For Brittany Farms, smaller means bigger

The famed Kentucky farm scored its second straight Breeder of the Year award despite downsizing significantly five years ago.

Art Zubrod prefers to look forward, not wallow in past glory, but he can't hide his pride about the fact Brittany Farms has celebrated back-to-back Dan Patch Breeder of the Year awards *after* the famed Kentucky farm downsized significantly about five years ago.

Zubrod, Brittany's only general manager since it was founded by owner George Segal in 1983, said continuing to produce champions such as Dan Patch winners Perfect Sting, Bettors Wish and Manchego, despite fewer mares and fewer acres, "has been thrilling.

"It means a lot to my wife (Leah Cheverie) and I, and George and everybody here at the farm," Zubrod said of the Breeder of the Year title, the farm's fourth to go with ones it earned in 2019, 2006 and 1996. "It validates what you've been doing all your life."

In 2016, Brittany sold some 850 acres of the 1,000 acres that comprised its original farm in Versailles, KY and moved down the road to a new 121-acre site and retooled.

"We downsized for many reasons," Zubrod said. "We found a

nice farm and we just continued our program. We kept the right mares, but we're still trying to improve our broodmare band. We're not quitting, we're looking at Perfect Sting as our next stallion."

In 2020, Brittany was third among breeders with its progeny earning over \$5.5 million. Brittany also tied Hanover Shoe Farms for producing the most Breeders Crown winners (27) in history.

In 2021, Brittany is poised to be just the third breeder — behind Hanover and Winbak Farms — to top \$200 million in total progeny earnings.

This from an operation that now sports just 39 mares.

"When we made the decision to sell the old farm, which it took us four years to do that, we were over 100 (mares) and by the time we sold the farm we were low to mid 60s, 62 or 63. Our broodmare band is always in flux. We always have fillies coming off the racetrack and we have to downsize and we're at 39 right now," Zubrod said.

The secret to Brittany's continued success — beyond making judicious decisions in retaining mares and breeding them to the right stallions — may just be in the soil at the new farm, Zubrod said.

"The geology of this place is incredible. I thought it was, but until I'd spent a couple of years here I wasn't sure. If you read the history of Kentucky and raising horses, water is important. I think that means there's either water going through your farm or around your farm. You really need your farm to have access to water. Not drinking water, because those days are gone, but I believe the water that's around your farm helps the limestone to come up through the soil. We're very, very shallow here and there's no clay on this farm or we have not found any clay, it's all top soil. A lot of places on the farm are two, three feet deep and when you get a little bit of a drought, it'll brown up real fast here, faster than other places, but there's so many springs and so much water surrounding us that, with just a half inch of rain, it looks like Ireland again. I think that's an advantage that we have here."

Another advantage is a farm small enough to easily keep tabs on all the horses.

"You can pretty well see everything from either my house or the office. There's hardly any field that you can't see," Zubrod said.

Also, the new Brittany Farms has proven particularly effective in allowing horses to reach their potential, Zubrod said.

"We've got six or seven in each field and two guys in charge of that, that are very comfortable. They are very

relaxed and I think that's a big portion... certainly, pedigree and whatnot is important, but our horses seem to be so relaxed. Nothing bothers them.

"Over the hill from us, they hunt a lot. Some Saturdays, it's just non-stop explosions of those shotgun shells and these horses don't even lift their head up from eating."

As for 2021, Zubrod and the Brittany team are excited about the sophomore prospects of Perfect Sting, who was, fittingly, perfect in 10 starts as a 2-year-old before being turned out at Brittany last fall.

"(Trainer Joe Holloway) sent him here to turnout after the season, and he's the soundest horse I've ever gotten back from the racetrack. This horse didn't have anything, nothing, I could work on," Zubrod said.

"I've been doing this for close to 50 years and this is the most professional horse that I've ever been around in my life. It was so exciting for Leah and myself to have this horse here. He does nothing wrong; he takes care of himself. He exercised and he's good with people. He did make a buddy with a trotter we have here, a horse named Ethics that Julie Miller is going to train as a 3-year-old. They were buddies and they'd be fun to watch. Over the fence, they'd try to get each other going. They both have got a lot of personality. One would ignore the other one and that would make the other one really mad, so it's been a lot of fun with him.

"He's an absolutely gorgeous horse."

At age 6, Manchego is back in training with Nancy Takter. Bettors Wish is beginning his stallion career at Diamond Creek Farm of Pennsylvania.

"He's a really neat horse with a lot of personality. He seemed to be a very sound horse, too, so hopefully he can pass that on," Zubrod said of Bettors Wish, owned, in part, by Zubrod and Cheverie's Fair Island Farm Inc. (the Breeder of the Year in 2002).

