Count On Cody's comeback story particularly special for Al and Lori Manke

After a successful 2-year-old season, the trotter was sidelined by a suspensory injury for much of the next three years, but now, at age 6, Count On Cody has earned a check in his last five starts at Miami Valley for the couple that manage Ohio's Steiner Stock Farm.

Everyone loves a good comeback story. In the case of trotter Count On Cody, the once talented 2-year-old resurfaced at Hollywood Gaming at Dayton Raceway in late 2020 after an extended absence from racing. Al Manke and his wife, Lori, now campaign the son of Full Count, and they share many connections to the gelding, who returned to the winner's circle Friday (Feb. 5), at Miami Valley Raceway, the first time since 2018.

"He's a fun horse to race because he gives you everything

he's got all the time," said Al, manager of Steiner Stock Farm in Lima, OH. "We have 400 or so acres here that are dedicated to the horses and 30 broodmares. I have eight foals on the ground and 13 to go, so he's just fun for us. I'm not going to break him down racing. If he gets off, he's done."

The Mankes' connection to Count On Cody begins with

both the trotter's sire and dam. Prior to managing Steiner Stock Farm, Manke worked two decades for his father-in-law, Ohio Hall of Fame trainer Marty Wollam. Wollam conditioned Full Count and his sire, Striking Sahbra, as well as Count On Cody's dam, the SJ's Caviar mare Caviar Forthe Lady. During her career, the mare amassed 21 wins in 76 starts with \$567,306 in earnings.

"His mother, shoot, we went all over with her. In one month, she won the Buckette and Pennsylvania Sires Stakes," Al said. "Of all the horses, she was my wife's favorite to take care of, and she was just a sweetheart. She was special, and we've always done well with the Full Counts."

Manke and his wife transitioned to Steiner Stock Farm before Count On Cody debuted in 2017. That year, Count On Cody, the second homebred out of the dam from George and Brad Berlin's Acadia Farms, hit the board in each of his eight seasonal starts, registering two wins and four runner-up performances, including a second-place effort in the \$250,000 Ohio Sires Stakes Championship. He finished the season with just shy of \$127,000 in purse earnings. Upon his return as a sophomore, Count On Cody won two of four starts, setting a Northfield Park track record in his third trip behind the gate. By mid-July, the colt was sidelined with suspensory issues.

"He was a really good 2-year-old and he had a suspensory injury. He came back at 3 and he only started a few times and hurt it again. They were going to try him back at 4 and he didn't make it back," said Al. "When he was 4 and trying to come back, George gave us his sister, Ladycallstheshots, as a broodmare since we were running the broodmare farm."

When it was apparent Count On Cody would not return to racing, the Mankes were asked if they would take him as

well. They agreed and the trotter was gelded and sent to them. In turn, they shipped their acquisition to The Meadows, where he was broke to ride. When Lori tried to ride Count On Cody upon his return, it was clear he had a different agenda.

"We brought him back home and she tried riding him," Al said. "He didn't have quite all of the race out of him. He would ride, but you weren't going to throw the saddle on him and ride him through the drive thru at McDonald's. He's a little strung up."

Spending his days in the field for what Al estimates was over a year, Count On Cody's suspensory issues improved as did his soundness. Noting the change, the couple decided to put the 5-year-old back in training. Last fall after the harvest, Al began working with Count On Cody in a local wheat field.

"When they took the wheat off, I jogged him every day for about a month and a half," he said. "I mowed a path through

the stubble with the zero turn and jogged him about four miles out in the wheat field.”

The trotter responded well to the program, and soon Al was training his charge at the fairgrounds across the street from Steiner Stock Farm. He qualified Count On Cody at Dayton in mid-December, and the gelding raced second, timed in 1:58.4. On Dec. 29, he would make his first pari-mutuel start since August 4, 2018. He finished fourth, clocking a 1:57 mile and :28.3 last quarter with Al in the bike.

“We kind of had to race him into shape. If he had the opportunity, he would trot every ounce he could go every time and be more than happy to do it. That’s what he was born and bred to do,” the trainer said. “That’s why I drive him, just to take care of him a little bit.”

Now 6, Count On Cody has five starts under his belt at Miami Valley, earning a check each time out. In his last three trips behind the starting gate, he logged a 1:58.4 triumph and a pair of second-place finishes. His last time out he eclipsed \$150,000 in career earnings. The trotter is back in to race today (Feb. 21) at Miami Valley.

“My wife and I both felt like he wanted to; he still had some race in him,” Al said. “I think she’s hoping that once he gets all the racing out of his system he’ll settle down and she can ride him around. I don’t know. He might be 25 or something.”

