A few facts about the only trotter to be voted Horse of the Year three times

Plus, a look at the original Super Bowl.

Monday (Feb. 13) marks the 30th anniversary of the only trotter to be named Horse of the Year three times, Nevele Pride.

Here's a couple of facts on the fastest trotter of his era:

1. He lived to age 28 and as a yearling sold for \$20,000 (Hip 168 as Thankfuls Pride).

2. When he time trialed six days apart on both the mile and the half-mile, the two world records had a distinctly similar theme.

His 1:54.4 mark at Indianapolis set the new all-time standard. His 1:56.4 mark at Saratoga was the new half-mile record.

Here are the individual fractions in each: :27.3, :28.1, :29.2 and :29.3 for the 1:54.4 mile and :28.2, :28.4, :29.2 and :30.1 for the 1:56.4 record.

The first quarter was the fastest; second quarter, the second fastest; third quarter, the third fastest and the fourth quarter, the slowest, in both.

- **3.** He was buried alongside Count Fleet and Meadow Skipper at Stoner Creek Farms. Not sure who Count Fleet was? He won the thoroughbred Triple Crown by a combined 36 lengths, matched by Secretariat in 1973.
- **4.** His \$3 million syndication was the highest upon retirement after 1969.

5. His first crop had Nevele Diamond, his second had Hambletonian winner Bonefish and many champions both here and overseas like Zoot Suit, Pershing, Messerschmitt, Panty Raid, Tarport Frenzy, Rosemary and La Pomme Souffle, the dam of 1980 2-year-old pacing king French Chef.

6. Property of a syndicate with a \$10,000 initial stud fee, he retired as the richest trotting stallion ever at \$871,738.

THE FIRST SUPER BOWL

- **1.** He was born in 1968 when the NFL-AFL Championship Game was not yet named the Super Bowl.
- **2.** In the half century since Super Bowl was the 1972 Trotter of the Year, Hambletonian winner and the fastest 3-year-old colt trotter in the sport's history at 1:56.2, no stablemates trotter and pacer have been 1-2 in HOY voting. Four-year-old pacer Albatross, also from Stanley Dancer's barn, was Horse of the Year in 1972.
- **3.** Not only were they stablemates, but they also won their individual divisions by the same tally, 190-1: Albatross over Tarport Skipper and 3-year-old Super Bowl over Songcan.
- **4.** Super Bowl was the eighth and final Hambletonian-winning son/daughter of Stars Pride and easily an all-time best.
- **5.** The first crop of Super Bowl, to say the least, gives a nod towards the NFL's biggest game as well as the Miami Dolphins, with names like Blitz Hanover, Coach Hanover, Csonka Hanover, Dolphin Hanover, Fumbles, Griese Hanover and Touchdown Hanover.

(**Note:** Super Bowl's first crop was in 1974 and the Dolphins competed in the Super Bowl three-straight years from 1972-74 with a loss and then back-to-back victories including the only undefeated season in NFL history).

BILLY HAUGHTON'S FIRST HORSE OF THE YEAR

Green Speed was Billy Haughton's first Horse of the Year. He won the 1977 award. But, in 1976, Haughton served notice that he was coming for the hardware soon by placing four in the Top 10: Keystone Pioneer (2nd), Steve Lobell (3rd) Windshield Wiper (7th) and Handle With Care (tied for 8th).

THIS MAY BE THE ODDEST HOY STAT OF ALL

Delmonica Hanover was HOY in 1974.

Not only was she 5-for-17 on the year, but her win percentage (29) was less than in her three previous years:

1971 – 29 16-6-1 – win percentage, 55.

1972 – 26 18-4-1 – win percentage, 69.

1973 – 23 7-7-4 – win percentage, 30.

MACK LOBELL AND JATE LOBELL

In 1987, Mack and Jate went 1-2 in the HOY voting and just two years earlier sold at the same North American sale, 32 hip numbers apart.

They were Trotter and Pacer of the Year, respectively, and while it appeared clear that no one was unseating Mack at the top, Jate's adventurous Meadowlands Pace night certainly didn't help him.

