

Harness Racing Update

Richard Moreau was joking. He's doing just fine in his own right.

Moreau, 54, this month was named Canada's outstanding trainer for an unprecedented sixth consecutive year, after accumulating 315 wins and a career-high \$4.6 million in earnings in 2018. At his regular pick-up hockey game, he was likened to six-time Super Bowl champ Tom Brady.

"It's gratifying, and motivating, but I'm not somebody who looks for attention. I keep my two feet on the ground. The only publicity that matters for me is results," Moreau said over lunch during a visit to Montreal to see his parents and son Gabriel, 21, a university student.

Although he's based now in Ontario, Montreal is where Moreau got his start in harness racing almost four decades ago.

A neighbour, Robert Galardo, used to take him to the races at the now-defunct Blue Bonnets track, where Moreau got to watch driver/trainer Raymond Gingras (Yannick's dad), married to his father's sister Monique.

Horses hadn't been part of Moreau's daily life growing up. His father, Roland, worked in finance, and his mother, also named Monique, was a teacher. But there was something about the sport that captivated him from an early age.

"My uncle Raymond was my idol back then," he said. "Now it's Yannick."

Through the Gingras family, Moreau landed a job at Blue Bonnets as a groom, working for several trainers.

He was also studying finance in college, and not liking it much.

"I'd go to school two days and the racetrack on the others. I was happier working outside than in. I quit school for the horses at 19, but I didn't tell my parents for two weeks," Moreau said. "They weren't pleased. But things changed over time. Now, my mom is my biggest fan. She watches all the races. She's congratulating me for wins before I'm even aware of them sometimes."

Moreau said his progression in the sport was more steady than remarkable, with some good breaks along the way.

One of his dad's co-workers at the bank helped him buy his first horses.

When driver/trainer Daniel Dube exited Quebec to take his shot in the U.S., he left behind half his stable, with Moreau as the recommended trainer.

When the Quebec racing industry fell on hard times at the turn of the century and Moreau shifted his base to Ontario, his contacts in his home province ensured a steady supply of new stock.


He quickly made a name for himself at Windsor Raceway before gradually upgrading his stable and expanding his reach to virtually all tracks in the province, including the biggest one, Woodbine Mohawk Park, where he was leading trainer in 2018.

After a long association with Sylvain Filion, "who I really respect," Moreau now has Louis-Philippe Roy as his main driver, but the size and spread of his operation means he actually employs several.

"I try to get the best driver possible. That's always been my way," he said.

In a sport where fortunes often fluctuate wildly, Moreau has been a model of consistency. He's topped 100 victories every year since 1996, winning with more than 20 per cent of his starters, to push his career total beyond 5,600. His stable has exceeded \$1 million in earnings annually since 2000 for a total of more than \$54 million and he's done it the hard way, in the trenches.

Although he's had a few major stakes winners along the way, including 2018 O'Brien Award recipient Jimmy Freight and 2013 Metro Pace victor Boomboom Ballykeel, Moreau's stable consists primarily of overnight horses entered wherever they can be competitive. His three trailers are



constantly on the road.

"I'm not a dreamer," he said, "I didn't have the bankroll starting out to breed or buy yearlings or the time and patience to wait to see if they'd be stakes horses. I preferred horses who were developed already. It worked and I stuck with it. I think I've proved myself, but I paid my dues. I persevered."

His is a high-turnover operation, with an average of one horse moving in or out every day. "I respect the animals, but I don't fall in love with them. We've usually got about 60 horses, but we've been up to 80. I always have room," said Moreau. "Normally, we'll have 11 to 14 racing on any given night. One Saturday, we had 24 in. At this point, I'm used to overseeing a large number of horses and so is my staff of 10. Everybody knows the routine. Everybody knows their job. I can do the entries now in about 20 minutes."

He's been asked about expanding into the U.S., but so far hasn't been tempted. "I've got my hands full here and I'm happy. I've already travelled plenty in my life."

While his profile in the industry has never been higher, Moreau's vision of success has little to do with awards.

He's proud of the fact respected trainers such as Marcel Barrieau and Dustin Jones entrusted horses to him this winter when they headed south. He's proud of the 45-acre farm near Mohawk that he now owns outright. He's also a newlywed, having tied the knot with his girlfriend of four years, Cheryl McGill, in November.

