The Ontario-sired son of Kadabra was the toast of the 31st O'Brien Awards which included Richard Moreau's seventh straight Trainer of the Year award.

Richard Moreau (with wife Cheryl), won an unprecedented seventh straight Canadian Trainer of the Year award.

Forbidden Trade, conditioned by Luc Blais, the runner-up in the Trainer of the Year category, also took home divisional honors in the Three-Year-Old Trotting Colt category. The son of Kadabra, owned by Determination Stable and driven by Bob McClure, provided his connections with a season of thrills and memories last year, highlighted by his victory in the \$1 million Hambletonian. He was a top Grand Circuit

competitor, scoring eight victories and over \$1 million in purse earnings. Some of his noteworthy wins included an elimination of the Goodtimes, three Ontario Sires Stakes Gold events and the Ontario Sires Stakes Super Final, his final win on the season. But it was a Saturday afternoon on Aug. 3 at The Meadowlands where his most coveted win came as McClure guided him to a masterful victory in

trotting's Holy Grail in a lifetime best 1:51, providing his connections with one of their greatest career achievements.

As for Moreau, last year he trained 285 winners and trained horses to more than \$4.5 million in earnings. He topped the trainer standings in earnings and wins in Canada, and at Woodbine Mohawk Park. He trained O'Brien finalist Double A Mint and the talented older pacing horse Jimmy Freight, a winner of more than \$436,000. One of Jimmy Freight's top performances last year was his Gold Cup victory on June 15 at Woodbine Mohawk Park. Other top performers from the Moreau Stable included top pacing mare Sandbetweenurtoes, a winner of more than \$127,000, older trotter B Yoo, a winner of more than \$197,000 and two-year-old pacing colt YS Mathis, a winner of more than \$256,000.

Moreau has surpassed \$2 million in purse earnings for the past 10 consecutive years and banked more than \$1 million for 20 consecutive years.

Louis-Philippe Roy of Guelph, ON won his second consecutive title as Driver of the Year. Five years ago, the native of Mont-Joli, QC was driving at the Quebec Fairs and his ascent up the driving ranks is almost unprecedented. Roy's win was the result of another stellar year that included 293 wins and more than \$6.2 million in purse earnings, which put him second best in the country. He's surpassed \$5 million in earnings for the past three seasons and for the past three years he's shared his good fortune by donating a full card's earnings to a food bank in his hometown. Roy was the regular driver for two O'Brien Award winners — two-year-old pacing filly Alicorn and two-year-old trotting colt HP Royal Theo.

The partnership of **Al Libfeld and Marvin Katz** has evolved into one of the harness racing's most respected breeding

enterprises and they continue to be at or near the top of the charts for Canadian breeders. The 2019 season was no exception and for the fourth time in the past five years, they were recognized for their continuing contributions with the Armstrong Breeder of the Year Award.

In 2019, horses bred by Libfeld-Katz won 39 races and earned more than \$2 million in purses. These 14 starters, which included millionaire Greenshoe, Soul Strong, O Narutac Perfetto and Bautista, averaged more than \$148,000

in earnings per starter. The sale of the sport's first million-dollar yearling, Maverick, a Father Patrick full-brother to Greenshoe, was another major breeding accomplishment for the Libfeld-Katz partnership. Horses they have owned and bred have accounted for victories in the Hambletonian, Kentucky Futurity, Canadian Trotting Classic and other world-class events. Libfeld and Katz were also the presenting sponsors of the 2019 Breeders Crown Championships at Woodbine Mohawk Park, and initiated the Breeders Crown Charity Challenge which raised more than \$200,000 for area charities.

Gilles Barrieau took home the O'Brien bronze for the O'Brien Award of Horsemanship. Barrieau is annually one of the top percentage drivers in the country and the Saint John, NB native posted a 0.401 UDRS in 2019 while competing regularly on the Red Shores circuit. The veteran horseman, who also won this award in 2005, finished second in the driver standings for both wins and earnings at Red Shores Charlottetown and Summerside venues last year and ended his season with 151 victories and more than \$435,000 in earnings. In addition to catch driving, Barrieau continues to train a modest-sized stable that registered 40 wins and \$178,000 in purse earnings last year.

The Future Star winner was **Dave Kelly**, a native of Sydney, NS, who now resides and competes in Alberta. The talented young horseman enjoyed a career year in 2019, driving 108 winners and recording more than \$672,000 in purse earnings while also topping the Century Mile driving charts in wins. As a catch driver he reined many top performers including 3-year-old pacing filly Rockin Mystery, who he teamed up with for several stakes wins including the Alberta Standardbred Horse Association (ASHA) Breeders Stake on June 15. On the training side, Kelly conditioned 50 winners and horses to almost \$275,000 in earnings.

The Cam Fella Award was presented to trainer/driver Anthony MacDonald of Guelph, ONfor the innovative work he has done in promoting harness racing and attracting new horse owners with the launch and growth of TheStable.ca. This award recognizes meritorious service to the Canadian harness racing industry and is awarded only when warranted, not every year.


Through **TheStable.ca**, MacDonald provides an opportunity for anyone to purchase a one per cent share (or more) in a racehorse, while enjoying 100 per cent of the horse ownership experience in their fractional ownership groups. MacDonald's enterprise has attracted 760 people from 12 countries to horse ownership since its launch in 2015.

Alicorn was voted the O'Brien winner in the Two-Year-Old

Pacing Filly division following a stellar season which saw her record four Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) victories and 11 top-three finishes in her 13-race campaign. The daughter of Bettors Delight scored her richest payday with a runner-up finish in the Shes A Great Lady, and her richest victory was in the Ontario Sires Stakes Super Final. She scored her season's mark of 1:50.3 in an OSS event at Woodbine Mohawk Park and then repeated that time in an elimination of the Shes A Great Lady at Mohawk.

