Pennsylvania situation must be a wake-up call

In these uncertain times, the only certainty is that no one can ever take away the money racing earns from pari-mutuel handle.

The enemy in Pennsylvania is governor Tom Wolf. It is also complacency.

In the wake of Wolf's stunning announcement that he was going to strip about 80 per cent of the money from slots revenues that went into Pennsylvania's Race Horse Development Trust Fund (RHDTF) (full story here), there's never been a better time for the harness racing industry to look at itself in the mirror. Wolf's attempts to take that much money out of the fund would be devastating to both the standardbred and thoroughbred games in the state and put their survival at risk.

That wouldn't be the case if harness racing offered a betting product that was appealing. It's not.

First it was Ontario, where the government killed the Slots at Racetrack Program in 2013. The sport was fortunate that the government came to understand the harm that it had caused to the industry and came forward with subsidies to support racing. Now it is Pennsylvania.

At the end of the day, Wolf may not get everything that he wants. The industry will fight back between now and July 1, when Wolf's 2020-2021 budget must be finalized. It will make familiar arguments, about the economic impact the sport has on the state, about the jobs it creates, about how the industry was told that the money was being put into a trust and could not be touched by the government ever again. These are smart and sound strategies.

Wolf will undoubtedly feel some pressure. The guess here is that the fund will be raided, but for an amount less than the \$204 million Wolf is going after. But for how much? There is no way Wolf is going to walk out of this empty handed, especially after he has promised to use the money to help residents afford the costs of college. Yes, the legislature will have its say before a final budget is pushed through, but how many politicians are going to fight for racing when the governor has said this money is needed so that poor little Johnny from Johnstown can afford to go to college?

And who will be next? New York? Delaware? To believe that harness racing's take from casinos is here forever is naive, foolish and damaging. The slot money is tenuous.

That means the sport can't continue to sit around and do nothing while feasting on a slots gravy train that has an expiration date. Or it can put all its energies into efforts to revitalize what was once the backbone of the industry — wagering.

In these uncertain times, the only certainty is that no one can ever take away the money racing earns from pari-mutuel handle. To grow the handle means less reliance on slot revenues. Less reliance on slot revenues means less fear about the future. Harness racing has to do everything it can to be self-sustaining. It must wake up and realize that this

may be its last chance to reinvent itself and create a wagering product that is far more appealing than the one now presented.

The track owners aren't going to do that. The three harness tracks in Pennsylvania are each owned by casino companies and it's no secret that they have no incentive to see to it that harness racing grows. In fact, they'd probably be thrilled if the sport went away, ending what they undoubtedly see as a needless burden.

That means the responsibility falls on those whose livelihoods depend on a healthy sport in Pennsylvania, the owners, breeders, trainers and drivers.

What they shouldn't do is worry about marketing. Fix the sport first, then market. Marketing is all about selling something and harness racing won't have much success selling a wagering product that is so unappealing.

There are no magic bullets and no one is saying this will be easy, but the horsemen must demand massive changes, starting with a significant cut in the takeout.

Of the three Pennsylvania tracks, The Meadows has the best rates, from 17 per cent on win, place and show to 25 per cent on trifectas and superfectas. Harrah's Philadelphia offers Pick 4s at a reasonable 15 per cent, but charges 30 per cent on trifectas and 32 per cent on superfectas. At Pocono Downs, the bite ranges from 19 per cent on win, place and show up to 30 per cent on tris and supers.

The numbers may be all over the place, but they all tell the same story, that the takeout is exorbitant and puts racing at a huge disadvantage versus other forms of gambling. The same company, Harrah's, that takes 32 per cent on tris and supers, has a 10.27 per cent takeout rate on its slots. Harrah's knows that if it hit the slot player with a 32 per cent bite

that betting on the machines would plummet and revenue would fall dramatically.

It may be true that the tracks set the takeout rates, but the horsemen can flex their muscles and demand changes. Since so little is now wagered on the races in Pennsylvania, the casino owners probably don't care one way or the other what the takeout is. So, insist that it drops to something comparable to what they take with the slots, something like 10 per cent or 11 per cent. You may say that will never happen or work, but why not? And isn't the alternative a status quo that is leading this sport nowhere?

There's more that can be done.

Monmouth Park has entered into an agreement with the Australian firm BetMakers to offer fixed odds wagering on their 2020 meet. Will it help? Who knows? But fixed odds wagering is a huge hit in Australia and is seen as one of the main reasons why purses have doubled there over the past seven to 10 years. Harness racing needs to try this.

