9 ways horse racing can retain slot revenue

Lessons learned from Ontario's Slots at Racetracks Program.

Having had a front-row seat to both the beginning, full tenure and calamitous end to Ontario's Slots at Racetracks Program (SARP), I can contribute something of an educated opinion about horse racing's ever-tenuous relationship with slot machine revenue, subsidies and politicians.

Given the crisis in Pennsylvania ([full story here](#)), what follows is constructive suggestions for any jurisdiction where revenue from other gaming or taxpayer dollars is flowing to the horse racing industry.

One disclaimer first: the point here is not to admonish Pennsylvania's horse racing interests for what has not been done — because they have been more proactive than most when it comes to justifying the slot money. Rather, I wish to share what may be helpful to them and others because, make no mistake, at some point the politicians will come for the money everywhere. Chances are, those not well armed to defend it will be doomed to a similar sad fate suffered in Ontario.

1. Change the mindset

Fifteen years ago, before most horse racing jurisdictions had revenue from slot machines, Jeff Gural gave a quote that is as applicable now as it was then. Gural, who didn't own the Meadowlands Racetrack until six years later, equated horse racing's cut from slot machines to a human that receives a heart transplant.

"It's going to keep the patient alive for a little while, but it doesn't guarantee him a long life," Gural said.

The point is, horse racing must change its mindset about revenue that either comes from other forms of gaming or from the government directly in the form of either tax breaks or subsidies.

Yes, gaming companies and state coffers have benefited by having slots at racetracks and, yes, revenue is designed to compensate for the cannibalization of horse racing's wagering revenue, especially when machines have been installed in horse racing's houses.

But while those in the horse racing industry understand and appreciate those are solid grounds for compensation, try explaining those sophisticated arguments to the general public — much of which, sadly, doesn't know harness racing exists and believe, like this opinion piece in Saturday's *Philadelphia Inquirer* ([full story here](#)), that money going to horse racing is a taxpayer-funded subsidy better spent elsewhere.

Trying to successfully argue it's not a subsidy — even when it wasn't, as was the case in Ontario when SARP existed — is fraught with failure and is a waste of time.

Instead, the focus should be on appreciating the opportunity horse racing has been given by gaming or subsidies — or both — and being realistic that this new revenue stream is a short-term solution to help horse racing reach a position of self-sustainability and growth.

Since politicians can enact legislation that changes deals thought to be iron clad, it is important to remember that horse racing is not truly owed the money, it should not be entitled to it and it should not expect it to last forever.

That means, all facets of the industry — tracks, participants, racing regulators — are responsible for taking that golden opportunity and using it to...

2. Grow the game

The best way to grow the game and reach true sustainability is to get more people to buy horse racing's product — namely, gamble on it directly. That goes far beyond lowering takeout, though that's always a good place to start.

No doubt, growing handle isn't easy, particularly when one considers pari-mutuel wagering is a complicated form of gambling that requires a certain level of knowledge, frequently delivers meager returns and clearly lacks mass appeal.

To attract more handle, beyond lowering takeout, pari-mutuel wagering needs great innovation and expansion of its gambling menu.

Just like there's a million things one can bet on with respect to the Super Bowl, horse racing must create many more options to attract everyone from the novice bettor to the pro punter. Fixed-odds wagering, exchange betting, simplistic pick 'em tickets, more exotics. Heck, let's even get into some prop bets and over/unders. Give people a million different ways to bet on the races and make some of them fun and really simple.

Yes, that's going to require a lot of work with the various regulatory bodies that govern the sport, but that work is critical to horse racing's survival and a percentage of slot machine revenue or subsidies should be diverted to that cause.

3. Make gamblers our true partners

For far too long, horse racing has viewed itself as a game with two chief entities – tracks and participants – while leaving out perhaps the biggest partner, the betting customers.

Today, I'd argue that horse racing has four essential parts – bettors, tracks, participants (which includes breeders) and government (politicians and regulators).

Horse racing needs to treat bettors as a true partner, include them at the table and regularly consult them about the best ways to grow wagering.

Bettors are the group best equipped to articulate what is needed.

Those that continue to ignore them do so at their peril, just as it's perilous not to...