McGill, 32, a former show jumper and thoroughbred exercise rider who knew little about standardbreds, was working in security at the Mohawk paddock when Moreau invited the mother of two to lunch.

"It couldn't be dinner because we both worked in the afternoon," she said.

They hit it off immediately.

"He's humble, he's quiet, he's level, he's always the same person no matter what day it is or what's going on," she said.


"When I come home," said Moreau, "that's when I most have a sense of accomplishment."

Harness racing's "no try" races need a dose of transparency

Judges' notes and driver interviews can help stop the bleeding.

We've seen it more times than we can count. A fast horse is odds-on, but the driver fails to put the horse into the race, finishing a fast-flying fourth. Immediately after the race, in the grandstand or on social media, there's a cacophony of criticism – some fair and some surely unfair – about the driver, trainer, and the entire sport of harness racing.

Meanwhile at the track, whether it be the backside, the judges' room, or the announcing booth, there are crickets. Everyone knows what they just saw, but it's like it never happened. This acts like gasoline on a July brush fire, because these already frustrated customers find they are yelling into a vacuum.

From people inside the industry whom I speak with from time to time, there seems to be little alarm about this practice; it's just the way it is, and it's not a big deal. In my view this is not reality, and comments I read from customers frequently illustrate it.

In our experience, we know some drivers won't put forth an effort with well-bet chalk for a few reasons like these:

- i) The horse had some terribly tough trips and the connections want to cover him up.
- ii) The horse is not grabbing the track, or doesn't feel very good and the driver believes the horse's best chance to win is sitting or tripping out.
- iii) It's a bad post this week, and the trainer wants to wait for a better one.

The first two reasons are understandable; the third one much less so (and it's probably worth another column). However, they are a part of racing horses, and have been forever.

My question is: Why are the powers in harness racing unable to admit as much, and why are they so afraid to put forth policy to make things better?

I think there's something the sport can do.

I believe the easiest way to address this issue is through the judges. When a horse is 2-5 and is buried, it is incumbent upon those who officiate the races to ask the driver why, and let the public know. This is simply sound policy — it ensures nothing nefarious is going on, and if it's done in a systematic way, bettors will have their questions answered.

This information could be placed in barn notes on the track




website, or for the most progressive tracks, in the program. Unless the drive was particularly egregious, I don't think fines are needed because the drivers will get the message. It just might make the races better.

Another way I believe no tries can be handled – and I fully realize drivers would not be a fan of this — is through driver interviews. Do you ever notice that at track after track we hear from the driver of the winner, but never the well-bet loser who raced terrible, or was buried in an odd drive? This should be easy enough to change. Via an after-race interview, the driver can be fully transparent – he or she can relay how the horse was not on the bit, was not grabbing the surface, or, in some cases, the driver can simply say "I screwed up". Bettors might not like their answers, but some will, and it's infinitely better than the silence they currently get.

For the very rare time something untoward did actually happen and "the fix was in," the above policies will probably make drivers and connections think twice about doing it again. If you know you'll be called up by the judges, or interviewed on camera, wouldn't you?

In 2011, when Theo Epstein took over as general manager of the Chicago Cubs he said, "something as simple as


transparency is really scalable because it quickly impacts the culture. And the culture is something everyone feels."

Harness racing's customers (and some participants, truth be told) are pleading for a culture change, and they want to feel that change. It can be achieved one policy at a time. Why not get started?

Her being named Pacing Mare Of The Year is especially interesting considering:

- It's never been done before by a Down Under-bred female.
- It is the first time such an honoree won better than \$1 million.
- It has been 50 years since a Down Under-bred was rewarded in the post-season banquet 1968 Cardigan Bay (Older Male Pacer of the Year). He was the first millionaire of either breed male, or female. Shartin N is the first 4-year-old or older pacing female to topple seven figures in a single season.
- JoAnn Looney and Jim King, Jr. are now the only duo to have a million-dollar earning single-season male pacer (Wakizashi Hanover in 2015) and a female over age three do the same.

The Butler didn't do it

Adios Butler that is.

He was the 1960 and 1961 Horse of the Year, but trainer Paige West and driver Eddie Cobb are the only two trainer and driver combo to win a back-to-back Horse of the Year title and not make the Hall Of Fame.