After being stuck in traffic from an overturned tractor-trailer on the New Jersey Turnpike, Jate finished seventh in the Pace as the 4-5 favorite.

He actually had three horses finish in front of him at odds greater than 170-1:

Burning Chance (4th) 171.90-1.

Meadowbranch Bret (5th) 183.40-1.

Happy Affair (6th) 180.80-1.

WE CAN GO ANOTHER CENTURY AND NOT SEE THIS AGAIN

One horse upended two future Horses of the Year in the same race.

In the 1985 Pilgrim at Garden State Park, Armbro Dallas defeated 1985 HOY Nihilator and 1986 HOY Forrest Skipper.

SEVEN-FIGURE WILSONS AND THE HOY

We are now past a decade from the last edition of the Woodrow Wilson which began in 1977.

Even now, the six richest races ever contested remain Wilsons.

Zero winners of those seven-figure Wilsons were ever named HOY in the same year.

Niatross won the Wilson and HOY in 1979, when the purse was \$862,750 – the year before it hiked into the stratosphere – but it was still the richest race to that point.

Nihilator won the HOY title the year after he won the sport's richest ever test when the 1984 Wilson went for \$2,161,000.

Only 3-of-the-10 \$1 million-plus Wilson winners got any HOY votes at all. McKinzie Almahurst in 1981, Fortune Teller in 1982 and the aforementioned Nihilator in 1984 who finished third in the HOY voting.

ONE MORE THING

LeBron James is now the all-time leading scorer in NBA history. Kareem Abdul-Jabbar held it for 38 years and 10 months.

Could we be looking at a similar time period in harness racing for the all-time earnings record?

On July 31, 1987, John Campbell took it over from Herve Filion.

We are now 35 years and 7 months into that reign.

Campbell is over \$299 million. Dave Miller is a little over \$271 million and Tim Tetrick is over \$255 million.

We might just have an even better scenario than the NBA had with two drivers simultaneously going after a hallowed mark.

The averages of Miller (58) and Tetrick (41) over the past several seasons bring them both into play three years from now. Although they may need a little more time, it's going to be close. Stay tuned.




BOB-BING AND WEAVING

Bulldog Hanover getting the Proximity Award is just further evidence of sheer and utter greatness.

Three examples that only happen when you are indeed the best of the best:

- **1.** Jate Lobell was undefeated in May of 1987 as a sophomore. In order to absolutely ensure that he'd compete in the \$100,000 New Jersey Sire Stakes final, they doubled the purse to \$200,000 and Run The Table upended him in the year's fastest mile 1:51.
- 2. Niatross being buried at the Hall of Fame. Enough said.
- **3.** Tarport Hap passed away on March 12, 1977 and that same year, just four months later, a race in her honor for sophomore pacing fillies debuted.

Dreaming of new directions

"It is never too late to be what you might have been." — George Eliot

Winning a \$1,000 wager on a horse race is nice but not much of a dream. The reward is fleeting. Money comes and goes. Raising or selecting a yearling that evolves into a fine racehorse is a much more fulfilling dream. The best future for our sport may be to shift away from dependence on pari-mutuel gambling toward participants chasing long-term dreams.

Reality will force our hand. The battles for sports gambling dollars are fierce and our horse racing warriors face long odds against the giant invaders. References to Custer's Last Stand, The Alamo, The Charge of the Light Brigade, and Napoleon's Invasion of Russia are tempting, but let us remain positive. And we should be positive. The assault may force us into an exciting and enjoyable future.

We did not ask to change course, but complete reliance on parimutuel wagering for a slow-paced sport in a universe where everyone can wager on everything is beyond challenging. Should the money streams dry up, where do we go? Who will lead us out of the harness racing wilderness?

A consortium of our breeding farms taking the reins for planning and implementation may be an answer. We should emphasize that every racehorse is a personal franchise and lean heavily into stakes racing. Of course, we cling to every dollar available, including the casino funding. Perhaps we should reallocate the money towards a new harness racing structure and create a self-contained ecosystem where individuals and groups compete for the best yearling. Many already play this game, and reconstruction may simply be jettisoning the segments we do not need.

