Lack of effort drives should draw much harsher penalties

Fortunately, the infraction is rare in the sport, but when the violation does happen - as it did in February at The Meadows – a much stronger message must be sent.

Like any other sport, harness racing plays referee to its participants and assesses fines and suspensions routinely based on a myriad of different violations, most of which border on the minor side of things. But unlike most other sports, including its thoroughbred counterpart, the mainstream perception of harness racing is that sometimes

it is a sport that's less than on the up-and-up.

Because of this, and because of its reliance on taxpayer funds to sustain itself in many jurisdictions, racing cannot be hesitant to condemn detriments to the sport in the harshest of terms. At the top of this list, I would consider any infraction that destroys the integrity of a race outcome.

From last week's Fines and Suspensions list published from the USTA, there was a major ruling against trainer and driver

In the race in question, here's what happened: Kreiser worked his way to the front with 5-2 chance App Hanover from post 2 after an early three-way skirmish and cut the mile in the off-going from there. Kreiser is seen kicking out the plugs on the backstretch and then carries his lead turning for home as a couple horses challenge to his outside. Throughout the stretch drive, App Hanover maintained his lead with Kreiser sitting motionless and if anything, it at least appears Kreiser tries to slow the progress of App Hanover. Only in the closing stages once App Hanover is finally passed and, on the wire, does Kreiser then elect to hopelessly flick the whip.

Admittedly, the description of what I saw is coming from someone who's never driven in a single harness race before, so maybe I have it all wrong. But it was deemed serious enough to be categorized as an extremely rare unsatisfactory drive due to lack of effort. Keep in mind that there are often unsatisfactory drive violations but those are almost always attributed to the misdemeanor version of careless driving.

How rare is a lack of effort violation in the U.S.? In searching the USTA historical ruling's through Pathway, the Kreiser violation is the only one this entire century from The Meadows. The only other incident I recall that at least visually looked as bad was from a different driver at Dover nine years ago. And amazingly, that occurrence was the only one in the entire century from Dover. So, based from the elevation of the incident to an infraction that is evidently once a generation, individuals in higher positions than me took exception to the drive.

As the ruling states, Kreiser was fined \$5,000 and suspended for 120 days because he "did not put forth his best effort to win by failing to drive his horse to the finish." Which, if what the ruling says is true, is a polite way of saying that the outcome of the race was illegally altered.

On the surface, a suspension of 120 days may seem like a lot by current local standards, but if it happened elsewhere the punishment would have been far worse. In harness racing in New Zealand and Australia for example, that same drive may have resulted in a suspension of a year, if not more. Drivers are routinely set down for weeks for commonplace things such as poor strategic decisions where

if it occurred in North America, no one would bat an eye.

Whether right or wrong, we've come to accept certain non-trying efforts as part of the game. Deserving heavy favorites who duck at the start or who elect to sit fourth on the rail instead of pulling only to then close in 25 seconds and miss by a length comes with the territory of betting the races. But what you can't do is somehow not win when it appears completely inevitable that you're about to do so.

Regrettably, such actions give credence to those who say that harness racing is crooked. If what is described in the USTA ruling is factually accurate, then what other reaction could one possibly have?

To compound matters, the incident came in Pennsylvania, right at a time where there are discussions of redirecting the funds currently afforded to the state's racing industry. If racing in the state were self-sustaining, the infraction would be bad enough but at least the sport could police itself without having to care about outsiders. But what happens when horseplayers cease to bet on a product because of dwindling confidence; how much longer then will lawmakers still support harness racing?

With ongoing perception issues, there's simply no room in harness racing for cheaters. To send a clear message that racing does not tolerate conduct detrimental to the sport, any instance in general that could be categorized as a driver not winning with an opportunity to do so should be met with an automatic one-year suspension for a first-time offender. If it happens again, the result should be a lifetime ban.

Other sports have issued lifetime bans related to point-shaving and gambling; most notably of course is Pete Rose who after over 30 years remains banned from baseball. And in his case, he at least bet for his team unlike most racing infractions that are the result of someone trying not to win.

To help combat integrity concerns and in the process gain confidence from existing and potentially new horseplayers, harness racing needs to run a clean product. That may mean stiffer penalties to rule breakers, but it'll ultimately be a necessity for racing to continue on.