4. Spread the wealth

From horse racing's cut of slot revenue or a taxpayer dollars, it is prudent to set aside a generous percentage for improved gambling initiatives, marketing, infrastructure improvements, breeder incentive programs, animal welfare initiatives that specialize in care for horses after their racing careers, education, research, gambling addiction programs and significant charitable donations that are well publicized. Benchmarks need to be set and expenditures reviewed annually.

Ideally, all this should happen before money flows to purses – or if the money is already going to purses, some of it needs to be redirected to these initiatives.

Yes, that last part is controversial. Yes, purses are important for keeping participants in an expensive game. But those other initiatives are critical for keeping the money flowing that helps augment purses. If horse racing is able to grow wagering, the purses will grow, as well.

As for the importance of charity, I often wonder if the SARP program would still exist if Ontario's horse racing industry had, from the start, directed a percentage of the money to help build a children's hospital named something like the Ontario Horse Racing Children's Hospital and perhaps a school named the Ontario Horse Racing Institute. After all, the politicians that stripped away the program did so while making the bogus claim the money would be better spent on health care and education.

Charity is also key to maintaining a good relationship with politicians.

The trick is to spread the money as widely as possible across the entire state or province, help improve communities in each political district and be sure the politicians in that region know all about it.

Politicians love jobs, so one key area of focus for slot revenue or subsidies should be on strengthening...

5. The agricultural argument through breeders awards programs

Agriculture may not resonate strongly in urban centers, but in rural jurisdictions, where jobs are often scarce, agriculture is a key provider of employment.

Developing strong breeder reward programs that flow directly from slot revenue or subsidies is not only key to driving employment in rural areas, it can also increase tax revenue and help preserve green space. All are strong arguments political allies can make on behalf of the industry.

A strong rewards program also gives breeders the financial incentive to produce the horses necessary to provide full fields to drive handle which furthers horse racing down the road of self-sufficiency.

This is also another way for horse racing to prove it improved its product thanks to the helping hand of subsidies or slot revenue, all of which is pointless unless the industry

6. Market wisely

Admittedly, marketing horse racing is very challenging in an extremely competitive sports and entertainment environment. Simply saying we need to “market” or hire the correct marketing firm is not enough.

Instead, the industry must focus its marketing efforts on continually telling the public what horse racing has done to contribute back to the people of that jurisdiction in all the areas mentioned in the above section called “Spread the wealth.”

Beyond the contribution back to the state or province in terms of tax dollars and employment, horse racing needs to strongly tout its major charitable efforts, enhanced equine retirement programs, gambling addiction research and prevention, etc.

That process means horse racing must ...

7. Educate and support politicians

Continually thanking politicians for, and educating them about, the benefits of the slot or subsidy program is tantamount. That means work and money must go into producing critical, reliable data.

Politicians need to be told ad nauseam about how many jobs were created with the industry's share of slot revenue, exactly how much slot money is churning in the economy, exactly how much the program is returning to taxpayers, how else horse racing has used some of that money to help the taxpayers of that jurisdiction, how the program has improved a homegrown agricultural product — the quality of horseflesh — and, most importantly, how that money has helped horse racing get to a position of self-sufficiency.

Give politicians the tools to advocate powerfully on behalf of horse racing to their constituents.

Speaking to politicians also requires donations to them and horse racing must set aside its usual fractiousness, come together and...

8. Speak with one resounding, positive voice

Politicians frequently pound home the message that horse racing needs to speak with one clear voice that represents the will of all of its factions. Sadly, we often ignore that message.

Our politicians have told us explicitly that they do not want to hear complaints from different horse racing groups with different agendas. They especially don't like to hear complaints from an industry that receives strong financial support.

To carp about one's lot in life only increases the likelihood politicians will consider the money flowing to horse racing best served elsewhere, particularly in areas more politically expedient to their re-election, because, sadly...

9. Horse racing is not viewed as critical

Those that derive their livelihood from horse racing — no matter how much they love it and how hard they work at it — must never forget that horse racing is not considered a vital activity by the vast majority of the public. Certainly it does not supersede a long list of mainstream concerns such as health care, education, taxes, infrastructure, defense, safety, transportation, etc.

Staying modest and grateful and understanding where horse racing stands in greater society is critical to working hard to keep the funding, achieving greater public recognition and respect and avoiding a dangerous sense of entitlement that can lull one into complacency.

Only that way will this critical money keep flowing as long as possible to give horse racing the chance it needs to survive on its own.

