List of Seth Fishman clients released

Meadowlands owner Jeff Gural said he is going over the list which lacks context of whether alleged clients bought legal products from the disgraced vet or PEDs.

Two days after Dr. Seth Fishman was found guilty on two counts of drug adulteration and misbranding (full story here), which could land him in prison for as much as 20 years, a list of his clients was obtained by the pool reporter who had been covering the trial for several publications, *Harness Racing Update* among them.

There are more than 2,000 individuals on the list, and virtually all of them were from the standardbred industry, including many of the top names in the sport. But that does not mean that 2,000 harness owners and trainers were procuring performance-enhancing drugs (PEDs) from Fishman. The disgraced veterinarian sold some products that were legal and trying to decipher who bought legal medications and who bought PEDs

could prove to be difficult if not impossible. The Fishman list gives no information about who was buying what drugs.

"The list covers anybody who bought any products of any kind from this guy," said Jeff Gural, who was in the process of going over the list. "We don't know what they bought. I think we will find a way to find that out, but at the moment we don't know."

(Editor's note: Publishing some or all of the names could lead to accusations against people who did nothing wrong. Thus, Harness Racing Update will not be releasing the names of any of Fishman's clients at this time).

It was also noteworthy that the list was largely absent of names of thoroughbred horsemen. One of the few exceptions was Ohio-based trainer Jamen Davidovich, who admitted under oath during the Fishman trial that he used PEDs supplied to him by

the vet. It was not immediately clear if Fishman was selling his products primarily to standardbred people or if there is another list of thoroughbred buyers that has yet to be made public.

Fishman was missing from the final two days of his trial and there was yet to be any reports to explain his absence. He will be sentenced on May 5. His trial was also supposed to include his assistant Lisa Giannelli, but a mistrial was called in her case after her lawyer came down with COVID-19. Gural hopes that Gianelli will be called on to answer many of the questions that arose in the Fishman trial and with the release of his client list.

"His assistant is going to be tried shortly," Gural said. "I would hope she would change her mind about going to trial and offer to tell us which drugs these customers were buying. I am sure she knows who was buying or thought they were buying performance-enhancing drugs. We have to hope that she will tell us."

Gural said he will be speaking to some of the people on the list.

"I sent a clear message in my press release (**full story here**) that there are people who should have their records in order," he said.

Best In Show is a great cross to many Indiana-sired broodmares, and his foals will be Breeders Crown eligible.

FINES & SUSPENSIONS



This week's fines and suspensions:

On Friday (Feb. 4) HRU published its weekly Grassroots Perspective column. This week, the person featured was California horseman Jessie Pacheco.

Full disclosure: After the story was published, on that very same day, Pacheco appeared on the USTA's fines and suspensions list with a \$5,000 fine and a 364-day suspension from the California Horse Racing Board for "Possession of hypodermic needles, syringes and/or injectable and/or other drugs."

Pacheco has appealed that ruling. If we see or are notified of the result of Pacheco's appeal we will publish the results at that time.

Clearly, it was bad timing on HRU's part, but note that Pacheco did not disclose to HRU or the writer that he was under suspicion for this offense at the time of the interview, which was done in advance of Friday's public notification of this alleged offense. Clearly, the fine and suspension were released publicly after the story came out in HRU.

In the name of transparency, on Saturday we added an editor's note to this effect to the top of that column — in the online version — explaining the bad timing. Otherwise, the story remains as it was published — again, for full transparency.

The news of Pacheco's fine and suspension comes the same week we had planned to start publishing weekly links to both the USTA and Standardbred Canada's fines and suspension list. There's no reason not to continue with that plan even when someone we just featured in a story appears on this week's list.

Note that, for now, HRU is simply providing a link to public-ly-available lists for convenience sake.

Readers are reminded that because a person's name appears on the list does not necessarily mean they are guilty of an offense. Many times, cases are not finalized and many of the accused are still entitled to due process.

Also, please note, for context, the first link is to the Association of Racing Commissioners International's classification system of drug penalties to give readers a sense of the difference between a Class 1 and a Class 4 positive.

There are two finalists in each category.

Richard Moreau will be looking to add a record ninth O'Brien trophy to his mantle in the **Trainer of the Year** category and is up against **Nick Gallucci**.

Richard Moreau of Puslinch, ON has earned eight consecutive titles as Canada's Trainer of the Year. To date in 2021, he tops the charts for all trainers in Canada in wins and earnings. First-time finalist James MacDonald is en route to a career record season in 2021, winning 309 races and driving horses to more than \$7.3 million in earnings to date. In addition to leading all Canadian drivers in wins and earnings during his 'dream season', his stakes triumphs include the Maple Leaf Trot with Lindy The Great, the Battle of Waterloo with Betterhavemymoney, a Matron Stakes win with Threepointbluechip, and Champlain Stakes with Silver Label and Adare Castle. In addition, he won three Ontario Sires Stakes Super Finals, 18 Ontario Sires Stakes Gold divisions and took the Lampman Cup as the program's leading driver for 2021. MacDonald is the regular driver for six O'Brien Award finalists – Adare Castle, Betterhavemymoney, Prohibition Legal, Silver Label, Twin B Archie, So Much More and also drove Logan Park a handful of times.

Sylvain Filion has driven 223 winners and horses to earnings in excess of \$5.2 million. A four-time winner in this category as Canada's Driver of the Year in 2012, 2013, 2015 and 2016, Filion was the regular driver for O'Brien Award finalist Voelz Delight and is the second leading money earning driver in Canada and in Ontario Sires Stakes competition.

Luc Blais and **Mark Etsell** are the finalists for the **O'Brien Award of Horsemanship** and are both first-time nominees.

