Sweet home Chicago

The longest Hawthorne's standardbred meet in history begins Saturday with everyone involved dreaming of the day a casino can open there to augment purses.

The longest meeting in Hawthorne Race Course's 50-year harness racing history will leave the starting gate on Saturday (Feb. 15).

There will be 104 nights of racing during the meeting that won't hit the finish line until Sept. 20.

Hawthorne's longest previous continuous meeting was last year when it put on 72 programs from May 3-Sept. 22.

After a lawsuit resulting in bankruptcy put Balmoral Park and Maywood Park out of business in 2015, the sulkies returned to Hawthorne for the first time since 2008 for Jan. 1-13, March 3-May 1 and Sept. 26-Dec. 31 meetings.

The standardbreds and thoroughbreds have been time-sharing at Hawthorne since 1970. From 2003 through last year, the runners had a spring meeting there before moving to Arlington International Racecourse for the

summer and then coming back in the fall.

However, Hawthorne didn't apply for thoroughbred dates this spring in order to accelerate and facilitate the remaking of the track into a racino. Last year, the Illinois General Assembly passed a massive gaming expansion bill and signed by Gov. J.B. Pritzker that allows casino gambling at racetracks starting in 2020.

Hawthorne president Tim Carey applied for a license on the day applications opened, Aug. 26, hoping to get the \$350 million renovation project underway in January and have it finished by the Oct. 1 start of the thoroughbred meeting. His rationale for having harness racing in March and April instead of thoroughbred racing was to enable construction crews to work throughout the day.

Leaders of the Illinois Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (ITHA) agreed that the project would cause significant problems if they trained in the morning and raced

in the afternoon and supported Carey's proposal.

"The focus should be on Hawthorne," said ITHA president Mike Campbell. "They're willing to put up hundreds of millions of dollars."

Unfortunately, the Illinois Gaming Board review of the application has taken longer than expected. The applications submitted by Hawthorne and Fairmount Park, the thoroughbred track across the Mississippi River from St. Louis, are unique for a regulatory body that hitherto has had only casino and video gaming applicants. Moreover, the casinos are corporate entities while Hawthorne is a family-owned business that has 60 shareholders.

Carey said he has high hopes that he will get the go-ahead sometime this month and, in the meantime, the preliminary preparations have been made.

"We've moved the racing end of the operation to the west end of the building," he said. "Our plan is to give the contractor the rest of the building, all three floors."

Plans call the casino to occupy 4,000 square feet on the second floor.

Amid all of the activity, it will be business as usual for racing secretary Robin Schadt.

"It's a similar template to what we've done the last couple of years, nothing new or added," she said. "In February, March and April, racing will be geared toward the hard-knocking overnight horses. The series we had last year will commence in May and all of our Night of Champions (preliminaries) will start at the end of May. Our Night of Champions (11 stakes races for Illinois-breds) will be on the last Saturday night of the meeting."

Casey Leonard, who has won every driving championship since Hawthorne resume harness racing in 2016, will be back to try to perpetuate his monopoly, and his father, Terry Leonard, will be in quest of his third straight trainer title during that time frame.

The stalwarts in Terry's stable figure to be a pair of Illinois-breds, the 5-year-old gelded pacer Fox Valley Gemini and the 4-year-old filly pacer Fox Valley Triton, and Ponda's Prospect, a 6-year-old Indiana-bred gelded pacer. Fox Valley Gemini was the Illinois-bred Horse of the Year in 2017 and 2018 and was a winner on last year's Night of Champions program as was Fox Valley Triton.

Although it will be the longest Hawthorne meeting on record, the racing weeks will be very short, consisting of Saturday and Sunday nights from Feb. 15-29 and Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays from March 1-Sept. 20.

Illinois-breds are the foundation of the racing program and they have been in short supply in recent years because breeders have been foaling their horses in Indiana and Ohio where racino-funded racing has produced financially robust meetings. From an all-time high of 2,535 Illinois foal registrations in 1983, the numbers nosedived to 182 in 2016 and 144 in 2017 before going up to 268 in 2018.


"Our purse structure is still respectable, but it's not competitive with the casino tracks," Schadt said. "Once our casino is up and running our purses will go up significantly (thanks to a minimum revenue stream of 12.75 per cent that will be earmarked for purses).

"In three years I think we'll be on top of the mountain."

Carey is of the same opinion. He believes Hawthorne's casino will lead to "the redevelopment and regrowth of racing in Illinois."

"We've been waiting 15 years for this opportunity," he said. "This is what it's all about."

Although a sense of optimism still abounds, Illinois harness racing experienced a major setback last October three weeks after the Racing Board awarded the 2020 dates. The board was forced to amend its dates order and rescind the 12-night Dec. 6-29, 2020 meeting it awarded Playing in the Park, a proposed state-of-the-art racino in south

suburban Tinley Park, thwarting Carey's hopes of coordinating his future harness meeting with those of the new track.

