McWicked rules the continent, voted U.S. Horse of the Year

Three weeks after winning Canada's Horse of the Year award, McWicked has been voted the U.S. Horse of the Year and Pacer of the Year for 2018. Older pacing mare Shartin N was second in the Horse of the Year balloting. Hambletonian winner Atlanta was voted Trotter of the Year.

McWicked (Brian Sears, winning in 1:46.2 at Red Mile) has been voted the Horse of the Year in the U.S. and Canada.

McWicked on Sunday became the oldest pacer in history to be named Horse of the Year, receiving harness racing's top honor to cap the U.S. Harness Writers Association's Dan Patch Award banquet at Rosen Shingle Creek. The 7-year-old stallion bested pacing mare Shartin N, 86-27, to claim the trophy. Atlanta, who was named Trotter of the Year, finished third with eight votes.

Earlier in the night, retired pacer Foiled Again entered the banquet hall to receive accept his Stan Bergstein Proximity Award in person.

In other awards, McWicked was named Pacer of the Year, 95-31, over Shartin N. McWicked was also voted Canada's Horse of the Year and Older Pacer of the Year earlier this month at the O'Brien Awards.

McWicked and trainer Casie Coleman.

McWicked is owned by Ed James' SSG Stables and trained by Casie Coleman. Brian Sears was McWicked's primary driver, but David Miller also won on the Grand Circuit with the stallion. A son of McArdle out of Western Sahara, McWicked was bred by Andray Farm.

"Winning double (Horse of the Year titles) with him — and to do it with a horse that's seven, turning eight now, it's not often that happens," Coleman said. "Now we've just got to hope that he can do it again this year. He's another year older, but I see no reason why he can't be just as good this

year."

McWicked led the sport in earnings last year, with \$1.57 million, and became the oldest horse in 43 years to top the money standings. For the season, McWicked won 12 of 19 races, capping his campaign with a five-race win streak, and hit the board a total of 17 times.

The previous oldest pacer to be named Horse of the Year was Good Time, who was 6 when he received the award in 1952.



Coleman has trained three Horse of the Year winners in Canada, but McWicked was her first in the U.S., as well as the first for owner James. Sears, who drove McWicked in 12 of his 19 races, has sat behind four Horse of the Year honorees.

"Casie is a good trainer, good personality. She knows what she's talking about and is as smart as anybody I've met at that level," said James who has owned horses for some 60 years.

McWicked's victories last season included the Breeders Crown, Ben Franklin Pace, William R. Haughton Memorial, Canadian Pacing Derby, TVG Series Open championship, Dan Rooney Invitational, and Allerage Farms Open. His 1:46.2 clocking in the Allerage was the second-fastest race mile in

history.

"When he won the Canadian Pacing Derby, he just dominated Lazarus, who was all the talk at the time," Coleman said. "They way he did that, I said, 'We're going to end this year really good.' Every single tie this horse went on the track he didn't get tired. I don't know how many first-over miles he had. It seemed like he was always first-over and it didn't matter. He'd just keep grinding and grinding and put them away."

Atlanta became the first filly to win the Hambletonian since 1996 when she captured the \$1 million final Aug. 4 at the Meadowlands. Driven by Scott Zeron, she won eight of 14 races last year and led all 3-year-old filly trotters with \$1.01 million in purses. Her victories also included the Kentucky Filly Futurity and Empire Breeders Classic.

A daughter of Chapter Seven out of Hemi Blue Chip, Atlanta was owned in 2018 by trainer Rick Zeron, Michelle and Al Crawford's Crawford Farms, William Holland's Holland Racing Stable, Howard Taylor, and Brad Grant. She was bred by Order By Stable. The horse sold recently for a record \$1.55 million to a group led by Michelle Crawford.

"I feel like (Atlanta) is the belle of the ball, like I was the belle of the ball," Michelle Crawford said, laughing. "It was awesome. It was a huge surprise."

"She should be Trotter of the Year," Michelle said. "She did something that was unprecedented. Not a lot of fillies have done what she's done."

The announcements of Horse, Pacer, and Trotter of the Year were made during Sunday's banquet. Previously announced divisional champions also were honored at the event.

Division-winning pacers were 2-year-old colt Captain Crunch, 2-year-old filly Warrawee Ubeaut, 3-year-old gelding Dorsoduro Hanover, 3-year-old filly Kissin In The Sand, Shartin N, and McWicked. Division-winning trotters were 2-year-old colt Gimpanzee, 2-year-old filly Woodside Charm, 3-year-old colt Six Pack, 6-year-old gelding Homicide Hunter, 4-year-old mare Ariana G, and Atlanta.

Other honorees included Driver of the Year **Aaron Merriman**, Trainer of the Year **Ron Burke**, Breeder of the Year **Order By Stable**, Owners of the Year **Burke Racing and the partnership of Mark Weaver and Mike Bruscemi**, and Rising
Star **Marcus Melander**.

Also recognized were the members of the 2018 Hall of Fame class, which will be inducted in July: **Blair Burgess, Ted Gewertz, Joe Holloway, Jerry Silverman, Linda Toscano**, and **Ted Wing**, as well as Communicators Hall of Famers **Dave Little** and **Mark Hall**.

McWicked gives Sears his fourth Horse of the Year

When McWicked was announced as Horse of the Year Sunday night at the Dan Patch Awards, his driver, Brian Sears, joined select company by nailing down his fourth Horse of the Year title and first since Sears was elected to the Hall of Fame. McWicked, at age 7, is the oldest pacer to be voted Horse of the Year.

Sears was also the driver for:

- 2005 HOY Rocknroll Hanover (\$2,223,257 the third highest single season total to that point for a pacer).
- 2009 HOY Muscle Hill (12 12-0-0, \$2.456,041 the richest single-season ever trotter or pacer).
 - 2013 HOY Bee A Magician (17 17-0-0 the first and only

female trotter to surpass \$1.5 million in a season).

All four of Sears' Horse of the Year were record-setting superstars.

