Brittany Farms announces emotional end of an era

Over the next three years, Brittany Farms as we currently know it will come to an end and Art Zubrod and Leah Cheverie will retire. Farm owner George Segal said he hopes to find a buyer in the standardbred world for the harness racing breeding institution.

Though the exit plan has been contemplated, in some measure, for years, when it finally came time to put it into motion and say it publicly, Art Zubrod suddenly found himself emotional for the first time. On the phone from Kentucky this week, Zubrod's voice caught in his throat when he and wife Leah Cheverie announced they were retiring from Brittany Farms and owner George Segal was selling the farm that has long been one of harness racing's greatest institutions.

"It has been our life, Leah and mine, for 40 years now. It's something I'm quite proud of. It's a dream to work with people like those I've been able to work with," Zubrod said, pausing to collect himself. "Sorry, that's the first time I've been emotional since this started."

Cheverie added, "We're very proud of what we've accomplished and we couldn't do it without all the people that have been behind it and out there working those long hours."

"There's been very little turnover," Zubrod said, adding that as many as six other people have worked at Brittany for over 20 years.

The good news is that the end of Brittany Farms — at least under its current ownership and leadership — will play out over three years. Zubrod, the farm's manager, and Cheverie, Brittany's office manager, will retire after the 2025 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

"It happens to be a great time because by the time Art and Leah retire, I'll be 87-and-a-half years old," Segal said. "And every time that I think about that, I think I should get a lot smaller, even though we've gotten a lot smaller over the last 10 years. I think I should get in a position where I don't drive my wife and kids crazy after I'm gone. My plan is to sell the farm.

"I would like to sell the farm to someone in the standardbred business, if I can. A perfect scenario would be to sell it to somebody who wants to do their version of breeding and racing or just breeding or whatever and keep most of the employees here. They have been great employees and they've been here for many years. I think the longest is 35 years."

Segal still owns a piece of the Red Mile racetrack in Lexington, KY and is still on the board of the Hambletonian Society. Nearly 38 years after he purchased Bill Shehan's Clermont Farm in 1985 and Brittany Farms was born, Segal remains as passionate about harness racing as ever. Though, his family is much less so. That makes turning the farm over to an heir out of the question.

"There's no absolutes in this world, but that is an absolute," Segal said, laughing. "They have no interest.

"When the kids were smaller, in high school or maybe in college [they had some interest], but they have too much on their plates now. They work and they have families. My wife comes to the Hambletonian and she enjoys it, but it's not her thing."



That success has increased, if anything, since Brittany moved to a smaller property — eight miles from the original farm location — in 2016. In 2022, for the fifth year in a row, the farm ranked first among all standardbred breeders in average earnings per starter, at more than \$57,000 per.

And that doesn't include the champions the farm has bought and raced under the Brittany banner, such as Cantab Hall, Western Hanover, Three Diamonds and many, many more.

On the list of personal favorite moments, Segal and Zubrod agree nothing tops Artsplace's 1:51.1 world record win as a 2-year-old in the **1990 Breeders Crown at Pompano Park**.

"That was quite the night," Segal said.

Though, Zubrod added that Life Sign's win in the **1993 Little Brown Jug** was "huge, just huge."

As part of winding down operations, Zubrod hopes to preserve a lot of that history. Many equine greats were buried at the original Brittany location. Some 12 headstones were then moved to the new farm.

"One of the things that weighed on my mind is what to do with all the trophies and headstones we have here," Zubrod said. "Some of the trophies can go to different places, but we've got too many trophies for someone to accommodate all of them."

It's another reason Segal is hoping a standardbred person or group will come along to purchase all of Brittany Farms and carry on the tradition.

"It would be nice for somebody to do that. It would solve the problem of headstones," Segal said. "I mean, it could be 'Hanover Shoe Farms at Brittany Farms' or something. I don't know."

AN EMOTIONAL END

Segal said this story is just the beginning of the public phase of bringing an end to Brittany as we know it today.

"I have not mentioned this or floated the idea of somebody buying this farm to anybody," he said.

Internally, Zubrod said he, Segal and Cheverie have been talking for about a year about how to end it, but plans only started to gel about three months ago. Zubrod will turn 74 this year.

"Physically I'm having trouble doing anything outside, due to some back injuries. I really enjoy doing the [yearling] videos, but I didn't feel 100 per cent safe out there this year. So, we'll see. That's just a part of life. I've aged a little faster than some people age," Zubrod said.