Other horsemen may have been quick to dispatch a project like Count On Cody. For Al and Lori Manke, the gelding is a connection back to a time when they spent each day in the shed row, caring for and developing horses alongside family for long-time partners such as Acadia Farms and others. He is a special horse for many reasons.

“It’s hard for people to understand. My wife and I have done it all our lives, and it’s fun for us to go race,” Al said. “With him being a nice horse makes it even more fun. He’s special to her because he’s out of her favorite mare. He’s special because our good friends bred and raised him. Just all the way around he’s fun, just a nice horse to be around and we’re having fun with him.”

The storied career of Dr. Glen Brown

The highly-decorated former president of Armstrong Bros. has had a rich life in the standardbred industry.

There aren't too many people who have had as storied a career in harness racing as Dr Glen Brown. His accomplishments include, but are not limited to, membership

in the Harness Racing Living Hall of Fame in Goshen and the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame; being the former president of the Canadian Standardbred Horse Society (the registration department that was a precursor to Standardbred Canada), a long-time board member of the Hambletonian Society; a former director of the Ontario Jockey Club (precursor to WEG) and head of its standardbred division and most importantly, the former president and face of the Armstrong Bros. breeding empire for many years, one of the greatest breeding establishments in the history of harness racing.

Brown's dad, James William, was a draft horse dealer in the '30s and '40s. This was at a time when more people had horses than had cars. He started working for a man by the name of Jack Galbraith of Brussels, ON, who provided him with a train car load of horses to take to northern Ontario to try to sell. By the end of that first day, Jim Brown had sold all the horses and came home to Brussels.

"Where are my horses?" Galbraith said. Brown said they were all sold, mostly to lumber men and miners. He gave him his money.

Jim Brown continued primarily at first with draft horses, but

branched out to harness horses and raced them through all the fairs in Ontario and Quebec. He was in Quebec City racing during World War II when Winston Churchill had his famous conference with Franklin Roosevelt.

James Brown became president of the Canadian Standardbred Horse Society (CSHS), Canada's equivalent of the USTA registration department. It was theoretically a government agency, but it was essentially run and administered by harness people. Several years later, Dr. Glen Brown became head of the CSHS, becoming the second son of a former president to head the society. The only other father/son tandem to have previously done so was the Honorable Earl Rowe and his son Bill.

Jim Brown was one of those involved in starting harness racing at Thorncliffe Park in Toronto. He was the manager, and when the Ontario Jockey Club bought them out and moved harness racing to Old Woodbine, he became the Jockey Club's first standardbred racing manager.

Young Glen Brown didn't have much chance but to become involved in the horse business. While attending the Ontario Veterinary College (OVC) at the University of Guelph, he worked for the most prominent equine vet at Old Woodbine (later Greenwood) as an assistant. He worked from 7 a.m. to about 4 p.m. After those working hours he took a second job as an attendant in the horse ambulance each evening at the track. He did this for several years. Remarkably, not one single time in those years, was there the need to utilize the horse ambulance.

Upon graduation from the OVC in 1957, there were two things to do: 1. Marry his sweetheart, Pat. 2. Get a job — preferably with racehorses.

Dr. Brown first went to work for Peter Pan Farms in

Washington, PA (no relation to the Peter Pan Stable of Bob Glazer).

They stood two stallions — Meadow Gene, a moderately successful son of Adios, and a Worthy Boy trotter named Worthy Aristocrat. Dr. Brown stayed there 11 months. To say he did not enjoy his stay there would be an understatement. It seems that farm owner David Resnick wasn't the most pleasant person to work for.

He tells the story of the time some people delivering hay were picking up a friend of theirs who worked at the farm. Mr. Resnick arrived and asked Dr. Brown who those people were that were doing nothing.

"You need to get rid of them," Resnick told Dr. Brown, who responded: "But Mr. Resnick, they don't work for us" to which Resnick said, "It doesn't matter. I fired them anyway."

Dr. Brown remembers bringing the yearling crop to Harrisburg for the sale. On one of the seemingly interminable tunnels on the Pennsylvania Turnpike, the truck carrying the yearlings caught on fire. Fortunately, he was in a car trailing the truck. Somehow, they managed to unload the yearlings with no damage caused. The horses made it to Harrisburg safely. That consignment included Dares Direct, one of the early Canadian Juvenile Circuit stars which was purchased by Del MacTavish.

Around that time, Elgin Armstrong was just starting to acquire quality well-bred livestock. Prior to that, his standardbreds were nothing but an ordinary lot and his thoroughbreds were worse.

