Dave Landry James MacDonald has been voted Canada's Keith **Waples Driver** of the Year for the second year in a row.

Bulldog Hanover stole the show, winning the Somebeachsomewhere Horse of the Year title, taking the Older Pacing Horse division, and he was also honored as the 2022 recipient of the prestigious Cam Fella Award.

Bulldog Hanover captivated the hearts of harness racing fans across North America, becoming the fastest standardbred the sport has ever seen when he stopped the clock in 1:45.4 in the William R. Haughton Memorial at The Meadowlands. It was a memorable season for the Jack Darling-trained son of Shadow Play that saw him win 14 races in 16 starts for \$1,858,210 in earnings. Some of Bulldog Hanover's other notable victories came in the Dan Patch Stakes and the Hoosier Pacing Derby at Hoosier Park, the Dayton Pacing Derby, the Canadian Pacing Derby, the Breeders Crown and the TVG Open.

Millar Farms, recognized with the Armstrong Breeder of the Year award, was the leading breeder in the 2022 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) program and, in total, saw 34 starters earn more than \$2.1 million. Some of the most notable 2022 starters bred by Millar Farms were O'Brien Award winner Silver Label and Simcoe Stakes winner Velvet Stinger.

Richard Moreau added a record 10th O'Brien trophy to his mantle, with another Trainer of the Year title. In 2022, he topped the charts for all trainers in Canada with 330 wins and \$5,254,296 in purse earnings. He was the leading trainer of 2022 at Flamboro Downs, Georgian Downs and Woodbine Mohawk Park. Two of Moreau's trainees also picked up O'Brien Awards: Gaines Hanover in the two-year-old trotting colt category and Fashion Frenzie in the Older Trotting Horse division.

James MacDonald was honored as the Keith Waples Driver of the Year for the second-consecutive year following a career best season. MacDonald shattered his personal bests last season, winning 451 races with more than \$9.9 million in purse earnings. In addition to leading all Canadian drivers in wins and earnings during this career season, he added a second-consecutive Lampman Cup, which is awarded to the leading driver in the OSS program. Other accomplishments include winning the inaugural Charles Juravinski Memorial Cup at Flamboro Downs with Linedrive Hanover in a Canadian-record time, as well as an historic night at Woodbine Mohawk Park which saw him win eight races on a card — a new WEG/OJC

record. MacDonald was the regular driver for three O'Brien Award winners: So Much More, Adare Castle and Twin B Archie.

In 2022, **Dr. lan Moore** winner of the O'Brien Award of Horsemanship, enjoyed one of his best years to date, finishing with a career high \$2.4 million in earnings. Most of his success came courtesy of two-year-old pacing colt Stockade Seelster, winner of the O'Brien Award for his division and O'Brien finalist Tattoo Artist. Stockade Seelster swept every race in the provincial program this year and added a Metro Pace title at Woodbine Mohawk Park, giving Moore the first Metro of his career. Tattoo Artist finished with more than \$1 million in earnings in a single season for the first time in his four-year racing career.

Samuel Fillion, honored as the Future Star winner, improved from 100 victories and \$574,000 in purses in his first Future Star-nominated season in 2021 to 164 wins and more than \$1.1 million in 2022. The Quebec native won the Quebec/Eastern Ontario Regional Driving Championship and was one of the leading drivers last seasons at Rideau Carleton Raceway.

Sylvia Hanover won the O'Brien as the country's top Two-Year-Old Pacing Filly. The daughter of Always B Miki finished off her nine-start year with a record of 8-1-0, and \$903,300 in the bank for trainer Shawn Steacy. Owned by Hudson Standardbred Stable of Quebec, her list of accomplishments included victories in the Champlain Stakes, Shes A Great Lady Final and the Breeders Crown Final, which were all held at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

In the Two-Year-Old Pacing Colt division, **Stockade Seelster** was awarded the O'Brien trophy. The son of State Treasurer had a stellar year for trainer Dr. Ian Moore, finishing with eight wins in 11 tries and bankrolling \$917,470. He was perfect in the provincial program (five-for-five), capped off with a win in the OSS Super Final. His biggest payday came from his win in the \$900,000 Metro Pace.

