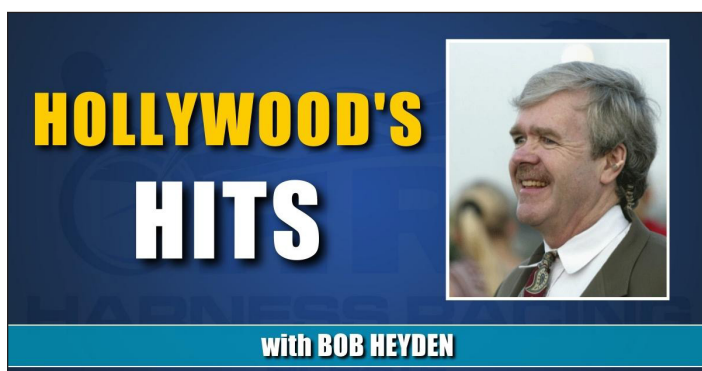

Your guide to tonight's Dan Patch Awards

A handy 20-item reference for the gala that will crown the 2021 Horse of the Year.

Twenty short items you can refer to while watching tonight's ceremonies (which can be viewed on USHWA's Facebook page [here](#) beginning at 6:30 p.m. (EST)):

1. The most unusual stat of the night is this: Brian Sears, Yannick Gingras and Tim Tetrick have combined for 18 of the top 25 driving single seasons of all time (72 per cent) by earnings, but on this night they account for just one divisional title: Tetrick

with Lyons Sentinel in the Pacing Mare category. Oh, and the trio are the last three drivers of the Horse of the Year – Sears with McWicked in 2018; Tetrick with Shartin N in 2019 and Gingras with Tall Dark Stranger in 2020.

2. Test Of Faith. When she is honored as Horse of the Year, we can only hope she has the life that 1954 HOY Stenographer had. She lived to be 35. Stenographer was a pioneer of sorts. She was the first female filly to win the HOY. She raced from 1953-1957 and banked \$167,290.

3. Middle men and one lady, too. These three Horses of the Year all won it multiple times. They also are the only three to have raced before and after their award-winning seasons:

Scott Frost 1954-1957 winning it in both in 1955 and 1956.

Mack Lobell 1986-1991 winning it back-to-back in 1987-1988.

Moni Maker 1995-2000 taking down the hardware in 1998 and 1999.

4. Hall of a feat. Frank Ervin became the first driver to win the HOY award in three different decades: 1949, 1952, 1964-1966. John Campbell became the only driver to do so in four different decades: 1987-1988, 1991-1994, 2000-2002, 2006 and 2010. Note, he wasn't the regular driver of Staying Together in 1993, Gallo Blue Chip in 2000 or Rock N Roll Heaven in 2010.

5. Paving the way. From 1949-1976 Frank Ervin and Stanley Dancer trained and drove 12-of-the-28 Horses of the Year. Today, we don't see many trainer/drivers. The last time a pacer was named HOY with a trainer/driver was 2001 with John Stark, Jr. and Bunny Lake. The last time a trainer/driver drove a trotter that was HOY was 1995 with C R Kay Suzie – if you count Rod and Carl Allen as one and 1977 with Billy Haughton and Green Speed if you don't.

6. Swede smell of youth. There has to be something in the water there. Per Eriksson won three Hambletonians before he turned 32 and had the 1985 HOY runner-up Prakas and 1991 HOY runner-up Giant Victory. Nancy Takter has had two Horses of the Year before age 40 – JK She'salady in 2014 and Tall Dark Stranger in 2020. Jimmy Takter had three HOY titles before 40 – 1997, 1998 and 1999 (Malabar Man and Moni Maker twice). Marcus Melander is not yet 30. Yet, nobody has been a bigger Hambletonian presence the last five years and in 2019 his star Greenshoe was voted Trotter of the Year.

7. David Miller is also one sipping from the fountain of youth. Miller did not have a divisional winner in the 20th century, breaking through with Magician in 2000 in the Older Trotter category. Two drivers have three divisional winners each this year, but Miller is a quarter century older than Dexter Dunn (57-31).

8. Will 2021's award winners turn out to be similar to the way it was in 1948? There were four Horses of the Year in the top 10 that year:


Rodney #1 398 points

Proximity #4 138 points (1950 winner)

Good Time #5 126 points (1949 and 1952 winner)

Victory Song #10 with 51 points (defending champ in year one of the ballot in 1947).

9. Longevity award. Which HOY later made it to their 10-year-old season? Just one: Savoir (1970-1978, \$1,365,145), the 1975 HOY. He was a Hambletonian runner-up to Speedy Crown in

1971 and retired #1 in trotting earnings.

10. Kentucky's finest. Tonight is a big night for Kentucky. Kentuckiana Farms is part of the HOY ownership of Test Of Faith. In 1981, 40 years ago, they also bred a filly you might have heard of – Three Diamonds. And in 1947, year one of the HOY award, Kentucky's Castleton Farms had the top pair – Victory Song and Hoot Mon.

11. Good 'ol boys club. Each of the last two HOY sires – Bettors Delight and Art Major – are 22. And, they were both right there in the HOY race on the track, too. It's been a long time between drinks for the last time, consecutively the HOY sires were older than 20: In 1975, Savoir was the HOY and sire, Stars Pride, was 28.

In 1976, Keystone Ore was the HOY and sire, Bye Bye Byrd, was 21.

12. (Half) Billion dollar boys club. David Miller has career earnings of \$261 million and Tim Tetrack is at \$241 million.

13. Two and six. If this was baseball, you might be packing your bags, but not here. Manchego is now the fourth member of the exclusive club of division winners at age 2 and 6:

Peace Corps all five years from 1988 to 1992.

Wesgate Crown in 1993 and 1997.

Eternal Camnation from four years from 1999-2003.

