Sometimes big numbers at The Big M don't tell the whole truth

Meadowlands owner Jeff Gural on declining revenue and the need for The Meadowlands to get a casino for horse racing to survive at harness racing's biggest U.S. track.

For several years, The Meadowlands has been touting their nightly, weekly and yearly handle, which for 2024 averaged \$3 million a night for the fourth time in the last five years, by far the biggest number in the sport in all of North America.

Although those numbers paint a rosy picture, they're not the only elements that contribute to the finished work of art.

HRU spoke with Meadowlands president/chief executive officer Jeff Gural to get his thoughts on how 2024 went at harness racing's top track. This conversation took place last week, prior to The Meadowlands sending out a press release on Tuesday (Jan. 14) with the headline "Meadowlands revenue in decline" (see Page 8).

"I think from a betting standpoint, we're continuing to see a slow decline in our handle, mainly on-track and on the import side," Gural said. "We make most of our money on the import of other signals, and what you're seeing is a slow decline because our customers are old like me, and they're dying off, or they're betting on sports, which they can do. In New Jersey, you can play casino games online, so, we're competing with the casinos.

"Someone told me recently, he said, 'Jeff, think about it. Racing would be the equivalent of having a casino where the slot machines work for two minutes and then you shut them down for 22 minutes, and then they work for two minutes and then you shut them down.' He said, 'You know, people find other forms of gambling is just more action and less of a skill.' So, if

you're playing slot machines, you can press the buttons three or four times in a minute.

"If you're watching sports, you can have prop bets, so you can have action constantly, because things change in a football game — a long pass, an interception, a fumble — things can dramatically change quickly, so it's just more action. And there's a skill to betting on horse racing, and people just don't

have the time to learn that skill anymore. Back when I was young, the only gambling that existed was at racetracks, and they were packed. I would go all the time. I had a great time." Gural cited the recent pandemic as another reason why people no longer attend the races.

"COVID hurt us because it forced people who liked to bet on racing to learn how to use their phone or iPad to bet," he said. "Once they learned that then I think they basically said, 'Gee, this is a lot easier than fighting the traffic going to The Meadowlands.' So, I think COVID hurt us because of the fact that people were forced. If they wanted to bet, they had no choice but to bet online, and that's what happened." The Big M is also at a disadvantage as the only track in the Northeast to not have a casino, or, at the very least, slots.

"The other harness tracks are totally dependent on the revenue from slot machines, and the revenue from racing is unimportant and that's part of it... So, if we don't figure out a way to improve the product, who knows what could happen?"

Gural said. "It's not good."

According to Gural, one way to improve the product would be a casino at the East Rutherford mile oval.

"To be honest, I think if we don't get a casino at The Meadowlands in the next two or three years, most likely, or some kind of subsidy, then we would probably be closed, because I expect to lose money this year and next and I feel like nobody wants to write a check," he said. "So, it's very, very gloomy, although, to be honest, I'm optimistic that we will get a casino, that's my take. But without a casino, we're in big trouble."

Gural is well versed on what it would take to make a casino at The Meadowlands a reality.



"Two things have to happen," he said. "First, there has to be a referendum allowing casinos at The Meadowlands. And then once that happens, they would probably open bidding for casino companies to bid on building a casino at The Meadowlands... If they do open the casino and we're not the operator, then they have to reimburse us for the unamortized cost of what we spent, and then we would just close. So, if somebody got a casino at The Meadowlands and it wasn't us, then we would close the track, unless they made it so that that casino had to subsidize us."

Gural has been down a similar path before in New Jersey, since an amendment to expand casino gambling to Northern New Jersey was overwhelmingly defeated, by more than three-quarters of the voters, in 2016, leaving Atlantic City with a nearly five-decade monopoly on casino gaming in the Garden State.

"But the referendum [in 2016] was designed for us to lose, because basically it said, 'Are you in favor of a casino in Northern New Jersey?' it wasn't specifically at The Meadowlands, so my friends told me, 'I can't vote for that. I don't want to put the casino in my town,'" Gural said. "So, it's got to be at The Meadowlands, because there's no opposition to that, because no one lives there. Everybody knows how to get there. Everybody knows that the highways will go there, that involves 80,000 people. So, getting a few thousand people that come into a casino is not a big deal.

"So, those are the two things we need, the referendum that allows casino gambling at The Meadowlands, and then we would need to be awarded that license. I'm optimistic that would happen, but I feel that we can't put it on the ballot again and have it lose, it would never come back. So, my gameplan is to wait for New York to open the downstate casinos next year or in 2026 and hope that people who are living in northern New Jersey then have to go to Yonkers, or Aqueduct, but most likely Yonkers, and drive over the bridge, sit in traffic, and pay an \$18 toll or whatever it is. I'm hoping that people would look at it and say, 'Well, this is crazy. Why don't they put a casino at The Meadowlands?'

"But in the meantime, it has taken New York quite a long time to come up with a process, but it appears they now have a schedule, which would mean that they would be awarding the casino licenses at the end of next year, so hopefully Yonkers and Aqueduct get casino licenses because they can open quickly. Somebody else, it'll take them three or four years to build. So, I'm rooting hard for MGM [Yonkers Raceway] and Genting [Aqueduct] to get a license."

As for 2025, Gural will also be rooting hard on the first Saturday in August.

"Well, I'd like to win the Hambletonian," Gural said with a laugh. "I have a lot of horses; I'm partners with Ake [Svanstedt], and he's a great trainer. Last year, we won the Hambletonian Oaks with Warrawee Michelle, and we won the [Breeders Crown] 2-Year-old Filly Trot with a horse I bred [Lady Landia].

"I wish I knew what to do to get people to come more, it's frustrating. I really thought if I'd spent \$120 million to build a brand-new facility and made it cool that I could get people to come. We've succeeded in getting it on TV; lucky that I was friendly with the guy who's chairman of NYRA [New York Racing Association].

"It's frustrating that I can't get these 3-year-olds to race at 4, although, apparently, two of them are infertile and coming back to race at 4... The truth is, I don't even think it's such an economic benefit to not race at 4 to be honest. I raced Six Pack at 4 and he made over \$500,000. I had a great time watching him race and at the end of the day, when we syndicated him, we syndicated for the same price that we were offered when he was 3. So, by racing him, I made an extra [\$581,314], had fun, and [the syndication] didn't suffer at all financially... I mean, look at Europe. It's so much more successful in Europe. And the major differences are, they have fewer 2-year-old races, and they breed and race, so the best horses, people know who they are. Whereas our 2-year-olds, nobody knows who they are. But it is what it is.

"If we get a casino, and I have the money from the casino, I'll really invest in the sport, and then I'll be able to maybe make some changes by having races for the older horses. So, cross your fingers, because we need to get a casino."








Meadowlands revenue in decline

It is well known that The Meadowlands has for many years been the undisputed leader among standardbred tracks in both quality of product and handle on the races, averaging just over \$3 million per card again in 2024.

