Numbers prove the Meadowlands drives the industry

Jason Settlemoir reflects on Big M racing, handle and sports betting numbers.

In 2019, the Meadowlands showed how integral that the track is to the entire harness racing industry.

Handle across all tracks in the U.S. showed an increase of \$48 million, or 3.3 per cent in 2019. Of that, an increase of \$44.5 million came from a single racetrack — the Meadowlands. The \$44.5 million increase translates to a massive percentage increase of nearly 26 per cent year over year.

The underlying reason for the increase is due to the purse appropriation from the state of New Jersey that allowed the Meadowlands to substantially increase its purses to a competitive level. But unlike most other tracks who are also the beneficiary of appropriations or subsidies, the Meadowlands was able to use those funds to immediately have a dramatic impact on the handle front.

Meadowlands chief operating officer Jason Settlemoir said the state appropriation gave the track the ability to increase the purse account for overnight races by \$6 million dollars.

As a result, "We've been able to get more horses entered

into the box which puts more horses on the gate which attracts more betting dollars to our races," Settlemoir said. "At the end of the day, the increase of being able to race for more money and have more entries and more average starters – that's what drives the wagering."

On-track handle at the Meadowlands also experienced year-over-year gains. An average of \$195,000 bet on track nightly was good for a seen per cent increase from 2018. Though less than the all-source increase, it's still an impressive number considering that fewer and fewer people are physically at tracks to bet.

Was the on-track increase attributable in any way to the FanDuel sportsbook at the Meadowlands, which has increased the number of people entering the facility? Settlemoir said that hasn't been the case, and, if anything, the presence of sports betting has been both a positive and a negative for the Meadowlands and its relationship with racing.

"In July 2018, we opened the sportsbook and we were getting more traffic and had initially seen a bump in handle

from our live import. But then shortly after we saw the number on imports – the amount bet at the Meadowlands on other racetracks around the world – do down," Settlemoir said. "So what we saw initially with more people betting on horse racing has been going back the other way, because those people that were betting sports are betting sports, and then some of our horse racing customers are gravitating over to sports betting."

Settlemoir also noted that the migration of bettors from horses to sports also includes some of the bigger gamblers at the Meadowlands at the off-track-wagering facility Winners Bayonne. "People only have so much disposable income and at the end of the day they've only got so much money and they're splitting it up and you're going to lose it from one area."

What Settlemoir describes is in part the reason for the track's nine per cent decrease on the track's import, which is a big number when taking into account how big an import facility the Meadowlands is. But even though the track's import was off, that decrease was offset by the positive gains

from money being wagered on-track and around the country on the Meadowlands.

Into 2020, the Meadowlands is off to another strong start with handle generally approaching the \$3 million mark on the Friday and Saturday cards.

Changes that will be implemented in the upcoming year to increase handle further include the maximum number of starters in stakes races being reduced from 12 to 11. Also, races that had been contested at 1 1/8-mile distances will now be raced back at the standard mile distance.

"I think it's important, as far as the stakes races are concerned, moving to 11 starters and going a mile," Settlemoir said. "Unfortunately, what we had typically seen with the larger fields (12 horses) and the added distance was the opposite of what we thought we'd see. We saw a decrease in handle instead of an increase. So, we decided to go to 11 and go a mile and I think we'll see growth on those particular races."

Meadowlands race secretary Scott Warren added another reason for the change back to one mile.

"Another big thing that put us back in the direction of going a mile was last year when Lather Up went his race (Sam McKee Memorial) in a mile and an eighth and maybe he could have had the world record of a mile of 1:46 or faster, we'll never know because he had to go a mile and an eighth that night. And there was a lot of feedback where it seemed like there was more excitement in the building and for the sport when the distance is at a mile for those type of races," Warren said.

It remains to be seen how much more the Meadowlands can increase handle in the upcoming year, but there's no question that the sport is better off when the track is doing well.







Go rogue outside of the box: Part 2 - paving the money trail

How rebate programs can grow handle for tracks bold enough to try it.

In part one (full story here) we encouraged track administrations to create outrageous promotions, to go with any wild ideas they had and pursue them as never before. That doesn't mean the track bosses need to hire a six-figure promotion team that costs more than its input could ever produce. Simply, it means the track public relations (PR) antics should directly target the betting public in order for the track's staff to develop a bond with the sport's audience (which is, by definition, "public relations").