And now Manchego. Remember, she was undefeated as a freshman in 2017 and was third in the HOY balloting to Hannelore Hanover and Ariana G giving the trotting ladies a clean sweep of the board.

14. Southern hemisphere-northern hospitality. Tonight's Dan Patch Awards looks to be the biggest celebration/appreciation night for the land Down Under since 2004, when New Zealand trainers took down the first four spots in the MILLION \$ Meadowlands Pace:

1. Holborn Hanover for Mark Harder
2. Timesareachanging for Brett Pelling
3. Metropolitan for Chris Ryder.
4. Camelot Hall for Harder.

Kiwis took \$950,000 of the \$1 million purse.

15. IF... Venerable had gotten to and won the Breeders Crown final. She would have posted the biggest 2-year-old trotting season ever. As it is, Snow White remains the top dog at \$1,252,646

from 2007.

16. Déjà vu, anyone? Chris Ryder's Niki Hill is the top 2-year-old pacing filly in 2021. His first divisional winner also came with a freshman pacer. Ryder was the trainer of the top rookie pacing colt in 1997: Sealed N Delivered.

Richard "Nifty" Norman had both trotting millionaires this year – both fillies. Sound familiar? His first divisional title came in 2009 with 2YOFT Poof She's Gone.

Brett Pelling broke through with the outstanding pacing filly of 1996 – Mystical Maddy. He's done it again, big time, with 2021 HOY Test Of Faith.

17. Two weeks from this weekend (March 4, 1988) marks the anniversary of the passing of Cardigan Bay at age 32. He was the one who got the ball rolling for the Down Under invasion. He tied for divisional honors with Race Time in 1965 and then won it outright in 1968, the year he became the first career million-dollar winner.

18. Test Of Faith will race in 2022. Of the prior 74 winners of the Horse of the Year who came back and who did?

Of the first 37 winners, just 10 did not return.

Of the last 37 winners, 18 did not return.

See a trend here? From 2005-2010 none of the six HOY winners came back.

19. The words Triple Crown and Horse of the Year used to be synonymous. Not anymore. In the 1960s, there were seven Triple Crown winners. In the last 18 years, just two.

20. If you shake anyone's hand tonight, start with Chris Ryder. The guess here is that Niki Hill will be second in the HOY balloting to Test Of Faith. If true, Ryder will have just set the record of three straight years with the Horse of the Year runner-up with three different horses.

2019 – Shartin N won over Bettors Wish 83-42.

2020 – Tall Dark Stranger won over Party Girl Hill 89-29.

2021 – ?

Thoughts on the thoroughbreds rescinding stallion caps

What probably amounts to big news in the thoroughbred business is the Jockey Club's rescission of the rule capping stallion's books at 140 mares.

This whole megillah was an exercise in dumbness. For starters, a breed organization, by law, can only make rules limiting stallion books if it is necessary to preserve the genetic health of the breed. Unlike the basis for the USTA's imposition of a book limit of 140 mares in 2009, none of the same conditions prevailed with the thoroughbreds.

In case anyone has forgotten, the USTA acted after a scientific analysis of our breed, specifically the American trotter, revealed a 17 per cent plus loss of heterozygosity, the variability factor. The first manifestation of this loss is a reduction in the fertility of stallions.

Anyone who was in the trenches in the first 10 years of the 21st century can well attest to the fertility issues we encountered with the trotting sires of that day. To cite just one example, I give you Valley Victory. He was clearly a horse with a very high genotype, or genetic scale when it came to the inheritable speed gene.

Using the deck of playing cards as a sketch of a stallion's genetic makeup, Valley Victory probably had a deck that started with at least a 10, and went up from there. When two horses are mated, each brings 50 per cent of the genetic makeup of the foal at the time of conception.

But what they bring are two entirely different genes. Valley Victory brought to every mating a high speed gene, or, in this example, a high playing card. So if the mare only presented a card from the middle of the deck, say a seven, the average of the two parents would be a respectable 8 or 9, meaning a decent racehorse who could make money, but not a stakes colt.

If the mare in this hypothetical mating could come up with a highish card, a word just invented, you had a stakes colt. Which Valley Victory had plenty of, on a percentage basis of number of foals he sired from every crop.

Alas, those good foals were hard to come by, because Valley Victory's fertility was, to use a kind word, quite troubled. To the extent that a Valley Victory pregnancy was a cause for some celebration whenever it occurred. I personally gave some thought to framing and mounting the black circle that appeared on the ultrasound when we checked one of our mares here when we stood Valley Victory.

Back to the benighted Jockey Club, and its short-lived rule, none of the fertility issues we suffered from had any validity in the thoroughbred world. Any running horse who was popular enough to get a "full book" could happily be bred three or four times a day, 24/7. And he got, and still gets, most of his mares on their first cover.

So that's the thoroughbred book limit caper, and may it rest in peace sans further notice for the next millennium. And while I'm making wishes, may the Jockey Club henceforth refuse membership to anyone possessing less than a triple digit I.Q. Which clearly has not been in effect until now.

No brag, just fact

Ken Rucker flatters me by asking which of Gimpanzee and Greenshoe I think will be the more successful sire?

First, I wish I were smart enough to come up with an answer, even though I wouldn't dare say so if I could. But Rucker is asking me to use the available clues from both horse's phenotype, or visible characteristics, including racetrack performance, to

determine their genotypes, that word again, or genetic profile. Very quickly, I don't see any reason why both Gimpanzee and Greenshoe can't be successful sires. And in the interest of full disclosure, we have a now short yearling by Greenshoe we'll be selling at Fasig-Tipton this fall. Not to blow our own horn too loudly here, but in all modesty he probably can trot a 40 shot right now. Like they say at the rodeo; No brag, just fact.

