Bazire will drive defending champion Belina Josselyn (shown together winning the 2018 Prix de France) in today's Prix d'Ameriqué in Paris, the 100th edition of one of the world's greatest trotting events.

"Belina has reached exactly the same level as when she won last year, that's my opinion and I've felt her development during the last three weeks. That being said means that my choice (to drive) was pretty obvious," Bazire told Swedish media on Saturday afternoon.

Otherwise, the horse that people talk about is **Davidson du Pont** (Pacha du Pont), who finished fourth last year. Franck Ouvrie is the driver and the duo have been paired in all the B-races ahead of the PdA.

"Davidson du Pont is probably my best chance in the race this year. He is strong, fast and not at all complicated, plus Franck knows all about the horse's abilities," Bazire said.

Looking Superb (Orlando Vici) surprised as runner up behind Belina Josselyn last year and everything seems to be perfect in 2020.

"Looking Superb is...superb. He's in great condition and the preparation races have worked out exactly like we wanted, so

it will be interesting to see him in the Prix d'Amérique again," said Bazire, who also expressed his respect for the opponents in this year's edition of PdA.

"**Bold Eagle, Uza Josselyn, Vivid Wise As, Delia du Pommereux...**and the Öjran-horse, **Propulsion**. Look back at last year's race and see how great Propulsion raced. It's a nice field this year."

Björn Goop is driving the youngster in the race, **Face Time Bourbon** (Ready Cash).

"The horse has everything that makes a good trotter great. Strength, speed and legs are all components that follows him in a positive way, but he's the junior in the race and it's never easy to meet the already merited elite trotters in a race like this. But it'll be fun. This is the kind of race that we all want to participate in," said Goop.

Ten-year-old gelding upsets in Prix de Luxembourg

The \$121,800 Prix de Luxembourg was held at Vincennes on Saturday – the day before the Prix d'Amérique as is tradition – and a 10-year-old gelding showed great shape when he held his opponents behind him in mile rate of 1:54 over 1.3 miles.

The distance of 2.100 meters is the closest to a mile race we can find at Vincennes racetrack and Prix de Luxembourg usually collects trotters just below the absolute elite in Europe. Fast and strong geldings even get their shot to show what they can in the 1.3 miles long race and 10-year-old **Anzi des Liards** (Look de Star) took his chance and won, paired with trainer Romain Derieux after an optimistic drive where Derieux was more than happy to put his horse first over midway through the race.

Leader Mindyourvalue W.F. and Björn Goop kept the pace at an even level and when Jean-Michel Bazire surprisingly not attacked three wide from second over with favorite Dorgos de Guez, Derieux saw his chance to win the race.

Dorgos de Guez was given free space in the end of the last turn, but Romain Derieux played his cards very well. Behind him, Earl Simon had lots of power to use and Anzi des Liards strength was enough to keep the chasers in safe distance

when the wire appeared.

"My horse was very good today and normally he likes longer distances more than this particular one. I saw that the leader was beaten in the last turn and I gave it a shot," said Romain Derieux after the victory.

Dorgos de Guez was runner up and Earl Simon disarmed Mindyourvalue W.F. in the hunt for the bronze medal.

Destiny strikes again

This time in the form of one of the greatest trotting sires of all time: Stars Pride.

Before I get to this week's column, I need to correct an old man's error which I made in last week's story about Western Hanover. Of course, Precious Bunny was not by B G's Bunny. His sire was the great Cam Fella. It was his dam that was by B G's Bunny and it was that part of his pedigree with which Mr. Simpson was not enamored.

Last week's column related to destiny and how it defined Western Hanover's career.

The subject of this week's column is the trotting stallion, who in my often less than august opinion has had the greatest influence on trotting throughout the world – emphasis on "throughout the world" including and perhaps especially, the great French Trotter.

Just like with Western Hanover, there were several unforeseen events that came together that led to Star's Pride being given the opportunity to become the great stallion that he was destined to be and to have the influence on the breed that he has had.

There is very little about Star's Pride's upbringing and youth that I am aware of. I do know that he was bred by Henry Warwick of Westfield, IN.