The dates were taken away after Gov. Pritzger's office informed the village that the state-owned land on which the harness track/casino was to be built was no longer for sale. That decision was prompted by *Chicago Tribune* disclosures detailing the long-standing business relationship of would-be racino owner/operator Rick Heidner with Parkway Bank chairman Rocco Suspenzi, who allegedly also has had dealings with Mafia members.

Heidner is a real estate developer and the state's third largest video gaming operator with 500 slot machines. He denied any Mafia connections and pointed out that his video gaming licenses have been approved by the Illinois Gaming Board.

However, with his video gaming license up for renewal this month, Heidner found himself in hot water in December when the Gaming Board threatened to revoke the license because of a deal he allegedly was trying to make with Laredo Hospitality, which planned to remove 44 of his terminals from restaurants it had purchased.

The Gaming Board charged that Heidner offered to purchase the restaurants for \$5 million more than the new owner had paid for them and arrange for a quick resale in order to keep the video gaming terminals in the restaurants. This would be a felony under the state law that stipulates it is illegal to give anything of value to an establishment as an incentive or inducement to locate terminals in that establishment.

Heidner is maintaining he is innocent of any wrong-doing

and no charges have been filed against him in connection with either the Laredo Hospitality case of the proposed Tinley Park harness track/casino.

Another December development was the purchase of Balmoral Park by Phil Goldberg's Team Real Estate Development, LLC. from HITS, Inc., a New York-based company that acquired Balmoral during bankruptcy proceedings and renovated the property to hold hunter/jumper horse shows.

Goldberg wants to resume racing and introduce gaming but there are significant impediments. The deed from the bankruptcy sale prohibits pari-mutuel horse racing, casino gaming or any other type of gambling on the property until 2026. In addition, while the 2019 gaming expansion legislation calls for a new harness track/casino it stipulates that the racino must be located in any one of six south suburban Cook County Townships. Balmoral is in Will County, putting it outside the statutory boundary.

For Goldberg's plans for Balmoral to become a reality, the ban on racing and gambling would have to be invalidated and the boundary would have to be changed by the legislature.

Until a new track is built, the future will remain hazy for the horsemen who race in Illinois but they can rest assured when they race at Hawthorne their purses will be much higher than currently because a minimum of 12.75 per cent of the casino revenue will flow into the purse account.

Hawthorne is the only pari-mutuel harness track in Illinois which had seven other harness tracks when it introduced the sport in 1970 after operating solely as a thoroughbred track since it came into the racing world on May 20, 1891. The property was acquired by Tim Carey's great grandfather, Thomas H. Carey, in 1909 and after three unsuccessful attempts to revive racing, which had been banned in Chicago in 1905, he finally succeeded in 1922.

The State Fairs at Springfield and DuQuoin also have pari-mutuel harness racing but it's confined to a few days while the fairs are in progress so it would be misleading to categorize the fairgrounds as harness tracks.

Hawthorne's golden anniversary meeting has been prefaced by a sad note because the track lost one of the most important individuals in its history on Dec. 22 when former track president Tom Carey died at age 87. Tom succeeded his deceased father, Robert F. Carey, as track president in 1980 and remained at the helm until 2006 when he was succeeded by his nephew, Tim, in 2005.

Tom was a quarterback at Notre Dame during the Frank Leahy coaching dynasty and after college he won great acclaim as an outstanding high school football coach during a five-year career at Mount Carmel, his high school alma mater in Chicago.

But instead of pursuing a college coaching career the Northwestern Law School graduate chose to join his father's law firm.

"After I took over we would sit for hours and talk," said Tim. "He loved being around the racetrack and talking about the intricacies of horse racing and his experiences (but) he would say: 'I wonder if I made a mistake. I could have been a coach anywhere I wanted to coach.'"

Tom's greatest racing achievement was rebuilding Hawthorne after the track's clubhouse and grandstand were destroyed in a fire set by an unknown arsonist on Oct. 9, 1980. The track was insured for approximately \$4 million but the damage was estimated at between \$10 million and \$14 million.

"Most people thought we had no shot at rebuilding," Tom would later tell *Hoof Beats*. "Even some members of the family felt that way."

His father vowed to rebuild but was in failing health. So, it was up to Tom, who had been serving as his assistant, to find a way.

Eventually Tom came up with a complicated plan. He persuaded the village of Stickney, where the track is located, to issue \$10 million in industrial revenue bonds and arranged for Chicago's Continental Bank to buy the bonds. Then, Hawthorne entered into an agreement with the bank to pay the interest and principal and the bank made an arrangement with the builder that was akin to a mortgage.

Hawthorne was rebuilt and reopened on Feb. 18, 1980 for the last week of its harness meeting.

Enough with the negativity over Pennsylvania

Also, why Sunshine Meadows rules, why it's tough to get a mainstream advertiser for the Hambletonian, how to deal with a mare that grabs on and more.

Tidbits: I am sick and tired of the negativity about our sport on the Internet, in emails and newspapers alike. Let's make an attempt that if you don't have something good to say don't say anything. That seems to be an impossibility for some people.