The year prior to Rocknroll Hanover winning the 2005 Horse of the Year, he became the first ever sub-1:50 winning freshman taking the Metro in 1:49.4. Sears' first two million-dollar wins came with Rocknroll Hanover — the \$1,215,000 North America Cup and the \$1 million Meadowlands Pace (NOTE: The Metro was \$930,000 U.S. funds). This was also trainer Brett Pelling's first HOY, in his final season in North America until re-emerging two years back. Rocknroll Hanover was a first-crop HOY out of Western Ideal and Rocknroll Hanover sired a first-crop HOY in Rock n Roll Heaven 2010...

In 2009, Muscle Hill won his final 20 career starts and is the all-time record holder in earnings per start. He is the fastest ever Hambletonian winner at 1:50.1, doing so the same day that Lucky Jim — the HOY runnerup — also trotted in 1:50.1. Muscle Hill was a two-time Breeders Crown winner-and his two fastest wins came in his two Triple Crown races (the Hambletonian and his 1:51.1 mile in the Kentucky Futurity).

In 2013, Bee A Magician made Sears the first ever driver to have a pair of undefeated Horses of the Year when the super daughter of Kadabra went 17-for-17 and edged past Moni Maker's female single season earning mark of \$1.494 million while winning the Moni Maker. Nifty Norman trained, which means Sears now has two HOY titles for trainers from Down Under.



In 2018, Sears pulled off the rare driving double having recorded the fastest trot and pace of the year -1:46.2 with McWicked and 1:48.4 with Homicide Hunter. McWicked was a division winner prior in 2013-at age 3, when he decisioned Always B Miki and banked \$1.4 million plus. That total was surpassed again in 2018, making McWicked the only Horse of the Year ever to have had two \$1.4 million or better seasons at the time of being named Horse of the Year (NOTE: Moni Maker and Nihilator fell a bit short).

One final note on Brian Sears: His career money total as a driver entering 2004 was \$24,016,011. His 2004-2005 total in just those two seasons, was \$25,114,292, on the strength of his first two seasons of \$10 million or better. (2004 - \$10,028,306 and 2005 - \$15,085,992 (his first money title)).

Trainer Casie Coleman celebrates her very first U.S. HOY with McWicked. He finished 2/5ths off the world race record, making McWicked the second fastest HOY. Always B Miki was the 2016 winner with a 1:46 mark.

The first driver to notch four Horse of the Year titles was Frank Ervin, who won the 1949 and 1953 titles with Good Time and the 1964, 1965 and 1966 HOY crowns with Bret Hanover.

The first driver to notch four HOY titles with four different horses was Stanley Dancer with: Su Mac Lad (1962), Nevele Pride (1967, 1968 and 1969), Albatross (1971, 1972) and Keystone Ore (1976).

Shartin N tops the t-breds

Down Under stars

It's quite an honor to win a Dan Patch award, especially when something has not been done in a half-century. Shartin N is the first Down Under Dan Patch winner since Cardigan Bay in 1968. She was the first ever Down Under pacing mare to bankroll 7 figures in a season. He was the first to reach a \$1 million anywhere. Which leads to the question: who was the first to a half-million?

That would be Bye Bye Byrd. The 5-year-old stallion, in mid-November 1960, won a mile and a half test at Yonkers to improve to \$504,846 and tip past half-a-million for the very first time in standardbred history. It was a six-horse field, the time was 3:07.2 over the off going and second was 20-1 Culver Pick. This was the first try past 1 1/4 miles for the 1959 HOY, whose victory came in the Good Time Pace, named for the 1949 and 1952 HOY. The margin was two lengths, it was a Thursday Night, well over 12,000 witnessed live for owner Rex Larkin and trainer/driver Clint Hodgins (original trainer Don Taylor). He paid \$3.10 to win. Bye Bye Byrds' year finished up at 25 11-7-2 \$200,112.

Some Horse of the Year notes through the years

In 1970, Albatross, a \$7,000 yearling and not yet the two-time Horse of the Year he'd become in 1971-1972, gave a look-see into the future winning his division 203-1 in the voting as a freshman.

In 1976, the "Keystone Combo" of Keystone Ore and Keystone Pioneer went 1-2 in the HOY balloting. Lost in that year's ballot with eight votes was Green Speed, the 1977 overwhelming choice for HOY.

Just 26.5 per cent of the vote was all that was required in 1975, when the closest vote occurred with 52 going to Savoir and 49 for the filly Silk Stockings. Fifteen different horses received ballots (one off the record) as 196 voters cast their ballots.

Young Quinn got four votes in 1975 and two more in 1976 for HOY — far off the winners, of course, but still recognizing the Down Under talents of the special import.

Billy Haughton twice won the HOY and was well past 50 both times (1977-54; 1985-62).

Cam Fella's two-year total for votes was 347 in 1982 and 1983 — the last pacer to go back to back in the HOY. He won over Genghis Khan 164-48 in 1982 and then over Triple Crown winner Ralph Hanover in 1983, 183-90.

McWicked won HOY this year at age 7. How did Rambling Willie do in the HOY balloting at the same age? In 1977, Rambling Willie was third with 28 votes, far off the top pair Green Speed 117 and Governor Skipper 78.

Eight divisions in 2018 were decided by over 100 votes, which is amazing when you consider only 136 ballots were returned.

In the 1974 Horse of the Year ballot, 16 got at least one vote for first, which is a record. For the only time, the winner received fewer than 25 per cent of the tally — 24.7 per cent was enough for Delmonica Hanover (5-for-17 on the season) to take home the prize. She won it 48-32 over Armbro Nesbit. Also unusual that year was the fact that Handle With Care lost the 3-year-old category to Armbro Omaha 98-71, but then got 8 more votes than he did in the HOY final count 30-22. Bonefish got a single vote, tying him for 14th the year prior to his winning the Hambletonian.

Hall's Pedigree Matching service Balazsi's secret weapon

A few years after he started using Norman Hall's Pedigree Matching service, Stefan Balazsi's Order By Stable is the Dan Patch Breeder of the Year thanks to producing both Atlanta and Gimpanzee.

Sunday evening at the Dan Patch Awards, the Order By Stable will be formally recognized as 2018 Breeder of the Year. Stefan Balazsi's success with producing trotters on a boutique scale was headlined by Atlanta (3, 1:50.3s; \$1,140,689) — the Hambletonian winner and Dan Patch Trotter of the Year and Three-year-old Trotting Filly of the year — as well as Gimpanzee (2, 1:54.3s; \$591,358), who was a standout among last season's two-year-old male trotters thanks to an undefeated season that included dominating the New York Sire Stakes, Breeders Crown, and divisional end-of-year balloting.