Make a mental list of the aspects of our sport that give you the most pleasure.

Here is mine:

- The birth of a foal.
- Signing the sales ticket for a yearling.

- Planning and dreaming about the career of a yearling.
- Being part of a unique sport with great people.
- The opportunity to own and manage a young harness horse.
- Long-term dreams.

On the other side, this is a list of things that lessen my pleasure in our sport:

- Overnight racing.
- Winter racing.
- Claiming races.
- Monotony.
- Races filled with horses that are meaningless to me.
- Sharp gambling minds who will crush me in a pari-mutuel world
- Artificial intelligence wagering conglomerates.
- Boredom and treadmills.
- Empty racetrack grandstands.
- Aged racehorses grinding out a living.
- An endless racing season.
- Selling a stale product.

We need to sell something to dreamers. Ask yourself, would you prefer watching the same movie 10 times or taking a stab at making a movie? Would you rather watch a golf tournament or play a round of golf, visit a cottage or build a cabin or read or write a book? Would you prefer to wager on a trotting race or own a trotter? Many people are passive in their pleasure pursuits, but a solid core long to be in the game. We have one of the few pursuits that allow deep immersion via ownership. Ownership is a unique asset, a unique niche.

The ability to tailor expenses allows individuals of all pocketbook sizes to play the horse ownership game, perhaps our sport's best selling point. Many of you are familiar with the joys and disappointments of raising, buying, selling, training, dreaming, studying and researching the career of a young harness horse. It is exciting to calculate what racing level your horse should compete at and meet friendly competitors in the same world. Sure, it has heartbreaks, but ownership is fun and could be more fun in an age of high technology and instant communication if we focused on this part of our sport.

The past five years have been my favorite in my harness racing preoccupation because I leaned into the items in the first list and avoided the second one. My money situation was not favorable, several horses never made it to the racetrack, but my overall experience was positive. I remained pumped about

the next racing season for a single reason: there is a place in this sport that allows me to dream actively.

Let me approach my theme from a different direction: the future.

Consider me as a canary in the coal mine. My horse racing gambling days have dwindled to almost nothing. You all understand the internal, external, monetary and demographic indicators pointing to the likelihood that our traditional wagering engine will sputter.

However, if the current purse structure for stakes racing at each level remains relatively stable (improvements appreciated), people like me will continue to play. If the stakes payments and other revenue streams that support expanded stakes racing are palatable in my state or any state we choose to race in, if we have enough opportunities to race our stakes horses, everything else can go.

Participants in a new, condensed structure could find a fun little sport. We may become a boutique sport, a niche sport, and a pay-to-play sport. But we will have a future and have fun racing and paying for our dreams. If someone builds this friendly little sporting universe for racing our horses, we will come and we may create a situation where new people with active sporting dreams will want to join us.

British bets: My kingdom for a pacer, Part 1

After years of explaining to new harness racing bettors what the A and NZ and other letters mean when they trail a standardbred's name, comes another — --GB (Great Britain).

It was chilly every October morning in Harrogate, North Yorkshire, UK but in the 1980s a horseplayer needed to wake early and walk to the nearest news agent before copies of *The Sporting News* were sold out. I faced the chill and completed the task daily.

Once purchased, I took my copy to the nearest café.

The first time I ordered coffee I was asked, "White or black?" "What?"

"Milk or not?"

"You serve it with milk?" I said.

"Some people prefer coffee or tea with milk," the server said.

"No milk," I said.

"Black, then?"

"Yes."

It was my second trip to the UK. The first trip I spent solely in London and then with an entourage insulated from the general public. Now I was in the countryside's quaint town of Harrogate among the natives and everything I said shouted urban America and it made me recall my first trip across the pond when David Bowie's drummer told me the U.S.A. and Great Britain are "two countries separated by the same language."