Silver Label won the title of Three-Year-Old Pacing Filly of the year. In 2022, victories for the daughter of Bettors Delight included the final of the SBOA and the Ontario Sires Stakes Super Final, and her seasonal earnings came in at \$498,138.

In the Three-Year-Old Pacing Colt division, **Pebble Beach**, the leading money winning horse in Canada with \$1.038 million earned on Canadian soil, won the O'Brien Award. The son of Downbytheseaside was a perfect five-for-five over the Woodbine Mohawk Park oval this year. Trained by Noel Daley, Pebble Beach's signature wins in Canada included the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup and the Breeders Crown final, both of which he won in dominating fashion.

So Much More picked up a second O'Brien trophy for her connections in the Older Pacing Mare division. Trained by Don Beatson, the daughter of Big Jim continued her dominance in Canada's upper fillies and mares ranks in 2022, where she made 34 starts, winning 16 times and earning \$427,707. She had 29 top-three finishes overall, which included a third-place finish in the Breeders Crown final. In 2022, she also surpassed the


\$1 million mark for career earnings and achieved her 50th lifetime win.

Righteous Resolve won the Two-Year-Old Trotting Filly honors. Just like her full brother — Duly Resolved, did a year ago — Righteous Resolve had a dominant freshman campaign, winning eight of 10 races while earning \$623,704. The daughter of Resolve won the Champlain Stakes, the Peaceful Way and four Ontario Sires Stakes events, including the OSS Super Final. She also finished third in the Breeders Crown final for trainer John Bax.

In the Two-Year-Old Trotting Colt division, **Gaines Hanover** won the O'Brien Award. The son of Cantab Hall won four of eight starts last season and bankrolled \$493,851 in earnings. The Richard Moreau trainee won the Champlain Stakes in September, but his biggest moment came when he captured the final of the Breeders Crown in October.

Adare Castle was crowned champion in the Three-Year-Old Trotting Filly division. This daughter of Muscle Mass, trained by Mark Etsell, matched her win total from a year ago (seven) and earned \$668,654 in the process. Her stakes wins included four Ontario Sires Stakes Gold events, the SBOA Final and the Casual Breeze. She finished second in the Elegantimage, the Simcoe and the OSS Super Final.

Twin B Archie captured his first O'Brien Award in the Three-Year-Old Trotting Colt division. In 2022, the sophomore gelding by Archangel racked up six wins and \$490,502 in earnings for

trainer Scott McEneny. He won the SBOA Final, two OSS Gold events and was second in the Goodtimes Final.

Older Trotting Mare **Atlanta** picked up her second O'Brien Award in this division, the first coming in 2019. The daughter of Chapter Seven, trained by Ron Burke, won six races in 15 starts and amassed \$493,721 in 2022, with stakes wins that included the Armbro Flight and the Miss Versatility Final. She also finished second in the Breeders Crown.

In the Older Trotting Horse category, **Fashion Frenzie** won the O'Brien after a season where he won seven of nine starts and more than \$226,000 in purses for trainer Richard Moreau. Most of the victories for the son of Archangel were in Woodbine Mohawk Park's Open Trot, with his notable stakes win coming at Georgian Downs where he won the Earl Rowe Memorial and set a new track record in the process.

The Media Excellence Awards and Outstanding Groom Award were also presented during the O'Brien Awards Gala.

Dave Briggs won his fourth Media Excellence Award in the Outstanding Written Work category for his feature, "**There's still some magic left in the old game**." The story, which was published on July 19 on Harness Racing Update, covers this past summer's magical evening of harness racing at The Meadowlands highlighted by historic performances from Canadian stars Bulldog Hanover and Beach Glass.

Horse Racing Alberta added its third Media Excellence Award in the Outstanding Broadcast category for the "2022 HRA Fun For Fans Promo," a video that tells the story of the Alberta Standardbred Horse Association's Fun For Fans charity initiative that has spanned 10 years and raised more than \$250,000 for charities province-wide. Produced by Jeff Robillard of Horse Racing Alberta and Mike Little of Shine Light Entertainment, the video first aired on the Horse Racing Alberta website and social media channels on Sept. 22.

