

#### **Harness Racing Update**

The \$741,000 Prix de Cornulier Monté race (Racing under saddle) was held at Vincennes racetrack in Paris last Sunday and as many fans predicted, the two giants Traders and Bilibili were outstanding when the battle was on.

Philippe Allaire-trained Traders came into the race as first choice and Allaire told jockey Yoann Lebourgeois that his horse was in shape for a performance good enough to win the prestigious race for the second year in a row.

Allaire was right. Traders had an outstanding performance, running in front by several lengths most of the race, but the problem was that Laurent Claude Abrivard-trained Bilibili (Niky) was too strong at the end of the Cornulier. Bilibili gradually picked up the lengths he had to leader Traders and in the last turn, the two trotters were long ahead of the rest of the field.

Eight-year-old Bilibili's home stretch was nothing more than phenomenal as he sprinted home to victory in an unequalled mile rate of 1:54.3 over 2.700 meters, approximately 1.7 miles.

Bilibili has monté genre as his speciality. Trainer Abrivard is well aware of that fact and keeps focus on preparing the horse for the biggest events under saddle, which so far has been a successful tactic. Bilibili's lifetime earnings has now reached a level of \$1,651,117, all exclusively in races under saddle.

A true champion was celebrated at Vincennes last Sunday.

#### Field for Prix d'Amérique is set

This Sunday (Jan. 27) is the day of one of the most prestigious harness races in the world. Paris is ready for the big battle at Vincennes and this year's edition of Prix d'Amérique seems to have all the ingredients to become a classic.

Defending champion Readly Express (Ready Cash) will probably not be the first choice in the race on Sunday since the French team with Bold Eagle, Belina Josselyn and Bird Parker, among many others, have shown great level in their preparation races ahead of the PdA.

Daniel Redén's Propulsion comes from a disappointing performance at Romme racetrack in the end of December 2018 and he wasn't sure his American-bred trotter would race the PdA this year. But since Wednesday afternoon, the son of Muscle Hill has been located at the farm in Chamant, north of Paris and according to Redén, Propulsion is ready for his third attempt in the tough race.

Belina Josselyn (Love You) was disqualified in Prix de Belgique, but showed her capacity and looked splendid as she crossed the wire ahead of Bird Parker (Ready Cash). Jean-Michel Bazire's domination at Vincennes this winter has been outstanding and Belina Josselyn's fans can all be sure that the charismatic chestnut mare will deliver a performance that most certainly makes her a serious choice in PdA.

Bold Eagle (Ready Cash) and his trainer Sébastien Guarato have found new levels this winter. With a training program that is different from previous years, Bold Eagle seems to have reached new tops and his speed, with the right position in the race, is tough to disarm.

Bird Parker is the first outsider that is named before the race. Bold Eagle, Belina Josselyn, Readly Express and Propulsion will be the top four among the bettors, but there are a couple of horses that could upset on Sunday and Bird Parker is definitely one of them.

Sébastien Guarato's domination in Prix d'Amérique 2019 is startling. Five of the 18 contenders come from his barn and Jean-Michel Bazire and Philippe Allaire can also be proud of their efforts so far. Three trotters will be attending from their stables.



Prix d'Amérique's post time is scheduled to 16.05 (CET) (10:05 a.m. New York time) and the purse is \$1,023,349.

#### Thoughts on my critics, betting horses coming from half-mile tracks, throat surgery, jockey agents and French racing

**Tidbits**: One guy says I have no balls. Another calls me a fake and a fraud, I must be doing something right because if they are not talking about me I would be very boring.

To be perfectly honest, the vast majority of the comments I receive are very nice and the majority of you like the column and respect my honesty and my opinion. The guy who said I had no balls was because I disagreed with his assessment of a situation. The man is "self possessed" i.e.: so enamored with himself and the horses he owns it kills him not to be in

the limelight. He would like to revamp the sales system to make it impossible to sell horses at auction. What happened to the words "reasonable" and "proper". I have more faith in the market than to have to create rules that would institute havoc in the marketplace. If this opinion means I have no balls so be it.

All of us that love harness racing and football learned a big lesson this weekend. The calls made by the judges in our sport are much more accurate than the calls made on the field in football. For sure Sunday was one of the worst officiating days in history and in my humble opinion the Saints got cheated out of a spot in the Super Bowl and if I wanted to push the envelope a bit the roughing the passer call that extended the Patriots march to victory could have prematurely ended the Chiefs season. In games of such importance all calls should be reviewable by request.