When I began reading the horse racing section of *The Sporting News*, I needed another language lesson. The racing jargon alone demanded interpretation. For one, there were no past performance lines; a "punter" trusted many journalists' observations and opinions. There were the scores of tracks sprinkled across England, Ireland and Scotland.

All offered grass surfaces and each owned its own configuration. Some were left- or right-handed, others were ovals, triangular, loop-shaped, U-shaped and horseshoe-shaped. One had a flat with easy bends and a few had straight courses (some

undulating) for one-mile races and a few had tight turns, as well as uphill and downhill runs. And the horses were jumpers, sprinters and long-distance routers.

"Another coffee. Black please."

And the betting? One shopped for odds at competitive bookie booths at tracks or off-track parlors or private bookmaker offices. The tender was the pound sterling; the wagers were one-to-one deals with the book; no pari-mutuel pools in the UK.

I bought an "A-B-C of Bets" book, a glossary of wagers with specific conditions and catchy monikers. I could bet a Dundee Shuffle, a Fido or a Flag; a Goliath, a Harlequin; a Rounder, Round Robin or a Roundabout; a Super Yankee, Sundial, Sun Trixie or a Super Heinz.

George, the landlord of my flat, became my secret mentor. His wife disapproved of punting so he carved a spot in the basement where he hid to handicap. We met there secretly.

"The jumping at Liverpool is superb this time of year," he said. "Its main jump course is toughest of the lot. There's one fence with a huge open ditch to clear. We call it 'The Chair' and if your pony clears it, you'll be sitting pretty.""

"It's a lot to learn," I said, "Are my odds better running with the bulls in Spain?"

"I dunno. But I can find you a bookie'll give good odds on it."

"Where is there harness racing?"

"You mean the clubs?"

I went to the bar and said, "Barney, you know breeding history?"

"Me dad took a fancy to the flats," he said. "He bet on bloodlines; bragged how he could trace a runner to the Arabians, Barbs and Turks. Messenger came from that lot and was shipped across the pond."

"Hear that, George?" I said. "Harness racing is naturally British." George said, "Everything's naturally British."



The making of Western Hanover, Part 1

I have sometimes been asked "Who is your favorite horse, ever?" The answer without giving it too much thought would undoubtedly be Super Bowl. Maybe more about "Soup" in a column somewhere down the road.

If I were asked that question about my favorite pacer the answer would likely be less assertive. There were several including: Tar Heel, Bullet Hanover and Albatross. But when push came to shove, the answer would be Western Hanover. It could be argued that the genesis of my story with Western Hanover at Hanover Shoe Farms began in 1967.

The yearling crop of '67 coincided with my first year at Hanover. There were some who might suggest that group of yearlings might have been as good an offering as Hanover had ever brought to sale.

Included among them was the trotter who was destined to win the Triple Crown: actually the big five when The Colonial and the Vernon Gold Cup were added to the Hambletonian, Yonkers Trot and Kentucky Futurity. His name was Galahad Hanover. It was soon to be changed to Lindys Pride. He was my favorite of all the yearlings of that group. I fully expected him to top the sale. Not only was I sure he would top the sale, but I felt certain I knew who would own him: the partnership of K.D. Owen and Clarence Gaines. I was wrong on both counts.

Galahad Hanover was sold to Howard Beissinger as agent for the Antonacci and Lomangino families. His price was a disappointing \$15,000. I remember Beissinger coming to me after the sale and asking "What is wrong with that colt? I fully expected him to bring at least twice what he brought." I was crestfallen. I agreed with Beissinger.

I was soon to find out that the Gaines-Owen partnership was prepared to buy him, whatever price he would have brought. However, before the sale, they had Dr. John Steele check him out. Dr. Steele's verdict was that he questioned the colt's hocks

and doubted that he would stay sound. The two gentlemen changed their minds about buying and didn't even bid on him.

To my knowledge, Lindys Pride might have had problems with his feet, but his hocks never bothered him.

Among the pacers in the consignment was a smallish Tar Heel colt named Laverne Hanover. Billy Haughton bought him for a price in the area of, or maybe an actual price of \$20,000. He was purchased for the account of Thomas W. Murphy Jr.

