



Sylvain Filion extends the legacy of one of harness racing's royal families

"Made in the USA, born in Canada." That was the way Sylvain Filion described his arrival on this earth. In the time period that he was conceived, his father, Yves, was racing in the United States and then moved back to Canada.

Coincidentally, we spoke on the day of Sylvain's 53rd birthday.

The four-time O'Brien Award winner as Canada's Driver of the Year was reacting to the results of James MacDonald's unanimous win in this year's O'Brien balloting; the first year that the honor was named for one of the most revered drivers to ever come out of Canada, Keith Waples.

"Even though I was a co-nominee along with James for the achievement, it was certainly most well deserved that it went to James. There was never the slightest doubt that he deserved and would win it," Sylvain said.

It has been a long and very rewarding journey for Sylvain, a native of Lachute, QC.

There was never any doubt that he would become a horseman, in his case a driver. Apart from being recognized several times as the very best in his country, in 1999 Sylvain was the very best in the world as a result of winning the World Driving Championship.

You were born into harness racing royalty. Your dad, Yves, is a member of the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame. Your uncle Herve is considered by several to have been the greatest driver to ever sit behind a horse. Another uncle, Henri, is considered by a few to have been as good as Herve and by a lesser few to maybe have exceeded him in talent. There are five other uncles who to varying degrees were very capable horsemen — Denis, Rheo, Reynald, Gilles and Marcel. Let's start with your dad Yves.

"What can I say other than he is and always has been great. He is the hardest worker that I've ever known. He can and has done just about everything when it comes to horsemanship. He has bred, trained, developed and driven great horses. He also built his own training and breeding center. Any success I've ever achieved, I owe directly or indirectly to him. He not only is a great teacher, but what few may realize is that when he was at the very height of his career as a driver, he in effect turned the lines over to me and allowed me to drive all of the good horses in his stable. That's not to say that he gave up driving. He didn't. Even at the advanced age of 75, he still drives sometimes, especially when it comes to giving early lessons to the colts and fillies that he raises and buys at the yearling sales.

"But when it comes to the nitty gritty and the horses are ready

to race for real money or at the major tracks, he generally calls upon me to drive them. One thing I will say about my dad and my driving, he has never, not even once, told me how to drive a horse. I guess his feeling is that if he trusts his horses to me, then he is confident enough in my ability to make the right decisions while I'm on the track."



Tell us about Uncle Herve, one of the most legendary figures in the history of our sport.

"There is probably little about him that I can say that hasn't been said by others and often. I idolized him as a Godlike figure. He was and will always personify the term superstar to me at least when it comes to harness racing. Like the words from that old Carly Simon song You're so Vain: 'You walked into the party like you were walking onto a yacht.' When Herve would walk into a room, there was an aura about him. He just kind of lit the place up. He instantly became the center of attention. He knew it and I'm sure he loved it. Yet with all his bravado, he knew he was good, but he always idolized Keith Waples who he patterned his driving after and who he believed was the greatest driver ever. I remember one time when Herve was up here and dad and I took him to the races with us. Unbeknownst to him, we knew Keith Waples was going to be there. When Herve saw Keith, he went up to him and got down on one knee before him recognizing the royalty that he believed Keith to be. Keith, being the self-effacing person that he was, laughed and swatted Herve alongside the head."

There were those who thought Henri was as good as Herve and even a few who thought he might even have had more talent.

"Henri was great — a great driver and a great horseman. So is my dad. But there was only one and there will only ever be one Herve Filion."

When did you start working with horses?

"There was probably never a time when I didn't. I probably never had a choice in the matter. I was just plain lucky. I was born into it. I don't ever remember aspiring to do anything else. I was born to be a horseman and that's what I became. Of course, like most French Canadian kids I was a follower of the Montreal Canadiens and dreamed about someday wearing

the bleu, blanc et rouge, but that was just dreaming. I always knew that I was destined to become a horseman and in my





mind preferably a driver. My dad had been racing in the states on the Brandywine-Liberty Bell Circuit when we moved back to Canada in 1975. Those were the glory days of racing in the province of Quebec, specifically at Blue Bonnets. I first started driving professionally at 18 at the Hippodrome Trois Rivieres, which is sadly now the only remaining pari-mutuel track in Quebec. I mostly drove my uncle Henri's cheaper horses which he had stabled there. My first win was with a solid open horse by the name of Supreme Jade which he allowed me to drive."

It seems as though you've always been a fixture and one of the leading drivers on the WEG circuit, but that was not always the case.

