HERE ARE 10 MORE HOY FUN FACTS:

- 1. Sep Palin went 1-2 in year one of the HOY balloting in 1947, with Victory Song leading the way. The very first HOY lived until the summer of 1962 passing at age 19. Remember that Palin's Greyhound competed when there was no HOY award.
- 2. Ladies went 1-2 in 1958 for the first time with Emily's Pride over Belle Acton even though they each had 28/81 first place votes cast.
- 3. Adios Butler won the Triple Crown (1959) and then two HOY titles, but in different years. In 1959 he was the first Pacing Triple Crown champ at 3 and then was honored as HOY at 4 and 5.
- 4. Only twice has a multiple HOY also sired multiple HOYS:

Cam Fella (1982-83) sired 1991 and 1994 HOY Precious Bunny and Cams Card Shark, respectively.

Albatross (1971-72) sired three straight: Niatross twice, 1979-80 and Fan Hanover, 1981.

- 5. Neither three-time HOY ever sired one. Bret Hanover (1964-66) and Nevele Pride (1967-69) both missed that mark.
- 6. A HOY trotter still has never sired a HOY trotter. We came close in 2012 when Chapter Seven was HOY. His sire, Windsong's Legacy, was a close second in the voting in 2004 to HOY Rainbow Blue, 119-98.

7. Ladies ruled HOY from 1995-2001 winning five of the seven votes:

1995 – CR Kay Suzie

1996 - Continentalvictory

1998 - Moni Maker

1999 - Moni Maker

2001 - Bunny Lake

- 8. It's been 14 years since a Hambletonian winner has also been HOY. The last was Muscle Hill in 2009.
- 9. The winningest dash driver ever, Dave Palone, drove 1992 HOY Artsplace, just once and prior to that year. The winningest money driver of all time, John Campbell, drove 1998-1999 HOY Moni Maker once in 1997.
- 10. If it's a clean sweep for Bulldog Hanover, it could mark the first time in 75 years that the HOY vote is unanimous.

So, get ready folks for tonight's Dan Patch awards celebrating the 75th anniversary of USHWA and HOY. Perhaps we should refer to it as "over-seers from overseas" since for one night anyway Orlando is most certainly in the import/export business, big time.

The making of Western Hanover, Part 2

Part 1 is here.

Western Hanover grew to become the type of yearling that Dr. Peter Boyce and everybody else at Hanover Shoe Farms thought he might become. He was stunning – not perfect, but stunning nonetheless.

He had the capped hock that I believe had been part of him all his life. He wasn't the biggest colt, but I would disagree with anyone who would consider him to be too small. He might not have been especially tall, but what there was of him was sturdy and strong. He had a certain elan about him. You might refer to it as a swagger. It was almost as though he knew he was special and was telling everyone that he was.

He was placed in String A at the Hanover Fairgrounds and placed in Row A in Harrisburg. The folks at Hanover thought he was their best pacing colt and wanted everyone to look at him.

His caretaker was Dennis King who for many years took care of the top string of pacing colts.

A young and beautiful (she still is) Dr. Patty Hogan, then 25 and in her third year of vet school at the University of Pennsylvania, was a part-time worker at Hanover. She helped farm manager Dr. Boyce in a variety of ways, including showing the yearlings on Row A at Harrisburg.

Now a world renowned equine veterinary surgeon, Dr. Hogan says this about her part-time pupil Western Hanover: "His conformation was absolutely perfect. He was a gorgeous specimen and had a great mind for a yearling."

Nevertheless, not everybody liked him. There were some that told Hogan, "He's too small. Put him away."

The Harrisburg Hanover yearlings were normally brought to the Fairgrounds at or around the week after Labor Day. At that time, they weren't even broke to halter. They were a wild lot, but it wouldn't take too long for them to become civilized.

It was the custom of George Segal to come to Hanover with his trainer Gene Riegle to get a preview of the yearlings and to evaluate the Farms' yearlings before he spent his money in Kentucky. The visit usually took place the day after the Little Brown Jug. They would hitch a ride on the Hanover plane and come see the yearlings.

Riegle evaluated the yearlings that they might be interested in, even though they didn't look near as good as they would a month or so down the road. He was nevertheless Gene Riegle, arguably the best "yearling picker" the sport has ever known.