Laverne Hanover was destined to become a world champion and to be his sire's richest foal with earnings of \$868,557.

Some other better-than-average performers from that consignment were stakes winners Crain Hanover, Penn Hanover, Nevele Major, Maneros Pride and Parula.

The entire consignment was to average \$12,137, an all-time Hanover record. The next year, the first consignment since the passing of Hanover's owner and co-founder Lawrence B. Sheppard, eclipsed that average by a staggering 50 per cent, averaging \$18,205.

Among the filly foals of 1966 was a Bullet Hanover filly named Wendy Hanover. I recall her as being the only yearling in the consignment that could pace alongside the lead pony. Could she ever. She could pace as fast as any lead pony Hanover owned could run. She did it in an ambitious manner with her ears pricked, always looking for more racetrack. I recall her as selling somewhere in the area of around \$15,000. She was purchased by Lofty Bruce for the account of his principal owner, the Mullins Construction Company.

She didn't star on the racetrack as I hoped she would, but turned out to be an acceptable race filly at Saratoga Raceway. She ended her career with a 3-year-old time trial record of 2:00.2 and earnings of \$9,114 – acceptable for the time – but far from great. When her racing career was over, she was offered for sale to Hanover. If my often-faulty memory is correct, I believe the price was \$10,000 in yearling credit.

There was very little in her pedigree that indicated she might become the founder of a top pacing family. Her dam, the Kings Counsel mare Wayblaze, went south quickly through her maternal family.

She had shown she was capable of producing good raceway performers such as Iron Rail (\$103,236), Nevele Blaze (\$62,558) and Post Rail (\$57,813), all good for that era, but there was nothing evident to indicate that she was destined to become the founder of a significant family of stakes horses. One of the lessons this scribe learned from this mare was that all families do not begin way back in history. They start at various times. There may even be one in the offing as this is written.

At Hanover, Wendy Hanover produced the very fast, but erratic Wellwood Hanover (\$253,191), Warren Hanover (\$267,655), Wrangler Hanover (\$106,974) and two fillies who were destined to become excellent broodmares: the Cams Card Shark mare

Caroline Semalu, who produced Semalu Express (\$644,392) and Imagine Semalu (\$173,378) and more importantly, the Best Of All mare Wendy Sue Hanover who had Walton Hanover (\$802,741), Walt Hanover (\$239,086), Wheels Hanover (\$128,174) and most importantly an Albatross filly named Wendymae Hanover who didn't accomplish much on the racetrack, but was destined for immortality through the feats of one of her sons.

Wendymae Hanover was a drop dead, gorgeous yearling. Like Wendy Hanover had been two generations previous, she could fly, pacing on the leadstrip. She was offered as one of the pair of fillies in the Hanover Yearling consignment of 1984. She was sold to "Wild" Bill Perretti for an eye popping \$380,000. Perretti had her trained at 2 and 3, where she showed some ability, but was plagued by a respiratory condition which never left her.

After her 3-year-old season, Perretti had enough. He called John Simpson and sold her to Hanover for \$200,000. That was probably more than she was worth at the time. But it could be argued that her yearling selling price of \$380,000 might also have been more than she was worth then. But Perretti was a good customer, so Simpson bit the bullet and paid Perretti's price. Simpson put her in training. She trained well, but her

respiratory problems persisted. They finally quit with her after she secured a time trial record of 1:57 with minimal earnings.

For her initial breeding, No Nukes was chosen as her consort. At the time, No Nukes was at or near the top of the pacing stallions in the country. Hanover had purchased a small piece of the horse and they had breeding rights to him.

Desiree Jones - Living her dream

It's no surprise that Desiree Jones went into harness racing, just look at who her parents are.

Her dad, Norm Jones, is a lifelong trainer/driver who began training horses in Eastern Ontario. He raced mainly at Blue Bonnets and Rideau Carleton Racetrack.

After moving to the Toronto area with his wife, Penelope Major Jones, also a trainer/driver in her younger years, Norm kept a stable of 25 to 30 horses in Rockwood, ON, and a small stable in New York where he raced at The Meadowlands in New Jersey.