Howard Pearce made an interesting point that I think should be addressed by the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO). Maybe my friend Clay Horner can give a little impetus to my proposal. Mr. Pearce for a long time has run a fractional ownership group for standardbreds in Kingston, ON called the LandMark Stable. He has found that the licensing of the group has become financially unsustainable for those in the two per cent or less bracket. After emailing back and forth I have learned that unlike most states in the U.S., where if you own less than five per cent licensing is unnecessary, Ontario requests that all general partners be licensed. It is just another one of the myriad of ridiculous obstacles stunting the growth of our industry.

Let's all think about pushing for the abolishment of licensing altogether. There really is no earthly purpose in the process. If the government claims it as a source of revenue, the amount must be minuscule .To compensate, we could pay the state a fee when we start racing, it could be recorded by a race office like a Coggins test, which is (another) total waste of time.

Think of how much money would be saved by eliminating licensing. The time and manpower it takes to peruse every racing program to make sure every person racing every night is licensed is enormous. Then add to that the 72 hours the commission has to chase down the culprits. The system is a joke. After it's all said and done you get to the track early to "obey" the rules and the first words you hear are "we were just about to scratch your horse." How sick of this are all of us?

The reason for the entire ordeal is obsolete. Who cares if a felon owns a horse? We don't have enough money left in our business to appeal to organized crime. The paranoia of 1950 must end right now.

I realize that this is no panacea, but anything we can do on a positive note is a plus in my book. Just a note, I love reading and or watching crime drama. Correct me if I am wrong but in cold cases 20 or 30 years old, somehow the fingerprints still match. How is it for the insane sum of \$100 we must be finger printed six times in 30 years? Just asking for a friend.

Jim Fromm asks: Ron, hopefully you can help. I spoke to Mike Tanner at the USTA and he thought this was a good idea, but felt it need to be started in the New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania and Delaware area. How could we start the Amanda Harris Cancer Fund? It would involve drivers, trainers, owners and racetracks. My plan would be for .05% or \$5 in every \$1,000 be set aside from checks and the total amount to be matched by the tracks. This money can go to Cancer Research.

You had me until your last line. If the money went to Andrew and the kids for the massive medical bills they have I think it's a wonderful idea. However, to figure out what Cancer Research charities are worthy of our support is another question. Where the money would actually go would be difficult to assess.

It is my understanding that a wonderful deed has already been accomplished. A notable Grand Circuit trainer has raised a substantial sum for the family.

Robbie Robinson asks: I have a 2-year-old trotting colt by Muscle Mass that has been 100 per cent perfect training down. When I hit 2:28 he started hiking in the turns. I gave him a few days in the field and it didn't help. I didn't want to put needles in his back at this age as my veterinarian suggested, can you help?



I certainly will try. Your problem is a very common one, but from my experience one that is often misdiagnosed.

Believe it or not, 90 per cent of the time the hiking comes from the opposite knee. For example, hiking right hind sore in left knee; hiking left hind (rarely a problem in a turn), sore in right knee.

There are other possibilities but they would be odd at best.

The next, most likely spot, would be right hind ankle I would say six per cent. That leaves four per cent for all the other possible places, that would include: right hock, right hind cannon bone, right whirlbone, left shoulder, left foot, and the wildest of all, but I have seen it, inside quarter of right front foot.

I am sure I can come up with more but they would be so esoteric they would be a waste of time. Please have your vet block the colt's left knee, upper and lower joints and go a slow mile and see if it helps. Most likely it will be the answer. If it is, inject with Adequan three weeks in a row if you are in a hurry, if not three weeks in the field will usually have a similar effect and will save you money. I would paint the knee with an iodine-based remedy mixed with DMSO. Any old time trainer will show you the proper mix.

If it doesn't work, follow the guidelines above as to where to look. It is a headache but one of those problems that will always have an answer.

Rory Mercurio asks: My wife is in a partnership with two 2-year-old pacers, that have been 2:37 and 2:42. Give me a ballpark figure as to where they should be by mid-February? Also, what do you think the chances are of Auburn going all the way in March?