Riegle did not need to look at one for long. About a minute or so was the norm. He did not say much, but Segal would sometimes venture an opinion, which often was "too small." I cannot guarantee that he said that about Western Hanover, but I would wager that he did.

I would later learn from speaking with Segal that Riegle told him to buy whatever he liked in Kentucky, but to be sure to save enough money to buy that No Nukes colt at Hanover.

Overall, one would say that Western Hanover was quite popular with the buyers. However, there were more than a few who said, "too small" or "I'm afraid of that capped hock." Of the former, I might agree with those who like a big, strapping

colt. Western Hanover was definitely not that. But he was correct and acted as though he thought he was big. Of the latter, regarding the capped hock, I would say one word: Nonsense.

I've been in this business 66 years and have seen literally thousands of horses, albeit only a few that had a capped hock. I've been exposed to some of the greatest horses and horsepeople of most of the last century. Never have I heard of a horse having issues due to a capped hock.

Segal went about his business at Lexington. He bought a few yearlings including a pair of pacing colts.

In Harrisburg, Hogan showed Western Hanover to many prospective buyers. Most liked him. Some did not.

The two folks that apparently liked him the most were two of the greatest horsemen of recent times — Riegle and Brett Pelling.

Riegle on behalf of Segal and Pelling for the account of Alan Katz of the Three Brothers Stable. Katz bid \$100,000. Segal went to \$105,000 and bought Western Hanover. I don't know this for a fact, but I would guess that Segal might have gone much further if he had to.

Western Hanover was initially shipped to Riegle's headquarters in Greenville, OH. Bruce Riegle, Gene's son remembers the first time he saw Western Hanover. He was at Greenville supervising the feed for the almost 60 head they had there. His dad said, "Come see the colt I bought at Harrisburg. I think he'll become a champion." Yes, Gene said that about a colt who had never even seen a harness. He didn't normally say things like that. But he was not often wrong.

Bruce thought Western was beautiful, but like some others he thought he might have been a little small — especially for \$105,000. It would be a month before they would be going to Florida. Bruce suggested they ship Western Hanover to Segal's Brittany Farms in Kentucky for some R and R before shipping to Ben White Raceway in Orlando. When he was first put in a paddock at Brittany, he jumped over the fence. After he was retrieved, he did it again.

"I knew right then that George had bought an athlete," said Brittany manager Art Zubrod.

After about a month in Kentucky, Western Hanover was shipped to Orlando where he encountered a problem. Much like his dam, Wendymae Hanover, Western Hanover was affected with respiratory issues. Bruce recalls him not even being in their top set for most of the winter. But Gene never changed his opinion on him. Western Hanover was going to become a champion. He was nursed along until springtime when his respiratory problems finally were resolved.

He was brought along until early August where he made his first start in a qualifier at The Meadowlands. He won that quite easily and looked good enough to be shipped to Montreal to race in the Prix de l'Avenir at Blue Bonnets. He won that race and went on to eight wins in 14 starts, with earnings of \$697,332 at 2.

Bruce remembers his dad warming him up for the Breeders Crown at Garden State Park. Gene went three trips with him. Bruce could tell he was really smoking in the last one. He asked his dad how fast he had gone. The response was 2:04, last quarter in :27.

"He's ready," Gene said.

He took his 2-year-old record of 2:00.4 in winning that race.

He was voted Two Year Old Pacer of the Year of 1991. Just think of that, a colt that didn't start racing until August becoming the divisional champion. He is not the only one to do it. It actually happened this past year with Volume Eight becoming the Two Year Old Trotter of 2022. But one would be safe in saying that it is far from a normal occurrence.

At 3, Western Hanover was looking to repeat his feats from the previous year. One would not be wrong to say that he succeeded, perhaps even beyond that. He won 19 of 28 starts earning \$1,844,315 on his way to being voted the Three Year Old Pacer of the Year for 1992.

He won numerous Grand Circuit and classics events including the Messenger and the Cane. Unfortunately it was the two races that he didn't win which some people

remembered him most — The Meadowlands Pace and The Little Brown Jug.