Tall Dark Stranger was the country's choice as Two-Year-Old Pacing Colt of the Year. The son of past O'Brien Award winners Bettors Delight and Precocious Beauty won eight of nine races and more than \$936,000 in earnings. His stakes victories included a leg of the Dream Maker, two Ontario Sires Stakes, a sweep of the Metro Pace, the International Stallion Stake and the Breeders Crown Championship.

In the Three-Year-Old Pacing Filly division, **Sunny Dee** was the voters' choice. While unraced as a 2-year-old, Sunny Dee was all systems go in her sophomore year as the Sunshine Beach filly racked up 13 wins and 21 top-three finishes in 23 races and her bankroll eclipsed \$601,000. Her stakes victories included a sweep of the Standardbred Breeders of Ontario Association Stakes, two Ontario Sires Stakes events, and the USS Indianapolis Memorial.

Century Farroh's connections took home the O'Brien in the Three-Year-Old Pacing Colt category. Last season the poster boy for the Ontario Sires Stakes won 12 of 16 races, including five in the provincial program and bankrolled almost \$720,000 in earnings. The son of the late Mach Three kicked off his 2019 season with a four-race win streak, including the Somebeachsomewhere and an Ontario Sires Stakes Gold Division. He took his lifetime mark of 1:49.1 in the North America Cup Consolation and initiated another four-race win streak which included another OSS Gold division. One of his more impressive victories came in the Simcoe Stakes where he tackled Grand Circuit competition with a 1:49.3 victory.

A finalist in 2018, Caviart Ally had another impressive season in 2019 which earned her O'Brien honors in the Older Pacing Mare category. She never finished worse than third while banking almost \$760,000 and was a formidable force on the Grand Circuit adding many stakes victories to her glowing resume. Last year, her stakes victories included the Rainbow Blue, where she scored a season's best 1:48, the Milton, the Allerage, and the Breeders Crown which was her richest payday, before concluding her season with a victory in the TVG Mares.



McWicked, who swept Horse of the Year honors in both Canada and the U.S. in 2018 returned for another successful campaign in 2019 and collected his second consecutive O'Brien as Older Pacing Horse. He won six of 17 starts and more than \$1 million in earnings this past season with victories in the Gerrity, Roll With Joe, Jim Ewart Memorial, and the Dan Rooney Invitational.

One of his top performances of the season was his four-length victory in the Allerage where he stopped the

clock in a season's best 1:47.2. After battling foot issues throughout the year, the son of McArdle ended his career with more than \$5.1 million in career earnings, retiring as the richest stallion to ever stand stud.

In the Two-Year-Old Trotting Filly division, **Dip Me Hanover** won the O'Brien following a season which saw her win two of 12 starts and more than \$307,000 in her rookie season. The daughter of Donato Hanover scored her richest payday at Woodbine Mohawk Park where she swept the Peaceful Way Stakes including a 1:55.1 lifetime-best effort in the elimination. While those were her only two freshman victories, she recorded top-three finishes in half of her 12 season starts.

HP Royal Theo, a son of Royalty For Life, put together a solid rookie season winning three races and banking more than \$286,000, earning him the O'Brien Bronze as Canada's Two-Year-Old Trotting Colt of the Year. One of his victories came in an Ontario Sires Stakes Gold event on Oct. 1 at Woodbine Mohawk Park. His richest payday came in the William Wellwood Memorial Final held at Woodbine Mohawk Park where he parlayed a perfect second over trip to get the job done in a lifetime best 1:54.2.

In the Three-Year-Old Trotting Filly division, **Evident Beauty** and **Only Take Cash** could not be separated in the voting which resulted in a tie for O'Brien Award honors. Evident Beauty won 10 of 18 races and more than \$617,000 in earnings. The Trixton filly's biggest win of the season came in the Elegantimage Stake where she overcame the outside post position 10 to get up for a neck victory. She also added wins in two divisions and the final of the New Jersey Sire Stakes, the Del Miller, a Casual Breeze division, and the Moni Maker to her impressive resume.

Only Take Cash was a model of consistency last season, scoring top-three finishes in 12 of her 13 races and earning more than \$511,000. A wire-to-wire effort in the Ohio Sires Stakes Final was the Cash Hall filly's richest payday of the season. She also scored wins in a division of the Casual Breeze, and two Ohio Sires Stakes events.

Atlanta took home her first O'Brien trophy as Older Trotting Mare of the Year on the strength of a solid season which included 13 top-three finishes in 15 starts, and almost \$900,000 in purse earnings. On July 6 in the Graduate Final at the Meadowlands, the daughter of Chapter Seven toppled male rival Six Pack in a lifetime best and world record (at the time) of 1:49.1. Other trips to the winner's circle on her lavish resume included the Miami Valley Distaff, and the

Charlie Hill Memorial Trot at Scioto Downs.

In the Older Trotting Horse category, fan favorite **Musical Rhythm**, a winner of seven races and more than \$206,000 in earnings, was voted the winner. After recovering from a life-threatening infection in 2018 — thanks to the incredible efforts of caretaker Sara Baillageon and trainer Ben Baillargeon — he resumed racing in 2019 and found his way back into the winner's circle. Not only did he recover, but the son of Cantab Hall was a seven-time winner and missed only one check in 17 starts, earning more than \$206,000. He put together a six-race win streak that kicked off on April 17 in the preferred trotting ranks at Woodbine Mohawk Park. The powerhouse also equaled the track and Canadian record for older male trotters with a 1:50.4 mile on June 17 at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The O'Brien Awards honor Canada's best in harness racing over the past season and are named in honor of the late Joe O'Brien, an outstanding horseman and member of the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame.