To be fair, there is no ballpark figure. I don't think I have trained a standardbred pacer in the last 20 years that couldn't go 2:02. So why worry how fast they are going in February? It's far more important at this point how they do it and if they are sound. Their times are well within proper scheduling. Trust your trainer to do the right thing and don't worry about how anyone else is doing.

As for Auburn, this is a year that there are about 25 teams that could win the big enchilada in Atlanta and Auburn would have to be considered one. That said, I have one problem with your team, their four losses have all come to decent teams on the road and when you are in the tournament all games are basically on the road.

I am a nutty Wildcat (UK) fan so I will be rooting against you.

Chris Cuozzo asks: I am a fan and a bettor, and I would like your thoughts on the stretch drive of Larry Stalbaum on Mr Cool Seaerye N in the Saratoga Open Handicap Trot 2/16/20. In my view Mr. Stalbaum did not want to be second. My guess, the connections wanted to get some money off his card so he could race for more money at Yonkers and with lesser competition?

I love conspiracy theories. Driving a horse in no way is comparable to driving a car. I will agree that to those without the knowledge the drive could have been construed as questionable. That said Larry was trapped with nowhere to go until he got an opening on the inside in the stretch. It happened so quickly that he really had no time to get his horse going. He couldn't have reacted by throwing the lines at the horse and risking a break that late in the mile. Another possibility is that there are some horses that absolutely refuse to pass a horse on the inside.

To end your conspiracy theory, the horse did not go to Yonkers but remained in Saratoga and raced back in the same class and finished fourth. There is no rest of the story...

Al Miller shares life lessons learned from standardbred ownership with grandson Brackton

One of those lessons Miller learned from his father, who told him, "If you can't be the winner, at least stand by the side and cheer as the winner goes by."

Whenever Al Miller offers up life lesson advice to his grandson, Brackton, it's a good bet they'll be plenty of horse racing analogies within the conversation.

What could an upcoming freshman year at Davenport University have in common with standardbred ownership?

Plenty, according to the Indiana horseman who has been part of the sport for nearly 50 years.

"I like to say to Brackton, 'Owning a horse is just like every day life... the highs are very high and the lows are very low.' He's going to (Grand Rapids) Michigan for his first year of college, and I'm sure that just like everyone else, he'll find out that those words are true."

Al Miller has known that ever since he owned his first racehorse in the early 1970s.

Born to Amish parents, Miller eventually moved to Indiana, bringing with him a longstanding appreciation and fondness for all things equine.

He owned his first standardbred when he was a teenager.

"We kind of, what they called, 'jumped the fence,' and took our buggy horses and made racehorses out of them," said Miller. "I've been owning horses since I was about 18 or 19."

While the number of horses he's owned has varied from year-to-year, Miller, who has also driven and trained standardbreds, currently has a one-horse stable.

Middleofamemory, a 3-year-old Indiana-bred daughter of Riggins, had three starts in 2019, all coming at Hoosier Park.

The bay, bred by Chapel Ridge Farm, in Grabill, IN, finished seventh in each race, all contested in October.

"I'm down to just one or two horses a year," said Miller. "One of them forgot he was a racehorse, so he's pulling a buggy now."

The veteran horseman is hoping Middleofamemory isn't buggy-bound.

"We got her ready last year a 2-year-old, raced her three times, and she acted like she wasn't mature enough. So, we turned her out for a while, and now we're getting her ready. Hopefully, she does better this year. If not, I whispered in her ear, 'You know, the buggies are pretty close."

Whether she establishes herself or not, Miller isn't ready to hang up his tack when it comes to horse ownership.

Not when he has his lifelong passion to share with others.

"When Brackton was 13, he was racing what are considered standardbred-cross ponies... they can't be over 52 inches tall. You can race them when you're younger. We got one and he did really well with it. But I told him, 'Brackton, you gotta get a standardbred. These ponies, it costs the same to shoe them, the harness costs the same – everything costs the same.' But the purses are only around \$50. I told him that if he likes doing this, we have to make a change."

And that's what precisely what they did.

Just over two year ago, Miller bought Shes Too Gucci, an unraced 2-year-old filly. He took Brackton to Dojea Stables to take a look at the trotting daughter of Guccio.