He was purchased as a yearling from a sale in Indianapolis by Harry Pownall for \$5,250 (a decent price for the time) for the account of E. Roland Harriman.

I've been told that Pownall actually had to leave before the sale was over and left the bidding to Jimmy Wingfield who signed the slip. The pre-arranged ceiling price was exceeded by \$250, but Mr. Harriman was still happy to acquire the colt.

Shortly thereafter, he took on his friend Lawrence Sheppard as his partner.

Physically, Stars Pride was a beautiful horse - that is, if one were looking to get a pacer instead of a trotter.

In his day, horses, especially trotters, were not measured for height versus length comparisons. If they were, my guess would be that Stars Pride likely would have been a minus two or minus three – that is, he would have likely been two or three inches taller at the withers than his length.

Generally speaking, that is not a desirable trait with trotters, since short coupled ones are more predisposed to hitting their shins.

Adding to the possibility of Stars Pride becoming a pacer was that his sire Worthy Boy, although a trotter himself, had exhibited a distinct likelihood of producing pacers.

Many of his better performers such as Harold J, Gold Worthy, Stand By and Winning Worthy wore hobbles.

Stars Pride was trained by Pownall, as was his main competitor, Florican, throughout their respective racing careers.

Both were very good horses in a year not considered the greatest for trotters.

They both had their adherents and the jury is still out on which was the better horse.

As the old maxim about quarterbacks says, "If a team has two good quarterbacks, the chances are that it doesn't have one great one." So it might have been with Stars Pride and Florican. Nevertheless, both Stars Pride and Florican were, at

the very least, excellent trotters throughout their racing careers.

Stars Pride finished second in the Hambletonian while driven by John Simpson.

Harry Pownall chose to drive Florican in the Classic.

Lusty Song won the race.

Lusty Song was a very good colt, but nowhere near the equal of his two contemporaries. It was likely a case of the best horse on that particular day winning the race.

It had happened before. It will happen again. We saw an example of that in this past year's Hambletonian.

As might be expected with a short coupled trotter, Stars Pride did hit his shins. But he was extremely game and still almost always stayed trotting despite the impediment.

In addition, he had bad feet which plagued him throughout both his racing and stud careers.

Both Stars Pride and Florican took their records in the same three-horse race at DuQuoin, IL. The third starter in the race, Scotch Rhythm, wasn't in the same league as Stars Pride and Florican and was in the race in essence to help fill it.

Legend has it that it was a fixed race, although that is far too strong a term. There was no wagering on it, so no harm, no foul.

Pownall wanted to get the fast record that he felt both horses deserved. In the first heat, Stars Pride cut the mile for Florican, driven by Delvin Miller who won in 1.57.2. Florican then cut the second heat for Stars Pride who won in 1.57.1.

At the conclusion of his racing career, an attractive offer was made to sell Stars Pride overseas to Italian interests.

Mr. Harriman was not in the stud horse business and Mr. Sheppard was not interested in standing him at his Hanover Shoe Farms.

Although Mr. Sheppard loved Stars Pride, he felt that the horse had too much going against him to stand at Hanover.

1. He was by Worthy Boy and, at that time, he was the only prominent trotter ever sired by him. He was a horse not that well thought of by trotting lovers due to his propensity to produce a great number of pacers.

2. He was beautiful, but short coupled. As expected, he hit his shins and hit them more than a little.

3. As mentioned earlier, he had bad feet which bothered him throughout his career.

4. Mr. Sheppard already had four trotting stallions standing at Hanover — Hoot Mon, Dean Hanover, Titan Hanover and

Nibble Hanover. The likelihood was that the Farms had barely enough trotting mares to do justice to the horses that they were already standing.

Mr. Sheppard felt that the fact that he hit his shins badly and had bad feet would definitely negatively affect the possibility of a successful stud career.

Thus, an offer from Italians to send Stars Pride overseas was accepted.

To quote Stephen Sondheim, then "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum".

As sometimes happened when dealing with the Italians at that time, the money never arrived.


Mr. Sheppard was in a bind. He would have to stand Stars Pride at Hanover.


As expected, he was not very well supported, neither from Hanover nor the breeders of the day.