"Actually this is my second go around here. We first started here around 1998 and 1999 when things got bad in Quebec. The purses weren't near good enough for us to make a decent living. Initially, I stayed here for three years and actually did quite well. But the combination of the purses getting better in Montreal and my feeling a bit homesick for Quebec resulted in our moving back to Lachute where my dad had his farm and stables. I built a home right there. We stayed there until 2012 when things really fell apart for harness racing in La Belle Province. We then came back and I've been here ever since."



In 1999, you were chosen as the Canadian representative in the World Driving Championship. You not only competed in the tournament, but you also won it.

"It was one of, if not the greatest honor of my life to be chosen to represent my country in this event. Then to be lucky enough to win it — wow!

"It was held in Australia that year. Strangely enough my wife and I and David Miller and his wife were the only North Americans there. The World Trotting Conference was being held in New



Zealand that year and all the Canadians and Americans stayed in New Zealand. But not to worry, we were treated beyond wonderful. The Aussies just might be the very greatest hosts and the most fun loving people on our planet. We were treated as well as was humanly possible. Of course, winning the tournament was a memory that will last forever."

In addition to winning that championship, you've also won four O'Brien awards as the leading driver in Canada and have been nominated a total of five times for the award.

"It would be false modesty to say that I don't think of myself as being a good, maybe even a great driver. But having said that, all of today's drivers, especially at the major tracks are good and there are some, probably more than just a handful that are truly great. It's not like the old days when trainers drove their own horses and it wasn't rare to see out of shape 200-pound guys behind horses. If they are not good enough, today's drivers just cannot compete. I look at us as being athletes. Most of us try to maintain our condition and stay in good shape. If we don't, chances are that we will be quickly replaced."

On the WEG circuit at which you regularly compete, who do you regard as your biggest competition?

"They are all tough to race against, especially when they have the horsepower. If you backed me up against a wall and said that I had to pick just one, I'd probably say Doug McNair. When he's got a good horse in a race, you'd better have one that's better than his to beat him. Out on the racetrack, he asks no quarter and gives none. I say this recognizing how good James MacDonald now is. He is still pretty young and will undoubtedly get even better."

In addition to your dad, who are some of the better trainers that you've been around and worked with and for?

"I suppose you'd have to start with Richard Moreau. He's won nine O'Brien Awards in a row as the leading trainer in Canada. He's just a great horseman and one of the hardest working guys I've ever been around. He's exceptional in how well he knows his horses and how to deal with them in terms of rigging, looking inside their heads and perhaps in classifying them and racing them in the classes in which they belong.

"Another one is Luc Blais. Maybe my dad deserves a little of the credit for his success. Before becoming the contract trainer for Serge Godin's Determination stable, he worked for my dad for about eight or nine years. He was always a very hard worker, who was a good judge of horses and understood them well. Dougie's dad, Gregg McNair, is also an excellent horseman. His stable always has a good assortment of young and older horses. There are others as well. If you are competitive in the major leagues including the WEG circuit, you need to be good. Otherwise you won't be make it."

You mentioned Serge Godin and his Determination Stable. Wasn't there a time when you actually drove for him regularly and weren't you offered a position as his contract driver?

"Actually my family and Monsieur Godin go back a long ways. My dad drove horses for Serge Godin's father, back when they were trained by Jacques Paquette. Monsieur Godin himself owned half of dad's great horse Goliath Bayama. The answer to your question is yes. I was offered the position of being the exclusive driver for Determination. I very reluctantly felt that I had to turn it down. I was very honored. However, I pictured myself in a position where down the road I might be forced to choose a Determination horse over one that was owned by my dad. I felt that in all conscience I couldn't do that. Determination instead chose Bob McClure who is an excellent driver and has done an admirable job in driving their horses topped off by his Hambletonian and Breeders Crowns wins with Forbidden

Trade in addition to several other important races with his great group of horses."

You mentioned Goliath Bayama. Was he the greatest horse that you have driven?

"He probably was the greatest, but Runnymede Lobell was likely the fastest. To be fair, I was just a kid when I drove Runnymede Lobell. I only drove him in schoolers and baby races. I sometimes kid my dad by saying that I never lost a race driving Runnymede Lobell, but he did."

Was there ever a really good horse that you might have missed out on driving because your dad had others that might race against it and preclude you sticking with it?

"One that comes to mind is Big Jim. I baby raced him once and thought to myself, 'This colt is really special.' Unfortunately I was unable to commit to driving him and Phil Hudon did a great job with him for his trainer Friday Dean and his late owner Jim Carr."