Unfortunately, operating without ancillary revenue from an alternate form of gaming and left to depend on money bet on the races as the main stream of revenue doesn't pay the bills, jeopardizing the industry leader's future.

The revenue being generated by the sources available cannot sustain purses at the current level, nor does it cover the cost of operations. That problem is compounded by the fact that handle on horse racing and in turn, the revenue derived from it, declines every year.

Despite the best efforts of Meadowlands management to stem the tide by offering a popular betting menu on full and competitive fields, guaranteed pools to enhance the most popular of those, the grandest stakes program in North America and a plethora of both racing and non-racing promotions, the declines in revenue continue and are taking their toll.

Those financial woes are complicated by the proliferation of sports betting options since FanDuel at The Meadowlands was the first to implement it in 2017. Sports betting took a 30 per cent hit when neighboring New York came online in 2022, and continues to face greater competition every year.

While the sports betting is indeed a separate entity from Meadowlands Racing, the agreement with the SBOA of NJ (Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of New Jersey) dictates that a percentage of the revenue be used for purses.

In 2024, The Meadowlands added \$2.5 million in sports betting revenue directly to the purse account and another \$11.5 million of that revenue was used to cover the losses accumulated operating the racetrack for the year.

To educate those involved in racing and illuminate the reality of racetrack operations, you'll find below the numbers to support the issues mentioned above:

Year-end summaries for pari-mutuel and FanDuel handle at The Meadowlands and Bayonne OTW for 2024:

In 2024 combined pari-mutuel handle was down compared to 2023 by \$18.8M or 5 per cent. We had the same number of race dates in 2024 as we did in 2023, but 2024 also saw The Meadowlands play host to the Breeders Crown Series in October. Live wagering is down \$930K (8 per cent), import is down \$8.5M (10 per cent) and export is down \$9.4M (4 per cent) for the year.

For the last four months, combined pari-mutuel handle is down \$4.75M or 5 per cent, with live being down \$54K (2 per cent), import down \$3.3M (12 per cent) and export down \$1.4M (2 per cent).

Pari-mutuel - \$1.3M net loss from racing revenues less statutory and purse related expenses.

Purse — \$789K loss to the purses of Meadowlands and Monmouth combined.

For FanDuel sports betting the 2024, combined handle is down

\$206M (4 per cent) from 2023. This consists of \$33.5M (12 per cent) in retail and down \$172.5M (4 per cent) in online.

Broken out are figures for September through December 2024 – football season. Historically, since sports betting became legal, wagering on football results in a redistribution of wagering dollars from racing to sports but has been a boon for FanDuel. (Please note, December is still being audited and has not been released publicly by FanDuel at this time).

At FanDuel over the last four months, combined handle is down from September through December 2023 \$462M (20 per cent) and consists of retail being down \$6.7M (7 per cent) and online being down \$455M (21 per cent).

The Meadowlands had two other online skins that stopped operating during 2024. PointsBet was acquired by Fanatics and stopped operating its online platform at The Meadowlands in May 2024 and Superbook stopped operations in July 2024. Both of these significantly impacted the cash flow of The Meadowlands negatively compared to 2023.

Bayonne Off Track Wagering outlet is down year-over-year \$5.1M (19 per cent) in handle for the year and down \$1.2M (15 per cent) for September through December.

Bayonne's impact is about a \$500K negative impact for year-over-year.

Meadowlands president Jeff Gural spoke to the problem, "Even though we spent over \$100 million to build a beautiful new facility which caters to owners, it has not resulted in drawing people, even horsepeople, to come to the track.

"The reality is that for us to continue to conduct a 90-day harness racing meet, The Meadowlands, like all the other harness tracks in the Northeast, needs the revenue a casino generates to help fund purses and operating costs.

"Every year our main competitor, Yonkers, receives \$50 million for purses while Pocono and Harrah's Philly each get around \$30 million in ancillary revenue from gaming. Without casino revenue, we receive only a \$6 million grant from the state and unlike the other tracks, we share our sports betting revenue with the horsemen.

"The truth is harness racing only exists in New Jersey because we have good lobbyists and provide thousands of jobs and green space, but our customers are continuing to die off which weakens our case each year.

"Making it worse, unlike here at The Meadowlands, the owners at all of the other racetracks are casino companies who would prefer to see horse racing disappear."

On Jan. 8, the Harness Racing Medication Collaborative (HRMC) members Joe Faraldo, chair, Mark Loewe, vice chair USTA, Dr. Kenneth McKeever, Dr. Thomas Tobin, Dr. Andy Roberts, Dr. Clara Fenger and Dr. Richard Balmer met along with Mike Tanner, USTA executive vice president.

An important topic of discussion which has plagued our industry has been the inability to detect unknown substances believed to be used in racing. Currently, performance enhancing drugs are rarely identified because most testing techniques only identify known, listed drugs.

HRMC, within its mission to advance drug testing, including setting national scientifically supported thresholds in harness racing, is pleased to endorse and support the use of an ion mobility mass spectrometer, which will be the first in use in harness racing, at the New York State Drug Testing and Research Lab. New York State still controls equine drug testing in harness racing, apart from New York thoroughbreds under the HISA labs.

Hopefully, this machine and any future AI technology will prove to be a new and valuable tool for use in harness racing, after the New York lab testing of the new technology is completed. The HRMC committee members overwhelmingly endorsed this newest innovation as a new tool able to identify sophisticated cheaters and eliminate them from New York harness racing.

New York will be the only state to test this technology in equine drug testing identification. If the machine performs as promised, it is presumed that it will be employed in other states where racing is conducted and apply to all harness racing.

Allegations of widespread illegal drug use in horse racing persists with the identity of performance enhancing drugs (PEDs) and is seldom reported. The primary reason there are so few positive findings is that most laboratories test for only known listed drugs. This is called targeted testing.

Recent developments in drug testing allows testing for thousands of drugs in a given sample without knowledge of their identity. This is called untargeted testing. This is what horse racing needs.

The ion mobility mass spectrometer reportedly can detect thousands of drugs and chemicals that are not detected using conventional testing methods currently in use in equine testing laboratories. The machine was used to detect 40 Kratom Alkaloids to demonstrate its fitness for purpose use in equine drug testing.

The recent Federal HISA/HIWU program that was established to stop illegal doping has not reported any new PEDs as drug testing under federal mandates has not improved over its state counterparts.

Of the thousands of potential PEDs available, ARCI lists 500, TOBA 196 and HIWU 1,280. Clearly, targeted drug testing is only the tip of the iceberg and has not deterred alleged PED use. Testing for other drugs that may be present is called untargeted testing with the objective to test for all possible drugs. The testing technology currently used in equine drug testing cannot accomplish this. Ion mobility mass spectrometry is a recent development that can improve the scope and sensitivity of drug testing and is ideally suited to untargeted drug testing.

After an accident, Tyler Angus never wrestled with getting back in the bike

The young horseman from Macedonia, OH, was down, but by no means out.