How about offering free past performances online for all U.S. harness races?

Or having shorter meets, which would mean larger fields,

better quality and a better betting product at tracks when they are racing and not facing so much competition. The owners may not want to hear it, but the sport would be better off if there were a contraction in the number of racing dates.

What about tracks that are a half-mile or five-eighths in circumference being rebuilt as one-mile tracks? Clearly, that is what bettors prefer.

Those are places to start. Surely, there are other good ideas out there. No one is saying this is going to be easy. But the sport needs to do something. It's time to stop sitting around. It's time to be bold. Change has to happen.

Interest in Mohawk Million heating up

The deadline is approaching rapidly to reserve a spot in the new million-dollar race at Woodbine Mohawk Park. Owner John Fielding is one of the owners that has already signed his purchase agreement.

John Fielding is one of several of the industry's most prominent owners that have submitted for a slot in the new Mohawk Million.

The deadline to enter for a slot in the inaugural Mohawk Million at Woodbine Mohawk Park is approaching and several of the industry's most prominent owners have submitted for a slot.

"From the moment I learned of the Mohawk Million, I was immediately interested in participating," said award-winning owner John Fielding, who signed his purchase agreement on Wednesday. "The Mohawk Million has the potential to make an impact in many areas of our sport and I'm hopeful this will be the start of a great new event."

A payment of \$55,000 (USD) is due Feb. 18, 2020 to be entered for one of nine slots in the

Mohawk Million for two-year-old trotters. The owners who receive the slots in the Mohawk Million will then be required to submit a \$55,000 payment by June 1, 2020.

If more than nine slots are purchased by the deadline, Mohawk Million slots will be determined by draw. The owners who are not selected in the draw for a slot in the 2020 event will receive first opportunity to purchase a slot in the 2021 event.

To help media and horsepeople fully understand the details of participating in the Mohawk Million, Woodbine Entertainment has provided answers to the questions below.

WHAT IS THE PROCESS FOR OBTAINING A SLOT IN THE MOHAWK MILLION?

A purchase contract (available here) and payment of \$55,000 must be submitted to Woodbine Entertainment by Feb. 18, 2020 to be entered for one of nine slots in the Mohawk Million. Following the deadline, one of three scenarios will take place:



- 1. If fewer than nine slots are sold, the race will be cancelled.
- 2. If exactly nine slots are sold, each purchaser will receive a slot in the race.
- 3. If more than nine slots are purchased, a live-streamed draw will take place to determine the recipients of the slots.

HOW WOULD THE MOHAWK MILLION "SLOT DRAW" WORK IF MORE THAN NINE ENTRIES ARE RECEIVED?

All the purchase contracts received will be entered in a live-streamed draw with nine contracts pulled to determine the slot recipients. Those outdrawn for a slot in the 2020 Mohawk Million will receive the first right of refusal to purchase a slot in the 2021 Mohawk Million.

What have we done in Pennsylvania to help ourselves?

This week, governor Tom Wolf of Pennsylvania came out with his earth shattering (to the equine industry) plan to divert more than \$200 million destined for purses and breeders' awards to education for people in need.

Governor Wolf has put us in a situation which isn't all that easy to defend.

He says that the money will be better spent on education rather than on purses for horse racing.

Why is this an either/or situation?

Why does the funding for education have to come from an industry which in fact has a great history as a significant part of agriculture and land preservation in the Commonwealth?

To the best of my knowledge, agriculture is still and has been for the longest of times the number one industry in the state.

Why not pick on someone else, like the filthy rich casino industry for example?

I'll tell you why. It's because we are likely the most vulnerable.

But as with most situations, there are at least two and possibly more issues involved.

What have we as an industry done to help ourselves?

It's like William Shakespeare said in Julius Caesar "The fault dear Brutus is not in our stars, but in ourselves, that we are underlings."

We — as do most people — have a tendency to place the blame elsewhere.

Unfortunately, a great deal of the blame for our situation rests on ourselves — all of us.

It's not necessarily because we have done wrong.

But what have we done to preserve our lot?

Harness Racing Update

What have we done to let the populace know who we are and what benefits we bring to the Commonwealth?

Through our lobbyists and sometimes a few in the upper echelons, we attempt to educate and influence our state representatives.