During his career, Norm made upwards of \$12 million training and driving standardbreds, and today is retired in Cambridge, ON.

"When I go home in the summer months, dad joins me at the barn three or four times a week, mostly telling me what I'm doing wrong," Desiree said with a laugh. "Unconditional love, he calls it, but he still gives me a great wealth of knowledge.

"Some of dad's better horses were Lord Stormont and RB Jet. Lord Stormont won the World Trotting Derby in Du Quoin, IL, and surpassed a million dollars in earnings.

"My father also used to compete in the "ice races' on the Rideau Canal, which held significant history in our sport."

Desiree and her brother Sandy, from a previous marriage, would follow in their patriarch's footsteps. Although Sandy never made the move to Toronto, choosing to stay in eastern Ontario and today still works as a trainer/blacksmith.

Sadly, Desiree lost her mother and another brother in 2011 and 2012, respectively, both to the effects of addiction.

"That experience only pushed me further into the horses," Desiree said. "I would say that the event of losing my family members really gave me the final push to make horses and racing my full-time career.

"When you spend most of your time in the barn surrounded by horsemen, you'll discover many people who have faced a lot of adversities in life. People from places that weren't always

Since before I can remember, I would spend all my time at my happy place — the barn — with the horses. I was in awe with those amazing animals from the very start."

Desiree remembers that all she ever wanted to do was spend every minute at the barn.

"I guess you could say I was obsessed," she said with a laugh. "I begged my dad to take me out of school early so I could go to the racetrack with him or to the barn every night at feeding time. "Since I was too small to train or jog a horse to a jog cart, my dad got me a pony when I was 4-years-old.

"That was the beginning of my life working with horses and setting my career up.

"A few years later, dad let me jog and taught me how to rate a mile. I guess you could say he threw me to the wolves but it was the best teaching method at that time.

"Although dad taught me everything he could about racehorses, as the years went by, he didn't want my training horses to be my only option in life.

"Dad's owner at the time, Eric Baker of Stormont Meadows, agreed to give me a leg up if I finished my schooling first, so I took a short hiatus from the horses to attend college and received a diploma in Business-Marketing.

"If dad and Eric were hoping to divert my attention away from working with horses, their plan didn't work, for I returned to the horses as soon as I could say,'yee haw' and kept a stable of four to eight racehorses — mostly homebreds — up until last year."

Today, at the ripe age of 30, Desiree trains out of the Cambridge area, about 25 minutes from Mohawk, racing mostly at Mohawk, but she travels to several smaller Ontario tracks for stakes races.

Last summer, Jones spent a few weeks in New Jersey with young horses and raced at The Meadowlands. In the fall of 2021 trainer Gino Toscano asked Desiree if she wanted to go to South Florida to winter train.

"Gino said they would be taking some racehorses and a few babies — emphasis on a few — but now we're here with 30 head," Jones said.

I asked Desiree how she liked training at Sunshine Meadows.

"I don't think you'll meet anyone that doesn't love training here," she said. "The conditions are amazing for both the animal and people. It makes a big difference when you don't have to add cork to a young horse or worry about their lungs in the frigid temperatures."

Desiree's best horse is a 3-year-old Archangel named What An Angel and her fastest is Whichwaytothebeach.

But who is her favorite horse of all time horse?

"I'd have to say that would be Lord Stormont: and this answer is biased, for my dad trained him and our family owes this horse a lot," Desiree said. "Lord Stormont made memories that lasted a lifetime. I love pulling up replays of his old races and seeing my dad's face light up every time."

As far as preferring trotters or pacers she said:

"Trotters, always. I was never raised with pacers for our stable was always filled with trotters. If we had a handful of pacers over my lifetime that was a lot.

"Yes, trotters are a challenge. They make you work that much harder to get there, and as crazy as that sounds, it's extremely satisfying to see a trotter in the winner's circle that you broke and trained down.

"Babies in general take every ounce of patience you have, and trotters will certainly make you pull your hair out, but they're lots of fun."