There is no reason to blame Pennsylvania horsemen for an election-year ploy by the state's governor. What is to be gained by this? Nothing. Bringing up the names of directors and trainers in a demeaning way is to no one's advantage.

Jealousy in this sport spawns innuendo. All successful trainers are cheats and as soon as there is a positive test for some environmental problem there is a major rush to lynching. Training horses at the highest level is very difficult both physically and emotionally. The stress is greater than you can imagine. That's why the watering holes adjacent to the raceways are so successful.

The Pennsylvania problem is not as menacing as you may think. As I said last week, they did the same thing before and I am certain they will do it again. Much must transpire before Governor Wolf can raid our funds. Right now it's good banter for his followers with eight months to Election Day. I am not saying sit on our hands. We must pick up the fight immediately, however predicting the end of racing in the state is beyond ridiculous. Worst case scenario, I am wrong. Now remember the miracle the Canadians pulled off when the same thing happened in Ontario and they managed to get a long-term provincial subsidy for racing. I am sure we are up to the task.

Interesting note I picked up from Twitter. New Jersey sports betting was over \$540 million in the month of January. Las

Vegas has never had a month in its history where sports betting went over \$500 million. Very nice,.

Per Henriksen wrote me an interesting note. "In my opinion the license is a waste of time. Any bad apple that wants to own a horse just gets a friend to front for him. Same as a trainer with a suspension. The United States and Canada are the only two countries that require licensing. They are the only two countries that don't commonly have trailers behind the gate (i.e. larger fields). The only two countries that every race goes the distance of one mile. The only two countries that need slots or government assistance to survive. It's time for a change!" Very interesting.

I find it really amusing that that there are people out there that complain that I make too much of the training at Sunshine Meadows. Here's the deal. Since the closure of the training side of Pompano Park, Sunshine Meadows has become a major force in harness racing and the development of stakes performers. I will say that more great horses in the past 30 years have been broken and trained at Sunshine Meadows than any other training facility in the United States.

There are seldom more than 300 winter residents in the horse colony, yet they have produced almost one third of the Hambletonian winners and more than 40 Breeders Crown winners in that period. Add to that more than 30 per cent of the Kentucky Futurity champions and although I couldn't find records for the World Trotting Derby there were a significant amount of victories there.

The facility has only been in existence for 38 years. It has been home to some of the finest trainers in the sport. Howard Beissinger, Bruce Nichols, Oswaldo Formia, Per Eriksson, Trond Smedshammer, Jimmy Takter, Jan Johnson, Mark O'Mara, and his dad Frank, Chuck Sylvester, Jonas Cerneyzon, Steve Elliott, Dwayne Minor, Doug Miller, Tony Alagna, Peter Wrenn, Trent Stohler, Cassie Coleman, Domenico Cecere, Rick Zeron, Ross Croghan and Jeff Webster.

To those I left out I apologize. Sometimes old age gets a pass.

Please don't email me about Aiken or Ben White. My story is in the present, I know how great they were in the past.

Tom Santoro asks: How can you explain Joe Sharp having eight horses disqualified due to drug positives and additional cases pending in Kentucky?

In a simple answer: really bad luck.

The positive was for Levamisole a Class 2 drug that is used as a deworming medication for cattle and other farm animals. It has been used by Sharp and others as an immunostimulant and to treat EPM. He was given bad information.

The fact remains if you are using a new product on your entire barn, it would be smart to check with your veterinarian or a racing commission to find out if there are any ingredients in the medication that could result in positive tests.

When there are numerous positive tests, there was obviously no malintent involved, thus the commission fined Sharp but did not suspend his license.

Unfortunately, we have seen this in our sport but not to that great of an extent. My advice is you cannot be too careful.

Robert C Dill asks: I have a 4-year-old trotting mare that grabs on. I race her with a dog chain, snaffle bit and a leather chin strap. She is not comfortable the way she is rigged, can you make a suggestion?

No horse is comfortable with a dog chain. There are many ways to stop a puller and that's one I cannot ever use. Beat The Wheel was the deadest mouth puller I have ever seen. She made many a grown man cry. I did find two solutions to this problem, neither of which has ever failed. You must try both to see which one she is most comfortable with.

The first is a snake cord – not the kind you buy ready-made of leather, one you will make yourself. You need two nickel rings about a half inch in diameter, a woven nylon cord and 3/8 thick rubber tubing. I will not waste my readers' time explaining how to assemble it. Any tack shop or horseman over the age of 50 will show you. Now that I think of it, you probably taught me. If the horse has an average size jaw, I like to set the length at 13 inches to start and make it smaller or larger as needed. Don't be shy, make it tight, the rubber will prevent it from pinching. You may want to add a tie down as a filly will likely throw her head till she gets used to it. This will definitely work when fitted properly. Please add a check bit ear plugs and make sure she has an open bridle. All are a must with a puller.