His first three crops numbered respectively 21, 16 and nine foals — a total of 46 foals.

From his first crop of 21, all 21 raced with 20 of them taking records and included Section Man a horse that hit his shins terribly. Nevertheless he still finished 2-2 in the 1957 Hambletonian which was captured by Hickory Smoke.

His second crop of only 16 featured Emily's Pride who won

the 1958 Hambletonian and Little Rocky who won a heat of that same Hambletonian. Emily's Pride also became the dam of Noble Victory.

His third crop numbered one third of the total of the first two combined, but included Diller Hanover who also won the Hambletonian. It also included Hickory Pride a wonderful colt who was destined to make his mark in the breeding shed at Hempt Farms.

Thus, from a total of 46 foals in his first three crops, Stars Pride sired two Hambletonian winners, a heat winner of the Hambletonian, a horse who finished 2-2 in the Hambletonian and a world class stallion.

Needless to say, he was now on his way.

Among his numerous feats, he sired eight Hambletonian winners, an accomplishment that in my less than humble opinion will never be equaled, let alone surpassed.

The story of Stars Pride would be certainly incomplete without mentioning the two people who kept him alive and functional during the last decade of his life.

Stars Pride had become seriously foundered. It was a combination of his extreme gameness and the skill of two great horsemen, Dr. Charles Raker of New Bolton Center and the farrier Robert Bosler Sr. that kept him alive and

reasonably well. Each month, Dr Raker would come to the Farms and would work with Mr. Bosler on making essentially two new artificial front feet for the great stallion. I was privileged to see these gentlemen perform their magic on several occasions. If it were any other horse I doubt that it could have been accomplished.

Stars Pride seemed to sense that they were there to help him. He was always on his best behavior and never gave them, or anybody else for that matter, a bit of trouble.

By the way, Mr. Sheppard was correct in worrying about Stars Pride siring horses who hit their shins and had bad feet. A significant number of them did. But most were game and fast and still became good horses.

I've decided to run this tale in two segments. The second installment on his effect on world trotting, especially the French Trotter will run in the next edition of the column.

It will begin: Monsieur Henri Levesque had a dream.

What you need to know about equine coronavirus

Coronavirus has been in the news a lot lately after a serious outbreak of a new variant of the virus was first reported in China at the beginning of 2020. There are five different coronaviruses that cause common nose, sinus and throat “colds” in humans.

Until a decade ago, it was thought there was no equine strain, but in the last 10 years, veterinarians have increasingly reported equine coronavirus (ECoV) as a common cause of sickness.

As with the human variants, ECoV infections cause fever, loss of appetite, and in fewer than 50 per cent of cases, colic. Bloodwork often shows a low white blood cell count, and some horse develop diarrhea or loose manure.

In very rare cases, the virus can cause the accumulation of high ammonia in the blood and neurological symptoms such as stumbling, slow reaction time or abnormal behavior.

There is no cure but, most affected horses recover within a week. Stall rest, anti-inflammatories and increased hydration can all aid in recuperation. Severe cases may require hospitalization for intravenous fluid and anti-inflammatories, as well as for treatment of acute colic symptoms.

ECoV transmission occurs through fecal-oral transfer – or when a healthy horse comes into oral contact with an object that has been contaminated with an infected horse’s manure.

Since the virus can survive outside the body for 14 to 21 days and can be shed in manure for weeks after infection, healthy horses can readily become ill from pastures, stalls, aiseways and trailers. Often when one horse gets infected, the whole barn will get sick too.

To reduce the likelihood of transmission, it is recommended that new arrivals are quarantined for 21 days. Sick horses may need to be isolated while ill and dedicated mucking and grooming equipment should be used.

Disinfecting high-traffic walkways is also advisable.

Thankfully, unlike the variants that cause Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS) or the current Chinese outbreak, equine coronavirus is not transmissible to humans or other animals.

Gel Fillers and Chronic Arthritis

According to information presented at a recent veterinary symposium in the United States, it is possible that some types of cosmetic gel fillers can be used to treat osteoarthritis (OA) in horses.