Defending champion in the Outstanding Photography category, **Clive Cohen** captured his seventh Media Excellence Award for his photograph, "**The Long Shadow**." The photo, which captures a striking bird's-eye view of a Standardbred casting a long shadow on the racetrack, was taken on June 2 at Woodbine Mohawk Park and published on the track's social media feeds.

Kayla Chappell, of Millet, Alta., was recognized with the Outstanding Groom Award. Chappell has worked for the Duane Marfisi stable for just over a year, paddocking, warming up, shipping and grooming horses. Before relocating to Ontario, she groomed horses for several Alberta-based trainers, and she was also a member of the Alberta Standardbred Horse Association social media team. Chappell is known for her attention to detail and treats every horse with great care. In addition to grooming, she has both her trainer's and driver's licenses and took part in the 2022 International Women's Day Race at Woodbine Mohawk Park last March.



Driver and trainer transparency is modernizing the game

Public comments from racing's participants give customers new reasons to wager and are in one small way changing an age-old betting sport

"You're right, that website does help me," said a friend via a text last week.

He was referring to **insideharness.com**, which, at the behest of the Jeff Gural team, lists upwards of 75 comments from participants, detailing information about their entrants for any given card at The Meadowlands.

My friend, initially skeptical of the venture, has come around. And I think there's good reason to: Many of the comments are actionable.

When Linda Toscano tells the public her horse had two hard front-end speed missions in a row and might look for a helmet this week, it's real. When Ron Burke and Yannick Gingras mention how great a horse qualified, it's something to consider. When John McDermott says his horse had a cough early in the week and the public sees the horse scratched, it's a good thing.


Even the amateur races, which are a thorn in the side of serious horseplayers, can have a plethora of comments helping customers navigate that minefield. This information can aid them to gain an edge, especially in burgeoning Pick-4 and -5 pools.

Although new to harness racing, the concept of scouring for real time information about and from participants from non-traditional sources is a staple of the 2023 sports bettor, and perhaps has never been examined harder.

Professional bettor and chief executive officer of the **Hammer Betting Network**, **Rob Pizzola** said to me via direct message:

The days of Joe at Mulvany's Pub in Long Island spreading rumors about Frank Gifford's playing status because his 'cousin knows someone' are long gone. Local reporters, YouTube coaches' press conferences and gumshoes in the sports betting world provide this information right on our screens now.

For harness racing, some have argued this all doesn't matter materially — why should The Meadowlands and participants go to all this trouble — and they do make some valid points. However, something I noticed just last week might Illustrate why I think it's important.

At Woodbine Mohawk Park on Jan. 26, patrons opened the program and saw two races in the Pick-5 with potential chalks sent out by leading trainer Richard Moreau. These weren't regular favorites, though. Both horses were off over seven weeks, and due to the change in qualifying rules had no charted line. It was the quintessential quessing game.

I polled a few friends, curious what they were going to do about the popular Pick-5 bet that evening.

Their responses ranged from, "I assume both horses will be great, but I don't know enough to put money on it," to an incredulous, "Why would they do that to us?" and "I'd feel like a degenerate if I played."

One or two trainers from Woodbine Mohawk Park post comments on Inside Harness, but it's not pushed like it is at The Big M, and their leading trainer is not one of them. That left the customers with no out. One of my friends began searching for inside information — not unlike Joe at Mulvany's Pub did in 1972 — but he couldn't find out much.

If you're wondering, both horses were well bet but didn't hit the board, and yes, the Pick-5 pool was lower than the previous few Thursdays.

To become a better betting game (and drive more revenue for purses) I believe the sport needs to kick down the barriers between those who want to wager and those who take those wagers. It must, at every turn, find reasonable ways to encourage a customer to bet. Transparency not only builds trust; it keeps people engaged. It's an asset not a liability.

There were people looking at The Meadowlands last Sunday (Jan. 29) wondering if a horse in the fifth who had been off for a month was ready. They're opening Inside Harness for clues and likely finding at least some real time information to help them. That's a very positive thing and I applaud the trainers and drivers who are participating. To those who aren't yet, please consider it. You will be helping your sport modernize.