How Henri Levesque and an American stallion improved the French trotter

The continuing story of one of the greatest trotting sires of all time: Stars Pride.

I ended last week's story about Stars Pride (full story here) with the sentence: Henri Levesque had a dream.

Before I go to this week's follow up I need to digress a little.

I was privileged to meet with the great person and horseman Ebby Gerry Jr at Sunshine Meadows last Saturday morning, primarily to discuss Stars Pride with him.

I had a few questions to ask about Stars Pride and his uncle Roland Harriman's association with him.

The first was what motivated the Gerry and Harriman's private trainer Harry Pownall to go to a sale in Indianapolis to buy a yearling by Worthy Boy.

His answer was that he didn't recollect the exact details, but he felt it was likely that Harry was probably there racing, saw the colt and the horse caught his eye.

To his knowledge, prior to that Pownall had never had any connection to the horse, either through his sire or his dam Stardrift.

Quite simply, he saw the colt, liked him and contacted Mr. Harriman about buying him.

I asked him to compare Stars Pride to his stablemate and chief competitor Florican.

Ebby said that Stars Pride was both the better looking of the two and the better and faster racehorse. To him, there was no doubt about either.

Nevertheless, Florican was his favorite and that of all the Arden Homestead family, primarily because he was a homebred and Stars Pride an acquisition. He described Florican as a bulldog, whereas Stars Pride was extremely handsome.

On to Henri Levesque and his dream...

Before I go any further, I need to give a great deal of credit to French Trotting journalist Jacques Pauc, who furnished much of the background and data for this story and was very patient in answering my questions on various aspects of it.

To those of you who might not know of Monsieur Levesque, he was master horseman Jean Pierre Dubois before Jean Pierre reached anywhere the heights to which he was going to reach and still is accomplishing.

Henri Levesque did it all in French trotting. He bred, owned, trained and often drove his horses.

I was fortunate to meet Monsieur Levesque once.

I had been asked to participate on a panel discussion in Vincennes prior to the year's Prix d'Ameriqué.

I really didn't know what was to be expected or discussed.

My co-panelists gave basically a statistical analysis of what was taking place in their respective countries.

I was last to speak. I had no idea of the number of tracks operating, the number of horses being bred, the amount of purse money being distributed, etc., etc.,

Simply put, I hadn't done my homework, wasn't prepared for what was being discussed and frankly the statistical

- 4. If there is more than one division of any preliminary race, each division will race for the full advertised purse. If more than one division of any preliminary race is required, right is reserved to race one or more of these additional divisions on the next two racing nights.
- 5. The final will be determined by points. The horses with the most points will determine the final.
 - a. 50 points for 1^{st place} finish: 25 points for 2nd; 12 points for 3rd, 8 points for 4th; 5 points for 5th. (Dead Heats will be divided evenly)
 - b. 25 Points for each start. If any preliminary race is cancelled for any reason the horses entered receive 25 points. Make-up races will solely be determined by the Raceway at their discretion. If a make-up is re-scheduled, only those horses entered in the cancelled race may declare in, however, no points for starting will be given.
- 6. The final race will be limited to, but not restricted to eight separate betting interests. Choice of a starter in the final of this series from those horses that are declared in of the horses with the same points will be drawn by lot.
- 7. A trainer and/or owner will be limited to only a two horse coupled entry in the consolation. Any horse that changes owner or trainer after time of declaration of its first start in the series will be ineligible to race in the finals or consolations. The consolation race must have six separate betting interests or it may be canceled by the raceway.
- 8. Purse Distribution: 50% First, 25% Second, 12% Third, 8% Fourth, 5% Fifth. (Dead Heats will be divided evenly)
- 9. Yonkers Raceway reserves the right to refuse any horse, trainer, driver and/or owner to race in this series.
- 10. Declarations to start will close at a prescribed time and date, and must be made for all preliminary final and consolation races.
- 11. Should circumstances prevent the racing of any or all of these races; monies paid in will be refunded to owners of horses nominated unless one race of the series has been contested. Yonkers Raceway may cancel any race which has more than a two-horse entry or does not have six separate betting interests. In the event of weather or other unforeseeable cancellation of the final race, a make-up will be made the following week or the next conceivable date. All divisions of a Preliminary must be completed in order for points to be earned.
- 12. One charted line meeting the qualifying standards will be required within 30 days. If continued satisfactory performance is not maintained in races, additional qualifying line(s) will be required and subsequent declarations rejected until this requirement is fulfilled.
- 13. The Blue Chip Matchmaker series will have one (1) free breeding donated by Blue Chip Farms, LLC. The owner(s) of the winner of the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series Final, at the time the series final was contested, will have a choice of one (1) breeding to the following stallions: 'American Ideal', 'Bettor's Delight', 'Roll With Joe', 'Shadow Play' or 'Sunshine Beach'. The breeding awarded must be used with the mare that finished first during one of the following breeding seasons: 2021, 2022 or 2023. If the stallion of choice is not physically available for the year in which the mare is scheduled for breeding Blue Chip Farms, LLC., at its discretion, will provide a suitable substitution. The mare will be bred according to the terms and conditions of the chosen stallion's breeding contract, said contract to be provided by Blue Chip Farms. numbers didn't interest me much.

But what would I say?

I decided to speak off the cuff about Stars Pride. I told the story of his racing career and how he happened to stand at Hanover Shoe Farms and his impact as a sire primarily in North America.

Without too much bragging on my part, I was the hit of the show.

The audience seemed much more interested in hearing about "le Roi de Trotting en Amerique" than a bunch of dry statistical numbers.

After the discussion, numerous questions were asked by the audience, all directed at me.

Apparently those folks were as much interested in the stats as was I.

On descending the podium, the organizer of the event, Lyonel Fontenay, said that there was a man in the audience who would like to speak with me.

