From 2014-16, all horse awards including Pacer, Trotter and Horse of the Year were announced by USHWA at 3 p.m. on the day that the voting ended. But in 2014, even announcing everything provided some unforeseen mystery.

During a <u>live broadcast</u> from The Meadowlands, JK She'salady was announced as the winner of Horse of the Year, but as you can hear in the background of the video, the results were immediately questioned.

The mystery surrounded a voting anomaly.

Horse of the Year has been voted on by USHWA since 1947, with Pacer of the Year and Trotter of the Year added in 1970. The American Harness Racing Secretaries also currently get to vote.

Very simply, voters select a Pacer of the Year and a Trotter of the Year, and one of those two becomes their Horse of the Year.

In 2014, Sweet Lou was voted Pacer of the Year over JK She's alady by one vote (74-73), but the anomaly occurred when a greater number of voters that selected JK She's alady for Pacer of the Year also voted for her as their Horse of the Year, thus she won Horse of the Year by five votes (57-52) over Sweet Lou.

It was the first and only time to date that either Pacer of the Year or Trotter of the Year was not voted Horse of the Year.

It took many years for USHWA to agree on naming their annual awards. Billy Haughton's name was suggested, which, with a nod to the Oscars, would have had them referred to as the "Billys." Niatross was also in the mix, as were a few others, but when the voting took place, Dan Patch came out on top.

In 2012, USHWA made it official by adding the branding Dan Patch Awards to their bylaws, while in 2017 they changed back to announcing Trotter of the Year, Pacer of the Year, and Horse of the Year live at the Dan Patch Awards Banquet.



Although some years may be less mysterious than others when it comes to Horse of the Year, if not Pacer and Trotter as well, it's the years when it's not black and white that gets people talking and choosing sides.

Some perfect examples are in 2004, when 3-year-old pacing filly Rainbow Blue took HOY honors (119-98) over Triple Crown winner Windsong's Legacy, or in 2006's anticipated battle of the "Glides," that didn't actually materialize when 3-year-old colt trotter Glidemaster was named Horse of the Year over 3-year-old filly trotter Passionate Glide (119-39).

There are no guarantees that USHWA will stick with this format of announcing Pacer, Trotter, and Horse of the Year live at their banquet, since they've already shown that they don't mind changing things up. Remember, for several years they even announced two candidates for some of their divisional honors.

So, appreciate the mystery while it lasts, and don't forget to check out USHWA's Facebook Page on Sunday night to see the envelopes get opened.

Formalizing a U.S. and Canadian harness racing rivalry

Canada's four-time Driver of the Year James MacDonald on whether establishing a U.S. vs. Canada event like hockey's 4 Nations Face-Off could work in harness racing.

This past Saturday (Feb. 15), essentially what was meant as an exhibition hockey game caught mainstream attention in both the United States and Canada. The 4 Nations Face-Off is designed as an alternative to the traditional NHL all-star tournament. But, a politically charged atmosphere in Montreal carried over into the start of the game where three separate fights were launched in the first nine seconds of the game. The raucous crowd and fans on both sides of the border, mutually appreciated the spirit and national pride shown all around.

It immediately got me thinking. Could a similar dynamic be employed in harness racing? Of course, not from the standpoint of altercations on the track, but from the heated competitive spirit that comes with representing a country. There are harness racing parallels to hockey, where drivers based in the U.S. and Canada already compete against one another throughout the year just as they do in hockey, but how much does nationality come into play?

I posed the topic to driver James MacDonald, who is fresh off a fourth straight Keith Waples Driver of the Year award in Canada, awarded just last week at the O'Brien Awards in Toronto. He also won the World Driving Championship in 2017 representing Canada.

"I don't see it too much as a rivalry between countries, because it's still more individual and not really U.S. versus Canada," said MacDonald. "I think though on the bigger nights you'll have obviously the Canadian drivers cheering here a little more maybe for the other Canadian drivers. I think the same could be said for the American drivers down there when their big nights are on – probably cheering naturally for the guys they're closer with."

I'm sure hockey will look to capitalize on the renewed interest in competition between the two countries, and harness racing is uniquely positioned to do so as well with an idea that could absolutely work.

Likewise, for the most part, MacDonald didn't feel that there's a difference in treatment or an advantage when driving at a home venue versus someplace else.

"Not a lot," said MacDonald. "All these guys like Dexter Dunn, Tim Tetrick, Gingras and the best drivers from the States – they're going to be good wherever they go and race at and the same can be said for the best from Canada like Doug McNair, Jody Jamieson or Louis Roy or many others.

"Now when I was younger, I'd say that I would have felt a lot more pressure driving at The Meadowlands, maybe not knowing the guys a lot back then. But over the last few years as I've gotten to know quite a number of the guys well — both Americans and Canadians — now I can just go about racing at The Meadowlands like I'm racing at Mohawk. But when I was younger and I was lining up behind John Campbell and Ron Pierce... as a younger guy, obviously it's didn't feel like a normal race to me. But nowadays I can line up besides Yannick or David Miller or any of the best American drivers — Timmy or Dex or those guys — and just feel like I'm not so much worried what they're going to do, but more focused on what my own horse needs and how I'm going to drive him accordingly."