I continue to get emails from people I have great respect for, explaining to me the untold "facts" in the Zeron saga. It is now official that an appeal has been made. I refuse to print or make decisions about the case until there is some official notifications from the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario. It is quite obvious to me that my wish for more transparency in the matter has fallen on deaf ears. My hope there is a swift decision in this case because all the speculation is not doing any good to our sport on the whole.

#### **Harness Racing Update**

Congratulations to my good friend Sam Bowie on returning to our sport. Sam purchased a very nice trotter at Monday's Tattersalls sale and has turned him over to my talented assistant Chris Lakata to race in the Metropolitan area. Best of luck to you both.

Carl Coppola asks: I like to bet the Meadowlands but find it difficult to handicap with horses shipping in from half-mile ovals like Yonkers and Freehold. Is there a way to evaluate these situations?

I find that to win at the Meadowlands a horse needs to be stretched out and half-mile tracks do just the opposite. On the bigger oval, you are going pretty much full tilt the entire mile. On the half, you see portions of the mile being backed down especially in the four turns. To me, a rule of thumb at the Meadowlands would be to throw out shippers from the half-milers until they have had at least a start on the larger track. The reverse to me is also true when horses come from the bigger track to the half-mile. I think they have a distinct advantage as long as they can negotiate the tighter corners.

Cheryl McGivern asks: Was wondering what you opinion is regarding laser vs old ways on entrapped epiglottis on a 2-year-old June foal. Do you have a preference on a surgeon?

To begin with, it's been my experience that most babies grow out of these conditions, especially that young. Unless it is an extreme case where the colt can't breathe properly, I would do nothing at all. I have had many with entrapment in January that went on to be fine. The best example was Self Possessed who was entrapped from the start and was never operated on and obviously turned out fine. It is very common in Valley Victory line sires. When you operate on a throat a laser or a scalpel provides a fine line that can easily grow back together. Dr John Cummins has a method of making the partition with his finger, which causes a jagged tear that is far less likely to return to normal in the healing process. I must mention that Dr. Hugh Llewelyn was the finest surgeon in this field and a mentor to many of today's best practitioners, but unfortunately he has retired at a very young age.

Donald S Berman asks: Why don't the top drivers use agents to book their mounts like the thoroughbred jockeys do?

You are comparing apples and grapes. The thoroughbred business has so much more going on than we do. There may be four or five days of severe conflict in our stake schedule where there are between 50 and a 100 in their business. Plus, many of the jockeys have a language barrier that we don't have with a few exceptions (LOL). Jockeys get paid twice as much as drivers 10 per cent vs. five per cent and therefore would find the payment to an agent a lot less

taxing. Also, it is important to note that many harness drivers make personal commitments to a trainer that they stand by 95 per cent of the time. Basically the answer to your question is that we just have no need for agents in our sport.

Paul London asks: I enjoy watching trotting from Vincennes, France. Obviously these trotters are bred for endurance. My question is do you think that trotters in the USA have too much equipment on? In France I see open bridles, no headpoles very simple.

The racing most watched here in America and Canada are 2- and 3-year-old stakes races. In Vincennes, you are watching horses with an average age of 6 or 7 that are experienced and need little corrective equipment. Not only do they not use head poles and wear open bridles, many race without head checks. I know that head poles are not permitted in Sweden, but I am not sure about France. I will say the soft track and large turns on the Paris oval would make it very conducive to a lack of equipment. Nowhere that I know of on our continent is there a surface in any way comparable to Vincennes. You cannot hear the footsteps of the horses.

When I was training, I was famous for lack of equipment — always had long head checks, no headpoles, no boots just brace bandages and almost never used a check bit. Jimmy Takter when he had a horse hung up like that would call it "A la Gurfein."



#### **Harness Racing Update**

The main reason for the lack of equipment in Europe is they are fussier about lameness than we are. In most venues on the continent, the horses parade in a tight circle unchecked in front of a veterinarian before each race. They must be unchecked because it makes lameness more evident. If you ever have the opportunity to visit the Paris track, go for it. Without any reservation I will say it was the most impressive racetrack I have ever seen. The pomp and circumstance of the venue on the day of the Prix d'Amerique is only rivaled by Solvalla on the day of the Elitloppet, but they lack the food. The only track in America with similar appeal would be the

Meadowlands in the earlier days or maybe Roosevelt Raceway in its heyday with the Cloud Casino.