But what do we do to educate the people who these representatives are responsible to — the voters?

My answer would be pretty close to nothing.

Sure there are a few folks such as the Wilder family who put their hearts and souls into it and do just about everything they possibly can to help the business upon which their livelihood is dependent. But for the majority of us, myself included, we don't do very much.

What have we done to bring people to the racetrack?

If people do not go to the racetracks, they will not become fans. It's as simple as that.

We cannot have a horse-loving fan base without people seeing our horses and watching them race, preferably in person.

How much of the proceeds of the golden calf that was given to us have we reinvested to the sport's benefit?

I would say very little.

Whenever the subject of investing a given percentage of the purses for the promotion of the sport comes up, the various horsemen's associations are opposed.

Heck, our guiding body refuses to even put the question on a proposal to its membership.

The horsemen say promoting racing is not their job, it's the job and responsibility of the racetracks. In a perfect world that might be the case. This situation is far from perfect.

Overwhelmingly, the racetracks do not even want us. The sooner they get rid of us, the better. We are merely a necessary evil to the casino interests.

We were useful in helping them achieve their existence. But, our time, as far as they are concerned, has come and gone.

Why is Pennsylvania racing, particularly at Pocono Downs and Chester, often viewed both from within and outside of the industry as places where the crooks in the business go to race, when they cannot go anywhere else?

This may not be true, but it is accepted as such by many.

I cannot blame the horsemen for this, but why are we so tolerant of Pennsylvania's huge takeout? It is a unbelievably strong disincentive for people to go to or wager on our product. Even many of the fans that we now have refuse to

bet in Pennsylvania because of the onerous takeouts.

For this, I blame mostly the commission for tolerating these excessive takeouts and to a lesser degree the horsemen for not attempting to do something about it.

The cynic in me says that it is one of the many ways that the casino folks use to show the legislators that racing is a failure in Pennsylvania — existing on welfare that could be put to better use elsewhere.

If governor Wolf's proposal — which has the potential to also be quickly accepted by other states — is passed, we may be doomed.

Will we as horsemen do something meaningful to prevent it happening?

The optimist in me says I hope so.

The pessimist says, I fear not.

Propulsion voted Horse of the Year in Sweden for 2019

American-bred **Propulsion** (Muscle Hill—Danae) was one of four nominees when Swedish Horse Of the Year awards were held in Stockholm on Friday night. After a great year where the now 9-year-old stallion won titles in \$415,000 Åby Stora Pris, \$332,000 Olympiatravet, \$187,000 Norrbottens Stora Pris and \$415,000 Masters Final, Propulsion got most of the votes in the Horse of the Year race.

Propulsion's trainer **Daniel Redén** received the award for best trainer in Sweden in 2019 while **Örjan Kihlström** got the award for best driver.

Swedish-bred **Readly Express** (Ready Cash) won the title among the older trotters born in Sweden and **Activated** (Jocose) was named Mare Of the Year.

Derby winner **Attraversiamo** (Kiss Francais), trained by Svante Båth was best among the 4-year-olds and Kriteriet winner **Power** (Googoo Gaagaa), trained and driven by Robert Bergh, received the award for best 3-year-old.

Solvalla arranged V75-finals during the race card on Saturday afternoon and in \$62,500 Gold division, Finnish star **Elian Web** (Like A Prayer) took a safe wire-to-wire win paired with Jorma Kontio in mile rate of 1:56.3 over 1.3 miles. It's too early to speak about Elitloppet in May, but there's no doubt that Elian Web is a big hope for the fans from Finland this year. Elian Web defeated Propulsion at Bergsåker earlier this winter and will most likely be aimed for the Elitloppet at Solvalla in May.

Field set for \$385,700 Prix de France

Today (Feb. 9) is the day when the second out of the three big Grand Prix races during Paris winter meeting are held. Traditionally, two weeks after the Prix d'Amérique, the \$385,700 Prix de France over 1.3 miles is contested in Paris.

This year will pretty much be a shorter version of this year's Prix d'Amérique. Sixteen trotters will gather behind the gate this afternoon and 13 of them were in the big race two

weeks ago, among them the top trio (Face Time Bourbon, Davidson du Pont and Belina Josselyn).

Prix d'Amérique winner Face Time Bourbon will have to overcome a difficult post position in Prix de France. Björn Goop and trainer Sébastien Guarato were certainly not very happy when the draw on Thursday showed number 8 for the 5-year-old Ready Cash son.