Shartin N's baby

Also, I couldn't help picking up on the picture of Shartin's baby by Captaintreacherous. Again, the world will regard her as a lead-pipe cinch to be a top race filly, based on her parent's creds. She could be, but here again, it depends on Shartin's invisible genotype, not her great feats on the racetrack, which comprise her phenotype. All that said, if her owner ever decides he doesn't want to personally find out what kind of a race filly she'll be, we have a 12 by 14 stall already bedded, with the door open.

What struck me about the photo was the fact that, at a couple of days of life, the filly was wearing a halter and was clearly already broke to lead. That's no surprise if you happen to know Beth Yontz, who boards Shartin. She's a crackerjack horsewoman, and her husband, Doug, is one of the best blacksmith's in Kentucky.

It's basic good horsemanship to halter every foal on its first day, and it should always be led everywhere the dam is led. It takes only a few days, with a butt rope, to break a new foal to lead, and that simple lesson will carry over to every aspect of further training as the foal progresses to its ultimate goal on the racetrack. It takes no extra labor, either. Once a foal learns to lead, one man, or woman, can easily lead both dam and foal wherever they need to go.

Yet one knows that saying this will not make a collective dent in the consciousness of the vast majority of breeders who will be foaling mares this spring. Somehow I'm reminded of a cartoon that appeared in the long since departed *Harness Horse* magazine, when I was first getting in.

In it a young woman journalist is interviewing a grizzled old timer with a soft hat and a badly bent whip. The caption above the journalist:

"You must have seen a lot of changes in your days."

And the bewhiskered old veteran's caption reads:

"Yep, and I was against every one of them."

Post-time drag considerations are far from only problem as handle plunges

This past week, the Meadowlands announced the end to a short-lived experiment in which its post-time drag had been reduced. Admirably intentioned, the change led to more efficient, time-managed cards over the six-week trial period and was well received by both horseplayers and horsepeople alike. Over that span however, the Meadowlands cited that handle had dropped 22 per cent compared to the same time year over year.

But, in this case, does correlation necessarily imply causation? I don't think it does.

For starters, as acknowledged by the Meadowlands, last year's handle figures from January-to-mid-February were materially skewed as racing had been suspended at Woodbine Mohawk. And like many U.S. tracks, the Meadowlands was a beneficiary of re-directed handle that in part would have gone to Canada in a normal time. Using last week's Valentine's weekend as an example, in 2021, handle was over \$7 million across the Friday and Saturday cards. That's a number rarely seen over the course of an entire year, and it happened three times last year before the middle of February. With that said, the 2022 Valentine's weekend handle underperformed even when compared to more traditional benchmarks. The Meadowlands also points out that most of its top drivers have been away this winter, though I think that impact to handle is negligible, if any.

Looking at potential other factors at play, coincidentally, something else happened the same Jan. 7 weekend the Meadowlands began its post-time drag reduction experiment. On Jan. 8, mobile sports wagering was launched across New York state.

The impact of the emergence of sports wagering continues to be debated as to how it may impact racing wagering, but in looking at the dynamics, how could there not be an impact.

Since the launch of sports wagering in New York, handle in that state alone reached a staggering \$1.98 billion in its first month. With that type of volume, all it takes are the smallest fractions of a per cent to shift handle figures. For example, just one-hundredth of just one per cent of the amount wagered in New York in one month would equate to nearly \$200,000. Is it unthinkable that logic could explain part of the drop in handle seen at the Meadowlands?

And it's not as if the Meadowlands operates in a silo. Despite no changes to other tracks' post-time drag changes, the industry overall shows a current 17 per cent drop in total amount wagered year over year. Per race average and per betting interest are also down double digits. It's still early in the year, but these early season drops are too great to be ignored. Totally separate, while handle is down, race purses are up 28 per cent. How much longer can that be sustained?

Scoffing at the idea that sports betting can present a challenge to racing, I've heard industry executives repeatedly make the argument that racing will always have its own appeal because, essentially, who would want to make an even-money bet on a game that lasts over three hours when you can bet on a race and win a ton of money in two minutes?

That may have had some truth to it in the past, but today's sports betting isn't your father's sports betting.

Long gone is the day of laying \$110 to win \$100 on a sports event as the only way to make a wager. Every single day on social media I see notifications of sports bettors winning \$3,000 on a \$5 bet, winning \$15,000 on a \$10 bet, winning \$100,000 on a \$15 bet, and so forth. And this happens every single day. How is that possible, you ask? It happens through creative wagering options, such as parlaying in a football game, which player will score the first touchdown, combined with player "x" having over or under "y" number of receiving yards, and team "z" will win the game. In a basketball game, who will be the first player to score a basket, will this player have a triple-double, and will that team win? The creativity of these wagers — and they are available across all types of sports — is something that racing has failed to do, comparatively. Adapt or die, as they say.

Competition from sports wagering is only going to intensify and become fiercer, and now a very real case can be made

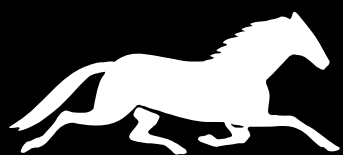

that the sports wagering platforms offer a better (albeit a still longshot) chance at making big scores. And as a new generation of bettors emerges, ones that are savvier to data, things like stubbornly high takeout rates in racing will eventually become more noticeable and continue to discourage entry into racing.

Anecdotally speaking, I see countless instances on social media of those posting sports wagering tickets who used to solely post racing tickets. It's not to say that 100 per cent of action from someone that plays the Meadowlands over a weekend has now moved entirely to sports, but even if just 10 per cent of wagers have shifted in states where sports wagering is live — such as harness racing hotbeds of New Jersey and Pennsylvania in addition to New York — that's a number that's going to be reflected in the drop in handle this year to date.