At the symposium, Dr. David Florent reported that a 2.5 per cent polyacrylamidehydrogel first developed for human use seems to reduce inflammation and lameness in OA-affected horses. Florent is a specialist in Surgery, Rehabilitation, and Diagnostic Imaging at the Equine Veterinary Medical Center, in Doha, Qatar.

Polyacrylamide gel, or PAAG, has been used for more than a decade in humans as an injectable, permanent filler for soft tissue augmentation. Popular in plastic surgery as means of augmenting breast size or of counter-acting wrinkles and thinning lips, these fillers are injected directly in the dermal or subdermal tissue to give skin more volume and smoothness.

Composed of 97.5 per cent water and 2.5 per cent



polyacrylamide, PAAG is a biocompatible polymer. Rather like long microscope strands of spaghetti, polymers are chemical compounds whose molecules are bonded together in very long repeating chains. Due to their molecular structure, polymers tend to be lightweight and strong, but flexible and elastic – much like human skin.

Because they are biocompatible, low-percentage polyacrylamide gels tend to be safe to use. Side effects are rare, although secondary bacterial infections from the injection process can occur.

There are two specific polyacrylamide gels designed for use in horses: Noltrex Vet (4 percent PAAG) and: Arthramid (2.5 percent PAAG). Dr. Florent's research includes both gels, but most of the current scientific research has focused on the 2.5 per cent product.

It is believed the gel works by improving joint capsule elasticity and by protecting joint surfaces from cytokines, or inflammatory molecules produced by the immune system during the osteoarthritic process. Indeed, research into polyacrylamide gel treatment of knee arthritis in humans has seen evidence of both effects.

Although Dr. Florent acknowledges that, to date, many 2.5 per cent PAAG clinical studies have been uncontrolled*, there have been positive findings.

A 2012 study of 12 horses suffering from three or more months of OA-caused pain in the coffin joint saw eight horses return to soundness six months after PAAG injections. Of the remaining four horses, two showed some improvement while the remaining two did not respond to treatment.

In 2014, a controlled trial was conducted to test the effectiveness of 2.5 per cent PAAG against sodium hyaluronate (TA-HA) in fetlock OA. In that study, more than half of the horses receiving PAAG sounded out whereas only 15 per cent of TA-HA became sound.

Florent also performed a pilot study in 2019 in which a total of 49 flat-racing thoroughbreds with either knee and/or fetlock OA were assessed for degree of lameness and then underwent a 24-week PAAG treatment program. After one month, 43 percent of the test horses were lameness-free. At 12 weeks, 67.3 per cent sounded out, while 65.3 per cent showed no lameness after 24 weeks. One horse regressed despite ongoing treatment.

It is important to note that 2.5 per cent PAAG treatment does not guarantee a return to racing for OA affected horses, and there is little research at present to indicate PAAG's efficacy in cases of severe or advanced OA.

Additionally, there is some anecdotal evidence that

subchondral bone cysts might respond to polyacrylamide gel, but Florent stresses that osteochondral chips or fractures will continue to require a surgical treatment option.

More research needs to be done to determine precisely when PAAG treatment should begin. There is also some evidence to suggest that dosage size is vitally important for successful treatment, but the exact dose levels have not been established.

PAAG will never be a "miracle cure" for osteoarthritic pain and lameness, but there is increasing evidence that it could be a viable treatment option.

**In uncontrolled clinical studies all patients are given a medical treatment or pharmaceutical to see if their condition improves over time. There is no comparison against another group, called a control group, that is either taking another type of treatment or no treatment at all. Typically, uncontrolled clinical studies are used for initial research and are followed by controlled studies if the findings are positive.*

Twice he was runner-up to Green Manalishi S in the \$453,750 Canadian Trotting Classic and Bluegrass Stake, and he hit the board in the \$220,000 Carl Erskine at Harrah's Hoosier Park and \$208,300 Matron final, where he trotted in 1:52 over Dover's five-eighths oval. In the Hambletonian final, Pilot Discretion raced on or near the lead until the stretch, trotting the mile in 1:52.3.

Indiana crowns its champions of 2019

The Hoosier State honored its best Saturday in Indianapolis.