My second choice and what I would consider a little more severe is a JIC bit. This bit will pinch on the cheeks of the filly the more she grabs on. Not a piece of equipment that pleases the animal and I have seen many throw themselves at first feel. Please be careful the first time you use it and walk the horse without a bike or cart before you try it on the track.

Drug laws are quite tight so there aren't many alternatives

to sedate your filly instead of using equipment, however if you do some research I am sure you will likely come up with a holistic product that will help you out and not endanger your trainer's license. Ask your veterinarian, he may be of help. Good luck.

Joseph Smith asks: Why can't the new Big M management attract advertisers from outside the industry to sponsor the Hambletonian, the premier event in harness racing in the United States?

Pretty much for the same reason CBS no longer carries the event on its main national network. Not only has interest in our sport plummeted, but sports in general have become so diluted almost every event has a smaller audience.

In the heydays of the Meadowlands, the Hambletonian was a major production on national TV. The show was an hour and a half showing the elimination races and giving background stories of the drivers and trainers, and up close and personal interviews with many owners. The production was over the top creative and took a week of preparation with Gary Siebel and Dave Johnson doing the color. The race was called the Cadillac Hambletonian. I even have a golf bag with that logo on it.

Think back to those days, only major sports were on television. Today, there is volleyball and lacrosse etc. The choices are out of control.

In today's market, if you are not a major sport, finding sponsorship for a marginally televised market is quite difficult. So please don't blame management for the situation they are in. I am sure they would love to have Cadillac back or any major brand name. It would be a big plus just to be back on national television.

Finding a spot to race his horses the toughest part for Shane Darish

Yet the third-generation driver, trainer and owner, based in New York, still has an unshakeable passion for the game.

Whether it's in the sulky or in the entries, Shane Darish admits it's not always easy to find the right spot.

There's certainly no questioning the 27-year-old New Yorker's unabashed affinity for standardbred racing.

A third generation horseman, the affable Darish, recipient of the 2018 Rising Star Award from the Monticello-Goshen Chapter of the United States Harness Writers Association, has a seemingly endless string of superlatives when it comes to harness racing.

That said, the driver/trainer/owner, who enjoyed several successes on the New York fair circuit ranks, readily acknowledges the challenges that come with being a smaller operation.

"One of the hardest things for me is finding places to race my horses," said Darish, who operates a small racing stable that sees its horses compete at a variety of venues, including Yonkers, Monticello, Tioga, Plainridge, and the Meadowlands. "I only have a barn of six to seven horses at a time, but when you realize you have horses to race at three different tracks on the same day... it's just me and my family. The best-case scenario is that we can get to two of those tracks, but there's no way we're going to be racing in three places at once."

Planning out the best odds for success isn't easy.

It can, on occasion, lead to more questions than answers.

"I find myself dealing with things like, 'Who do you leave out? What horse do you take to a certain track?' said Darish. "Sometimes finding the best spot to race is really tough. If you have Monticello, Yonkers and Plainridge all on the same day, if you go to Plainridge, you'll have to leave out Monticello and Yonkers."

Being a jack-of-all-trades isn't always a plus.

"For some people, they can race at Meadowlands and

Yonkers. They can race at one and drive across town to the other. When you're shipping, driving and doing a bunch of other things yourself, you can't do that. My biggest challenge is trying to find spots to race all my horses without being in conflict. You have to make tough decisions. That's my most difficult thing."

Yet, it's hardly enough to deter Darish from doing what he enjoys.

His love for the sport comes naturally.

Frank Darish, his grandfather, won the first race ever held on the re-configured half-mile track at Yonkers Raceway, when it converted from the mile track formerly known as Empire City. He headed a public racing stable starting in 1940 and ran it until he passed away.

Shane's father, John, a standardbred trainer and driver, launched the conditioning side of his career in 1977, winning three races from 27 starts in his rookie season.

Over the years, Shane, who won a New York Sires Stakes Fair Series Race for 3-year-old colts & geldings with Precious Bluechip in a memorial race named after his grandparents (Frank and Dotty Reilly), has been privy to plenty of helpful advice.

Many of those words still resonate with him.

“The way my family has always done it is that you just have to start by doing right by the horse, and then the business comes later,” said Darish, who is stabled in Crawford NY, about halfway between Goshen and Monticello. “If the horses are happy, healthy and sound, you’ll do well. You have to do what’s right by them for the long-term.”

That approach was no doubt a factor in his Rising Star honor two years ago.

Delighted with the award, Darish took a self-deprecating tone when he was given the good news.

“It was really cool and I joked to Chris Tully when he told me about it. I said, ‘Well, they must have had no one else.’ There are a lot of young people they could have given it to. It was very nice and it was much appreciated. I’ve grown up doing it and I know how tough it is to get recognition. It’s nice, even though I think there were other people that were more deserving. But, obviously, I’m very happy to have received it.”

And even on the toughest of days, challenges and all, Darish is content in doing what he does.

When his alarm goes off each morning, he’s reminded of where he’s headed to and what’s waiting there for him.