Perhaps I'm underestimating the impact of having a track show 0 minutes-to-post and thus having that track appear at the top of the online platforms wagering menus impacts handle. But it still doesn't seem like the "right" way to go about staging a product.

At the same time, I guess there's been some proven validity to it, so like tracks that have tried the same experiment prior, I don't blame the Meadowlands for going back and increasing the time between races in however way they see fit if it can help to stop the bleeding. But, it has to be known that there are and will continue to be larger issues at play.

Don Tiger recounts the mostly magical year of Charlie May

According to the Chinese calendar, 2022 is the “Year of the Tiger.” It is hard to believe that 2021 wasn’t also the Year of the Tiger – Don Tiger.

The likeable, 51-year-old owner of the Ohio Horse of the Year, Charlie May, enjoyed a dream year despite the ups and downs ranging from breathtaking performances and a world record to illnesses and a questionable DQ.

Charlie May won 2020 divisional honors in Ohio and Tiger had high hopes and big dreams for his homebred in 2021. Tiger’s ultimate goal for Charlie was to compete in the Little Brown Jug, but due to a missed nominating payment that did not happen. They would have to win one of the four sophomore classics – North America Cup, Messenger Stake, Meadowlands Pace or the Cane Pace – to be eligible to supplement into the 76th Jug for a \$45,000 fee.

After a workmanlike win in the previous week’s elimination, ‘Team Charlie’ – driver Brett Miller, trainer Steve Carter, assistant trainer Dustin Bothman and caretaker Ben Lindsey – was back at Miami Valley Raceway on April 17 for the \$40,000 James Hackett Memorial and the first of many meetings against rival Heart Of Chewbacca. Miller blasted out of post 8 and grabbed the early

lead, setting a moderate pace. Dan Noble brought Heart Of Chewbacca out of the three-hole and the pair paced in tandem with a :25.2 third quarter. Charlie May 'outpaced' himself broke going into the final turn crossing the wire in last.

"Up until that point, that was the worst racing day of my life," said Tiger. "When he crossed the wire, I thought we may have a big problem."

During his four-hour drive back to Pennsylvania, Tiger received several phone calls, including an unexpected one from Missouri State University Veterinary Clinic. His mare, Stipple Hanover, the dam of Charlie May, was sick and near death.

"That was a devastating day," said Tiger. "Things ended up okay. They were able to curtail her infection and my fears about Charlie were alleviated when Brett called. He said 'listen before we get into anything, do not worry about Charlie May. He showed me something today. Trust me, when it is all said and done, we'll be okay.'"

Fifteen days later they were back at Lebanon, OH for the first leg of the Ohio Sire Stakes. Charlie turned in a sub-par fourth-place performance.

"That is the one race that is on me. He scoped sick seven or eight days before that race. Maybe my britches were a little too big. I thought 50 per cent Charlie May was going to be good enough."

When COVID moved the North America Cup to September, one opportunity to get into the Jug was lost, but Team Tiger used that time and a qualifier and overnight event to get their star back into shape.

The second leg of the OHSS was next on June 19. Charlie May showed he was back in form with a gritty half-length win over Heart Of Chewbacca in 1:49.3, last quarter in :25.4.

"That race was a validation... He raced super that night and sort of got the monkey off our back. We got through the bobble, the sickness and got him back on his game."

Charlie May had his mojo back and was shipped to the east coast for the Messenger and Meadowlands Pace. He was a solid second in his Messenger Stakes elim and by just a half-length in the \$500,000 final to American Courage, who also needed a Messenger win to be LBJ eligible.

Tiger put up \$17,000 worth of supplemental and entry fees to be eligible for the Meadowlands Pace.

In the first elimination, Charlie May was upset by the 81-1 long-shot Hellabalou by a half-length in 1:49.2 over the 'good' surface.

The \$700,000 Meadowlands Pace final would be one of the most debated outcomes in recent memory.

Charlie May's night got off to a rocky start when he was forced seven-wide in the first turn and he never saw the pylons. As the field went into the final turn, it appeared that Southwind Gentry (#4) started a chain reaction event that caused Charlie May, Rockyroad Hanover and Abuckabett Hanover to break stride.

Miller quickly got the gelding back on stride and the pair rallied, crossing the finish line a neck ahead of Lawless Shadow and eventual divisional champ Perfect Sting in 1:48.3. Don Tiger had won the Meadowlands Pace for about 10 minutes as the judges reviewed the video. In the end Charlie May was disqualified and placed 9th.

Tiger handled the DQ like a gentleman and appealed the decision, an appeal that is still pending.

"I like our case," said Tiger. "We are confident that they will give us the result as the video evidence clearly shows Southwind Gentry caused the entire interference and the judges made an arbitrary and capricious decision without ever talking to any of the drivers. The appeal was not about the money but about giving the correct result for the history books for Brett Miller, Steve Carter and Charlie May."

Charlie May returned to the Buckeye state and won the third leg of the OHSS at MGM Northfield Park and a \$60,700 division of the Ohio State Fair stakes at Eldorado Scioto Downs. His performance ensured an invite into the \$300,000 Carl Milstein Memorial at Northfield.

Saddled with post #7, Miller sat patiently in the early stages and used a timely miscue by Heart Of Chewbacca in the third turn to get into contention. As Northfield's track announcer Ayers Ratliff noted, "Charlie May was in a different gear than the others" and cruised to a 4 3/4 length win in a world record breaking 1:48.4.

"Charlie warmed up terrible that day and he never warms up bad. After the race, we pulled his blood and it was off. He wasn't 100 per cent that night and still set a world record. That was a magical night."

Tiger came into the \$300,000 OHSS Final at Northfield Park on Sept. 5 full of excitement and confidence. During that mile Charlie May took everyone's best shot and found himself a neck short in second, upset by Borntobeshameless and Dan Noble.