In 2021, Luc Blais managed successful stables on both sides

of the border. The Quebec native, who is the private trainer for Determination, sent 44 winners postward and eclipsed \$2 million in earnings for the sixth consecutive year, of which \$1.35 million was earned in Canada where he races primarily at Woodbine Mohawk Park. In 2021, Forbidden Trade was a multiple stakes winner, posting victories in the Crawford Trot at The Meadowlands, The Earl Rowe at Georgian Downs, The Caesars Trot at Hoosier Park and The TVG Open at The Meadowlands. O'Brien finalist Donna Soprano was a winner in The Elegantimage and Simcoe Stakes at Woodbine Mohawk Park and The Del Miller at The Meadowlands. Enavant was the 2021 Potomac Pace winner at Rosecroft Raceway under Blais' conditioning. Mischievous Rose won an Ontario Sires Stakes Grassroots event.


Mark Etsell trained 21 winners and horses to more than \$767,000 in earnings in 2021. Etsell has a long-standing reputation for developing young stakes horses that compete in the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) program and this year he won an OSS Super Final with freshman filly and stable star Adare Castle, who earned more than \$486,000 and scored seven wins in nine starts. Etsell is known for his patience in developing yearlings and customizes his training and feed program for each individual horse in his stable. He also breeds some of his own horses and is stabled at 30th Sideline Training Centre.

Adare Castle won four Ontario Sires Stakes Gold divisions, the Super Final, The Peaceful Way Stakes and The Champlain at

Woodbine Mohawk Park, earning her an O'Brien Award nomination. Etsell also enjoyed a victory in the Balanced Image Trot at Hanover Raceway with Sea Can.

Prohibition Legal and **Silver Label**, two homebreds for Armstrong Breeder of the Year finalist, Millar Farms, are the nominees in the **Two-Year-Old Pacing Filly** division. **Prohibition Legal** boasted a near perfect rookie season, winning eight of nine races and earning over \$564,000. The Big Jim filly had a perfect six for six record in the Ontario Sires Stakes and scored her richest victory in the season finale Ontario Sires Stakes Super Final.

Silver Label, a daughter of Bettors Delight, was a winner of six of eight races and over \$341,000. Her stakes victories included four Ontario Sires Stakes events, and a division of the Champlain Stakes.

In the **Two-Year-Old Pacing Colt** division, **Betterhavemymoney**, another Millar Farms homebred, and **Stonebridge Helios** are the finalists. **Betterhavemymoney**, a Betterthancheddar gelding, hit the board in seven of 10 races with four wins and more than \$335,000 in earnings. The highlight of his season was a sweep of the elimination and final of Grand River Raceway's signature event, The Battle of Waterloo.

Stonebridge Helios was never worse than third in seven season starts and bankrolled over \$295,000. He posted three wins in Ontario Sires Stakes events and his richest payday came in winning a division of the Champlain Stakes.

Two ultra-consistent Bettors Delight fillies, **Scarlett Hanover** and **Voelz Delight**, will vie for divisional honours in the **Three-Year-Old Pacing Filly** division.

Scarlett Hanover hit the board in 11 of 16 races, earning over \$586,000 for her sophomore season, which included a sweep of the Jugette and a dominant victory in the Ontario Sires Stakes Super Final.

Voelz Delight scored top-three finishes in 15 of 16 races, which included the Fan Hanover, the SBOA Stakes and six Ontario Sires Stakes events, while bankrolling almost \$360,000 for her connections.

Bulldog Hanover and **Desperate Man** will compete for divisional honours in the glamor boy **Three-Year-Old Pacing Colt** division.

Bulldog Hanover enjoyed a stellar freshman season and returned as a strong sophomore, winning 10 of 15 races and over \$682,000. The Shadow Play colt's top performances came in the Somebeachsomewhere Stakes, Ontario Sires Stakes events, and put an exclamation mark on his season with a four-race win streak in stakes events at Hoosier Park.

Desperate Man captured the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup during his illustrious sophomore year that saw him earn over \$767,000. He ended his Cinderella season with an Ontario Sires Stakes Super Final victory.

Lyons Sentinel will attempt to usurp defending champion **So Much More** in the **Older Pacing Mare** category.

Lyons Sentinel scored 16 top three finishes in 19 starts for over

\$827,000 in earnings. The daughter of Captaintreacherous put together an impressive seven-race win streak that kicked off in July with the Clara Barton, and included the Lady Liberty, Roses Are Red Stakes, a sweep of the Milton Stakes and ended with the Dayton Distaff in October.

So Much More continued her dominance in the upper fillies and mares ranks at Woodbine Mohawk Park where she raced her entire 25 start season that included more than \$246,000 in earnings. She had 19 top three finishes, which included third place finishes in the Roses Are Red Stakes Final and an elimination of the Milton Stakes.

Warrawee Vital and Wheels On Fire are the Older Pacing Horse finalists.

Warrawee Vital made a seamless transition from the sophomore ranks to the Older Pacing Horse division, winning seven of 19 races and earning more than \$201,000.

Wheels On Fire scored 22 top-three finishes from 26 races and earned more than \$265,000. Seven of his 12 victories came in preferred events at Woodbine Mohawk Park and two were posted at The Meadowlands.

Adare Castle and Venerable will compete for Two-Year-Old Trotting Filly honours. Adare Castle won seven of nine races and more than \$486,000. Her stakes wins included five Ontario Sires Stakes events highlighted by a victory in the season ending OSS Super Final, a division of the Champlain Stakes and an elimination of the Peaceful Way Stakes.

Venerable enjoyed a phenomenal season for her freshman year, winning nine of 11 races, surpassing \$1.1 million in earnings, and racking up many stakes victories, including a sweep of the Peaceful Way Stakes and an impressive win in the Mohawk Million on Canadian soil.

In the **Two-Year-Old Trotting Colt** division, **Duly Resolved** and **Twin B Archie** are the finalists. **Duly Resolved** boasted an impressive 10 toptwo finishes in 12 races with \$631,000 in earnings. The son of Resolve had three Ontario Sires Stakes wins, a win in an elimination of the William Wellwood and runner-up finishes in the Wellwood, a division of the Champlain, the OSS Super Final and the Mohawk Million.