"After the [Lexington] sale in 2025, Leah and I will be retired. I think she plans on doing some work and I'll definitely help George out with anything he needs, but our grandkids are in Louisville and we'll move to Louisville at that time. We'll still be in the horse business. Both my daughters work for my sister, who runs Zubrod Stables, which is the stable that my mom and I started in 1967."

As the process unfolds, Brittany will continue on as it has.

"We don't know what the real estate market or the horse business will be in three years. We're going to continue as is up until about a year before that," Segal said. For all but the first two years of Brittany, farm manager Dale Logan and his wife, Patty, have also been a key part of the team. Zubrod said the Logans were sad when they were told the news.

"But, when I told them that it's not happening for three years, that was a relief," Zubrod said. "I could've walked in there and said, 'Well, tomorrow is the day."

In the meantime, Zubrod said he will, "concentrate on the good things – what we've produced and what the yearlings look like. I'm not going to concentrate on the end of it all.

"There was no emotion on my side at all until a few minutes ago. I would say the next time I'm emotional about it will be when we close the door. American-bred trotter tops in Paris on Saturday

On the eve of today's Prix d'Amérique, Beads won the \$105,000 Prix du Luxembourg.

American-bred trotters are not that common when races are held at Vincennes in Paris, but since the end of last year, 6-year-old **Beads** (Archangel) has spent his time in Jean-Michel Bazire's barn. In Saturday's (Jan. 28) \$105,000 Prix du Luxembourg, the trainer himself sat in the bike behind the horse for the first time in a race.

Beads became the bettors' choice in the Prix du Luxembourg and from post 7 behind the gate, Bazire seemed to have an optimistic tactic in mind. Beads was sent to the front, got passed by Bleff Dipa after a while only to re-take the lead midway through the race.

Bazire and the bettors knew what they were doing. In the last turn, when several horses disappeared for different reasons, Bazire stepped on the gas pedal and Beads flew away to safe win in a mile rate of 1:53 over 1.3 miles.

Beads has tried some of the preparation races ahead of the Prix d'Amérique without reaching the big race itself. Instead, he got his acknowledgement in Saturday's race, where the winner often shows up in more prestigious races for elite trotters later on during the season in Europe.

Dear Friend finished well as runner up and Cash du Rib claimed third place.

Vincennes' Saturday card also featured two big races for 3-year-old trotters.

In the \$160,000 Prix Roquepine for fillies, William Bigeon-trained **Kana de Beylev** (Express Jet), paired with talented driver Benjamin Rochard, proved to be the best. Rochard was eager to fight for the front positions at an early stage of the race, but when the drivers found their seats, Kana de Beylev had to settle in third on the inside, which could have been a position too

Despite arriving late in the 2022 breeding season, Best In Show booked 91 mares. He is a great cross to many Indiana-sired broodmares, and his foals will be Breeders Crown eligible.

far back to fight for the win. But Rochard found space between horses in the last turn and placed his horse with perfect cover from the race's first choice, Kracovia, throughout the last turn. Kracovia and Kana de Beylev battled side by side in the stretch and the latter had the longest nose when the wire was hit.

The mile rate for Kana de Beylev was 2:00.1 over 1.6 miles. Replay here.

The 3-year-old boys had a battle in the \$160,000 Prix Paul Viel and it ended with a big upset win for Alessandro Gocciadoro and his Maharajah son **Elton Wise**.

Elton Wise got a perfect third-over trip and Gocciadoro waited, with full attack, until the top of the stretch. Leader and first choice Koctel du Dain had to defend himself throughout the entire last turn when outside trotter Kompostel put hard pressure on him and he couldn't fight for the win as the wire approached. Elton Wise finished strongly and disarmed Kompostel shortly before the finish line.

Gocciadoro has had a very strong meeting in Paris this winter. This wasn't the first time he upset in a big race and today (Jan. 29) the Italian top trainer has two shots in Prix d'Amérique.

Today is a big day for racing fans all over the world. The \$1,075,000 Prix d'Amérique has a history that few other trotting races on this planet can match. The fact the race is held on an almost two kilometer long track with uphill and downhill parts makes the Prix d'Amérique even more special.

Though, there was some bad news on Friday (Jan. 27). Elitloppet winner Etonnant has to stay in his barn due to Lyme disease.

Etonnant was in the crowd of favorites in last year's Prix d'Amerique and Richard Westerink's trotter would probably have been many fans' choice today.

The French team is strong this year and it wouldn't be a surprise if Bazire has peaked the form with his weapon Hooker

Berry. Bazire is the master of Vincennes, both as a driver and as a trainer. He won his first Prix d'Amérique as a driver with American-bred super mare Moni Maker in 1999 and after that day, he has collected three more wins in the race. In 2004, he sat behind Kesaco Phedo, who gave him his first victory as a trainer in Prix d'Amérique. Eleven years later, in 2015, Bazire was entrusted behind Franck Leblanc-trained winner Up And Quick.