Balazsi's rise to success on this continent has been particularly remarkable given the small number of Order By Stable-breds: They totalled just 30 all-age North American starters last year, yet 19 were winners and the group earned a collective \$2.47 million in 2018. Call it a royal flush for the self-described "full-time poker player and entrepreneur," who has been breeding standardbreds since 2001.

Norman Hall believes the results are rare for a small breeder, unless that breeder taps into statistical analysis on the production of champion racehorses. The Prince Edward Island breeding expert is known for his **Pedigree Matching site**, where he provides a commercial service advising on yearlings, stallions, and broodmares. He attended the Dan Patch Awards banquet in Orlando, FL, to celebrate his client's outstanding year. Horse of the Year McWicked is owned by Ed James' SSG Stables, who has also worked with Hall's system.

Hall tells HRU that he first met Balazsi "about six or seven years ago" at the Standardbred Horse Sales Company's yearling sale in Harrisburg, PA. The Island horseman was selling Pedigree Matching DVDs at his usual booth, and took a break to "shoot the bull" with Frank Antonacci and friends in the cafeteria. Discussion turned to Lisa America, the Italian-bred world champion owned by the late Lou Guida. Hall remembers that Antonacci expressed interest in purchasing the top daughter of Varenne, and "Stefan sat

down and sort of listened to the conversation. When the others cleared out, he said he was interested in what I was doing with Pedigree Matching."

At the time, Order By Stables owned a larger group of mares residing at New Jersey's Concord Stud Farm. Hall said he was enlisted by Balazsi to review their bloodlines. "I did my usual thing, sorting them in terms of good or bad in Pedigree Matching. Half the mares scored poorly. They were by some nice sires, but some hadn't raced for obvious reasons." Balazsi then sold several of the mares, in foal, and consulted with Hall on the remaining mares' consorts. "He would pick out some stallions he thought were suitable for a particular mare, and he would ask me what I thought," said Hall. "He ultimately made the final decision."

The Breeder of the Year also owns racehorses in Sweden, as Order by Stable AB, Borås. "Initially, he (just) wanted to sort out the mares in New Jersey," says Hall. Balazsi has most recently asked him about which mares, Swedish and/or American, would be good matches for new sire Tactical Landing.

"The consequence has been that because he's had success with racing and breeding, he's established credibility," said Hall. "He was a top consignor at Harrisburg, with several yearlings in the first session."

It marks the continuation of a turnaround from seven years ago, when Balazsi did not have any of his yearlings in the coveted opening session.

In 2015, a filly bred by Order By Stable captured significant attention at Harrisburg. Staffan Lind and Karl-Erik Bender's winning \$500,000 bid on Future Secured (Cantab Hall) boosted her into the record books as the highest-priced yearling trotting filly ever sold at public auction (a title shared with Courtney Hall). It also tied the figure for the fourth-highest-priced standardbred yearling ever.

The following year, the then-unnamed Alarm Detector (Chapter Seven) brought \$110,000 for Order By Stable, which consigns its yearlings through Concord Stud Farm. Atlanta was sold under original name Django Unchained in the same sale, for a modest \$60,000.

In 2017, colt Kings County (Muscle Hill) was Order By's top-priced yearling, selling for \$210,000 at the Standardbred Horse Sale. Colt Marseille (Muscle Hill) drew \$180,000, while Gimpanzee (Chapter Seven) went through the ring for \$170,000 under his former name, Army of Monkeys.

Last year was the best year of all for Balazsi's breeding operation, as Sweden's SRF Stable landed Fifty Cent Piece (Muscle Hill) with a sales-topping \$500,000 winning bid at Harrisburg, equalling the all-time record price for yearling fillies. Order By's Swiss House Onfire (Muscle Hill) was the highest-selling colt of the sale, going to Robert Lindstrom (agent) for \$335,000, while colt Back Of The Neck (Ready Cash) brought \$150,000.

Hall notes that it's still quite common to assess yearlings based upon fashionable sires and conformation, without really understanding what goes into making a solid pedigree, or a durable racehorse. "Some got lucky and got a good horse, but you have to have a process and do your homework" for "predictable outcomes," he said. "Stefan is a very successful business man in his own right... He listens and he tries to understand what's happening."

Pedigree Matching was introduced in 1988, to help flag horses with the genetic potential to excel. It has since evolved to encompass software (Pedigree Matching Globetrotter), international lectures, and "Pedigree Camps" in PEI.

Hall likes to share a sobering statistic on yearling selection: "The basic fact is, out of all the yearlings raised, less than five per cent will pay for themselves over a lifetime. But, statistically, you are entitled to one out of four (25 per cent) if you get the pedigree right. That's the difference between doing your homework and not doing your homework."

The "Pedigree Guru" describes two distinctive patterns he's noticed in the bloodlines of the best North American harness horses today. He calls them "double/doubles" (DDs) and "top and bottoms" (TBs), simple terms to express the intricate connections the professional engineer looks for across a horse's pedigree.

Dan Patch Award-winning older male pacer McWicked is a DD; so is past winner Always B Miki. Because he also works with other breeds, Hall noticed an unusual finding in two of last season's best thoroughbreds: Catholic Boy and Rushing Fall are both DDs, "bred like a good standardbred is, by a standardbred owner (John Fielding, with Fred W. Hertrich III)."

Hall said it was through close study of an exceptional trotter's pedigree that he detected the rise of the second pattern. "I always wondered why Moni Maker was so good," he said. "Then I started looking for them (TBs), and what did I find? Warrawee Ubeaut, Jimmy Freight." The TB pattern is less common at present.

He was struck that this past Breeders Crown, five of the eight divisional champions had breeding which corresponded to the DD pedigree template, while another two winners' bloodlines illustrated the newer TB pedigree template, which he's identified more commonly among thoroughbreds than standardbreds. Balazsi took heed: "So the plan for going to the sale last year was, Stefan wanted horses who were one or the other [DD or TB]. These were the only horses he looked at, with his partners."