"That was the worst loss of my career. He had a good post and he deserved to win that race. Everyone came after him, a tag-team effort... I make no excuses. He got beat."

Little Brown Jug week had arrived and unable to obtain an emergency order to allow his Jug entry, Tiger was relegated to enter the \$54,350 division of the Ohio Breeders Championship.

Dexter Dunn, who substituted for an ill Brett Miller, guided the son of McArdle to an easy OBC Score in 1:55.2.

Charlie May was done with his Ohio opponents and would then take on the Grand Circuit's best.

A pair of Lexington starts resulted in a win over Perfect Sting in the Bluegrass Stake and a fourth place finish in the \$500,000 Tattersalls Pace (beaten by 1 length) despite leaving from post

#12.

Charlie May won his Breeders Crown elimination, but came up a length short to Perfect Sting in the \$500,000 final.

Charlie concluded his season with three starts in Delaware – a win in the \$164,750 Matron, a fourth in the elim and a third in the \$310,000 Progress Pace final.

"He developed a quarter crack and raced all three races in Delaware with that. It was a day-by-day thing. We could have scratched him at any time."

"The Matron was awesome. It was an opportunity to validate himself against some of the top colts in the country."

Charlie May completed his season with a 10-6-1 mark in 22 starts, earning \$879,400. He easily won divisional honors and was named the "Ohio Horse of the Year" at the annual Ohio Harness Horseman's Association banquet.

Tiger is now looking forward to another successful year in 2022.

"I just made out his stakes schedule. I am going to a little light on him. The Graduate Series, the Confederation Cup and couple of those Ohio races – the Ewart (Memorial) and Charna (Pace). If we would get an invite to the Battle of Lake Erie I would seriously consider that. We are not going to pound on him. I will be a little conservative with him, 14 -18 starts."

Sly Little Fox gunning for Winter Wonderland Series title tonight at Hawthorne

After debuting as a freshman in July 2020, more than 16 months passed before Sly Little Fox returned to racing action. Bambi Fox, her owner and breeder, was unsure the trotter would make it back to the track. Now 4, the mare has bounced back impressively, winning six of eight starts since mid-November, and she will attempt to add a seventh win tonight in the \$22,000 Winter Wonderland Series final at Hawthorne.

Fox has always had a passion for horses. In the past she has ridden jumpers and event horses quite often. Today, the veterinarian and owner of Fox Equine Services, has traveled from farm to farm throughout the Paducah, KY area for nearly four decades. It was Fox's late husband, Jim, that had a passion for racing. When he died in October 2015, she picked up the mantle and continued with the small racing and breeding operation.

"It was my husband's passion first. When he died and I had these horses, I thought, 'Well, okay, let's see what we can do with them.' I've really enjoyed doing that," Fox said.

The couple purchased On Center Stage at Lexington in 2010 with hopes of having a nice racehorse and broodmare. Her older full-brother, Guiltywithanexcuse, has a mark of 1:52.4 and just shy of \$500,000 in earnings. The Classic Photo-Gold Medalist filly, however, never raced. A snake bite derailed her career before it ever had a chance to take off.

"She got a snake bite right above her left knee, and we almost lost her. It gave her arthritis in that joint, so she was never trainable," said Fox. "I sold her not too long after Sly Little Fox was born. I needed to downsize a little bit. This was the one chance I got to breed to Swan For All. I think it worked out pretty good."

Sly Little Fox is the fourth foal out of On Center Stage. The breeder had a name picked out based on the filly's early tendencies, but instead had to settle on the name she races with today.

"It was not my first choice. When the filly was born, she was one of these that as soon as she hit the ground she had something to say. A real talker," Fox said. "So her barn name is Chatterbox. I tried to name her Chatterbox or some kind of permutation, but could never get what I wanted. I got frustrated and I thought, I'll just put Sly Little Fox on there, and lo and behold, I got it."

The Indiana-sired trotter won her freshman qualifier at Harrah's Hoosier Park by a nose in 2:01.2. She trotted third in her pari-mutuel debut at the Anderson oval on July 7, 2020. As quickly as she started, her campaign abruptly came to a close.

"She qualified and made one start and then had some issues with her front tendons. I didn't know for sure if she would ever make it back to the track or not," said Fox. "I brought her home and we rehabbed her. I worked her quite a bit, just getting miles in her and getting those tendons tight."

Fox had never worked with trainer Mike Hollenback, but upon the recommendation of a mutual friend, she reached out once she felt Sly Little Fox was ready to try racing again. Since then,

'Chatterbox' has had plenty to say on the racetrack. Hollenback placed her in a qualifier at Hoosier Park on Nov. 13, where she finished second for Robert Taylor. Five days later, Taylor steered her to her first career win, and did so again the following week, this time in the \$18,150 final of the Howard "Bunny" Colvin series, romping by five lengths.

"She's been really good up front. She was pretty easy to get back going. I didn't feel like I had any issues with the front legs. She was just green," said Hollenback.

Moving to Hollywood Gaming Dayton Raceway in December, Sly Little Fox experienced her first miscue, making a break behind the gate and finishing sixth. It would take three weeks to get back in at Dayton, but she returned to the winner's circle with a 1:58.4 score, her best performance of the abbreviated 2021 season. Sly Little Fox started the 2022 campaign at Miami Valley with a victory, but had a hard time getting back in, so Hollenback sent her to James Eaton to race at Hawthorne.

"I knew she could race every week at Hawthorne. I had never raced her back-to-back races after those starts at Hoosier Park. It was usually always two or three weeks before she raced. I called her my thoroughbred because she didn't race very often," Hollenback said.

In her Hawthorne debut, Joey Putnam steered Sly Little Fox to a runner-up performance, falling a head short to Spice-It-Up in

1:57.3. In the \$11,000 opening leg of the Winter Wonderland Series, held Feb. 6, Mike Oosting guided the favorite to a three and one-quarter length score. Last week she wired the field for Oosting in the second leg to win by more than four lengths, stopping the clock in 1:57.3. Tonight, she starts from the inside post in the \$22,000 series final, carded as race five.