As AA continually impresses, the best PR antics have to do with gifts, preferably those with value, preferably value that translates into dollars. The best dollar-value gifts are dollars themselves. All old-school gifts and prizes offered to the public were lame compared to money, because money is the strongest image in a bettor's mind when gambling on anything.

A few years back, track PR departments that were still giving out hats and shirts also strongly implied to the public that the excitement of watching horses and drivers compete in races was alone worth the price of admission to a pari-mutuel track. While that was becoming a futile device and the crowds were fading, a new brand of betting operations began to grow elsewhere.

Enter off-shore betting (OSB) accounts.

OSB companies, loyal to any breed of horse racing, were soliciting clients using the best trio of value gifts available — money, money and money. These operations scouted for bettors that would open accounts and wager through the new facilities, doing so with money as the bait. Thus was

born the rebate: money paid to the account holder based on his or her losing wagers.

Bettors listened with rapt attention when OSB companies said, "If you are betting horse racing anywhere without a regular rebate on your losing wagers, you are missing out."

The point is clearly that money is what the account holder will collect on winning bets and earn on losing bets.

The notion touched a nerve that no pari-mutuel racetrack knew even existed. It was not long before OSBs were signing up all levels of pari-mutuel players. Their go-for-the-throat promises were perfect, offering more than the money bettors risked by playing.

OSBs did not stop with standard rebates, either; they offered additional cash-based rewards. They boasted about rebates within rebates for particular types of wagers and promised that "over months of betting [a player] will see a significant boost in a bankroll."

That promise uses all of the words that resonate in the ears of bettors. OSBs understand bettors want to make money and are ready to lose money trying, and they understand and wish to assist with money because they want us to stay in play.

REBATES RETURNS

Giving cash rebates in one form or another is never a true expense to a pari-mutuel operation. However a track PR team puts together a program that gives customers a rebate, that program will wind up costing a pittance. Aside from free cash becoming a business expense, there is a bigger return on investment for the track because bettors will use rebate money one way — to keep betting.

Here's a new type of "churn"; a track gives rebates and the recipients put the cash back into the betting pools, where racetracks get their share of betting income. It is brilliant; it is the purist definition of the old adage: "You have to spend money to make money."

Once the word is out, the "rebate" tracks could create new bettors, but also get back bettors that may have left.

Moreover, rebates will attract bigger bettors, the kind that truly can move numbers in pools.

As well, a rebate program will do more than a straight-out lottery-type money contest because everyone is going to lose bets, so everyone is eligible to get rebates. In a lottery-type cash contest there is one lucky winner — a person all of the losers pelt to pieces in their imaginations because the one winner was not any of them.

AA suggests racetrack administrations look into the details of creating a rebates program simply by studying how any betting organization sets up a system. Think it through, create it and promote it all over your raceway. Advertise it in *HRU* and *Daily Racing Form* and with prominent banners and floating ads on your website and at ADWs.

Is that out of the box, or what? Something so simple as giving money back to bettors so they could continue to pour money into the pools that keep a racetrack open is, indeed, radical.

This is the explosive element that defines the process known as "thinking outside of the box." Racetrack PR departments should be inspired to create a program that blows up "the box" itself. Not only won't there be a box any longer, there will be no borders to the territory revealed from the explosion.

Who knows what spinoffs may come from it and how profitable PR programs may become? No one knows and no one will know unless one track goes rogue, experiments, and grabs the attention of the people keeping them in business.



The book on how Hanover buys its broodmares

My Aussie friend Brett Coffey recently sent me a six-item question relating to my experience at Hanover in purchasing broodmares.

- 1. What does Hanover look for in a broodmare?
- 2. What characteristics made you rule out a mare?
- 3. What were some of the characteristics of the best broodmares?
- 4. What mares exceeded expectations and what mares fell short?
- 5. Were there any great mares that Hanover missed on that turned out great?
 - 6. How are mares purchased by Hanover?

I'll start with question #6

Through the years, the vast majority of potential Hanover broodmares were purchased privately.

People, friends and customers would call about mares that they would like to sell. The mare's name and credentials were passed out to a screening committee which consisted of Jim Simpson, Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky (Dr. J), Russell Williams, Pete Spears and myself.

The majority were outrightly dismissed due to several factors — mostly lack of commercial pedigree and age.

The possible seller was then notified of our lack of interest.