The story of how Southern Oaks became the finest training center in Florida

Steve and Cindy Stewart were visitors at The Deck on Wednesday morning.

They were on their tour of the Florida training centers, which is an annual prelude to the beginning of the breeding season at their Hunterton Farm at Stoner Creek Stud in Kentucky.

They started up north in Ocala where they visited with their equestrienne daughter and worked their way south.

Although all of the training centers have their pluses, Steve couldn't stop raving about Southern Oaks, now owned and managed by the Pinske family and built and formerly owned by John Simpson Sr.

I've always referred to it as Horse Heaven. Steve replied that it is not only Horse Heaven, but also People Heaven for the people who are fortunate enough to live and work there.

The only negative I can possibly come up with relative to the place is that it's possible that Ben White Raceway, a formerly treasured place in Orlando, might still be a functioning entity if not for the building of the Simpson Training Center.

Throughout the years of its existence beginning in 1948 and named to honor one of the greatest horsemen in harness racing history, Ben White Raceway was known as The Winter Capitol of Harness Racing.

Before the establishment of Pompano Park, the majority of the greatest names in the history of the sport winter trained there.

When Pompano was built, stables such as those of Bill Haughton and Delvin Miller headed south, but a significant number of the outstanding horsemen who had made the place their winter headquarters remained.

The stables of John Simpson, Sr. and John Simpson, Jr. were certainly among the most prominent remaining.

Simpson, Sr. had long been an outspoken opponent of hub rails. He was of the firm opinion that they served no useful purpose, but perhaps most importantly represented a significant danger to both the horses and those sitting behind them, especially since close to the majority of the horses being trained there were coming 2-year-olds getting their first lessons.

One winter, John, Jr. was training an Albatross colt that he felt was his best 2-year-old. Something spooked the colt and he went over the hub rail, subsequently breaking its neck.

Simpson, Sr. was incensed. What he had long predicted had come to pass.

He went to Herman Holland, the track superintendent and demanded that the hub rail be removed. Holland said that he felt he couldn't do that unilaterally without the consent of the majority of the horsemen there. He called a horsemen's meeting and asked them to vote on the issue.

Surprisingly, the proposal was defeated and the hub rail remained.

To this very day, not a single person who voted for it has given me a reasonable reason as to why they voted the way they did.

Simpson, Sr. told his son Jim, "To hell with those fools. We'll build our own training center. We'll move ours and Johnny's stables there and let these guys keep their hub rail."

Not only was this a significant loss to the horse population

of Ben White Raceway, it resulted in a loss of about a third of its equine population. But perhaps more importantly, it was a political blow to its future.

Simpson, Sr. had been a long time resident of Orlando. During that time he had made it his business to get to know all the mayors and politically influential people in the city.

He continuously let them know of the political and economic value of Ben White Raceway and its many contributions to the city.

Losing Simpson, Sr. caused the remaining horsemen irreparable harm in the halls of Orlando City Hall.

By that time, Simpson, Sr. was totally blind. Thus, he delegated his youngest son Jim to do the spade work for the building of his dream training center.

He purchased a large tract of land about a half hour northwest of Orlando.

He told Jim that he wanted trees, lots of trees. Jim purchased numerous saplings and had them planted. Those saplings today are a collection of beautiful full grown trees that are certain to impress anyone who enters the grounds.

Most importantly, he wanted to take care of the horses living there as well as possible.

Large airy stalls were built.

He wanted paddocks, lots of roomy paddocks; not the small kind found at many training centers that quickly turn to mud from lack of space and over use.

Most of all, he wanted a great racetrack. He told Jim to build a racetrack patterned after the one at Springfield. Although he was quite reliant on his sense of hearing due to his blindness, he said "I want the track to have a great cushion, so that I don't hear the horses when they go by."

All of his goals were accomplished.

Today and for many years previous, it has been the finest such facility of its type.

In the meantime, Ben White Raceway began to flounder. The loss of a third of its equine population was devastating.

Even worse, and in many ways the supreme irony, was that many of the horsemen who had voted against the proposal to remove the hub rail left the track and moved to the better equipped training center that didn't have one.

Great things come in threes

by Bob Heyden

Two dozen memorable trios in our sport's history:

1. Trainer Gene Riegler sending out this incomparable trio: in 1990 2-year-old Artsplace, in 1991 2-year-old Western Hanover and in 1992 2-year-old Life Sign. All won the Governor's Cup and went on to fabulous careers.

