient of the 2024 Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association Terry Holton Youth Award.

Rhoades was born into the harness racing industry.

"He eats, breathes, and sleeps horses," said his father, Bill. "He works seven days a week, waking up to go to his own successful stable at Northfield Park and then to drive at fairs or onto the racetrack."

Braiden began driving in 2022 and won his first race the following year. In 2024, he had 443 starts with a record of 42-48-52, earning \$341,229.

Braiden is even more successful as a young trainer. In two years, he has scored 85 victories, 53 seconds, and 55 third-place finishes in 447 starts. His career earnings are more than \$640,000.

"I'm getting to live my dream," Braiden said. "I'm grateful and honored for all the opportunities I've had. Even being nominated for this award is special, let alone winning."

The Terry Holton Youth Award is awarded to an Ohio horseman between the ages of 13 and 19 who have actively participated in harness racing during 2024 as a driver, trainer, groom, breeder, race office/publicity assistant, track maintenance crew, or has provided outstanding service to harness racing.

The award, in its 22nd year, is named for Terry Holton, a 2005 inductee into the Ohio Harness Racing Hall of Fame. Holton of Newark, OH, was the winner of over 1,700 races in his career. He overcame many obstacles in his life, the biggest may have been overcoming pancreatic cancer.

Sippinonsearoc named 2024 Ohio 2-Year-Old Colt Pacer of the Year

World champion Sippinonsearoc hit the board in nine of 11 starts in 2024, earning \$568,000 on his way to being named the Ohio 2-Year-Old Colt Pacer of the Year.

In addition to setting the divisional world record of 1:48.2 at The Red Mile, Sippinonsearoc won six starts, including the \$300,000 Ohio Sires Stakes Scarlet Championship. The son of Downbytheseaside closed out this season with a second-place finish in the \$700,000 Breeders Crown final.

Sippinonsearoc is trained by Ron Burke and owned by the Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Brusceci, R A S Racing, and Knox Services. He was bred by the Trent Stohler Stable and Alesha Binkley.

Odds On Hialeah named Ohio 2-Year-Old Filly Pacer of the Year

Winning seven of eight starts as a freshman, Odds On Hialeah was named the 2024 Ohio 2-Year-Old Filly Pacer of the Year.

Her victories included the \$300,000 Ohio Sires Stakes Scarlet Championship. Trained by Virgil Morgan, Jr., the daughter of Lather Up never missed the board, capturing her only second-place finish in the fourth leg of the OSS. Odds On Hialeah earned \$324,750 for owners Let It Ride Stables and Odds On Racing. She was bred by Odds On Nourrir.

Lt Loverboy named Ohio 2-Year-Old Colt Trotter of the Year

Lt Loverboy showed grit on his way to being named the 2024 Ohio 2-Year-Old Colt Trotter of the Year. The Long Tom gelding overcame interference, winning the \$300,000 Ohio Sires Stakes Scarlet Championship.

Bred by Midland Acres and owned by Wayne Mast, Jr. and Callam Racing, Lt Loverboy never missed the board. He scored six wins, three seconds, and one third-place finish, earning \$304,855 under Daren Harvey's conditioning.

Mocha Hill named Ohio 2-Year-Old Filly Trotter of the Year

Mocha Hill was dominant from the start, winning six of nine races to secure her place as the 2024 Ohio 2-Year-Old Filly Trotter of the Year.

Bred by Franklin Equine, the daughter of What The Hill hit the board eight times throughout her season, earning \$259,742 for owners Burke Racing Stable, Hatfield Stables, Weaver Brusceci, and Knox Services. Her victories under trainer Ron Burke included four legs of the Ohio Sires Stakes and the Ohio State Fair.

Page, Burke, Rhoades, Sippinonsearoc, Odds On Hialeah, Lt Loverboy and Mocha Hill will be honored at the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association Annual Awards banquet on Jan. 18, 2025, at the Marriott Columbus Airport in Columbus, OH. Seats are sold out.

The 2024 Ohio Horse of the Year will be announced at the awards banquet.

Merriman, Kreiser pace away with 2024 driving and training titles

Aaron Merriman wrapped up another stellar season at MGM Northfield Park with 574 winner's-circle trips from 2,324 starts, to collect his eighth straight driving title and 13th overall at the Home of the Flying Turns. Hunter Myers (260), Kurt Sugg (257), Justin Irvine (255) and Ronnie Wrenn, Jr (236) rounded out the top five in 2024.

Merriman doesn't just win at Northfield, as he tacked on 300 more victories around the country to bring his grand total to 874 for the 2024 racing season which catapulted him to his astonishing 10th-consecutive season as leading driver in North America. Merriman not only spends a lot of time winning, but his bike racks up plenty of miles as he had 4,125 starts which marked his 11th season with over 4,000 starts vaulting him over 85,000 total.

His total purse earnings in 2024 of \$8,696,524 marked his seventh consecutive season over \$8 million excluding the abbreviated pandemic year (2020). Merriman also had highlight wins on Super Weekend with Clever Cody (trained by Dr. Ian Moore) in the \$300,000 Scarlet Championship and then a pair of \$100,000 Gray Championship scores with Howaboutyankee (K. Dean Glispie) and Mega Money (Christopher Beaver).

"I keep telling myself I want to slow down because it is a little tiring but if I think about being tired, I'll perform like I'm tired so for now I'm not going to cut back... I'm not chasing

records just trying to go out there and do my best to win each race," Merriman said when asked about pulling double duty throughout the week at The Meadows and Northfield.

Obviously, Merriman knows you can't win them all with as many starts as he makes each year, but he is very hard on himself.

"I don't like losing and I am very hard on myself but as I have gotten older, I've learned to let it go, after a couple minutes I just move on to the next race and go out and give 110 per cent," he said.

The 46-year-old Northfield native and career earner of over \$121 million began his career in 1997. With an accumulating total of 16,187 he now ranks third all-time in wins 1,632 behind Tony Morgan and 4,868 wins behind Dave Palone, who is the only driver over 20,000 wins.

On the training side, it was Cory Kreiser who had an exceptional season to dominate the standings with 197 wins. Jodi Schillaci (117), Bill Rhoades (110), Ron Burke (109) and Renae Loney (90) rounded out the top 5. For Kreiser, it was his second chart-topping season in three years at the Northeast Ohio circuit. He was dominant all around, and while having the most starts certainly can't hurt the stats, the quality was the impressive part, nearly winning at 20 per cent this season with an in the money percentage of 47 per cent and total earnings of \$1,347,699.

Kreiser now makes it three straight seasons of over \$1,000,000 in total earnings and it was his second season with over 200 wins across all tracks.

"Honestly growing up driving was everything, but I realize I'm a little overweight and not as talented as some of the others, so I do it when I'm stuck..." he said. "I do enjoy driving young trotters and doing the training miles."

Kreiser was a bit harsh on himself as he finished seventh in UDRS rating this season after chipping in 27 driving wins from 283 starts (9.5 per cent).

While the trainers receive most of the credit there are many steps to get a horse ready week in and week out.

"It is a big achievement for me to win a second training title at such a young age [recently turned 31]," Kreiser said. "It takes a village to do what we do and to accomplish this. Everyone in the barn, owners, drivers, and anyone else along that way help make it possible."