The top Indiana performers from the 2019 pari-mutuel and fair circuits were honored Saturday night (Jan. 25) in downtown Indianapolis at the Indiana Roof Ballroom. **Trace Tetrick** and **Jeff Cullipher** repeated in the top driver and trainer categories, while Victory Hill Farm Inc. again received distinction as the state's leading breeder. Freshman **Odds On Osiris** was tabbed Indiana Pacer of the Year, while sophomore filly **Grand Swan** took home the Trotter of the Year award.

It was another banner year for Tetrick, who reigned in his sixth straight Harrah's Hoosier Park driving title, and eighth overall. He finished the 160-day meet with 328 wins and more than \$4.4 million in purse earnings. Tetrick finished seventh in North America last season with 478 trips to the winner's circle and just shy of \$6 million in purses. Cullipher collected his third straight Harrah's Hoosier Park training title on the strength of 108 victories and more than \$1.7 million in earnings. His stable finished 12th nationally with 186 wins and \$3.4 million in purse earnings in 2019. Tetrick and Cullipher teamed for several Indiana Sires Stakes scores with phenomenal freshman trotting colt TJ's Top Pick, divisional champion with eight wins from 10 starts, \$302,871 in earnings, and a 1:53.3 Hoosier Park track record.

Don Eash sent out 46 winners during the fair season and earned Fair Circuit Trainer of the Year, a status he has achieved several times. **Joey Putnam**, on the other hand, secured his first Fair Circuit Driver of the Year award. The son of Hoosier horseman Joe Putnam steered 61 winners over the summer and fall.

Odds On Osiris led all 2- and 3-year-old Indiana-sired pacers in Indiana earnings, leading to Pacer of the Year honors. The Rockin Image—Antigua Hanover gelding won seven of 10 starts for trainer Melanie Wrenn and Dana Parham's Odds On Racing. Driven by Peter Wrenn, Odds On Osiris captured the Fox Stake, \$270,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Super Final and \$61,500 Madison County, and raced second in the \$125,000 Elevation to finish the season with earnings of \$343,895 and a 1:50.3 mark, a new Hoosier Park record for freshman gelding pacers.

Grand Swan captured 10 of 15 starts and accumulated earnings of \$411,232 to garner Trotter of the Year honors.

Trained and driven by LeWayne Miller, the Swan For All—Queen Mum sophomore is owned by the partnership of Grand Swan Racing, Go Fast Stable and Never 2 Late Stable. The filly won six Indiana Sires Stakes legs and the \$270,000 Super Final, also annexing a \$34,500 division of The Pegasus and \$32,300 division of The Circle City. She finished a neck behind Evident Beauty in the \$135,000 Moni Maker.

Always A Virgin—A Nite To Remember mare **Glorious Nite** was selected as Aged Pacer of the Year, while multiple ISS final winner **Bridge To Jesse's** earned Aged Trotter of the Year honors. Glorious Nite led all older pacers with \$68,407 in Indiana earnings, while Jailhouse Jesse-Bridge To Nowhere product Bridge To Jesse's accumulated \$131,650.

Rockin Image and **Swan For All** led all stallions in Indiana in 2019. A total of 55 starters represented Rockin Image in Indiana Sires Stakes competition, amassing earnings of \$1.74 million to lead all pacing stallions last season. Besides Odds On Osiris, Rockin Image sired Super Final winners Rockin Nola and Priceless. Nationally, the son of Rocknroll Hanover sired 285 starters that collected 203 victories and \$7.8 million in purses. A group of 53 starters sired by Swan For All banked \$2.29 million in sires stakes purses to top all trotting stallions in 2019. Offspring claiming ISS Super Finals included Grand Swan, Swandre The Giant, TJ's Top Pick and Rock Swan. Swan For All's 2019 North American totals include 115 wins from 168 starters and purses of \$6.27 million.

Victory Hill Farm Inc., which stands both Rockin Image and Swan For All, picked up yet another award as Large Breeder of the Year. Horses bred by Victory Hill earned \$1.3 million in Indiana last season, and 91 starters combined to rake in \$2.89 million nationally. Larry E. Miller Jr. was recognized as Small Breeder of the Year. Miller bred two horses that started in 2019, one of which was the aforementioned champion Grand Swan.