Tar Heel was the foremost broodmare sire of the time, Part 3

Quite often the subject of nicks or crosses comes about when discussing the breeding of horses, specifically standardbreds and in this case pacers.

To his era, Tar Heel was recognized as the foremost broodmare sire of the time, perhaps ever.

The numbers are overwhelming.

There have been 4,660 horses out of Tar Heel mares who have raced.

Almost 30 per cent (1,346) of them took 2:00 records, the sign of racetrack superiority for much of that time.

Horses out of Tar Heel-sired mares have earned a staggering \$186,113,713, much of it earned in time periods where the purses were nowhere near what they have been in modern times.

Another incredible factor is that Tar Heel produced 28 crops of foals. The number is staggering. It covers at least two eras and quite possibly extends to three. That would be twice as many as most stallions would be expected to have in a lifetime.

For purposes of this article, we will look at the crosses at which Tar Heel mares nicked with best and yielded the best results or ask the question whether there were any specific outstanding crosses at all.

My friend Myron Bell, a person who is one of the great students of pedigrees, sometimes scoffs at those who speak of crosses.


"The only place where crosses are of importance is in church," Bell said.

Myron is a firm believer in maternal families above all. I am not one to argue with him. That belief has certainly served him and his long-time employer George Segal and his Brittany Farms extremely well.

This scribe is of the belief that good crosses exist, but that they are not necessarily of paramount importance.

Other factors such as maternal families, conformation, speed, demeanor, intelligence and the environment in which they are raised, may be equally important or of greater or lesser importance. I'm of the belief that each mating is a separate breeding that stands on its own merits or lack of same. The challenge of the astute breeder is to determine his breedings in a manner that leads to success by increasing the positives and eliminating the negatives. Even then, breeding quality horses is far from an exact science.

Tar Heel daughters produced seven millionaires by seven different stallions. Is there a special nick there? To this scribe, the answer would be maybe and probably yes. Four out of the seven mares are by Meadow Skipper (Ralph Hanover, \$1,828,810) or his sons Most Happy Fella (Doc's Fella, \$1,267,059), Albatross (Praised Dignity, \$1,194,713) and Scarlet Skipper (Forrest Skipper, \$1,044,650). Two of the remaining three are out of mares sired by stallions who might be considered outliers, Happy Motoring (Anxious Robby, \$1,191,383) and Tarport Effrat (Millers Scout, \$1,162,061). The

One might be inclined to ask will only seven millionaires give a definitive answer to the question of whether specific nicks existed for the matings for Tar Heel mares? Probably not.

Let us look a little farther. We will come up with an answer that may be close to positive.

There has been a total of 50 horses out of Tar Heel mares that have earned in excess of \$400,000. No less than 23 of those mares were by Meadow Skipper (3), and his sons and grandsons. They include eight by Albatross and six by Most Happy Fella. Next in line is the Adios line which includes Adios himself (1) and his sons Adios Vic (3) and Dancer Hanover (3).

Those numbers certainly conclude that breeding Tar Heel mares to Meadow Skipper and his sons has proven to be quite successful. How successful, one might ask? I would say more successful than breeding to most other sires. Bear in mind that those numbers do not take into account the total number of mares by Tar Heel which were bred to individual sires or perhaps of equal or more importance, their maternal lineage.

Tar Heel was a great sire and also a great broodmare sire. The fact that he is a great broodmare sire should be a given. All great sires are also great broodmare sires. I've yet to find an exception. There are quite a few stallions who are looked upon as good broodmare sires who were not great sires themselves. It is my belief that in many of those cases their maternal family as well as other factors relating to the mare rises to the occasion over the relative mediocrity of the sire. Am I able to substantiate that opinion? The answer is no, not in black and white. The breeding of horses remains and will likely continue to be an inexact science.

Adventures in breeding land

If Plan "A" didn't work, the alphabet has 25 more letters. Stay cool.

The breeding season is fascinating. The pending arrival of a foal and those first wobbly steps are a magical time. With only our wits and a crystal ball, broodmare owners weigh costs, market trends and pedigrees for the next sire, broodmare and foal. Each dance with equine destiny and genetics is strangely addictive.