Tyler Angus' racing world came crashing down on him, literally, on the night of June 9, 2024.

In rein to Virgins Beach Boy in the 14th race at Northfield Park, Angus was involved in a multi-horse accident that occurred shortly after the three-quarter mark in the \$16,712 pace.

"It happened so quickly," he said. "I got knocked out and when I came to, I was on my way to the hospital. I didn't have a clue what happened. I was fortunate to come out of it with just a concussion. I didn't have any broken bones, so I was very grateful to come out of it the way I did."

Sidelined for two weeks, Angus leaned on lessons learned from another sport to help him navigate his way back to the race bike.

"I wrestled for a long time," said Angus, who was a standout on the mat, holding status as a state and national place-winner. "For me, it is hands down the best sport in the world. I played soccer, baseball, football – none of it compares to wrestling. The discipline and mentality – I think that is what helped me more than anything to get through those days I was sitting out. I leaned on what I learned from my wrestling days."

Still, there were hurdles to overcome before his return to action.

At times, the 22-year-old grappled with self-doubt.

"I didn't know if I was ever going to be what I was," Angus said. "The first time you have that major accident — it happens to everybody — you realize the biggest thing is how you come back from it."

On June 23, two weeks after the accident, Angus was listed for five drives.

In the minutes leading up to the start of the first race, he pointed Be A Lucky Star, a pacing son of Luck Be Withyou, towards his rail spot on the gate.

The pair rocketed to the front seconds after the field was on its way and held a near two-length lead after a quarter in :27.3.

Be A Lucky Star, who was 3¼ lengths clear turning for home, crossed the wire a 5¼-length winner in 1:55.2.

"It was a special win for obvious reasons," Angus said. "You never know how you will feel in that first race back."

But he wasn't done there.

Before the night was over, Angus would make two more trips to the winner's circle, all three of them coming for trainer Harla Loney.

"It was one of those weeks where everything was perfect," Angus said. "I was a little nervous, but after a month or so of driving, it felt normal again."

Yes, the mojo was back.

The rest of 2024, perhaps unsurprisingly, played out the way the previous five months and following six would.

"We had kicked the year off pretty well," Angus said. "At that time, I was still working for a guy named Brian Loney, who has been a very successful trainer for many years. Our first big night of 2024 was Jan. 23 when we won four races on the night – the most I had ever won on a single card. That was a big deal for me."

Three months later, in April, Angus recorded his first open score, the milestone coming with Nvrfearlloydishere, also a Harla Loney trainee.

"After the accident, it was up and down, but by the end of the year, it started going up again," Angus said.

On Dec. 23, Angus was named the 2024 recipient of the Peter Haughton Memorial Award. The award is presented to a young Ohioan who is an "up-and-coming" star in standardbred racing.

Last year, he won 88 races, to go along with 115 seconds, 131 thirds from 1,186 starts. His purse earnings topped \$1.1 million.

"Being able to come back was a big highlight," he said. "I also picked up a stakes drive for [trainer/driver] Stacie Currie, a 2-year-old named Fear The Thunder, in a Buckeye Division race in September. I ended up winning, which was my first stakes win in Ohio. That was huge for me."

As was in knowing that he had the fortitude and drive to handle the uncertainties of horse racing.

"You will be at your highest moment one week and then you could be at the bottom of the ladder the next week," said Angus, who drove his first official race Aug. 24, 2020, and piloted Ruffy's Desire, trained by Billy Rhoades, to a win at Canfield Fair. "It's crazy how quick things can happen and change. We started off so well and things went downhill for a while. And then we started having success again. It's been one hell of a ride."

With the 2024 campaign now in the rearview mirror, Angus, son of longtime trainer Ryan Angus, is eager to look ahead.

His goals, both in the short and long term, are lofty ones.

Even so, Tyler feels more equipped to handle whatever might come his way as he chases those objectives.

"I want to try and be a top five driver at Northfield," he said. "It will be very hard to do. You are driving against so many talented drivers, but I want to give that my best shot. If I can double my wins and purse earnings in 2025, that would be huge too.

"Ohio is my home, and I don't want to ever leave, but there is that feeling of wanting to take a shot out east and see if you can drive at The Meadowlands or Yonkers. That is going to be one of my long-term goals, to see if I can go there at some point and see if I can be successful."

Tyler understands the journey beyond the Buckeye State isn't something to be rushed.

"I know I have a long path ahead of me before I would even consider making my move out there," he said.

For now, the resilient reinsman will set his sights on crafting a successful 2025.

Come what may, Tyler is ready for whatever happens to be in store.

"You never know what each race will bring," he said. "It's why you appreciate the wins and the big moments and put the tough times in perspective."









Damian MacLellan is adding Mohawk to his list of firsts

The newest name in the Woodbine Mohawk Park drivers' standings is also the youngest, and one of the few in the current top 20 to currently train as well.

Damian MacLellan was en route to Flamboro Downs on Saturday (Jan. 11) when he found time for an interview. The 22-year-old was also listed to drive his girlfriend Grace Sorrie's horse Howmac Maximus (p, 5, 1:52.4S \$59,392) that night at Mohawk, where they finished second, after this interview.

Back on Dec. 20, it was Howmac Maximus who delivered MacLellan's first Mohawk victory. The pair bided their time behind pacesetting favorite Batterup Hanover and driver James MacDonald in a Pop-Up Series leg for male pacers, sweeping past down the stretch at odds of 13-1. The 1:52.4 mile was a new lifetime mark for the 6-year-old Articulator—Scirocco Miley Kay gelding.

MacLellan has only been competing since 2022, starting on the right foot by winning his first-ever drive in a pari-mutuel race:

May 26, 2022 at Red Shores Charlottetown, with trainer Jennifer Doyle's tough mare Elm Grove Mistress.

He also won his first pari-mutuel drive in Ontario, Nov. 25, 2022 at The Raceway at Western Fair, driving Stewart McQueen's gelding Dontdoubtthelakers.

The Inverness, NS, native spent most of 2024 racing in Prince Edward Island, collecting 48 wins from 327 total drives last year. Shortly after Howmac Maximus' Nov. 5 win at Red Shores Summerside, MacLellan and Sorrie (the sister of driver Austin Sorrie) made plans to revisit Ontario, where they had worked in the recent past.

"About a year ago, me and my girlfriend were up in Ontario, and we decided to go home for the summer and try and build up a stable of our own, which we did," said MacLellan.

"We had a couple of horses, and we were helping out her stepmom at the time, Tammy Collings. We had about 10, 12 horses between the two barns that we were all helping each other out with. We had a good summer, you know. We had fun. We always said that we would come back up to Ontario, whether just for the winter or permanently, you know what I mean? We don't have any set plans. We just play it by ear, so we decided to come back up."

MacLellan said that he, Grace, and Howmac Maximus left PEI for Ontario "the second week of November, and he was the only horse we brought with us." The gelding was a natural choice to bring along.