Jean-Michel Bazire's top duo Davidson du Pont (4) and Belina Josselyn (5) will draw much attention from the bettors



Not a single Horse of the Year in the 21st century has taken a step on overseas soil. Will that end anytime soon? Moni Maker, the last horse to step overseas and be Horse of the Year, is also the last to repeat at HOY (1998 and 1999). Can anyone go back to back-or win it twice?

No driver since John Campbell has won the Hambletonian back to back since 1988 (Mack Lobell in 1987and Armbro Goal in 1988).

* * *

No pacing colt since 2003 has won the Triple Crown the longest ever drought for the pacers capturing the Cane, Messenger and Little Brown Jug. No Pan Intended was the last to turn the trick in 2003.

* * *

It's been 48 years since a conditioner has twice sent out a Triple Crown winner. Stanley Dancer last did it in 1968, 1970 and 1972. Can Paula Wellwood, Rick Zeron, Blair Burgess, Ivan Sugg or Ben Wallace do it again?

* * *

It's been 39 years since Fan Hanover became the only

female to take the Little Brown Jug (1981).

* * *

It's been 60 years since Countess Adios took the Cane and the Messenger of 1960. No filly has won either since.

* * *

It's been nine years since See You At Peelers beat the boys in the Rooney valued at \$307,734 in 2011. Can a pacing filly beat the boys for a bigger pot anytime soon?

* * *

It's been 55 years since a horse won 35 straight — Bret Hanover to start his career in 1964-1965.

* * *

It's been 30 years since a pacing colt was named HOY with the same driver/trainer. Ray Remmen in 1990 with Beach Towel

* * *

It's been 20 years since a 20-year-old won a Breeders Crown — the youngest to ever do so. Popcorn Penny, guided by Ryan Anderson, won the sophomore pacing filly Crown.

It's been 45 years since the richest race ever held was won by a female. Silk Stockings won the \$230,521 Monticello OTB Classic I. Note, six weeks later, the Hambletonian went for slightly more (\$232,192) and a colt won - Bonefish.

- Most Happy Fella won the Triple Crown, making trainer Stanley Dancer the first to win it twice and the first to win it with both a trotter (Nevele Pride, 1968) and a pacer. No other trainer has duplicated this feat since.
 - 35,465 horses started that year.
 - John Campbell turned 15, and Bill O'Donnell turned 22.
- They raced for \$89,280,537 in total purses, an all-time high.
- The betting leaders by state were: New York (\$843,711,053); Illinois (\$262,587,645); Pennsylvania (\$161,272,223) and New Jersey (\$88,009,764).
- Fresh Yankee was in the midst of her 56 straight races finishing 1-2-during her career. In 1970, she went postward 31 times with 20 wins and 11 seconds.
- The HOY ballot looked like this: Fresh Yankee 110, Most Happy Fella 49, Timothy T 29, Albatross 10, Columbia George 8, Fulla Napoleon 1
 - 1970 marked the 99th year of the Grand Circuit
- Albatross, the top 2YO in a landslide, banked \$71,031 and was readying for his 1971-1972 HOY campaigns.
- Une De Mai ended 1970 as the all-time leader at \$1,045,800 with the pacing side led by Cardigan Bay at

\$1,000,837.

• Steady Star time trialed in 1:54 as a 3YO. The following year he would set the all-time mark of 1:52 at age 4.

For the third time, the Jug went for six figures (\$100,110).

- No one born in 1970 or later has made it to the Hall Of Fame until this year, when Tim Tetrick (born in 1981) was voted in.
 - The Yonkers Trot was still called the Yonkers Futurity.
- Grandpa Jim was in the middle year of taking three straight Maple Leaf Trots.
- Herve Filion led the way in earnings at \$1,647,837, with Del Insko next at \$1,330,737.
- The top six money-winning drivers in 1970 were the same six as in 1969: John Chapman 6-6, Del Insko 1-2, Carmine Abbatiello 4-4, Stanley Dancer 5-2, Billy Haughton 3-3, Herve Filion 2-1. Filion led in victories at 486 to 295 for Carmine Abbatiello.

Twenty-five-year-old Alesha Binkley was born to race. Coming from a family involved in harness racing, it was not a surprise their daughter would follow in their footsteps.

Born in Kentucky, Binkley relocated to Indiana and sought employment at Hoosier Park Racetrack when she was 19-years-old.