"She's a nice filly, and I don't think she really still knows what she's doing," said Hollenback.

After the Winter Wonderland final, Sly Little Fox will receive a slight break before returning to a series at Miami Valley that begins March 2. After the series, the trotter will race at Hoosier Park, which is set to open in late March. To date, she has earned \$18,925 in 2022, and \$37,425 since her first sophomore start in November. Fox looks forward to watching her homebred compete this year, but should suspensory issues emerge again, she will bring Sly Little Fox home to begin the next phase of the mare's career.

"The plan is to race her as long as she stays healthy and sound. At the point that she is no longer able to race well, she'll come back home and be a broodmare," said Fox. "She's done well for herself."

women, but all drivers, across Australia in the late 1990s and early 2000s. She won five national drivers' premierships from 2000-2005.

Before that, Manning famously travelled to Europe with her father's grand old trotter Knight Pistol and won the Group 1 Harley Davidson Trot in Norway in 1997. She became only the second woman to win a Group 1 race in Europe.

There were other fantastic female drivers around that time. Jodi Quinlan and Kellie Kersley both won Australia's premier speed

test, the Miracle Mile.

But still most tracks only had make-shift women's drivers' rooms and they were far outnumbered by the men.

How times have changed.

Over the past decade, women have become major players in every Australian state and regularly compete and beat the guys in our biggest races.

There's none bigger now than Kate Gath, who has beaten the boys to win the past two Victorian metropolitan drivers' premierships.

Gath was one of three women on last year's Australian top 10 drivers' list. The others were South Australia's Danielle Hill and Western Australia's 21-year-old Emily Suvaljko.

Suvaljko is a rare talent, potentially the best of the lot.

Think about this. Just a few weeks ago, Suvaljko was one of four female drivers in WA's biggest race, the \$A450,000 Group 1 WA Pacing Cup. The others were: Deni Roberts, Jocelyn Young and Maddison Brown.

Before that, only a total of four women drivers had ever driven in the race. That's remarkable.

Suvaljko has been a revelation. It's only four years since she drove her first winners and she's already posted more wins (almost 350) than any other woman in WA history. She is the first WA woman to drive more than 100 wins in a season (last season).

"I saw that come up in my Facebook memories the other day... my first winner," she said. "I do have to pinch myself to think how far I've come in what feels a short amount of time."

The diminutive Suvaljko snared her first Group 1 win on Savvy Bromac in the WA Mares' Classic last November for her "boss", trainer Nathan Turvey and she went within a whisker of a winning that WA Pacing Cup a few weeks ago for Turvey on Miracle Moose – beaten in the last-stride by Wildwest.

"I thought I'd won. I gave a victory salute and copped a suspension for. It's always been my worst nightmare, to celebrate thinking I'd won when I hadn't. I knew I had them beaten all around me, but it (my) Uncle Callan who shot up along the inside and beat me right on the line," she said.

The WA Cup has been bittersweet for Suvaljko. She's unlucky not to have already won the race. Twelve months earlier, she was booked to drive outsider Vultan Tin in the Cup, but a two-week suspension sidelined her. Instead, her father Shannon took the reins and won.

It stung her. She couldn't watch the race live and admitted to the West Australian newspaper's Steve Butler: "I was happy for dad, but it took me about a week or so to be really happy for him."

Shannon said it was clear from a very early age Emily was a natural with horses.

"Since she was two years old she wanted to lead horses in the paddock. She was never afraid of horses and just loved them. She always naturally sat in the cart and didn't panic and just has

always had that natural calmness about her. She's come a long way, she has done all the hard work and I'm very proud of her."

Thanks to those trailblazing women before her, Suvaljko rarely thinks about being a woman in a once male-dominated sport.

"Maybe early-on I thought the boys ganged up on me a bit, but I'm sure now I get the same opportunities any of the guys do," she said.

"There are reminders though. Like going to Gloucester Park (Perth's major track) each week. The boys have this big and terrific driver's room, while we (women) have a tiny room with two showers and a couple of benches. There are four, five or six of us there each week now and we're pushing for a new room."

The tight travel restrictions of Covid have clamped Suvaljko's ability to gain experience outside of her home state for the past couple of years, but she can't wait to try it again.

"That first Lady Drivers' series I competed at in Queensland and then another one in Tasmania, they were fantastic. I got to meet some of the greats like Kerryn Manning and Kate Gath," she said. "I swear that was some of the most competitive racing I've been in. There's no doubt women are more competitive against each other like that than men.

"The chance to drive against them and then socialise and chat afterwards was really special."

Suvaljko openly admits she is fiercely competitive and, as such, has become a real goal-setter.

"Morgan Woodley re-wrote all the records in WA before me, and I knocked a few of them off already. The next one is the fastest to get 500 (wins). Alan Parker, who is the historian over here, set me the challenge, I need about another 130 wins by February next year to beat Morgan's record. I'll be throwing everything at that."

The stunning emergence of Suvaljko is the just the latest sign that it won't be long until there are as many women at the top of Australia's driving ranks as there are males.

And that's downright refreshing.

American-bred trotter Milligan's School best in newly established race

Joyce and Richard McClelland-bred **Milligan's School** (Yankee Glide—Tori Ann) has been a serious threat on the Swedish V75-circuit and other big races since he landed in Europe in the winter of 2016/2017. The 9-year-old has earned \$100,000 or more at five occasions and his European career so far contains several high stakes wins and a total earnings of \$1,883,945 (American earnings included).

When Swedish track Bergsåker offered a new race, with \$53,500 to the winner, Milligan's School took the opportunity to start his sixth season on Swedish ground in the best possible way on Saturday (Feb. 19).