“What makes me happy to get up each day is that I get to go to the barn and see my horses. I have four I own myself and just going out to see them is more than enough incentive to get up. You get up and you get moving.”

But not always the first time he hears the alarm.

“It doesn’t stop me from hitting the snooze button five times,” deadpanned Darish.

And nothing, not even the times he’s faced with having to choose which racetrack he’ll take his horses to, is enough to diminish his passion for the sport.

“You’re optimistic every time you draw in and get the rail... that’s a good spot to be in. All kidding aside, it’s one of those things where you have to be optimistic about the sport because otherwise you wouldn’t be doing it. Obviously, there are a lot of other ways that take a lot less hours to make the same money, but I do this because I love this sport and I love the horses.”

Flight for horses from USA to Elitloppet taking shape, but may go through Belgium

Solvalla's sports director Anders Malmrot confirms it may be possible for American trotters to join a plane that will bring horses to Solvalla for the Elitloppet in the end of May.

"That's the way it is and the plane will go to Belgium, but if this is going to be a reality, we need really interesting horses that want to come. We have already booked a flight for the French horses from Paris to Stockholm and if we can connect any horses from America to that plane, it would be nice," Malmrot said. Marcus Melander has a couple of very interesting 4-year-olds in his barn and the successful trainer has obvious plans on making the trip with at least one of them.

"As far as I understand, there will not be a direct flight to Sweden and we haven't solved an eventual trip from Belgium to Stockholm, but I'm interested in going to Sweden with Gimpanzee this year," Melander said.

The Elitloppet gets a little bit more spicy and exotic when American trotters make the journey over the Atlantic ocean, that's a fact, but the logistic problems have to be solved before the European harness racing fans can see horses such as Manchego and Gimpanzee on a Swedish track.

"Manchego, together with Gimpanzee, is at the top of my list of horses that I'm interested in this year and I agree that the whole idea about Elitloppet is that the best trotters from all possible continents should compete over the mile at Solvalla. That case makes the whole event so much more spectacular for the active horsemen and the spectators," said Malmrot.

Reversed roles in Prix de France

The \$385,700 Prix de France over 1.3 miles was held at Vincennes racetrack last Sunday and once again, the top duo in the Prix d'Amérique earlier this year, played the main roles in the race.

Five-year-old Face Time Bourbon (Ready Cash), who was successful in the PdA two weeks earlier, had to struggle with a pretty bad post position when the car accelerated away

from the field and what seemed to be a surprisingly great trip for the Sébastien Guarato-trained trotter ended up a tactical one for Jean-Michel Bazire. Bazire's choice this time was Davidson du Pont (Pacha du Pont), who was runner up behind Face Time Bourbon in the PdA, and a quick start ended with a position first over while Uza Josselyn kept the strong pace in front.

Bazire knew that he had Björn Goop and Face Time Bourbon in his back, so instead of pushing for the lead, Bazire waited until three wide trotter Vitruvio was on his way forward towards the top duo. At that point Davidson du Pont could get the control in the lead and the most important thing for Bazire was that Face Time Bourbon didn't get the right cover in second over.

Eventually, Face Time Bourbon was seen in third over and when opponents attacked three wide and closed the door for Goop, Bazire had everything under control in front. What seemed to be an easy win for Davidson du Pont ended somehow in a spectacular home stretch battle since Björn Goop in some magic way found his way between horses with Face Time Bourbon. And the speed that both Face Time

Bourbon and third-placed Delia du Pommereux delivered was unique. They couldn't reach leader Davidson du Pont, who won in mile rate 1:54.2, but the impressions of them both was that they are something extra.

In the \$222,800 Prix des Centaures monté race, 6-year-old Evangelina Blue (Speedy Blue) started 25 meters behind the front horses in a 1.3 miles long race, but that handicap didn't bother the Jean-Philippe Mary trained mare. Evangelina Blue got encouraged by the high pace in front and she sprinted to safe win in 1:56.

Winbak Ontario open house and stallion showcase a smash hit

When Winbak Farm of Ontario brought in four new standardbred stallions to stand at its Inglewood, ON operation for 2020, Pat Woods said he knew the time was right for an open house and stallion showcase, but not without some trepidation about doing it in February in Canada.

“We were terrified because it costs a lot of money to do this. We had so many people behind it that we were just so worried about a bad day,” said Woods, the farm manager of Winbak Ontario. “You know what the weather in February can be like, and if we got a bad snow day, we would have had 30 people.”

Instead, the weather on Feb. 9 cooperated and Winbak played host to close to 10 times that number of guests who came to view the farm’s 11 stallions – including newbies Jimmy Freight, McWicked, Stag Party and The Bank – and wish Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame 2019 inductee Angus Hall a happy retirement from his stud duties. Winbak

also stands veteran stallions Archangel, Artspeak, Betterthancheddar, Bettor’s Delight, My MVP, Royal Mattjesty and Shadow Play at the former location of the famed Armstrong Bros. breeding farm.