With mares that passed the litmus test, price comes into question. If the asking price is acceptable we would tentatively meet it. If it was too high, we might reject the mare or if we were not too far away, we might come back with a counter offer.

Hanover would never make an offer on a mare before the potential buyer had set his or her asking price.

Once a price had been set on the mare, the sale became

contingent upon the mare being shipped to the Farms at the owner's expense and being judged both reproductively and physically acceptable. At such time, the sale was consummated. If for some reason the mare was rejected, she would be shipped back to her owner at Hanover's expense.

The other main vehicle was buying mares at public auction — mostly at Harrisburg, but sometimes at other venues such as the Tattersalls Winter Sale.

What generally occurred was that Dr. J and I would peruse the catalogs and independently come up with a list of mares that we felt would be of benefit to the Farms.

The lists were combined and Dr. J would evaluate them physically at the sale. Most were ruled out due to conformation or size defects. The ones deemed desirable were put on a list and price limits were established. Generally speaking, and likely to a degree based on the success of the preceding yearling sale, these prices might be exceeded, but rarely by much.

Question #1

We looked for a mare to check most of the boxes.

Pedigree, most specifically commercial pedigree, would be the number one necessity.

Following that would be size and general conformation,

followed by race record and race earnings.

People might think that compatibility to the stallions which we stood would be a factor, but I don't remember it being so. If the mare was attractive enough, we would certainly find an acceptable mate for her.

Question #2

The major things that would rule out a mare for us would be a lack of pedigree, size, age and of course significant conformation flaws.

In quite a few cases, we were offered mares that were good race mares, had high earnings but lacked what we felt was an attractive pedigree.

We wouldn't rule out a mare that was on the small size, but we weren't interested in shrimps. Small mares will generally produce small yearlings. Small yearlings do not generally sell well.

A notable exception is the mare Panera Hanover, who is quite small, but is the dam of the outstanding coming 3-year-old Papi Rob Hanover, who is a pretty good sized horse.

With the rare exception, a mare older than five would not interest us. In such cases, the mare would be 10 or more before we knew what we had.

Most conformation flaws are generally passed on. If a mare had a major physical defect, then we just were not interested.

Question #3

I think that Dr. Jablonsky, or others that work with mares on a regular basis, would be better suited to answer this than I. From what she and her predecessor Dr Peter Boyce have told me, one of the main characteristics of good broodmares is that they are generally good mothers to their foals.

Question #4

Beyond that, I cannot say too much.

The first and most obvious example would be Rich N Elegant. She was a decently-bred, decently-performed mare who we expected to be a decent broodmare. We bought her through Bob Boni for the bargain basement price of \$12,000. Nobody, least of all me, expected her to become the great mare that she became.

Another great buy was the mare D Train. I don't remember exactly what we paid for her, but it was likely in the area of \$10,000. If it was more, then not much more.

As I recall, we didn't particularly want her, but the price was right and we were buying her from a couple of good

customers. Romola Hanover, who I regard as the greatest producing pacing broodmare of all time was a homebred who was retained by the Farms at a time when Hanover made a practice of retaining some fillies to become future broodmares. She had world class speed but lacked the gait and manners to become a high earner on the racetrack.

We bought the Hall of Fame broodmare Tricky Tooshie for a pretty high price. The number \$100,000 comes to mind. If it wasn't that, it was somewhere in that vicinity. I recall that I didn't like the buy, especially at that price. The mare was a wonderful race filly, earning in excess of a million dollars. But, in my opinion, at the time, she lacked the pedigree to become a high-caliber broodmare. On the other hand, Dr. J loved her. It is one of the many instances where her wisdom prevailed over mine. Not only has she been a great and very consistent producer herself, but one of her daughters is the dam of this year's Dan Patch 2-year-old pacing filly winner Lyons Sentinel.

Question #5

The one that we missed out on that most comes to me was Heathers Western who became the dam of Betting Line.

I loved Heathers Western.

I first saw her as a yearling when I went to Delvin Miller's old Meadow Lands Farm doing yearling evaluations for the Harrisburg sale.

I remember Bobby Sutton showing her to me and saying that in his opinion this was the best looking yearling filly ever raised at the farm. I don't believe that he was exaggerating one little bit. She was drop dead gorgeous. She turned out to be a decent race filly and was sent to Harrisburg at the end of her racing career. I was sure that we would get her. But Fair Winds Farm wanted her more than we did and we ended up being the under bidder on her.