Twin B Archie had eight top-three finishes in 10 season starts and eclipsed \$285,000 in earnings while posting wins in three Ontario Sires Stakes events including the Super Final, and a division of the Champlain Stakes.

Donna Soprano and **Up And Ready** are finalists in the **Three-Year-Old Trotting Filly** division. **Donna Soprano** won an O'Brien as a 2-year-old and made a solid transition to her sophomore year with five top-two finishes in nine starts while earning more than \$384,000. She scored victories in the Delvin Miller, a division of the Simcoe Stakes and the Elegantimage Stakes.

Up And Ready boasted 12 top-three finishes in 15 starts and bankrolled more than \$361,000 with wins in two OSS events, including the Super Final, and the SBOA Stakes.

Fashion Frenzie and **Logan Park**, both sons of Archangel, will compete for **Three-Year-Old Trotting Colt** honours.

Fashion Frenzie won 50 per cent of his 12 races and almost \$525,000. Three of those victories were in OSS events, including the Super Final. He also swept the Goodtimes Stakes.

Logan Park won five of his 15 starts and \$366,000. Four of those victories were in Ontario Sires Stakes events.

In the **Older Trotting Mare** category, **Grandma Heidi** and **Power And Grace** are the finalists.

Grandma Heidi was a model of consistency during her 5-yearold campaign, recording 19 top-three finishes in 32 starts and amassing \$126,625 in earnings. The daughter of Muscle Mass raced primarily in the upper conditioned and preferred ranks at Woodbine Mohawk Park but did venture stateside for five races at The Meadowlands in the springtime.

Power And Grace was another consistent performer, hitting the board in 22 of her 29 races and earning just over \$85,000. The 6-year-old mare raced exclusively on the Ontario B Track circuit after four early races at Northfield Park.

Oney Hall and **Perfetto** are finalists in the **Older Trotting Horse** category.

Oney Hall was a winner of seven races and more than \$185,000 during his 5-year-old campaign, which saw him win four preferred events at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Perfetto is the defending O'Brien Award champion in this category, and enjoyed another stellar year, posting 18 top three finishes in 23 races, which included six wins in the preferred ranks at Woodbine Mohawk Park while bankrolling more than \$253,000 in earnings.

Ontario-based trainer **Kyle Bossence**, and Quebec-based driver **Samuel Fillion** are the finalists in the **Future Star** category.

Kyle Bossence has become a household name at Ontario's B tracks and is en route to a career year, training 68 winners from 306 starters, who have earned more than \$432,000 through December 21. He was the leading dash winning trainer at Grand River Raceway and is currently leading all trainers at The Raceway at Western Fair.

Samuel Fillion has made his presence felt at Hippodrome 3R and is en route to a career year, more than doubling his win record from 2020. He finished as the fourth leading driver at Hippodrome 3R this season and currently sits fourth in the standings at Rideau Carleton Raceway. Fillion has driven 94 winners from 683 starters, who have earned more than \$547,000.

Millar Farms and **Winbak Farm** are finalists in the **Armstrong Breeder of the Year** category.

Through Dec. 21, Millar Farms' 26 starters for 2021 posted 67 victories and eclipsed \$2 million in earnings, and include O'Brien Award finalists Prohibition Legal, Silver Label, and Betterhavemymoney.

Winbak's 251 starters scored 475 wins and amassed more than \$5.2 million in earnings. Winbak's top Canadian-sired or foaled performers were led by O'Brien Award finalist Desperate Man, and also included Bet On Becky and Camealongway.

One of the winners in the divisional categories will be awarded the Somebeachsomewhere Horse of the Year title.

Amazing Dream wraps up Down Under career with third in the Hunter Cup; now on to North America

One of the greatest mares we have even seen Down Under is heading to North America.

Amazing Dream, a 10-time Group 1 winner, will be flown to the U.S. this week to continue her racing career with Hall of Fame trainer Linda Toscano.

She leaves after finishing third in one of Australia's greatest races, the Hunter Cup, Saturday night (Feb. 5).

Amazing Dream's \$1,464,760 in earnings make her the second-richest mare in Down Under history on stakes money earned in Australia and New Zealand.

"We've decided the time is right," managing owner Gordon Banks said. "We were very happy with her Hunter Cup performance, as

those slow fractions were never going to give anyone a chance at beating (leader) King Of Swing.

"We are happy to end her Down Under racing career on a high note and at the peak of her game.

"We have high hopes for her over here and she will be staked for all the major North American open are stakes races.

"We believe she deserves to leave Down Under at her peak and with the recognition she deserves as the second highest earning mare in Down Under history (excluding Shartin N, whose earnings were primarily in North America).

"We also felt she deserves the chance to come here and be given until our stake season begins in late May to acclimate to her new home.

"Hopefully she will show harness fans here the greatness and heart of a champion that she has so spectacularly demonstrated Down Under."

Amazing Dream raced much of her career for the powerhouse All Stars barn, headed by Mark Purdon in NZ, then joined Purdon's son, Nathan, for a successful Australian stint in the middle of last year.

Just a 5-year-old, Amazing Dream has raced 48 times for 24 wins, 10 seconds and eight thirds.

"You'd have to say she's up with the very best mares we've ever seen here," champion driver Anthony Butt said. "You rarely see the girls compete so well against the boys, but she did more than that. She beat them in four of our biggest races. That's pretty special."

. . .

Champion pacer **King Of Swing's** run to retirement could take his already stellar career to the next level.

As great as the 7-year-old son of Rocknroll Hanover has been so far, he will secure genuine legend status if he can add an unprecedented third \$A1 million Miracle Mile.

King Of Swing is one of eight pacers to win two Miracle Miles, but none have been able to add a third.

"That's our next big target for sure," co-trainer and driver Luke McCarthy said. "We get to go back home and race at his favourite track again now, which is great."