One of the more poignant moments of the evening took place during the Indiana Standardbred Hall of Fame's induction of four new members. Jessica Barnes, Director of Racing and Breed Development for the Indiana Horse Racing Commission, inducted her late father-in-law, **Harold Barnes**. Harold was a third-generation horseman and former leading driver and trainer, the son of fellow Hall of Fame members Ed and Luella Barnes. Kay, his wife of 56 years, and other family members were on hand for the induction. Harold Barnes passed away November 10, 2019 at the age of 79.

Lynn Wilfong, who has actively participated in harness racing in the Hoosier State for more than six decades, also joined the hall of fame Saturday as one of its newest members. Wilfong has bred several Indiana Sires Stakes champions as well as top Illinois horses. He served at the helm of the local horseman's association for more than a decade and helped lobby to bring pari-mutuel racing to the state.

Equine inductees Saturday evening included **Hannelore Hanover** and **Freaky Feet Pete**. Both retired competitors brought increased recognition to the Indiana breeding program while showcasing their talent on the Grand Circuit. Hannelore Hanover called it a career late last year as a triple millionaire, former Horse of the Year, and one of the greatest trotters in the history of the sport. She earned two Breeders Crown titles, one while beating her male counterparts, and a slew of stakes victories. Freaky Feet Pete earned much of his \$1.6 million bankroll competing for his late breeder and trainer, Larry Rheinheimer. The Rockin Image colt won a Breeders Crown final in 2015 and was part of the "Big Three" that included fellow Indiana-sired pacers Wiggle It Jiggle it and Always B Miki.

Nadina Ironia – equine artist

The sport of harness racing has its very own superstar artist named Nadina Ironia.

Born in Latvia, Ironia re-located to Ireland in 2009.

“It feels like I was born with dreams about horses and a set of brushes, but professionally I took up painting in my mid 20’s while I was in college,” Ironia said.

“The first set of trotters I sketched was in 2005 after I fell in love with the sport, but serious interest in painting harness racing began when Christine Cone commissioned me to paint her champion, Hot Shot Blue Chip, to celebrate his millionaire status in 2012. That was it: I was hooked and there was no going back.”

Cone was so pleased with Ironia’s work, that she now owns a total of 10 paintings done by the talented artist, featuring her horses Hot Shot Blue Chip, Maven, and Mystery Woman.

Top trainer Casie Coleman, who has developed and trained several champion stallions such as American Ideal, Betting Line, Sportswriter and Betterthancheddar, hired Ironia to paint her superstars and the great McWicked is soon to be added to the list.

Ironia has painted European champions such as Timoko, Bold Eagle, (his champion sire) Ready Cash, Up And Quick, Facetime Bourbon, Scarlet Turgot, Readly Express, and Belina Josselyn. More well-known superstars are currently in progress and will be displayed during the Prix d’Amerique 2020 this weekend in Vincennes. This will be Ironia’s second invitational exhibition in Paris.

So how does this talented woman capture the beauty of the horse and how difficult is it?

“After 25 years of working with horses, knowing the anatomy and equipment of different equine disciplines, I wouldn’t say it is difficult to me, but it can be super tricky to create details where I don’t see any from old photos, poor lighting, odd angles, etc.

“I not only see the fragility of the horse, but I feel it and deal with it every day. A horse’s ‘look’ tells me a lot about how they feel and what they are thinking. I am a person who is very much into the animal’s feelings and emotions and I want to transfer those feelings onto canvas.

“Reference photo is also very important. I do try to work from my own photos; unfortunately, it’s not always an option for horses that are based abroad. Luckily, there are great photographers who the clients arrange a photo shoot for their horse, or they agree on reproduction of racing images. I still study more than one photoset to know a little more about each horse’s features and the equipment they wear.

“I was recently hired by Le Trot to paint in Vincennes for a winner of the Grand National Trot series. Given only two hours to complete the painting was very challenging and due to the winning horse not being victorious the final race (he finished 6th), I had to use photos from the entire season to capture ‘his looks’; but I think I nailed it for the proud owner was showing off his prize to others.”

Ironia said it was hard to choose a favorite from her work.