In 2019, it was Belina Josselyn's year and Bazire captured his fourth and most recent victory in France's biggest harness event.

But beside Bazire, Eric Raffin and his horse Horsy Dream, have many fans. Raffin is still gunning for his first win in the Prix d'Amérique, which seems odd since his resume contains several Group 1 victories in his home country. This could be his year and Hooker Berry and Horsy Dream are the two hottest horses in the 2023 Prix d'Amérique.

Snowstorm Hanover (Muscle Massive), the winner of the 2017 Kentucky Futurity, will return to the U.S. after five years in Sweden.



Tar Heel finds his footing as a stallion, Part 2

Part 1 is here.

"Johnny, the best thing you could do at Hanover is to make a gelding out of Tar Heel. I've trained a few and I don't like them all, especially the fillies. They are bad gaited and nasty. They kick so hard that they can kick the stars out of heaven."

Those were words spoken to John Simpson by Stanley Dancer after congratulating and wishing Simpson well on being made the general manager of Hanover Shoe Farms.

Dancer was not unique in expressing such views after the first few crops by Tar Heel had been to the various training centers and racetracks.

A few of the old timers at Hanover recalled George Sholty's arrival at the Fairgrounds one fall morning. At the time, Hanover published its own yearling catalog with the yearlings in it arranged by sire. The first thing Sholty did after getting his book was to make a show of tearing out all the Tar Heel yearling pedigree pages and throwing them in the trash saying: "I don't want to ever see or be around another one of them again."

Sholty had trained a few Tar Heels and had bad experiences. He had one named Gar Hanover, who could go a little, but had the bad habit of falling down with Sholty in the bike. Little did Sholty know that before the next year was done, he would change his tune after becoming the regular driver behind Tarquinius and Bengazi Hanover.

The tale of Tar Heel at stud was that of two entirely different stallions. For his first five years, the majority of the mares he received were by trotting sires. The type of individuals generally produced by those matings were big, plain and coarse. They could often go fast, but their gaits were not the most desirable and their manners were often found to be lacking.

But that didn't mean that they were no good, far from it. They showed promise from the get-qo.

His first crop numbered only 17 foals. Fourteen of them were out of trotting-sired mares. They included stakes winner Nyland Hanover and the filly Sweetmite Hanover, his first of many fillies destined to become multiple stakes producing broodmares.

His second crop was much bigger and better. From just 31 foals, he produced such accomplished stakes performers as Tar Boy, Thorpe Hanover, O'Brien Hanover, Painter and the fast filly Traffic Lady. All of them from mares by trotting bred sires. Once again, the majority (19) were out of mares which were sired by trotters.

From afar, to this neophyte student of breeding, it appeared as though the management of Hanover

were doing with Tar Heel what they had done with his sire Billy Direct. They were breeding him almost entirely to trotting-bred mares. My guess, and it is only a guess, is that the management just hadn't replenished their pacing broodmare ranks.

His third crop numbered only 25. Once again, the mares were mostly trotting sired. Fifteen of the 25 were by trotting sires. They included the good colt Carloader and a pair of stakes fillies, Honick Rainbow and Brenna Hanover. Brenna Hanover, of course, was destined to become the dam of the great Bret Hanover.

The next crop numbered 33 and their dams were the first where pacers outnumbered trotters. Eighteen were out of pacing sired mares. They included the stakes colts Doc Hobbs and Chipmans Heel and one of the first very consequential horses out of a pacing bred mare, Romola Hanover, a mare who several, including this scribe, believe to be the greatest ever of all pacing broodmares. She was out of the Hal Dale mare Romola Hal. The first of a great paternal line, extending from Hal Dale himself, to Adios and Good Time, to excel after having been bred to Tar Heel.

A note about Romola Hanover: John Simpson, who trained her, believed her to have had more pure speed than any other horse that he had ever trained or sat behind. Unfortunately, her manners

did not always correspond to her ability. She had the bad habit of sometimes laying down on the racetrack.

Crop number five numbered 34. They were equally divided at being out of pacing and trotting-sired mares. Included among them were the first of many 2:00 performers to come out of an Adios mare, the colt Tarport Jimmy, and, most importantly, the horse that many consider to have been Tar Heel's greatest performer, the colt Tarquinius. To appreciate how great Tarquinius was, you had to see him in action. He was big and strong and fast, very, very fast. Sadly, we were never to realize how great Tarquinius really was as his life ended after undergoing intestinal surgery at Cornell in 1965.