That said, MacDonald does see the potential for more direct competition between the two countries.

"I know there's been some talk over the years of trying to do a U.S. and Canada driver challenge – which I think would probably help to amp up the jabs and trash talking," said MacDonald. "We're all human beings and I think in that type of competition you'll seeing Canadians cheering harder for Canadians and Americans cheering harder for Americans. I think you'd see a

lot of hard racing between the two countries, and I really hope that one day they do it. But for right now, it's still more of an individual game and not quite like Team Canada versus Team LISA."

Indeed, as MacDonald notes, a drivers challenge between the U.S. and Canada could be a huge event for galvanizing both the U.S. and Canadian fan bases. It could carry far more interest than what traditional drivers challenges offer, and it would be of certain interest to see how it plays out on the track. I think it would be taken more seriously than most other driving exhibitions.

Through the years there's been some great Canadian-based horses that have come to the U.S. and have won on the biggest stages. Ones that come to mind of course are Bulldog Hanover, Somebeachsomewhere, and San Pail, who won on U.S. soil at The Meadowlands in the Nat Ray before defending home turf later that year back at Woodbine in the Breeders Crown.

If competition were expanded beyond the equine athletes to the human ones, it could be something that quickly gains popularity and in turn, would gain new exposure for the sport. I think there would be real interest in areas surrounding the host tracks, where every year or every two years, the driving competition could rotate between The Meadowlands and Woodbine Mohawk Park.

To what extent prior talk of a potential U.S. and Canada drivers competition may have taken place, there's no better time than now to make one happen. I'm sure hockey will look to

capitalize on the renewed interest in competition between the two countries, and harness racing is uniquely positioned to do so as well with an idea that could absolutely work.

As a sidenote, I would have been remiss while speaking to MacDonald if I didn't ask what his mindset is for the upcoming season. MacDonald is coming off a year where he won at least 400 races at Woodbine Mohawk Park for the third straight year. No other driver has won 400 races at WEG more than twice, ever.

"It's been an unbelievable ride," said MacDonald. "I've been blessed to get to drive some amazing horses, and owners and

trainers to drive for. I'm just going to try and keep the ball rolling. My goal this year is the same as it's been the last few years. Just to show up to the track with a good attitude and try and be consistent and give the horses their best opportunities. And if that translates to 400 wins, or not even close to 400 wins, I can still sleep good at night."

Jacob Rheinheimer's journey from the barn to the frontside to the Dan Patch Awards

This weekend, Indiana's own Jacob Rheinheimer will receive the Lew Barasch Breakthrough Award at the U.S. Harness Writers Association's Dan Patch Awards dinner. I sat down earlier this week to talk to Rheinheimer, who serves as race marketing manager at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing and Casino. We discussed his family's deep connection to harness racing, his grandfather, Larry Rheinheimer, who bred and trained Breeders Crown champion Freaky Feet Pete, and a career at Hoosier Park that began with an internship at the Anderson, IN oval and has grown into so much more.

You grew up in a harness racing family. What are your first memories of the sport?

"For me, it was probably going to the fairs with my grandma and grandpa [Larry and Mary Jo Rheinheimer] during the summer. That was always kind of the highlight of my summer, pretty much living with them during the summer, going to all the fairs. That's probably the first memory I have. That was a big deal for me."

What did you enjoy about the experience?

"I just remember being so excited whenever our horses went to the track. You're sitting there, you're a little kid, you don't understand they are racing for like \$1,500. But you're so excited because you know the work that went into it. And you're like shaking on the fence when they finally go to the track. The excitement when they did well, and then the heartbreak when they didn't do well. So, I was just kind of hooked on that feeling."

Give me the family racing history. Did it start with your grandparents?

"My great-grandfather, Ray Rheinheimer, helped start the pony races in LaGrange. Everyone did the pony racing for a while. My grandfather, my dad [Marty], and my uncle, Matt. And then in the late '90s they made that shift to standardbred racing once Hoosier Park got going. My grandpa had a stable for the rest of his life. And then obviously now Matt and my dad each have their own stables. It's been cool to see Matt go from place to place, whether it was working for Victory Hill Farm or working for Joe Seekman when he had Art Official. They have their own stables and I try to be as involved as I can. I own a couple with my dad. I do miss the barn aspect of it quite a bit, not living as close to them as I was."

What were your aspirations in high school? Was harness racing going to be part of the future?

"I was always kind of a good student and I was pretty much told I was going to go to college. If it were up to me, I would

If harness racing didn't work out, where do you think you would be now?

"If it didn't work out, I was hoping to go into golf or hopefully work for a sports team of some kind. Trying to get into Purdue

would have been a really cool thing too. If I could have gotten into their athletic department. But once I got the internship at Hoosier Park, then I kind of got my foot in the door. And it confirmed that that's the direction I want to go."

You spent the first summer there. Did you ever think this isn't for me?