All worked out well though. If we had bought her, there would have been no Betting Line and Hanover would not be standing him.

Conversely, there were some that got away that we bid strongly on and turned out to be relative disappointments.

I recall us bidding at least \$600,000, maybe more, on Continentalvictory. Thankfully, we didn't get her. On the other hand, maybe, and it's a big maybe, if we had bought her, she might have had better production than she did.

Even worse was the purchase of Rae. We wanted her, but the price we set on her was a maximum of \$300,000. I believe she brought something like \$600,000 and we were the underbidder. Thank goodness we didn't get her. Sadly, I believe she died even before she produced a single foal.

My beshert experience

The word "beshert" is a Yiddish term which means preordained or destined to be.

Such an occurrence recently befell me.

Anybody who knows me, knows that I am a crazy Duke Blue Devils fan — emphasis on the crazy.

You just never know

Examples of incredible horses that had humble beginnings. **by Bob Heyden**

Here's some great examples of great horses that had humble beginnings:

Pinkman was catalogued to be sold at the Harrisburg Mixed Sale in 2014, but was ultimately retained by trainer Jimmy Takter. Twelve months later, he wrapped up the single biggest money season for any Takter trainee (\$1.897 million) and won the Hambletonian, as well.

Stars Pride sold for \$2,950 in 1948 and went on to be the most prolific trotting sire with a bushel full of Hambletonian and Triple Crown winners.

Fresh Yankee and **Greyhound** each sold for \$900 initially and then wrote their own chapters in the sport's history.

On The Road Again sold for \$10,500 at the NJ Classic sale, and then at 3 and 4 was the Horse of the Year runnerup both times and briefly held the all-time earnings record.

Fight The Foe raced in \$4,000 claimers at Liberty Bell in early 1979, then climbed the claiming ladder and made his way to the features and free-for-alls, banking around \$800,000 lifetime the record at the time for a horse who never won a stakes event.

Mr. Muscleman was overlooked in 200, costing just \$2,000 as a yearling. He was later resold for \$155,000 and went on to a \$3.5 million plus standout career.

In 20+ years, Tetrick stands alone

Strange how rare this fact is, but Tim Tetrick is the only driver in the 21st century to win the earnings title and the Hambletonian in the same year. He did it in 2012 with Market Share the same year he posted better than \$18 million season.

Prior to the year 2000, it was far more common:

1946 — Thomas Berry won the Hambletonian with Chestertown and the earnings title with \$121,933 (it was the first year the money records were kept)

1950 — Del Miller won the Hambletonian with Lusty Song and the earnings title with \$306,813

1985 — Bill O'Donnell won the Hambletonian with Prakas and the earnings title with \$10,207,372 (it was the first \$10 million driving season)

1987 – John Campbell won the Hambletonian with Mack

Lobell and the earnings title with \$10,186,495

1988 — John Campbell won the Hambletonian with Armbro Goal and the earnings title with \$11,148,565

1990 — John Campbell won the Hambletonian with Harmonious and the earnings title with \$11,620,878

1995 — John Campbell won the Hambletonian with Tagliabue and the earnings title with \$9,469,797

1998 — John Campbell won the Hambletonian with Muscles Yankee and the earnings title with \$10,768,771

Campbell Grand Slam

This year marks the 25th anniversary of John Campbell's Grand Slam

In 1995, Campbell won the Little Brown Jug, North America Cup, Meadowlands Pace and Hambletonian with Nicks Fantasy, David Pass, Davids Pass and Tagliabue, respectively.

Oddity

Try and think of a horse who made over \$100,000 at both age 2 and age 8. Here's one: Art Director. \$117,880 at 2 and \$171,670 at 8. He had six such seasons in his career.

Like father, like sons

Bettors Delight and his sons Tall Dark Stranger and Bettors Wish have similar histories.

In 2000 and 2001, Bettors Delight was voted the freshman and sophomore pacing colt of the year, respectively.

In 2019, he was the sire of both winners in those same categories.

Tall Dark Stranger was voted the top freshman with a record of: 9 8-1-0, \$717,514

Bettors Wish was the top sophomore with a record of: 19 13-6-0, \$1,643,745

Others, such as Caviart Ally \$672,215 and Alicorn \$405,569, added to Bettors Delight's record season of better than \$25 million.

Bettors Delight just turned 22.

Shartin N trying to match Rainbow Blue

Shartin N is trying to become the first female in 15 years to be both Pacer of the Year and Horse of the Year since Rainbow Blue did it last in 2004.