You've raced in Canada pretty much all of your career. Have you ever been tempted to race in the United States at The Meadowlands and on the Grand Circuit?

Harness Racing Update

"I've been asked that question many times. The answer is that it has probably crossed my mind once or twice, but the answer is not really. I've been happy and very comfortable racing in Canada regularly. I've occasionally crossed the border to race in a stakes race. But I've never been really tempted to move."

I would classify you as being more of a finesse type driver than a speedball type would you agree with that assessment?

"I would say yes and no. I think when speed is called for, I'd like to think I can hold my own with most. However I've always felt that taking care of the horse I'm driving should be my number one priority. I owe that to the owner, the trainer and the horse itself. As often as not, working out a good trip might produce better results than doing all the work and then getting beat at the end does. Being the son of a great horseman, who also owns the horses that he trains has taught me that there is always next week and of the importance of bringing back a fit horse which hasn't been hurt."

You are now 53 years old. If, perhaps, you might not

be at your peak, you are still quite competitive. What more evidence could be asked other than mentioning that this past season, you were the co-nominee for the Keith Waples, O'Brien Award Winner as the best driver in Canada. What does the future bode for Sylvain Filion?

"I'll steal from what Billy Popfinger said to you last week. I intend to just keep on, keeping on. I realize there will be a time when I'm not as competitive as I am now. I hope that time isn't near, but it will come when it will. I hope when that happens, I am wise enough to recognize it and cut down and maybe train a few head and relax a bit. Until then though, I intend to do what has brought me to where I am."

Baby, it's hot inside

The standardbred market has never been hotter than it is today, as evidenced by the Blooded Horse Sale last Tuesday.

Glancing through the sales catalog, an open pacing mare caught my eye. She had good credentials, both as a race filly herself, and then as a producer from her first of three foals, and a good, if not great, pedigree.

However, on the minus side, the mare hadn't had a foal last year, and she was selling open.

She was consigned, as agent, by Spring Haven Harm, aka Ms. Senena Esty, the young woman who is everything to all things horse related in Ohio.

So I gave her a call to get her take on what price range this mare would fall into. She did her usual thorough job, which included a discussion with the mare's owner. The upshot was an informed opinion that the mare would sell for around \$5,000.

Here's the punchline. She brought \$17,000.

I read with some bemusement the humor piece by Trey Nosrac about his breeding strategy (full story here). It's still a free country, at least I hope so, so one can breed to any horse he wants to. If you want to be whimsical, be my guest. But to speculate about how a top sire would have fared if he started with fewer than 20 indifferent mares is a failure of logic.

By definition, a Muscle Hill or Walner (why didn't she spell his name right?) had the racing creds that foreshadowed success in the stud. Sans his great record at 2, for me the definitive year, Muscle Hill simply isn't Muscle Hill.

While it's a fact that any horse's phenotype, the visible horse, i.e. the racehorse, is totally disconnected from his genotype, or genetic profile, it makes no sense to speculate about any stallion by discounting one of his basic elements.

I'm really not one for doing matings by hunch, as Mr. Nosrac suggests, but there is a fertile field for an informed breeder to get good results from an unlikely source.

Here, in the interest of full disclosure, the breeder I'm going to be referring to is my beloved nephew, Seth Rosenfeld.

No one has bred more good horses from a very limited number of mares than Rosenfeld. A few years ago he sent his mare, Sweet Dahrlin, to Falcon's Future. Here was a horse with virtually no popular appeal, but he had done enough, especially at 2, to rate Rosenfeld's attention.

The result was a filly he named Sweet Future, and again he went against the popular vein and bred her to Yankee Cruiser. The result was Sweet Lou, a great racehorse, and a now a leading sire. If Mr. Nosrac ever decides to breed pacers, he should take a lesson from my nephew.

I was lucky enough to receive a welcome message from a good English friend, Gordon Garnett. He talks about inbreeding, with some valuable insights. I think perhaps I have not been clear enough about the necessity to inbreed only with superior individuals. Garnett points out how important that is, because when you inbreed, you heighten certain characteristics, and they better be good ones, or you're a seven letter word that starts with "ph" and ends with "d".

Garnett mentions the great Italian (or Eyetalion, as we say in Kentucky) horse Sharif Di Iesolo. He was sired by the strictly American-bred Quick Song, who was intensely inbred to Spencer. In case you forgot, Spencer was also the key player in Scott Frost's pedigree, being 2 by 3 in the equation that produced that immortal racehorse.