"That first year, the first Dan Patch I worked was the Lazarus year and all that went into that. And there was a large part of me that thought, 'Holy cow, I'm not cut out for this. I don't have this in me.' But I don't know, Emily saw something in me that first year, I guess, and kind of kept pushing me and kind of took me under her wing. I don't know why. I said maybe three words total that first year as an intern. And my eyes were about this big around. That was my first job outside of the barn. She just latched on to me and kept pushing me. And I started to settle in a little bit and kind of find my path."

You go from the barn to the front side for the summer. What was the experience in seeing racing from a different perspective?

"It definitely helped me learn the handicapping side of it a lot more. Getting to work with the bettors or the regulars who are there every night, and seeing more of that aspect, I just learned the business and the financials of it a little bit more and what actually translates into money for these racetracks. I was always one of those people, I think you see a lot of these people who say, 'The sport just needs marketing and then it will all be fixed.' And then you get in it and you're kind of in the beast a little bit. You realize there's a lot more that goes into this. It's just pretty eye-opening learning how the business actually works. And there's no real quick fix if that's what you're looking for."

Did that lead to interesting conversations with family at home?

"It did. I think it helped the more I was at Hoosier Park, being able to give that perspective. I think it helped them understand why things were the way they were. Not that everyone always agreed on everything. Not that I always agreed on everything. But, yeah, I think giving them that perspective kind of helped them see the big picture a little bit more."

You finish that first summer. Was it a guarantee that you're coming back?

"I knew I wanted to keep my foot in the door as long as I could until something full-time opened up. So that second year for sure. And then I was graduating the next year and

that's when COVID hit and there were no real job opportunities. So, I was lucky that they were having a hard time finding interns. So that third year I came back, the COVID year."

How was that second year different?

"I settled in a little bit more and kind of started to find my voice a little bit. I wasn't afraid to give opinions and try different things. That first year I was just so afraid to screw up. I looked up to Emily so much and I didn't want to make an idiot of myself."

Talk about the highlights of that second year.

"I think that second year was cool because that was [Freaky Feet] Pete's last year on the track, and especially that first half of the year when he was still an open horse. You could tell he wasn't the same horse, but he was still digging in and fighting. Getting to experience that; and everyone would want to talk to me about Pete up front. So, getting to see that experience play out was pretty cool."

I'm glad you brought up Pete. Talk about the 2014, 2015 and 2016 campaigns.

"I worked for my grandfather the summer of Pete's 2-year-old year. So, I could see the start of it. Then I went back to school, and then his 3-year-old year I started working for Matt. I got to see more of the Churita aspect a little up close [Churita raced for seven seasons, retiring a millionaire in 2020]. But it was incredible for our whole family. We had family that hadn't been

that involved in racing that were going to all the races and traveling to all these different places. It was just really cool to see my grandfather have that experience and to have the horse of his lifetime and see how much it meant to him. We were just so incredibly tight at that time. It was a special, special time."

The 2015 season, in particular, turned into the dream season with the Breeders Crown win.

"Yeah, the way it played out, he could have gone to the Meadowlands Pace and North America Cup. And I think he would have done okay. But the way it worked out, staying here in Indiana, and then the goal all year long was to get to the Breeders Crown. And for it to all work out like it did, it just made it all worth it. To beat Wiggle It Jiggleit towards the end of that year, and those two really good races. Like I said, to get to see my grandfather and my dad have that moment, that's something I'll never forget."

The next season was tough. You lose your grandpa to a heart attack the night Freaky Feet Pete raced second in the Hoosier Park Pacing Derby.

"Yeah, it's one of those things, the first half of the year was incredible. Pete became a world champion at Pocono and had those battles with Wiggle It Jiggleit and some of the others. And then Pete started to get a little banged up. The night at Hoosier Park when grandpa passed away, it's one of those things you look back on now, we should all be so lucky to go out like that. The last thing he saw was Freaky Feet Pete going out to the track to warm up. It was hard for the rest of us, but glad that he had

When Emily [Gaskin] called me on Christmas Eve to let me know that I'd won [the Lew Barasch Breakthrough Award], it didn't register. I saw the other two nominees, and I saw the people who have won that award before. It's hard to look at that and not feel like I don't belong. It's a huge honor, and I do really appreciate those who have supported me in this industry and put me in that position because I never expected it. It's beyond my wildest dreams. I'm looking forward to Orlando.

that experience at the end of his life, and made it all kind of worth it. Like I said, a brutal, brutal night for all of us, but when you put it all in perspective, like my dad said, he was talking to Jimmy Takter, who was in the paddock, and hooked up to go to the track, just proud as a peacock and that was it. I'm just glad for him that he had the experience though at the end that he did. We should all be so lucky that the horse you wait your lifetime for is going to be the last thing you see."

You mentioned the Breeders Crown earlier. Talk about the opportunity you've had to be a part of two Breeders Crowns at Hoosier Park.

"I didn't get to work the 2017 edition. I worked 2020 and obviously that was unique with no fans and I didn't get the full Breeders Crown experience. But it was also hard because there was a COVID scare in the race marketing department which left me as the only one there for Breeders Crown elims and finals. So, you're just trying to kind of keep up and hope you're doing everything okay. Then 2023, obviously the full gambit and you got to see it and experience it. Moira Fanning, I have just immense respect for her and all that she does, and John Campbell, probably two of the most respectable people in all of harness racing. So, it's been pretty cool. And just to feel like you're a part of something big, it's one of the coolest experiences I've had."