It was Henri Levesque who was now totally blind and in what seemed like poor health.

There were tears running from his eyes. He gave me a big hug and the traditional two-cheeked kiss.

He thanked me and we reminisced about John Simpson, Lawrence Sheppard and Billy Haughton — all of whom he had known and with whom he had broken bread and sipped wine.

Levesque was the breeder, owner, trainer and sometime driver of the great mare Roquepine.

She, unquestionably, ranks among the greatest trotting mares ever.

She won the Prix d'Ameriqué in 1966, 1967 and 1968 in addition to winning the Roosevelt International twice.

She also won numerous other prestigious stakes events. She was the first of several to be called The Queen of Trotting.

M. Levesque loved training and driving, but his greatest passion was in breeding.

In his mind, the greatest results would be obtained by breeding Roquepine, the greatest trotter in the world at that time, to the greatest trotting sire in America, Stars Pride.

There was a problem with doing so. The French stud book was closed. Any foal produced by such a mating could not be registered in France, nor could it race in all but a handful of French trotting races.

The leading French breeder of that era, Albert Viel, had been quoted as saying "Breeding American blood in the French trotter would be analogous to planting weeds in one's garden."

M Levesque took the bit in his mouth and decided to do it anyway. He would deal with the consequences later.

Jean Pierre Dubois had the assurance that the French stud book would be open for a few years to approved American stallions when he went on his epic breeding adventure.

Henri Levesque had no such safety net.

He would leave Roquepine in America for two years and first breed her to Stars Pride and then to Stars Pride's greatest son at the time, Ayres.

From those breedings came two lovely colts to be named Florestan and Granit.

The main problem was that Mr. Levesque had no place to race them, since neither of them were eligible for the French registry. Unless they became superstars there would be no place for Monsieur Henri to race them in France, but for a few major races.

He decided to give them to the renowned German horseman Gerhard Krueger to train and drive in Germany and Italy.

Insofar as I could discover, they were both adequate racehorses, nothing more. Granit, although described as being a little pacey in his gait, was the better of the two.

When it came time to retire both colts to the stud, a deal was reached with the French authorities.

The French stud would make their progeny eligible for



registration if Mr. Levesque would sell them both to the French National stud.

Kind of ironic, wasn't it?

The same authority that banned both horses from being registered now wanted to stand them at stud.

The deal for Florestan was that Mr. Levesque would receive the equivalent of 115,000 euros in francs, then the currency of the country. Perhaps more importantly, Mr. Levesque was also entitled to 10 free lifetime breedings to Florestan.

Unfortunately, I don't have the details on the purchase of Granit, though he became an adequate sire whose progeny included the Grade One Criterium winner Quartz.

Florestan was destined to become perhaps the most influential French trotting sire, his only rival on that account being the great Kerjacques.

Consider this: He never had a book that wasn't full. I believe that some sort of lottery system was adapted to determine who would be allowed to breed to the great horse.

Of the 18 starters in this year's Prix d'Ameriqué, all but one (Billie du Monfort) traced its lineage to Stars Pride, with several having more than one branch of it.

Stars Pride's male line is unquestionably the number one in France and arguably throughout Europe, mostly through Ready Cash, his young sons Bold Eagle, Bird Parker, Brillantissime, Charly du Noyer and also through such as Timoko, Niky, Jag de Bellouet, Real de Lou and Uriel Speed.

The great Ready Cash is undoubtedly the best trotting sire in France and perhaps throughout Europe.

His many champions include this year's Prix d'Ameriqué winner Face Time Bourbon who, at 5 years old, was the youngest starter in the grueling race.

Ready Cash is line bred 6X5X5X6 to Stars Pride, twice through Florestan and twice through Nevele Pride's son Kimberland.

As great a sire as Florestan was, he is generally considered to be a better sire of broodmares. His daughters led the stud book in production for many years.

How you can help change the perception of horse racing one social media post at a time

Securing and cultivating new revenue streams is imperative to horse racing's survival. We all know that. But it's become clear lately that defending ourselves from political attacks is equally important.

I'm sure many of you have seen the recent bad press received by our partners in the thoroughbred industry. Over the years, we too have faced similar hurtles on the standardbred side, but today's attackers are much more sophisticated.

In a day and age ruled by popular opinion that is largely driven by social media, we have once again fallen drastically behind. Social media has affected presidential elections, sparked revolt and is now the preferred communication tool of the White House.

Using this tool correctly can be a difficult thing to do, and we certainly haven't mastered it, but the people pushing this current narrative about horse racing have.

Special interest groups were successful in phasing out dog racing this year in California and have now shifted their sights to horse racing. They have brought war to the door steps of every track in that state, and I doubt they will stop there.

Santa Anita, now directly in their cross hairs, has come under extreme scrutiny regarding horse fatalities at their facility over the past year.

The track's statement about this is both political, and poignant:

"Horses raced or trained at Santa Anita Park more than 420,000 times over the last year with a 99.991 per cent safety rate."

There is no easy way to talk about horses dying, but I believe Santa Anita has done everything right in being

transparent about what it is doing to combat future fatalities.

The most important points for racing to touch on in this day and age should always be:

- The care of the horse.
- Addressing and improving safety procedures.
- Expanding post career care and adoption avenues for our equine athletes.

I think we are growing as an industry in the right direction, but we cannot continue to fight as counter punchers in every battle. At some point, we have to be ahead of the criticism.

The little things we can easily do every day on social media can help shape how we are viewed and what people think about us.

Social media is reshaping society and we need to speak on behalf of our sport, horses, and the industry that we all love. Share your stories and invite people on social media into our sport. Show them why you love being a part of it. This is the very definition of a grassroots movement.