In the Meadowlands Pace he won his elimination impressively and was the favorite for the final. He was run into in the final, eliminating all his chances. In the Jug, he won the first heat and lost the final by the slimmest of noses. There were many who thought he was the best colt that day. But Bill Fahy may have forgotten a maxim about Delaware, OH. If you are the best, don't let anyone go.

Midway through his 3-year-old season Segal began thinking of places where to stand his champion colt. Before we enter that realm, we need to go back several months in time.

Hanover Shoe Farms were in the market for a quality son of No Nukes to add to its stud barn. They had entered into a gentlemen's agreement with Mickey Chasanoff, who with his brother Allan owned half of the top pacing colt Die Laughing together with Marty Granoff. Right before the final papers were signed, the Chasanoffs "put a wheel" under the deal. They came up with a clause with which the folks at Hanover could not live. The agreement subsequently blew up.

Segal's first thought as to where to stand his No Nukes colt went directly to Hanover Shoe Farms. He contacted Paul E. Spears and yours truly. We met him for lunch at the Union Square Cafe in Manhattan. The terms of an agreement were ironed out. Western Hanover was to be syndicated to stand at Hanover Shoe Farms beginning with his 4-year-old season. The agreed-upon syndication price was to be \$2.5 million.

In addition to Hanover and Brittany's interests in the horse, shares were to be offered to all the leading commercial breeders in North America.

One would think that it would have been quite easy to syndicate a horse who had been the leading horse of his age and gait at both 2 and 3 for what the principals believed to be a most reasonable price. That was not the case. Shares were offered to virtually all of the leading breeders in North America.

With the exception of one share purchased by All American Standardbreds, no one else was interested. Had we miscalculated the horse's value? This scribe does not believe that. Rather, I believe that Western Hanover was the subject of a campaign of derision by some who referred to him as "Little Ralph," a reference to Ralph Hanover who was also a great 3-year-old pacer, but who failed miserably in the stud arena. The implication was that Western was to be doomed to the same result as befell Ralph Hanover.

Haley Farken is finding her stride in harness racing

It didn't take long for Haley Farken to find her stride in her new standardbred role.

There had always been a certain curiosity about harness racing and the sport's horses, an interest that dates back to her early childhood days in the northeastern U.S.

A love for all things equine was a cornerstone of those times growing up in Maine, something that has stayed with Farken throughout the years.

"I've had riding horses my whole life," Farken said. "I started riding when I was five, so I've been in the horse industry — I'm 28 — for 23 years. I've owned, bred, raised and broken riding horses and been in the horse-riding side of things for the past 22 years."

Farken has now added a new chapter to her horse story.

"I've been a standardbred groom for about a year now," Farken said. "I got started when my friend, Katelyn Gerow, who has been in both the riding and standardbred worlds, told me someone she knew needed help paddocking. I learned the ropes a little bit there and then I just jumped in head-first."

Under the tutelage of local horseman Bobby Marston, she eagerly went about learning more about the pacers and trotters who had now become a big part of her life.

With each day she came to the barn, Farken, now working for driver/trainer Zach Vickerson, was picking up more knowledge and trying new things.

"I learned to jog right away and tried to learn everything I could," Farken said. "My favorite part of it is taking care of them, making sure they are good from morning until we put them away for the night."

Vickerson's horses also have the good fortune to feel right at home in another spot, an expansive property not far from Plainridge Racecourse.

It's a place where the standardbreds have plenty of room to roam.

"I also own my own farm," Farken said. "So, we transition from the track to the farm and make sure all the racehorses get turn-out turn time and get to enjoy that part of their life. I also get to know the horses better too. So, it's been cool to bring my riding horse knowledge into the horse racing world. At the end of the day, they are horses, so even though I'm new to the

harness world, I can still bring something to the table as far as knowledge of the horses goes."

She can also speak of her longstanding bond with a trotter by the name of Lakota Lily.

The now 22-year-old daughter of Au Bar—Springtime Melody didn't have a prolific racing career winning twice in 19 starts, but the mare, bred in Maine by Alberta Emerson, has led the good life since her final start on Oct. 24, 2004, at Scarborough Downs in Maine.

