## A DREAM COME TRUE

From a field of three outstanding finalists for Canada's Horse of the Year, six-year-old pacing mare **Dreamfair Eternal** (Camluck) emerged with the trophy last night at the O'Brien Awards, Standard-bred Canada's annual event recognizing the greatest achievements in Canadian harness racing.

A more legitimately Canadian candidate for the year's top honor

would be difficult to find: Dreamfair Eternal was bred in Ingersoll, Ontario, by John and Mary Lamers, continues to be owned by the Lamers, and is trained by Pat Fletcher of Hagersville, Ontario. In 2010, the mare racked up 16 wins in 22 starts (all but five contested on Canadian soil), with just under \$1 million in purses. Among her triumphs were the Milton Stakes, the Forest City Pace, and the Breeders Crown. Dreamfair Eternal beat out **San Pail** (San Pellegrino) for HOY, though each horse took home an O'Brien trophy in their division (aged pacing mares in the case of Dreamfair Eternal, aged trotting males for back-to-back Maple Leaf Trot victor San Pail). "Two and a half years ago we (he and wife Karan) were working for other people," said a mildly incredulous Pat Fletcher after the trophies were handed out. "We got thinking, 'We've run other people's stables, it's time to do our own.' Along comes a mare like this, and suddenly we're at the O'Brien Awards." **Cont. p2**

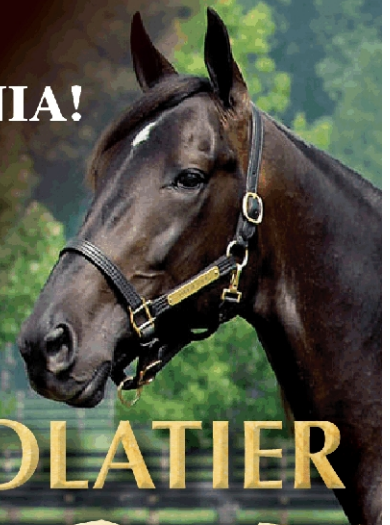

Although Dreamfair Eternal's temperament is famously difficult and Fletcher claims she "regularly tries to kill me," all is clearly forgiven as soon as Dreamfair Eternal gets down to work. "She's done it at all different tracks--she has something like five track records," said Fletcher. "It's just amazing. We just put the harness on her, she does the rest." Of future aspirations, he commented, "We'd like to see her get to \$2 million in earnings, but everything from here on in is gravy."

**'Man Oh Man...**

Between them, trainer Casie Coleman and driver Randy Waples hauled away the bulk of the O'Brien Awards on Saturday night. Coleman, who is only 30, picked up her

fourth trophy for Trainer of the Year, while her charges **Western Silk** (Western Terror) and **Idyllic** (American Ideal) took home honors in the three-year-old pacing filly and two-year-old pacing filly divisions, respectively. (Only Coleman's sophomore pacing colt, Sportswriter, lost out to rival Rock N Roll Heaven in their division.) Waples, the regular pilot for Dreamfair Eternal, San Pail, and Text Me (winner of the three-year-old trotting colt division), collected his third bronze

as Driver of the Year. "It's pretty sweet," remarked Coleman. "I've been nominated six years in a row, and won four of those six. If you had told me 10 years ago that I'd get even one nomination, I would have said it was a 100-1 shot. It's a dream come true."

After going 0-for-3 in an inauspicious campaign in the U.S, **Auckland Reactor** (Mach Three) was back in action yesterday in New Zealand.

Here is the report from Harness Racing New Zealand:

At the Ashburton trials yesterday (Wednesday) Auckland Reactor made his first public appearance since his disastrous American campaign of last year.

'The Reactor' drew a solid heat but there was nothing in his class on paper and so it proved in the final wash up.

Auckland Reactor set hearts fluttering a little early with a mischievous gallop in the score up. He didn't lose too much ground and caught the field up to be only a length or so back at dispatch.