Hall has a system in which he assigns numerical ratings to yearlings in a catalogue. He recommends that his clients inspect only the colts and fillies with approved bloodlines—"You have to have a 140 for a decent trotter and 160 for a decent pacer," he said, revealing only that he calculates the number for each yearling based on the accomplishments of the family, using a wide swath of statistics, as opposed to a narrow focus on black type in the first three generations, or worse, conformation and videos. "Pedigree comes first, because pedigree is the first decision in creating a horse," quips Hall. "It may just be 12 per cent, but it's the most important 12 per cent."

USTA records show that the Order By Stable has produced 110 North American foals since 2007. It has registered 11 foals of 2018, including a Muscle Hill half-brother to Future Secured; a full sister to Marseille; a full sister to Gimpanzee; and a Muscle Hill half-sister to Atlanta.

The Breeder of the Year was unable to attend the awards banquet due to being sick with the flu, so Julie Meirs and her father, David Meirs III, of Concord Stud Farm accepted the trophy on his behalf.

"It was a great honor for a small breeder to win the Breeder of the Year," Julie told HRU. "The small breeders don't always get recognized, because they don't have nearly as many to compete as the big breeders."

She calls Balazsi a quiet man, in "constant contact almost daily" by phone to discuss his New Jersey-based mares and offspring.

David agreed that Balaszi's "remarkable" accomplishments as a breeder go back to the place where Pedigree Matching also starts: close study of maternal pedigrees over many generations. "He keeps to himself, but he studies the mares, respects the genetics on them, and he's had a lot of success."

Out of Takter's shadow, Engblom hoping to make a name for himself

Per Engblom isn't trying to be the next Jimmy Takter. That, he says, would be impossible. But that doesn't mean the 39-year-old former assistant to Takter is aiming low. With his former boss having retired and turning over dozens of his horses to his former assistant, Engblom is determined to show people he has the skills to be a top trainer on his own and that, he, too, can excel at the sport's highest levels.

Takter made the stunning announcement in 2017 that he would be retiring after the 2018 season, even though he was only in his mid-fifties and widely considered the best trainer in the sport. He said his stable would be divided up between his daughter, Nancy Johansson, and Engblom. The latter had two stints working as an assistant to Takter, from 2000 to 2004, and then from 2012 to 2016.

Taking over for a legend can be a mixed bag. You can't get

a getter education than working for Takter and Takter left him with some very good horses. But the pressure to succeed must be overwhelming.

"I feel like I'm never going to be Jimmy," he said. "I know that. I have to try to be myself and I have to do my own thing and, hopefully, I can do good for my owners and customers and my horses can do the best they can."

Engblom has 42 horses -24 of them are 2-year-olds and Engblom, Takter and his bloodstock advisor Perry Soderberg, worked together to pick them out. He has 18 older horses and said "13 to 15" of them came from Takter.

One that did not is the Australian-bred trotter La Grange, a son of Muscle Hill. A winner of six of 22 career starts before he arrived in the U.S., he made his debut for Engblom on Feb. 21 at Yonkers. Despite drawing post eight, he won the \$20,000 conditioned race by four lengths to give his trainer his first ever win in the U.S.

"Of course it felt good to get that win," Engblom said. "He was going from the eight post so we figured it wouldn't be easy. It's always nice to hit it out of park right away. We had

very good reports on him from down there. He's a big horse and needed some time, but he is a super well-bred horse and I think he'll do some good here. Maybe he will be a stakes horse. He was born in November, so he's 5 here and 4 there. I'm going to give him time. He fit that race at Yonkers well. He'll need a couple of races on the bigger track. Maybe I'll go for a couple of series at Pocono. His first start was very good for him."

Lost In Time leads the list of older horses that Engblom acquired from Takter. The 2017 Governors Cup winner, he had an injury plagued 3-year-old season that kept him to just four starts, but Engblom has high expectations for him this year.

"He was finishing very well in the North America Cup, but, unfortunately, got hurt," Engblom said. "He's coming back off surgery, so he may not race for us for a while, but he's a top horse and I think he'll do really well this year."

Other horses that he took over from Takter that he is high on include: Osterc, Super Schissel and Beautiful Sin.

After he retired, Takter take took off to Australia and New Zealand on vacation. He came back briefly and then resumed his travels. Engblom says he hears from Takter often, but it's mainly to give him pep talks. If he is going stand watch over Engblom and Johansson and tell them what to do, he hasn't shown any signs of that yet. That said, Engblom welcomes his input.

"It's nice to have him to lean on to make decisions," Engblom said. "He's actually very happy with all the horses. He knows if I have a problem I will give him a call. This time of year we don't expect to have too much trouble. The plan is he'll help us out in April and May because that is crunch time for the babies. His knowledge and experience is too good. It's not something where you would say to him no thank you. He'll be coming and going. I cannot count on him being there every day. I need to prove myself on my own."

Bazire continues to dominate in Paris as Belina Josselyn wins 2.6-mile race

The \$397,000 Prix de Paris over 2.6 miles was held at Vincennes racetrack in Paris on Sunday afternoon and as has been the case this winter, Jean-Michel Bazire dominated the show.

Belina Josselyn (Love You) won Prix de France 2018 and Prix d'Amérique earlier this year, so to fullfil her trophy collection from the Grand Prix races, she needed a victory in Prix de France.

It is proving to be both her year and Bazire's.

The top French driver found a perfect spot in second over with Belina Josselyn and when stable mate Looking Superb put hard pressure on leader Bahia Quesnot with a lap to go (approximately 5/8ths of a mile) everything worked out perfectly for Belina Josselyn.

Looking Superb reached the front position with 1,800 meters to go, which forced Belina Josselyn to race without cover for the rest of the show. But that didn't stop the chestnut 8-year-old mare. When Bazire pulled the plugs with a half-mile to go, Belina Josselyn seemed more courageous than her opponents and Bazire steered the race however he wanted.

In the end of the last turn, the duo left leader Looking Superb behind and Bazire looked quite pleased when he understood that his mare had collected another Group 1 win in her career.

Tony Gio finished strongly from third over to second place and Carat Williams held to third place after a cover trip behind winner Belina Josselyn.

The mile rate was 1:59 for the winner.