I've also had a flattering email from Arie van Bellen. Unfortunately, he has posed a number of questions that it would take too many words and pages to answer, so I'm not able to oblige him with a response.

Like many of the people I hear from, van Bellen seems to know every bit as much about breeding standardbreds as I do. In addition, he's also a linguist, speaking Dutch, French, and English. For my part, I have only a smattering of French, but I'm altogether fearless in speaking it. That comes from my two years of French



at Andover, by the direct method.

For those unexposed to that particular form of educational torture, the direct method means only the studied language can be spoken in the classroom, starting with "Bonjour, Monsieur Forbush." One blurted word of English meant a zero for the day.

As I said, I can't begin to frame answers to all the questions van Bellen raises, but of all of them, the last thing I could do is give advice to both the Dutch and the other European breeders.

Obviously, the French have struck gold with a few of their good studs being crossed on American mares. So far, that's all being done with frozen semen, which is not something a layman can deal with. One of their horses will have a real impact when he stands here in the flesh and can breed a full book of 140 mares. Or even better, stands in Canada, where I believe the book limit is 250.

On this subject, all praise is due Jean-Pierre Dubois, who has led the way in bringing French blood to American breeders. Years ago, Dubois also was the only breeder who took advantage of the brief time the French Studbook was opened to American blood. The horses he bred in America are still prominent in French pedigrees today.

So as a closing note, Senena Esty now joins the short list of women, headed by my wife, Meg, who could easily sell me a bridge. Or, if not the whole span, at least get the down payment.

Hobby booming for Rocket Man's Boomer

Owning a piece of Little Rocket Man has led Jack "Boomer" Freeman to successful Miami Valley campaigners Levi and Dirty Judge.

Jack "Boomer" Freeman insists that he is not in the horse business. Racing is just a hobby, a fun sideline when he is not working as a logger. The problem is, his hobby is growing, thanks to the exploits of Indiana Sires Stakes champion Little Rocket Man, a horse he owns in partnership. That success has multiplied this winter at Miami Valley with late 2021 acquisitions Levi and Dirty Judge reaching the winner's circle with frequency early in this new year.

"I keep telling myself that I'm not in the horse business, but it keeps growing," Freeman said. "It started off as a play thing. Now, it has turned into something more."

Freeman has owned standardbreds on and off through the years dating back to when Harrah's Hoosier Park first opened in 1994. He admits that he's owned a lot of cheaper horses in the past. However, the arrival of Little Rocket Man provided



new opportunities. Since his debut as a 3-year-old in 2019, the Rockin Image gelding has taken Freeman and partner Russ Beeman on quite a ride. Now 6, the pacer has 32 wins from 54 career starts, with earnings of \$547,445. The 2021 campaign was the best to date for Little Rocket Man as he won 15 of 25 starts, hitting the board 20 times and earning \$258,915. He capped the season with a victory in the \$70,000 Indiana Sires Stakes final for older male pacers.

"Whenever you're successful in something, it's going to grow. Because of Rocket Man, it's given me the opportunity to buy some other horses," the Anderson, IN resident said. "Since he came along, now I have an opportunity to get into this a little more. I really love the business, I love the people. He has definitely opened a lot of doors for me."

Teaming with trainer and long-time friend Ryan Bellamy is one of those new opportunities Freeman pursued. In early November, the owner privately purchased then-sophomore Dirty Judge and sent him to Bellamy. The Rockin Image gelding has won twice in 2022, and has earned just over \$20,000 since entering the Bellamy barn.


"I watched this horse all summer. He's a beautiful, big, strong horse. I just thought he had loads of talent," the trainer said. "He got sharp a little bit over the summer, but he wasn't very consistent."

A purchase in the last week of December, however, has delivered the biggest success for the team thus far. Bellamy and Freeman were one of three interested parties that attempted to claim Pet Rock gelding Levi out of a \$12,500 contest at Hollywood Gaming at Dayton Raceway.

"I looked at the program and this horse caught my eye. He's an Ohio bred and that helps us as an out of state owner. I watched some replays on him and I told Boomer this is the horse. I watched his last replay. Basically, he got trapped in, and when he got out, he was flying," Bellamy said of targeting Levi. "We drove over together and put a claim in on him. There were three claims in on him and we won the shake."

In his 2022 debut, Levi raced second in a \$15,000 claimer at Miami Valley after drawing post nine. Back in for \$12,500 four days later in the opening round of the Claim To Fame series, he was claimed by Charlie Stewart. Bellamy was set on getting the five year old back, and did so after a winning performance in the second leg of the Claim To Fame at Miami Valley on January 17.