King Of Swing's Menangle record is stunning, especially over a mile. He's had 19 starts at Menangle for 16 wins, two seconds and a fifth.

But over the Menangle Mile he is unbeaten in 10 starts, four of them at Group 1 level.

Saturday night, King Of Swing led throughout to win his second Hunter Cup, making him the only pacer to have won the Cup

and the Miracle Mile twice.

While retirement to stud looms large, McCarthy is adamant King Of Swing is "at least as good as ever."

"I know he had a lovely run in front, but he did that really easily. He felt fantastic all the way," he said. "I know there have been a few doubters of late, but everything I've seen of him at home and the races says he's flying. He certainly hasn't lost anything."

If McCarthy and his wife, Belinda, have their way, King Of Swing will race on beyond the Miracle Mile.

"We'd love to give him a break after that and bring him back for a couple of runs at the big Queensland (Constellations) Carnival (June/July), especially now they've boosted the stakes money," McCarthy said.

* * *

Two of Australia's best stables continued their dominance in two of Australia's biggest races last weekend.

Over in Perth, champion trainer Gary Hall Sr won a mind-blowing 12th – yes 12th – \$A450,000 Group 1 WA Pacing Cup. To win the biggest race in your own backyard 12 times is quite something else.

This time he did it with a rank outsider **Wildwest**, who paid \$91 for a \$1 bet, and snatched victory right on the line at Gloucester Park on Friday night (Feb. 4).

"It's been a great race to me, no doubt about that," Hall, Sr. said. "I didn't see this one coming. He's always had the ability Wildwest, but he's only any good on the marker pegs and when he drew wide I thought he was no hope."

Hall, Sr. admitted he only saw Wildwest in the last stride with his focus being on his aging champion Chicago Bull, who ran a mighty third, just a neck from the winner, after doing loads of grunt work.

"I really wanted 'Bully' to win it. I thought he was going to on the home bend, but he's just done too much work. He was so brave," he said. "Right on the line I saw this horse flash through near the inside and I thought 'hang on, I think that's Wildwest.' I couldn't believe it."

In a pre-arranged plan by Hall, Sr., Wildwest now leaves his stable to join the powerhouse Luke and Belinda McCarthy in NSW.

"It's so he can race on the bigger 1400m Menangle track, which will really suit him. It sounds strange given he's just won our biggest races, but he doesn't really like Gloucester Park much at all," Hall, Sr. said.

In Victoria, husband and wife, Andy and Kate Gath continued their dominance of Australia's biggest trotting race, the \$A300,000 Group 1 Great Southern Star. Like the Elitlopp and Little Brown Jug, it's a heat and final series on the same meeting.


Brilliant Majestic Son gelding **Majestuoso** gave Team Gath their fourth Great Southern Star win in the past six years and their third in a row.

"It's such a great race and to win it four times is pretty special," trainer Andy Gath said. "To have Kate driving and for Norm (Jenkin) to own him, it all comes to together to make things really special. Norm's been such a great supporter of mine for a long, long time."

Majestuoso's win was drama-packed given he was stuck in traffic in his heat and only just scraped into the eight-horse final by finishing fourth and being one of the fastest unplaced heat runners.

He whizzed to the front in the final and clocked a race record 1:54.6 mile rate for 1720m to just stave-off former brilliant juvenile Wobelee and win by a head.





Breeding can wait for Big City Pearl as she continues to surprise at Miami Valley

When Big City Pearl dashed across the wire first in back-to-back weeks at Miami Valley Raceway, trainer LeWayne Miller was just as surprised as the betting public. After all, Miller never had designs on dropping the 4-year-old trotter into the \$30,000 open handicap. However, when races don't fill, interesting things happen.

"I entered her in the class below, non-winners of \$12,000. She fit that, but they didn't go with that class," the conditioner explained. "They asked if I would put her in the open and I said yeah, just to get her a race and keep her tight. The last two starts she's really surprised us."

With two races under her belt, Big City Pearl lined up behind the Miami Valley starting gate Monday, Jan. 24 as the second-longest shot on the board with 49-1 odds. She started the season in the open handicap, managing fifth in her 2022 debut. This time, however, the Chapter Seven—Annalina mare was on her game for Miller, who steered the trotter.

"I got away in the back and she got a little bit aggressive, so I pulled her hoping I could get cover. And then she just kept marching," Miller said. "She got a little soft around the last turn. I thought she was done. But as soon as we hit the straightaway she took another gear."

Big City Pearl pushed a neck in front of Pass The Vape to take the open handicap in 1:54.3. Returning a week later, the mare scored her second consecutive in the class. Brett Miller handled the driving duties in the Jan. 31 start, where the duo were sent off at odds of 11-1. Once again, the 4-year-old won by a neck, this time over second choice Refined and Mitchell Cushing in

a time of 1:54.2.

"We were going to give her last week off, but she raced so well that we gave her another start," the trainer conceded.

Just as the move to the open handicap was not part of the plan, the strong start to the new season was not anticipated either. LeWayne Miller's brother, Daryl, purchased Big City Pearl last September with plans to breed her in 2022. She is booked to top Indiana stallion Swan For All. Her recent success may change those plans.

"I just talked to my brother the other day. I said we better put her on Bluegrass Staking. We might have to stake her up a little bit, just a few here and there," LeWayne said. "She's a well-bred mare, so she could possibly step it up. Verlin always liked her and always thought she was better than what she was doing. She just didn't have a whole lot of opportunity throughout the summer to show herself."

Developed by Verlin Yoder, the trotter captured three of nine freshman starts. At 3, Big City Pearl lined up behind the gate 23 times, winning on five occasions. Yoder entered her in the Hambletonian Oaks, where she missed the final after racing 10th in her elimination. Daryl Miller, competing under the banner of Miller101 Racing, purchased the sophomore the next month and she qualified for the new connections Oct. 9. In nine attempts racing out of the Miller stable, Big City Pearl recorded two wins, but she also missed checks three times.