“We had just shy of 300 guests and I was really pleased with how our stallions behaved and how our staff handled them and had them looking,” Woods said. “They came out and they looked as good as these horses are.”

Woodbine Mohawk Park race caller Ken Middleton, Jr. acted as emcee for the event and his colleague on the broadcast team at the Campbellville, ON track, Monique Vag, interviewed industry celebrities such as trainers Anthony MacDonald and Scott McEneny – who was reunited with his former trainee Bettors Delight – driver Louis-Philippe Roy and Jimmy Freight’s owner Adriano Sorella, a key part of the planning and promotion of the day. Sorella sponsored a couple of food trucks and arranged for a number of prizes to be given out to attendees to be given out through the afternoon.

Woods said Sorella’s involvement and marketing savvy helped grow an event that had been in the planning stages since December.

“When Adriano came in and said, ‘I’ll sponsor a food truck’ then more people started to jump on board and it just sort of took off,” Woods said. “A lot of it is that he’s thinking outside the box. He has a lot of knowledge in the advertising and marketing side of things and he has a lot of fun and he’s so passionate about the sport. He takes that passion and he’s not afraid to put his money and ideas behind things. And he’s there in full support, saying, ‘What do you need me to do? Would this work for you guys? I don’t want to step on any toes, but can we do this?’ He always asks permission, but he’s just got great ideas that help fuel the whole business and people love it. They love these little prizes, they love the advertising, they love the ideas he’s coming up with.”

Sorella said the open house was, “a huge success. I had many people approach me with questions on breeding, Jimmy Freight’s overall attitude, and what I thought of his overall racing style. I didn’t see one person not smiling during the day, and we did get decent weather for winter. Winbak was well organized and we had pretty much everything covered in the way of food. I hope we can do this

year after year. Who knows, maybe we’ll have a big summer barbeque.”

DOUBLING DOWN ON JIMMY FREIGHT

Two days after the open house and stallion showcase, Sorella also announced he was extending his \$100,000 Jimmy Freight Stakes at Woodbine Mohawk Park ([full story here](#)) for progeny of the stallion for at least a second year and has added \$20,000 in breeder bonuses for Jimmy Freight’s first crop, due to hit the racetrack in 2023.

“I was really looking to do something different when I announced the \$100,000 Jimmy Freight Stakes (to debut in 2023),” Sorella said. “It was so well received that I decided we would continue into 2024. I’ve been getting updates on his book and it’s a good one, so I decided to throw something else out – \$20,000 in breeder bonuses for the Jimmy Freight-sired of 2020. No gimmick here, he’s got close to a full book and that’s huge for Ontario. This is my way to say, ‘Thank you.’ I couldn’t imagine being happier for the response he got. I did hustle, but the support was one that I truly appreciate. I’m happy for my syndicate partners and we invite

others that might be interested. One thing's for sure, I will use all my advertising potential to support my syndicate partners, Winbak and, most importantly, Jimmy Freight."

Woods said Sorella's marketing savvy has already paid off for Jimmy Freight and Winbak Farm of Ontario.

"It just makes people look at things and say, 'Hey, I'm going to support that horse.' A little story here is that Adriano gave a prize to the Indiana year-end awards and there was a gentleman down there that thought that was a really nice thing for him to do. He bought a mare up here in Ontario and brought it to Winbak Farms to breed and he's breeding to Jimmy Freight for that reason, because (Sorella is) supporting people in the industry," Woods said, adding the open house led to direct business for some of the farm's other stallions, too. "We sold a couple of shares that day and we sold a bunch of breedings that came in this week, as well as some syndicate shares to a few of the stallions."

Woods reported fantastic support from a wide number of industry partners and associations and Winbak owner Joe

Thomson flew in from the United States to be at the farm despite a very busy week for his non-horse business Pacer Financial.

"I know he had one of his national conferences this week down in Florida and he didn't think he was going to make it up to the (Winbak) event," Woods said. "He called me Thursday night and said, 'No, it's too important. I'll be flying up.' He flew up in the morning and had to leave in the afternoon, but he felt it was too important not to be here."

Thomson, who also has Winbak Farm operations in New York, Pennsylvania, Delaware and the home base in Maryland, has long been a huge supporter of Ontario racing and breeding.

"He just feels that there's a lot of incentive," Woods said of Thomson. "He loves the racetracks up here, he loves the breeding program, the sires stakes and he's been relatively successful up here and he's been supported well at the sales by the Ontario buyers, so he continues to feel like he needs to support it. That was one of the big decisions about

putting the four new stallions here, to keep this industry and the Ontario market strong.”

Hats and swag bags were given out from Trot, Ontario Sire Stakes, Ontario Racing and Woodbine Mohawk Park. An incredible ride for Jim Avritt Sr.

Jim Avritt Sr. bought his first standardbred in 1963 when he was a senior at Xavier University and nearly 60 years later continues to enjoy the thrills of racing and breeding.