Shartin N is set to become just the fifth female in 50 years to be named Pacer of the Year. On the trotting female side, a female has been named Trotter of the Year 17 times.

This record is safe

Here's a record unlikely to be beaten: Ron Pierce's mind-boggling five straight seasons of winning either the Meadowlands Pace or the Hambletonian (all for at least \$1 million) and six straight years with at least one million-dollar race win. Check this out:

2006 - \$1,360,000 North America Cup with Total Truth.

2007 - \$1.5 million Hambletonian with Donato Hanover (Note: Pierce also won the Canadian Trotting Classic with Donato, but it fell a little shy of a \$1 million with a purse of \$970,000).

2008 — \$1 million Meadowlands Pace with Art Official (over Somebeachsomewhere).

2009 — \$1,305,000 North America Cup and \$1 million Meadowlands Pace with Well Said.

2010 - 1.5 million Hambletonian with Muscle Massive (over Trotter of the Year Lucky Chucky).

2011 — \$1,020,000 Metro with Simply Business and \$1,000,000 Meadowlands Pace with Roll With Joe.

Pierce went into the Hall Of Fame in 2004 with two million-dollar race wins, the 1993 Hambletonian with American Winner and the 1997 Meadowlands Pace with Dream Away. He won eight million-dollar races after he was enshrined in the Hall.

Looking back on the first 1,000-win season

The first 1,000-win season by a driver was orchestrated in 1998 by driver Walter Case, Jr., who posted 979 of those victories at Yonkers alone where he posted a .511 UDRS and earnings of \$4,165,854.

Case's national totals that year were: 2,993 drives 1,077 wins, 566 seconds and 367 thirds for earnings of \$4,458,228.

He was the HTA Driver of the Year for 1998.

Other notables about that accomplishment:

- Case did not race at all in 1997.
- He won nine races at Yonkers on June 16.1998.
- The 1998 crown was his second dash title. He won it prior in 1992 with 843 wins.
- He missed 60 race nights in 1998, yet still became the first to hit 1,000 win.
- He finished the year at #25 on the all-time money list at \$32,655,632
 - His UDRS for the entire year was .504.
 - He won over 36 per cent of his starts.

Three decades on...

Can it really be three decades since trainer Gene Riegle's historic run?


Yes, indeed, 30 years have passed since Gene Riegle brought out 2-year-olds in successive seasons named Artsplace 1990, Western Hanover 1991 and then Life Sign 1992. Stars every year they race and then impact stallions, it'll be a long time until anyone does better than that.

Elian Web upsets in Sundsvall

Propulsion entered the \$31,500 Zoogins Race at Bergsåker, Sweden as the heavy favorite in the gold division on Saturday afternoon, but the 9-year-old Muscle Hill son had to capitulate in favor of leader Elian Web (Like A Prayer) and Jorma Kontio.

Elian Web's ability to leave quickly behind the gate was mentioned as one of the factors that could bring down Propulsion's chances to win the race in Sundsvall and as expected, the Finnish owned and trained trotter was easily sent to the front early in the race.

From the lead, Elian Web had great spirit and morale when Propulsion tried to challenge on the outside and the victory was a safe one in a mile rate of 1:56.2 over 1.3 miles.

Propulsion finished second and the plan to take him to Paris in two weeks still remains. It's most likely that on Jan. 26 the American-bred champion trotter will make his fourth consecutive try in the Prix d'Amérique.

Elian Web replay.

Helgafell best in France

Three-year-old Helgafell (Charly du Noyer) appears,

without doubt, to be the best H-horse (3-year-olds bred in France) in Paris at the moment. The Philippe Allaire-trained trotter won the \$111,200 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Vincennes on Saturday afternoon and driver Eric Raffin saved his horse's speed until the home stretch. The winner's time was moderate. Helgafell came home in a mile rate of 2:02.2 over 1.6 miles and trainer Philippe Allaire noted that his horses took all three podium places since leader Heavens Pride was runner up ahead of Allaire's Holzarte Vedaquais.

Swedish star Campo Bahia (Muscle Hill) was the first choice in the \$111,200 Prix de Croix at Vincennes but despite a calm journey in front position, the Conrad Lugauer trained 5-year-old was beaten at an early stage and Campo Bahia showed signs of sickness directly after the race.