"She was a little inconsistent. We were dealing with some health issues with her, but she seems like she's overcome that now," Miller said. "She seems to like the weather. I don't know if she likes the cold weather better or what. She's healthier too, so that helps."

A winner of \$56,575 at three, the trotter is off to a fast start in the new year. She has yet to miss a check this season, with a runner-up finish to go along with the pair of wins. Miller and his brother had hoped that Big City Pearl could generate some income before moving to the breeding shed. The mare banked \$36,500 in the first month of the year, and could prolong her racing career.

"We left the door open. We're not sure. It just depends on how she does," commented the trainer. "If she keeps making money, we'll keep racing her. If she tells us that she's done, we'll breed her."

Maharajah and Ready Cash dominate European sire rankings

Ready Cash continues to dominate French harness racing as sire while the same can be said about the new king in Sweden, Maharajah, who claimed his third consecutive win in the sire league.

Viking Kronos son Maharajah also dominates in more countries than Sweden — Finland, Norway, too — while it's pretty clear that Ready Cash is starting to let younger stallions conquer shares of the French market, at least regarding the new crops, even if Ready Cash still tops the list among 3-year-olds.

Ready Cash's importance for the European breeding is indubitable and in Sweden, his son Readly Express is the rookie of the year. Readly Express ranked fourth Sweden and he is the sire of the two dominant trotters in the crop born in 2017: Calgary Games and Honey Mearas.

5,000th training win for Robert Bergh


Swedish top trainer Robert Bergh reached a great milestone on Thursday (Feb. 3) afternoon as he claimed his 5,000th win as a trainer.

TALES FROM THE CURMUDGEON



with MURRAY BROWN

A conversation with the inimitable Bill "Showbiz" Popfinger

He will be 86 years old next fall. The primary item on his mind nowadays is where he will be training his stable of horses during the next off season. That was the first question he asked of me.

If one were looking for lifers in this sport of ours, Bill Popfinger will be one of those names who would appear at or near the top.

Popfinger and his older brother Frank come from the small

Western Pennsylvania town of Wexford, situated just north of Pittsburgh.

Their father was a butcher who usually had a pony or two in his backyard. The boys rode the ponies and would race against each other.

Before too long, they discovered that there was an opportunity to race these ponies for real money at the nearby Butler County Fair. You got \$5 for actually racing them and \$10 if you won the race.

While at the fair, they came upon these horses pulling carts that were known as harness horses. They would race, as did their ponies, but the stakes were for big money — a few hundred dollars.

Bill and Frank quickly decided that this was for them.

They both became grooms and rose through the ranks where they each separately assembled a few horses to race at Buffalo Raceway, where they first trained and drove their horses. That was the norm back then. Virtually all trainers were drivers as well. The days of the omnipresent catch driver were way down the road.

They remained at Buffalo for a few years, but something came up where they didn't see eye to eye with those in the race office. They decided to leave. Imagine that? Horsemen having problems with the race office.

From Buffalo they headed east to the newly opened Monticello Raceway, where Bill received his big first break. He was hired by Ben Slutsky of the famous Nevele Resort Hotel and Nevele Racing Stable to become their contract trainer/driver.

Both brothers had reasonable success at Monticello. They each had horses that graduated through the ranks and were good enough to compete on the big time — the Yonkers-Roosevelt Raceway circuit.

Bill's affiliation with the Nevele team was what resulted in his moving to Florida and setting up headquarters at Pompano Park.

Ben Slutsky and his brother Julius had winter places in South Florida and thought it would be great if they could see their horses train and race at nearby Pompano Park. Thus Billy Pop, known throughout the business as Showbiz, started a career at Pompano from its beginning.

The culmination of a great career, which according to Popfinger is nowhere near over, occurred this past July at Goshen when he was inducted into the sport's Living Hall of Fame.

Let's start with your induction to the sport's pantheon, its Living Hall of Fame. How did that affect you? I know you were nominated several times, but never quite made it until this past year.

"Of course, it was great. It's the greatest honor a person in our sport can possibly attain. I was somewhat humbled. But to be absolutely frank with you it was a bit of an anti-climax. As you mentioned, I was nominated several times. Each time, I was told that I came just short of making it. I just missed by a single vote or stuff like that. I had pretty much given up hope on getting in. Then, when I finally made it in 2020, COVID came along. The induction ceremony for 2020 had to be cancelled and I wasn't

able to be inducted until 2021. But, all good things end well and I got my ring this past July. I was very happy and honored."

Talk about some of the best horses you had a role in developing. Who was your best?

"That would undoubtedly be Lady B Fast, a horse that unfortunately time has mostly forgotten. She was a truly great trotter who raced against and was able to consistently hold her own against all of the great trotters of her generation.

"She beat Nevele Pride taking the worst of it in a free-for-all trot at Yonkers. Fresh Yankee was also in that race. I was one proud dude. Billy Popfinger from little Wexford, PA, was able to have a hand in beating two of the sport's giants — Stanley Dancer and Joe O'Brien — who were driving two of the sport's greatest trotters ever, Nevele Pride and Fresh Yankee.

Lady B Fast was remarkable in that she kept getting better. I think she had a record of around 2:07 as a 2-year-old. I thought she was okay, but just okay. At 3, she was considerably better. It was as an older mare that that she really blossomed. We shipped her to California where she won the \$75,000 American Trotting Derby. That was huge money back in those days. She won several in a row out there. But the brain trust behind her, Bob Bregman and John Cashman, decided that shipping me out there to race her was too costly, so they decided to use Eddie Wheeler. She got beat. Undoubtedly through no fault of Eddie's, but that was her only loss. The next week I was back aboard."

How about some of the others?