Bazire made a trip to the French Riviera on Thursday night and he had his aim on the \$90,500 Prix de Joinville le Pont with his Prix du Luxembourg winner Cleangame (Ouragan de Celland). The duo left third over with a mile to go and landed outside leader Cavalleria shortly thereafter. It looked almost ridiculously easy when Bazire controlled the game over the home stretch. Cleangame won in a mile rate of 1:57.1 over 1.8 miles and Bazire also secured the runner up spot, too, since Ble du Gers and Alexandre Abrivard took the silver medal.

Bazire's domination is total wherever he shows up in his home

country for the moment and it will be very interesting to see if he sends some of his best horses (Aubrion du Gers, Cleangame, Looking Superb, Belina Josselyn) to some of the biggest races in other European countries this spring.

Ron Van Wagoner details breaking his maiden as a driver

There was a bit of a buzz last week on social media when Ron "Cubbie" Van Wagoner took his first driving win on a major track.

The likable 27-year-old Michigan native – who was given his nickname by his mom when because he made growling noises like a bear cub when he slept as an infant – received several congratulatory Tweets and Facebook posts after guiding the 5-year-old Somebeachsomewhere gelding Papiamento to a convincing win last Tuesday night at Northfield Park.

Van Wagoner took no chances with the 6-5 favorite, sending Papiamento right to the front at the start, and the son of the Western Hanover mare Keystone Dawn then led his rivals on a futile chase on route to a 7 1/2-length win in 1:54 in the non-winners of \$1,500 last four starts conditioned race.

Van Wagoner explains that he was full of confidence heading to the gate. "I knew going in that the horse was a couple of seconds the best," he said. "He already had a mark of 1:54 this year and none of the other horses had shown that."

He seems a bit surprised at how easy the win came, however. "Going to the 3/4 pole, I looked over my shoulder because I couldn't hear anything," Van Wagoner said. "When I came into the stretch, I looked over again because I still couldn't hear anything, and it was the first time I had been leading by that many lengths. I was kind of surprised, so I was like: don't make a break, don't fall out of the bike and sit chilly and get across the wire, you're home free."

The modest teamster had no demonstrative celebration at the wire, which drew some ribbing from his driving brethren when he got back to the drivers' room. "The guys were asking why I didn't do anything; why didn't I celebrate my first win," Van Wagoner said. "I told them I just wanted to make sure I got through the wire and I didn't want to get fined for anything or do anything crazy. I was relieved just to get that first win over with."

Van Wagoner seems a bit surprised there were no rituals bestowed on him by his fellow drivers to commemorate the milestone win. "I thought they might give me the silent treatment or something like that, but I had a few guys come up and shake my hand to congratulate me and that was it," he said. "I was worried because I thought they might dump water on me, and I had more drives that night. That would have ruined the whole night."

Although Van Wagoner's family has been involved in harness racing for as long as he can remember, there wasn't an instant attraction for him as often happens in many harness racing families. "I never messed with the horses," he said. "I played sports and hung with my friends. The last thing I wanted to do was go to the barn and clean stalls in the morning, so I really didn't get into it until I was about 20 years old.

"I had my first start in a fair race about four years ago. But I haven't taken it seriously until about six months ago." He explained that he started to focus more on driving because he appreciates it when owners put their faith in his skills. "I've been on both sides of the spectrum where I've had horses in races that I trained and also driven horses in other races," he said. "I like to have people put their trust in me to make a living. I think that's the biggest thing; that someone puts me up and respects and trust me enough to go out there and make them money. It's a nice feeling."

It seems that Van Wagoner is making up for lost time now as he takes care of the family's stable full-time in Ohio. "My dad's down as trainer, but I do all the work," he said with a laugh, noting that his dad commutes back and forth from Michigan to Northfield while Ron holds down the fort at Northfield.

The maiden-breaking win didn't go unnoticed in the industry as Van Wagoner was asked to appear on the Post Time With Mike and Mike radio show with Mike Bozich and Michael Carter last Thursday morning.

"That was cool because Mike Bozich was calling races at Hazel Park when I first started going to the track and I didn't know anything at all," he said. "Now, here I am on the phone, on his show, talking to him about my driving. It was like a full-circle thing for me and I tweeted out that it was a very humbling experience to kind of see what I've done over the last few years."

Humility doesn't appear to be a virtue that Van Wagoner is short on as he explains why he has embraced a future driving racehorses. "I'm not in it for the money; I'm in it to make other people happy," he said matter-of-factly.

The Blacken Stallion (Part 1)

The Real Life Ventures and Adventures of Trey and Batman

"Isn't it about time to choose a stallion for your broodmare?" asked my new pal from Silicon Valley as we waited at the DQ drive-thru for our milkshakes.

"I'm a last-minute shopper. I figure the more stuff I put off, the more stuff I have to look forward to."

"Well, that's irresponsible."

"Yeah, I'm going to get help for my procrastination problem one of these days."

"No doubt you have an infamous Trey theory when it comes to selecting stallions."

I handed him his shake and gave him a thumbs up. "Of course, I have dozens. No doubt they are absurd, but the whole stallion selection thing is a muddle of madness and hype to me. I just wing it using some rules of the off-road."

"Solid planning."

I speared a straw into my plastic lid, took a slurp and said, "You'll lose your mind if you keep trying to understand mine. I'm always contrary and rarely correct, but the strange thing is that my scorecard in selecting stallions for my mare is great. She has had four babies, the first two raced at the sires' stakes level and the next two in the pipeline are looking good."

He tipped his milkshake in salute and asked, "What's your system?"

"I use an anti-system. Different sires, different states, never top tier stallions, never pay much, and every breeding is a crazy little saga."

"Interesting. Insane, but interesting."

"My thinking is that famous stallions, the netherworld of syndication, the high prices, the pedigree fanatics, and the researchers are a loop of normal customers. I ain't in that loop. For one thing, I just have one trotting baby horse each year and I don't NEED to sell it as a yearling. I can race if I don't get my price, so market trends don't mean diddley to me."



"But you never get the great stallions?"

"Who sez? My thinking is that there are herds of good studs that never have a prayer. They never get a fair shot. I like to go to these underdog stallions. Heck, three of the four stallions that I bred to, I didn't know their names until I went semen shopping. One of the stallions had a crop of about a dozen babies; my filly was in that crop and did fine."

"That's quite a radical slant on breeding."

"I call it my Beau Blacken theory of stallion selection?"