The slow start allowed Mark Purdon to slot Auckland Reactor to the rear of the field and that's where he stayed until the home turn. Strathcullen led the heat in Indian-file and that's how it stayed until Alchemy made a move off the back straight - Auckland Reactor made a bigger move though. **Cont. p3**

From last he scorched down the middle of the Ashburton track to pick up Exposed by a neck. Third home was Auckland Reactor's stablemate Collectable.

The official time was 3.04.9 for the mobile 2400m. The final sections of 55.8 and 27.0 making for a solid hit out. 'The Reactor' though was privately timed to run his final 800m in a sharp 53.9.

These sorts of sections are nothing new to the former champ but at least the trial shows the old spring is definitely still in his step and he's ready for the next phase of his Inter Dominion preparation.

Auckland Reactor is now earmarked for a trial at Motukarara next Wednesday before a resuming run at Ashburton in their specially programmed mile on February 12.

### Chasing Yonkers

Oh, Yonkers. You are such a tease. You deserve fresh flowers for again trying something interesting—overnight races at 1-1/16th distance-- but you deserve a (dry) martini splashed in your face for refusing, still, to stream live racing on your website. How in the world is harness racing going to grow as a sport, to attract new fans and bettors and investors if one of the premier tracks in the country limits the exposure of its product to the world?

I want to watch the racing at the new distance. I think it's a great idea to try to get outside horses involved in half-mile races. And I think it would be helpful and productive for the industry if as many people as possible were able to evaluate the old-is-new experiment. But I don't live in New York—the local listings there don't apply to me. I don't want to hang out on the YouBet.com site all night (not that there is anything wrong with that). And right now I don't want to pay the Dish Network the King's Ransom they require to allow me to see the Racetrack Television Network (that's on you Todd Roberts). So I am out of luck—a customer whose favorite store is making it hard to shop.

I have been bugging Yonkers for years now to transform its website into something more than a static enterprise. Just ask Robert Galterio and Frank Drucker and they'll tell you. But while many of Yonkers' competitor tracks have made wonderful and welcome improvements to their online operations—as has the United States Trotting Association, to give credit where it's due—Yonkers still won't make it easier for a harness fan like me to see what's happening there most nights of the week. I mean, what's the point of having the brilliant and funny Frank Drucker doing his unique and clever thing trackside if people can't see his work?

The fact that so many other tracks have put their product online over the past few years tells me that there is no dark statistic out there that proves that handle is reduced dramatically by streaming live video of races (or, in New York, races with a brief delay due to state law). Jeff Gural's Tioga and Vernon tracks certainly haven't been hurt by making live racing available on-line. Jason Settlemoir, who essentially runs those tracks, told me Thursday that he has "no regrets about offering video streaming... as a courtesy for the owners and trainers who are unable to make it to our facilities to watch their horse race."

With the situation with the Meadowlands Racetrack in New Jersey still in flux, you would think now more than ever that Yonkers would be interested in asserting its powerful role in East Coast racing. You would think with its purse structure high, its revenue solid, and its new racing distances, the track would want to highlight its racing. All it needs to do it delay the video stream by a few minutes to satisfy state law and everyone in the world can see what's happening on the track at Empire City. If there is a downside to such a plan, I have never heard it. If there are significant costs involved, I'd be shocked.

Last fall, the two major American yearling sales were live-streamed online—and the experience was a smashing success. On Saturday, the good folks at Standardbred Canada and the Woodbine Entertainment Group are combining efforts to live-stream the O'Brien Awards—to the relief of many folks (like me) who can't make it up to Mississauga. There's talk of live streaming the Dan Patch Awards and even, perhaps, the year's USTA meetings. All of these things are sensible, forward-thinking and likely to catch the attention of people who might otherwise miss watching the good things that are happening in harness racing. Don't you think the most important track in New York should finally join the party?