This also happened to Pat Crowe, but he alone trained and

drove the great Cam Fella in 1982 and 1983 to his consecutive awards as HOY.

Revisiting Tetrick's super seven

In 2012, Tim Tetrick was the driver behind seven divisional titles.

The next closest driving season ever is four by any driver in any season.

In 2012, Tetrick handled Chapter Seven, American Jewel and Heston Blue Chip (all for trainer Linda Toscano), as well as Captaintreacherous, Check Me Out, Market Share and Androvette.

25 years ago...


In 1994, Cams Card Shark won the Horse of the Year after becoming the first horse to better \$2.2 million in a single season.

Mike Lachance and Ron Gurfein won the first of their three Hambletonians together, this one with Victory Dream.

Pine Chip won his second straight Trotter of the Year award.



Getting a generational twist on the giveaway gimmick (Part 1)

Giveaways have long been gimmicks employed by racetracks to attract attendance. I have never seen a study that would prove success or failure of giveaways over the decades, but I think it would be safe to say that like many other gimmicks it had a measure of success. However, in the days when an audience for pari-mutuel racing was practically a guarantee, it is difficult to assess how giveaways added to the mix.

In the new millennium, tracks' marketing campaigns continue to enjoy using giveaways because marketers have not adjusted to the paradigm shift in legal wagering across North America, therefore losing touch with the lure of the game: making money.

Branded shirts and hats and other apparel will always be appreciated by those already stuck on the sport and the gambling game, but no complementary items magnetize the novice masses to become involved with betting horse racing regularly. Over the years, I have asked many younger folk, all age-eligible, to make wagers, if they would spend a night out at a racetrack or online with a racetrack stream with betting options, if they received free items by the track.

I found a strong percentage of those asked that said they would go to the track at least for a night when there were giveaways. Others flatly refused to commit to going without offering a reason. Granted, there is nothing empirical about my study but there are similarities in the responses that crave a full-blown study for the modern marketer to use to assess what I suspect — that giveaways do not function as bait to attract new players. Here is that list:

1—They cared about what kind of free items were involved. Some youngsters changed their minds about going based solely on the types of items. When I suggested it was free apparel (the usual shirts, hats, etcetera), the response was still "all right, I'll go," but the attitude was "take it or leave it."

2—All of the responders asked if there were any conditions, that is, even though I said giveaway items means "free" for simply showing up, there were questions such as, "Do I have to stay a certain amount of time?" "Do I have to bet?" "Do I only get one of

the items?"

3—A few that said they would go were surprised when I told them it was not thoroughbred racing, it was harness racing. Questions ensued: "Are those the buggy horses?" "Isn't that the old man racing thing?" "What is harmless [sic] racing?" That last question may or may not have been the product of Attention Deficit Disorder.

4—Finally, I asked each person if they ever went or thought of going to the racetrack, even if there were no giveaways and, if not to bet, to watch any breed of horse race live. The overwhelming answer was "No."

Even with no scientific foundation, my little study must be taken with some seriousness. After all, millennial and Generation Z (or iGen) youngsters of betting age are rarely sited at any pari-mutuel tracks anyway. Those generations are, however, the targets for all the public-relations companies that are hired to help boost attendance and betting. So, as of this writing, as far as I know (specific research on the subject will be provided in a future article), the giveaways concept is still one of the devices suggested.

If I were a track manager and an outside public relations firm suggested I use giveaways as one of their ideas to help business, I would immediately and loudly say, "Next idea."

Unless, of course, a few new twists on giveaways were presented, some fresh and contrived versions that all involved betting.

Off the top of my head, how about a free "X" item for anyone present at the track that wins an exotic bet from a ticket worth \$10 or more?

Or a free beverage for anyone present at the track that cashes a "place" bet of \$10 or more.

There are numerous forms of such giveaways that will entice bettors to play a few more dollars here and there. And there is no way someone can forge a ticket to get the "item," since winning tickets are always cashed.

There could always be lesser impressive items free on the same evening for anyone showing up at the track, just as a simple showing of appreciation (perhaps a free racing program or in-house tip sheet).

Being creative with giveaways that prompt more wagering should always be taken seriously. Add that element to be specifically aimed at younger generations by offering items to give away that appeal to those generations.