You can be sure the people on the other side of the fence will do as much, or more, and are every bit as loud as we ever could be. Look at what they have accomplished thus far:

CNN, Fox, MSNBC, and every other major mainstream media outlet has printed less than flattering stories about California racing in recent months.

The latest was the *Washington Post* in their most recent Sunday publication.

It's sad, but the newspapers that used to inform us are now really just magazines that push their own agenda, worrying more about exciting their own base and selling ad space rather than reporting the day's events with any degree of unbiased accuracy.

The news today is whatever sells; and nowadays that's clicks, shares, and likes.

The once mighty truth tellers, are now all in sales, and what used to be mainstream media cowers and claws for advertising revenue however they can get it.

Factor in the deep pockets of special interest groups and things start to get scary.

Before you ask why we wouldn't simply educate people about the difference between thoroughbreds and standardbreds, explaining to them how low our catastrophic injury rate is and separate ourselves from the sport of kings, the answer is, albeit blunt, but no one cares. People who don't know the difference between our breeds, are certainly

Make no mistake, they will sink together if we continue to offer no defence to claims of animal cruelty.

Our politicians are watching closely and will not stand behind us if enough of their constituents complain, and the people we all thought were our friends will be the ones holding the knife when we feel that familiar sharp pain in our backs again.

Belinda Stronach had all the right answers at the Pegasus last Saturday when interviewed on TV, and yet all the *Washington Post* would write about is horses dying at Santa Anita, even quoting *Horseracing Wrongs* with absolutely no rebuttals awarded from racing at all in the editorial.

This is 2020 and we need to start understanding the world around us.



- 8. Any horse that changes owner or trainer after time of declaration of its first start in the series will be ineligible to race in the finals or consolations. The consolation race must have six separate betting interests or it may be canceled by the raceway.
- 9. Purse Distribution: 50% First, 25% Second, 12% Third, 8% Fourth, 5% Fifth. (Dead Heats will be divided evenly)
- 10. Nominations close February 15, 2020. Nomination fee: \$5,000 Declaration Fee: \$1,000 each Leg. There will be no Starting Fee for the Final or Consolation.
- 11. Yonkers Raceway reserves the right to refuse any horse, trainer, driver and/or owner to race in this series.
- 12. Declarations to start will close at a prescribed time and date, and must be made for all preliminary final and consolation races.
- 13. Should circumstances prevent the racing of any or all of these races; monies paid in will be refunded to owners of horses nominated unless one race of the series has been contested. In the event of weather or other unforeseeable cancellation of the final race, a make-up will be made the following week or the next conceivable date. All divisions of a Preliminary must be completed in order for points to be earned.
- 14. One charted line meeting the qualifying standards will be required within 30 days. If continued satisfactory performance is not maintained in races, additional qualifying line(s) will be required and subsequent declarations rejected until this requirement is fulfilled.
- 15. Judges official order of finish will be used in determining eligibility to the Final events, exclusive of all appeals yet to be decided at the time of declaration to the Final events. In the case of a positive drug test, all appeals will be excluded from eligibility to final events until they are resolved by adjudication.

Celebrating Herve and Jackie Mo on their birthday weekend

Jack Moiseyev and Herve Filion. Their birthdays are and would have been this weekend.

Jackie Mo turned 60 on Jan. 31 and Filion would have been 80 on Feb. 1. Let's take a look at some of their career highlights.

Jack Moiseyev

- Won his first race in 1977 at age 17 with Scotch VO at Brandywine.
- Was only a teenager when he won with Minus Two and Vaudeville at the Meadowlands in January, 1977. He and Kyle DiBenedetto are the only two drivers to win a Meadowlands race both before age 20 and after age 50.
- Was the driver of Precious Bunny in 1991, the Horse of the Year who set the single-season money record of \$2,217,222. That year, in addition to the Jug, he won the Meadowlands Pace, the very first time that race went in sub-1:50 (1:49.4, over Artsplace).
- Three weeks after winning his first million-dollar race, he drove Giant Victory to a Hambletonian score, the very first time driving. It was his first million-dollar trotting score.
- In 1992-1993, he guided Presidential Ball to a \$3,021,363 career, highlighted by another Pace score.
- He was the principal driver for trainer Ed Lohmeyer on his star pupil, Pacific Rocket (\$2,333,401).
- He drove Ellamony, who set the female Meadowlands record for consecutive wins at 16, which still stands.
- He handled Stienams Place, the 1997 Breeders Crown winner and 3YOFP divisional champion for trainer Bruce Riegle.
- He won the 1991 Cane Pace with Silky Stallone, first time in the barn of Brett Pelling. Moiseyev-Pelling also teamed with White Ruffles, a star of the early 1990s.
- Moiseyev also handled such stars as 1997 Jug winner Armbro Operative, Survivor Gold, Stoneridge Scooter, Magical Mike, Armbro Monarch (Doherty Winner), Shore Patrol and Sweetheart winner Clover Hanover.
- He was both the leading money-winning driver of 1991 (\$9,568,468) and the dash-winning leader that same year

769 wins. There are only three drivers in the last half century who have led in both wins and earnings the same year. Moiseyev, Herve Filion and Tim Tetrick.

- He had been runner-up in victories in 1988, and would again be second in 1992.
- He was the second leading earner in each of the next three years after winning the title (1992-1993-1994) and was the HTA Driver of the Year in 1993.
- He was one of the first drivers to handle both a \$3 million trotter and pacer Presidential Ball and Fools Goal.
- Lifetime, Moiseyev has driven the winners of some \$130 million.