"He raced good down east all summer," said MacLellan. "He paced [1]:54-[1]:55 consistently down there [in PEI], so we thought we can come up here and race at Flamboro and London all winter."

Getting a maiden Mohawk win together was not in the original plans. Howmac Maximus had never raced on anything bigger than a half-mile track.

"We got up there [to Ontario] and we gave him a couple of weeks off from shipping up, then we started jogging him back," said MacLellan. "The Pop-Up Series became available and he fit it, so we decided to try it and he raced really good."

Howmac Maximus finished fourth in the Pop-Up Series opening leg Dec. 13; came back with a win Dec. 20; and has finished second in three subsequent starts at Mohawk, including the Dec. 27 Pop-Up Series final.

"A week before the series started, we took him to Mohawk and we schooled him," said MacLellan, who trains and drives Howmac Maximus. "I was really happy with the way he schooled. He was strong, he paced right through the wire. His first start, I wasn't expecting much, because I knew we still had to get some conditioning back from being off for 5-6 weeks.

"Going from racing on a half your whole life to going to the big track, it takes horses a start or two to adjust to that long stretch, you know. I didn't expect much, that first start. I more or less wanted to not abuse him, not hurt him, and hopefully get some money, and he raced really good. He was very strong heading to the wire, and his second start [at Mohawk], he drew good again on the gate in a pretty competitive class."

MacLellan said he "still gets chills" every time he wins a race, but Howmac Maximus' victory will always be special to him.

"I kind of knew he could do it, but at the same time, halfway down the lane, when you're 200-300 feet from the wire and you're still in front, it kind of hits you, like, 'Oh, I'm actually going to win a race at Mohawk,'" said MacLellan.

Recently celebrating his 22nd birthday, MacLellan said he knew it would take hard work to reach the level of visibility he would like as a potential catch driver at Mohawk.

"I went back to PEI [in 2024] to kind of reset myself, to regain my confidence and just try and get my name out there, because even though I was driving here and there when I was up here in Ontario the last time, I wasn't driving as much as I'd like to," he told HRU. "I figured if I went back home, I'd try to get my name on the program a lot and hopefully people would see me and start listing me again.

"The overall goal, probably for this year, would be to try and have the same year as I did last year, maybe a little bit better, with more wins, more money... It's hard to break in there [at Mohawk]. There's some really, really talented drivers there, and not too many spots open there, and of course, when there are spots open there, you've got your top 'B' track drivers that go there and fill in those spots."

MacLellan works full-time for trainer Robert Kyle Fellows now, as he has in the not-too-distant past, and frequently schools and qualifies horses from that barn at Mohawk. Grace also works at Fellows' Rockwood, ON training center, where Howmac Maximus is currently stabled.

Driving horses to the track as well as driving the horses themselves, the young trainer/driver with the one-horse stable said that long days and nights are just part of the game: "If you want to do good, you have to put in the time."

He recalled learning from mentors like his late father, Inverness horse owner Donald "Piper" MacLellan; his older brother, Donald; horseman Shelby Miller, who first let him sit behind a horse at Inverness Raceway; 2024 Atlantic Regional Driving Champion Redmond Doucet, Jr.; and Austin Sorrie, whom he speaks with regularly at Mohawk and the "B" tracks.

While acknowledging the depth of talent among Maritime drivers, Damian said that proving himself in Ontario is a bigger challenge.

"The only way people know you is if you just show up," he said. "Even if you're not listed on anything, try and be at the track as much as you can... because if people don't know who you are, they're not going to list you.

"The 'B' tracks are your stepping stone. Rob [Fellows] has been really good. He's been listing me on a majority of his 'B' track horses and we've had some luck. I've had a good run since we've come back up, and I hope things keep going in that direction."

Thanks to Howmac Maximus, Damian has already broken the ice at Canada's top track.

"That was pretty cool," he said, looking back at the Pop-Up Series upset. "There are not too many times you get to go by James MacDonald in the lane. I always wanted to drive at Mohawk, and never had a doubt that we could do it, but you try to set your goals realistically."

With a win (Ava Seelster), place (23-1 shot Northern Belle) and an off-the-board finish in his three drives at Flamboro Sunday (Jan. 12), it's very realistic to regard Damian as an emerging talent to watch this season.





Trotter with lowest earnings posts best performance in Prix de Belgique

Thomas Levesque's **Iroise de la Noe** (Tornado Bello) entered Sunday's (Jan. 12) \$125,000 Prix de Belgique as the least merited trotter chasing a spot in Prix d'Amérique 2025. But money earned doesn't count when horses race; Iroise de la Noe was the well-deserved winner when it all was summed up.

A three-wide opening didn't bother Iroise de la Noe, who overtook the lead from Ideal Ligneries with a mile to go in the 2,850-meter long race, and once in front, Levesque's trotter was too hard to beat. The 7-year-old mare won in a mile rate of 1:56 over 1.7 miles and behind her, two additional names were ensured for the Prix d'Amérique: Ideal Ligneries followed as runner up ahead of great finisher Hooker Berry (ready for the PdA since the first B-race) and Prix de Belgique-favorite It's A Dollarmaker.

This result means that there are some places left for horses with a high level of earnings and the ones that already now are set for Prix d'Amérique (if the connections surrounding the horses want to enter, respectively) are: Ampia Mede Sm, Don Fanucci Zet, Inmarosa and Kana de Beylev.

As it looks right now, all four horses will enter the Prix d'Amérique since Koctel du Dain, who has enough earnings for the race, will participate in the \$320,000 Prix Bold Eagle for 5-year-olds on Prix d'Amérique Day.

Inmarosa could be the horse that will be left outside of the 18-horse field on Jan. 26. It all depends on whether Keep

Going will race or not. Keep Going qualified for the PdA when he won the Criterium Continental on Dec. 22 and it's not completely certain if he will try the toughest race in Paris this year. He might very well opt for the Prix Bold Eagle, just like Koctel du Dain.

And speaking of Koctel du Dain (Boccador de Simm), Philippe Allaire's 5-year-old was one of the most dominating horses in the French K-crop as a 3- and 4-year-old, but even if solid performances have been delivered by Allaire's trotter, Koctel du Dain hadn't won since May 11, 2023 before Saturday's (Jan. 11) \$125,000 Prix de Croix.

David Thomain steered the 5-year-old Allaire trained colt to the lead at an early stage and as Thomain used the tactics of increasing the pace after the first half mile, the opponents faced hard tasks chasing the leading favorite.

Koctel du Dain sprinted to a safe win in a mile rate of 1:57 over 1.7 miles and, as mentioned earlier, the next objective will be the Prix Bold Eagle on Jan 26.

Sunday (Jan. 19) is the day when the world's biggest monté race is scheduled on the Vincennes race card. The \$750,000 Prix de Cornulier at over 2,700 meters has the runner-up from 2022 and 2023, Granvillaise Bleue looks to be the event's most merited horse as 18 trotters were still in the race on Wednesday night.