Tar Heel's foals of 1959 numbered 43, 23 of the mares were by pacers, only the second time that the pacers outnumbered the trotters. He had seven in 2:00, the most he had previously sired in a single season. Included were Gamecock, Emory Hanover, Buxton Hanover, Jeremiah Hanover, Mighty Tar Heel, Tarport Boy and the filly Ritzy Hanover.

Crop seven numbered 36,24 out of pacing-sired mares. Included were the colts Steady Beau and Sly Yankee and the fillies Lady Heel and Lantana.

In the eighth crop were Bengazi Hanover, Newport Tarzan and the filly Sand Tart.

Tar Heel was to have 19 more crops of foals, yes 19, for a total of 27. Included in those numbers were Laverne Hanover, Nansemond, Kentucky, Isle of Wight, Otaro Hanover, Keystone Pat, Penn State and the ultra-fast filly Hazel Hanover.

All told, Tar Heel sired 1,368 foals equally divided between colts and fillies. His racetrack performers earned a total of \$39,085,461.

This story would be incomplete if I were to not speak about Tar Heel, the horse and his remarkable and unique personality.

Tar Heel was a big, strong horse, but his nature did not match his stature. If one were to describe him with one word, that word might be "wuss." For a big, strong, manly horse, he was somewhat of a sissy.

He was great around people and especially appreciative of treats. He was especially glad to be given mints. But one had to be careful in giving treats to any of the studs. Mr. Simpson hated the practice, believing that it encouraged bad behavior and sometimes led to injury to the stallions.

There was one group of people that Tar Heel hated. He was able to instinctively smell them out. They were veterinarians and especially Hanover's resident vet Dr. Garner Greenhoff, as nice and sweet a man as has ever been this scribe's pleasure to know. But Tar Heel did not think so. The term "smell" might be very literal. Dr. Greenhoff might be just around the corner and Tar Heel would know he was coming, quickly retreating to the far corner of his spacious stall.

In the breeding shed, Tar Heel was very fertile. Each ejaculate would produce upwards of 200 ccs of the highest quality semen, which would live for as much as three or four days after collection. Although his semen was of the highest quality, being able to collect it might be somewhat of a challenge. He was extremely picky of the mares which he was to service. Several mares in heat were brought to the shed and Tar Heel would search them out and pick the one he wanted. Occasionally there were none that matched his needs and that day would result in his not being collected.

He was also a wuss in the breeding shed. This scribe remembers one day when there was a gray mare in the shed. She so frightened Tar Heel that he wasn't able to be collected for the remainder of the week. From that point on, gray mares were to be kept out of Tar Heel's sight on breeding days.

Indiana fair circuit changes to create more opportunities

When the Indiana Sired Fair Circuit kicks off in the Hoosier State in June, the program will offer a different look than in previous years. The changes are part of the state's 2023 breed development program, valued at just under \$14.3 million and approved in December by the Indiana Horse Racing Commission (IHRC). The updated fair schedule places an emphasis on greater opportunities for horsemen.

"When we make changes, we're making them based on feedback that we're hearing. We think this is a step in the right direction to address that feedback," Jessica Barnes, director of racing breed development for the IHRC said of changes to the fair program, which has a projected budget of \$1.4 million. "I think it does provide more opportunities,

and it does provide a little bit more money for those racing in that first series. I think, ultimately, it will have a positive impact on series two with the horses available and the horses that can move to Hoosier Park and fill opportunities there."

The first series Barnes is alluding to is a set of 24 race dates spread over 14 different stops on the circuit building to the Governor's Cup Championships, held in mid-August at the Indiana State Fairgrounds. In order to qualify for the \$25,000 championships and \$10,000 consolations, a horse has to make a minimum seven starts on the fair circuit. The top eight point earners with this designation compete in the championships, while horses outside the top eight with the minimum required starts race in the consolations.

One of the takeaways from last year's fair season was that Governor's Cup consolation races didn't fully fill. Of the seven consolations contested (there was no sophomore colt pace due to lack of eligible horses), four of the events had five or less starters, with two walkovers.

"One of the things we saw last year were the consolations not filling or having very short fields. We wanted to look at that and try to maximize starts," Barnes said. "One of the ideas that was discussed was moving the fair finals outside of the state fair.



Ultimately, it wasn't a popular idea. People didn't like it, and I understand why. So, we wanted to look at how to maximize starts."