"A famous racehorse?"

"Nope, an unknown baseball player."

He just stared at me, so I explained, "In the year 2005, I spent a season in the lowest level of professional baseball. The team was the Chillicothe Paints of the Frontier League. I met a kid from Lake Stevens Washington named Beau Blacken. He not only had the coolest name, but he was also the best player on the team."

"How did we get from horse racing to baseball? Where is this going?"

"Think of it like this. If Beau was a yearling at the Lexington sale, this is what you would find — a deep pedigree of great athletes on his family HIP page, flawless conformation, chiseled six-foot-three, 215 pounds, excellent attitude, and a fierce competitor."

'What didn't he have?"

"Luck, or people in his corner. He was a quiet guy. Baseball did not have all the Moneyball stats and data at that time. He probably didn't get scouted in college, even if a few scouts did wander into the desert they must have been asleep because Beau slammed 14 home runs and drove in 61 runs during his final year at New Mexico State."

"Still don't see where we are going."

"Beau was not drafted, which baffled plenty of people. I know it baffled Beau. He said every coach he played for felt there was absolutely no reason he should not have been drafted. He pretty much led every team he ever played for."

"At that point, on draft day, or in his case non-draft day, his

fate was sealed."

"How so?

"Drafted players get agents and money is invested in their progress, a lot of money. They have other people invested in them. Drafted players received top-notch instruction, training, and nutrition. They have a real chance of making it to the show."

"Your guy, Beau?"

"Undrafted players like Beau are on their own with very little instruction, eating cheeseburgers on a bus rumbling through the night to play in front of five hundred fans and zero scouts for seven hundred dollars a month. Independent Pro ball is not a developmental league. You play hard, you play hurt, you play non-stop, and you play well or you are gone in a week."

My friend slurped the bottom of his milkshake and said, "Life isn't fair, but what does this have to do with selecting a stallion?"

"I believe this happens in harness horse racing, both in the racing and in the breeding game. At a sale, a yearling colt goes for \$200,000 to a wealthy group. The horse is sent to a top trainer and he gets the best of everything just because somebody, for some reason, probably a good reason, raised their hand."

"That's not a guarantee the horse will make it to the top tier."

"No, but I gotta believe that big-ticket horse has a leg up on a \$9,000 yearling that fell through the cracks, sells to a dentist from Idaho and goes to the fairground barn of trainer Barney Shlump who trains alone, doesn't use vets, does his own shoeing and rushes the colt to the races. Sure Barney's colt can climb the racing ladder, maybe even climb high and potentially become a stallion – but the odds are much longer."

"What happened to Beau?"

"He played four years in the Frontier League, playing for the Chillicothe (OH) Paints, the Evansville (IN) Otters, and the Florence (KY) Freedom, hitting 50 home runs, driving in 233 runs in 378 games, and twice batting better than .300. He never got a call from the Major League affiliates, never got a look, never really had a chance."

His manager in Chillicothe and Florence, Jamie Keefe said that Beau was popular with the fans, and respected by the opponents. "There you go again with the pressure. I mean, it's not like the world is going to run out of stallion semen, or that these stallions are all going to fill their books. Even if one did fill their book, there are plenty of others."

"And no doubt Trey has more loopy theories."

"I have an infinite supply of lunacy. When I'm ready to pull the trigger, I will give you a few stallions and fabricate reasons why these stallions are fantastic choices. You can help me make the final cut."

"Sounds like a plan, a crazy and tardy plan, but at least a plan."

I thought for a second and then said, "And if I get a colt out of my craziness, I'm going to name him Beau Blacken."

Hannah Miller – Driver / trainer / veterinarian specialist

The name Miller is a common one in harness racing. When one hears it, they usually think of David Miller — the "Buckeye" from Ohio who is one of the sport's top drivers, or Erv Miller from Illinois — a trainer who conditioned great horses such as Manofmanymissions, Incredible Tillie, Loyal Opposition and Classic Photo.

Even Erv's son, Marcus, has made a name for himself as an up-and-coming star driver, so when Erv's daughter, Hannah, took amateur racing by storm, it was not surprising. Hannah's first year in the bike was not easy for she raced against male counterparts, but that didn't scare the 27-year-old blonde. She won 32 races, finished with a .425 UDR in 118 drives, and was named "National Amateur Driver of the Year." (She was the first woman to win this award.)

Hannah also dominated the C.K.G. Billings Series where she won the East Regional final at The Downs at Mohegan Sun in Poconos.

This ambitious, hard-working and beautiful young lady grew up around horses and started helping her dad at the barn when she was quite young.

"When I was 15 my dad purchased a yearling for me. It was the perfect way for me to learn the business alongside a young horse learning everything for the first time. I cleaned stalls and groomed for several summers in high school before I ever went to the racetrack. At first I didn't want to go on the track because I loved being close to the horses and having that one-on-one relationship with them.

"One day dad came to me and asked if I wanted to drive in an amateur race. I wasn't sure I was ready to drive, but dad thought I was and insisted. I drove my first horse in 2012 at my home track at the Illinois State Fairgrounds and finished second. Two weeks later, I drove again at the World Cup of Amateur Racing that same year.

"My boyfriend at the time, Nick Surick, helped me find some older trotters to buy and we quickly became involved in amateur racing. I own several horses now, but not quite as many as I have in the past. I have a couple older trotters and a 3-year-old pacing filly that I'm looking forward to racing this upcoming season.

"It's a family business. Even my mom is involved where she does a lot of behind the scenes work. She does the bookkeeping, day-to-day tasks and is the backbone of it all. She has been so supportive of both my brother and I driving, and has traveled overseas with me to watch me compete."

A new opportunity recently presented itself to Hannah, which is horse related, but in a different aspect.

"About a year ago I started working in the animal health side of the industry as an Equine Specialist Territory Manager for Kinetic Vet. I have learned so much, enjoy working with veterinarians, and seeing the business side of things, which is giving me a chance to use the bachelor's degree I worked hard for in college. This past year has been a huge transition with Kinetic Vet. I plan on taking this experience and applying it to harness racing.

"I recently attended the inaugural Equestrian Business Women Summit in Florida and had the opportunity to meet so many women from all walks of life. They all have a passion for horses, in one way or another. It was a chance to listen to inspiring women tell stories about their struggles and successes and to discuss new ways to grow brands.