## Dr. J on the two horses that made her a harness racing "addict"

Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky said two horses — brothers Melvins Strike and Sans Strike — are responsible for getting her "addicted" to harness racing.

The executive vice-president and syndicate manager for Hanover Shoe Farms said without those two "mean, mean brothers" — both sons of Strike Out out of Briarwood Loraine — she may never have ended up at Hanover, or working with standardbreds at all, for that matter.

Jablonsky's family ran a boarding farm on Long Island where people who raced at Roosevelt or Yonkers would send

their horses when they wanted to turn them out.

"This was before training centers, so when people wanted to turn out their horses they had to send them to a farm," Jablonsky said. "They raced at Yonkers and Roosevelt and then they would come out Monday morning, turn out for a few days and then go back... It was me and three of my cousins doing the stalls and taking care of them.

"We were younger, like eight or nine years old. We weren't allowed to handle them, but we would clean their stalls, so we felt like we took care of them."

Melvins Strike earned nearly \$700,000 racing between 1976 and 1982. San Strike made over \$170,000 between 1979 and 1988.

To Jablonsky and her cousins, Melvins Strike and Sans Strike were TV superstars.

"I used to watch that show with Stan Bergstein and Spencer Ross they did from Yonkers and Roosevelt at 11:30 on Saturday night. It was right after wrestling," Jablonsky said. "I used to watch wrestling just so I didn't miss the opening."

At the time, Melvins Strike, the better of the two horses, was racing in the open. Watching the brothers race on TV at the top harness tracks in the country and then getting to help care for them a few days later made Jablonsky particularly star-struck.

"They were at the farm, then you'd see them race. And they had such personalities," Jablonsky said. "We felt that even though they were mean they liked us. They didn't really like us, but we felt they did. They were both chestnuts, beautiful chestnuts.

"I always loved the horses, but I may not have fallen in love with this sport without those two horses and me watching them on TV.

"I could have gone a different way, into riding horses. They made me love the sport."

Our accreditation process will ensure that groups exercise sound business practices and equine care to the benefit of our horses and horsemen."

## Wally Hennessey scores 10,000th career win

Hall of Famer Wally Hennessey drove his 10,000th winner on Wednesday night at Pompano Park. The milestone victory was part of a driving grand slam for Hennessey.

He achieved a milestone that only 16 other North American drivers have accomplished when he drove Prince Of Fame to victory in the last race at Pompano on Wednesday.

Hennessey, who is sporting a lofty "batting average" over .550 during the current Pompano Park meeting, is averaging three plus wins per racing night and shows no signs of slowing down while competing against a very talented driving colony in South Florida.

Last season, Hennessey racked up 382 wins, second only to his 1995 total of 419 victories.

In reflecting on his milestone achievement, Hennessey, in a post race interview, said, "I have been around for many years and am lucky to have stayed competitive all these years. It certainly doesn't get any easier with the talent around these days but that's why it's necessary to work harder than ever to retain your sharpness."


Hennessey fondly remembers the early days on Eustis Street in Charlottetown, becoming enamored with the sport that has been his life work.

"I have a picture of myself at age 10 holding the head of a horse driven by my dad and it's a constant reminder of what a great influence he was on my career. I have been lucky to have driven some really great horses over the years, including, of course, Moni Maker."

Hennessey has won some of the sport's most prestigious races, including the Woodrow Wilson at the Meadowlands and countless stakes events here and overseas.

When asked about his future goals, Hennessey remarked, "This is a sport that is a one-step-at-a-time sport. Having said that, my next goal is win number 10,001. Then, hopefully, I'll go on from there."

Hennessey has enriched the owners of horses he has driven by over \$66 million and joins Dave Palone, Tony Morgan, Herve Filion, Cat Manzi, David Miller, Dave Magee,

#### **Cushing pushes to keep career** on fast track

Mitchell Cushing is the first to admit that patience is not his strong suit. Cushing, who turned 21 on Jan. 12, is coming off a year that saw him finish second in the driver standings at two New England racetracks on Tom Melanson his way to 247 wins and \$1.51 million in purses, both personal bests in his career.

He drove the legendary Foiled Again to victory in a Farewell Tour race at the Windsor Fair in Maine, captured a Massachusetts Sire Stakes title with I'm A Clown, and finished second to Dan Patch Award-winner Shartin N with Apple Bottom Jeans in the TVG Series championship for female pacers.

And he is anxious for more.