2. Only three drivers in the last 50 years have led in both wins and earnings in the same season – Herve Filion seven times and once each for Jack Moiseyev (1991) and Tim Tetrick (2007).

3. Remember the 2016 free-for-all class? Does it get any better than Freaky Feet Pete, Wiggle It Jiggle It and Always B Miki? (The 1-2-3 finishers in the Ben Franklin in early July). Two of the three were voted Horse of the Year.

4. Jimmy Takter's 2014 Hambletonian trio of favorite Father Patrick and the second and third favorites, who finished 1-2, Trixton and Nuncio.

5. Tim Tetrick's three seasons of \$18 million, the only three in the sport's history – 2007 \$18,350,047; 2008 \$19,752,066; 2012 \$18,529,676.

6. Billy O'Donnell's fabulous trio of stars in 1984-1985 – 1984 HOY Fancy Crown, 1985 HOY Nihilator and Hambletonian winner Prakas. No driver since has had the HOY back to back with two different horses – a trotter and a pacer.

7. Steve Elliott's 1988 season of three divisional winners – 2YOCT Valley Victory, 2YOCP Totally Ruthless and 3YOFP Sweet Reflection.

8. Bob McIntosh winning three divisional titles in 1998, all pacers – 2YOCP Island Fantasy, 2YOFP Mattaroni and 3YOCP Artiscap.

9. In 2015, three geldings for the first time ever were the first three to reach \$1 million that season – Wiggle It Jiggle It, Wakizashi Hanover and Pinkman.

10. Muscles Yankee siring three straight Hambletonian

winners in 2008 Deweycheatumnhowe, 2009 Muscle Hill and 2010 Muscle Massive.

11. San Pail taking three straight Maple Leaf Trots – 2009-2010-2011.

12. Mack Lobell winning three straight Breeders Crowns in 1986, 1987 and 1988. It is the only time this has happened with the same driver for a trotter (John Campbell). NOTE: Bill Fahy did it on the pacing side with Jennas Beach Boy.

13. Rambling Willie taking the Older Pacing Title in 1975-1977.

14. Bill Robinson sending out a different single-season double millionaire three times in a four-year span – 1991 Precious Bunny (\$2,217,222); 1993 Presidential Ball (\$2,222,166) and 1994 Cams Card Shark (\$2,264,714).

15. Three Breeders Crowns non-consecutively for Grades Singing (1986-1987-1989), the first to win three times but not in a row.

16. Jennas Beach Boy winning the Breeders Crown in 1994-1995-1996. He still the only pacer to win the Breeders Crown three straight years.

17. Three Triple Crowns for Stanley Dancer – 1968 Nevele Pride, 1970 Most Happy Fella and 1972 Super Bowl. He is the only trainer to do this three times.

18. Foiled Again three straight years as the Older Pacer of the Year in 2011-2012-2013.

HISTORIC HARNESS SITES



with DEAN HOFFMAN

Remembering Walnut Hall Farm and Pop Geers Park

Part of a continuing series on historic locations in American harness racing.

Walnut Hall Farm, Lexington, KY

It is the grand dame of the Bluegrass trotting nurseries.

It covers a couple thousand acres of the best land in the Bluegrass for raising horses, and Walnut Hall Farm has sent forth stakes winners over a span of three centuries, starting when it was established in 1892.

The original Walnut Hall covered 4,000 acres, but over the decades the farm has been divided among the descendants of founder Lamon V. Harkness.

Today, Walnut Hall is divided, like Gaul of ancient lore, into three parts: Walnut Hall Stock Farm, Walnut Hall Ltd, and Dunroven Stud. They are owned, respectively, by Katherine N. Sautter, Meg Jewett Leavitt, and Martha N. Brown. The scale of the breeding operations is much reduced from the prime years in the first half of the 20th Century when Walnut Hall Farm stood at the top of the sport.

It's remarkable that Hanover Shoe Farms in Pennsylvania is approaching its centennial in less than a decade, but Walnut

Hall Farm had been breeding champions for more than three decades before Hanover was established.

A walk in the stately Walnut Hall cemetery (now on property that is part of Walnut Hall Ltd.) gives you a full appreciation of this Bluegrass nursery's impact. A statue of Guy Axworthy, one the great stallions of the early 20th century, stands sentinel over dozens of other immortals.