"I believe that collaborating like this is what the future depends on in a world that is so cut throat, for it's important to have a sense of community. I think in the future of harness

racing we will see overall less races, but this will lead to higher purses and even more competitive races. I think the 'best of the best' will have to come out to compete, which includes not only horses, but drivers and trainers as well.

"As far as giving advice to young women who want to drive racehorses, I say to them, 'Sit behind horses as much as they can. The more experience you have, the more comfortable and confident you will be.' I'm very lucky my dad had such a large stable, for it gave me the opportunity to jog a lot of different horses.

"It's a wonderful opportunity to drive horses for it has taken me all over the world. One of my favorite times was when I competed in the World Cup of Amateur Racing in Budapest, Hungary, representing the United States. I only missed winning the World Cup by a single point. I think that experience helped to prove my ability as a driver since it was

an international competition and I was still able to hold my own in such a different setting.

"As far as getting pushed around because I'm a female — I've been pushed around on the track as much from other female drivers as male drivers. This is a very competitive sport that people rely on to make a living, so every driver is out there to do their best and hopefully win.

"I love harness racing and it will always be a huge part of my life. I will continue owning racehorses and plan on continuing to drive, also. I see myself not only driving in amateur races, but also competing in more overnight races as well."











Weingartner, Pikelny on Communicators Hall of Fame ballot

Ken Weingartner, the media relations manager for the U.S. Trotting Association's Harness Racing Communications arm, and Phil Pikelny, who worked as a publicist, broadcaster, and co-author of a biography of the great pacer Rambling Willie, were selected for places in the mid-summer balloting which could lead to their being elected to harness racing's Communicators Hall of Fame, in voting conducted this afternoon (Saturday) by the directors of the U.S. Harness Writers Association (USHWA).

Weingartner, who first went to the racetrack pushed by his father in a stroller, graduated from Lycoming College and then worked in the central Pennsylvania area before returning to his native New Jersey. Ken's column "Horse Play" in the Allentown (NJ) Morning Press was honored in 2001 by the New Jersey Chapter of USHWA and brought him to the attention of the USTA, for whom he has worked in his present position since 2002.

In 2007, he was voted the Golden Pen Award by the Standardbred Media and Marketing Association, and Weingartner was doubly-honored in 2015, by USHWA's Monticello-Goshen Chapter and by Harness Horsemen International. Weingartner serves as the chair of USHWA's Journalism Awards Committee and is co-chair of its Hirt Sports Media Workshop Committee.

Pikelny was spotted by double Hall of Famer Stan Bergstein when he started a harness racing club at Northwestern University near Chicago, and then became the youngest publicity director in any major sport when he went to the U.S. Trotting Association at age 23. He combined with author Don Evans to produce the book Rambling Willie: The Horse That God Loved, which followed the career of the sensational standardbred who set records for both 2:00 victories and earnings — with 10 per cent of those earnings going to the church of Vivian Farrington, the wife of Willie's trainer. In 1981, Pikelny and the horse then went "on tour" throughout America, appearing at racetracks, shopping malls, and other media opportunities.

Pikelny worked as publicity director at Scioto Downs (OH) and at the standardbred meet at Del Mar (CA). He then went on to a long career in many facets of communications while continuing to speak at harness conventions and mentoring young publicists.

Pikelny and Weingartner will now be joined during mid-summer balloting by Hall of Fame nominees who will be decided in early July. Those that receive 75 per cent of the yes-no voting will go on to receive the sport's ultimate prize, enshrinement in their respective Halls of Fame in Goshen NY.

The voting for the summer ballot spots for the communicators was very tight, with Weingartner getting 11 votes, Pikelny 10, Jay Bergman and Joe Kyle 9 each, and Bill Fidati 5 — the last-named three sure to be strong candidates in upcoming years.

Brett Miller gets 8,000th win in Beissinger Memorial Medley at Miami Valley

Brett Miller picked a great time to post his 8,000th career victory on Friday night (Feb. 22) at Miami Valley Raceway. The 45-year-old purple and white clad reinsman captured the \$25,000 championship final of the inaugural Howard Beissinger Memorial Medley in the track's first-ever added distance 1-1/4 mile race.

Miller guided Double A Goldrush to the 2:27.4 triumph in gate-to-wire fashion over fast-closing No Whip Chip (Chris Page) and Nothinbutanallstar (LeWayne Miller). Fractions for the first mile of the endurance test were :29.1, 1:00, 1:29.3 and 1:58.1.

The winner swept through all three legs of the Beissinger Medley, notching a 1:11.1 score in the first leg, a five-eighths mile dash; returning with a 1:54.2 tally at the conventional mile distance in the second leg; then tacking on the lucrative added distance championship.

Ross Leonard trains the 5-year-old son of Elegant Man for Michael and Laura Lee and their partner Terry Leonard. The victory was Double A Goldrush's 16th from just 64 lifetime starts and pushed him past the \$200,000 earnings plateau.

"He thought about pulling up for a moment just past the mile mark," Miller said. "I guess he thought he'd done enough work for the night, but he got right back to business when I chirped to him."

Miller, the son of Del S. Miller and cousin of Hall of Famer

David Miller, began his racing career in Ohio at age 19 in 1992, winning one race in 31 tries, good for \$3,258 in earnings. It wasn't long afterwards that he hooked up with the late trainer John Lee at Northfield Park and the duo began winning races at an alarming rate. For a period of seven years before Miller left for The Meadowlands in 2007 he averaged more than 500 wins a year with purse earnings of more than \$2 million in each of them. His lifetime purse earnings are approaching \$85 million.


"John Lee gave me my first big break," said Miller. "I might not be here today if not for the trust he placed in me. I think about John and the good times we had at Northfield often. He was a great guy and great trainer. I miss him."

While his annual purse earnings more than doubled during his decade on the east coast, Miller kept an eye on his Buckeye roots and the renaissance taking place in terms of increased purses. Yearning to return "home," Brett decided the timing was right when the calendar turned to 2019 and he couldn't be happier with that decision.

"I'm happy to be home and winning races at this clip again (68 already in 2019, good for more than \$700,000 in purses).