Driver Ulf Eriksson understood that the front position would fit his horse well over 2,640 meters and when Milligan's School hit the lead with strong French trotter Ble du Gers on the outside, the race started to become a show worth waiting for. Ble du Gers is the kind of trotter that never gives up, the same can be said about Milligan's School, at least when he races in front. So the battle between them began at the back stretch during the last lap and leader Milligan's School fought well and seemed to

have control of the race as the wire approached. But from out of nowhere and far outside, Stoleteshow was equipped with jet motors and he flew into the hunt for the leading duo. Milligan's School put his nose, or head first at the wire and the first big race of the year in Sweden ended up in Stefan Melander's possession. Melander owns and trains the 9-year-old winner who won in a mile rate of 1:58.3 over 1.6 miles.

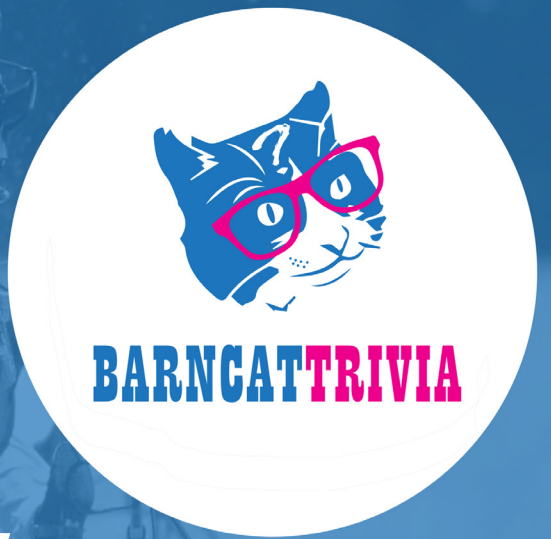
Runner up Stoleteshow and bronze medalist Ble du Gers both finished with the same mile rate as the winner.

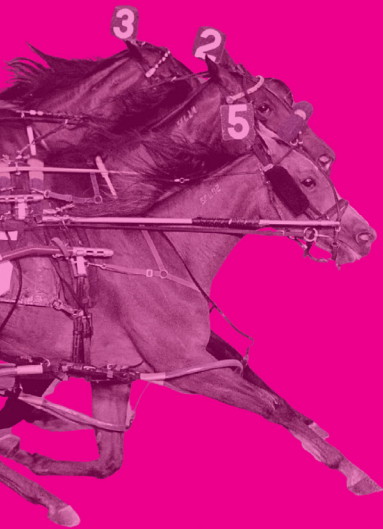

HRU Foal Spotlight



Shartin N's royally-bred filly arrives at Anvil and Lace Farm

One of the best-bred pacing fillies in the world was foaled on Sunday, Feb. 13 when world champion and 2019 Horse of the Year Shartin N gave birth to a filly sired by world champion and 2012 and 2013 Pacer of the Year, Captaintreacherous.

Ola Yoder, owner of Kountry Lane Standardbreds, LLC of Indiana, purchased Shartin N for an undisclosed sum in December, 2020 and had her bred to Captaintreacherous.

"I'm tickled pink with Shartin N's filly," Yoder said. "When I first saw a photo of the foal, I told them he's a nice-looking colt. Then they told me it's a filly and that made it even better."

"Shartin will again be bred to Captaintreacherous," Yoder said. "He produces some great racehorses. I'm pretty excited about all of this. I've put together a pretty nice string of top mares and I look forward to seeing their foals develop and then go in the big yearling sales."

Shartin N gave birth Sunday at Beth and Doug Yontz's Anvil and Lace Farm in Kentucky. That has been home for Shartin N.

"The filly was born at around 1 a.m. February 13," said Beth Yontz. "It was a textbook foaling. She was just perfect and she loves her baby."

"It has been very exciting to be part of the process," Yontz explained about breeding and foaling world champion Shartin N. "I'm just so happy that everything went smoothly and that she's such a good mother."

Agent Dean Miller, who bought the mare from Richard Poillucci and sold it to Yoder said it was a tough two weeks.

"She was overdue," Miller said. "And all of us were on pins and needles for two weeks until Sunday."

Shartin N, the fastest pacing mare in history, had a glittering harness racing career. The world champion mare won 46 of her 68 lifetime starts and \$2,667,563 in purses – an average of \$39,228 per start – and took a world record lifetime mark of 1:46.4.

She clocked an amazing 20 winning miles in 1:50 or better.

Bred in New Zealand, Shartin N did not race at age two and

commenced her career in Australia as a three-year-old, winning seven races and \$105,718 in purses including the Queensland and Tasmanian Oaks.

Following her defeating Victorian Horse of the Year, Jiliby Kung Fu 1:48.4 (\$529,710), at Melton in 2017, when Shartin N sat parked out the entire trip and won in a class record 1:52.5 mile rate over 1720 meters, Shartin N was bought by leading New Zealand bloodstock agent John Curtin on behalf of USA owner Richard Poillucci of South Easton, MA.

Poillucci would then take on partners JoAnn Looney King of Delaware and later down the road, driver Tim Tetrick of Delaware.

Ironically, Shartin N's foal was delivered on Feb. 13, which also happens to be Richard Poillucci's birthday.

In 2021 Captaintreacherous ranked first among 2-year-old pacing money-winning sires with \$3,358,498 earned and third among 3-year-old pacing money-winning sires with \$4,768,577 earned.

Captaintreacherous is also the sire of both 2021 Dan Patch older pacers of the year Allywag Hanover (Anderosa Hanover) p,1:46.4 \$1,195,998 and Lyons Sentinel (Tutu Hanover) p,1:48 \$2,003,594.