"He was entered back for \$12,500 and he was already committed and I knew we were going to lose him," Bellamy explained. "I told Boomer he's going to win the series. We gave \$16,200

when we claimed him back and he won the final."

Steered by Sam Widger, Levi took command early in the \$25,000 final, held Jan. 24. Setting the fractions, the pacer would draw away late to win by nearly three lengths in a time of 1:53.2. Levi was paid into the next Claim To Fame series, made eligible to both the \$20,000 and \$30,000 classes. Bellamy took a chance when entering his charge and dropped Levi into the \$30,000 series with an eye on keeping him in the barn.

"If we put him in for \$20,000, he's probably getting claimed, and I don't know if we want to lose him for \$20,000. I think he's legit. Let's pay him into both series and race him for 30 first and see where he's at. We can always drop him into the second leg of the 20," the conditioner said of his strategy. "I knew we were safe for 30, nobody was going to take him. But then he wins, so I think he's a proven 30 already. He's a pretty nice horse."

Starting from post two on Thursday night (Feb. 10), Levi and Widger were the early leaders before being shuffled to second behind favored Voracity. They tracked the leader throughout the mile before swinging out in the stretch and putting a neck in front. Levi tripped the timer in 1:52.

"That's one thing I liked about the horse as I watched him race. He seems to be a really good finisher," said Freeman. "He's done very well for us. So far, this year has just been an unbelievable start."

Now a winner in three of five seasonal starts, Levi has quickly banked \$35,625 to begin the year. Since he has already qualified for the final, Bellamy hopes to give the gelding at least one more start in the series while also working in some needed time off. Levi came to the barn with a quarter crack that still lingers.

"He does have a quarter crack on his right front foot that could probably use a few weeks. If we could get that 100 per cent, he might even be a better horse than what I think he is," Bellamy said.

Levi and Dirty Judge are not the only horses that have delivered victories for Freeman in 2022. Hoosier Celebrity, purchased last May, earned over \$27,000 in 2021 and has already collected \$18,960 in five seasonal starts, winning twice in the Buckeye State. Freeman also owns Encore Encore gelding Sign Here And Here, a six-year-old trotter with \$150,000 on his card. The owner is excited to see Sign Here And Here return to the track this year.

"I think he has a lot of promise. He's a horse that went lame and I bought him and gave him time off. I really have a lot of high expectations for him," Freeman said. "He's got a :54 record. He's a very good horse if he comes back sound. So far he's done everything that he's supposed to do. I'm really excited about him."

If that were not enough, Freeman owns two freshmen – one trotter and one pacer – with Ken Rucker. They are both currently in training, and while early reports are good, he is not getting his hopes up yet. A long road remains before either sees a starting gate. For a man that contends he is not in the horse business, he has a lot of irons in the proverbial fire.

"I tell myself every day that I'm in too deep as it is," Freeman said. "Your mind says no, but your mouth says yes. If they keep doing well, I'll get more. Hopefully it is something that continues to grow."

Growing up in New York, young Becky Healey often attended harness racing's greatest racetrack, Roosevelt Raceway. From the time it opened its doors in 1940 until closing in 1988, Roosevelt Raceway was "where it all began."

It was the original home of the Messenger Stakes — part of the pacing Triple Crown — and also the first track to use the mobile starting gate.

Such greats as Carmine Abbatiello, Billy Haughton, Stanley Dancer, Sanders Russell, John Chapman, Eddie Cobb, Sacha Warner, Frank Safford, Delvin Miller, Joe O'Brien, Lucien Fontaine, Benny Webster, Buddy Gilmour, Eddie Cobb and Del Insko were just a few who helped make Roosevelt Raceway the most

popular harness track in the world.

Champion horses Adios Butler, Speedy Scott, Bret Hanover and Romeo Hanover competed on the half-mile track. In fact, almost every great racehorse in the '60s and '70s raced at Roosevelt Raceway for it was the creme de la crème of harness racing.

Eddie Cobb, trainer of Adios Butler, Times Square, Jean Laird and Jerry The First, can credit some of his success to the expertise help from his friend and second trainer, Buck Norris, before Buck went out to establish his own productive career.

Norris' daughter, Becky, remembers her life growing up around the racetrack.

"I was born and raised in Westbury, New York and my playground was hanging out at Roosevelt and Yonkers Raceway.

"My dad, Buck Norris, was a top trainer and my mother, Jo Lois, was the bookkeeper for his business. My brother Scott and I returned to help dad in the family business after graduating from college.