The first horse he bought from Delvin Miller was a Hoot Mon filly by the name of Helicopter. Armstrong left her with Miller to train. She turned out to be pretty good, winning the Hambletonian for Miller's assistant trainer Harry Harvey.

There's an interesting back story to how Miller happened to have Helicopter in his stable at the time.

It seems that Miller and John Simpson had sold a filly to Fred Van Lennep. After awhile, Simpson asked Miller where the money for the sale was. "I'll have to ask Freddie," Miller said. Van Lennep suggested that instead of cash, they use the money as credit for buying one of Castleton's fillies. They bought Helicopter and the partners decided that Miller would train her. There is yet another back story to the filly's name. She was named Helicopter because Mrs. Van Lennep was transported in a helicopter to deliver one of her children.

That winter, Elgin Armstrong, whom Miller had never met, stopped by Miller's stable at Ben White Raceway and asked Miller if he had any good fillies to sell. Miller mentioned Helicopter, but said that he had a partner whose permission he would need. Miller called Simpson and told him he had this Canadian to whom he could sell their filly for a fair price.

"Hell, yes," Simpson said. "You never can go broke if you take a profit."

From that point on, Miller was the Armstrong brothers' main trainer. They also had Harold McKinley, who trained and raced the horses that weren't quite Grand Circuit stock in Canada. Jimmy Takter, Chuck Sylvester, Jack Kopas and Bill Wellwood also trained some on occasion.

Dr. Brown isn't one hundred percent sure, but he believes

that it was Miller who recommended him to Elgin Armstrong to be their vet and farm manager.

Dr. Brown met Elgin and was hired.


"What a pleasure to finally work for some reasonable people," Dr. Brown said.

When Dr. Brown arrived at the Ontario nursery, things were somewhat in turmoil. The 300-acre farm was infested with strangles. About 20 of the mares were thoroughbreds that weren't much. The standardbred mares numbered around 15. They were a little better, but not a whole lot. Dr. Brown recommended that they sell all the thoroughbreds and most of the others.

With Dr. Brown's urging, Elgin Armstrong decided to concentrate on quality. The apex of quality at that time were pacing mares by Adios (who he called Adioo) and trotting mares by Hoot Mon. The majority of the fillies and mares they concentrated on in the early years were by those two stallions. After all, two of the first horses they bought were Dotties Pick (Adios) and Helicopter (Hoot Mon). At one time, Armstrong Bros. owned 22 mares by Adios.


When one considers the passage of time, arguably the greatest pacing filly ever was one of those Adios mares. Her

name was Countess Adios. She completely overwhelmed a good crop of colts as a 3-year-old. She raced free legged. She demolished the colts in the Cane and the Messenger and would almost certainly have also won the Little Brown Jug had she been eligible. He raced Countess Adios in partnership with Hugh Grant, but the deal was once she was retired, she would become a member of the Armstrong broodmare band. The Armstrongs also owned a sister or two to her. Miller had a yearling colt out of her dam, Countess Vivian, who he offered to Elgin Armstrong. Assuming that the colt was by Adios, he was interested. When he found that the colt was by Dale Frost, he lost interest. That colt was Meadow Skipper.

After a few years, Armstrong Bros.' ABC Farms became one of the sport's breeding behemoths.

In the early 1970s, Glen Brown was part of one of the many groups trying to get the Ontario government to fund a Sires Stakes program. He was appointed a member of the Ontario Racing Commission in 1973 and served there for 11 years. The Commission immediately formed the Ontario Horse Racing and Breeding Advisory Committee and made Brown its chairman. It had representation for the breeds, the tracks and the horsemen's associations. They were tasked with designing and implementing a program. The program has been highly successful and has saved the Ontario Industry. In 1989, The CSHS honored Dr. Brown with its Achievement Award.

Shortly after concluding his Commission time, he was elected a director of the Ontario Jockey Club, later to become Woodbine Entertainment. (WEG). He served on that board for a number of years, including as chair of its standardbred committee.

When Dr. Brown first came to work at Armstrong Bros. they were selling their yearlings at Harrisburg. He was instrumental in establishing the first Canadian select yearling sale to be run by the CSHS.

Most people believe the Kentucky Standardbred Sale was the first to be a "select" sale that physically evaluated the yearlings nominated. They were not. The first one was the one established in Canada by Glen Brown.

One year at Harrisburg, when Elgin Armstrong had a decent consignment, their horses were sold first thing in the morning. They believed they were negatively affected by the forward placement in the sale. The next year, Alan Leavitt

was starting a new sale at Liberty Bell. The Armstrong yearlings sold there for a few years. One year, Leavitt told Dr. Brown that he was going to sell his Lana Lobell, Speedy Crown yearlings at his New Jersey farm to coincide with Hambletonian weekend when many European buyers were expected to be present.