Herve Filion

- Filion was the youngest (at the time) to be voted into the Hall Of Fame in 1975 at age 35.
- Seven times he led in both wins and earnings. Only Jack Moiseyev and Tim Tetrick have done so since, and each has done it just once.
- Holds the all-time record for most combined wins/earnings titles with 22. Fifteen times he led in wins, seven times in earnings. Billy Haughton is next at 18 combined with 12 earnings titles and six dash titles.
- His 15 title years were: 1968, 1969, 1970, 1971, 1972, 1973, 1974, 1976, 1977, 1978, 1980, 1982, 1988, 1989, 1990
- Eleven different drivers were second best to him at various points during his dash-leading seasons.
- He is the only driver to lead in wins in four different decades 1968-1990.
- Filion was the national earnings leader in these years: 1970, 1971, 1972, 1973, 1974, 1976, 1977
- He was the first driver to reach \$2 million (1972 \$2,473,625).
- Filion was the 1970 World Driving Champion.
- He won the 1985 Breeders Crown as a last minute substitute behind Caressable. He won the 1986 Breeders Crown with the sensational Grades Singing and he also beat pacers one night in New York with that great trotting mare. Grades Singing also beat the boys in the 1986 Maple Leaf Trot.
- Filion drove the first horse to surpass \$800,000 in a single season (Hot Hitter in 1979, \$826,542). He won the Jug that year, and the James Dancer, with this Lou Meittinis trainee.
- He won the 1971 Jug driving Nansemond to victory over Albatross. It was one of only three losses that year for Albatross, the Horse of the Year repeater.
- In 1980, both he and Billy Haughton passed \$30 million. Filion went in front and held that title until July 31, 1987, when John Campbell took over for good.
- \bullet Filion died in June 2017. He had been a Hall Of Famer for more than half his life -42 of his 77 years.

The Grind, part two

Part one is here.

Playing horses to win is the rudimentary function of all pari-mutuel wagering. Because making a profit is our goal when betting any race, any other bets should be abandoned without a clear decision to play a horse to win.

In as far as any rule of play may go, suffice it to say the playing any exotic wager without having a win bet is nothing less than cavalier. To put it another way, a win wager is never sacrificed for any other bet.

Professional horseplayers have found that to be a sound rule because they also know that having a win bet is the inspiring factor for making any other wagers on single- or multi-race exotics and that when they do, the promise of a sincere return is, more times than not, valuable.

Keeping the profit motive in mind and being objective about everything Bettors Banquet (BB) practices, read what follows closely.

Secondary and sparingly, a bettor in a "Grind" mode (a Grinder) addresses exotic wagers only as supplements to a win bet; exotic wagers then become dependent upon the win bet and that horse becomes the "key" horse in all exotic combinations; that is, all exotic wagers will be built upon the key horse as their winner.

The object behind having a key horse in order to make exotic wagers is to aim for maximum profits. After all, if the bettor has deemed a key win bet valuable (its chances seem higher than its odds), it will also attend to raising the return price of an exotic.

Next, the Grinder works to assure maximum profits for key-horse-guided exotic combos by ignoring costly procedures used by others betting into exotic pools. That is, buying the least number of combo sets that are, for all due purposes, "losing" tickets.

This requires a commitment to the separate win bet and a very short list of other candidates that help build exotic tickets in the other-than-win positions required. A Grinder dismisses boxing exactas and stacking many probables in any exotic combo and prohibits any use of the "All" option at any time. These rules direct money to have specific decisions about contenders joining the exotic set. That eliminates the waste invested in huge combo tickets.

As well, these rules allow for a most important profit factor —

playing exotics' combinations more than once (that action will be discussed in future BBs).

Here is a sample example of how a Grinder (as in every scenario BB makes, our fictional Delaney) might invest in single-race exotics following the procedures above.

Delaney decides the 5 horse, one of his top three contenders in the race, offers the best value in the win pool. He plays that 5 horse to win. Delaney then buys exactas with his other two contenders, the 1 and the 7, in the second positions.

Then he plays a trifecta, again with his key horse in the win position, but this time he plays his other two contenders each in the second and third finishing spots. He will rarely go deeper than the demand of three finishing events (see part one for exotic wagering event demands) and, if successful, at most, buys merely two losing tickets.

Delaney's wagers:

BET TYPE - HORSE(S)

Win - 5

Exactas - 5-1; 5-7

Trifectas - 5-1-7; 5-7-1

If the race above is the opening leg of a multi-race "Pick" exotic, intrinsic problems arise if Delaney wants to address the Pick stream. He has to decide three key win bets for a Pick 3, four for a Pick 4, etcetera, and has to forecast the best value to assign key horses before substantial wagering on the other legs take place. This is where common multi-race players waste money by adding too many tickets and cost to a Pick stream.

Plus, exotic-betting menus host pools of Pick races that overlap (a Pick-5 stream may include a Pick-3 stream, a leg of a Pick-4 stream may be an ingredient of a Pick-6 stream and so on). Important factors leading to a valuable win wager become more speculative.

As well, the base costs of playing most exotics have dropped to retro-comic-book prices. The lure to participate in as many exotics as possible is greater than ever, but without judicious choices and tickets limited in scope, the results are left more to a matter of luck than handicapping or smart wagering. Over time, enough of these wagers lost is devastating to a player's bankroll.

Here is a common example of hitting a 50-cent Pick 3 that is a time-and-money wasting investment. It's from Jan. 17 at The Meadows:

Race 8 1/4/5/7

Race 9 2/4/5

Race 10 4/5/6

The ticket costs \$18 for correctly having the single set of winners -7/5/4. The price to collect a single set is \$19.40. A profit of \$1.40 on an \$18 ticket is the kind of profit that paves a sturdy road to the Poorhouse.

Muscle Hill and Ready Cash dominate European stallions

Swedish harness racing publication *Sulkysport* presented the European statistics regarding stallions last week and it's very clear that Ready Cash and Muscle Hill stand strong when it comes to the breeding business overseas.