Not far from the Guy Axworthy rest the remains of Volomite and Scotland, two stallions that surged to the top of the stallion ranks after Guy Axworthy's passing. Both Volomite and Scotland sired extreme speed and class on both gaits. The powerhouse pacing line of Somebeachsomewhere goes back to Volomite as do many trotting stalwarts. The trotting line of Valley Victory takes you directly back to Scotland.

It is altogether fitting and proper, to steal a phrase from native Kentuckian Abe Lincoln, that Guy Axworthy be honored with a statue at Walnut Hall. He came to the

Bluegrass not long after it had been established and shot to the top of the ranks of trotting stallions.

Guy Axworthy was 24 years old when the first Hambletonian was contested, but his sons Guy McKinney and Guy Dean finished first and second. In the second Hambletonian, sons and daughters of Guy Axworthy swept the first three places, led by the filly Isola's Worthy. Guy Axworthy sired his final Hambletonian winner at age 28, and that colt Lord Jim won after his sire was resting in the Walnut Hall cemetery.

The year that Guy Axworthy sired Lord Jim, Walnut Hall got a new kid in the stallion barn, a 4-year-old named Volomite. He established himself immediately among the top stallions in the breed and reinforced that repeatedly over the next several decades.

Volomite was the most influential standardbred stallion of the 20th century because his prepotency allowed him to sire both trotters and pacers of extraordinary merit. His best trotters were the brothers Volo Song and Victory Song, Lusty Song, Worthy Boy, Kimberly Kid. Duke of Lullwater, Chestertown, and Scotch Rhythm.

The best pacers sent forth by Victory Song were the brothers King's Counsel, Chief Counsel, and Blackstone – as well as Sampson Hanover, Goose Bay, White Mountain Boy.

Such trotting sires as the brothers Conway Hall, Andover Hall, and Angus Hall, Credit Winner and the extraordinary young sire Walner are others from the Volomite line.

A few years after Volomite took up residence in the historic stone stallion barn at Walnut Hall, he was joined by Scotland, a stallion that would leave his own remarkable impact on the breed. His best were the *Born To Trot* filly Rosalind and Hambletonian winners Hoot Mon and Spencer Scot.

Scotland sired a remarkable five Hambletonian winners and his son Hoot Mon sired a trio. But that branch of the Scotland line ultimately withered while the line from Spencer Scott-Rodney-Speedster is indeed vibrant.

For virtually two decades from the mid-1930s until the mid-1950s, trotting stakes were basically dominated by the get of Volomite and Scotland.

Walnut Hall also suffered its share of disasters. It invested heavily in the royally-bred stallion Algiers in the 1940s, only to see him flop badly. A decade later, the Nichols family went after the exciting young stallion Demon Hanover and paid dearly to acquire him, but Demon died after just a year at Walnut Hall.

In 1967, lightning struck a yearling barn at Walnut Hall, and 20 yearlings by such sires as Adios, Star's Pride, Tar Heel and

others perished.

In America's Bicentennial year, Walnut Hall sold a yearling colt named Abercrombie for a modest price, then watched him become Horse of the Year in 1978 and later an incredibly influential stallion.

Like Old Man River, Walnut Hall keeps rolling on and its influence on harness racing is indeed enduring.

Pop Geers Park, Columbia, TN

How many city parks do you know that honor a harness horse trainer and driver?

None?

Think again because you'll find Pop Geers Park in the heart of Columbia, Tennessee, a city in the southern part of the state also known as the home of President James K. Polk.

Alas, Edward F. Geers – known to all during his life as “Pop” – is virtually forgotten now, but he was a towering figure in harness racing for the first quarter of the 20th Century.

He was a master trainer and driver, and his integrity and character were never questioned. He was revered by all in the sport.

Geers died as a result of injuries suffered in a racing accident at Wheeling, WV on Sept. 3, 1924.

Before the races that day, the Grand Old Man shook hands with a Pennsylvania lad whose grandfather brought him to see Geers and the trotters and pacers in action.

That youngster from Pennsylvania was Delvin Glenn Miller, and after he returned from military service in World War II, Miller vaulted to the pinnacle of his profession, gaining the same widespread admiration that Geers enjoyed in his lifetime.

Geers was known as "The Silent Man From Tennessee" because he preferred to let his horses do the talking on the track. He also was not the kind to criticize others in the sport. Much like Miller, Geers saw the good in people.