Then there are the new crop of Brittany 2-year-olds which Zubrod hopes will prove to have its share of champions.

"I'm excited about my yearlings, excited about the foals coming, excited about the ones I'm going to breed," he said.

The decision to downsize Brittany is, in large part, because Segal – who was also Breeder of the Year in 1992 with late horse partner Brian Monieson – has no apparent heirs in his family willing to continue on with the horses. At age 82, Segal is slowly winding down the operation.

But when the day finally comes to close down one of harness racing's greatest breeding operations, Segal, Zubrod, Cheverie and the rest of the Brittany team are determined to

go out on top.

"We all know this is going to come to an end, probably sooner than later when you look at being here over 30 years, but I think we're all going to go out having some fun," Zubrod said.

Wrapping up 2020 Dan Patch awards by the numbers

Interesting notes and numbers from the 2020 Dan Patch winners:

1. Dan Patch-winning brothers! Nice job by Andrew McCarthy with Ramona Hill and Todd McCarthy with Anoka Hanover. Each driving brother won a division title with a trotting filly. Females were also in the spotlight in 2014 when Trace Tetrick won the 3YOFP division with Colors A Virgin over Sayitallbb 106-40. Tim Tetrick drove the Horse of the Year J K She'salady her final two starts to wrap up the title, and also was the regular driver behind Androvette who tied with Rocklamation for the Older Pacing Mare title. Tim also drove the Trotting Mare Of The Year Classic Martine.
2. The Trotter of the Year and Pacer of the Year awards were started in 1970. Before that, it was Horse of the Year only.
3. Prior to 1978, there was only one award per age and gait, with males and females combined as in a Two-Year-Old Pacer of the Year. Since '78, each division has honored both a male and female horse.
4. Gimpanzee as Trotter Of The Year follows Greenshoe in 2019, both for trainer Marcus Melander. This year, three different sets of stablemates won year-end awards:
Nifty Norman— Fire Start Hanover (2YOFP) and Amigo Volo (3YOCT).
Nancy Takter (3) — Kissin In The Sand (Older Pacing Mare), Manchego (Older Trotting Mare) and Tall Dark Stranger (HOY, Pacer of the Year and 3YOCP).
Chris Ryder— Bettors Wish (Older Pacing Male) and Party Girl Hill (3YOFP).
Note: Owner Of The Year" the Pinsky stable had three — Venerate, Amigo Volo and Fire Start Hanover.
5. Thirty years elapsed from a trotter winning the Breeders

Crown/division title at 2-3-4. It happened with Peace Corps then and with Mack Lobell in 1986-1987-1988. Gimpanzee now joins that elite company.

6. Why has no horse repeated as HOY in the 21st century? For starters, 11 of 21 retired after winning it, including Tall Dark Stranger this year. Moni Maker doubled up in 1998-1999, as did Mack Lobell 1987-1988, Cam Fella 1982-1983 and Niatross 1979-1980.


7. Six of the 12 Breeders Crown winners also won their divisions. Oddly, not Tall Dark Stranger (second) or Party Girl Hill (third) the top two in the Horse of the Year tally.

8. Dexter Dunn had five division winners the year he turned 31 — Fire Start Hanover, Manchego, Kissin In The Sand, Party Girl Hill and Bettors Wish. Tim Tetrick set the all-time record of seven division title-winners in 2012, the year he turned 31 — Chapter Seven, Market Share, Check Me Out, Captaintreacherous, Heston Blue Chip, American Jewel and Anndrovette.



9. Tall Dark Stranger is the 19th winner from the male sophomore pacing division (26 per cent) in the 74 years of balloting to be named Horse of the Year.

1949 — Good Time 19 15-2-1 First to come back and do it again (in 1952 at age 6).

1957 — Torpid 22 19-1-2 John Simpson, Sr.'s lone HOY.

1965 – Bret Hanover 24 21-3-0. The only pacer to win three HOY titles.

1971 – Albatross 28 25-2-1. The richest one and two season horse \$558G-\$1 million+ covering the '71-'72 seasons.

1976 – Keystone Ore 33 22-9-1 back-to-back for Stanley Dancer on this list.

1978 – Abercrombie 33 22-6-3. The first to \$700,000 in a single season. Sired Artsplace.

1980 – Niatross 26 24-0-0. Rewrote record books with a \$1.4 million season. He out-earned all thoroughbreds, too, in 1980.

1982 and 1983 – Cam Fella 33 28-2-0 in 1982 (and started 69 times in two HOY seasons).