For the first few months, Miller jogged the bay, getting a helping hand from with Brackton when he had time off from his studies and high school basketball games.

"Even though he was young, you could tell he liked the horses. That hasn't changed since then. Together, we've found it's a lot of fun owning horses. When you're in school, it's hard to do anything outside of focusing on your education. But this, it's just nice to have something to do together."

Even if winning with an odd-on favourite is no slam-dunk.

"I told Brackton it's just like basketball, when the game or the race is over you have to turn the page because you can't dwell on it. He does that and so do I. When you're younger you do tend to dwell on it, but you have to move on."

Miller can use Whole Lotta Speed as a perfect example of what he preaches.

Sent off as the 1-9 choice in an Indiana Sires Stakes event, in what appeared to be a sure win – both before and after the gate swung open – soon turned to disappointment.

"She was in, I believe it was a \$100,000 sires stakes final," said Miller. "We put a brand new pair of knee boots on her because you really want to be ready for a race like that. Well, the suspender broke, and it wrapped around her legs. The driver had to pull her to the outside and my wife turned to me and said, 'Man, I was already smelling those roses.' She didn't even finish the race because the suspenders wouldn't unwrap. They just slowed her down. We look back now and laugh.

"Then there's other times when you win a race at 50-1 and you can't believe it. It's just like life. But we've been blessed.

I've had lots of good memories over the years."

Not that it's always been easy.

Miller has seen the sport go through several twists and turns over his six decades in it.

"The biggest things for me is keeping the horses sound with the speeds that they are going, and to keep them classified. You need to keep them classified to make money. With the little guy, it's tough to just survive at one racetrack because if you run out of conditions, you'll have to ship them east or somewhere where there's a little variety in terms of the conditions. I used to have horses up to six-, seven-, and eight-years-old, but it seems likes with our sires stakes, once they're out of there, if they're good they can go on, but if not, it gets tough to keep them classified."

Approaching 70, Miller still finds plenty to keep him coming back every year.

"The outside of a horse is really good for the inside of a man," he offered, quoting the famous line of Winston Churchill. "I love horses, and the passion is still there. Once the fire in my belly leaves, then I think it's time to head to the seashore and watch the time roll by."

Until then, you'll find grandfather and grandson standing side-by-side along the rail at Hoosier Park.

"I think everybody here in Indiana wishes everybody the best. It might not be quite as good as it used to be, but I still think it's great. If someone is down and out, people are willing to help. I think it's still a family-type atmosphere amongst the horsepeople."

And a sport that has a seemingly endless amount of lessons to draw upon.

"My dad always told me, 'If you can't be the winner, at least stand by the side and cheer as the winner goes by.' I still try and instill that in my family. You might not win that race, but you never know... it might be you the next time."

Belina Josselyn ended her career on top with Prix de Paris victory

French queen of the tracks Belina Josselyn (Love You) claimed the last of the three Grand Prix-races at Vincennes during the 2019/2020 winter meeting.

The chestnut colored 9-year-old won the 2019 Prix d'Amérique and also followed that success by winning \$380,750 Prix de Paris one month later.

This season has been almost as good as last year's and when the Prix de Paris was scheduled at Vincennes last Sunday, trainer and driver Jean-Michel Bazire had everything in perfect shape regarding Belina Josselyn.

Over the solid distance of approximately 2.6 miles, Bazire gave his lady a perfect cover trip in outside position and when the heavy distance began to put its marks on the contenders, Belina Josselyn once again showed that she's one of the most versatile trotters in the world. In the last turn she flew three wide and at the beginning of the stretch, Bazire noted that he was several lengths ahead of the chasers and Belina Josselyn won easily in a mile rate 1:59.3.

Recalls made many trotters stressed when the race went on and Belina Josselyn's stablemate Davidson du Pont was not relaxed enough for running two laps on the big track in Paris, so his day ended in disqualification after an early break.

Tony Gio finished strongly for second place and Earl Simon took home the bronze medal.

Belina Josselyn made her last performance at the track with this start and it's like a fairy tale that she even came back in this condition after her serious injury after the winter meeting last year.

Belina Josselyn won the \$121,800 Prix de Belgique on Jan. 12, finished third in Prix d'Amérique two weeks later and made a break in Prix de France before she could end her magnificent career with a win in the Prix de Paris.