Muscle Hill had an outstanding year as a stud during the season 2019 in Sweden and this was the Muscles Yankee son's third consecutive "win" in the northern European country.

Behind Muscle Hill, Maharajah ended as runner up ahead of Love You and Ready Cash and as the three previous years, Propulsion is the trotter that leads the way for Muscle Hill in the league. Propulsion was once again the best offspring of Muscle Hill and in 2019, the now 9-year-old stallion earned \$872.825.

Notable from the Swedish list is that rookie stallion Googoo Gaagaa, who now stands stud in Sweden, was best when it comes to offspring with highest winning percentage. Googoo Gaagaa had 19 horses that raced at 130 occasions which ended in 29 victories and \$975,579 in earnings. The son of Cam's Rocket was best even when it comes to average per race and average per starting offspring. Per race, Googoo Gaagaa's offspring earned \$7,504 and the winner of \$825,000 Kriteriet, Power, made sure that the figures ended at this high level.

In France, nothing much had changed since the season 2018. Ready Cash continues to dominate the French breeding and Love You and Prodigious are following him. Love You, third in the list 2018, passed Prodigious by small margin.

Recent Prix d'Amérique winner Face Time Bourbon was Ready Cash's best offspring with \$789,574 in earnings during 2019.

Death by a Salesman (Part 3)

Thursday night, at the *Smoke and Beerors Tavern*, I continued to revolutionize the stallion business. Rhetorically, I asked my wealthy patron a difficult question.

"What does one do with a stallion that gets fewer than 25 mares in a season? A stallion that may be old, questionable, falling out of favor, or has never been in favor?"

He gazed at his glass of Coor's Lite, "My answer would be: get another stallion."

"Suppose you have affection for this old stallion, he may be more of a pet than a financial investment?"

He shrugged, "Then, I have no idea."

"I do."

"Of course you do."

"My suggestion for a struggling stallion in this situation is something I just invented called the Stallion Challenge. My plan is more whimsical than a fiscal windfall, a brilliant marketing tool that might stir up a few more bookings. Most of all, it could be fun."

"For who?"

"The breeding farm, the owner, and the buyer."

"Clarify and continue your insanity."

"Imagine you own a stallion that will get fewer than 30 breedings. Let's say that you own Full Count, an aging, underrated, Ohio stallion. The ownership of Full Count has confidence and decides to issue a challenge to other trotters

A Challenge: \$10,000 prize

Hear Ye, Hear Ye - The ownership of the stallion, Full Count, is officially throwing down the gauntlet* to a potential challenger.

Should you own a stallion that will breed approximately an equal number of mares this season (less than 30), you may apply to accept the challenge. The parameters are simple. We believe that at the close of the 2023 racing season, the Full Count crop will earn more in official purse earnings than the crop of your stallion.

\$5,000 award to the owner of the individual horse in these competing crops that accumulates the most purse earnings in 2023.

\$5,000 award to the ownership (or farm) of the Stallion whose foals earn the highest total purse money in 2023.

in the same boat. The challenge begins with posting this notice.

"Is this real?"

"No, at this point, the challenge is hypothetical. But what would life be without hypothetical questions?"

"Where would the prize money come from?" he asked.

"Each stallion owner would put up \$5,000. But remember, one of the two will get their money back. My thinking is that if this quirky challenge spurs one or two additional breedings, it will create a positive cash flow for the sponsoring competitors."

"You're suggesting a small incentive to possibly push buyers to do some business with a not-so-hot prospect?" he asked.

"Sure. As a buyer, I'm looking at one of those sub crops of maybe 60 horses from these two stallions. I know that not all the mares will carry to term, not all the foals will race, and the stallions will probably not get top-tier mares. To the minds of overoptimistic broodmare owners like me, this is equine cocaine. We know OUR foal will race. We know that OUR mare will be the best of this lot. Suddenly, to our delusional minds, this \$5,000 carrot feels like free money."

"Do you think it would make a difference? Do you think this little perk would push a few owners to breed to a stallion in this category?"

"I'm not sure."

"Wow, humility, from Trey."

"Yeah, the world needs another genius like me with humility; there are so few of us left. What's the downside? The quirky little side game couldn't hurt. I mean, buyers are fickle. Weird things can be tipping points. For someone like me, granted not a normal person, this extra perk could be a factor. Following the competitors in the challenge and a potential \$5,000 bonus gets my attention."

He summed up, "So... at best you get a few mares going to a couple of aging stallions, who will be very aging stallions by the end of the contest. This scheme doesn't feel like a tidal wave to perk up the stallion business and recruit new owners."

"Baby steps," I said. "I used two elderly stallions in my model. Similar models could be used by other stallions who face a bleak future, stallions with flaws in the eyes of the marketplace."

"Flaws?"

"Yeah, maybe the stallion is an unraced brother of a great champion, or your stallion was a fast horse with a marginal family, or a foreign horse, or a well-bred horse that was a dud on the racetrack. There will be a long list of stallions that, for one reason or another, will not get much business.

"You think these 'small crop challenges' could work?"

"Who knows? All it requires is that a few stallion owners have enough audacity to set up these little side pools, advertise, throw down the gauntlet, and accept the challenge. The pools could be fun for farms, fun for owners, and fun for the customers. Winners could get trophies, and there could be good-natured trash talk. Operators could be innovative. Foolishness is nothing to fear."

Betting tops \$3 million at Big M

The action at the Meadowlands has heated up in a big way of late, and the trend continued Saturday night. Wagering on the 13-race card pushed past the \$3-million mark for the second time this year as \$3,026,740 was put in play.

The other time betting went past the magic \$3-million mark was on Jan. 3, when \$3,069,967 was pushed through the windows.