1985 – Nihilator 25 23-1-0. The last to retire as the richest and fastest ever and the first to \$3 million lifetime among pacers.

1990 – Beach Towel 23 18-4-0. The first to eclipse \$2 million in one year.

1991 – Precious Bunny 25 20-3-1. Back-to-back \$2 million single seasons between him and Beach Towel.

1994 – Cams Card Shark 18 15-2-0. Died in 2020.

2000 – Gallo Blue Chip 29-19 5-1. The richest single-season gelding.

2003 – No Pan Intended 21 17-3-0. The only Triple Crown and Breeders Crown winner.

2005 – Rocknroll Hanover 18 12-4-2. Brett Pelling's lone HOY.

2008 – Somebeachsomewhere 15 14-1-0. The last sophomore named HOY to also set the single season money record and the 11th to do so.

2010 – Rock N Roll Heaven 21 16-2-1.

2015 – Wiggle It Jiggleit. The last \$2 million single-season earner.

2020 – Tall Dark Stranger. The only millionaire in 2020 in all of standardbred racing. Both he and his sire, Bettors Delight (2001) won their divisions.

Tall Dark Stranger's owners reflect on his brilliant career

Tall Dark Stranger will go down in history as the winner of the 2020 Horse of the Year Award handed out by the U.S. Harness Writers Association. For the members of his ownership group, he might be remembered as the horse of a lifetime.

Michelle and Al Crawford's Crawford Farms Racing, Marvin Katz, Judy and Buck Chaffee's Caviart Farms, and Howard Taylor shared ownership of Tall Dark Stranger throughout his racing career, which concluded last fall with 19 wins and two second-place finishes among 22 starts. He earned \$2.02 million lifetime.

As a 3-year-old, Tall Dark Stranger won 11 of 13 races and \$1.30 million. He was harness racing's only millionaire in the COVID-19 impacted season and his triumphs included the Meadowlands Pace, North America Cup, Cane Pace, and Kentucky Sire Stakes final.

He is the only horse to ever win the Metro Pace and a Breeders Crown as a 2-year-old and the Meadowlands Pace and North America Cup as a 3-year-old.

Tall Dark Stranger established his career-best win time of 1:47.1 in a stakes-record Cane Pace performance at The Meadowlands last August. Only six 3-year-old pacers in history have gone faster. He also won twice in 1:47.2 last season, making him the only 3-year-old pacer in history with more than two victories in 1:47.2 or faster.

One of the 1:47.2 triumphs came in the Meadowlands Pace, which he won in dramatic fashion, giving up the lead to Papi Rob Hanover in the stretch before fighting back to win by a neck. He became well known for fighting his rivals in the stretch and winning tight finishes — six of his 11 victories at 3 came by a half-length or less.

Even in defeat, Tall Dark Stranger gained admiration. His second-place finish in last year's Breeders Crown colt-and-gelding pace came after he set a stakes record with a :52.3 half and battled nearly the entire field as he came down the stretch. He held them all off except

Sandbetweenmytoes, who rallied on the far outside to win in the final strides.

"Many people think that may have been his greatest race, and I wouldn't argue with that," co-owner Katz said. "But there are a lot of memories. Winning the Metro as a 2-year-old, winning the North America Cup. His victory in the Meadowlands Pace was so dramatic and his performance in the Cane was beyond spectacular.

"How do you pick one highlight? He had half-a-dozen races of a lifetime."

Tall Dark Stranger is the seventh male pacer in history to receive a Dan Patch Award at age 2 and be named Horse of the Year at 3. The others were Somebeachsomewhere, Nihilator, Niatross, Albatross, Bret Hanover, and Torpid.

A son of Bettor's Delight out of Dan Patch Award winner Precocious Beauty, Tall Dark Stranger was bred by Jim Avritt Sr. and sold for \$330,000 as a yearling at the Lexington Selected Sale. He was trained by Nancy Takter and driven by Yannick Gingras.

Following is a compilation of comments by Tall Dark Stranger's owners, reflecting on the horse's career.

Judy Chaffee: "When he was a yearling, he looked the part. He was very impressive. I said to Buck at the sale, is there any such thing as being too perfect? He already looked like he owned the world, and he hadn't even sold yet. He came to know it himself."

Al Crawford: "Going into his first qualifier, Nancy said that he was a special colt. Then he was lights out in his qualifier, especially with his last quarter (:26.1). That's when we started to think, 'Wow, maybe he is special.' By the time he made his second or third start, you could see he had tremendous ability."

Buck Chaffee: "When you get into horse racing, you dream of, not even a Horse of the Year, but just a top horse. For that horse to go on and be so fantastic and end up being Horse of the Year is beyond our wildest dreams. It's like a once-in-a-lifetime kind of thing."