ERIK ADIELSSON RETIRES


One of Europe's most successful drivers in history, Erik Adielsson, 50, announced on Tuesday (Jan. 14) that he is retiring as a driver.

Adielsson has been prominent in the harness racing business since he was 18 years old. In just his third season as a driver, he drove Easy Lover in the Hambletonian at The Meadowlands.

Since the mid 1990s, Adielsson has been among the top European drivers and his track record is impressive. His four wins in the Swedish Derby is some of his best work.

Adielsson will now enter "the other side" of the industry. He will begin his work as head of judges for harness racing in Sweden, which is an occupation that will suit him well. Adielsson is well known for his ability to look at different racing situations with clear and impartial eyes and his new role will be very interesting to follow.









Down Under stars Leap To Fame, Swayzee, back in action

It has taken less than three weeks for the 2025 season to get serious Down Under.

The two biggest pacing stars — half-brothers Leap To Fame and Swayzee — both step-out for the first time this year.

Somewhat strangely, neither of them will be in Australia's biggest open class race this weekend, the \$100,000 Group 2 Ballarat Cup on Saturday night (Jan. 18). More on that race soon.

Swayzee will be the first big name to step-out when he takes what should be another step towards a new \$1 million bonus in the third leg of the five-race New South Wales Carnival of Cups series.

The 7-year-old has won the first two and victory in the third leg at Tamworth tonight (Jan. 17) will guarantee his connections at least a \$250,000 bonus.

Swayzee will be unbackable odds against just six vastly inferior rivals at Tamworth.

He then heads to Albury on Feb. 14 for leg 4 and then the final leg at Penrith on March 14.

Winning four of the five would snag Swayzee a \$500,000 bonus. It grows to \$1 million if he can win the lot.

Trainer Jason Grimson has already flagged bypassing Victoria's biggest race, the iconic Group 1 Hunter Cup on Feb. 1, to throw all focus at the bonus.

For the first time in his stellar career, the great Leap To Fame is returning from a setback.

The now 6-year-old battled a niggling throat infection late last year and missed three of the sport's biggest races, the Victoria and New Zealand Cup as well as the chance to defend his title in the NSW Inter Dominion series.

Leap To Fame hasn't raced since a Menangle win on Oct. 26.

Trainer/driver Grant Dixon admitted there is always some level of trepidation when bringing a horse back from a setback, especially a champion like Leap To Fame.

But he quickly added, after Leap To Fame sparkled in an Albion Park trial win last Friday, that all signs were the stallion's throat issue was history.

"It was a strong trial and he felt as though he could've gone much quicker," Dixon said. "His heart rate was great after it, which shows his fitness. We just want to get through this Albion Park run, which will certainly tell us if there is anything still lingering.

"If this week goes well, and with the run under his belt this week, that might be all he needs to prime him for the Hunter Cup.

"The way the travel works, he will be in Melbourne 10 days before the Hunter Cup, so there's the option to give him a run down there the week before, but it's in the plans at the moment. We'll finalize everything after he races this week."

Leap To Fame boasts 44 wins from just 55 starts and almost \$3.25 million in prize money.

Last year, Leap To Fame won the Hunter Cup, Cranbourne Cup, Newcastle Mile and Miracle Mile in the space of five weeks as part of a 13-race winning streak.

Dixon said a replica program was on the cards again, providing Saturday night goes to plan.

"If we're in Melbourne, it just makes sense to stay and do Cranbourne," he said. "Then, it worked well to go to Newcastle last year to qualify him for the Miracle Mile.

"There's been some talk Newcastle may not be a [Miracle Mile] qualifier this year, but it still seems to be and that's certainly our preferred pathway."

Rounding out a big weekend, many of Victoria's major Hunter Cup hopefuls will clash in the \$100,000 Group 2 Ballarat Cup on Saturday night.

Sadly, the race is a shadow of its glory days, but still an important guide to the likes of rejuvenated veteran Bulletproof Boy (gate 3), last week's Shepparton Cup winner Kanena Provlima (5) and classy Emma

Stewart-trained stablemates Mach Dan (7) and Perfect Class (8).

While the stars are spread far and wide this weekend, most of them will come together for the Hunter Cup.

Trainer Andy Gath has opted to bypass Ballarat and wait another week to unleash his \$2 million earner Catch A Wave, despite two recent impressive Melton trials.

"Historically, he's best when he backs up within a week going into a major race," Gath said. "So, if we wait and go to the Casey Classic next week, he can back-up the week after in the Hunter Cup."

Excitingly, waiting in the wings and ready to cross the ditch from New Zealand is one of its three pacers, Republican Party.

He brilliantly won the Flying Stakes at Cambridge last Thursday and will launch his Victorian campaign when he clashes with Catch A Wave in next Saturday's Casey Classic.

The Cran Dalgety-trained Republican Party has gone to a new level this campaign with Group 1 wins in the Auckland and Invercargill Cups, along with a placing in the New Zealand Cup behind Swayzee.

Just for good measure, Australia's emerging pacing star Don Hugo, who brilliantly won last month's NSW Inter Dominion final, is also being set for the Hunter Cup.

Interestingly, trainer/driver Luke McCarthy is leaning towards going into the race first-up.

Don Hugo hasn't raced since that Inter Dominion win on Dec. 14.

Award-winning duo helps lift Daley to Trainer of the Year honors

Noel Daley entered 2024 believing he had two of harness racing's top 3-year-old colts, pacer Captain Albano and trotter Sig Sauer, in his stable.

Exiting the season, those horses were named Dan Patch Award winners and helped propel Daley to his first Trainer of the Year honor.

With Captain Albano's victory in September's Little Brown Jug and Sig Sauer's triumph in October's Kentucky Futurity, Daley became only the fourth trainer since 1986 to win a Triple Crown race with each a pacer and trotter in the same year. Daley joined Tony Alagna (2020), Ron Burke (2017), and Jimmy Takter (2009, 2014) on the list of trainers to pull off that double in the past 38 years.


But Daley's successes went beyond his award-winning duo. The conditioner picked up Grand Circuit wins with seven other horses, totaling 19 victories on the circuit, and notched statebred stakes victories with an additional 10.

Among his other stakes-winners last year were Buy A Round (who earned \$390,182), Miss I La (\$337,420), Onajetplane (\$234,380), and Paulina Hanover (\$184,501). Buy A Round finished second in the Hambletonian Oaks and Miss I La was second in the Kentucky Filly Futurity. He also trained Miss Belmar, a Breeders Crown runner-up.

All totaled, Daley's stable banked 4.87 million in purses — a career high. His stable's earnings ranked 11th among all trainers in North America, with Daley's 603 starts being at least 299 fewer than seven of the trainers ahead of him.

"We had a bit of depth; that's probably what got it for us," Daley said, referring to his Trainer of the Year Award. "Obviously, we had the pacer and the trotter in the colts, but we had a few others that were able to have their moments in the sun. That all helped, I think.