Emily stepped away last year and you moved into a different role, although you had some familiarity.

"Yeah, it was hard. It felt like big shoes to fill, but then she was also still there. So that helped. I think it helped everyone around to see that she was still guiding me in this position, and it helped me because I had someone to bounce all these things off of. I was used to doing all the admin stuff, doing more and more TV and stepping into a bigger role there. I'm not a trained

broadcaster. I never have been, so I've been just trying to figure that out on the fly. That's been the tricky part of it. Also, just having the confidence to run a department and come up with these different ideas and say, 'This is what we're going to do.' We have a great director of marketing in Jeremy Medley, and his support there has been huge."

Did you aspire to be in front of the camera?

"It's something like I'd always hoped to do someday, and then as I got started as an intern in the admin, I saw how it actually worked and I'm like, 'Man, I don't know if I'm cut out for that.' I think those who know me know I'm not really a big talker. I'm a pretty introverted person and pretty quiet, but I can talk racing and I will talk racing, so that's been a big learning experience.

"Just learning to be a broadcaster, that's been a huge learning curve. But Emily helped there, too, where she's like, 'You know horse racing, talk horse racing.' Bob 'Hollywood' Heyden was a huge help in that too. I did the Dan Patch two years ago because Emily was doing the Fox Sports broadcast. I just got thrown into it. First time I'd handicapped with another person and it's Bob Heyden, who for my money is the best to ever do it. I don't think I put together a coherent sentence the first segment we did together. Finally, I kind of found my footing and Bob looks over at me and says, 'Emily who?' He was so patient and kind with me."

You began to get the repetition last year being on television nightly. How did that feel?

"The repetition was big, and just getting more consistent time and figuring it out. Doing the night drive was a big help. I'm trying to find my voice and my way there. It was just repetition and trusting my horse racing knowledge and trusting my handicapping ability and the rest will kind of follow. And I think it did. Towards the end of last year, I was starting to feel better

and better, especially on the weekends when we were bringing in quests every weekend, whether it be Jenna [Otten], Bob or Emily. I enjoyed that time together as we were able to bounce things off each other."

You have a year under your belt handling television duties and running the department. What's in store for 2025?

"I think from a marketing perspective, I keep telling Jeremy I want to take some swings that we haven't taken in a long time. And I've gotten comfortable enough to. And I feel like I have enough trust with those above me to kind of take some of those swings and do some different things promotionally and for some of our big events. Television-wise, I don't quite know what all that is going to look like right now. I hope it's something similar to what I did last year."

Any hints on the big swings we might see?


"When you're looking at promotions and big events, is it going to be a driver or is it going to be a perk for people who would be there anyway? We're trying to do some things that are going to be drivers where we're looking at a \$10,000 Dan Patch promotion or giving away a \$5,000 megabet on Kentucky Derby Day or something like that. Just some bigger swings that we feel like we're going to be able to promote. People would say, 'Oh hey, I have a chance at \$10,000, maybe I want to check that out.' We are trying to do some more drivers as opposed to just perks."



Handicappers, the most important morning line is yours

On just about every pari-mutuel racing program, the patron will find the morning line, which is one person's opinion — or maybe, in this day and age, one computer's opinion — of the anticipated winner of a race.

As a handicapper and morning-line maker, I have seen morning lines from countless tracks and have found that the most important morning line is yours, and a complete handicapper will make their own independent line and, quite possibly, take advantage of ones shown in the program.

Since my first handicapping gig 50 years ago — Balmoral Park — I have been fortunate to rub shoulders with many of the best handicappers in the harness racing industry, from Mike Paradise and Johnny Brokopp in Chicagoland to Jay Bergman and Derick Giwner out east to Garnet Barnsdale and Gil Winston and many others too numerous to mention.

I, myself, besides Balmoral Park, have done seminars at The Meadowlands, Teletrack and, of course, my beloved Pompano Park, doing track night broadcasts with Gabe Prewitt for many years.

Yes, I have had to put some "chalk" on top, but I have also been proud to have had 50-1 shots on top, a 40-1 single in a Pick-4, an exact Hi-5 with a 10-1 shot on top in the program, among countless others.

My motto, hanging on my wall, reads "Hardly a man is now alive, who paid his mortgage at 3-5."

That has given me a perspective (in line, I am sure, with the aforementioned others mentioned) that has afforded all of us to sift our way through all of the information listed on a racing program and, sometimes, find a 20-1 or more diamonds among the many, many 7-5 grains of sand.

That is exactly what the handicappers try - and succeed - to do for you.

Still, for the very ambitious, you can try and find your own diamond by constructing your very own morning line.

The Pompano morning line and the handicapping picks in the program were my passion.

I believe there is a bit of a misconception about the morning line, where people think that it shows the makers opinion of what horse that one single person thinks has the best chance of winning.

My belief is that the morning line should show just who the public thinks will win and, therefore, will take the action and be the tote-board favorite.

That's where the focus shifts from where the conglomerate of bettors believe the betting dollars to flow to your worthy opinion on the "tracer" or "potter" that will get you to the cashier's window.