In part two of this subject, we will explore the studied purchasing characteristics of the younger generations of betting age and make some suggestions that you may not hear from a public-relations firm offering old, stale gimmicks.

Majority owners retain Atlanta after \$1.55 million online auction; Ron Burke to train

The 2018 Hambletonian winner was purchased back Thursday through ongait.com with a winning bid of \$1.55 million by Michelle Crawford, Howard Taylor and Brad Grant as part of a sale to remove trainer Rick Zeron from the group. Atlanta will now be trained by Ron Burke.

In the end, Friday's sale of 2018 Hambletonian winner Atlanta for \$1.55 million through the online auction site ongait.com was as expected — a very public exercise for the majority owners to buy out trainer Rick Zeron and his five per cent share in the trotting filly.

"This past week has been a trying week for many, ending with the auction of our great mare Atlanta," said the winning bidders in a statement to HRU. "As a result of the sale, going forward the ownership group will consist of Crawford Farms (Michelle and Al), Brad Grant and Howard Taylor. We would like to also thank Bill and Christine of Holland Racing for their support throughout this whole ordeal and wish them well in their future racing ventures."

Grant confirmed Saturday night that the Hollands — who originally had a 25 per cent share in Atlanta — have opted not to remain among the filly's owners.

Atlanta will now be trained by Ron Burke.

"Going forward, Atlanta will be entrusted to the care of Ron Burke whose record as a trainer and horseman speaks for itself," the remaining owners said in their statement. "Ron has the experience of dealing with great horses in the big races and we look forward to an exciting year. I would also like to thank Tony Alagna for taking the mare into his care and looking after her until she is shipped to the Burke barn."

Was the \$1.55 million winning bid truly a record for a standardbred sold at auction? Maybe if you attach an asterisk. Since the people that owned 70 per cent of the horse — Brad Grant (25 per cent), Howard Taylor (25) and the Crawfords (20) — ended up with the winning bid, it is believed \$527,000 changed hands — \$387,500 to the Hollands, who decided to cash in their 25 per cent share, \$77,500 to be paid to Zeron and the expected fee of \$62,000 to ongait.com based on its published commission of 4 four per cent.

The \$1.55 million bid technically surpasses the \$1.1 million Finnish owner Erkki Laakkonen paid in 2001 to purchase Cameron Hall at the Tattersalls December Mixed Sale. Even that record likely deserves an asterisk since it was also made to break up a partnership — that one between Laakkonen and Cameron Hall's breeder Walnut Hall Ltd. In 2008, Total Truth, the 2006 Pepsi North America Cup champion, sold for \$900,000 at Tattersalls, but that was also to break up a partnership.

That makes the highest-priced standardbred to completely change hands at a public auction Donato Hanover's full-brother Detour Hanover, who was purchased by John

Cancelliere for \$825,000 at the 2011 Standardbred Horse Sales Company's yearling sale in Harrisburg, PA.

Atlanta, the 2018 Dan Patch winner as Three-Year-Old Trotting Filly of the Year, found herself up for auction on ongait.com on Tuesday night (Feb. 12) after a bizarre week in which the majority partners asked trainer Tony Alagna to pick Atlanta up from Rick Zeron's shedrow at Sunshine Meadows training center in Florida (full story here). Once the filly was moved, Zeron instructed his top assistant Ernie Hendry to go get the filly back.

Grant told HRU the only choice was to buy Zeron out.

"It's a choice that had to be made to... remove Rick," Grant said Thursday.

The group offered Zeron \$50,000 for his five per cent share, but Zeron declined saying she was worth more than \$1 million total. Zeron ultimately proved to be correct, though Atlanta sold for much less than the \$4 million Zeron was allegedly requesting from the other owners (he allegedly asked for \$200,000 for his five per cent cut, putting Atlanta's value at \$4 million).

In the end, the remaining owners ended the week on a conciliatory note.

"In closing we would like to congratulate Team Zeron on the great year Atlanta had with a special thanks to Ernie Hendry who looked after Atlanta as if she was his own. He was a big part of her success," the owners said.











Tracking the Future

The Real Life Ventures and Adventures of Trey and Batman

Walter B. Paine, DDS, would not have been my choice for a dentist. The name did not bother my friend from Silicon Valley. He emerged from the front door after his cleaning and slid into my front seat.

I said, "I always figured uber-rich people would have dentists who made house calls."