"To be honest, I thought I'd have a shot in there, but I didn't think I would get it. That was a little bit of a surprise. I was just hoping the two 3-year-olds got their divisional honors, so I was pretty happy we got the lot. The ball landed in our court this year; we'll take it."



Sig Sauer hit the board in six of 10 races, winning five and earning \$871,812 for driver Andy McCarthy. In addition to the Kentucky Futurity, the colt's triumphs included a Breeders Crown, the Earl Beal, Jr. Memorial, and a division of the Stanley Dancer.

He was the season's fastest 3-year-old trotter, with a mark of 1:49.3, which he set in the Kentucky Futurity despite a parked-out trip. Only one 3-year-old trotter in history has gone faster, Six Pack with a 1:49.1 mile in the 2018 Kentucky Futurity.

"Sig Sauer winning the Kentucky Futurity was about the most satisfying moment I've ever had as a trainer," Daley said. "Just getting him there. It was a balance between having him sound enough and fit enough. We just had to manage him.

"He was coming off a break five weeks earlier, and didn't have a start in between. It was a little bit of a battle having him fit enough. We went in not really knowing where we were going to be. He warmed up good that day and Andy asked what I thought. I had pulled his shoes, and I said, 'I'm not going to look for the first couple of hundred yards, just head on out of there [from post eight] and see what happens.'

"Andy basically left out of there, dropped in for about five steps, and then was parked every step. But [Sig Sauer] showed him who he was that day. He was just the best of them. A good Sig

Sauer, a sound Sig Sauer, I think on his day was just better than them. He wanted to do it, so that was a big help. He was a pretty determined horse."

Sig Sauer was retired following his win in the Breeders Crown. The stallion is at Hanover Shoe Farms in Pennsylvania for the 2025 breeding season. The son of Muscle Hill—Sigilwig was owned during his racing career by Patricia Stable, Joe Sbrocco and JAF Racing, Allister Stables, and Caviart Farms.

"In the Breeders Crown, Andy just gave him a great trip," Daley said. "That was a good way to end out for him. His book was full in no time with a book of good mares. He's going to have every chance. With his personality, his determination, I'll be shocked if he doesn't get the job done there. He's got breeding and he was a real looker, that horse."

Captain Albano was a repeat Dan Patch Award winner. He hit the board in 16 of 18 races last year, winning 12 and earning \$1.1 million for driver Todd McCarthy. In addition to the Little Brown Jug, the colt's victories included the Adios, Max C. Hempt Memorial, Progress Pace, and Matron Stakes. He is owned by Patricia Stable, LA Express and Sjoblom Inc., Sjoblom Racing, and Michael Dolan.

He joined Perfect Sting, Tall Dark Stranger, Somebeachsomewhere, Captaintreacherous, and Bettors Delight as male pacers to be Dan Patch Award winners at both 2 and 3 this century.

"Albano' was just so honest," Daley said. "He sort of just was unlucky in the big ones, but he showed in the other races that he could do it.

"He was so good Jug Day. He came out of the first heat and couldn't blow a match out. I thought that if they couldn't beat him in the first heat, there's no shot they're going to beat him in the second heat. I was super confident he would win that. All his owners were there, they all made the trip. That was really good for them. It was a lot of fun."

Captain Albano was expected to retire to stallion duty this year, but after fertility testing, the decision was made to return to the races.

"That wasn't planned," Daley said. "I raced him so long, we basically two days later [after the Progress Pace in late November] had to test him. They thought he was just having a blockage. It went on for a week, 10 days, and then it got too late that you had to let people know. He was going to have a full book, but we couldn't hold people to him while we waited.

"If I had to bring one back, I don't mind bringing him back at all. I'm going to test him again in the next couple of weeks and if he's OK, we might breed maybe 20 mares here in New Jersey and race him as well. He's been back [in Daley's barn] a week now. I don't think he has to step up much to be competitive with those open horses. We'll just see how it works out. He's very easy to be around. I'm looking forward to racing him."

Daley, Sig Sauer, and Captain Albano will be among the honorees at the Dan Patch Awards banquet, presented by Caesars Entertainment, Feb. 23 at Rosen Centre in Orlando, FL.

Details announced for 2025 Mohawk Million

Woodbine Entertainment is now accepting entries to purchase a slot in the 2025 Mohawk Million (G1).

Following significant interest in 2024, Woodbine has kept the price of purchasing a slot in the Mohawk Million at \$50,000. A total of 10 slots will again be available and Woodbine will add \$500,000 to maintain the \$1 million purse.

The Mohawk Million for 2-year-old trotters is scheduled for Saturday (Sept. 20) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The deadline to purchase a slot for the Mohawk Million is Tuesday (Feb. 18). The interested parties must submit \$25,000 by that date. The remaining \$25,000 of the slot fee is then due by June 2.

Should more than 10 parties submit to purchase a slot, a draw will be held to determine the 10 slot owners. Each slot is an entity that may be sold, traded or leased. Slot owners must declare a horse to race in their slot by Monday (Sept. 15) at noon.

The lone change to conditions for 2025 is limiting owners and trainers to declaring a maximum of the three horses to the Mohawk Million race.

Brittany Farms receives USHWA's President's Award

One of harness racing's storied and most prestigious breeding farms, Brittany Farms, has been selected by the president of the United States Harness Writers Association, Michael Carter, to receive a President's Award.

Brittany Farms, located in Kentucky, ceased operations as a premier breeding facility at the end of 2024 following the sale of its final crop of yearlings, but it will continue to use the Brittany Farms name on any horses with which owner and Hall of Famer George Segal stays involved (Segal acquired the Clermont Farms property of Bill Shehan in 1985 and has operated it as Brittany since). It also will be associated with the farm's final few crops of racehorses, continuing its longstanding tradition of quality.

Brittany's success is well-documented in the annals of the sport. Brittany (in 2019 and 2020 named by USHWA as Breeder of the Year since the award was opened to voter selection in 2012) and Hanover Shoe Farms (the winner of the 2024 Breeder award) have been locked in a contest for the top spot of Breeders Crown winners bred for years. It has produced 47 millionaires on the racetrack; among the top horses associated with Brittany have been Artsplace, Manchego, Art Major, Bettors Wish, and Passionate Glide.

"Brittany Farms has long been one of the sport's top breeding farms," Carter said. "Segal, along with his team headed by Art Zubrod, Leah Cheverie, and Myron Bell, not only breed champions, but they give back to the sport and the community in other ways. Brittany Farms has been a huge supporter of the Harness Horse Youth Foundation and many other industry initiatives, while Zubrod and Cheverie have been an integral part of the USHWA Caretaker of the Year award.

"Brittany's constant community outreach and support of the industry as a whole are part of the many reasons why Brittany Farms has become respected throughout the entire standardbred breeding and racing industry," Carter said.

Brittany Farms will be recognized at the 2024 Dan Patch Awards banquet, presented by Caesars Entertainment, which will honor the best of the best of harness racing, both human and equine. Jugette winning trainer Jessica Roegner and the connections of Breeders Crown champions Allegiant, Miki And Minnie, Sig Sauer, and Louprint will be presented Special Recognition Awards at the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association Annual Awards Banquet.