Howard Taylor: "I'm hoping I do, but I'm expecting to never have another one like him. I've had a lot of good ones, but I've never had one like him. I've never seen a horse that just says, 'I'm not losing.' He's just an unbelievable horse."

Michelle Crawford: "I don't know if there is a horse that brought more excitement to every single race. That excitement of watching him in the stretch, almost every race,

there's no other horse like him. I don't know if my heart could take another year of him racing on the track. (Laughs.) But he never gave up. It was unbelievable to watch."

Buck Chaffee: "His races were always tense; he just never let you relax. He wouldn't get out there and blow the field away, he was wanting to duke it out with them all the time. He made your heart skip a few beats, that's for sure."

Howard Taylor: "My cardiologist is very happy that he's retired. He didn't want to lose, but he sure as heck didn't want to win by much. I really think that he was toying with them. In the Meadowlands Pace, I was sure he was beaten. I was counting how many others were coming to see if we could still get a check. But then he just did what he always does. It was an unbelievable race."

Al Crawford: "That is probably one of my favorite races of all time. The other race that stands out is the North America Cup. He just destroyed them. They just weren't able to pace with him."

Marvin Katz: "You lose sight of the fact he had incredible high speed and could carry it for a very long distance, which is a trait of great champions. Of course, his courage and determination, that is the unique quality everyone looks for that separates the great ones from the rest of them. But he had everything. He was the whole package."

Al Crawford: "He did what he needed to do to win. He's a very smart horse. Yannick didn't just send him every week, he drove him intelligently, and the colt always got home. I think he was brilliantly fast, but he also had more heart and determination than any horse I've ever seen."

Buck Chaffee: "Just unbelievable character. Now we're hoping he passes that along to his offspring because we're breeding a lot of mares to him, as you could imagine. We're hoping for them to carry that on."

Michelle Crawford: "I think he will have every chance to produce any kind of champion."

Marvin Katz: "I think the market considers him one of the great horses we've seen in a long time. I certainly do. It's been a magical ride. I've been fortunate to enjoy great horses and you really appreciate their brilliance after you have a chance to reflect on it. When you look at what he accomplished, he's in the most elite company possible. I think he's a horse for the ages."

In the spotlight: Oz Colon, the Meadowlands' Director of TV

This is the first in a monthly series of profiles of members of the team at the Meadowlands that matter.

Director of TV is his title, but it doesn't scratch the surface of what the accomplished Oz Colon does night in and night out at The Meadowlands.

MeadGyver might be a better name for Colon – even though he's not working with chewing gum and paper clips – as he is expected to come up with immediate and creative solutions on the fly.

Marjorie Roman, assistant manager of closed-circuit TV at the Meadowlands, works with Colon and knows first-hand what is expected of him.

"Anything can go wrong at any time, especially during a live production, so he's had to go out of [TV Control] many times for different reasons – to change a TV, to fix an IFB [interruptible foldback earpiece] that's not working, or a tote board quadrant is out," she said. "Anything that's wrong he has to go out and be the engineer to fix it."

Colon, 50, has worked at The Meadowlands for more than half his life and is a second-generation employee.

His mother, Damaris Marrero, was a security guard at the mile oval a year after it opened in 1976.

While Colon was attending Old Dominion University in Norfolk, VA in the late '80s, his mom got him a part-time job at the track in the cleaning department, but it wasn't until 1991 when the stars aligned and put him on his current path.

"My mother was talking to John Latronica [head engineer and Director of TV] and he said, 'If your kid ever needs a job,



let me know.' So, I said I'm interested in a job working in TV just to try it out because I was going to school to become a history teacher.

"He gave me a job in May or June of 1991 and I started off doing the retrieval system. In the old building, each floor had a retrieval system. People would call and ask for a specific race from the week before and we'd have to find the tape, find the race and play the race."

After a year, Colon learned how to shoot a handheld camera in the winner's circle and eventually went on to work every position in that department, including tower cam, graphics, tape to deck edits and directing.

At that time, the racetrack was overseen by the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority (NJSEA) as part of the Meadowlands Sports Complex, which included Giants Stadium and The Meadowlands Arena.

Being under the NJSEA umbrella afforded Colon the opportunity to use his TV skills for the Devils, Giants, Jets and Nets.

"The racetrack has been my catapult to do everything else I've done in the industry," said Colon. "When I first started shooting for the Giants and Jets, I used to be in a room with the NFL film guys. They were basically the ones who taught me how to shoot. They would guide me, because when I first went to shoot football, I didn't know anything about shooting football."