Allaire had a great day in Paris on Saturday. His Feliciano (Ready Cash) was served a perfect trip by David Thomain and when first over trotter Falcao de Laurma disarmed Campo Bahia in the last turn, Feliciano found space to use his speed, which was enough to win in mile rate 1:58 over 1.7 miles.

Feliciano has been successful in bigger races in Paris before. Last year, the 5-year-old Ready Cash son won the \$222,400 Prix de l'Etoile in an impressive mile rate of 1:53 over 1.3 miles.

Speaking of Paris and Vincennes. Today's (Jan. 12) \$121,800 Prix de Belgique is scheduled and it's the last chance for horses to qualify for the Prix d'Amérique.

Megan Scran - horse trainer

Megan Scran wasn't brought up in the business like many other young women; in fact, she didn't even start working with standardbreds until she was 21. Today, the trainer is one of the first people on the track at Sunshine Meadows in Florida and one of the last to leave.

Growing up in Toms River, NJ, Scran, the girlfriend of top driver Scott Zeron, was always in love with horses.

"I have been horse crazy my entire life. I rode and competed in 4-H, The Pony Club, and local horse shows," Megan said.

"Although my family was never involved in the racehorse business, I was running a small riding horse farm when a friend of mine told me about a job that opened working with racehorses.

I was looking for a change and decided to give the job a shot. My boss just happened to be Norway native, Trond Smedshammer, a well-known name in the harness racing industry, who has trained many superstars, including Triple Crown winner Windsong Legacy.

"I was blessed to have gotten my start under Trond for it was a great place to learn the ropes of harness racing. I worked for Trond about two years. After the first six months I was fortunate to take care of a horse called Royal Ice who raced in the Hambletonian. He was a brother to the great(s) Ice Attraction and Ice Dutchess.

"Trond gave me a lot of great opportunities that many trainers would not have — allowing me to jog and train the horses, besides just grooming. I think that is really when my love for harness racing blossomed.

"At that time, Trond also purchased several thoroughbreds for his owner, Wanda Polisseni (Purple Haze Stable). With my experience in riding I took care of the thoroughbreds — breaking and riding them every day."

That brought Scran to the Meadowlands in 2013 where

she met Zeron.

"I started working for Scott's father, Rick, who is a renowned name in the sport. I groomed and helped ride horses for Mr. Zeron. In fact, the world champion trotting mare, Atlanta, was in the Zeron Stable during that time.

"I didn't take care of Atlanta for I was caring for another 3year-old trotting filly named Courtney Hanover. Atlanta was a super quiet filly when she was in the barn. In fact, you would have to make sure she was alright for she didn't make a peep."

Scran was also lucky enough to work with the great horse Marion Marauder during his 3 year-old-year. In 2016, the trotting son of Muscle Hill won the Triple Crown with Scott Zeron, in the bike. He became the eighth reinsman to take the Hambletonian on his first try.

The Wellwood family, the owners of Marion Marauder, finally tasted Hambletonian glory as their trotter crossed the finish line first. This was Paula Wellwood's 10th try for the trophy—joining Linda Toscano as the only women to train a Hambletonian champion. Paula is a living testimony to "try, try again and never give up and your dream will come true."

"Paula Wellwood and Linda Toscano are my idols with many major wins under their belt. They have been very supportive of my young career and are always there to offer their knowledge to me."

Having a strong foundation under the guidance of trainers Smedshammer and Zeron, Scran decided to break away and spread her wings and start her own stable.

"I took one year hiatus and drove Scott from track to track in the busy season during stake races. After a while I realized

this was not for me — not being with Scott, but being away from working one-on-one with the horses.

"Scott bought me what was supposed to be a temporary claiming horse, but one turned into another and a few more when an owner asked me if I would be interested in taking three of his horses to train. It was unexpected, but a blessing."

In the winter months, you can find Scran at Sunshine Meadows in South Florida, and in the summer she stables at Mark Ford's Training Center in Middletown, NY.

"Currently I have three standardbreds in training (Two 3 Year-Old-Pacing Colts and one 2-Year-Old Pacing Colt). I also own a broodmare, an aged racehorse and one riding horse I've owned for 18 years.

I had my stable up to 10 head this past summer, but I prefer to be completely hands on: grooming, riding, etc., and

with a stable of three racehorses, I can really concentrate on my horses."

Having a boyfriend who is one of the best drivers, does this mean Zeron drives for her?