Being a stickler about an accurate morning line, each line should land right at the point of the track's "magic" number, meaning that the odds posted in the program are, indeed, viable and possible to see on a tote board.

What does that mean?

If a track's takeout on win wagering is, for example, 19 per cent, that track's magic number is 123, meaning if you take 19 per cent away from the number 123, the remaining result is 99.63.

That number should never be over 100 because the track will pay only the net pool available for the bettors after their takeout. A minus pool could cause the payout to be over 100 per cent, but that is extremely rare.

Over the years, I have seen many morning lines haphazardly thrown together without regard to whether the listed line is even remotely possible on a tote board with some lines as low as 70 and some as high as 180 — the normal being in the 120-124 range.

In these eyes, this is still a spectator sport and the novices may still need a hint to gain some familiarity with wagering procedures.

One night at The Pomp, I was challenged by a gent asking about my handicapping selections and my morning line, which seemed miles apart.

I had made one horse 5-2 in the morning line and the horse I selected was listed at 12.

At post time, the M/L favorite was 9-5 with my selection 9-1, a bit lower than my line, probably because a few of the punters took my program advice.

This is exactly why, if one has the task of both the morning line and the handicapping, always do the morning line first before handicapping so odds do not have any influence on your selection and have every one of your selections 2-1 or 5-2.

Your own morning line can prove to be a huge advantage as far as replays are concerned as I don't think a computerized morning line has looked at any replays. Of course, another advantage for bettors is visual inspection of a horse on the track during a post parade — a big advantage.

I look for a shiny coat, smooth gait and wiggly ears as signs that the horses get great care and are aware of surroundings and task ahead. I have seen some with droopy ears that look like they don't have oomph in their step during the post parade. So, let's get to work.

To make your own perfect morning line, you need only two things — the takeout on win wagering at your track and the number of horses in a race — that's it.

Magic numbers can be as high as 129 (a 22 per cent takeout) or as low as 118 (a 15 per cent takeout).

To get to your magic number, the following values (without fractions) are assigned to horses in the following manner: 20-1 = 4 points, 15-1 = 6, 12-1 = 7, 10-1 = 9, 8-1 = 11, 6-1 = 14, 5-1 = 16, 9-2 = 18, 4-1 = 20, 7-2 = 22, 3-1 = 25, 5-2 = 28, 2-1 = 33, 9-5 = 35, 8-5 = 38, 3-2 = 40, 7-5 = 42, 6-5 = 45, 1-1 = 50, 4-5 = 55.

By the way, you get to those numbers in the following manner — as an example 3-1, gets 25 points as 3 plus 1 = 4 and 100 divided by 4 = 25.

The chart above takes care of that for you.

Because of the fractional value of many odds, i.e., 9-2 = 18.18 points or 15-1 = 6.25, bring your (example) 123 morning line down to 121 and the fractional values will bring it up close to the 123 and the net pool pay of 100.

Finally, FYI, to begin your more profitable handicapping strategy, the following states have a morning line magic number of 122 — Ohio, New York (harness), Kentucky, Delaware, Maine, and Indiana. States with a magic number of 120 are New Jersey, Minnesota, Illinois, Maryland (tracks with a handle of \$600,000) and Pennsylvania. In Maryland, if the handle at a track is under

\$600,000, the magic number is 124. In California, the morning line magic number is 118 and, in Canada, the number is 120.

Handicapping and making your own morning line is great therapy and the rewards just might be an exhilarating experience, especially on your way to the cashier to collect your ticket on a 15-1 shot.

Hawthorne meeting ends, but the future of Illinois racing is still in limbo

The Hawthorne Racecourse harness meeting that left the starting gate on Oct. 9 will cross the finish line on Sunday night (Feb. 23).

Racing has been limited to weekends and Sunday will be the 48th night. One program was canceled by mutual agreement of track management and the Illinois Harness Horsemen's Association (IHHA) because of bad weather and Saturday night's program was cancelled because of a shortage of entrants.

Five of the races that would have been held Saturday were added to Sunday's card, making the finale a 13-race program.

Except for this past week when the temperature turned bitterly cold following the most significant snowfall of the season, the weather conditions have been favorable throughout the meeting.

Hawthorne's perennial leading driver Casey Leonard, who is adding another

title to his collection, gave high marks to the racing surface.

"The track crew has done an outstanding job," he said. "That was one bright spot of this winter meet.

"The stakes program was pretty strong but the overnight program struggled mightily."

ITHA executive director Tony Somone said of the meeting, "I wouldn't categorize it as anything special. We're hanging in there — same old thing."

Next month, the thoroughbreds will take the reins at the once-flourishing Chicago metropolitan area's only remaining racetrack and the harness horses won't be back until Nov. 7 for a meeting that is scheduled to run through Dec. 30 but probably will be extended into the following year as it was this year.

Except for the mini-meetings that will total approximately eight programs during the State Fairs at Springfield and

DuQuoin in August and September, no pari-mutuel betting on Illinois harness racing is in the offing for more than eight months.

However, the non-betting summer races at Springfield and DuQuoin funded by the Hawthorne purse account that were held in 2023 and 2024 are expected to resume in June, following the same twice weekly format.