Saturday night got off to a good start, as in the first race, \$250,382 in action was taken. A total of \$71,830 was pumped into the 50-cent Pick-5 pool, outdoing the previous 2020 best of \$63,798 (on Jan. 4) by 12.5 percent.

Betting on the 50-cent Pick-4 also reached a season high with a total pool of \$117,502, which is just over \$8,000 more than was pushed through the windows on Jan. 3. Total wagering on the eighth race – which is the start of the Pick-4 – was a night-best \$306,163.

Betting has now surpassed the \$2.5-million mark for three straight racing programs at the Big M.

PAPPY KEEPS GO GO GOING: Pappy Go Go ran his winning streak to four facing his toughest test yet, taking the co-featured \$37,500 Preferred for trotters.

The Andrew Harris-trained 6-year-old son of Tad The Stud—Paging Willy left the gate quickly, along with Nows The Moment and JL Cruze while Misslarose was also away alertly to protect rail position.

Pappy Go Go marched to the top at the three-eighths and

took the field past the half before taking pressure from JL Cruze, who backed off just a bit on the far turn before coming back on late, only to be out-kicked for second by Muscle Diamond, who was explosive in the latter stages to miss by a neck.

Corey Callahan drove the winner, who covered the mile in 1:52.3, to his 33rdwin from 84 lifetime starts, good for earnings of \$268,297 for owners Michael Goldberg Racing. He returned \$4.20 as the even-money favorite.

"It's the Pappy-lands," joked Harris. "He's as good as he's ever been. He beat a solid group tonight. In this class, you can't expect a blowout every week. Corey is driving him smart."

THE CAPTAIN COMMANDS BOTH FEATURES: Callahan, aka The Captain, was the driver colony's top gun Saturday, winning four times on the night. The 41-year-old pilot swept both features, as after winning with Pappy Go Go, he guided Endeavor to the winner's circle in the \$37,500 Preferred for pacers.

Working out a pocket trip behind 8-5 favorite Italian Delight N – who was looking for his third win in as many starts since arriving in North America from Australia – Endeavor vacated the pocket in mid-stretch and rolled right by the public choice to record an authoritative 3½-length victory in 1:49.1. Sicily out-kicked Italian Delight N for second.

Endeavor, a 7-year-old gelded son of American Ideal-Jett Diamond who is trained by Jeff Cullipher, won for the 33rdfrom 112 lifetime starts, and now has earnings of \$702,062 for owners Pollack Racing and Jeff Cullipher. As the third choice in the betting, he paid \$8.20 to win.

REMINDER: When racing resumes Friday (Feb. 7), post time will change to 6:55 p.m.

A LITTLE MORE: Woodbine Mohawk Park TV personality Monique Vag correctly selected the Can-Am Pick-4 that returned \$260 for a 20-cent bet... Yannick Gingras matched Callahan, driving four winners on the card. Not surprisingly, trainer Ron Burke conditioned all of Gingras' winners... One sharp player betting into the Oregon hub held the only ticket to last six legs in the 20-cent Survivor Pick-10 and cashed in for \$10,026.

The 4-year-old Bettors Delight gelding Better B Going grabbed the front early and wired his competition in the \$40,000 Snowshoe Final.

Driver Chris Christoforou cleared command with Bettor B Going before a :27.2 first quarter. The Wilford Perrault trainee continued uncontested towards a :55.2 half and only faced minor first-over pressure from Warrawee Vital approaching three-quarters in 1:23.2. Warrawee Vital gained slight ground on Bettor B Going through the stretch but finished two-and-a-half lengths behind the winner in a 1:50.3 stakes record mile. Bernie, riding the pylons throughout, took third.

Owned by Grant and Joanne Curnow, Bettor B Going won his seventh race from 21 starts, earning \$85,399. He paid \$6.00 to win.

Completing a series sweep, Sugar Dance darted off cover to capture the \$36,000 Blizzard Series final.

Positioned in the middle of the pack from her second-tier post, Sugar Dance sat sixth while Betsea led the field passed a :28.4 first quarter. Driver Jody Jamieson then angled Sugar Dance to track cover from first-over Playa Duharas into a :58.3 half. Playa Duharas stalled into the final turn, prompting Sugar Dance to tip off cover heading to three-quarters in 1:27.2. The 4-year-old Ghees House mare swept to the front spinning into the stretch and maintained control in progress to a 1:54.4 victory. Vintage Whey rallied from near-last to snag second with Betsea faltering to third.

Winning her seventh race from 14 starts, Sugar Dance has collected \$51,010 in earnings for owners Sandra Hennessey and Paula Sugars. Edward Hennessey conditions the \$3.80 winner.

The Snowshoe Series and Blizzard were each open to 3 and 4-year-old pacers (fillies & mares for the Blizzard) that were non-winners of two-races or \$30,000 lifetime as of Oc. 31, 2019.

Horses stabled at Saratoga scratched at Meadowlands

In response to a **possible case of respiratory EHV-1** at Saratoga Harness track, all horses entered to race this weekend at The Meadowlands that are stabled at that track were scratched as a precaution.

When the Big M became aware of the situation Friday morning, Meadowlands race secretary Scott Warren contacted presiding judge Pete Koch to discuss how they might best protect horses and horsemen racing at The

Meadowlands.

After consulting with the New Jersey Racing Commission (NJRC) veterinarians it was decided to eliminate the risk of allowing horses from Saratoga to be brought into the paddock, thus the scratches which numbered 15 on Friday and three on Saturday. Affected horsemen were notified immediately.

"We hope to get more information this weekend and will communicate to the affected horsemen about entering on Tuesday for next weekend," said Warren. "Only those horses stables on the grounds at Saratoga are affected by the exclusion until the problem is controlled to the satisfaction of the NJRC vets."