"As long as he is at the track I am racing at he does, but when he's somewhere else, of course he can't," she said.

Like many other horse trainers and owners, Scran's dream is to have "that once in a lifetime horse."

Here's wishing Scran the very best in her racing career, but I'm sure this hardworking, gritty, and ambitious young woman won't need it.

My friend said, "Never heard of him, but if he was crazy for trotters, eccentric, and not working at 40, hell, maybe you already WERE him in an earlier life."


"Interesting twist. A rerun would be fine because according to my research, his life looks great."

He liked it so much he purchased 25 acres and built that magnificent trotting stable near 196th Street."

He nodded. "You really researched this stuff?"

"Oh yeah, this is an excellent hobby. Billings was just getting started. He built a mansion attached to the stables. I mean a REAL mansion. Scroll down and check out the next photo."

He did.

I said to him, "Read the description."

The mansion, on the highest point of the property, was 250 feet above the Hudson River on the site of Fort Tryon. Known as Tryon Hall, the mansion, designed in the Louis XIV style, featured an extravagant S-shape driveway costing \$250,000 that was 1,600 feet long and rose 100 feet on a 6-degree grade. The estate included a heated indoor swimming pool, two-story squash court lined in maple, a "fumed oak" bowling alley, pergola and formal gardens. There was also a landing for his 232-foot yacht, Vanadis, on the Hudson River. Built at a cost of about \$2 million, the mansion was completed in 1907 and became the full-time residence of Billings and his wife, his two children, and 23 servants."

He handed me back my phone and said. "Mister Billings raced the best trotters in the world."

"No. Billings BOUGHT the best horses in the world but never raced his horses for money. He raced for record times, and he got them with horses like Uhlan, William, and Lou Dillion. His horses would compete in amateur events and sometimes he sent them on tours around the world so people could watch them trot."

He asked, "So what is your plan for entering this kingdom? Are you just going to walk up and say, 'Mister Billings, Trey here. from a future life?'"

"Of course not, don't be silly, I'll need to have some schemes to worm my way into his golden circle. Maybe get a



job working in his stable, or be the groom for Lou Dillon, the first trotter to go under 2:00, or be a waiter at the legendary dinner that Billings held to celebrate the completion of his stables."

"Dinner?"

"Man, what a scene. It was epic. Billings was president of something called the Equestrian Club. He planned an exclusive dinner for the members in 1903. I began to read off my phone. 'The word leaked out, and crowds of reporters gathered by his gates, hoping to see the fabulous stable and glamorous visitors. Billings secretly moved the party to Sherry's restaurant, at Fifth Avenue and 44th Street. He had the grand Rococo ballroom transformed into woodlands, complete with imitation grass on the floor and babbling brooks so that he and his guests could sit on their horses (which had been taken up to the fourth-floor ballroom by elevator) while having dinner. The diners ate from trays attached to their saddles and sipped champagne through rubber tubes from iced bottles in their saddlebags. Waiters dressed as grooms served courses, and each horse had a feedbag of oats to chomp on as well."

"CKG Billings (above left, with Lou Dillon in 1903) sounds as loopy as TREY."

"My master plan is to make a move on his daughter,
Blanche Pauline Billings, who, due to my careful planning,
will be exactly my age. I haven't been able to find any photos
of Blanche, but my research continues. Son-in-law to CKG
Billings is definitely my plan A, especially if Blanche is a fox.
Imagine a fox on my arm and great trotters all around me. I'd
be living the dream."











Caviart Ally to return to racing in 2020

Caviart Ally, 2019 Breeders Crown mare pace champion and O'Brien Award finalist, will return to racing this year and is being pointed to the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series, according to her owners Buck and Judy Chaffee of Caviart Farms.

The lucrative Matchmaker series is expected to begin in mid-March at Yonkers Raceway.

"A lot of Caviart Ally's fans have been asking us whether Ally will race again this year," said Buck. "Our entire Caviart Farms team actually spent a couple of months debating what to do. We had been thinking seriously about retiring Ally to breed her to Captain Crunch, 2019 North America Cup winner and 2018 Dan Patch Two-Year-Old Pacing Colt of the Year. We are among his original owners and think that he has a great chance of mirroring his own sire's (Captaintreacherous) phenomenal breeding success – so we rather wanted Ally to have a foal in his very first crop."

However, as the racing season progressed, the Chaffees said that they began to question the wisdom of retiring her.