"Everything has progressed quickly and I wouldn't want it any other way," said Cushing, adding with a laugh, "The way I am, if it can happen tomorrow I'd rather have it happen yesterday.

"I'm pushing it to happen as fast as it can. I know there are so many things along the road to get there, but I absolutely love what I do and I'm going to push to be the best I can be."

Cushing, the son of driver Ron Cushing, began driving in 2014. In his first four years he won 141 races, a total he exceeded by 106 in 2018. He finished second in the driver standings to Drew Campbell, who is approaching 5,000-career wins, at both Plainridge Park and Scarborough Downs last year.

"I had some quality opportunities," Cushing said, referencing regular drives for Plainridge leading trainer Jimmy Nickerson as well as for Apple Bottom Jeans and I'm A Clown conditioner Kevin Switzer. "That helps. That makes it nice. I'm extremely thankful people have given me so many good opportunities."

With racing in New England on hiatus for the winter, Cushing has spent January competing at Freehold Raceway and the Meadowlands Racetrack, both in New Jersey. Cushing has five drives at the Big M on Friday and is listed on another five for Saturday. He has a total of three drives over the weekend at Freehold.

"It keeps me busy and I'm doing what I love," said Cushing, who lives in Maine. "I wouldn't want to do it any other way. I'm happy."

Cushing has won 10 of 147 races at the Meadowlands during his career. He enjoyed his two best weekends last October, when the Breeders Crown was at The Downs at

Mohegan Sun Pocono. Cushing won four of 23 drives at the Big M during that span.

"When I take a look back at it and take a deep breath, it couldn't be going any better," Cushing said. "I'm extremely thankful for the way it's going. If you would ask me on a day when I wasn't being appreciative and wanting to win races, I wish it was going the same as it was in October while everybody was at the Breeders Crown. But that's not realistic.

"It's hard for me to accept that because I'm so competitive and when I get an opportunity I don't want to waste it. It's a good thing to be competitive, but sometimes you have to take a deep breath and work hard and let stuff happen. These last couple weeks, with the time I've put in, I'm getting more quality drives. I'm running from Freehold to get to qualifiers (at the Meadowlands) and stuff is starting to go my way a little more. That's kind of nice. It's starting to get to the point where people think they can use me to begin with, not just when someone picks off."

Cushing grew up around harness racing and always enjoyed the sport and horses. But it wasn't until he suffered a knee injury his junior year of high school that focusing on it as a career became a passion. Cushing tore his ACL and during his recovery was unable to do much in the way of physical activity. He could, though, jog horses.

"I always loved it, but that's when it changed," Cushing said. "Even before I was out of high school I was pushing hard to progress."

Cushing has seen his career and abilities progress, especially in terms of getting along with horses.

"Getting behind a horse and getting a quick and solid understanding of a horse, I think that's what developed the most," Cushing said. "As a catch driver, that's what your job is. You've got to be able to get on and get along with a horse the best you can for two minutes. As last year went on, I think that was my biggest growth.

"And learning the races better, understanding races better, your decision-making gets quicker. People know about you statistically, but sometimes people wait for you to do the wrong thing and think maybe you're not ready. When you do things the wrong way, or you do things the right way, it changes opinions. I'm just going to keep trying to do things the right way and hopefully people think I deserve (an opportunity)."

Cushing will continue racing at the Meadowlands and Freehold until Plainridge reopens in April. At that point, he hopes to have accomplished enough at the Meadowlands to continue getting drives on the weekends.

"I don't expect to be there on a stakes night, but on a regular night throughout the year, that would be a huge personal accomplishment," Cushing said. "I hope I can just keep doing what I'm doing. It will get to a new level."

And that would be worth waiting for.

#### **Q&A** with Troy Beyer

Young reinsman is chasing his driving dreams at Yonkers

Although Troy Beyer grew up around standardbreds, it was a singular moment in his adolescent years that ultimately pushed him down the path of becoming a horseman. At just 23 years old, Beyer has already worked among some great horses in the stables of Nancy Johansson and Noel Daley. The Illinois native now plies his trade in the barn of Brett Pelling with the goal of becoming a catch driver.

Beyer made his first pari-mutuel start in 2013 and spent the next three years driving in Illinois with some success. The 2018 season proved to be the young reinsman's breakout year, as he teamed up with Ricky Bucci to compete for the rich purses at Yonkers Raceway. Beyer drove 16 winners in 2018 and another 50 in the money to purses of \$305,308.