"You figured wrong. We floss and have tartar removed one piece at a time, just like everybody else."

He officially opened the meeting as I made a right turn out of the parking lot, "In our previous session, you proposed an idea — an investment group constructs a harness training center in Hardeeville, South Carolina, just off I-95, the primary north/south highway. The facility is to be adjacent to a massive, upscale, RV center under construction for snowbirds and travelers."

I nodded.

"Obviously, anything with the potential of finding racing fans is good. The problem with your idea is that investors will not see much of an upside. Even if the training center proves popular, where is the revenue? You can't even wager on horse racing if you live in South Carolina."

I replied, "True, at this moment, South Carolina is a black hole of gambling."

"That would seem to work against your idea."

I wagged my finger and said, "The future my friend, that's what you are always blathering about. The future will not look like the past."

He put his fingertips together near his lips, gave a little head bob, and said, "Take me to your future, Yoda."

"There is a website named State-by-State Sports Betting Bill Tracker. It keeps track of the progress each state is making towards sports wagering. The site looks like one of



those CNN maps of America on election night with states shown in different colors. Ever since the gambling laws changed last June, they color in the states that open the door for gambling. As of today, the list is up to eight states that have enacted legislation. They predict how far along the other states are in passing legislation."

"South Carolina?" He asked.

"In the middle, number 24. Here is what they say..."

I handed him my phone and he read off the screen, "Introduced in 2017, House Bill No. 3102 would have amended South Carolina's Constitution to allow "sports betting on professional sports." Any betting would have been "strictly" regulated and limited to "specified" areas. According to a court document from the now-resolved New York daily fantasy litigation, South Carolina's current definition of gambling "includes betting money on the outcome of any 'game,' regardless of the skill involved in the game." The bill was not enacted prior to the close of the last legislative session."

He handed my phone back and said, "Your long-range plan is to be ready for the legislation?"

"Yes. Build a nice facility, sort of tread water and bend ears so that when gambling comes, the training center could be the area that is 'strictly' regulated and limited to 'specified' areas in the legislation."

He chewed on this for a few seconds and said, "In horse racing, a clean slate in a virgin state would be easier."

"Exactly, it is easier to build yourself a new house than it is to rehab a shack owned by 16 people. This new house is long overdue, like 80 years overdue. South Carolina probably likes horses and racing just as much as any other state, maybe more. They proved this in 1938 when two brothers from Mullins, South Carolina, leased some property and built Washington Park Harness Race Track in downtown Myrtle Beach. On opening day, the grandstands were full. Myrtle Beach enjoyed harness racing, but wagering was the thorn in their side. The anti-gambling forces pushed back and despite

attempts to try several forms of gambling, Washington Park Race Track had a run of merely nine years until the South Carolina Supreme Court slammed the wagering door."

He asked, "So you think racing could come back when the legislation winds shift?"

I answered, "Among other things. Money could arrive by opening a racetrack on this site following gambling

legislation. South Carolina is starved for sports. They have ZERO professional sports and harness racing would be unique. Racing and gambling have been missing in the Palmetto state since the dinosaur era. Presented properly, this could be as if a cork pulled was from a dam. Even if the legislation doesn't come through, although you have told me you think it is inevitable, this center with horses training in front of new faces could be fun and interesting."

I took a breath and finished my pitch, "Take a look at the revenue streams for my pipedream — training fees, travelers, tourists, a gambling hub located in the fresh territory, maybe on-track wagering. Dude, can you see a sliver of light?"

He nodded. "I can. Multiple revenue streams are always good, being ahead of the curve is good, additional exposure is good and trying is good." He paused and then asked, "Would you put your money into a venture like this?"

"Absolutely, all two \$212."

Soliciting readers' thoughts on another As Is case

I read with interest the recent Harness Racing Update stories on the Richard Young case (full story here) and a response from Jim Avritt Sr. (full story here). My interest was sparked by two reasons, one being the fact that I am currently involved with another ventral sepal heart defect (VSD) in a recently-purchased yearling (now a 2-year-old). The other reason I will put forth in a moment, and one that would beg other's comments.

As the buying public knows, the "as is" clause has been around for a long time, and rightly so, for many, many reasons. Like other legal terms (and I of course am not a lawyer), as well as to protect certain parties in transactions, there is also a considered intent. I am not sure how that intent would work with a VSD and whether or not a breeder should have known that the condition existed when the yearling went to a sale, and I will refrain from any further comment on that one.