The possibility of conducting pari-mutuel betting on these races came up at last fall's Illinois Racing Board dates hearings. Hawthorne's general manager John Walsh said he discussed the possibility of leasing the Fairgrounds from the Department of Agriculture last year but was told it wasn't feasible because of other activities scheduled at the track.

"If there's some way, we're for that," Walsh told the board, looking ahead to this year.

Speaking for the IHHA, Somone said, "I hope so. I'd say maybe. We are trying, but it's not easy to pull that off. If it was up to us, we'd do it but there are other people involved."

Last year the county fairs proved to be an integral component in keeping the struggling sport on its feet financially.

Leonard said he drove at the fairs for the first time "in about 15 years" and he intends to return to the circuit this summer.

Anything at this point would be great. [A new track in Decatur] would be a very nice addition, but it would not fix our problem. Decatur cannot support a 10-month schedule. "It's kind of a different path than we normally take but it shows where we're at [economically in Illinois]," Leonard said.

This wasn't the scenario that was anticipated when the Illinois legislature passed a gambling expansion bill in 2019 that permitted the state's racetracks to add casino gambling — with a significant portion of the revenue earmarked for purses — and gave the green light for the construction of a harness track/casino in any one of seven townships on suburban Chicago's far South Side.

But both thoroughbred and harness racing were thrown into disarray when corporate owner Churchill Downs, Inc. (CDI) sold its world-renowned, architecturally-magnificent and traditionrich thoroughbred track Arlington International Racecourse to the Chicago Bears of the NFL with the stipulation that there be no gambling of any kind on the property.

The obvious reason was to wipe out casino and pari-mutuel gambling competition for Rivers Casino, the state's most profitable casino which CDI acquired in 2018 and is located less than a half-hour drive from the opulent racetrack that the Bears have destroyed to reduce their property taxes.

Compounding the problems created by Hawthorne's thoroughbred/harness time-share arrangement, Hawthorne has been unable to follow through on its proposal to incorporate a \$400 million casino into its racing facility.

Large portions of the grandstand and clubhouse were demolished in 2020 as the first phase of the project but five years later instead of a showcase racino there is only rubble.

And now much higher than anticipated construction costs appear to be inevitable as a consequence of President Donald Trump's proposed tariffs.

After assuring the Illinois Racing Board every previous year that the rubble was going to be cleared and construction was forthcoming Hawthorne president Tim Carey last fall introduced Edward Winkofsky as the track's regulatory counsel on financing and development of property, a newly-created

position. Winkofsky cited "significant progress" but said a confidentiality agreement stipulates that information henceforth could only be shared privately with the Racing Board and Illinois Gaming Board.

"Nothing," said Somone when asked if the IHHA had been briefed on any further developments. "It has been incredibly quiet. It's just so frustrating.

"Not only horsemen are suffering but also people in all of the other ancillary jobs that are reliant on the industry going forward. Right now, everybody is in limbo."

Meanwhile, a bill has surfaced at the spring session of the Illinois legislature that would allow a harness track/casino to be constructed on a 200-acre parcel of vacant land in Decatur, a city of 67,917 residents in downstate Macon County. Decatur is 200 miles south of Chicago; 49 miles west of Champaign-Urbana, where the University of Illinois is located; and 40 miles east of Springfield, the state capital.

Virginia-based Revolutionary Racing has pledged to invest \$150 million in the proposed racino and hopes to have it open in the fall of 2026.

According to Somone, "They're working on it and we're supporting it. We need a place to race and we also need a Chicago metropolitan area racetrack."

Leonard is of the same mind.

"Anything at this point would be great," said the state's foremost driver. "It would be a very nice addition, but it would not fix our problem. Decatur cannot support a 10-month schedule.

Brittany Baker is finding success with a 'horse first, you second' attitude

It was rather appropriate that Doin The Most delivered Brittany Baker her first official training win.

The evening of July 13, 2019, at Hoosier Park, held great promise for the young horsewoman from Urbana, OH, who was heartened by the hope of what could be in store later in the card.

Her nervousness heightened throughout the first five races as she counted down the minutes to Doin The Most, then a 2-year-old, would take on seven rivals in the sixth race, a pace with a \$6,500 purse.

Baker exhaled as she watched driver Trace Tetrick point Doin The Most, the 7-5 choice, towards the starter car and third post position on the gate.

Fourth after an opening quarter in :28.2 and a half reached in :59.2, Tetrick then gave the son of Bigrisk—The Big Daisy his

cue and the bay responded with an impressive burst to take command. Three-plus lengths on top after three quarters, the duo braced for the sounds of their pursuers' hooves closing in.

Standing on a deck reserved for horsepeople, Baker had a frontrow seat for the drive to the wire.

"I get so nervous watching my horses race," Baker said. "I like to go to the races by myself a lot of the time, just because I am so nervous. I'm pretty sure I put a hole in that deck because I was stomping my foot up and down. I was just so excited. I had owned and trained a couple of claimers, but this one was different.

"I named him myself. It's a funny story. My boyfriend, Logan, tells me that it is me... that I am the one always trying to do the most."