Although he is still searching for his first win in the new year, Beyer already has six top-three finishes at the Hilltop and has his sights set on a big year. Beyer has first call on all of Bucci's starters, including distaffer Made Of Jewels As and open trotter Mostinterestingman, who regularly compete in the track's \$44,000 features.

Beyer took the time to chat with the SOA of NY's Brandon Valvo about his career so far and his aspirations in the sport.

#### How did you first get involved in harness racing?

"My dad used to train horses several years ago; that's how I got into it. I really didn't get into it until I was probably around 13 or so. I really started to get into it and it just kind of took off from there. It got into my blood and ever since I've been right into it. I was out jogging, I just never knew what it was for when I was really young. It just wasn't something I wanted to go do or anything. I just didn't realize what it was for."

## What was the moment when it clicked that made you realize this was for you?

"Probably when I was 13 my dad wanted me to go train one for him at the little farm we were at in Illinois and I think ever since that day, I did it once and I was hooked. It was just that easy. The horse was Casino Comp. At the time, she was just very young. I don't even think she had raced yet. It might have even been her first time training. She turned out to be an alright condition horse at Balmoral and just raced through the conditions, basically. She was an alright horse, made a little money for us."

#### And when did you first start driving in races?

"At 16 I started driving qualifiers. I schooled one first for a friend of ours at Balmoral. I schooled a trotter and I just loved that. As soon as I did it, I wanted to just do it all the time. Just the adrenaline rush was awesome."

## You mention you've worked with some big stables already. Who are some of the nicer horses you've gotten to work with so far?

"When I came to the east coast, I worked with Nancy Johansson. When I came in, JK She'salady was there, but it was at the end of her career. But getting to be around a horse like that, she was a cool horse to see and it was exciting to have a horse like that in the barn. I looked after a horse called Wicked Little Minx. She was a nice little mare, she made a little bit of money for Nancy. Another good little horse we had at the time was Cruzado Dela Noche, who won the International last year. Really cool little horse. Really awesome personality."

#### Were you there at Yonkers when he won the International Trot?

"Yes, I was. That was exciting. I'm not a gambling kind of person, but a buddy of mine that was down watching the race, I told him, 'You know what, I bet this horse will win because he's a cool little horse, he's a nice horse, and I know they've been prepping him for this race for a long time.' And sure enough he went out and won."

## It looks like this past year, you really started to ramp up the number of starts you were making.

"Yeah, it picked up really well for me, especially the last three months of the year, it picked up really strong at Yonkers. The last couple years, I've been working for Noel Daley and just had one or two of my own in the wintertime. Noel helped me a ton. He got me a lot of drives for him and for people who saw me drive for him. He gave me a shot in stakes races, too and people saw that and they gave me a shot, too. I would go and drive one or two a week at Yonkers and really just always show up and it's worked out well for me. A snowball effect happened where it just picked up stronger and stronger and then I picked up Ricky Bucci as a big account and there's a couple other little guys and it's just really worked out well. We had a lot of luck and made a lot of good money at the end of the year there.

## How did you team up with Ricky and get first call on all his horses here at Yonkers?

"I'm driving all of them now and that's awesome. I drove one for him and won straight away. He gave me a shot, put me up on a few and we did really well right away and it's just taken off from there. I listen to what he has to say about them and how he wants to race them. He gives me a lot of

freedom to let me do what I want with them. It's just worked out really well."

## Do you tend to be on the aggressive side? Do you try to be a little more patient? What's your style like?

"It just really depends on the horse and it depends a lot on the draw at Yonkers. If they have the inside, I'm more inclined to be aggressive with them and if they're mid-pack, it just depends on the horse and what class it is."

#### Yonkers is not an easy place to break into when you consider the driving colony here. Were you surprised to get such a big account relatively quickly?

"Honestly, yeah, I was really surprised. It was almost like night and day. Ettore (Annunziata) told him to give me a shot. He came and asked me one night and said, 'I have a friend of mine who needs a driver, he wants to put you down on a couple.' I thought I was going to drive maybe one or two for the guy, I didn't even know who it was. The sheet came out and I was down on three. It was just like a light switch. From that moment, I was driving a bunch really quick after."

## And even getting drives in the open handicaps. Talk a little about Made Of Jewels As and what she's like to drive and to work with.

"I really, really love driving that mare. She's classy and she likes to race from off the pace, which I like to, too a lot of times in the upper conditions. They kind of beat themselves up early and then usually you can sit back and come at the end of it. They pop up and win every once in a while for good money. She's just a lovely horse to drive, she runs in a little bit, but you just help her through the turns and wait on her and she'll give you everything. She'll just fly home. She can fly. You can do whatever you want with her."