Roegner, a Northfield Park-based trainer, is being recognized for her 2024 Jugette victory with Soft Shot at the Delaware County Fair. Despite being a supplemental entry, Soft Shot won her elimination in a world record of 1:49.3 and capped it off with the Jugette final. The 3-year-old filly pacer closed out her season with 11 victories in 15 starts, earning \$232,520 under Roegner's conditioning.

Ryan Smith of Dennison, OH, is being recognized as the owner of 3-year-old filly trotter Allegiant. Allegiant hit the board in 12 of 19 races, winning six including the Breeders Crown. She bankrolled \$748,027 in 2024 and over \$1 million lifetime. Allegiant was named the 2024 3-Year-Old Filly Trotter of the Year by the U.S. Harness Writers Association.

Robert Mondillo of Delaware, OH, will receive the Special Recognition Award for his part ownership of Miki And Minnie.

The 2-year-old pacing filly won the Breeders Crown and the Three Diamonds at The Meadowlands. She never missed the board in 11 seasonal starts, taking a record of 6-4-1 and earning \$843,086. Mondillo also co-bred Miki And Minnie, named the 2024 2-Year-Old Filly Pacer of the Year by the U.S. Harness Writers Association.

Joe Sbrocco of Brecksville, OH, is being recognized as part owner of Sig Sauer. The 3-year-old colt trotter won half of his 10 seasonal starts, including the Breeders Crown and Kentucky Futurity in a career-best of 1:49.3. Sig Sauer made over \$870,000 during his sophomore campaign, upping his lifetime earnings to \$1.15 million. He was named the 2024 3-Year-Old Colt Trotter of the Year by the U.S. Harness Writers Association.

Ronnie Wrenn, Jr., a staple in the Northfield Park driving colony, drove Louprint to victory in the Breeders Crown for freshmen colt pacers in 1:49.1. The triumph was the first win of its kind for Wrenn. The U.S. Harness Writers Association named Louprint the 2024 2-Year-Old Colt Pacer of the Year.

OHHA 2024 Outstanding Groom Award presented to William Chubb

William Chubb of Columbus, OH, has been named the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association Outstanding Groom for 2024.

Chubb has worked for the Jim Arledge Stable since 2000 and received several nominations.

"If something needs to be done, Willie knows what to do," said Ohio trainer Tye Loy who was one of Chubb's nominators. Loy complimented Chubb's dedication to each horse and love of the sport.

Chubb has been in the industry for over 40 years, getting his start at Wildwood Farms, in Georgia.

Seaside Diva Named Ohio 3-Year-Old Filly Pacer of the Year

For the fourth time in six years, the defending freshman filly pacer of the year has stepped up to repeat as a sophomore. This year Seaside Diva followed the path of McSeaside (2024), Sea Silk (2022), and Queen Of The Pride (2019) to be named the 2024 Ohio 3-Year-Old Filly Pacer of the Year.

Owned and bred by Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi, Knox Services, and Let It Ride Stables, Seaside Diva was undefeated in the Ohio Sires Stakes, taking all five legs and the \$300,000 Scarlet Championship. In 2024, the daughter of Downbytheseaside bankrolled over \$570,000.

Seaside Diva claims a record of 17-5-3 in 31 career starts, banking \$812,595 in lifetime earnings. She is trained by Ron Burke.

Tennessee Tom named Ohio 3-Year-Old Colt Trotter of the Year

Repeat divisional award winner, Tennessee Tom won six of 11 starts on his way to being named Ohio's 3-Year-Old Colt Trotter of the Year.

Owned by Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi, Hatfield Stables, and Knox Services, Tennessee Tom hit the board nine times this season, making \$294,530. The son of Long Tom won the James K. Hackett Memorial at Miami Valley Raceway, three legs of the Ohio Sires Stakes, and the \$142,000 Ohio State Fair Stakes.

Tennessee Tom was named the Ohio 2-Year-Old Colt Trotter of the Year in 2023. He claims a record of 11-4-2 in 20 career starts, banking \$750,880 in lifetime earnings.

Ron Burke trains Tennessee Tom. Albert Miller bred the trotter.

Clegg and St. Louis to receive Racing With The Stars Award at Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association Annual Banquet

Betty Clegg and Marc St. Louis, Jr. will receive the Ohio Racing With The Stars award as the top trainer and driver on the Ohio county fair racing circuit in 2024 at the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association Annual Banquet on Saturday, Jan. 18.

Clegg led all Ohio trainers with 75 fair wins last summer. In 2024, she had 114 total winners with earnings of \$879,270.

St. Louis won 114 Ohio fair races last year. Overall, in 2024 he won 166 races and earned \$936,233.

Sugar Instead named Ohio 3-Year-Old Filly Trotter of the Year

Sugar Instead dominated the ranks of sophomore filly trotters, earning the Ohio Triple Crown on her way to being named the Ohio 3-Year-Old Filly Trotter of the Year.

Owned by Joyce McClelland and Larry Wills and bred by Elmer Miller, Sugar Instead won 15 of 17 starts this year. Her victories included the \$139,000 Ohio State Fair Stakes, the \$113,640 Ohio Breeders Championship, and the \$300,000 Ohio Sires Stakes Scarlet Championship to earn the Buckeye State's only Triple Crown of 2024. She was undefeated in Ohio, banking \$541,739 in seasonal earnings.

Sugar Instead was named the Ohio 2-Year-Old Filly Trotter of the Year in 2023. She claims a record of 22-2-1 in 28 career starts, banking \$915,664 in lifetime earnings. She is trained by Virgil Morgan, Jr.

It was the fourth time in the last six years that the 2-year-old champion repeated as a 3-year-old. Rose Run Yolanda did it in 2023, Gabbys C Note in 2022, and Only Take Cash accomplished the feat in 2019.

All of the above will be honored at the OHHA Annual Awards Banquet on Saturday (Jan. 18) at the Marriott Columbus Airport in Columbus, OH. Seats are sold out.

Cellmate looks to escape with fifth straight win at Big M

Winter racing at The Meadowlands has featured competitive, full fields, and while 10 starters behind the gate is supposed to be a hindrance to horses looking to compile long winning streaks, such is not the case for Cellmate.

He's popular with his fans — not to mention owners and trainers at the claiming box — having gone unbeaten in his last four starts, and the 5-year-old gelded son of Huntsville—Twin B Bikini will ramp up his drive for five Saturday (Jan. 18) in the sixth race at The Big M. He'll leave from post 2 with Jason Bartlett in the bike as the 5-2 morning-line favorite.

"I didn't notice the horse," said Frank Calcagni, who became Cellmate's trainer at the conclusion of his win last week. "My owners picked up on him. They kind of pick out their own horses. Cellmate slipped through the cracks on me, but he seems to be running on all cylinders right now. I like the lines on him and he's nice to be around."