As with all of the top mares that Ola Yoder has, their foals will be sold at auctions. It will be a great contest to see how much Shartin N's Captaintreacherous filly will bring.

Zero-sum game

A solution to all of harness racing's problems.

Illegal drugs, horse shortages, a boring product, lack of innovation, ridiculously high takeout's, PETA, unfair post positions, horrific demographics, on and on. The list of problems in harness horse racing are long and deep. The challenges are wearying. Using deeply superficial research and a fevered mind, let's examine a possible solution to many of these problems.

Close your eyes. Open your mind. Visualize a new branch of our sport: contests based on precision rather than raw speed.

Note the term contest instead of race. The next scheduled contest is for 2:00 trotting horses. The purse is \$8,000. You have wagered \$10 on horse number three, *New Horizons*, one of the five trotting horse contestants.

Now we stray into new territory. There is no starting car, merely a solitary horse on the track approaching the laser-controlled starting line. The goal is perfection. Perfection for this contest rests in four 30-second quarters for a score of zero. Each quarter-mile time deviation, over or below, measured to the hundredths of a second, is a penalty.

The first horse trips the starting beam. A pleasing chime signals the horse has begun the mile. Your eyes glance back and forth between the trotting horse and the large running timer display. At the first quarter milepost, the optical laser light blinks on 30.021, an excellent time. The horse trots on. You shift your gaze to the timer as the horse trots toward the half-mile laser display. The laser blinks 60.140, and then the three-quarter laser time is 1:30.020. The final time of this mile is 2:00.010. The contestants' goal is the lowest penalty time, which is arrived at by compiling each quarter time. The score of the first horse flashes on the giant scoreboard:

.021
+ .140
+ .020
+ .010
= .191

Within a minute, horse number two approaches the laser starting beam. This trotter has a poor outing. His time is .235

The horse you wagered on, *New Horizons*, is next. You know your target time is below .191. Your horse is off in quest of the perfect mile, each quarter rivets your attention, the final time -.187! You take the lead. Two more horses in the contest, each significant to you.

Please cease all scoffing, eye-rolling, and swearing. Gently set aside terms like blasphemy, madness, rabble-rousing, sedition, and take a calming breath. Stakes racing and traditional racing will remain. At this point, this timed harness event is an experiment for veteran horses that have already established a performance ceiling.

Allow me to ask and answer your questions.

Q. This game is about speed! It is about winning! The faster your horse goes, the better, you idiot!

A. I agree, well, maybe not with the last two words. In this new proposal, the faster the horse you own can compete, the more purse money you will earn. Speed remains essential. Should you have an older trotter with the talent to trot miles in 1:56, your purses will soar to \$30,000. Should you own a trotter that possesses the ability to compete when the time marker for a trotting contest is a breathtaking 1:52, the few who can compete at this speed could compete for a \$100,000 purse. The possibilities are endless.

Q. How is this exciting? One horse at a time? Come on man, quit smoking stuff that is not on the approved medications list.

A. I believe this type of timed competition is superior to traditional harness races due to mental stimulation. Virtually every second during the 15 minutes required for this five-horse contest introduces action for the player. Every race in this contest is meaningful as your eyes dart back and forth between the timer and the trotter speeding around the track. Your mind is occupied as you constantly make mental calculations. Every quarter-time flashing, each thirty-second interval, is of interest to you. This concept offers a more immersive presentation.

Q. How in the hell does this help the handicapper?

A. In many ways. First, while beautiful horses and trotting talent remain on display, an additional onus is placed on the driver, a human being. Second, each of the five horses and drivers is

competitive, ultra-competitive. Third, the difference between the horses will be infinitesimally slight. No unbeatable 1-9 favorites and hopeless longshots in this format. Fourth, the need or desire to dope horses will vanish when every horse in the race can comfortably make the classification time. Fifth, while this sort of contest will squeeze out a segment of genuine handicappers (only a matter of time in an artificial intelligence world), the opportunity to open the gambling door to more recreational players will more than compensate. And sixth, this offers a fresh start for a stale product and can be integrated into existing racing programs.

Q. We tried this in 1957. We called it time trials or time bars or something, and it was a dud. Why repeat it?

A. This is not 1957. Remember the adage: one never steps into the same stream twice.

Q. What makes you believe this is possible?

A. I spoke to my daughter on the phone this morning. She lives 1,000 miles away. I not only talked to her, but we also saw each other. She was baking chocolate chip cookies. I showed her the 1947 edition of *Gulliver's Travels* that I picked up at a flea market. Later in the day, I watched and wagered a traditional trotting race on my iPhone.

Q. A sport that cannot implement teeny, tiny changes will revolutionize? Keep dreaming.

A. I will. Aside from laser timers, Beta testing of this program would not require significant investment or retrofit of a race-track. Why not experiment with the first two or last two races on traditional racing programs and analyze the reception.

Q. What other benefits could there be from this insane idea?

A. Use your imagination. Imagine chipping away at the old problems with a new concept.

Well, that takes care of the sport of harness racing.

Next week, I will unite the maniacal political factions.

We regularly ask: Why can’t we attract new owners, new horse-players and new fans”? Perhaps we simply need to take a very close look in the mirror.

North American industry drawn on French format?

North American harness racing differs from European in two main respects, one which is the predictable pedigrees of the entries in the big-time stakes. Surprises are few and far between. It's like the owners and trainers never dream of racing their ponies on the national campaigns if they are not blue-blooded. No, they are content with racing in the neighboring states of PA, NJ, NY and ON.

So why is the industry shrinking geographic wise?

Defeatism. Useless complaining. Get a life! Up the ante, by "French" stake fees included in the sale and registration. Not all-inclusive, though. Four stakes (2 & 3 YOs) would open for free elims until the finals. This race at Vincennes, Paris on Sunday illustrates the point of diversity: 14 entries, 13 sires.