“I have an emotional bond with most of my paintings, for I give a little part of my life to each piece. However, if I have to pick one I guess it would be the painting “Sweetheart” (Newtown Jody). I painted it last year before she started performing her champion miles.

"Newtown Jody was born at Newtown Stud, where I spend every morning grooming horses. Her dam, Onyx Killian, is charismatic, sweet and was extremely talented while racing in Canada. In fact, Onyx is the first to greet me in the paddock. I love all of her foals.

"When Jody was born, Onyx proudly invited me to observe her newborn gem. Later, Jody was in the racing barn with us and to me it was so special to be with her. She will always be a 'sweetheart' to me (thus the title of her painting) and I'm very proud of her. I will always have special feelings to the foals, for my journey began at the stud farm.

"And as far as other things I enjoy painting: every horseperson has a dog, and I also love painting dogs."

Having seen many of Ironia's paintings, I asked if she is open to take on private jobs for people who would like a portrait of their four-legged child.

"I paint 99 per cent on commission for clients. I really wish I had more time to create my own, but due to a busy schedule between work for IHRA (I do marketing and run Pony Races in Irish Harness Racing Association), stables, photography and events, I have very limited time left for painting. Horses are my life and it is hard to tell where the hobby ends and work begins," she said.

"Thanks to horses I have traveled a lot and met so many wonderful people. In order to really get the feeling of my subject, I have to be there and feel the atmosphere of the races. Prix d' Amerique and Elitloppet are pretty inspiring to me, both as an artist and horseperson."

Unlike other artists, Ironia doesn't take part in competitions, stating her award is the customer's appreciation and happiness.

"I don't need to prove anything to anyone. Art is all about personal preferences. Someday, I would love to see The Hambletonian or International Trot in the flesh, but again, it all takes time. Someday I'd be happy to challenge myself and produce a collection for North America's public."

Death by a Salesman – Part 2

Idling at the *Taco Bell* drive-thru, I turned to my wealthy employer and said, “A few weeks ago, I read something brilliant. A clever fellow from Canada is going to host a \$100,000 stakes race in the year 2023 at Woodbine Mohawk Park. The race is for the progeny of a new stallion named Jimmy Freight ([full story here](#)). If I lived in Canada or if I had a pacing broodmare, this stallion would be on the table.

“But you don’t,” he said.

“Any brilliant idea should immediately be stolen and tweaked.”

He wagged his index finger, “Stealing may not be legal. Tweaking may not be an improvement.”

“True, I played bass guitar in a rock band. For our setlist, we leaned on Tom Petty and the Heartbreakers with a dash of Dylan. We billed ourselves as Tommy P and the Tone It Downs. We were doing okay, playing some gigs at the *Rock N Bowl*. Then I decided to tweak. I nagged Tommy into doing original songs and adding a tuba. Those were unfortunate tweaks. The tweaked Tone It Downs got turned off. Tommy P went solo.”

“So, your insane plan this week is to tweak the concept of a race only open to a crop from a particular stallion?”

“Yes. Imagine that Adam Bowden of Diamond Creek Farms went on a bender and called me asking for advice on marketing Creatine.”

“That is a phone call that will never happen.”



“Probably not, but my brilliant solution would be to offer a similar special race open only to 2023 offspring of Creatine with a tweak.”

“What’s the purse of your imaginary race?”

“Exact prices and details are to be determined. Trey paints with a broad brush and then delegates. Creatine is doing very well without me. He has some nice looking babies at the farm where we keep our mare. His first crop races this year, I have liked this stallion ever since he stepped into the game a few years ago. Twice Creatine was a finalist for my broodmare. My decision came down to coin flip, but I went the other way. Weird stuff can factor into pulling the trigger on a breeding contract. Tell you this, if he had the races I am proposing on the table, I would have a couple of Creatine in the barn.”

“Races, you just said races, plural?”

“I want the original race option with a tweak.”

“Does it involve a tuba?”

“No, the tweak involves subtraction.”

“Subtraction?”

“Yeah, the big race with the fat purses for the Creatine Crop would take place after stakes racing in 2023. At that point, my tweak is a second race on that day, nothing huge, maybe a \$20,000 purse that is open only to Creatine horses that did NOT earn \$10,000.”