The idea is to make the schedule as friendly as possible to horsemen, providing additional opportunities to log those critical starts and earn points toward the championship races. For instance, this year the Governor's Cup finals are not slated the same week as Grand Circuit/Fox Stake Day at the Indiana State Fair. The card is moved back one week, giving horsemen the option to enter their horses in the Grand Circuit races.

In addition, fair racing will debut at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino for three dates — June 21-23 — as part of each night's card. In the past, horses have stepped up to the pari-mutuel ranks sparingly due to the need to accumulate the needed fair starts. These dates will not only help director of racing Scott Peine fill the entry box, but it also gives connections an opportunity to try their young horses on the seven-eighths while collecting that valuable fair start. Stipulations require a horse to have raced in one of three prior fair stops leading into the Hoosier Park dates, and many of the same rules on the grounds apply. Barnes recognizes this could lead some to skip the round and point to the next week.

"They are going to be subject to licensing requirements, they are going to be subject to detention and all the rules that other horses are subjected to. If someone chooses not to race, they will still get their starts. We haven't taken an opportunity away, we have added an opportunity," she said. "Our hope is, with horsemen seeing how they can do at Hoosier Park on the bigger track, maybe there will be more horses after the Governor's Cup Championships are over that will go to Hoosier and compete."

In addition to the schedule changes, series one races will offer increased purses. Last year purses were raised from \$3,000 to \$3,500 across the board. For 2023, each division leading into the Governor's Cup Championships will carry a \$3,800 purse. The series two events, held after the championships in the month of September, will offer \$3,300 purses. Series two finals have advertised purses of \$7,000, a decrease from the \$10,000 events last season.

While the Indiana Sires Stakes program is relatively unchanged for 2023, small adjustments were made with Breeders Crown implications in mind. Hoosier Park will play host to the Crown for the third time this fall. One week prior to eliminations, the Anderson oval will wrap up the lucrative \$7.9 million sires stakes campaign with \$250,000 Super Finals in each division. Traditionally contested on a single night, this season the finales for freshman trotters will take place Thursday, Oct. 12. The balance of Super Final contests is slated for Friday, Oct. 13.

"This is by design because of the way the Breeders Crown schedule is set up the following week. We wanted to make sure that the horses that could be eligible to the Breeders Crown eliminations held on Thursday the following week had the same schedule as the horses that are racing on Friday," Barnes said. "It was a one-time scheduling thing this year. Our hope is that there are lots of Indiana horses that will move on to those races."

Sweden — Marcus Melander (Joviality S), Ake Svanstedt (Ecurie D, Special Way), Nancy Takter (Treacherous Dragon).





Today, Emma is 21 and currently enrolled in Brock University, which she attends after working with her horses in the morning.

Although athletic — Emma was involved in baseball, soccer, tap, ballet and swimming — her love for horses and harness racing only grew stronger throughout the years.

"From a little girl showing horses, to now, Emma has attained her RUS license [although there aren't many opportunities to



continue at the moment]," Colville said. "My daughter has gotten a trainer's license and recently passed her driver's exam.

"Emma is a natural. She is a well-balanced rider and loves jumping with her standardbred, The Painted Pony."

After Emma's grandfather signed the horse Millenium Seelster over to her, Emma now has the horse showing in flat classes and low jumps and racing.

"Emma has always been competitive and loves to stay busy, just like me," Colville said with a laugh. "Emma can do almost anything I do: from delivering foals to racing horses."

This past summer, Emma started racing some of her younger horses at Leamington Raceway.

"Leamington Raceway has a wonderful atmosphere there and coincidentally I also got my start at the smaller tracks [Kawartha, Barrie, Belleville and Kingston]," Colville said. "I did race periodically at Greenwood/Mohawk, but with the better-quality horses."

As proud as Colville is of her daughter, Emma is just as proud of her mom.

"Having the opportunity to do what I love, while learning under one of the best in the game (Moiseyev), has truly been a blessing.

"I worked part-time at Woodbine/Mohawk Park as the equipment judge and parade marshal on big race nights.

"I also host the annual National Caretaker Appreciation Day once a year, which allows us to celebrate the importance of our hard-working caretakers. "I'm also a volunteer for The Ontario Standardbred Adoption Society (OSAS): a program in place to find standardbreds their forever second home."

Colville also is involved with OSAS.

"It is a wonderful program that gives us a warm feeling seeing a horse that we have had end up in OSAS," Colville said.

Emma said, "A horse called JC's Royal Tease got me my first ever Woodbine Mohawk Park win and he just recently got adopted through OSAS."

Currently there are 20 horses in training at their stable they keep at the training center, with six anxious yearlings waiting to be brought in, and a few 3-year-olds who have been turned out to mature and grow.