My lack of knowledge of the breeding game is significant. My void of expertise in genetics, genotyping, pedigrees, phenotyping and marketing is close to a black hole. However, like a sparrow bringing fresh twigs to his annual nest, I learn a little more each year.

The most important thing I have learned is that breeding a broodmare and selling the foal as a yearling for a profit is challenging. Also, the breeding game is a bit nutso. Plans can go awry. Every horse breeder, be they commercial breeder or hobbyist, has a storehouse of stories — some happy, some tragic, some comic — that intercede during the months and years between the selection of a sire and the slap of a hammer at a yearling sales auction.

Folks like John Mossbarger, Adam Bowden, and Steve Stewart could, and should, write books about the unexpected twists and turns in the crazy world of sires, broodmares, buying, selling and growing yearlings. Allow me to relate a true story demonstrating the wildly unpredictable breeding world.

Looking back at the past 15 years, my partner and I have arranged the insemination of four mares, resulting in a dozen yearlings going to public auction (one foal died, and another year, the new stallion was infertile). Despite our delusional due diligence in selecting stallions for our mares and endless hours of discussion on the merits of one sire over another, our yearling sales results *never* reached or exceeded our expectations.

From the first yearling we raised, despite constantly tinkering with different mares and sires, we struggled to produce a

product that sold well. With each disappointment, our resolve grew to grow a yearling the buying public favored. This quest to find the correct sire and mare is a cycle that may resonate with many breeders.

For this tale, cast your mind back to the summer of 2020, the bizarre and frightening early days of COVID-19. Those surreal early months brought masks and blame, isolation and fear and a period where harness racetracks closed their doors. Nobody knew if or when the racetracks would reopen.

My partner and I had a 3-year-old filly trotter training as a racehorse during the COVID lockdown. The filly in question was struggling to qualify. She did not race at 2 and was not looking like a stakes performer on the training track. Suddenly, this filly's future, even as a county fair performer, was doubtful due to the virus. The day after the racetracks stopped racing, for how long nobody knew, my horse pal and I had our daily phone chat. It went something like this:

"He said, 'Oh man, how long do you think the tracks will stay shut down? What are we going to do with the filly?' 'No idea,' I said. 'It's a bizarro world out there."

After a pause, something popped into my brain, from where I did not know.

"I said, 'This might be impossible, we never talked about breeding this mare, but could we try to get her in foal?' He said, 'I don't know, it's probably too late in the breeding season,

and she is still on the racetrack.' I said, 'Obviously, when we bought her, we thought her breeding was pretty good, and there is a trotting stallion on a farm just a few miles away. Let's make a few calls."

We spent approximately two minutes researching this mating. The arrangements consisted of two phone calls in less than five minutes, this off-the-wall shot in the dark burst into my mind with less deliberation than selecting a pre-cooked rotisserie chicken at the grocery store. The following day our bewildered filly traveled a few miles down the road to a breeding farm.

Time marched onwards. The resulting foal, a filly, was born 11 months later on a late May morning at the farm where we keep our broodmare. The baby was nice looking. She grew tall and strong. When we visited the farms to watch her progress, we would laugh and smile at our "Pandemic Panic" filly.

We consigned the filly to a sale. Our hopes were not high. Although this yearling had a decent family pedigree, she was a late May foal from an unraced mare.


On the day of the sale, the "Pandemic Panic" yearling had very few visitors. We set a low price; if she did not bring that number, we would take her home and try her as a racehorse.

The auctioneer called her into the sales ring. This yearling — this random, wild, accidental stab that resulted from a global plague — stepped into the sales ring. Unlike the string of yearlings we had previously sent to market, she sold for over twice our expected price in less than a minute. What a rush.

Of course, being true harness horse junkies, we took our windfall and squandered the unexpected cash on another yearling filly later in the same sale, another horse that was more hunch than a deep study.

But for almost two hours, we were flush. We were ahead of the game. And we kept enough money aside for another swing in this crazy part of our game. Our next swing is just around the corner as we choose another sire. As always, the long trip to the sales ring will be exciting and possibly touched by a bit of karma.