In addition to the regular season, Colon shot Giants and Jets playoff games as well as the Nets twice in the NBA Finals, and the Devils, who won Stanley Cup championships in 1995, 2000 and 2003. He shot the Kentucky Wildcats NCAA Tournament victory at the Arena in 1996 and still works for MLB Network, where he won a Sports Emmy in 2016 as graphics operator for MLB Tonight.

Colon has always been a straight shooter, which didn't always go over well when the track was run by the NJSEA.

"I don't lie," he said. "I don't say yes just because you say let's do something. So I got skipped over a lot. They put a lot of people in front of me that were there less time than I was because those people wouldn't put up much of a fight."

Things changed when Jeff Gural acquired The Meadowlands and hired Mike Newlin as the track's new general manager.

At that time, in addition to being one of the track's announcers, Sam McKee was also the Director of TV. Colon was already performing the duties as McKee's TV assistant but just didn't have the title, which changed when McKee had a conversation with Newlin.

"Sam told Newlin that I could do the job if he gave me the opportunity," said Colon. "[Then] I went in and told [Newlin] I'm not a yes man. I'm going to tell you if something can't be done. I'm going to be honest with you. I don't know if you like people that are brutally honest, but this is who I am and if you want to go another way I understand because it's happened before. But he hired me and made me assistant manager to Sam at the time.

"Then Sam passed on [in 2017], God rest his soul, and I got moved up. Jason Settlemoir asked me if I could do the job and I said I could and I've been Director of TV since Sam passed away."

In addition to Director of TV, Colon had already taken over the engineering job when Latronica retired in 2015.

"So, I'm doing three jobs in one," said Colon. "If something breaks in the building for TV I have to run around and do what I can to get it fixed. That's for the TVG feed, for the in-house feed and what we send out. It's fine with me. It's my job. I enjoy it."

Colon says his department is family and that they are small, but strong.

"I was proud when we won No. 1 simulcast," he said. "I'm happy this department is one of the best ones in the industry with the few people we have. Everyone compares us to Woodbine, but Woodbine has a lot more people working for them than we do."

Roman, who has worked at the Meadowlands since 1999, credits Colon with teaching her and making her better at her job.

"He'll take the time to teach you if you're willing to learn. He'll nurture the people who want to move up," said Roman. "He's got a great heart. He cares about what he does. He won't put something out that won't look good in his eyes."

Maybe Colon was destined to be a teacher, just not in the traditional sense.

"I never thought about going back [to become a history teacher] because I love this profession so much," he said. "Once I got into it, I loved shooting camera. All those experiences I wouldn't have had if I was a history teacher."

"I would have never won a Sports Emmy being a history teacher. I would have probably affected more kids' lives, but I'm pretty happy with the choice I've made. Harness racing got me to where I am now."

Marissa Chadbourne banking move to Ohio will pay off in time

Marissa Chadbourne is going to hit her best stride. Although the numbers might suggest otherwise, the 2021 stat sheet for the young trainer doesn't tell the entire story. Not even close.

When she made the recent decision to move her standardbred operation from New York to Ohio, Chadbourne didn't expect the change in scenery to yield immediate results for her seven racehorses and seven babies.

She did, however, embrace the belief that a patient approach would eventually pay the desired dividends.

"It's very different here in Ohio," said Chadbourne, who made the move with driver/owner Jimmy Whittemore Jr. "In New York, there just wasn't anywhere to race. We had been talking about making a move here for a while, and it just seemed like the right time and the right place, so we decided to come to Ohio. I don't think we've had what you'd term bad luck, but it's different luck."

The Maine-born conditioner isn't about to bemoan the slow start in the Buckeye State.

Instead, Chadbourne believes the short-term pains could translate into long-term gains.

"The first week, the horses, they raced poorly – there's just no other way to say it. The next week, they came around, but they were a step behind. I wouldn't say they were short, but in certain places in the northeast U.S. or in Canada, there are times the horses can't train as they normally would because of the weather. The tracks can be icy. Everyone else here is coming off racing at Dayton, so they're race-tight and we're a step behind. I feel like we're playing catch-up a little bit, but we're getting there."

An encouraging result in mid-January, Chadbourne admitted, felt like posing for a photo in the winner's circle.

"It might seem silly to get excited over a check, but the other day when we got one, it was a great feeling. We knew it

was going to take some adjusting, for us and the horses. And it has."

If Chadbourne ever needs a reminder of what she's capable of, she need not look farther than her numbers in 2019 and 2020.

The former barrel rider – she also rode on the Quarter Horse circuit – recorded 77 wins from 458 starts in 2019, accompanied by nearly \$438,000 in purse earnings and a .294 UDRS mark.