"Throughout Ally's career, she has always been competitive at the very top level so it was not simply that she was racing well," said Judy. "What really stopped us in our tracks and caused us to rethink our strategy was that she was actually still improving, getting stronger and getting better – plus she really seemed to be enjoying racing. In the fall Ally stepped right up and won all of her final four stakes races – the Milton, the Allerage Farms, the Breeders Crown and the TVG. In fact, Ally actually took stakes records in both the Milton and TVG – and defeated the highly regarded Shartin N in their final three stakes competitions. It was a great

season for Ally. She really was incredible!"

Caviart Ally's trainer Brett Pelling also let it be known that he hoped that Ally would race again in 2020. "I hope so," he responded when asked in an interview following the mare's win of the \$175,000 TVG final. "It'd be a shame not to. She's at the top of her game, and we get along so well. I'd hate not to see her in the stall."

The trainer was also the first to bring up the subject of the Matchmaker series, Buck revealed, explaining, "Brett called us and said that he thought the Matchmaker would be a perfect fit for her. He totally believes in Ally, repeated how all season she kept improving and told us that he would have her ready in time for the Matchmaker. In fact, he even went so far as to say that he thought that she might well dominate the entire series."

In addition to the positive comments of Ally's trainer, the Chaffees also took to heart the sentiments of Caviart Ally's career-long driver, Andy McCarthy. "Even though Andy never tried to steer us in one direction or the other," said Judy, "he did detail how good it feels when he and Ally step onto the track. He said that there is a certain aura about Ally, called her one of the greats – and he said how wonderful it is when you can rely on a horse giving you 110 per cent every time.

"When thinking about the positive comments from both Brett and Andy, along with the grand fashion in which Ally ended the season, we couldn't help but feel that all of the signals were that Ally should race another year. Right from the very beginning, when Ally was a 2-year-old, I always said that when she was ready to stop racing, she would let us know. Mares have a way of doing that. And at this point in time it really seems that Ally still enjoys racing."

With the now 6-year-old Caviart Ally back in training, Chaffees say they are feeling very excited.

"Brett is so high on Ally that I guess his enthusiasm is pretty infectious," said Buck, laughing, "because now we can hardly wait for her season to begin. We are feeling very positive and excited."

During 2019 Caviart Ally escalated her earnings by \$760,000 to \$1.8 million – and was never worse than third in 19 starts. She was second by record among aged pacing mares and third by earnings.

Objective evidence shows Tall Dark Stranger was better

I am writing to answer the question asked by Ron Gurfein in the 1-10-20 edition of HRU, "How does Papi Rob Hanover lose 2-year-old pacing colt to Tall Dark Stranger?" (full story here).

In the interest of full disclosure, let me first say that I am obviously prejudiced since I bred and sold Tall Dark Stranger.

Next, let me say that I am not aware of any established criteria for the selection of the Dan Patch equine awards but would assume that any such criteria would include both subjective and objective factors. In light of my obvious self-interest I would like to exclude all subjective factors and consider only objective factors, i.e. the statistical evidence:

Tall Dark Stranger raced nine times winning eight (89 per cent of his starts), earning \$715,514 (\$79,502 per start) and took a record of 1:49.1.

Papi Rob Hanover raced 12 times winning six (50 per cent of his starts). He earned \$754,774 (\$62,898 per start) and took a record of 1:50 f.

Tall Dark Stranger and Papi Rob Hanover raced against each other five times with Tall Dark Stranger winning four of the five.

Tall Dark Stranger won the two biggest races for 2-year-olds, the Metro and the Breeders Crown. Neither of these races would be considered Canadian "indigenous" races.

Papi Rob Hanover is a great colt and if Tall Dark Stranger is #1, Papi Rob Hanover is no worse than #1A. While I understand why some think, on a subjective basis, that Papi Rob Hanover should have won the Dan Patch Award, the objective evidence does not support them.

In conclusion, I would like to say that I hope my remarks do not offend David McDuffee, the owner of Papi Rob Hanover. I had the pleasure of meeting him this past year and he bought Tall Dark Stranger's half-brother from me at the Lexington sale. I found him to be a true gentleman and consider him a friend.

If you are not on the "chosen" horse you may as well rip up your tickets. I shut my computer off when my 5-2 shot tucked in third, allowed a 70-1 shot box him in without trying to move to the outer flow and that was at the half-mile mark, so he should have been moving. I call it fraud.