Baker certainly achieved that with Doin The Most, putting in long hours and maintaining a patient, encouraging hand with the pacer.

All the perseverance paid off that night at Hoosier Park, which came one race after a debut second over the half-mile oval in Wellston, OH.

"I cried," she said. "This was a horse I picked out as a yearling. I had a partner, and we bought him for \$3,000 out of the sale in Ohio. No one really wanted him. He was already gelded and everyone just kept on passing him by. My boyfriend and I were told that if we got him in the right spot, he would be good. It took him a little bit of time to come around, but when we got him going, everything worked out perfectly. It was nice that he was the one who gave me my first training win."

Doin The Most would make five more starts for Baker before

moving on to other connections.

In his final race under her tutelage, on Aug. 23, 2019, he added another win in the Buckeye State, the victory coming in Lima.

"I raced him six times," Baker said. "He won three starts, was second twice and had one third. He went into a sale, and I told my partner that if he goes for anything less than \$12,000, I am going to buy him back. The people who bred the horse offered to buy him back with me or buy my partner out, but he was already in the sale.

"He ended up bringing in around \$20,000. At the time, I had to let him go — I understood the business — but I was sad to see him move on."

That Baker made it to the training ranks and recorded that first win was



somewhat of a longshot considering there was a time, not so long ago, when a career in horse racing wasn't on her radar.

But that slowly changed. It was not, however, an overnight thing.

"I was born into racing," she said. "My whole family does it. I am fourth generation on my dad's side and third on my mother's side. When I was young, my parents had a stable of their own, and they also managed a rehab center where the racehorses would go. People think I'm crazy, but when I was around 3 or 4, I remember swimming horses, making sure they went on the Equi-Ciser, rubbed legs, and made sure they were turned out. I am grateful to have learned the rehab aspect of racehorses."

Baker is just as thankful that she took time to figure out that harness racing was for her.

It was, of all places, the classroom that educated her on what the future held.

"Growing up, I didn't have any desire to make horse racing a career," Baker said. "I went to the barn every weekend and sometimes before school, but it wasn't something I looked at as a career. When you are younger, you want to have a balance between what you do and having time to yourself. I knew, from my mother, that it was anything but a 9-5 job.

"In high school, I would leave and go to the racetrack to catchpaddock and help. I went to college for two years to be a preschool teacher. After that, I came back and said, 'Horses.' I went to school in Florida, went to classes in the afternoon and night, and worked in a baby barn during the day. I think that is what that experience did, to help show me that horses and racing are what I love to do."

There is no denying that.

Despite the demands, the disappointments, and daily grind, Baker finds unmatched joy in the barn and at the racetrack.

After a career-best 2024 campaign, she's aiming even higher this year.

"Every year, I set a goal for wins," Baker said. "In 2023, I was one away from reaching my goal of 20. Last year, I set my goal for 25 wins, and I ended up surpassing it by two. So, this year, I wanted to set the goal a little higher. I landed on wanting to get 35 wins. I don't go by purse earnings, but I race cheaper horses, who I own myself. Hopefully, I can attain that number this year."

Down the road, Baker would like to transition her operation into one geared towards younger stock.

"Eventually, I would like to flip over into a younger horse barn," she said. "But I feel I still have a lot to learn and to understand the babies first. I would think around 10 babies and two racehorses of my own would be ideal. Right now, we have 13 horses, and all but one is racing."

During the colder months, Baker doesn't stray far from the shedrow and stalls. When the temperatures rise, she makes time to enjoy the outdoor life.

"I like to be at the barn all day long," she said. "When the opportunity does arise — it's cold now, so I just enjoy spending time with my horses — my boyfriend and I, we have two dogs, so we like to take the young one hiking. We like to walk trails and enjoy nature."

Even in those idyllic, sun-soaked moments, horses are never far from her thoughts. In fact, they are often the main topic of conversation.

"Some people don't bring the barn home with them, but we do," she said. "When my boyfriend and I go for walks, it's a good time to reevaluate outside of the barn and go through things together."

It is that support that spurs Baker on.

"I am still a smaller stable, but I would not be able to function without my little sister, Brianna, who lives with me," Brittany said. "She comes to the barn in the mornings and when we race, she finds time to get her schoolwork done and help me. She has a retired racehorse who she rides and just adores. I am usually optimistic, but on the days when I am feeling down or questioning anything, my boyfriend keeps me grounded and always encourages me.

"They are a big part of what I do."

As are many others, including her mother and stepfather.

"My mom puts her whole heart into each horse," Brittany said. "My mom and my stepdad have always had a small stable, around four of their own. My mom would just spend hours and hours taking care of the horses and of us. She would be up early in the morning at the barn, come back home, make sure we would get to school, and head right back to the barn. She would be there all day. That love of the horse – I got that from my mom, and it is something I am grateful for.

"My stepfather, who is from New Zealand, has taught me a lot about horsemanship. I learned a lot of things about how they do things there. I probably bother him so much, but he is great to me. My mom and my stepfather have instilled in me an approach of, 'horse first and you second'. But sometimes that will bite me in the butt."