"We had 22 horses that year and everything just seemed to fall into place. It was a fantastic year."

In 2020, her stable notched 21 wins from 166 starts, along with \$175,581 in earnings and a .265 UDRS.

One of the horses that helped contribute considerably to her impressive campaigns comes in the form of Major Leaguer.

A bay son of Art Major (NY), the veteran pacer has been a moneymaking machine for Chadbourne and Whittemore (who owns the gelding that was bred by James Avritt of Lebanon, KY).

Major Leaguer won seven of his 22 dashes in 2020, a year in which he also took his lifetime mark of 1:50.1 at

Plainridge Racecourse in Massachusetts.

In 106 starts, the original \$50,000 purchase at the 2015 Lexington Select Sale has amassed close to \$240,000 in his career.

“He raced some hard miles last year and the year before, but he’s given us a lot of great moments. He’s the best horse in our barn. We’re very, very lucky to have him. We’ve had him since he was 3. And he won 16 races the first year we had him. He was an on-the-whim buy. We never went to look at him, but a few people in racing called us and told us, ‘Don’t worry! Just buy him.’ So, that’s what we did. He’s given everything he has every year.”

Whittemore, who didn’t get to sit behind Major Leaguer for most of 2020 due to a hand injury, was back in the race bike for the veteran campaigner’s first start of this year.

Although the duo didn’t pick up a check, Chadbourne viewed the effort in the same regard as the choice to set up shop in Ohio.

“When you make a major decision in your career, things don’t always pan out right from the start. That goes for you and the horses. Obviously, you’re disappointed when you don’t get the results, but when you step back and look at the bigger picture, you get a sense of what needs to happen in order to achieve consistent success.”

Chadbourne is also thinking bigger picture with Bold Fresh.

A veteran son of Cantab Hall, the lifetime winner of 53 races and nearly \$250,000 in career earnings delivered his trainer with a cherished career first.

“I’m lucky enough to call him mine. I took care of him as a younger horse. When we moved to New York, it wasn’t an option to buy him. When he came up for sale in 2018, Jimmy purchased him as a Christmas gift. We trained him back and after a few starts at Saratoga we decided to try Meadowlands. ‘Bold’ came through as a longshot and also landed me my first Meadowlands win [March 29, 2019]. He’s the perfect example of ‘love the animal and they will give you everything they have.’ He’s now 12 and seems happy to be doing his job, but when the time comes that he wants to retire he has a home for life.”

The gelding is one of many reasons why any challenges, starting with opting for the Ohio racing scene, don’t faze Chadbourne.

Not even a campaign that was impacted by a worldwide pandemic is enough to dampen her enthusiasm.

“We’re not down on ourselves,” said Chadbourne, whose foray into standardbred racing came through odds jobs when she worked for trainers in Maine. “It’s different and we need to understand that. If change was easy, everyone would do it and there wouldn’t be any issue. But change isn’t easy and there are always different ways of going about the end goal. If you try and push things, you might get a week where

things go well, but I’d rather have several good weeks than one good week and then nothing for a while.

“I hope to figure out this Ohio circuit – classifications and the way they race here – and be here for a long time. I’m really looking forward to the babies. Racehorses are fun, but the babies are a lot of fun. We had Garretts Drama [a 3-year-old son of Art Major] and he got a little sore at the end of last year. Things didn’t always go his way, but training down, he was amazing. I’m interested to see what he brings back to the table.”

Chadbourne is just as interested – and motivated – to see how this new chapter in her career plays out.

She doesn’t expect to be a stranger to racing again in New York.

“Honestly, one of my biggest goals in 2021 is to make this Ohio move worth it. We don’t have to set the world on fire, but I just want to be worth it and learn something from out here. Last year was kind of a dud. I want to make this a go and not let us get discouraged. I think we’ll still have to go back to New York because we have some New York-breds, but I would eventually like to make Ohio permanent. We were looking at having eight-10 horses, but we have 14 with us. So, here we are... with more than we expected. But we’re not complaining.”

Just take things in stride, right?

“Exactly. We know we’re going to be alright and it will just take time.”

Gural, USTA organize committee to explore HISA recommendations

Spurred on by Jeff Gural, owner of the Meadowlands, Tioga Downs and Vernon Downs, and facilitated by the United States Trotting Association, a group of key stakeholders representing various parts of the industry and holding diverse viewpoints will meet in the coming weeks to examine the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) and harness racing's potential role within it. The HISA passed Congress last month as part of an omnibus spending bill that was signed into law on Dec. 27, 2020.