"Emma is a God-send," Colville said. "She will always do whatever is needed as far as having a horse at a track or an event, post parade on larger days if I have a conflict, and she's been very instrumental with the Toys For Tots drive between Mohawk and Western Fair. That saying, give a busy person something to do and they will always get it done rings true here."

Going north is better than going under

Harness racing needs to adapt to the new world of sports betting

No matter how hard you squint, this real-life report can't be good.

A flood of legal sports gambling is cascading across the land. Most of us hope that the new gambling wave will not be terrible for harness racing and these invaders will all disappear.

Every day since the inevitable launch of online sports betting, my phone and iPad keep chiming with offers from gambling apps. Each chime demonstrates that the new battles for gambling dollars are here to stay. A chilling, real-life sample of what we are up against in the brave new gambling world flashed across my screens and among my friends.

I am a paid subscriber to *The Athletic*, an online sporting publication. I subscribe because they have a staff of terrific baseball writers who feed my appetite for the grand old game. The day that sports betting arrived in Ohio, my iPad flashed an offer from *The Athletic* that was hard to refuse.

Everyone, everywhere, every team, appears to have a betting partner, and *The Athletic* is no exception; they have partnered with BetMGM. I was surprised this sports publication was now in the gambling business, but good for them. The economics of supporting any publication is complex, and if this publication finds an additional revenue stream to support great writers and editors, more power to them.

The Atlantic/BetMGM folks found me via my baseball passion and lured me to a detailed sports wagering guide with a glossary of tips, terms, and friendly advice. They also linked me to excellent articles about various sports. Very slick, one of the few internet teasers I did not click off in a nanosecond.

Then, *The Athletic* sweetened the deal for me: if I chose their sportsbook partner, they would toss in a free year's subscription. I have been a harness racing gambler for a long time, but here I sit, free subscriptions, bonus bets, a cornucopia of options, links to excellent writing, and free daily research on the sport I choose for my wagering money.

I looked at a section of the introduction to the betting site titled "What Sports You Can Bet." The list was long, including lacrosse, darts, rugby, and F1, which I googled and learned is car racing. What was not on the list was horse racing or harness racing.

The new sports gambling scene is the wild west. An article in my local newspaper on the early days of the sports gambling explosion ran an expose on questionable lobbying from sports gambling. Ohio representatives were already questioning their percentage of the gambling cut, and they were discovering enforcing the 21-and-up age restriction was problematic. These betting outfits have found a motherlode in young men, a group especially susceptible to sports gambling, and are lurking on campuses because these gambling entities plan. They know that hooking customers young can and does establish life-long patterns.

When horse racing gambling was king, we set similar patterns. How many of you found the lure of the trotters and pacers at a young age and remain today? How many young people will find a harness race as their passion in the blizzard of sports that blink across their screens?

To emphasize this point, I have been subtly recruiting a 30-ish fellow to join the harness racing gambling ranks for a few years. My progress in bringing him into the harness racing flock was between glacial and non-existent. Sitting next to him yesterday, I watched this guy gleefully wager on the point total over/under at 35 points for Luka Doncic, a Slovenian basketball player on the Dallas Mavericks basketball team.

For an eternal optimist, this little report on sports wagering is a total bummer. When a harness racing lifer like myself is wavering on his sports wagering options, we've got trouble in River City. From a macro view, this invasion into our territory should be unnerving for every harness racing fan. It makes our sport seem almost ridiculous, like an accordion player wearing a bow tie at a Super Bowl half-time bonanza.

A sharp kick in the rear end is likely if your head is in the sand.

All our lives, horse racing has been a gambling game, the only game in town. Maybe the new sports gambling menu will not hold much appeal to many of our current players and perhaps harness racing can hang on to them for a while longer. Still, the future will come and the new gambling world will be challenging for our sport.

Never shy about suggesting ridiculous solutions under a pseudonym; allow this proposal. If our gambling money is going south, why not investigate going north while we still have time? Going north will involve recreating our sport into more of an "ownership" sport, a sport where individuals or groups *owning* the franchise instead of betting on someone else's franchise is the focus.

Would a path like this be complicated and challenging? Obviously, but going north is better than going under.



Harness Racing Museum & Hall of Fame announces 2022 Immortals

In July 2022, the Immortals nominating committee of the Harness Racing Museum & Hall of Fame announced that the trustees of the Museum had unanimously endorsed the election of Charlie Coleman, Gordon Gilbertson, Ira Malott, Margot Taylor, Edward Willis, Adios Scarlet and Exciting Speed as harness racing Immortals. On Sunday (July 2), these individuals will be inducted into the Hall of Immortals during ceremonies held under the tent on the Museum's lawn.