His integrity was unquestioned. It wasn't unusual, even then, for race fixers to approach drivers to stiff a horse to cash a bet, but Geers gave them the cold shoulder.

"Temptation knocks unheeded at your door and hurries on to fields the promise more," wrote harness racing's poet laureate Walter Palmer in tribute to Geers.

Columbia is a city of 40,000 residents about 45 miles south of Nashville. Pop Geers Park is a tidy and nicely-landscaped urban haven with a granite spire that measures 45 feet. It was dedicated in 1926, two years after Geers died in West Virginia.

Although Geers was born in rural Wilson County in 1851, he came to call Columbia his home when he established his racing stable. His career on the track began in the high-wheel sulky era and evolved with the bicycle tire sulkies that came into vogue in the 1890s. Geers trained and

drove countless stars, many of whom are long forgotten today, but his fastest horse was Napoleon Direct p, 1:59-3/4, a free-legged pacer that wore elbow boots. Napoleon Direct sired Billy Direct, whose 1938 time at Lexington gave harness racing its first 1:55 mile.

Speaking of Billy Direct, he was foaled just north of Columbia near the small community of Spring Hill, TN. There is an historical marker on the east side of US Rte. 31 which marks the farm where the champion pacer was born.

Drive a little further north on Rte. 31 and you will notice another historical marker, this one on the west side of Rte. 31. That honors the birthplace of Star Pointer, the first 2:00 pacer with his epic mile occurring in 1897.

Surely, few residents of Columbia today understand the significance of Pop Geers, but Tennessee was once a hotbed of harness racing and the Pop Geers Park is a worthwhile stop for anyone traveling in the mid-South.

In a poem written just before Geers' death, Walter Palmer spoke for everyone in harness racing with these lines:

*"May time and tide that do not wait
Deal kindly with us here below
But may they please just hesitate
"Doggone it, Pop, we love you so."*

“Your feelings were hurt?”

“Hell no, Trey is used to rejection. I’ve been rejected by the best. Rejection for me is like when the experimental radioactive spider bites Peter Parker and turns him into Spiderman.”

“Then what happened, Spidey?”

“I gave the farm 24 hours to call back with a counter offer. My phone didn’t buzz, so I called stallion farm number two on my list and repeated that I’d like to breed my mare to their stallion. I would pay \$1,500. Their swift answer was – ‘Okay.’”

Make a deal, your best deal, for Nothing But Class (click here). If your mare catches in April, you pay the contracted price. However, if your mare does not catch until May, you take an additional 10 per cent off the contracted price, and if your mare does not catch until June, you take yet another 10 per cent off the contract price.

"Meh," he said.

"Meh...what the heck does that mean?"

"It means I don't think it's a game-changing idea, which is a polite way of saying your idea stinks."

View from Australia on product availability

RE: Brett Sturman's last column ([full story here](#)).

Monmouth Park has entered into an agreement with the Australian firm BetMakers to offer fixed odds wagering on their 2020 meet. Will it help? Who knows? But fixed odds wagering is a huge hit in Australia and is seen as one of the main reasons why purses have doubled there over the past seven to 10 years. Harness racing needs to try this.

Wagering is a very important issue as you have stated. But of course wagering is dependent upon product availability.

Over the past 10 years in Australia, whilst purse money has increased for various reasons, the number of mares served per season has declined every year from 7,941 to 4,624 or – 3,317 (42 per cent).

Race fields of 5 and 6 are now not uncommon and these do not attract viable wagering – fixed odds or pari-mutuel and this weakness can only grow into the future.

There is little hope that fixed odds betting in Australia will save the sport when there is not enough product to generate sufficient wagering demand (very little income is forthcoming from the few tracks that have slots).

As I have said for many years, the sport's future is totally reliant upon on track attendance which converts to loyal fans who become the owners and breeders that pay for the product – it's that simple.

Detailed suggestions for improving harness racing

In response to your article written by Bill Finley ([full story here](#)), I am sharing suggestions I recently sent to five prominent Florida residents to help harness racing here. Perhaps it is too early, but nobody has responded. My suggestions can be used as a model anywhere in the U.S. My letter was, as follows:

Fellow harness racing participants,

As an investment broker for 50 years, I did a lot of research, including surveys to the public regarding the various forms of gambling. I have been involved in harness racing for 45 years. However, in the early '80s, as an investor in U.S. industries, I began to acquire shares in slot machine manufacturers, and in casinos. As a futurist, I saw what would be taking place. Also, I wrote articles in *Hoof Beats* warning of the demise of racing because of forthcoming changes in gambling legislation. I was spot on. My conclusions are based on years of research and not merely on my opinion. The general public thinks harness racing is boring and that races are fixed. Fact.