"After graduating from Colorado State University with a bachelor's degree in Animal Science, I interned at Castleton Farm in Trenton, Florida, and then worked briefly at Castleton in Lexington, Kentucky, before returning to the family.

"I met my husband, Mark, in Pinehurst, North Carolina, where we both winter trained. We would go back with refreshed horses

and train them at Meadowlands and Freehold Raceway. In 1999, we moved to Earleville, Maryland to raise our three children.

"During that period, I worked for trainer Dan Warrington. After 10 years, I stopped working to care for my ailing father. When I was ready to return to work, fate seemed to intervene, bringing me to Winbak Farm and my present job as broodmare manager.

"My job includes overseeing our several hundred broodmares and group of retired mares. I keep track of their blacksmith schedule and reproduction records, entering the information into our horse farm management program.

"During the busiest time of year — breeding season — I assist our vet with checking mares and calling the breeds for the day. I then put all the notations she has told me and enter them into our "palp" sheet determining who gets checked on what days. I'm also responsible for collecting our Delaware and Maryland stallions and preparing the semen for artificial insemination and transporting the semen.

"Our foals are normally born between January and June. I'm responsible for all mare and foal movements and entering their locations in our HFM.

"When it is time to move mare and foal to our yearling section, I group the foals by sex and age, and determine their new field locations. (This occurs sometime in October).

"In the beginning of November we begin the weaning process and relocating the mares back to the main farm. Once again, I group the mares into barren fields and make sure pregnant mares are grouped into the proper fields according to their last breed date. It is a job that includes much time outside with the horses, but a tremendous amount of work in the office."

Winbak Farm is one of the sports finest farms where many champions were born and raised, such as Muscle Hill, Bettors Delight, Courtly Choice and Roll With Joe.

"Our Delaware stallions include Badlands Hanover, Roddys Bags Again, Glidemaster, Classic Card Shark and Royal Mattjesty and we are in the process of adding new stallions this upcoming breeding season.

"As far as the broodmares, Yankee Blondie (the dam of Muscle Hill) is probably one of my favorites, along with Arts Bid.

"Arts Bid simply amazes me and has my everlasting respect for she's super sweet and an awesome mother, despite her being totally blind. She gets along beautifully with a little special care (i.e. a bell around her foal's neck, and her own special field).

"Many of the broodmares we have or have had I've either cared for at the track or watched them raced. There is nothing more gratifying than watching these ladies come full circle.

"At Winbak, our goal is to sell all the foals born here. When a

problem arises we have a great vet, Dr. Sarah Mackie, along with foaling manager, Jerry Crump, yearling manager, Jim Ladwig, and general manager Jack Burke, along with a great working relationship with New Bolton Center and Manor Equine hospital handling the situation in the best manner for the horse and getting the greatest success rates.

"We have many, many retired mares that live out their lives in peace with the best quality care. I have the utmost respect and admiration for the Thomson family for giving every horse top care.

"We have a great group of people here at Winbak, making it one of the sport's best. We are passionate and knowledgeable about our jobs and horses. It is my greatest joy to drive into our farm every day and be part of this wonderful operation — day in and day out.

"I'm so lucky and blessed to have a new playground of so many horses and to be a part of their lives. It's definitely a dream come true and I'm so thankful to the Thomsons for letting me be a part of the Winbak family."

Uncle Thad goes online

Five years ago, at the time of these events, my application for a part-time job at a harness racing website flew to the top of the queue. My fast-tracking was no surprise. My name is Deke Pohl. My last name may not mean much to you, but my uncle, Thaddeus Pohl, is a big deal in the world of harness horse racing. He owns over a hundred horses, outstanding horses, top-flight racehorses, top-shelf broodmares, weanlings, and yearlings.

Pre-COVID-19, the website office was in a vacant tanning salon in a lonely strip mall. The staff consisted of three people, three cubicles, three desks, three computers, and a blue sofa that sagged in the middle. Anna was perky and sexy in an Olive Oyl sort of way. Rodney, the boss, looked and acted like a 30-year-old Woody Allen and had a neurotic obsession with spreadsheets and billing statements. And then, me.

I liked Anna. Asking her out for a date crossed my mind. There were possibilities because she seemed to view me, if not with lust, at least as an exotic spider in Hawaiian shirts and sweatpants. Every day, at some point, Anna would teleport herself next to my desk, and we had our usual conversation.

"Deke, do you have a minute?"

"I have every minute until quitting time."