Desiree is a dedicated, loyal, hard worker. She can be seen on the track at Sunshine Meadows when the sun rises and is there until the late afternoon hours, living out her dream.

In the stretch, Shesasharpshooter put away first-up challenger Music Box Noise, but couldn't fight off Chedda Chedda up the rail, who prevailed by a neck in 1:55.1.

Music Box Noise settled for third.

A daughter of Betterthancheddar, Chedda Chedda is now twofor-five this season after winning one of eight as a rookie. The Mitchell trainee increased her seasonal earnings to \$33,332 and career bankroll to \$48,762 for owners Decision Theory Inc. Chedda Chedda paid \$20 to win. The Snowshoe and Blizzard (fillies and mares) were open to non-winners of two races or \$30,000 lifetime as of Oct. 31,2022.

Also on Friday, O'Brien Award winner So Much More returned to her winning ways in the \$30,000 mares preferred. The 7-year-old mare and driver James MacDonald moved to the lead in the second-quarter and never looked back for a 1:53.3 victory over four rivals.

Western Wish finished second, while Need To Breathe was third.

Friday's win was the first triumph in three starts this season for So Much More. The Don Beatson trainee won 16 of 35 starts and earned over \$427,000 last season for owners Don Beatson, Ken Beatson and Cole England.

So Much More is now a 58-time winner with over \$1.2 million earned.

New Jersey judge rules in favor of Charlie May as Meadowlands Pace winner

A decision was announced on Friday, Feb. 10 from New Jersey Administrative Law Judge Andrew M. Barron, overturning the disqualification of Charlie May and requesting his reinstatement as the winner of the Meadowlands Pace.

His order reads:

"I hereby **ORDER** that the determination of the track side judges which was sustained by the Racing Commission must be **REVERSED**, as it was arbitrary, capricious and unjust, and violated petitioner's fundamental due process rights, and the rights of the wagering public, whose interests the track side judges, and the Racing Commission are supposed to protect as well. **I FURTHER ORDER** that Charlie May should be reinstated as the winner of the Meadowlands Pace which was held on July 17, 2021.

I hereby **FILE** my initial decision with the **NEW JERSEY RACING COMMISSION** for consideration.

This recommended decision may be adopted, modified or rejected by the **NEW JERSEY RACING COMMISSION**, which by law is authorized to make a final decision in this matter. If the New Jersey Racing Commission does not adopt, modify or reject this decision within forty-five days and unless such time limit is otherwise extended, this recommended decision shall become a final decision in accordance with NJ.S.A. 52:14B10.

"Within 13 days from the date on which this recommended decision was mailed to the parties, any party may file written exceptions with the CHAIRMAN OF THE NEW JERSEY RACING COMMISSION, 140 E. Front Street, PO Box 088, Trenton, New Jersey 08625-0088, marked 'Attention: Exceptions.' A copy of any exceptions must be sent to the judge and to the other parties."

His decision has been filed with the New Jersey Racing Commission which can either accept, reject or modify said decision.

Lack of due process behind successful appeal of Charlie May's DQ


After a lengthy decision process, Don Tiger's appeal of Charlie May's disqualification in the 2021 Meadowlands Pace has been confirmed. It is important to note that the basis for the appeal was not whether the disqualification was right or wrong but that the judges made a decision without due process specifically the input of the drivers involved. The judges cannot be faulted as the policy in New Jersey to forsake driver input since reliable responses are few and far between was a directive from the New Jersey Racing Commission.

Experienced presiding judges can utilize the replay and ask questions of the driver that often will provide information important to the decision making process. The presiding judge at The Meadowlands was qualified to include and dissect these conversations. I have had inquiries where talking to the driver provided information that was not clearly defined on the video e.g. broken equipment or getting hit with a pulled shoe.

I hope this decision will impress on the racing commissions that gathering all the information available whether on or off the track is an absolute. Interpreting replays are always included in racing officials' seminars. The course needs expand to provide guidance regarding how to conduct corresponding driver/jockey interviews.