#### And what about Mostinterestingman?

"He is awesome. I really love driving that horse, too. The pair of those two horses are really nice to drive. Mostinterestingman, he's really nice to drive. He doesn't really get on a line or anything like that. You can do whatever you want with him. If you want to leave out of there with him, you can and he has no problem with it. If you want to duck and race him off a helmet, he does that just as good. He doesn't get grabby in a hole or grabby up front. Just two fingers, a really good horse to drive at any time, no matter where you are."

## You're a young guy, just getting started. What are your goals for your career? Do you aspire to be a catch driver? A trainer? What path do you see yourself pursuing?

"I like doing both. I like training and driving. I would like to eventually just catch drive. That's what I really love to do. But I don't mind training either. I really enjoy training babies down. I might keep doing that, just have a couple of my own in the wintertime and just work with babies. But my main goal is catch driving for sure. That's what I really love to do and want to do. If you love what you do, you never work a day in your life."

#### Casino at Monticello closing, horse racing faces uncertain future

The Times Herald-Record reported Tuesday (<u>full story here</u>) that the casino at Monticello Raceway will close "on or about" April 23, though horse racing will continue at the site, for now.

The news came from Monticello's parent company, Empire Resorts, in a filing to the Securities and Exchange Commission.

"Forty employees will remain at the raceway, while the operation's other 160 can take jobs at the nearby Resorts World Catskills casino, also owned by Empire Resorts, or receive severance packages," said the article, written by Daniel Axelrod.

"Empire Resorts Inc. said horse racing will continue. But, in a written statement and in an SEC filing, it made no guarantees about the track's long-term future."

## Brinkerhoff enshrined into Ohio Hall of Fame

The Ohio Chapter of the United States Harness Writers Association handed out its annual awards at the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association banquet on Saturday (Jan. 19) at the Marriott University Area Hotel in Columbus.

Tom Brinkerhoff, one of Ohio top trainers/drivers, was enshrined as the 45th member of the Ohio Harness Racing Hall of Fame.

During Brinkerhoff's 60+ year career he campaigned some of Ohio best horses, including Osborne Creed; Osborne's Bret; Golly Too, the four time Ohio Sires Stake champion; Lark's Luke (\$441,240); Doc Mistake (\$342,793); and Ruffstuff Baker, the Ohio Triple Crown winner in 1993.

Brinkerhoff was elected into the Northfield Park Wall of

Fame in 1994 and received the Jerry Kaltenbach Memorial Award as the top Ohio Sires Stake trainer in 1995.

He is credited with 1,695 career driving wins and made his final career start, a second-place finish, at the Richland County Fair in 2016.

The Ohio Chapter also honored Aaron Merriman as the recipient of the Winner's Circle Award for the Ohioan who has achieved outstanding accomplishments in the past year; Trevor Smith as the Peter Haughton Memorial Award winner as the young Ohioan who is an "up-and-coming" star among harness horsemen; Pius Soehnlen into the Immortal Hall of Fame; First Breath into the Standardbred Hall of Fame; and Dave Bianconi as the winner of the Rambling Willie Award for the Ohioan who has done the most for harness racing over the past two decades.

Merriman, North America's 2018 Dash Driving champion, recorded 1,141 seasonal wins to become the first driver to record 1,000 or more wins in multiple years. He was also selected as the "Driver of the Year" by the United States Harness Writers Association.

Smith is a 22-year-old resident of Washington Court House, OH. He enjoyed a tremendous 2018 season with 104 driving wins and earned more than \$1.1 million in purse money.

Soehnlen was a great trainer and driver and gained fame with the great trotter Dream Of Glory, who won 50 of 86 career starts, was a four-time Dan Patch award winner, set world records before becoming an influential sire. Soehnlen bred and campaigned many other champions over the years, among them Stoneking, Fence Post, Proxies Garland, Preshlash and Kick A Lot. Early in his career, he also drove Pickwick Baron. He passed away in January 2016 at the age of 76.

First Breath earned over \$100,000 during her four year

racing career, winning 28 of 58 career starts, but the daughter of the pacing sire Hold Your Breath left her mark by producing several of Ohio's top trotters. Bianconi is a director for the United States Trotting Association and part of the on-air talent team for the simulcast show at the Delaware County Fair and Little Brown Juq.