Her 74 career starts resulted in 23 victories and lifetime earnings of \$2,848,991.

"I'll never get in contact with a mare like Belina Josselyn again," said Bazire after the victory in Prix de Paris on Sunday afternoon.

Face Time Bourbon closes the meeting

Saturday (Feb. 29) is the last day of the French winter meeting and traditionally the \$217,000 Prix de Selection closes the game for this season.

The Prix de Selection is open for 4-, 5- and 6-year-olds where the youngest trotters starts 25 meters ahead of the 5- and 6-year-olds, but this year, no 4-year-olds wanted to enter the race, which means that all eight contenders will start from distance 2,200 meters. It seems like Sébastien Guarato trained Prix d'Amérique winner Face Time Bourbon has a great shot to win the race for the second time.

A closer look at the pedigree of Shartin N, the 2019 Horse of the Year

In researching my book on the maternal lines of standardbreds called *Queen Among Queens* I found a book called *Patterns Of Greatness* by Alan Porter, a book about thoroughbred breeding. There was one quotation in there that spurred my interest in the evolution of maternal lines and the influence of special individuals. He urged breeders to "delve deeply" into a pedigree to discover the underlying genetic strengths which are not readily apparent in the first few generations. As he said: "This can reveal that one particular background cross has been built up to a point where it dominates a pedigree and reaches a critical mass reinforcing vital genes to the point where they explode in the form or a dynamic performer."

Shartin N is a perfect example of this scenario.

He further speculated that close inbreeding maternally can bring about positive mutations as he referenced Marianna Haun's book on the X-factor, a genetic inheritance carried on the X-chromosome of the mares on the maternal line.

That may sound a bit airy-fairy to most readers, but it has been a key consideration of mine since reading and writing about it and indeed was a factor in my recommendation to purchase McWicked, the 2018 Horse Of The Year by McArdle. Now we have a similar situation with the 2019 winner of the Dan Patch Horse Of The Year in Shartin N. It is a long story so bear with me because in part it goes back to the very beginnings of the standardbred breed maternally to a daughter of Bartlets Childers, foundation sire of the thoroughbred and to his full brother Flying Childers, the founder of the standardbred breed. To read the full story of these individuals you can find it in *Queen Among Queens* available by download from the pedigreematching.com website.

In the near term, the pedigree of Shartin N revolves around the presence of Tar Heel maternally as it did with McWicked, and as indeed it did for many of McArdle's top performers since it is the most consistent factor in his stallion profile. Shartin N is by a son of McArdle called Tintin In America, who like McArdle also has a maternal line that is dominated by the influence of Tar Heel, one of the best broodmare sires of the past 50 years, and appears in the maternal lines of other great broodmare sires such as Albatross and Bret Hanover.

Tar Heel's influence on maternal lines comes from his dam by Volomite whose dam was by San Francisco whose own

dam was Oniska, a 2x3 maternal inbred to the X-factor influence through Lida W, a daughter of Nutwood, the best son of Miss Russell, the subject of my book *Queen Among Queens*.

Shartin N's dam, Bagdarin, goes back seven generations to a mare called Protege by Jack Potts who was one of the first great broodmare sires Down Under and his dam was by Steiner from a daughter of Nutwood called Miss Marjoe. The dam of Protege was Abyssinia who brings a maternal trace through the dam of World Champion Arion whose dam was Manette by Nutwood. Protege, therefore is an X-factor double to Miss Russell, a pretty good starting point.

Protege had one daughter, Chenault, by U Scott who was then bred to Bachelor Hanover whose maternal family is one of the top maternal families in Minnehaha that is also one of the longest since it is the one that goes all the way back to that daughter of Bartlets Childers in the late 1600's.

The mating of Bachelor Hanover to Chenault produced Bravine, Shartin's fifth dam. By coincidence, perhaps, the fourth dam of Tintin In America, Zenover, was a descendant of one of the best maternal families in Australia/New Zealand and she too was by Bachelor Hanover and from a mare by U Scott. That makes Shartin N an X-factor double to its source, the ancestral mom herself, The Spanker Mare. But that is just another component of her maternal strength, there is much more added in the next three generations that built up into the explosion that is Chartin N.