News and notes: Josh Potts earns the distinction of being our first correspondent. He accepted my invitation last week to the harness racing world to share ideas about how to improve the sport and maximize whatever opportunities we have left. He wrote: "First of all, we need to think about what value harness racing offers in the marketplace. From there, we can look at the "4 P's of Marketing: Product, Place, Price & Promotion," and figure out the best approach to: A) increasing harness racing's customer base, B) generating more handle from harness racing's current customer base, and C) providing the best possible customer service to the fans and bettors. In the marketplace, harness racing is a gaming option. Customers must feel like they have a chance to make money, and have a good time doing it."

# the UPDATE's Q & A

## With Bill Perretti

Is the glass half full or half empty for Bill Perretti and Perretti Farms? They own arguably the two best stallions in the world in Rocknroll Hanover and Muscles Yankee, yet they are located in New Jersey. You might say they are stuck in New Jersey, where the harness racing industry is in turmoil due to the uncertainty of the Meadowlands. Perretti's thoughts on the Meadowlands? Will Perretti ever fold up shop or move out of the embattled Garden State? Those were among the questions we posed to the master of Perretti Farms.

**HRU:** You're 84 and caught in the middle of a mess in New Jersey, yet Perretti Farms is still going...and going strong. Do you ever wonder, is it worth it?

**BP:** I don't know. I don't want to do a political fight and that's what's going on.. I'm not a politician. What's happened is that we've gotten into a political fight, which I think is ridiculous. We have a governor that doesn't seem to have any brains. Like (Pennsylvania Governor) Rendell said, if people want gambling, give it to them. That's what people want, so give it to them at the Meadowlands.

**HRU:** Do you have much hope for the future of racing in Jersey?

**BP:** Do I have hope? I think we're just waiting to see what happens. That's what everyone is doing?

**HRU:** Are you worried?

**BP:** I'm not worried about anything. Why should I? How is that going to help me? We have a tough game. It's always been a hard game. I've done pretty good with it, I guess.

**HRU:** Why do you stick it out?

**BP:** What am I supposed to do? You want me to start another operation in New York or Pennsylvania or someplace else? I don't want to do that at 84.

**HRU:** What if you were 34?

**BP:** I'd probably get out and do something else. I was a car dealer and this was a hobby of mine. I created a business out of it.

**HRU:** Is it still fun?

**BP:** Yes. If you have a good horse, it's still fun. If you have a good sale, it's still fun. As bad as the business has been, we did alright this year at the sale. We were short a little, but my farm still made money.

**HRU:** How do we fix things?

**BP:** We don't have enough buyers. We have too many horses and not enough buyers. We need fewer horses and more buyers, but nobody seems to be moving in that direction. The reason we raised the stud fee on 'Rocknroll' to '25' was to cut the book so we would have less to sell and less on the market. That way we thought we'd get more money for them.

**HRU:** So what are the new numbers?

**BP:** I don't know how many we'll bred to with him, but it will definitely be less.

**HRU:** Obviously, Perretti needs slots at the Meadowlands as much, if not more, than anyone. Your thought on the subject?

**BP:** The key to everything is gambling in New Jersey and the governor should OK gambling at the Meadowlands and let the chips fall where they may instead of trying to control everything. Let the thing go its own way. Don't say 'I'm going to save Atlantic City and get rid of the Meadowlands.' Let the business take care of itself.

**HRU:** You are among those who have pledged to give Jeff Gural financial support as he pursues a lease of the Meadowlands. Why?

**BP:** I'm not investing with him because I necessarily think it's going to be successful but because I think the guy deserves a shot at this. He's doing a good job and he's trying. I don't want to leave him out there by himself.

**HRU:** Anything else?

**BP:** Yes. You know how I got into the business? I had nothing to do one night so I took my sons to the racetrack. I hadn't been to the track in 20-something years. I wanted a table. I offered a guy \$100 for a table and I couldn't get one. He wanted my \$100, but he couldn't find a table for us. He couldn't take the money. I saw that and figured this is a good business, I'm going to try it. That's how I got into the business.