Robust support of Breeders Crown program generates purse hikes

The Breeders Crown, harness racing's year-end championship series, will raise purses on six of the 12 divisions of Breeders Crown races to be held at Harrah's Hoosier Park, Anderson, IN, on Friday, Oct. 27 and Saturday, Oct. 28.

All four freshmen events will go for \$700,000, a purse level not reached for those divisions since 2008. That makes the Breeders Crown the richest 2-year-old races offered on the 2023 calendar, with the exception of the Mohawk Million for 2-year-old trotters.

Mare pacers and trotters will race for \$400,000, the highest base purse for older distaffers in the 40-year history of the Breeders Crown and the highest for their division on the stakes calendar.

All 3-year-old divisions and the Crown Trot and Crown Pace will maintain a purse structure of \$600,000.

In addition to lucrative purses, a Breeders Crown title has major implications in voting for year-end awards. In 2022, seven of the Dan Patch award winners were Breeders Crown champions. Should the heavy favorite for Horse of the Year, Bulldog Hanover, succeed, he will bring the total to 30 of 39 Horse of the Year winners also winning their Breeders Crown.

"As the racing and breeding businesses have flourished in the past several years so have the Breeders Crown championships enjoyed the support of the stallion nominators, breeders, owners and horse people," said John Campbell, president of the Hambletonian Society, which owns and administers the Breeders Crown series.

Payments to participate in all Breeders Crown divisions are due Wednesday, Feb. 15 and can be found on **ustrotting.com** or **Hambletonian.com**,

"The 2-year-old nominations were at record levels last year and in anticipation of that continued popularity, the Breeders Crown committee of the Society felt the purses could be raised to \$700,000 across the board," said Campbell. "That support and the ability of our valued Host Tracks to present the Breeders Crown in a first-class manner has allowed the Breeders Crown

event to continue to grow in stature and prestige and offer historically high purses.

"In recent years, older mares have been an extremely competitive group and also featured full fields, so they also got a purse hike to \$400,000."

The Society's mission statement since 1926 has focused on supporting and promoting the breeding of Standardbred horses. Keeping 2-year-old purses at a high-level benefits breeders and helps owners with a timely return on their investments.

The 2023 Breeders Crown will take place on the final two weekends in October at the host track of Harrah's Hoosier Park, Anderson Indiana. The Midwest's premier seven-eighths mile track is hosting Crown events for the third time, having previously held the 2017 and 2020 editions.

The freshmen Breeders Crown finals take place Friday, Oct. 27 and the eight 3-year-old and up events are set for Saturday, Oct. 28.

Racing applications for the inaugural spring harness racing season at Shenandoah Downs, which runs from April 1-May 14, are now available at **vhha.net**.

All horsemen wishing to compete in the first of two pari-mutuel meets in Woodstock, VA, this year must fill out an application and return it to the Virginia Harness Horse Association by March 3. Another campaign will be held in the fall.

Races during the seven-week, 14-day spring meet will be held every Saturday and Sunday at 1 p.m. A total of \$1,060,000 in purse monies will be distributed.

Signature events are a pair of \$25,000 races — the Blue Ridge Pace and Alleghany Trot — and both will be held on Saturday (April 22). The marquee races were introduced last fall but were switched to the spring meet this year.

Another slate of \$25,000 races will be contested on the first weekend in May. Graduates of the Virginia Harness Horse Association's (VHHA) Certified Residency Program will get a chance to compete against each other for the first time. The Pace will be held Saturday (May 6) and the Trot on Sunday

(May 7). Foals from 2019 and 2020, that completed their residency requirements, will be eligible to participate.

Continuing on in 2023, the 106th Shenandoah County Fair harness meet will be held on Aug. 30-31 and Sep. 1-2. The eighth annual Shenandoah Downs fall season will follow from Sep. 16-Oct. 29 pending Virginia Racing Commission approval. Highlight of the fall meet is the 26th annual Virginia Breeder's Championships, scheduled for Oct. 29. Elimination/prep legs will take place on the four weekends prior, beginning Sept. 30.