However, I am aware of at least two other different types of yearling cases that have occurred, including one ongoing at the present, in a different area of North America and would certainly like to hear from Mr. Avritt Sr. and others that may wish to comment. Both of these cases involve the buying of yearling fillies, that were subsequently deemed to be in foal.

To me, as a non legal expert, the intent of the "as is" clause, is concerning many and multiple musculoskeletal reasons, perhaps some congenital reasons, sick or diseased, faults and defects, etc. However, if I am going to a yearling sale, I am going with the expressed purpose of buying a young standardbred that I may be able to train and potentially race in the future. I am not going to a yearling sale to buy a "broodmare in foal", that may be trainable initially, but certainly not for a very long time. The mixed sale would be

where I should be going if I wanted such a broodmare in foal.

Not only would I have to think that the intent of the "as is" would not cover such a situation, but it would also imply gross mismanagement on the part of the yearling breeder, especially if they were unaware and presented such a pregnant yearling at a yearling sale. And as far as examining for pregnancy in a yearling filly pre-purchase, I am totally unaware of any veterinarian that does that or would even be allowed by the consignor/breeder to do that at any sales complex, as it may be deemed a risky procedure in a young relatively un-handled filly in a strange environment.

I would be most interested to hear some comments on these cases and how implied warranty's or even examinations for such may apply.

USTA responds to Sturman

In Brett Sturman's "Between the Lines" column on Feb. 14, he advocates for making statistical record data publicly available and cites some examples of records and their availability online.

His assertion that "There isn't any central location to go in hopes of finding out what pretty basic records are," is clearly inaccurate. The USTA website with its statistical information in the online Trotting & Pacing Guide and Pathway contains significant information on "basic records." While it is necessary to register for a Pathway account, there is no charge for that.

The online Trotting & Pacing Guide, which was launched in June 2016, is the most complete compilation of statistics and records in the history of the sport with the advantage that information is available anywhere, anytime on any Internet-capable device and is now updated on a daily basis instead of annually in a printed book, which contained obsolete information every time a new record was set.

It's easy to look up simple, "basic" stats like the fastest race of all time or the most driver wins in a year that are similar top-line stats as those cited in the column.

"Basic" all-time and recent year stats and records for horses, owners, trainers and drivers; world records; North American record times for both gaits on any size track; leading sire and broodmare statistics; results of major races

and sales; and award winners are all easily accessible in the T & P Guide and Pathway online for free. Many of the reports are in sortable columns and new reports are continuously being developed and added with the most recent ones being the Top Owners information on the Statistics tab and fines and suspension rulings reports by people, facility and state in Pathway.

Perhaps Brett should become more familiar with the information available through those resources. The USTA Information and Research staff would be happy to assist with that. And for specific track records, the individual tracks should be able to help with those.

Furthermore, comparing the simple examples of the availability of the "basic" records for rushing yards in an NFL game or strikeouts in a major league baseball with the questions about winning seven of seven on a single card or whether a trainer has won 100 per cent of his races with as many as seven starts is like comparing apples to oranges.

Annual statistics for 100-yard rushing games in the NFL is available, but which running back in NFL history has the most 100-yard games at Arrowhead Stadium? Or in major league baseball, what is the list of hitters with the all-time, top 10 batting averages at Wrigley Field in day games only?

Like the inquiries submitted to the USTA and the research information used in this article, those answers can be researched and compiled through queries in the football and baseball data bases.

Regarding the fact that some of the USTA statistical reports are not free, the Pathway fees are minimal and necessary because there is a cost involved in collecting, compiling, managing and disseminating statistical data and records. As the centralized registry and record keeper for harness racing, the USTA provides critical services that would be much more expensive, if even possible, for the individual entities in the industry to accomplish without the USTA.

However, any media member working on a story for publication that needs any available statistical information for that purpose, can feel free to contact me directly and I'll make sure that there is no charge for that request.

Finally, while the USTA is proud of the information currently available through the T & P Guide and Pathway, as well as other innovations that we've developed, like online registration, online entry and the eSales program introduced last August, we're constantly working to expand and improve

our information and welcome suggestions on what our members and fans would like to see.