"There were quite a few. Some that come to mind are Happy Escort, Say Hello, Kassa Branca (who won the Woodrow Wilson), Happy Motoring, Spellbound Hanover, Shirleys Beau Crackers and Praised Dignity. I was also the first trainer to have two \$100,000 winning pacers in the same year — Say Hello and Spicy Charlie."

Let's talk about some of them.

Happy Escort — "I'm guessing that most people think of my winning the Little Brown Jug with him over heavily favored Falcon Almahurst and Flight Director was my biggest claim to fame and my best drive ever. I guess it's probably my biggest claim to fame, but it wasn't my best drive. I just happened to be in the right place at the right time and things worked out well at the Jug. I just took the shortest way around the Delaware Ohio track and things turned out for the best. My best drive came in a race that I didn't even win. We'll get to that below."

Say Hello — "He was just a real nice racehorse who had early speed. I won the Fox Stake with him when that was the most prestigious 2-year-old event in North America. He might have become a whole better if he didn't have a breathing problem which they couldn't treat near as well back then as they do now."

Spellbound Hanover — "She was just a little itty bitty filly, but no one ever told her she was too small. She earned 38 thousand short of a million dollars. She is probably better known today as the dam of Marion Marauder, who won the Hambletonian and earned more than three million dollars."

Crackers — "He was quite aptly named. Actually, I think he was named that because he exhibited his nutty and mean traits from an early stage and his owner Leon Machiz changed his name to match his personality. I had a disagreement with Mr. Machiz regarding him that resulted in my losing his horses. Machiz wanted to race him in the Lawrence B Sheppard at Yonkers. I told him that I felt that was a mistake. Crackers hit his knees and wouldn't be able to get around a half-mile track. He decided to take him there anyway and gave him to the Haughtons to train. He performed as I thought he would. He just could not handle those turns.

"He might have been the only horse I've ever had who might have been what I would describe as bad, meaning mean and miserable horse. We kept a long rope on his halter, so that he could be caught. Once you caught him, he was manageable. Never easy, but manageable. Without being caught, he was a terror. One time, we shipped him to Wolverine and he had somehow lost the rope. My people couldn't catch him for over a day. I went into his stall to try to get him. Fortunately I was wearing a sports coat, which he grabbed and ripped to shreds. I thought to myself, 'That could have been my arm.'"

Praised Dignity — "He gave me my best drive ever. I drove him in the 1984 \$2,161,000 Woodrow Wilson, which is still the richest harness race ever contested. I believe that at the time it might have been the richest race of any breed ever. Nihilator was the class of the field by far. He won the race by open lengths. I was sitting ninth past the quarter pole and followed the speed the entire mile hoping that some of them would die off. They did and I managed to get up for second. His share of the purse was over half a million dollars, considerably more than any other race that I ever even won. Praised Dignity finished that season with earnings of over a million dollars."

Let's talk about the Popfinger brothers, you and brother Frank. Who was the better horseman?

"Undoubtedly me. Blush. But Frank is smarter. He was smart enough to marry a rich wife. He just celebrated his 90th birthday this past summer. He is still smarter. I still have to work to make a living, while Frank continues to enjoy the good life."

Speaking of working. You are 85. You are still one of the hardest workers in the game. You are and have always been among the first to get to the track in the morning. You are at the track every time one of your horses races. Will you ever stop?

"What else do you expect me to do, stay home and fight with my wife each morning, especially when I can never win an argument? That's not for me, nor is it the type of person I am. I've always been, make that I've always needed to be, active. I'm a busy guy. I love sports and participating in them. The day I stop being active will probably be when they bury me. Don't get me wrong. I've certainly slowed down somewhat. There was a time where I had as many as 50 horses in my stable. Now I'm down to four, all of which I train and own. In addition to not driving for quite some time, I don't even go warm up miles with my racehorses anymore. I don't believe today's horses need them or

maybe I'm just getting a little lazy. I think that the post parade and scoring them down, which allows them a chance to empty out is enough."

Who are the best horses that you've ever seen?

"I'm not really much in tune to today's horses enough, but going back to my glory years, I'd have to include Adios Butler, Bret Hanover, Albatross, Niatross and Nihilator in any conversation."

How about trotters?

"I would guess that Mack Lobell and Moni Maker would have to be in that discussion."

What about drivers?

"You'd have to say that considering all that he has done John Campbell would have to be the best ever. All you'd have to do is look at the record book. Back in my time, Joe O'Brien, Carmine Abbatiello, George Sholty, Del Insko and Herve Filion would have to be in the discussion. Don't let anybody ever tell you that weight isn't a big factor in making great drivers. Look at all those guys I mentioned. All of them fit into a given physical prototype. Pretty much the same applies to all of today's better drivers. I think that I was a fairly decent driver myself. But I was always at a disadvantage. I weighed about 170-180. I was always giving away about 30 or 40 pounds to the guys I was racing against, plus the wind resistance created by my height."

How about owners?

"I've had more than my share of excellent ones. I've always said that being a successful horse trainer isn't all that difficult. The two major requirements are common sense and getting good sponsors in terms of good owners. I've been very lucky with the latter, I'm not all that certain about the former. I've had some great owners including, but not limited to, Bill Mulligan, the Slutsky family, Bob Suslow, Leon Machiz, Jim Thomas, Bob Bregman and Irving Cohen."

Aside from not wanting to fight with your wife in the morning, you've now been married to Betty for 59 years. Not too many have reached that goal.

"You know they say that absence makes the heart grow fonder. I've been absent my share of the time. In all seriousness, it's been a great run. We met at Batavia Downs where she was making a trophy presentation. She was a cheerleader for the New York Giants at the time. That was before I went to work for Uncle Sam in the United States Army for two years. When I got back, I looked her up. We've raised five great kids, make that, she's raised five great kids. I've been mostly an onlooker. We have 11 grandchildren and now we have two great grandchildren."

Is there anything that you are particularly proud of in a lifetime spent training and racing horses?