"The very first person I worked for was Judi Lundsford. I look up to her so much for she taught me a lot. Presently I work for Trent Stohler and have been with him for six years. Trent really has taught me everything I know and is a great mentor."

In didn't take Binkley long before she moved up the ladder in the Stohler Stable, from a groom, to second trainer, and now a driver.

"I train and drive but my heart is the happiest when I groom for I love working one-on-one with this magnificent animal," Binkley said.

"I love it all — training, driving and grooming the horse, but I discovered driving is a real passion for me. It's my way of showing my 3-year-old daughter, Maevyn, that females in the sport can do anything they set their minds to.

"Besides Lundsford, I owe Trent so much. If it weren't for him I probably wouldn't be driving. I was winter training with him in South Florida. I was on a mare named Astarisontheway. After finishing the mile Trent said, 'You are sitting behind your Ladies Pace horse.' I thought he was joking, but he wasn't.

"I can't thank Trent enough. He's always giving me constructive criticism for he wants me to do my very best and be the best I can. He never treats me differently because I'm a woman.

"Now I drive almost every Saturday night at Northfield Park in the Billings Amateur race. I love driving for I feel so relaxed and content on the racetrack. I never thought I would enjoy driving as much as I do. I love crossing the wire first, but also training and feeling my horses respond differently to different things. I hardly ever carry a whip when I train. I like to hand drive for I feel like they respond better that way and keeps them happy."

Presently, Binkley operates a stable of 18 horses for Stohler at the Virgil Morgan Jr. Training Center in Ashville, OH.

"In about a week I should have eight more horses. Trent is sending some horses from Florida and two are coming from New Zealand. We are currently racing at Miami Valley, Northfield Park and The Meadows."

As far as getting attached to the horses or having a favorite, Binkley said she gets way too attached.

"I put my heart and soul into each of them. I feel like many people in the business treat horses like machines. They're not. They're animals, so love the animal first, and then the sport."

Along with the gratification comes the pain of losing one in a claiming race. Binkley recently experienced this first hand.

"The best horse I've owned is a mare named Queen Ann M. I claimed her for \$5,000 and she made almost \$50,000 last year. She gives me 100 per cent every time she steps on the track — even if she's not feeling 100 per cent.

"Queen got claimed from me last summer and I made a huge profit. Everyone told me 'Take the money and run.' My daughter Maeyvn and I cried and were heartbroken. I had to get her back and waited it out for one month. It felt like an eternity but she's back home with us and she's not going anywhere this time. The only time she will leave again will be to become a momma."

Queen is not the only horse Binkley is attached to.

"I love them all and it's hard to pick a favorite. Besides Queen, I have a fat little trotter I drive in The Billings Amateur named Body Of Work. He has the best personality and loves my daughter and he's always happy to see you when you walk in the barn. Another is Captain Velocity. He's a big, beautiful Somebeachsomewhere and loves getting attention."

Harness racing needs fresh, young blood and Alesha Binkley is just that.

"Maybe a little something. I called a friend, Richie Schwarzer. We go way back. We started our first year together, and now he heads our product development marketing."

"Is Richie a racing fan?"

"No, he grew up in Utah, not a harness racing hotbed. Anyway, I explained your sport, your lack of growth, even selling stallions. Then I asked him for advice."

I opened my hands, "Nobody does cool like Trey."

"The next suggestion he passed along is my favorite. He said to find a higher purpose behind the product or service. If you do, you will come from a genuine place. Higher purposes, such as supporting a charity, will make it easier to find people to invest in a difficult product or service."

I did a little TomTom rift on the steering wheel and shouted, "Dude, that is one of my ideas. I've mentioned this to you. If we had some owners with deep pockets, you know, the people who could not get rid of all their money if they tried, it would be awesome if they raced their horses for charities, homeless people, or sick people. It would make buying horses, owning horses, and racing horses more fun. Owning a stable of horses could be a new way to give to charity. One famous, wealthy person involved in this sport for charity could be a tide that raises all the boats."

He went on, "Calm down, here is the last idea Richie sent me.Always tell stories. Focus more on stories. Relating stories always drives higher engagement. Tell stories about common characteristics or aspirations the customers have about some successful role models or peers they might know."



New betting menu yields big payoffs at Big M

A new post time of 6:55 p.m. and new betting choices highlighted the action at the Meadowlands Friday night, and despite no horse paying off at double-digit odds through the first nine races, the payoffs for the 20-cent Pick-5, 20-cent Pick-6 and Early 50-cent Pick-4 were all extremely attractive.