On Feb. 23 in Orlando, FL, Avritt's **Precocious Beauty** will be honored as the Pacing Broodmare of the Year at the U.S. Harness Writers Association's Dan Patch Award banquet. Precocious Beauty is the dam of Tall Dark Stranger, who that same night will receive the Dan Patch Award for best 2-year-old male pacer. Earlier this month, Tall Dark Stranger picked up the O'Brien Award in Canada.

Avritt bred and raced Precocious Beauty, who in 2013 also captured O'Brien and Dan Patch awards. Tall Dark Stranger, a Bettor's Delight-sired colt who sold for \$330,000 at the 2018 Lexington Selected Sale, was her second foal. Her first foal, an Avritt-owned filly by Somebeachsomewhere named Beautyonthebeach, was a two-time Kentucky Sire Stakes champion. She was retired following the 2019 season and will be bred to Bettor's Delight this week.

"It's incredible, really incredible," the 79-year-old Avritt said. "I never thought when I started out that I'd reach this point, that's for sure. I never dreamed at that time I would have something like Precocious Beauty down the road, either as a race filly or a broodmare.

"I can't wait (for the awards weekend). I'm going to hit some of the training centers on Saturday morning before heading to Orlando. I'm looking forward to it."

Avritt traces his successes to the purchase of Dominique Semalu as a broodmare in 1995. Dominique Semalu is the dam of Precious Beauty, whose offspring, in addition to Precocious Beauty, include O'Brien and Dan Patch awards winner Sportswriter and Grand Circuit winner Prescient Beauty. The family also includes the grandam of Dan Patch Award winner Downbytheseaside.

"I've said it before, if I hadn't been lucky enough to buy Dominique Semalu nobody would have ever heard of me," Avritt said. "I've sold some high-priced yearlings out of her. Although she didn't produce any really top stakes winners, she had good raceway horses that earned quite a bit of money, and every daughter she ever had turned out to be a

tremendous producer."

Avritt generally keeps fillies out of his broodmares and sells the colts. Precocious Beauty's third foal, a colt by Somebeachsomewhere named Beach Party, sold for \$190,000 last fall at Lexington. Avritt has kept a yearling filly out of Precocious Beauty, by American Ideal, named Elegant Beauty.

He also has a 2-year-old homebred filly out of Barefoot Beauty that he is training. She is by Shadow Play and named Barefoot'npregnant.

"She is a really, really nice filly," Avritt said. "She's probably as nice as anything I've trained. If she's good enough, she'll go up to Gregg (McNair) when he goes north from Florida. Otherwise, she'll stay down here and I'll race her some at the fairs and see how much she can improve."

Avritt still likes to drive in races, although he does not do it often.

"Every now and then I drive," he said. "I really enjoy that part of it. There is no feeling in the world like going behind the gate."

Even if he does not get on the track, the Kentucky resident still gets to enjoy watching his small broodmare band's offspring compete.

"I'm hoping it's not over yet," Avritt said. "I just wish I was younger so I could enjoy it a lot longer."

Monti 'made some big strides' in 2019

When opportunity knocked, Drew Monti answered. It led to the best season of the 25-year-old driver's career.

Monti was amid what he called a "pedestrian" campaign at his home track, Buffalo Raceway, when he was presented an opportunity to drive regularly at Plainridge Park. It gave Monti the chance to make new, as well as strengthen previous, connections and drive in an increased number of stakes. By the end of 2019, his purse earnings were a career-best \$2.24 million.

Prior to last year, Monti had driven in two races worth at least \$100,000. In 2019, he drove in 11. He won a Massachusetts Sire Stakes championship with Odds On Orlando and competed in Grand Circuit events at multiple tracks.

He did not arrive at Plainridge until early June, but with the notable backing of Lindy Farms, posted 89 wins the rest of the meet. Only Mitchell Cushing and Drew Campbell won more races during that time.

Monti also enjoyed success at Red Mile, winning 13 of 75 starts (only Dexter Dunn won more among drivers with fewer than 130 starts at the Lexington oval) while still finishing third in the standings at Buffalo and fourth at Batavia.

"It was definitely my best year so far, including exposure," Monti said. "It's nothing even compared to what I'd gone through. Even just going to Plainridge for Lindy Farms and stuff, I feel like I made some big strides as far as taking it to the next level.

"It's a great circuit at home, but if you really want to be in the game and do well, you have to get out there. Lindy really got me going. They got me out there and the rest of it snowballed from there. I'm very grateful to them for that."

Monti has kicked off this year by driving at The Meadowlands and Buffalo. It is his first trip back to the Big M since the winter of 2017. He has nine wins in 86 starts at The Meadowlands heading into this weekend's action, when he will have a total of 17 drives on Friday and Saturday.

"I talked with people about coming down and I'm glad I did," Monti said. "I'm happy to be there. It's been going pretty well, I think.

"It's hard to pick where you're going to go. You kind of go where you're needed. Obviously, you've got to have enough work to make it worth your while. Anyone can say they're going somewhere, but to actually compete and have enough work to make it worthwhile is the key."