The Act authorizes the creation of the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority that will oversee anti-doping/medication control and racetrack safety programs for thoroughbred racing. An opt-in provision allows other breeds to be included. HISA has been controversial within harness racing, with support coming from the Gural-owned tracks and the Hambletonian Society, and opposition put forth by the USTA and numerous horsemen's organizations. The committee aims to bring these competing interests to the table in an effort to find common ground and to help clarify harness racing's needs as they apply to the federal legislation.

"I think the two things we all agree on is that the current system is not working and the federal legislation needs to be modified for it to work with standardbreds," said Gural. "I look forward to working with the committee and hope to pass any amendments that our industry can support."

USTA president Russell Williams expressed his support.

"Jeff is presenting this as the opportunity to including everything that harness racing needs in the new statute," Williams said. "I hope to be able to report just such a package to the USTA Board of Directors for approval when the work of this committee is done."

Woodbine releases schedule for lucrative 2021 standardbred stakes

Woodbine Entertainment has unveiled the tentative schedule for the 2021 stakes season at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

More than \$20 million in stakes races, including over \$12 million in Woodbine administrated events, will be contested at Woodbine Mohawk Park in 2021.

"While we continue to advocate for the safe return of live standardbred racing at Woodbine Mohawk Park, we are preparing for an exciting 2021 standardbred meet," said Jim Lawson, CEO, Woodbine Entertainment. "With a proven track record and industry-leading health and safety protocols already in place, we are confident that when it is safe and permitted to resume horse racing at Woodbine Mohawk Park, we will be well positioned to restart the industry and the thousands of jobs it supports."

Currently, horse racing (without spectators) is not permitted until at least Feb. 10 in Ontario due to the COVID-19 pandemic and government restrictions. However, Woodbine Entertainment has published this 2021 stakes schedule (subject to the latest government restrictions) to provide horsepeople with the information required to prepare for the season.

Typically kicking off in May, the 2021 Woodbine Mohawk Park stakes season is headlined by the million-dollar Pepsi North America Cup and Mohawk Million races.

The 38th Pepsi North America Cup for 3-year-old pacers will take place on Saturday, June 19 and is the headline event on a stacked Grand Circuit card of racing. The eliminations for the \$1 million contest take place a week prior on Saturday, June 12.

The Pepsi North America Cup card will also include the \$450,000 Fan Hanover (3-year-old pacing fillies), \$330,000 Roses Are Red (pacing mares), \$250,000 Armbrø Flight (trotting mares), \$250,000 Goodtimes (3-year-old trotters) and \$100,000 Mohawk Gold Cup (invitational pace).

The second edition of the Mohawk Million is scheduled for Saturday, Sept. 25. The \$1 million race for 2-year-old trotters continues to follow a "buy-in" format with nine slots available for purchase.

Each slot available for purchase in the Mohawk Million is priced at \$100,000 (CDN). The 10th and final slot will be awarded to the winner of the \$610,000 William Wellwood Memorial on Saturday, Sept. 11. The deadline to purchase a slot is Feb. 15, 2021.

The Mohawk Million card on Sept. 25 is scheduled to be the richest card of the season. The lineup for the night also includes the prestigious \$850,000 Metro Pace (2-year-old pacers), \$540,000 Shes A Great Lady (2-year-old pacing

fillies) and \$250,000 Milton (pacing mares).

The month of September is loaded with rich stakes events each Saturday, starting with the \$600,000 Canadian Pacing Derby and \$600,000 Maple Leaf Trot on Sept. 4 and closing with Mohawk Million night on Sept. 25.

The \$610,000 Wellwood Memorial (2-year-old trotters) and \$400,000 Peaceful Way (2-year-old trotting fillies) take place on Sept. 11, while the \$600,000 Canadian Trotting Classic (3-year-old trotters) and \$375,000 Elegance (3-year-old trotting fillies) are scheduled for Sept. 18.

The traditional Champlain and Simcoe Stakes are sprinkled throughout the end of August and early September.

Other notable Grand Circuit races include the Somebeachsomewhere (3-year-old pacers) on Saturday, June 5, Nassagaweya (2-year-old pacers) and Eternal Camnation (2-year-old pacing fillies) on Saturday, Aug. 28, and Casual Breeze (3-year-old trotting fillies) on Friday, Sept. 3.

Woodbine Mohawk Park will also play host to a leg of the Miss Versatility (trotting mares) on Friday, May 28, and Graduate Series (4-year-olds) on Saturday, June 5. Both events are administrated by The Meadowlands.

The Ontario Sires Stakes Super Finals and Grassroots Championships will again be held at Woodbine Mohawk Park in 2021. Final dates for the Ontario Sires Stakes season will be released at a later date.