“What! Why?”

“I don’t like the idea that if Creatine pops a few monsters in this crop, and he very well could, those top horses can swoop in and take all the money. The good Creatines made it, and good for them, those breeders are happy customers. This second race is for the less fortunate offspring, a race where the slower horses from Creatine can recoup some costs. As a buyer, I’m looking for an insurance policy from a disastrous year on the track.”

“Insurance policies in harness horse racing are a strange concept.”

“We have one broodmare. We have dozens of viable stallions in the state, hundreds in other states. There are





reasons we cross them off. However, if a stallion has the carrot of a big race attached and if this insurance race is attached, it means a lot to small-timers. Our

thinking is that with a limited pool of eligibles, our possibilities improve.”

My pal added, “And if you send the horse to a sale, the additional races for Creatine horses could have a positive effect in a sales ring.”

I nodded, “This happened to me. We danced to a big dance. We cashed an insurance policy.”

“Happened? Danced? Cashed? Past tense? Isn’t this a new concept?”

“Not for me. Wishing Stone stood his first season as a stallion in New Jersey. Despite never setting foot in the Meadowlands and not knowing a single resident of the state, we bred our mare to Wishing Stone simply because we predicted a very small crop with two legs and a final for the Sires Stakes.”

“And what happened?”

“Well, first of all, horse buyers are smart. A few noticed our filly was in a very small pool, they noticed the mathematics and quickly grasped that merely qualifying placed this filly in a lucrative race. We received a few offers.”

“Did you sell?”

“Nope. As it turned out, we should have, but we were having too much fun. The crop was small, maybe a dozen. We followed every horse and got to know our competition by name. We did qualify, barely, so our filly was eligible for two legs and the final in short fields of maybe six or seven.”

“Interesting.”

“It was interesting, a new slant on racing with the limited pool. That season was fun, but we did not make money.”

“Trey, how could you not make money?”

“It’s a gift. However, we did not get killed due to our little insurance policy. Yannick Gingras will never know how much driving our marginal trotter across the line for the last check meant. It kept us from total fiscal ruin. It may very well have kept us in the sport.”

“So you are looking for a stallion that can recreate that limited field experience with private races for both the top and bottom tier?”

“Carrots and insurance policies will make Trey play.”

“Do you think these ‘Sire Only’ races could become a regular part of the racing scene?”

“I hope so. Strange things can happen. Heck, Tommy P and the Tone It Downs could make a comeback at the *Rock N Bowl*.”

New Jersey Sires Stakes to feature four new races

The board of trustees of the New Jersey Sire Stakes has announced that it will institute four new events for 4-year-old harness racing trotters and pacers beginning in the spring of 2020. The new races, called the New Jersey Breeders' Maturity, will be open to all horses that were nominated as yearlings to either the New Jersey Sire Stakes Premier Division or the New Jersey Standardbred Development Fund.

"We are pleased to offer this set of races to the standardbred industry," said New Jersey Department of Agriculture Secretary Douglas Fisher, who is also a trustee of the Sire Stakes board. "New Jersey has a wonderful tradition in horse racing and we believe these new races will be a great addition to the sport in our state."

The races will be conducted at The Meadowlands on March 20 and 27 and April 17 and 24 and will consist of a preliminary leg and a final. Preliminary legs will go for \$12,500 or \$15,000 depending upon the number of entries, with the top 10 point earners advancing to the finals.

All preliminary legs will be contested, regardless of the number of entries. Purses for the finals shall be tiered based upon the number of entries. If less than five horses enter, the purse for the final will be \$30,000; if five to seven horses enter the purse for the final will be \$40,000; and if more than seven enter the purse will increase to \$50,000.

To remain eligible, a nomination fee of \$200 must be made for each horse by February 15, 2020. A \$200 starting fee will be required to enter the preliminary leg. There will be no additional starting fees for horses that qualify for the finals.

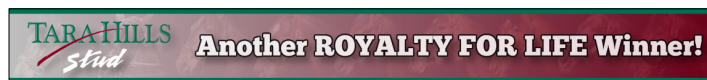