Driver Drew Monti, 25, is coming off his best year in the game.

Monti, a Buffalo native, has won 1,532 races in his career with earnings of \$9.50 million. In addition to driving, he helps his dad, Darrin, with the family's training stable. The family ties make for difficult decisions when it comes to traveling.

"I don't think it's a secret, I love Buffalo," Monti said. "I'm not saying I would be opposed to moving anywhere, but I like the area I live in and I'm very close with my family. That was one thing that was difficult for me. You can't be everywhere all the time. You've got to make sacrifices. Sometimes it was with our own horses back home. I'd be watching our horses race and it was the first time I wasn't the one driving them. That said, I can see the rewards.

"I'm very happy with the last couple years and the way things have progressed. I'd like to continue at that pace. I'm not one to really push things. I like to kind of let it come to me. (Early last year) I was a little bummed because I wasn't doing that great at home. I was winning races, but it was just very pedestrian. It's funny; it just shows you how things can change."

Monti, who so far in his career has won two driving titles at Batavia and one at Buffalo, hopes to have a schedule similar to 2019 this year.

"I'm planning on going back to Plainridge, I'm planning to be available for stakes, Grand Circuit, stuff like that," Monti said. "I'll still make appearances at Buffalo as much as I can. It's hard to say because things can change so quickly and unpredictably. It's hard to plan exactly what you're doing."

Because you never know when opportunity will knock.

A laughing matter for McIlvain/Mears family

Janine McIlvain laughs when discussing the names of her family's racehorses. That's exactly what Janine's daughter Leigh intended.

Leigh was a teenager when she began naming the family's horses some number of years ago. It was her love of horses as a young girl that had helped prompt Janine's father, Bill Mears, and Janine's husband, Bob, to invest in their own passion and start racing and breeding standardbreds.

One of their homebreds, an 8-year-old pacing stallion, races Saturday in the first round of a Leap Year Series division at The Meadowlands. His name belies the fact he's hit the board in more than half of his 139 career starts and earned \$240,862.

He is Time Out I'm Tired.

"She's got a little quirky sense of humor," Janine said about Leigh. "When she was a little girl, all she wanted to do was horses. Of course, my husband and father were thrilled. They just went headlong into these horses. She loved it. She grew up around horses, helped with the horses, jogged horses.

"That's where the whole thing began, with a little girl about 4 years old wanting horses. That little 4-year-old grew up and decided to be funny with naming all of them. She is quite a character."

Time Out I'm Tired is a son of Artiscape out of Badlands Laura. The mare, named by Janine's father after the oldest of the McIlvain's two girls, is out of Hollys Premium. Janine's father and husband bought Hollys Premium for \$250 a little more than 20 years ago and all their homebreds are out of her or her daughters.

Around the McIlvain house, Time Out I'm Tired is known as



Timmy. So how did his name come about?

"When Timmy was born, we had not had a lot of what my father would call world-beaters," Janine said. "They would get so far and that would be it. So, Leigh said maybe these horses just need a little timeout during the race. So, she named the horse Time Out I'm Tired.

"We kind of laugh every time the announcer says the name because you would think he'd be at the rear of the pack. But he's doing okay. He's got a lot of heart. He doesn't like to lose. He likes to chase them at the end. Sometimes he's able to win, other times he's just a little bit short and we wish we had a couple more yards on that track."

Leigh had already showed her budding penchant for offbeat names before Time Out I'm Tired was born. She named Timmy's older sister Some Brown Horse just so she could hear track announcers say, "Here comes Some Brown Horse." Another family favorite is Justa Ordinary Guy, who is now 17 and living the life of Riley on the McIlvains' property.

Some of the names are related to family, such as Mean Janine.

"She thought that was funny," Janine said.

Janine, though, did laugh at the name, maybe because some years later there was a Jolly Janine.

Hurricane Joyce was named as a reference to the temper possessed by Janine's mom. Pretty Patty Pat was named after Bob's mom, who will turn 88 on St. Patrick's Day.

"There is a meaning behind all the horses' names," Janine said. "All from a quirky little girl who thinks it's funny to name these horses these names."

SBOANJ breeders incentive programs for 2020

The Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of New Jersey will again offer a resident mare rebate as well as pacing stallion incentive program in 2020.

SBOANJ membership is required to qualify for all programs.

The resident mare rebate will pay up to \$500 to owners of mares bred in 2020. A mare does not have to be bred to a New Jersey stallion, but must reside in New Jersey for 150 days up to and including foaling. Proof of foaling in New Jersey via U.S. Trotting Association registration is required. The mare rebate program will be capped at \$100,000.

The pacing stallion incentive program will rebate 15 per cent of the advertised stud fee, up to \$1,500, to the breeder of record as per the breeding contract. Stallions must breed at least five mares to be eligible for the rebate. Private treaties will receive a \$250 rebate. The pacing stallion

rebate program will be capped at \$150,000.