The Pick-5, which saw its base bet decrease from 50 cents, saw a typical pool of \$55,082, which is more than double the wager's \$25,000 guarantee. But with bettors "spreading" their tickets further, the resulting payoff of \$1,335.10 was superb given that the odds of the winners during the sequence were 4-1, 9-2, 3-2, 8-5 and 6-1. The horses in the third and fourth legs were the post-time favorites.

The Pick-6, which will no doubt offer attractive carryovers on occasion in the coming weeks, paid off on six-for-six to the tune of \$3,056.56. All the winners were 6-1 or less – with one exception – as Muscle Fashion won the seventh race, paying \$20.80 to win.

The Big M's "signature" wager – the Early 50-cent Pick-4 – now begins in race six, and after Say You Do sat a perfect pocket trip to surge past Rubber Duck to win at 5-1 in the payoff leg, those who hit cashed in for \$758.90. The key to hitting was Leg One, when players included 4-1 shot Resita, who upset 2-5 favorite Max.

The Late 50-cent Pick-4 also yielded a solid payout despite favorites winning the last two legs. A 16-1 shot started the sequence followed by a 6-1 leading to another four-figure payoff, at \$1,130.90.

All-source wagering on the 13-race card surpassed the \$2.5-million mark for a fourth straight program as \$2,534,709 was put in play.

A LITTLE MORE:Corey Callahan, Andy Miller, Tyler Buter and Dexter Dunn all recorded driving doubles on the program... Windy conditions made things tough on horses racing on the front end all night long. Handicappers should take that into consideration when looking at those horses who raced on this card and showed speed.

Opening night at Pocono featured Game of Claims Series

The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono opened on Saturday night, the earliest seasonal start in the 55 years of racing at the track, but while the temperature hung around the freezing mark, the competition on the oval was hot, mainly in the first preliminary leg of two sections of the track's Game Of Claims Pacing Series.

Action for horses entered at various claiming prices, with three preliminaries determining those who will race for the throne as their Game Of Claims divisional champion, provided two divisions of \$25,000 base-price horses going for \$25,000 each and three cuts of \$15,000 base-price horses going for \$15,000 (the base price in each grouping goes up slightly with each preliminary) opening night. With \$50,000 and \$30,000 Championship purses respectively, it's no surprise that a total of 18 horses were claimed in Saturday's first round action, including four of the five divisional winners, for a total of \$350,000.

The only Game Of Claims winner on Saturday not changing barns will be the Rock N Roll Heaven gelding This Is My Song, who moved after a blistering half, made the lead easily to the ¾, and defeated his field of \$25,000 horses handily in 1:51.2, fastest mile of the opening card for driver George Napolitano Jr., trainer Dan Maier, and Racing To Win Stable. The other winner at that level was the Captaintreacherous ridgling Trente Deo, who never looked back for the brother team of trainer Rene and driver Simon Allard in 1:53.4, last half :55.4, for Allard Racing Inc. and Earl Hill Jr.

Team Allard also won the first division for the \$15,000 horses, with the Delmarvalous gelding Machine Team benefiting from a fast pace to score a closing victory in 1:55.4 for A 1 Racing as the only Game Of Claims favorite to win. The other two sectors for \$15,000 horses were taken by Darren Taneyhill- trained horses coming off two-month layoffs, and they won by a combined 14¼ lengths for driver Jim Morrill Jr. and owner Eric Prevost – the Cheyenne Rei gelding Cheyenne Reijane coming out of the pocket for a 7½ length win in 1:53.3, and the Make My Day gelding Ancle on the engine to finish $6\frac{3}{4}$ lengths to the good in 1:54.1.

The 11-year-old Western Terror gelding Atta Boy Dan, 2019's Pocono Pacer of the Year while posting a United States-high win total of 19 seasonal triumphs, readjusted quickly to northeast Pennsylvania, capturing a \$14,000 conditioned pace in 1:51.4 for driver Tyler Buter, trainer Peter Pellegrino, and owner Stephen Larkin. Rock Diamonds N did not want to surrender the early lead, so Buter put "Dan" in the pocket, then came again after the leader in the stretch and went by for a half-length triumph, the 73rdwin of the pacer's distinguished career while moving his lifetime bankroll to \$974,002.