Then she would nudge me to contact a customer, design a layout, write about some harness race, help with a format, or ask if I had any angles to drum up more advertising; you know, crazy stuff.

The day of the incident was hectic. My nerve ends, frayed.

For an intense hour, I had been busy at my computer playing *MultiMystiqueWarfareIV – the cyclone rises*, just killing it. I was in the zone, at level NINE, probably my best day at the office. It was easy to avoid my phone vibrating on my desk, but then Anna loomed.

"Deke, do you have a minute?"

"Not right now."

"I think we can sell a big ad."

"Not right now."

"A stallion owner is a bit of a... well... a manly man. I think it would help if you talked to him. I have all the specs."

"Maybe later."

She leaned forward, "Come on, Deke, it's your job. We need this. Quit screwing around."

Then the unthinkable happened. Anna reached her bony wrist across my keyboard, and using a pink fingernail, tapped "Quit."



Harness Racing Update

Woodbine has made a few amendments to the usual staking process to get the SBOA for colts and geldings off the ground in 2022.

"The races for fillies requires horses to be nominated as yearlings and that obviously wouldn't work to get the colt races started immediately," said McLinchey. "February 15 is the date to nominate for this year and next year's editions of the SBOA for colts and geldings. We'll then link up the colt races with the fillies for the 2024 edition by requiring the usual yearling nomination payment this May."

The nomination fee for this year's SBOA Stakes for 3-year-old colts and geldings is \$300, while nominating for the 2023 event is \$200.

The eliminations for this year's SBOA Stakes will be contested Friday, May 13 and Saturday, May 14, while all finals will be held on Saturday, May 21. All eliminations will go for a guaranteed purse of \$25,000, while the finals will have \$50,000 in added money.

Gural shocked by treatment of Adrienne Hall

I am shocked at the treatment that Adrienne Hall (full story here) has received on social media and the comments that I have seen because she decided to cooperate with the Feds and help put Fishman in jail where he belongs.

While everyone is concerned about our decision to allow her to race, my main concern is are we going to have enough owners and trainers to race at the Meadowlands once we find out who was buying drugs from Fishman and Grasso. The list we have seen from Fishman hopefully represents mainly horsemen who bought legal therapeutic medication or used his company for blood testing. Unfortunately, I am sure there will also be horsemen on the list who bought illegal performance enhancing drugs.

While I have no idea if they are going to be arrested, they are certainly not going to be allowed to race at my tracks and maybe others in the industry will follow suit.

What people criticizing (Hall) don't seem to understand is that when you present evidence to a jury you have no way of knowing how it is going to turn out even if you have a great case. The FBI and the U.S. attorney felt they needed someone to testify they used Fishman's product and they saw improved performance. I have interviewed her personally and have spoken with others who know her as well. She loves her horses and made a mistake but owned up to it and made herself available when she was contacted by the FBI.

In all the years I have owned racetracks, with the exception of one or two horsemen I am friendly with, not one of the thousands of owners trainers grooms drivers who I am sure have seen something or know something that might have been helpful in catching these criminals has ever come forward. The fact that she is getting crucified on social media and the press is a disgrace and just shows how much trouble we are really in as an industry. Her life has become hell since the Fishman trial and I am sure she regrets agreeing to cooperate.

Being such a small player, she was never at risk of being arrested or charged with a crime as they are only interested in major players. Hopefully, we will be able to identify all the people who bought illegal drugs from Fishman and Grasso soon and the only people left to race will be those horsemen who are honest. Since I am used to it, I do not mind being criticized even though I am spending about \$250,000 annually between (security director) Brice (Cote) and 5 Stones to try to keep drugs out, which is more than all the other harness tracks in North America are spending, but I would appreciate it people would take into account that this is a woman who loves her horses and everyone I have spoken to who knows her has confirmed that.

Russell Williams: Don't be misled, Adrienne Hall should be excluded from horse racing

The story from Adrienne Hall in your recent issue (full story here) is an entertaining read, but no one should let it mislead or distract them from the reason she should be excluded from horse racing. The transcript of Hall's testimony in the Fishman trial on January 27, 2022 has been publicly available for some time (and it can be obtained from the USTA). I will refer to page numbers in that transcript. At trial, Adrienne Hall gave a rather different side of the story, testifying pursuant to a written agreement with the Government under which she would not be prosecuted if she testified truthfully. (772-73).