Charlie Coleman (1921-2003) Charlie Coleman, one of harness racing's best-known caretakers, handled such brilliant performers as 1964 Hambletonian and Trotting Triple Crown winner Ayres, 1970 Hambletonian winner Timothy T, Sugarcane Hanover and 1960 Little Brown Jug winner, Bullet Hanover.

Gordon Gilbertson (1920-2016) By using his extensive experience both treating horses as a veterinarian and training harness horses, Dr. Gordon Gilbertson revolutionized the standardbred racing industry when he invented the quick hitch harness. Gilbertson's idea changed the sport and has become so much a part of modern-day harness rigging it seems as though it has been here forever.

Ira Malott (1898-1975) Ira M. Malott was the inventor and developer of the Visumatic timer. In 1951 the United States Trotting Association approved the device and Malott secured a contract with Roosevelt Raceway the following year. The Roosevelt contract would prove that manual time with a stopwatch allowed variations of as much as four-fifths of a second for a mile distance. Malott's Visumatic timer eliminated the human error.

Margot Taylor (1934-1994) As a trustee and later president of the Harness Horse Youth Foundation, Margot Taylor shared her love of harness racing with future generations by creating programs, fundraising, writing manuals and curriculum, expanding the reach of camps, inspiring committee workers and traveling coast to coast to spread the foundation's mission both within harness racing circles and with other equine youth organizations.

Edward Willis (1870-1930) As a trainer, driver, farm superintendent and manager, Edward D. Willis made a mark with historical ramifications reverberating to this day. Willis was said to be "one of the greatest of all early speed makers," by famed harness racing historian John Hervey. Willis is credited with breeding, breaking and training the majority of Peter The Great's offspring at W.E.D. Stokes' Patchen Wilkes Farm.

Foaled in 1959, broodmare **Adios Scarlet's** production was nothing short of sensational in both quality and quantity, producing multiple winners at the highest level of competition

including six individual \$100,000 winners in the 1970s: Isle Of Wight (\$493,514), Little Brown Jug winner Nansemond (\$448,436), Woodrow Wilson winner Scarlet Skipper (\$423,658), Richmond (\$317,301), Nancy Isle (\$148,903) and Southampton V (\$119,748).

A foal of 1965, broodmare **Exciting Speed** produced 1981 World Trotting Derby winner and Trotter of the Year Panty Raid (\$473,932), 1975 Hambletonian winner and Hall of Fame Immortal Bonefish (\$309,375) and world champion Imagery (\$218,246), all by Nevele Pride.

Poliseno sentenced to four months in doping case

Former harness trainer Donato Poliseno, 72, was sentenced on Wednesday (Jan. 25) to four months in prison for doping offenses in harness racing according to a story in Thoroughbred Daily News.

According to federal filings, Poliseno used his company, Equine Vet Supplies LLC, to funnel prescription drugs to horsemen that would otherwise have required a licensed veterinarian to be prescribed.

"Poliseno so abused his position that he sought to use a deceased veterinarian's credentials to continue ordering prescription drugs," wrote prosecutors in a sentencing submission.

British invader on the money again at Big M

It may not be having the same impact as the four lads from Liverpool had when they arrived in America some 60 years ago, but the Ron Burke barn's On The Money GB brought smiles to her connections and her backers while winning for the second time in as many North American starts Friday night at The Meadowlands since her arrival from Great Britain.

The 5-year-old daughter of Control The Moment—Riverboat Queen is one of five British horses brought over by Burke and his ownership team, who brought a half-dozen horses over three years ago who did some good, so they figured they'd try it again.

Not surprisingly, things are going well.

On The Money GB, sent to the gate for a second straight start as the 3-5 favorite, was put on the point by driver Yannick Gingras early, and despite having to hold off a pesky Super Girl, completed her wire-to-wire mission in 1:52.3, a lifetime best. Super Girl was a nose back in second with Always Beachy third in the conditioned pace for fillies and mares.

"They brought some nice horses over here (from Great Britain)," said Gingras, "and they have been pretty good so far (Ladyford Dollar GB won his North American debut Sunday). They have been racing in the proper classification. I like (On The Money GB), she dug in and was pretty good tonight."

Gingras didn't mind handing out some good-natured needling to his friend Mark MacDonald, who drove the second-place finisher. "I let him get to me a little bit in the stretch, so I could tell him better luck next time nearing the wire."