Even when it does, Brittany has no regrets about the life and career she chose, where doing the most helps her navigate the unpredictability of horse racing.

"In this business, there is a lot of luck involved," she said. "I have gone for two months without a win, and I have also won three in a week. All you can do is work hard, take care of your horses, put them in the best situation, and hopefully, everything turns out as you hope it does."







Team Abrivard stole the show in the Criterium des Jeunes in Paris

Alexandre Abrivard sat behind his father Laurent-Claude's 3-year-old **Maitre Jacques** (Rolling d'Heripre) when the \$200,000 Criterium des Jeunes was held at Vincennes on Sunday (Feb. 16) afternoon and when the duo hit the lead with two kilometers to go, the rest of the journey became more like a training pass for the talented trotter.

Maitre Jacques claimed his fourth win in six attempts and he more or less played with his opponents in Sunday's race, after being allowed to race in front at a pretty moderate pace during the race's first half.

Alexandre made it difficult for the challengers as he let Maitre Jacques race on in a sharper pace from the uphill part of the track, all the way to the wire, which Maitre Jacques hit in a mile rate of 1:59 over 1.6 miles.

Mille Etoiles finished second, favorite Mack de Blary third.

TITLE DEFENDER IN PRIX DE PARIS?

The third and last Grand Prix-race during the French winter meeting in Paris is scheduled for Sunday (Feb. 23) and as usual,

the series ends with the \$400,000 Prix de Paris over 4,150 meters.

Two laps as Vincennes' great track requires strength, speed and great conditioning from the horses competing and last year's winner, Hussard du Landret will, as it looked on Wednesday night, be the favorite to win in 2025. Hussard du Landret had a world record-performance — a mile rate of 1:55.3 over 4,150 meters — in last year's edition of the Prix de Paris, and a mile rate close to that world record will probably be required on Sunday.

As of Wednesday night (Feb. 19), 14 horses were still in the race and some of the winter meeting's most merited trotters will try to capture the trophy.

Jackpot Hi-5 mandatory payout scheduled for Saturday at Woodbine Mohawk Park

International craze, who was the first 2:00 trotter in Butler Fair history this past summer after going exactly 2:00, is co-owned by trainer/driver Schadel and his wife Christine along with Rick and Regina Beinhauer.

Pocono has racing scheduled for this Saturday and Monday, the 22nd and 24th, at 1 p.m. The Saturday card will find the Game Of Claims Series for pacers valued at \$25,000 race the first of their three preliminaries, eight divisions strong, after losing the original initial leg to the cancellation this past Saturday; these horses will race three \$17,000 preliminaries, trying to earn their way into the \$35,000 Championship, now slated for Saturday (March 15). She was third in a Jugette heat and Matron Stakes elimination and final.

"When shopping for broodmares, I really like to see mares from strong families with stakes-winning performance and this mare checked all the right boxes," said Joe Thomson, Winbak Farm owner. "I also liked that she had already produced nice performers from limited opportunities."

Bartlett, Burke sweep Big M features

Driver Jason Bartlett has been killing it all year long on Saturday nights at The Meadowlands. Trainer Ron Burke has been killing it just about every night for years now at The Meadowlands.

The duo combined to take both the feature and second feature on the Saturday (Feb. 15) program, as Bartlett guided five winners on the card and Burke schooled three to victory lane to lead their respective colonies.

Southwind Coors took the feature, a \$22,000 high-end conditioned trot, while **Dixie Dream** won the next best race of the night, a \$16,000 TrackMaster 85 pace for fillies and mares.

Despite going off at odds of even-money, Southwind Coors was an upset winner, defeating 3-5 favorite Antognoni S, who was seeking his third win in as many starts since his arrival from Sweden about a month ago. Both horses reside in Burke's barn.

The 5-year-old gelded son of Walner—Southwind Cabaret sat a pocket trip behind the favorite, slid off the rail as he eased into the stretch off the far turn, and blew right by that foe on the way to a convincing 51/4-length romp in 1:54.1. Antognoni S held second over Outside The Fire.

Southwind Coors returned \$4.20 after registering his 13th career win in 49 tries. His earnings are now just over \$350,000.

Bartlett was content with how things went in the early stages.

"I heard Dave [Miller, driving Antognoni S] behind me [at the quarter], so I figured he'd be the last one to the front," said

Bartlett. "I figured be on the lead or sit behind Dave. I knew I had a good chance but Dave's horse has been pretty unstoppable of late. [Southwind Coors] was a really good horse as a 2- and 3-year-old. He's got some back class to him."

Dixie Dream used a lot of grit and determination to win her dash, as she vacated the rail heading to three-quarters to take on leader Tony's Mom.

"I gave her a shot," said Bartlett. "She did it the hard way."

A 5-year-old daughter of Always A Virgin—Yes We Did, Dixie Dream wore down Tony's Mom while traveling first-over, then had to have one final surge to hold off a late-rallying-along-the-inside Shesnoaprilfool IR by a neck. Tony's Mom hung on for third.

Dixie Dream paid \$7 to win as the lukewarm 5-2 favorite, and completed the mile in 1:53.2 to win for the 10th time from 59 lifetime outings. Her earnings now stand at a little more than \$150,000.