Nominations for all Woodbine Standardbred Stakes close on Monday, Feb. 15. Conditions and payment details can be found in the [2021 Woodbine Stakes Booklet](#).

Woodbine continues to administrate stakes for Ontario Racetracks in 2021, including Grand River Raceway, Flamboro Downs, Clinton Raceway and Hanover Raceway.

Triple Crown races highlight 2021 Yonkers Raceway stakes schedule

Following a year in which the COVID-19 pandemic obliterated the stakes schedule at Yonkers Raceway, MGM Resorts has reinstated a full slate of Grand Circuit races for 2021, anchored by a pair of Triple Crown events occupying a new slot on the calendar.

Held in late August/early September the last few years, the \$300,000 (GTD) MGM Yonkers Trot and \$300,000 (GTD) MGM Grand Messenger Pace Stakes finals for 3-year-olds shift to July 2 on the

calendar in 2021. Eliminations for both Triple Crown events will be conducted on June 25, along with filly counterpart races – Park MGM Pace and New York-New York Mile – that culminate with \$125,000 (Est.) finals on the first Friday in July.

The change in scheduling for the Yonkers Trot and Messenger coincides with a move of major stakes for 3-year-olds at The Downs at Pocono from Fourth of July weekend to the end of August. The races at Yonkers are now the first legs of the Triple Crown on both gaits.

“With all the setbacks and difficulty 2020 saw, we’re excited to get all of these important stakes races back onto the calendar for 2021,” said Alex Dadoyan, director of racing at Yonkers Raceway.

The male companion event starts one night later on Wednesday. Both events offer three legs with \$15,000 (GTD) purses and culminate with added-money finals and guaranteed consolations on March 23 and 24, respectively.

The John Brennan Trotting Series (formerly the SOA Bonus Trot), honoring the memory of the long-time Yonkers Raceway paddock representative, starts on March 31 with the first of three legs for 3-year-olds and up who are Non-winners of 6 races and/or \$100,000 lifetime through Feb. 1. An added-money final and \$30,000 (GTD) consolation is scheduled for Wednesday, April 21.

The Reynolds Pace for 3-year-old colts and fillies also joins the stakes calendar at Yonkers on May 7. Finally, July 9 and 16 offer eliminations and the final of the \$100,000 (Est.) MGM Springfield Stakes for 2-year-olds.

Saturday sizzle keeps burning at Big M

What a difference a year makes.

The first three Saturdays of 2020 were solid from a business perspective at The Meadowlands, as total wagering of \$7.7 million averaged out to \$2.569 million per card, resulting in an average per race of \$183,523.

Turn the page to 2021, and despite the COVID-19 pandemic's continued miserable grip on the globe, business at the industry's handle leader has been booming.

Good as the numbers were during the first three Saturdays of a year ago, thus far this year has seen tremendous gains over the corresponding race cards.

Betting reached \$4,562,477 on Jan. 2, which represented the third-highest single-card handle – beaten only by Meadowlands Pace Night and Hambletonian Day – over the last 13 months.

A total of \$3,646,603 was put in play Jan. 9 while \$3,458,896 was wagered on Jan. 16. Over the three-Saturday span, a total of \$11,667,976 was pushed through the windows, an average per card of \$3,889,325 for an average per race of \$259,388.

"That's an increase of almost \$4 million when compared to our first three Saturdays of the year before," said Big M chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemaier. "The average handle per race has increased over \$65,000 and the pools are the largest we have seen on overnight racing in over a decade."

Five of the Meadowlands' most popular wagers have seen average pools over the three Saturdays that are deep to say the least. The 20-cent Pick-5 has led the way by averaging \$205,437. Rounding out the top five were the 50-cent Pick-4 (\$99,858), Exacta (\$74,125), Win-Place-Show (\$63,370) and Trifecta (\$53,730) bets.

As usual, the track's Exacta wager continues to take the most total action. Over the last 45 races conducted on

Saturdays, total Exacta play has exceeded \$3.3 million.

"The Meadowlands wagering menu offers horseplayers plenty of action all night long," said Settlemaier. "What an encouraging start for New Jersey racing when you see the size of our pools increase this much going up against the NFL Playoffs on Saturday nights."

"We are certainly getting some new eyes on our product with our low take outs and low minimum wagers, especially now that we are offering free programs every night on our website. Low take outs equal greater payoffs, and that creates longer play. We try to create an exciting wagering format for the horseplayers and offering value for the customer is very important to us at The Meadowlands. It has been a major part of the equation to our early success in 2021."