"She came to me when I was around 9 or 10," Farken said. "I actually got her for free. I saddle-broke the horse myself. I always had a soft spot for standardbreds. I always liked them. I was always intrigued by them, but I just never had the experience. It's actually funny. I run into Eric Bickmore, who trained her, all the time now. He told me, 'You're not that 9-year-old girl anymore!' He'll always ask me about Lakota Lily and if I've seen her. It's a running joke we have."

Farken now has another filly in her life.

She is the proud owner of Bet On Jozie, a 3-year-old daughter of Yankee Cruiser—Pascals Wager, who is being readied for her sophomore campaign.

Bred in Ohio by Sheila Hummel, the bay filly could be the one to provide Farken with her first standardbred win.

It's something she thinks of often.

"She's a really nice filly," Farken said. "I'm looking forward to seeing her race this year. She has a great attitude and having that is half the battle in our world. It's nice to own them. If you win with one that's yours, it will be special, I imagine. I'm anxious about it."

Having her horse and those she takes care of fully prepared to compete is a top priority. So too is ensuring each horse receives individualized attention.

"I'm competitive and I take care of all of them, but the biggest thrill is when they win," Farken said. "That's what we're all here to do, is see that success. I enjoy taking care of them, jogging them and caring for them correctly to help them be successful. It's nice seeing all that hard work come full circle."

Working alongside Vickerson has provided Farken with a frontrow seat for her harness racing education.

She views that relationship as a win-win for both of them.

"Zach is teaching me everything in his world, but I feel like I'm reciprocating on some level because of my long history with horses," Farken said. "I've learned so much from people in standardbreds that has helped me with my riding horses, so it's a really cool dynamic."

When she isn't heightening her horse racing IQ, Farken spends a majority of any downtime with her daughter.

Keeping pace with an 8-year-old can be a tall order on most days.

"I don't think unwinding is ever a thing," Farken said. "But when I do get away, it's mostly just enjoying my time with her. Thankfully, she enjoys the horses and she rides herself. I have a beautiful 35-acre farm, so I have my little slice of heaven always here for me."

The game plan for her standardbred career, as of now, is to work her way up to the training ranks.

Being committed to achieving that goal won't be a problem for Farken.

"I really enjoy learning all the aspects and details of training," Farken said. "It's very fascinating to see everything that goes into these horses. The more I learn, the more I enjoy it. Hopefully, one day, I can become a trainer myself. That's definitely on the radar now and I'm going to continue to do everything I can to see that come true."

USTA joins horsemen's associations for drug research study with SMRTL

The U.S. Trotting Association, in conjunction with the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association, Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of NJ, and the Standardbred Owners Association of New York, have agreed to fund a research project with the Sports Medicine Research & Testing Laboratory (SMRTL), one of two United States Anti-Doping Agency labs that does research and testing in the area of human sports for the World Anti-Doping Agency. The research will seek out legally defensible extraction methodologies for a variety of modified erythropoietin (EPO) biosimilars.

USTA Harness Racing Medication Collaborative (HRMC) chairman Joe Faraldo, who is hopeful that other concerned horsemen's associations will join in supporting the study, brought the proposal forward from HRMC member Dr. George Maylin, the head of the New York State Drug Testing and Research program.

"The USTA is pleased to be a leader in the forefront of this initiative in equine research," USTA president Russell Williams said in making the announcement. "The United States Anti-Doping Agency (USADA) was the original agency the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority (HISA) planned to have administer their anti-doping and medications control program before the two could not come to a financial agreement."

USADA, which is the official anti-doping organization for all Olympic, Pan American and Parapan American sport in the United States and is the administrator of the UFC Anti-Doping program, utilizes Sports Medicine Research & Testing Laboratory to conduct their testing.

"For the first time in our study, the Sports Medicine Research & Testing Laboratory will apply its existing science and research to horses," Williams said. "Harness racing is entering into a comprehensive testing and anti-doping program along with other international, national and professional organizations, including Olympic, collegiate, professional sports leagues, and federal and state departments. The USTA is excited to join in this study that will help us address the issues involved with the use of illicit performance-enhancing drugs in harness racing."

This work, Faraldo said, "is promised within three to six months after the first samples are made available for analysis."

Research and testing will be done at the SMRTL lab in Jordan, UT, and will be conducted by Daniel Eichner (PhD), president of SMRTL, and his associates Geoffrey D. Miller (PhD) and Chad Moore (PhD).