Programs print planned post times. At Pompano they show the first race planned at 7:20 followed by 15 minutes between races. On average, there will always be more like 20 minutes between races. On Sunday, the planned post time for the final race 11 printed as 9:50. That race actually went off at 11:08. Why not change the planned intervals between races from 15 to 20 minutes? It will never be perfect but it will be a lot more meaningful.

Why does the Minutes Until Post display as zero at least 5 minutes or more prior to each race? That doesn't get anyone to place their bets any sooner because everyone knows that it is not an accurate or meaningful number.

Why do people bet so heavily on odds on favorites? A classic chalk player once said, "Better a short price than a long face." But I always remember the words of John Berry who often says, "Hardly a man is now alive who paid his mortgage at 3 to 5."

More on Richard Young case

Coming on the heels of the Richard Young case in which the court refused to enforce the "as is" clause to the purchase of a yearling with a congenital heart defect, I found Dr. Moore's question about the applicability of the "as is" clause to the purchase of a pregnant yearling filly to be most interesting (2019-02-17 Feedback here).

With regard to the Young case, I still don't understand the basis upon which it was sent to a jury.

In the Feb. 3, 2019 issue of HRU, Russell Williams was quoted as saying Young "...tried to argue that the As-Is Clause was no longer the law in the US... that was the main defense and he lost..." Young himself was quoted as saying "we didn't argue that (the breeder or seller) knew because it didn't matter if they knew. They should have known, that's really what it comes down to..."

In his Feb. 10, 2019 response to the initial HRU story Young states that "...Our first defense was it was standard practice to return such horses (i.e. those with a congenital heart defect)..." and "...the breeders would take them back..." He then went on to say that he also argued that the seller had made an express warranty with regard to the yearling in question and "...that there was such communication admitted at trial..." However, he never said what the express warranty was and Russell Williams was quoted in the initial HRU story as saying that the trial transcript reveals that "...nobody in the case testified that there was a warranty..."

Only the jury instructions and the jury verdict would shed any light on this issue and I have seen neither.

With regard to the issue raised by Dr. Moore, the sale/purchase of a yearling at public auction creates a contract between the buyer and seller and incorporates the terms and conditions of the sale catalog, including those that pertain to express and implied warranties and their disclaimer.

The sale of a pregnant yearling filly clearly violates the seller's implied warranty of fitness for a particular purpose, i.e. training and racing. The question then becomes whether or not the seller is protected from liability under the provisions of the sale catalog that state that all yearlings are sold "as is" and "with all faults". In my opinion, the answer should be "no."

Most states have adopted the Uniform Commercial Code, including the provisions thereof that relate to express and implied warranties and their disclaimer. An introductory provision of the U.C.C. (355.2-302) is intended to aid in the interpretation and application of other relevant code provisions, including those pertaining to express and implied warranties. This introductory provision is entitled "Unconscionable Contract or Clause" and provides that "If a Court... finds... any clause of the contract to have been unconscionable at the time it was made it may refuse to enforce the condition..."

While I do not believe it to be unconscionable to enforce an "as is" clause with regard to the sale of a yearling with a congenital heart defect (at least where there is no evidence that the seller knew of the condition), I do believe it to be unconscionable to enforce the "as is" clause in the case of the sale of a pregnant yearling filly. Such a case would have to involve some degree of culpability on the part of the seller, i.e. did he fail to separate his colts and fillies soon enough or did he know that a colt had had access to the filly at some point in time? Regardless, the enforceability of the "as is" clause would be for the Court to decide, not a jury!

I also believe that there is another legal defense upon which the purchaser of a pregnant yearling filly might rely to void the purchase, one that I think would be much easier to prove. That defense is based on "mutual mistake". Even though the U.C.C. is clearly applicable to the sale of horses, general contract law also applies.

One of the requirements for the formation of a contract is that the terms upon which the parties have agreed must mean the same thing to each party. Thus, there can be no mistake or ignorance as to any material terms of the agreement. While contracts are not normally set aside because only one of the parties was mistaken (unilateral mistake), they are normally set aside if both of the parties are mistaken (mutual mistake) and the mistake was of substantial importance and in fact formed the basis of the agreement.

Assuming the pregnancy of the yearling filly was unknown to the seller (otherwise the sale could be set aside on the basis of fraud), both the buyer and the seller were mistaken as to her pregnancy (mutual mistake). This could be established by merely asking the seller if he thought the filly that he sold was pregnant at the time he sold her—his answer would have to be "no". Since no one would question the importance of the pregnancy status of a yearling filly sold at auction, her sale should be set aside on that basis alone.

I have been a small market breeder for over 50 years and have never pregnancy checked a yearling filly before her sale, nor have I ever had a potential buyer request to do so. Furthermore, I am not aware of any yearling sale company that would even knowingly accept the consignment of a pregnant yearling filly.

Sturman responds to Leary

In response to the feedback provided by Dan Leary on behalf of the USTA to last week's column about statistical data specific data being made available for free (2019-02-17 Feedback here).

I first appreciate the feedback. There were some points made by Mr. Leary that I agree with – and conceded as much

in the column – but other points that still didn't address the statistic that was the basis for the column to begin with.

All I wanted to know is if seven training wins on a single card was a harness racing record. It seems simple enough, right? This is not available in the online T&P guide that Mr. Leary referenced, nor can it be found on Pathway, even if someone were willing to pay for it. Similarly, information about most driving wins on a card is not available through these means either. I do feel these qualify under the category as "basic" statistics.

As for the data that is available in the online T&P guide or through Pathway (for free), I gave due credit in the column to the USTA for having the last five years of records available for horses, trainers and owners. In addition to that though, the data mentioned by Mr. Leary pertaining to seasonal award winners, and records of the major historical races are welcomed sources of information that should have been referenced in the column as well.

The data within the T&P guide is solid if you're only interested in recent history, but there's limited information for anything outside of the last five years. And while you could certainly debate what constitutes "basic" statistical data, it should be obvious that much statistical data may not be readily available and is not free of charge.

More than once in my column it was noted how gracious and helpful the USTA was in this particular data request, as they have always been in prior similar requests. The overall point was just that if this type of statistical information is available and can readily be accessed, then how about seeing what can be done to make it more publicly available. Through Mr. Leary's response in constantly improving and expanding its information, it seems that the USTA is doing just that.