Bravine foaled Kiatina by Fallacy whose maternal line contributed a North American link to the X-factor through two daughters of American Star. Kiatina was then bred to

Noodlum, a son of Bachelor Hanover, whose maternal line brings in another trace to American Star through the dam of World Champion Dexter, the fastest son of Hambletonian, as well as doubling up the family of Minnehaha.

The breeding to Noodlum produced Kinsale, third dam of Shartin N, and she had six daughters but only two of them, both daughters of Save Fuel, had success as broodmares, and that was when the pedigree met up with Meadow Skipper for the first time through Save Fuel's dam by that sire.

Slatina is the second dam of Shartin N and her full sister is Chivasso who, when bred to McArdle, produced the first decent performer in this entire maternal line to date in McDana N who made \$165,000 mostly in the United States. She now has another of her sons, Italian Delight N, a recent import, currently racing in Yonkers Open competition as a result of two wins at the Meadowlands taking a record of 1.50.1.

Slatina was bred to Live Or Die whose dam, Mica Lobell, is an X-factor double to Tar Heel, and whose maternal line goes back to yet another daughter of Nutwood called Stray Moments and three more traces to American Star. This was exactly the kind of breeding needed to provide the fuel for the fire lit by Tintin In America in the breeding to Bagdarin, the first female in the maternal line to beat 2:00 with a win in 1.57.4.

Tintin In America has a dam that is a maternal X-factor double to Tar Heel and as a filly Shartin N inherits that bonus to her own maternal traces to Tar Heel through her own dam. This is in addition to the interesting X-factor doubles to Bachelor Hanover and to Meadow Skipper.

In recent times, I have also noticed two pedigree patterns, which I code as DD or TB, that occur often in top individuals. Shartin N is an example of the TB pattern where the Adios/Hal Dale sire line of McArdle is inbred in her dam through sons of Adios and Good Time for an added bonus.

This affinity of Tintin In America for Tar Heel maternally is evident in his best performers with the next best, also a filly,

bred in similar fashion but perhaps not with the same long term build up maternally. His sire, McArdle, shows the same affinity for Tar Heel with the vast majority of his best being from mares that are X-factor doubles to Tar Heel or are X-factor doubles themselves as a result of McArdles own maternal doubles to Tar Heel in his each of his first three dams.

McWicked had the added benefit of having a DD pedigree pattern where the maternal lines in his dam are the same as those in his own dam and those of his sire. The DD pattern has also produced such recent champions as Greenshoe, Six Pack, Manchego, Mission Brief, Gimpanzee, Hannelore Hanover and Always B Miki among others while TB patterned champions include Jimmy Freight, Warrawee Ubeaut, and several of the best by Muscle Hill including Marion Marauder, Propulsion, and Green Manalishi.

My fascination with the Tar Heel influence, in addition to supporting my recommendation to buy McWicked as a result of four of his first five dams being double copies to Tar Heel or his dam-sire Volomite, pointed me to my first and only credit as a breeder. That was in the form of Scarlet Chaser. from a mare inbred to Tar Heel. His sire was Hussy Chaser, a colt I bought as a yearling for \$1,500 on the strength of him being from a mare that was also an x-factor inbred to Tar Heel, and he went on to be the second richest Maritime bred in his day earning over \$520,000. I got him back when he retired and then looked for the right mare, one with the Tar Heel double and found one in Lucky Hare, a daughter of Precious Bunny. The resulting colt, Scarlet Chaser, retired last year after making over \$240,000 and being race timed in 1:49.4 to become the fastest race-timed colt ever bred on PEI and the fastest and richest Island bred colt by an Island based sire.

King plans shorter season for Shartin N in 2020

No one needs to worry about Shartin N resting on her laurels, although she might get to relax a little more this year than her previous two seasons.

In 2018, Shartin N made at least one start in every month from January through November on her way to the first million-dollar season for a pacing mare and a Dan Patch Award for best older female pacer.

Last year, she made at least one start in every month from March through November. She won 15 of 19, finished second on three occasions, earned \$982,177, set the record (1:46.4) for the fastest mile ever by a female pacer, and was named top pacing mare, Pacer of the Year, and Horse of the Year.