"What about us and the other consignors?" asked Dr Brown. "Oh, I'll continue the Liberty Bell sale," said Leavitt. That would have been the equivalent of taking Hanover yearlings away from Harrisburg. This obviously did not sit well with Elgin.

"We grew tired of being manipulated by the sales companies," Brown said. "We wanted a say in our destiny. Tom Crouch and Bill Shehan had started the Kentucky Standardbred Horse Sales Company and we looked into selling there, but only if we could buy into the enterprise and have some say as to how we were handled. They sold us and Jack Baugh (Almahurst Farm) each 24 per cent, with Crouch and Shehan each retaining 26 per cent. From that point forward, we sold all our premier yearlings there."

One year at Harrisburg, Miller told Dr. Brown and Elgin that he needed to cut down. Dr. Brown had just given him a list of

the yearlings that they were keeping to train. One of the ones that Miller had commented on was the Helicopter filly. "Maybe you ought to give her to someone else to train. I haven't had much luck in training her foals," Miller said. "Besides, I really need to cut down and start enjoying life."

Elgin asked him who he would recommend to train. Miller said that Joe O'Brien had just become available. He was the contract trainer/driver for the Camp Stables. Sol Camp had passed away and after a couple of years in the business, his son Jim had just sold all the horses and their farm in Kentucky. "He'd be a great trainer for you," Miller said.

They met with O'Brien at Harrisburg and the horses were placed in O'Brien's care. That Stars Pride filly out of Helicopter that Delvin had referenced turned out to be Armbro Flight, who Glen Brown believes was the greatest horse ever raised by Armstrong Bros.

"One thing about Elgin," Dr. Brown said. "He believed in always having good people working for him whether it be in the construction or the horse business. Jimmy Hammond and Larry Drysdale were two of the very best people I've ever known when it came to raising and prepping yearlings."

Elgin Armstrong noticed that they were racing for pretty good purses in California, so he suggested that Dr. Brown send some there to race. They sent a few from their Canadian stable to Howard Beissinger. The best was a pacer by the name of Fast Buck. He did pretty well, which prompted Beissinger to ask, "Do you have any more like those to send to me?"

Elgin bought a place in Florida where he would spend the winter. He decided to give a few to Billy Haughton so that he could keep his interest piqued by being near his horses. The very first one was an Airliner colt by the name of Armbro Omaha, a grandson of Countess Adios. As with Miller and Helicopter and O'Brien with Armbro Flight, it wasn't a bad way to begin. Omaha became the first standardbred to win five \$100,000 races in one year.

After Elgin and brother Ted died, the Armstrong Bros. equine enterprise was left in somewhat of a state of flux. Elgin's son Charlie had some interest, but initially his main interest was with jumpers and show horses. He gradually acquired some standardbreds and began to raise his own, in addition to having his name on the masthead of Armstrong Bros. Through the years, he achieved significant success with Bill Wellwood training and driving

for him. There were other members of the founding family who didn't have the equine interests that Charlie had. The construction company had been sold. There were some among the heirs who felt that the same should be done with the horse enterprise. Thus the seeds of the demise of Armstrong Bros. as a major force in world-wide breeding were sown.

What about Albatross? You guys were in the original syndicate organized by Alan Leavitt, then you sold out after the excrement hit the fan and the horse was re-syndicated with John Simpson running the show?

"There has always been somewhat of a misunderstanding regarding those events. Firstly, Armstrong Bros., the corporation, was never a principal in Albatross. For business reasons, Elgin and Ted were as individuals. We all felt, rightly or wrongly that physically Stanley Dancer was in no position to train and race a horse in which we had a large investment from a hospital bed. It was somewhat incongruous to have an ambulance show up at the paddock and unload Stanley to race him. Things got pretty nasty and Elgin and Ted decided that it would be wise to just get out. A good offer was made, so that is what they did."

The year was 1979. Dr. Brown was in Harrisburg with Charlie Armstrong, Bill Wellwood and Glen Garnsey. Armstrong had budgeted \$300,000 to spend on yearlings. They had bought Delmegan and a high-priced Steady Star filly. Delmegan was given to Garnsey to train. "We are all spent out," Charlie said of he and Wellwood. "We are going home."