"If it came down to just one thing, it would be that in all the years I've spent in the sport, I've never had a single horse come up positive to anything. I like to believe that I've lived by and played by the rules."

Any anecdotes that you'd care to share?

"It may have happened elsewhere, but I doubt it. Many years ago, Frank and I finished a race in a dead heat at Roosevelt. Two brothers in a dead heat at the top track in the country. Imagine that!

"Another thing that I'm guessing maybe only a guy like Herve might have done is that I once won races at three separate pari-mutuel racetracks in a single day. I won a race at Freehold in the afternoon, drove to Yonkers and won a race there and then drove to Monticello and won there. On my way to Monticello I got a speeding ticket in Chester, NY. Russ Carpenter who owned horses and was the breeder of Adios Butler, was the mayor of Chester. He took care of the speeding ticket."

You are as well known by your nickname Showbiz as you are by your given name. You came by the name honestly by actually starring in a movie.

"I don't know about 'starring.' They were making the movie Easy Money here in Florida. Part of it took place here at Pompano Park, which in the movie they called Hoover Downs. Rodney Dangerfield and Joe Pesci were the stars. They had me driving a horse that was supposed to win. It showed me putting the brakes to it. It was a lot of fun making the movie. Best of all, I got paid for my role. You can watch the scenes I'm in on YouTube."

What does the future bode for Showbiz?

"Unless something should change drastically, I'll just keep on, keeping on. When Tioga Downs opens, I'll go and spend the racing season there. It's one of the few tracks that still has its own stable area which makes it so much easier for the horsemen, especially an old guy like me. Then I don't know. With Pompano about to close, I really don't know what I'll do next winter. I asked you when we first spoke to find me a place where I can train. You haven't given me an answer yet."

Too soon old...

Although he's largely forgotten today, Tar Heel played a very prominent role in my early days as a breeder.

Tar Heel was a son of Billy Direct, a great pacer who won everything and set several world records. He was a big, black horse for whom the term "fast gaited" was created. In his day, most races were single file affairs to the ¾ pole, and then the real race would happen. Billy Direct was so powerful that he could go to the front anytime Rupe Parker felt like it and laugh his way home.

He was foaled in 1934, and at 4 he set a world record of 1:55 against the fence. Although the last recorded time trial of the present day was Cash Hall's 1:51.1 at Delaware in 2006, in the early days they were *de rigueur*, and there were literally hundreds of them during the fall race meeting at The Red Mile.

For those uninitiated on the subject, a time trial was a fairly true test of a horse's speed and courage. As opposed to an actual race, where there are other horses in front at some point of the race, in a time trial the horse trialing was looking down two long, open stretches. It could be intimidating to more than a few otherwise good racehorses.

Conforming to my belief, and the great Federico Tesio's, that 2-year-old brilliance is the foreshadowing of a stallion's future sire potential, Billy Direct was a winner at 2, although you had

to go back and check the results of the fairs to find his name. I particularly was struck by seeing his name as the winner of a 2-year-old race at Mineral Point, WI. That was the track on which Volo Song, one of the greatest trotters who ever wore a bridle, suffered his fatal breakdown from the bad track conditions.

Billy Direct was the first pacer to stand at Hanover Shoe Farms. He was one of two potentially foundation horses to die there early. The other was Spencer Scott, who lived only long enough to sire Rodney, the greatest trotting sire never to sire a Hambletonian winner.

Their deaths had nothing to do with mismanagement, just part of the risks inherent in every living creature, including these beautiful animals who give our lives meaning.

Back to Tar Heel, he was the best racing son of Billy Direct. He raced for the powerful stable of Will Reynolds, trained and driven by another immortal, Delvin Miller. The various branches of the Reynold's family made indelible marks in American industry both in the tobacco and metal businesses, as well as our little world.

Tar Heel was one of two great colt pacers Delvin developed and raced for Mr. Reynolds. The other was Solicitor, destined, like Delvin himself, to play a pivotal role in my life.

The classic pacing stake of the day was the Little Brown Jug. In their year, Tar Heel won it and Solicitor was second to him. In those days of heat racing, it could take all afternoon, and sometimes longer, before you had a winner. The year Keystoner finally won it for Frank Ervin, it had gotten dark before they held the final, decisive heat. There were no lights on the Delaware track in those days, so they got cars to park all the way around the track with their headlights on.

Keystoner emerged from the black of night as the winner, but I sometimes wondered, somewhat whimsically, if the experience hadn't affected his personality, because he turned into a seriously vicious horse after he went to the stud at Castleton.

Will Reynolds passed away during Tar Heel and Solicitor's 3-year-old seasons, and all the Reynolds horses were consigned to the Harrisburg sale that fall. The two prizes were the two great colt pacers.



Lawrence Sheppard, showing the foresight that made Hanover the greatest farm in our sport, wanted a top pacing stallion. He couldn't decide which of the two, Tar Heel and Solicitor, he liked the best, so he bought both of them.

Solicitor went for \$100,000, and Tar Heel for \$125,000. Steve Jones was good enough to enlighten me that Walter Michaels was the underbidder on Tar Heel. Michaels was a big player in his day, although, as John Gaines, liked to say, somewhat price conscious. He once came home from a mixed sale with six stallions, all bought for less than \$10,000, with the intention of standing them at his Bonnie Brae Farm, in Ohio.

Michaels was the president of the USTA at one point, and he changed the whole course of our sport for the better when Hal Jones, his farm manager, introduced artificial insemination with his great stallion, Gene Abbe.

Tar Heel quickly became a leading sire, both of racehorses and broodmares. They were the perfect match for Adios. That was the cross, Adios on Brenna Hanover, who was by Tar Heel, that produced Bret Hanover. Although Bret is a footnote today, he was the only pacer ever to be voted Horse Of The Year at 2, 3, and 4.

The Shoe Farms naturally wanted a son of Tar Heel to take over from his sire when the time came. Alas, that never happened. In fact, with only one crazy exception, Tar Heel never sired a top sire.