Cellmate's streak started on Dec. 7 in a \$20,000 claimer with a victory for trainer Tom Fanning at the mile oval as the 4-5 favorite, which was followed by a win at 10-1 from post 8 at Yonkers 12 days later in another \$20,000 claiming event. After that race, trainer Mark Ford took Cellmate home on his trailer.

The next two starts — both in East Rutherford — brought more visits to the winner's circle. A Dec. 28 score as the 9-5 public choice in a \$25,000 claimer was followed by the last of Cellmate's "Fab Four," another victory at the \$25,000 claiming level, this time as the 2-1 favorite. That's when Calcagni and his owners claimed the lifetime winner of 14 of 58 starts, who has earnings of \$115,561.

"I'm just going to give him a light week," said Calcagni. "Cellmate was pressed in his win last week. I like that Hunt For Cash [who was second in that race], too. I had him in my barn a few weeks ago.

"I go by the horse's form [when considering claims]. I look back four, five, 10 lines and try to pick a horse that's in form or getting in form."

For Calcagni, the objective is to not have trainees in his barn for an extended period of time.

"I don't like keeping horses very long," said the 43-year-old conditioner. "Not more than a year. I want to see how they pan out, then I like to move them. I like fresh faces. I'm starting to get into the claiming game a little bit more. Horses can stay sharp when they move around from barn to barn."

So, what's the hope with Cellmate?

"I wouldn't mind if he won this week and got claimed right back," said Calcagni. "He's in the right [\$25,000] class. I would

expect someone to put in a claim on him, but sometimes people are a little shy the first time in a new barn."

Maybe that means Cellmate will get a stay from the Governor and get to be in Calcagni's barn for another week or two.

SHOWING THE KIDS A THING OR TWO: The cold weather is supposed to be a time of year when the bigger names in The Meadowlands driver colony are vacationing somewhere warm, affording the track's "Young Guns" an opportunity to win a lot of dashes.

Apparently, Dave Miller and Bartlett have a youthful spring in their respective steps.

Through the first four race cards of 2025, the 60-year-old Miller, who has said this will be his last year racing full time at The Big M, has 10 victories, good for second in the standings. He's been ultra-consistent, recording no fewer than two but no more than three wins on any program.

Bartlett, 43, leads the colony with 14 walks down victory lane. The 13-time Yonkers kingpin won six races on Jan. 4 and followed that up with five more last Saturday (Jan. 11).

Thus far in 2025, only nine drivers have two or more Meadowlands wins. Miller and Bartlett have been so dominant, their total of 24 victories are equal to that of the next seven drivers in the standings combined.

'Brue' trips out, takes Big M feature

Dave Miller wasn't exactly sure how things were going to go for him and **Brue Hanover** in the Saturday night (Jan. 11) featured \$24,000 high-end conditioned pace at The Meadowlands, but a combination of early aggressiveness followed by typical Miller patience resulted with the pair in the winner's circle at the conclusion of a 1:50.2 mile.

"I wasn't sure how I was going to race him," said the Hall of Fame pilot, who led the Big M driver colony in dash wins during 2024. "But it worked. I think I've actually [driven] him before and under-drove him, so tonight, I thought we're going to take a shot [and leave the gate]."

Miller hit the gas pedal from post 6 in the nine-horse field (there was one scratch) at the start and had the point on a windy, chilly night in :27.2. That's when Jordan Stratton put For Once Inmy Life in motion from the 3-hole and quickly brushed to the top just after the three-eighths before hitting the half in :55.1.

Seeking a third straight win two weeks after beating Oakwood Heymiki IR, For Once Inmy Life turned for home with the lead off three-quarters in 1:23. But holding the advantage would prove too tough this time around.

Waiting until just inside the eighth pole, Miller moved Brue Hanover to the outside to challenge and achieved top gear nearing the wire to record a three-quarter-length win over a stubborn For Once Inmy Life. Chase H Hanover stayed close to the action throughout to finish a ground-saving third. Sport Secret, the 6-5 favorite, failed in his bid for a third straight score and finished fourth.

"I don't know how it would have gone if we had raced on the lead," said Miller. "But my horse got covered up and the trip worked out perfectly."

A 5-year-old gelded son of Stay Hungry—Blind Ambition who is trained by Ron Burke, Brue Hanover returned \$6 to his backers as the 2-1 second choice. He now has 19 wins from 66 lifetime starts, good for earnings of \$294,581 for owners Burke Racing and Weaver Bruscemi.

BARTLETT KEEPS ROLLING: After winning six races one week ago on Jan. 4, the scalding-hot Jason Bartlett put up five more victories on the Saturday card.

The 43-year-old perennial Yonkers kingpin has been a Saturday sensation at The Big M of late. On Dec. 7, he won five times to become just the second driver in 2024 to win that many on a card twice. Bartlett then had a four-bagger on Dec. 28 as a prelude to his heroics over the last two weeks.

A LITTLE MORE: A carryover of just over \$5,000 coerced players to bet \$22,275 in "new money" into the 20-cent Pick-6 pool for a grand total of \$27,448. After a sequence that saw winners'

odds of 1-2, 3-1, 2-1, 2-1, 3-5 and 1-1 many bettors collected the payout of \$205.84... Joe Bongiorno had a driving double and led the trainers with three victories... Miller recorded his second straight 10-winner weekend after taking three walks down victory lane... All-source handle totaled \$3,263,716 on the 14-race card to complete the first \$6 million weekend at The Big M since Nov. 29-30.

Michael Merton, Laura Aldrich take titles at Monticello Raceway

The curtain fell on the 2024 racing season at Monticello Raceway with Laura Aldrich taking her second consecutive training title and Michael Merton taking home top driver honors for the third time at his hometown track.

Merton handily took the 2024 title with a 14-win cushion of 241 wins and earnings of \$1,064,580. In addition to competing at Monticello, he also drove successfully at Tioga Downs. His brother Greg finished second with 227 winning drives and earnings of \$997,680. Former multiple dash winning driver James Taggart, Jr. was third with 196 wins; Taggart also eclipsed the milliondollar mark with purses of \$1,016,101. Another former multiple dash winner, Bruce Aldrich, Jr., finished fourth with 174 wins. Kyle DiBenedetto had an excellent year with 133 trips to the winner's circle to take the fifth slot. Thomas Merton also broke into the top 10 with 125 wins, good enough for sixth place.

The last two scheduled racing days of the 2024 season were canceled due to warming temperatures affecting the racing surface. The loss of the two dates may have had an impact on the race for leading dash winning trainer. Monica Eriksen was loaded with entries on Monday and Tuesday in an effort to catch Laura Aldrich but was thwarted with the forced cancellations.

Aldrich, 2023's leading trainer, copped the 2024 title in a tight battle with Eriksen. Aldrich had 104 winners hailing from her barn, while Eriksen was second with 100 winners. Gary Messenger took the show spot with 73, Danny Gill was fourth with 68 wins and Art Green had 53 winners.