Dr. Brown decided to stay at the sale with Garnsey. Hanover was selling in a night session. Dr. Brown was looking for an Albatross filly to become his future broodmare. They were very much in demand and brought some hefty prices. There was a filly in the ring not bringing much money. Dr. Brown had seen her, but Garnsey had not. Dr. Brown recalled Wellwood telling him that he had been to Hanover and had seen the filly. Dr. Brown remembers Wellwood telling him, "She could fly on the pace alongside the lead pony. She was small, but could she ever go." When the filly was in the ring, Dr. Brown bought her with one bid at \$20,000. He said to Garnsey, "You'd better go take a look at her." Other than being quite small, she was well put together. Garnsey said, "She's too small to breed as a 2-year-old. Why don't you ship her to Florida and we'll see what we've got?" The filly's name was Fan Hanover. She turned out to be one of the great pacing fillies ever. She was Horse of the Year in 1981 and is still the only filly to ever win the Little Brown Jug.

At the age of 71 in 2004, Dr. Brown decided that it was time to lessen his work load and semi-retire. Dr. Moira Gunn was named the Armstrong Bros.' president and farm manager.

She called her mother in Scotland to give her the news. "I've got both good news and bad news," she told her mom. "The good news is that I've become the president of Armstrong Brothers. The bad

news is that they will be going out of business fairly soon."

The sad fact was that there were quite a few heirs to the Armstrong fortune and very few of them had any interest in harness racing.

The decision was made to sell all the horses and the farm.

It was a melancholy time for those who had given so much for the farm's success and its place in history.

Dr. Glen Brown is now 87 and lives self-sufficiently in a condo in Brampton, ON.

"I don't expect to live forever," he said. "This old body is showing its age. I still get around, albeit with the aid of a walker. My family visits often and I really enjoy my time spent with them. I still follow the horses. Normally at this time of year, I used to be in Florida where I leased a condo. But COVID-19 has dashed all those plans. All in all, I consider myself a pretty lucky guy, who has lived a great life."

It's never too early to talk about the Hambletonian

Eight drivers earned Hambletonian money both at Du Quoin and the Meadowlands.

- **Stanley Dancer** earned \$288,109 at Du Quoin with three driving wins, and \$607,980 at the Big M.
- **Howard Beissinger** earned \$296,593 winning three times at Du Quoin in a 10-year stretch, and more than double that (\$607,790) at the Meadowlands without winning a final.
- **Mike Zeller** earned \$12,841 at Du Quoin on the strength

of his fourth-place finish with Stock Split in 1974, and then he had the favorite in his heat in the initial Meadowlands Hambletonian in 1981 with Banker Barker, who was fifth in summary at day's end good for \$43,900.

- **Tommy Haughton** made \$73,392 finishing second to stablemate Burgomeister in 1980 at Du Quoin with Final Score, who was the division winner. Haughton then won it in 1982 with Speed Bowl at The Meadowlands. Overall, Haughton's Meadowlands take was \$491,500.

- **Doug Ackerman** made \$14,678 at Du Quoin and \$70,000 at the Meadowlands. (Son DR drove to the second-place finish in 2006 with Chocolatier).

- **Dick Richardson, Jr.** \$19,261 at Du Quoin came from Golden Sovereign finishing third in summary in 1974. At the Meadowlands, he banked \$147,964. Richardson was fifth in 1987 and 1991 with Cotton Hanover and Crystas Best, respectively.

- **George Sholty** won the 1979 Du Quoin Hambletonian with Legend Hanover and the horseman earned \$240,342 at Du Quoin. Sholty earned \$304,750 at the Big M.

- **Carl Allen** banked \$15,000 at Du Quoin and \$175,800 at the Meadowlands.

Twenty-seven times a driver has finished second in the Hambletonian and never won it – nine of those have occurred at the Meadowlands:

Luc Ouellette, Cat Manzi, Yannick Gingras (3), Berndt Lindstedt, D R Ackerman, Jim Meittinis, Sonny Patterson (2), Andy Miller (2) and Randy Waples.

The other 18 drivers are: James Allen, Bill Herman, Vernon Dancer, Walter Ross, Sonny Dancer, Eddie Wheeler, Harry Pownall (twice), Dana Cameron, James Wingfield, Fay Fitzpatrick, Harry Whitney, Lee Smith, Harry Short, Vic Fleming, Spec Erskine, Daryl Parshall, Lyman Brusie and Townsend Ackerman.

Hambletonian in six decades

Delvin Miller is the only driver or trainer to appear in the Hambletonian in six different decades. He started with Don Scott in 1946 and he trained Tarport Mark in 1992 who was 11-1 in his elimination heat and finished fifth with Tom Sells driving.