At the time she approached Fishman, Hall already had a history of using performance-enhancing substances on her horses. (842, 859). Hall stated that she reached out to Fishman to get his help pre-racing her horses, meaning to get drugs to give to her horses to improve their racing performance. (793-94). Hall knew that administering the different forms of "blood builders" that she obtained from Fishman was not allowed and could result in loss of her license if she was caught, but she did it anyway. (777, 803, 805). Hall was not naïve. She had a conversation with Fishman about whether his products would "test." (810). Evidently satisfied on this point, Hall met one of Fishman's runners in a parking lot to get blood builders known as BB3 and TB-7. Hall administered Fishman's substances to her horses intravenously. (816). Asked why she did not ask a veterinarian to do this, Hall replied, "I think it would have been stupid ... the vet would have gone to the commission and told them what I was doing." (817).

Adrienne Hall's sworn testimony was that she administered performance-enhancing substances on race day to her horses in violation of both state and USTA rules. (803). "I could lose my license," she said. "I would probably most definitely be suspended and fined." (805). The USTA suspended Hall based on her own sworn testimony. Our rules and bylaws provide Hall with a right of appeal and the opportunity to explain why her

Faraldo on "folly" of Gural's new stakes rules

On the latest folly from the Meadowlands Guru...

The new Meadowlands policy "any persons who the FBI determined to have purchased performance enhancing drugs" will not be eligible to compete in the stakes and the money you paid in forfeited.

Just a couple of things to consider:

- 1. The FBI is not the one to determine the ultimate facts and as we know many people are on the Fishman list may or may not have purchased any such medications. According to the FBI's pharmacology expert, Lasix is performance enhancing. Will the purchase of Lasix now disqualify an owner from racing his/her horse in a stake race at the Meadowlands? And does that include the forfeiture of the previous paid in stakes money? Remember there are horses for which payments were made before this list was publicized in court by the FBI. Also, remember, that there are indeed innocent owners who merely paid a bill, submitted to them, as well as trainers who found an economical source of permissive meds to save their owners money.
- 2. What litmus test will be utilized to determine whether the FBI is correct on its characterization of what is performance enhancing when they can't identify what the "performance enhancing" drug was?
- 3. In view of all this, consider the arbitrary and hypocritical determination that will be made by the guru at the Meadowlands, like the one we recently saw that if you admitted to injecting horses on race day and using "performance enhancing" drugs even before hooking up with Dr. Fishman, you can race at the Meadowlands without differentiating between stakes or overnights. Assuming an admitted user can race in overnights but not stakes, how does that figure?

Understanding that owners purchase yearlings with the dream of winning stakes races should (they) consider paying into any stakes where the rules can change after they paid in and then were declared ineligible?

On top of this, consider the latest that certain very talented drivers must report for duty at the Meadowlands by March 4th or they too will be determined ineligible to drive in stakes races there in 2022. What is an owner paying for if he can't have one of these clearly most sort after top drivers. What if other tracks decided to bar drivers from their tracks stakes, early or late closing events unless they raced at their tracks every Friday and Saturday evening? How many tracks can a driver be beholden to? Complacency in all of this is as bad as the actor committing the act.

It is unfortunate that horses don't swallow pills easily or effectively and injectables are used. Now each day I swallow several vitamins, supplements and medical over the counter pills for allergies [seasonal] and pain relief. They are not banned illegal or harmful.

Now many trainers use the same supplements to maintain and improve post-race recovery time in the harness horses. It is unfortunate that they self-inject the animal, but they do it for economic reasons, not nefarious ones. I think the public lacks the understanding of the drain a race puts on the animal, and human athletes all engage in similar enhancement. The short of it is every needle found is not for evil intent.

Racing in Florida

I am glad to see a legislator trying to keep harness racing alive in Florida (full story here). Since the deal to redevelop Pompano Park looks like a done deal, alternatives must be considered if harness racing is to survive in Florida. Since most betting on racing is now conducted off track the location of the track anywhere in Florida should workout, especially if the permit holder is also allowed to conduct casino type games and slots at the track's physical location.

As mentioned in the article, the major cost would be to construct new facilities like the grandstand and other support facilities. It would seem to me that the most easy choice would be to allow any of the old dog racing tracks that would have the space to expand the old dog track into at least a half-mile harness track get preference to get a harness racing permit. In those cases they would still have an existing grandstand building that could be reused, thus reducing the capital cost to build a new track from scratch. Obviously, there would still be other extensive costs to do this, especially if the permit holder had to construct on site backstretch facilities. However, depending where the new track is located they may be able to run without on-site stabling. Since there are several training facilities located in the state horses could ship in from there. I hope something can be done since especially in winter Florida has always provided an alternative to cold northern tracks that run in winter.