The one exception should have involved me, but I wasn't smart enough.

In 1963, as I was just getting Lana Lobell Farms underway, Lyss Steele approached me at the Harrisburg sale. There was a

3-year-old pacing colt named Steady Beau selling that morning in the mixed sale, and Lyss, short for Ulysses C. Steele, had four other breeders who wanted to buy the colt and stand him with me.

Steele had bred Steady Beau, who was by Tar Heel, out of Steady Beat by Adios. Billy Haughton had raced him both years, and as a 2-year-old he had won the biggest race of the day for 2-year-old pacers. At 3, he did absolutely nothing.

In those days the horses to be sold were lined up along one wall of the Fair Show arena, waiting their turn in the ring. I dashed over to the lineup and checked out Steady Beau. He was standing with all four feet in what looked at first glance like the same hole, ears laid back, and a bad haircoat. He made me think of a horse left out in a bad storm, and just trying to survive.

So I, who since have come to realize how important Steady Beau's stakes wins at 2 were, promptly turned him down.

So a guy from Tennessee, John Colvin, bought Steady Beau for \$25,000. He took him home, and wrote ads that started with, "My sermon today..." And from that humble beginning, Steady Beau sired, among other nice horses, Steady Star, who became the fastest standardbred of all time when he time trialed in 1:52 at Lexington.

As the Pennsylvania Dutch say; Too soon old, too late smart.

Inside the mind of an unconventional breeder

Referring to myself as a breeder is a stretch. With one or two trotting broodmares, you could refer to me as a dabbler or, as many prefer, a delusional dolt. Nevertheless, I find the breeding section of our sport endlessly intriguing. Every foal that struggles to stand on wobbly legs is a step on a multi-year adventure that leads to those terrifying few minutes in the auction ring.

My preference is to sell the foal as a yearling, but an advantage of my small corner of the breeding world is that I can take the yearling home from the auction and head for the racetrack. Unlike commercial farms or professional breeders, the fallback position is comforting. A profit in the sales ring is my goal, but not selling is not the end of the story.

Choosing a sire for my broodmare is an exciting part of the cycle. I enjoy rolling the dice with stallions slightly off the grid. Of course, statistics support the big-name sires who send yearlings to the sales ring and eventually the racetracks. But I always wonder how many stallions come and go that do not have the cache, connections, or syndication. Apples-to-apples scenarios are challenging to make with stallions.

The window of opportunity for a new stallion is fleeting. It is an open question how the top titans in the stallion game would fare if they only got fifteen marginal mares in their first crop and a dozen in their second crop. Some weird empathy for underdog sires often finds me stallion shopping in odd places. These outlier purchases may not be wise, but they give me a warm fuzzy feeling, like buying a new barbeque grill from a Main Street hardware store instead of a Home Depot.

Some logic is involved in my choice. I make a case for each sire, admittedly a case that may not hold up under scrutiny by an expert. Great stallions are great for commercial and competitive reasons. Buyers pay jaw-dropping prices for a commercially raised yearling from top-tier stallions with deep pedigrees. Stallions with small books of mares rarely sell high. Yearlings from iffy stallions cosigned at the end of a catalog will pay the price. The breeding marketplace is what it is, and in 2021, it was terrific.

Looking back at the dozen or so stallions I have booked in my pseudo career as a breeder reveals quite the eclectic bunch. Off the top of my head, stallions in three different states, a very old stallion, first crop stallions, a very small-statured stallion, an Internet stallion breeding, a donated stallion breeding, a stallion still racing, a charity for resale breeding, a resold stallion share, a ridiculously inexpensive stallion, and the most expensive stallion in the state.

"Book Full and Closed" has never been a problem for me. Such are my chops as a breeder that the notice "Book Full and Closed" usually appears before I knew the book was open or that there even was a book published. Stallion syndication deals are not on my table because multiple breedings do not hold much value for a person with one broodmare who operates year to year.

In the long run, decisions to open the barn door to second-tier or questionable sires are probably recipes for disaster. Mercifully, a couple of foals sold decently, and most that did not sell for what I felt was market value raced decently. My only disasters were a barren season and a foal that died.

For certain personalities, coloring outside the breeding lines has a place in the breeding market. Taking a bit of a wild swing at a sire when you have one nicely bred trotter in the barn feels liberating, sort of like backing a long shot in a horserace. They might not come in, but when they do, it's extraordinary.

My weird little world of stallion roulette has provided me with pleasure. For me, the racehorse breeding process is a nice ride. After the stallion selection, the pregnancy, and the birth, raising baby racehorses is as much fun as racing. My visits to the growing baby on the beautiful farm where my mare lives are enjoyable. Following the yearling through the consignment and selling process is exciting. Watching a yearling that you sold succeed on the racetrack is fulfilling, and if you had success with a sire that others overlooked, it adds a little extra spice.

A quick note for those who struggle to sell seats on the breeding bus - advertising your stallion works for some of us quirky customers. We check out the possibilities and enjoy sniffing around, pretending to unlock the mystery of producing an outstanding horse by finding a sire that defies the odds.

Last month, I noticed several new trotting sires heading for stud duty. Honestly, I never heard the names of some of these horses until they appeared on a website notice, advertisement, or stallion listing. I noticed some French trotters are siring American trotters. There is also a sire with a Swedish background. I noted a warhorse with an iffy pedigree that an owner wanted to give a shot at breeding. They all sound sort of cool to me, and they are all in play.

When it's time to get down to stallion shopping, and for me, that's a few weeks before my mare foals, the big ships will have sailed. The cream of the stallion herd will be full and closed. No problem, second and third-tier sires will be available for those of us who play in the peanut gallery.


Science, genetics, market forces, buyer preferences, statistics, and data go into selecting a stallion. For a few of us, karma and hunches are also in play.


Nova Scotia Harness Racing Industry Association launches website