Two-for-three

Howard Beissinger won twice in his first three Hambletonian assignments – 1969 debuting with Lindys Pride and then in 1971 with Speedy Crown. Nobody has done this since – and Beissinger was no spring chicken. He debuted in the Hambletonian at age 46. Scotty Zeron came the closest in 2018 with Atlanta winning the driver his second Hambletonian in just four attempts.

Hammer time

Roger Hammer turned 75 on Feb. 18. He is the oldest driver to debut in the Meadowlands Hambletonian and is the oldest driver to win it – 2005 with Vivid Photo. Hammer was about a half-year older than J P Dubois, who also debuted at age 59.

Post 10 in the Hambletonian...

... may not be as bad as you think.

2020 – Amigo Volo was fourth from post 10 at 6-1.

Who is going to hold these titles the longest: **Herve Filion**, who was the winningest driver in North America for 40.5 years (from 1972 until Dave Palone passed him in 2012) or **John Campbell**, who has led all drivers in career earnings for 33.5 years and counting?



Age is just a number to Melady's Monet

Melady's Monet is getting up in age but remains young at heart. The 12-year-old male trotter has three wins and a second in four starts this season after failing to cash a check Saturday (Feb. 20) at The Meadowlands in the \$22,500 conditioned trot.

"He's doing really good," trainer Hermann Heitmann said. "Nothing has changed with him (over the years). He is still acting like a young horse, actually. He likes to play around in the paddocks, he enjoys his lunch, he doesn't look like he wants to slow down yet.

"He just likes to race."

Melady's Monet is a son of Revenue S out of Keystone Melady. He was bred by Ester Balenzano and her husband Luca, who passed away last year. Ester remains the horse's owner under the Melady Enterprises banner.

For his career, Melady's Monet has won 70 of 224 races and \$1.73 million. He has earned more than \$125,000 in each of the past eight years.

He won the 2016 Vincennes Invitational at The Meadowlands and later that season was second to Bee A Magician in the \$250,000 Yonkers Invitational. In 2015, he won The Meadows Maturity and had third-place finishes in the Cutler Memorial and Crawford Farms Open Trot.

In recent years, he has remained a consistent performer in top-level trots at various East Coast racetracks, particularly Yonkers. The gelding was sidelined for five months in 2018 because of colic surgery but has earned a paycheck in 49 of 54 starts since his return.

"He's like the horse of a lifetime," Heitmann said. "There are not too many around like him."

Saturday's start at the Meadowlands was Melady's Monet's first at The Big M since December 2019.

What makes Melady's Monet successful in fending off rivals as well as Father Time?

"His attitude," Heitmann said. "He knows when we're going to the races and he likes the competition. He tries unbelievably hard, always. He never gives up.

"Attitude is everything with him. He just wants to do it. You

Racing with Intelligence

He began to lecture me the second I stepped into his kitchen.

"Artificial intelligence will destroy pari-mutuel wagering. The average handicapper, even an excellent handicapper, cannot compete with complex algorithms."

"Destruction? Artificial intelligence? Algorithms? Dude, I haven't even had my morning coffee yet."

I headed towards the Keurig and slid my trusty 'The Man, The Myth, The Legend' coffee mug under the spout. When my pod of Italian Roast clicked into place, I asked, "Now what's this Silicon Valley BS?"

He continued to speak as if he were conducting a morning seminar, "Not many people understand that the ramifications of artificial intelligence are both amazing and dangerous. One of the dangers is that people too many people believe they understand it."

"Alright, alright, there's going to be a war between artificial intelligence and natural stupidity. I already have my NS Tee shirt. Which side are you joining? And why did you drag in horse racing?"

"Last night, I did some research. AI is already involved in horse racing more than most people realize."

"Everyone knows the days of a guy with a pencil in his fedora hat are gone."

"Trey, they have been gone for 30 years. Your game needs some serious renovation. I have a concept that could give your game more time."

"I'm listening."

"Horse racing should turn the tables. Racetrack management should use artificial intelligence to their advantage and squeeze the juice out of wagering data preemptively. AI should design the races to make every race uber-competitive. I can think of several ways to create equitable races, assign posts, drivers, stagger starts, etc."

The Keurig gave a final hiss. I grabbed my mug and took a sip. "So, you are suggesting every race be a blanket finish, no

long odds, no short odds. Just photo finishes every race?"

"Yes, competitive races all the time would be an improved entertainment product."

"But what about gambling? How does your reclassification idea stop the artificial intelligence floodgates?"

"Nothing will stop artificial intelligence, but horse races created by it will minimize the wagering on AI."

I gave him a blank stare, so he continued, "Scientifically presenting races that move from obvious data-based selections to races determined by less predictable random events is the way to go for your sport. Gambling against data machines makes any handicapper toast."