She became the first pacing mare in history to be named Horse of the Year, as well as the first horse bred outside North America to receive the honor.

The 7-year-old New Zealand import is already working toward her return to the races, which is expected to come next week at Dover Downs. Then it's off to Yonkers Raceway's Blue Chip Matchmaker Series, a six-week event that Shartin N has won each of the past two years. Following the Matchmaker, which begins March 13 and ends April 18, trainer Jim King Jr. will look to give Shartin N some time off.

"We've decided to try to give her a split year instead of trying to go all the way through the year," King said. "If that works out, when we get done with the Matchmaker hopefully we can give her a pretty good break and then get her back ready to take off from there. It won't be a real long break, but there are some races that we're going to try to miss.

"If she can be good early and be good late, she can still accomplish a lot. That's a lot to ask of a horse that you just got done racing for 10 months, twice. But so far, she hasn't minded me doing foolish things."

Shartin N, bred in New Zealand by Grant Crabbe, was purchased in the fall of 2017 by Richard Poillucci. She is now owned by Poillucci, Jo Ann Looney-King, and Tim Tetrick LLC.

Since arriving in North America, Shartin N has won 34 of 43 races and \$2.03 million.

"It's just absolutely amazing for us to be in a position to buy a Down Under mare and become Horse of the Year," Poillucci said. "I was just hoping for a nice open mare. This has far exceeded all expectations. What she's done at that level of racing is unbelievable. To keep them on their toes in those kinds of miles is a very difficult task.

"I think that's what most impresses me, her ability to carry speed the way she does and standout in races where they're going (fast fractions) and she's still charging. Horses don't do that stuff on a regular basis."

Tetrick has driven Shartin N in all her North American starts.

"She was pretty tough (to handle) when she started," Tetrick said during this past Sunday's Dan Patch Awards banquet, when the Horse of the Year announcement was made. "But she had big lungs and you couldn't get her tired. When she was on her game she was as good as any horse I've ever sat behind. She has a ton of speed and grit. She had a mind of her own, but she worked with us and we got it done."

Shartin N qualified on Feb. 19 at Dover Downs, winning in 1:51.3. Poillucci called the qualifier "absolutely perfect."

"Here it comes again," King said, referring to a new season. "Every indication is that she's come back very good."

Shartin N will attempt to become the first horse to repeat as Horse of the Year since trotting mare Moni Maker in 1998-99 and the first pacer to repeat since Cam Fella in 1982-83. She finished second to McWicked in balloting for 2018 Horse of the Year and, according to noted harness racing historian Bob "Hollywood" Heyden, is the first since Matt's Scooter in 1989 to be runner-up one year and come back the next season to receive Horse of the Year.

"I just want to say thank you to all the voters, and most of all thank you to Shartin," King said Sunday at the banquet,

USHWA concludes annual meetings with Dan Patch banquet

The annual meetings of the United States Harness Writers Association (USHWA), the sport's leading media organization, were held this past weekend at the Rosen Shingle Creek Resort in Orlando FL, with the weekend climaxing in Sunday's Dan Patch Awards Banquet honoring the top performers, equine and human, during the past 2019 season.

Saturday's USHWA meeting gathered together the group's Board of Directors, while Sunday's session was an open event for all of USHWA's members.

Positive numbers for USHWA were reported by several Officers and committee chairpeople. The Association reported a profit for the fourth straight year, with the prospects of a fifth straight growth period looking good, as USHWA's financial status is largely determined by the annual Dan Patch Banquet, and high-level performance in both sponsorship participation and ads taken in the popular Souvenir Banquet Journal were very promising.

Also a good sign is that the membership of USHWA, declining a few members a year in a contracting industry in recent times, actually showed a small increase since last year's meetings.

The annual By-Law and Rules & Regulations Change Proposals did not offer some of the controversy and heated exchanges of recent years, although both sides were argued well on a couple of contentious issues. One By-Law change that went into effect right away was the method by which the Directors established the two ballot candidates for this summer's Communicators Hall of Fame elections, and as reported earlier Jay Bergman and Joseph Kyle were selected from a talented field to take a place on the election ballot.