## Meadowlands Report

### 'Hero' Of the Night

The magic numbers at the Meadowlands on Saturday night were 6,000 and 23. Tim Tetrick, 29, became the youngest driver to reach the 6,000 win plateau, and he did it in style by guiding the undefeated **St Elmo Hero** (Western Hero) to yet another victory in the \$65,000 Complex Series final. It was the second straight night a driver hit a major milestone at the Big M as Andy Miller bagged his 7,000th on Friday. But the unquestioned star once again was St Elmo Hero, beating **Windsong Gorgeous** (Rambaran) by 1 1/4 lengths in a lifetime-best 1:49.1 on a snowy track. The 5-year-old gelding, a miraculous claim by owner John Barnard for \$8,750 from his first start last year at Balmoral Park, seems to be getting stronger as the competition stiffens. The Complex was the toughest test yet, and he came through with the mile of his life.

**Urgent Action** (Artsplace) was off stride before start, leaving nine to revved up and ready to go. **Thunder's Fury** (No Pan Intended) took charge briefly until **Code Word** (Western Terror), part of the four-horse entry from the Ron Burke barn, took charge with St Elmo Hero grabbing the three hole. Tetrick wheeled St Elmo Hero out for a back-side brush. They cleared the front entering the final turn, a demanding move as the timer flashed :53.3 for the half mile. St Elmo Hero had the lead, but the rest of the Burke brigade was coming, with Windsong Gorgeous leading the charge on a strong first-over surge. St Elmo's Hero's margin was down to a half length at the three-quarter pole, but he still had plenty of fight left. As in every race, the gelding found another gear in deep stretch.

"I knew it wasn't going to be easy," Tetrick said. "They are going to try their best to get him beat. My horse put up some really big numbers and toughed it out. It was a big mile tonight in this weather. No matter what I've done with him, he's finished good. The top of the lane, I called on him and dug for him, and he really dug in and took right off."

It marked the fourth straight week that Windsong Gorgeous settled for the place spot behind St Elmo Hero as the Burke brigade swept second through fourth with **Southern Allie** (Allie's Western) third and **Get It Now** (Western Hanover) finishing fourth. The St Elmo Hero fan club is growing. Seemingly everyone at the track had a ticket on the 1-5 favorite trained by Chuck Eustis who continues to soar beyond all expectations.

"We were just hoping to get a good conditioned horse," Barnard said. "He's exceeded every dream we ever had for the horse."

The tough-as-nails **Alexie Mattosie** (No Pan Intended) gutted out a head victory over **Bettor Sweet** (Bettor's Delight) in the richest event of the evening, the \$127,000 final of the Presidential Series for Free-For-All pacers. David Miller hoped to give the 5-year-old gelding an easier trip, but wound up grinding away first-over. Alexie Mattosie, trained by Nik Drennan, dead-heated for win with Bettor Sweet last week. This time, he was brave enough to secure the win over that rival who tracked him around the final turn and through the lane.

"I wasn't in the spot I wanted to be in," Miller said. "I figured if I left hard to keep position, I would have to go too hard. At the half, I had to move. He gutted it out. The horse went a huge trip. When I had Bettor Sweet following me around the last turn, I figured he would win, but my horse was dead game."

The 4-1 shot paced the mile in 1:49.2 to secure the win for Donald Lindsey, Paul Kleinpaste, William Alempijevic and Dennis Marvin. **River Shark** (Four Starzzz Shark) was third.

Denied in the Complex by St Elmo Hero, Burke got a stakes win when **Meirs Hanover** (Artsplace) powered to a 2-length victory over **Sniper Seelster** (Western Maverick) in the \$62,600 Clyde Hirt Final. The 4-year-old colt, who came within a neck of ending St Elmo Hero's streak in the final of the Blue Route at Harrah's Chester last month, surged to a lifetime best effort in 1:50.3 with Brian Sears at the lines. Owned by David Van Dusen, Michael Cimaglio and Strollin Stable, all of Ohio, Meirs Hanover is 2-for-3 on the season and 10 for 28 in his career. **No Monkeys Allowed** (Rocknroll Hanover), also trained by Burke, got third.