I tilted my head and tried to wrap my mind around his madness, "But there will always be a winner, always be a second place, always a third-place finisher."

"Yes. Look, no system can call every race correctly every time. There will always be variables like human error, horses throwing a shoe, a tiny misstep, or a horse just having a bad day. Gamblers move from math against a machine, where they will lose, to races determined by data that is much less measurable, especially drivers."

He continued, "Using artificial intelligence to design races will make every race more competitive. A race can have

500,000 data points available to predict the results, but no machine has access to a driver's mind, will know if a horse has a tiny blister under his shoe, or when a goose will run onto the track from the infield and spook a horse."

I took another slug of Italian Roast, "What's the point if a gambler can't feel superior when his horse comes in?"

He fired back with questions, "What's the point of playing a game you cannot win? How much fun would it be to sit down and play a game of chess against your computer set to a level where human Grandmasters cannot compete?"

I took another slug and got serious, "This is one of those ideas that sounds good in theory, but I see a dark side. Suppose I own a very nice 3-year-old trotter, one of the best in the state. I have invested a lot of money and time. My horse deserves to win. My horse deserves to crush the field. I don't want a stakes race manipulated to give others an artificial chance to beat me."

He nodded, "Great point, I was thinking about that myself. My first thought is to segregate stakes racing. Maybe all two-and three-year-old racing remains exempt from artificially created races. After all, there is already inherent randomness in a two-year-old trotter or any green horse. They still have small databases."

I picked up the ball, "After stakes racing, horses all have larger databases, and then they shift into your level the field artificial intelligence concept."

"Yes, or maybe a structure where a horse needs to race a dozen times before becoming eligible for AI-generated racing."

I took another sip and said, "The idea of AI-generated races would need to make sense for owners. They carry a lot of the load."

"Of course. The AI constructed races for older horses would need to make financial sense, enough sense that forfeiting their power to choose classifications and drivers would be palatable. Owning a quality horse must remain a real perk. Excellent racehorses will race for vastly improved purses than lower-quality horses and have a chance to win every time they race." Still excited, he almost yelled, "These details can be solved using AI and algorithms."

"Hey! I thought I was at war with artificial intelligence."

"You are, but don't be stupid about it."

Game Of Claims action hot again in second prelim at Pocono

The Game Of Claims Pacing Series barreled right along at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono on Saturday afternoon (Feb. 20), with the second preliminary round for \$25,000- and \$15,000-base-priced horses yielding only two repeat winners, one at each level, but seeing 24 more horses change hands to the tune of \$538,875.

The repeat winner at the higher level, which here went for a \$27,500 base tag in the progressively-priced prelims, was the Changeover gelding Glengarry Knight N, who took one of the seven \$25,000 cuts for his group in 1:54.2 for driver Simon Allard. Trainer Eric Ell and owners Ken Wood, Toby Rekoon, Bill Dittmar Jr., and Steve Iaquina had retained their pacer after the first prelim, but they lost him to a claim here after the front-end triumph.

Trainer Ell also sent out the fastest winner of the day, with the Captaintreacherous ridgling Trente Deo fronting an \$8800 conditioned field in 1:53 for driver Jim Morrill Jr. and owner Bill Emmons.

Before leaving the \$25,000 base-priced brigade, mention should be made of the Mach Three gelding Tullow N, who paid \$69.80 in closing from fifth at the head of the stretch to win in 1:54.1 when the surface was still good for trainer David Russo and owner Marissa Russo. Driving Tullow N was Eric Goodell, who had taken a hiatus from the sport from last March until last Saturday's opening day here, and soon found himself back in Victory Lane.

Among the \$15,000-base prices, going here for a \$17,500 tag before allowances in five \$15,000 divisions, the horse making it two straight was the Delmarvalous gelding Fernando, used hard early by driver Matt Kakaley yet holding firmly late to stop the timer in 1:54.2 for trainer Jennifer Bongiorno and owner Evan Katz. However, they, like the connections of fellow repeater Glengarry Knight N, had retained the pacer last week but now saw their horse depart to a different barn after a claim.

In all, eight of the 12 winners in the Game Of Claims races Saturday changed hands despite the uptick in price – and now comes the drama of whether to put them back in next Saturday in the third prelim, or hope their accumulated point totals have already earned them a spot in their respective \$50,000 and \$30,000 finals on March 6.

The driving Napolitano brothers, Anthony and George Jr., and trainer Dan Maier each had three winners on the Saturday card.