Of interest to the FSBOA, a few years ago, the Minnesota Harness Racing Association flew us (all expense) to the track where we spent several days with the officials who invited my wife Loveda to become manager of their organization. Because of Minnesota's cold winters, Loveda declined.

As permanent, 12 months a year Florida residents since 2001, we would be an asset to a program to preserve and expand the sport of harness racing in Florida. We both have held executive positions in the business world and have

raced horses for 45 years. We are currently retired, so have ample time.

Projects/reforms will include, but not be limited to the following:

1. A think tank group should be organized with the intention of working with Pompano Park, trainers, drivers, the FSBOA, legislators, etc. to save, change, and expand the Standardbred industry in South Florida. Our ultimate mission will be to create a model for the other racetracks and harness racing entities throughout the country to follow.

This group will consist of only a handful (too many people and sometimes a conflict of egos can cause confusion) of interested people who can exchange ideas, and then implement the agreed upon changes in a diplomatic, yet forceful manner. There are enough South Florida Standardbred influential and intelligent owners that, for the time being, I see no reason to search outside our region. Of course, we would not omit those interested outside of Florida.

2. A vocational school for high school age individuals who need to be in an educational environment advantageous to their personalities. A new vocation. This will take place at Pompano Parke, Sunshine Meadows, or the Trotting Center.

3. An equine therapy for veterans and emergency response individuals suffering with PTSD. Loveda and I researched this extensively and were prepared to launch a program at the Trotting Center, but Sam Stathis, the owner, seemed to lose his enthusiasm. A year ago, Sam was in favor, but in the meantime, he seemed to lose interest in either the program or us. This program will be unique because we will use only retired standardbreds which will create an opportunity for those with PTSD to gain an interest in our sport, but it will also create an opportunity for South Florida individuals to financially support it. A new vocation for the horses, and perhaps the ones suffering with PTSD.

4. Because Pompano Park is planning to oust harness racing, I believe they would be willing to experiment with select elements. Although Pompano Park may want us to fail, and to fail quickly, we will be able to make harness racing more exciting. We begin by making a video with questions for racetrack and casino customers as they enter and exit the track. This approach will give us a roadmap based on WHAT THE CUSTOMER wants, rather than rhetoric from horsemen who express only their viewpoints. We will give a new face to harness racing.

Racing needs many changes made. Some of my ideas, which I will discuss with you at a later date, may seem radical to some, but we need radical.

5. I have the following in one of my Facebook groups: :THIS IS WHAT THE INDUSTRY NEEDS: Recruit new owners worldwide, via fractional partnerships, who will become big fans as they watch the races via the Internet on their big-screen TV's, who will recruit new owners via fractional partnerships, who will become big fans, who recruit new owners, etc., etc., etc."

South Florida is an excellent geographical area in which to regenerate interest in harness racing. There is an abundance of retired folks living here with disposable income and plenty of time. Many are bored. We will buy and-or claim a few horses and give them to a worthwhile trainer, while teaching the new owners how to watch and wager on the races from the comfort of their homes.

This venture will be an experimental seed.

6. We will do human interest stories on those not as fortunate as Ron Burke, Tony Alagna, etc. The general public is not interested in how the elite with the \$100,000 yearlings are doing but they are interested in those of us with dirt under our fingernails and even some success stories from people with dirt under their fingernails.

7. Harness racing has all of the ingredients to be an interesting and exciting movie or reality type show. We have rich folks, poor people, sweat, tears, competition, and best of all – horses. With a lot of thought, we will make plans for something that will take our story to the homes of people currently bored with the garbage on TV. At one time, cowboy movies had the attention of almost every American. We will bring back entertainment that will be enjoyed by the young and the old. The ultimate goal will be to go into home nationally, but it can begin in Florida.

We have many more ideas, but those listed above will give you an idea of our thoughts.

Also, we believe that a team of enthusiasts could make a tremendous national impact – one that would influence others in the racing zones to become involved.