On The Money GB paid \$3.40 to win. She now has eight victories from just 16 lifetime outings, good for earnings of \$26,096.

YOU ALWAYS REMEMBER YOUR FIRST: A pair of young drivers recorded their first-ever Meadowlands wins on the card, and they did it with serious longshots.

Twenty-one-year-old Marvin Luna guided That's My Type (\$71.40 to win) to victory in the fourth race, and later on, Matthew Athearn, 24, scored with Frank Deford (\$84.40) in the 13th despite that horse having been on the shelf for 38 days.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: The Big M's streak of betting at least \$3 million on Friday and Saturday evenings extended to seven, as a total of \$3,029,828 was pushed through the windows on the 14-race card.

During 2022, betting did not surpass the \$3-million plateau for a seventh time until April 23, which was the 29th program of the year.

Offspring of the lightly-raced Yankee Royalty 3,1:57f (\$50,633) — Perfect Twenty and Royal Flirt — teamed up to capture the three remaining finals for 2-year-olds, kickstarting a potential niche for the son of Muscles Yankee. A boutique sire to this point, having only sired 18 foals — nine of racing age — Yankee Royalty will stand at Pine Haven Farm, in Bridgeville, DE., for \$2,500.

Anders Bluestone and Yankee Royalty will have new competition among Delaware trotting stallions, though, as world champion and Breeders Crown winner Southwind Frank 3,1:52.1 (\$1,950,887) invades the First State after standing in Pennsylvania for the first five seasons of his breeding career. Among three crops of racing age, his most successful progeny include Bond 2,1:52.3 (\$587,264), who capped her 2022 season with a win in the Goldsmith Maid, and Delayed Hanover 3,1:51.1 (\$514,278), whose biggest win came in the 2020 Bluegrass Stakes, as a 2-year-old. Southwind Frank will stand at Winbak Farm in Middletown, DE, for \$5,000.

In the pacing ranks, Badlands Hanover p,2,1:50z (\$754,772) and He's Watching p,3,1:46.4 (\$1,116,450) remain Delaware's kingpin stallions, and will both stand at Winbak Farm for \$4,000 and \$5,000, respectively.

Three new pacing stallions enter Delaware this season, most notably Highalator p,5,1:48f (\$675,764), a son of Somebeachsomewhere and world champion race mare Higher And Higher who won six times on Delaware soil in his 104-start career. In 2022, Highalator was bred to 57 mares in Indiana, but has relocated to the East Coast for former trainer Jenny Bier, who shares ownership with Joann Dombeck and Midsize Construction Inc. He will stand for \$3,500 at Safe Haven Farm, in Ellendale, DE.

Betterthanthebeach p,4,1:50f (\$158,798) and Keystone Honor p,1:52.4f (\$473,791) are the other Delaware pacing newcomers, standing for \$1,000 and \$500, respectively, in their first season at stud.

Offspring of stallions registered with the Delaware Standardbred Breeders' Fund are eligible to the lucrative DSBF program, which offers horses the opportunity to compete for over \$500,000 in purses (per division) through their 2- and 3-year-old seasons combined. Stallion nominations accompanied by a \$3,000 fee are accepted through March 1; those submitted by Feb. 1 are discounted to \$2,000.

More on Towers' column about free bets

I read with interest the **article by Dean Towers** about the success in Australia of using free bets to encourage new players to follow racing. I agree this would help especially since most sports betting sites offer first time players some form of free bets.

The other issue not addressed is the lack of advertising of harness or other horse race betting services. I play most of my horse race betting these days through advance deposit wagering companies. In both cases, I became a customer through free betting or matching deposit offers. While I am not the customer racetracks want since I have transitioned from being an on-track customer to now mostly an at-home player and I know the track operators get a much lower cut of my betting to support purses. However, the convenience of betting from home has also helped the tracks in that I play more frequently and thus may actually provide more income to purses than my previously once or twice a week trip to one of my local racetracks.

However, compared to sports wagering company advertising I almost never hear about advance deposit horse race sites on TV or Internet advertising. But I must also endorse the concept of the free bet as a hook to keep people interested in your product. Both my advance deposit companies offer promotional offers such as free programs, and free or matching bet offers and usually some form of betting rebates even for smaller customers. This compared to my on track experience where I have to pay for a program, and only sometimes receive a free mystery bet or some other drawing for a free bet or other free gift. So, if racing is expected to prosper in this new betting environment, they need to advertise more and encourage more betting through more free bets and some type of customer rebates. Otherwise, watch many players transform into other sports bettors and not get the younger age group they aspire to capture. Thanks for the opinion on this idea.