Racing resumes today (Feb. 21) at 5 p.m., with Game Of Claims action for \$10,000 and \$7500 horses; free past performances for the card can be found at <https://www.phha.org/downsmsppps.html>. A makeup card has also been added for Monday at 12:30 p.m.

Play Meadowlands finals in the books

It was one for the chalk players and one for those who like bombs in the two \$17,500 Play Meadowlands Series Finals at The Meadowlands on Friday night (Feb. 19).

In the division for pacing fillies and mares, **Its Mesmerise N** completed a two-race sweep of the event for trainer Darran Cassar and driver Scott Zeron.

Sent to the gate as the 1-5 public choice for a second straight start despite facing a tougher field this time around, Zeron had the 7-year-old daughter of American Ideal–Cullens Charm in the three-hole early before brushing to the top at the half, which was clocked in a quick :54.2.

Windsong Parisian, the 10-1 fourth choice in the 10-horse field, applied pressure to the leader while first-over past the half and three-quarters (1:22.1) and appeared to be done off the turn as they straightened away in the stretch, but she kept on digging all the way to the wire through a slow final quarter of :30.2 to come up a neck short of pulling off an upset. Misty Memory N was third.

"I wish I could have bided my time a little more," said Zeron of moving Its Mesmerise N to the lead. "She raced unbelievably given the pressure and the fractions. When I had to move as early as I did at the half, it was a bit of a concern and the immediate pressure didn't help. [Windsong Parisian] raced well. Both fillies cruised around the last turn and both hung in there down the lane. I think my horse is classier than these horses. I had been racing her from off the pace because she likes a target but had been a victim of being too far back. She showed tonight she can do it any

which way.”

Its Mesmerise N paid \$2.60 to win after completing the mile in 1:52.3 for her 18th lifetime win from 69 starts. She now has earnings of \$117,364.

Longshot lovers got their way in the Play Meadowlands for trotters as driver Steve Smith saved ground with **Take A Wish** from start to finish before bursting through between rivals late to score at 30-1 in 1:55.2.

After racing Take A Wish at the rail in eighth in the 10-horse field in the early going, as the flow developed on the rim, Smith advanced the Dawn Anderson trainee to the four-hole along the inside at the half. Remaining glued to the cones around the far turn, Smith waited until there was room and came with a rush in deep stretch to score the upset by a head and return \$62.40. Life Well Lived closed well on the far outside to get second while third-place finisher Gruden, the 2-1 favorite, failed in a second straight attempt to go wire-to-wire.

Take A Wish, a 6-year-old mare by Wishing Stone—Take A Taste, won for the 12th time from 85 lifetime outings and upped her earnings to \$210,836.

A LITTLE MORE: Handle topped the \$3-million mark again as a total of \$3,080,321 was put in play on a 13-race card conducted over a sloppy track that saw snowy conditions for the first third of the program. Wagering has now surpassed \$3 million on three straight Fridays, and 10 times overall for the 14 cards conducted thus far in 2021... Driver of the Week Dexter Dunn kept on rolling, racking up three winners to up his Big M leading-driver victory tally to 42. He's scored 15 times over the last four programs... What can be done to tackle racism?

There are a couple young drivers at Freehold who have made meteoric progress to get into the bike. How did that happen? Family relationships. A problem is African Americans lack that entry into the game, and that's a key pathway throughout the history of the sport. George and Montrell Teague are examples. Racism is subtle of course, although some find it hard to hide. Subtle? When the judges are looking to fill in drivers. Montrell, a multi-Breeders Crown stakes winning driver, whose dad George's training record speaks for itself, hardly ever gets a call for that open driver's slot. Yogi Sheridan's route was different from mine, I bought a horse to complete my drives. There was one trainer I asked if I could take a qualifier, and he all but said a N**** would never get on a horse of his. A lot goes into a decision to list a driver, but Montrell's lack of drives at the Meadowlands is both astonishing and revealing. At Dover Downs' current meet through Feb. 18, Montrell Teague is fourth in driver standings behind Tetrick, Callahan, and Alan Davis. What can be done, the article asks. For one, there's a significant African American interest in and passion for harness racing in Mississippi. Black drivers and trainers from Mississippi have competitively raced in Indiana and Illinois as trainers and drivers, others have sold racing stock for good money. At Hawthorne last year, I think a race went where there was a black driver or trainer for every horse. If it's a goal to tackle racism, maybe the USTA can start by sponsoring selected fairs in Mississippi, and perhaps linking promising drivers and trainers with mentors in the north. Obviously, these guys have never had access or opportunity like those young drivers at Freehold. And racing judges, take discretion and list accomplished drivers such as Montrell. Who knows? He could likely hit the wire first as his past drives have shown he can.