Sunday's General Membership saw the 26 USHWA directors in attendance joined by a similar number of members from the Active membership ranks. The greater portion of the Sunday meeting was devoted to the Committee reports of some two dozen USHWA subdivisions which keep all aspects

of the organization in working order throughout the year, from Hall of Fame candidate biography compilation, to traffic control during the Dan Patch Banquet, to oversight of various phases of social media usage.

Kim Rinker, the director of the Ohio Standardbred Development Fund, was elected president of the organization during the Sunday meeting. Rinker, who had been vice president, succeeds Shawn Wiles of Monticello Raceway, who by USHWA bylaw now becomes the chairman of the board.

In a contested election for USHWA vice-president, Barry Lefkowitz, the USHWA treasurer, narrowly defeated Derick Giwner of *Daily Racing Form Harness*. Lefkowitz said that he would retain his treasurer's duties as well during this term.

Both Wiles and Lefkowitz were presented with Gold Lifetime Membership pins during the General Meeting: Wiles as an outgoing President, and Lefkowitz, for the required years of service on the Board as treasurer.

Jerry Connors was again voted USHWA secretary.

At the Dan Patch Awards Banquet, pacing mare Shartin N was announced as the 2019 Harness Horse of the Year, which was met with wild cheers from her many and vociferous backers in attendance. Shartin N becomes the first older pacing mare to win Horse of the Year honors, and also the first horse bred outside of North America to take the United States' highest award. "She's certainly been a life changer for us," noted trainer Jim King Jr. at the banquet.

Greenshoe, the brilliant 3-year-old colt, was named Trotter of the Year; Trotter, Pacer, and Horse of the Year were the only awards being announced for the first time at the dinner. Greenshoe now goes off to a stud career at Hanover Shoe Farms, while Shartin N has already posted a winning qualifier in front of a 2020 campaign.

The highest human award given by USHWA, the Stan Bergstein-Proximity Award, resulted in a voting dead-heat for the first time in its 69-year history. The members of the Association voted equal honors to the contributions made by Joe Faraldo, the president and CEO of the Standardbred Owners Association of New York, an important member of the U.S. Trotting Association's Board of Directors, and a staunch advocate of horsemen's rights, and the Libfeld-Katz partnership of owners/breeders Al Libfeld and Marvin Katz, Ontarians who have ranked at the top levels of both of those fields of racing and also sponsored the Breeders Crown races when they came to their hometown Mohawk track this past year and held a successful charity tie-in.

Also honored at the Dan Patch Banquet were newly-voted

Hall of Famers Tom Charters, Jeff Gural, Bill Popfinger, and Tim Tetrick, along with Communicators Hall of Famers Phil Pikelny and Ken Weingartner. This group will be formally inducted into their respective Halls of Fame on Sunday, July 5 at the site of the sport's Hall, Goshen NY.

Pick-6 a hit in Big M return

On Feb. 7, management at the Meadowlands gave their wagering menu a big shakeup, and while the early returns on the new 20-cent-base Pick-5 and additional 50-cent Pick-4 have been solid, the bet that's provided the biggest jolt of energy has been the 20-cent Pick-6, which looks fresh off a considerable layoff.

"When you go back to the days when the Pick-6 was a staple at many tracks," said Big M chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemoir. "You have to remember that when the bet was flourishing, the multi-race options were the Daily Double and the Pick-3. What happened was, as those racetracks added Pick-4s and Pick-5s to their wagering menus, the Pick-6 got lost in the shuffle."

The Pick-6 is now back and it's experiencing a renaissance at the Big M.

When the Meadowlands last offered a Pick-6 in 2012, the Opening Night pool of \$3,302 created a one-day carryover of \$1,975. The next night saw a pool of \$2,610 and a two-day carryover of \$3,534. Remarkably, one week later, the four-day carryover had only reached \$8,435.

Three weeks ago, the first Pick-6 pool of this era was \$17,985, or five times more than the initial 2012 pot. The next night, the pool expanded to \$24,474 and one sharp player had the only winning ticket and walked away with \$20,797. That's quite a before (\$5,912) and after (\$42,549) when comparing the first two pools during the different eras.

On Saturday (Feb. 15), in only the fourth time the Pick-6 was offered, the bet failed to yield a ticket with all six winners, creating a carryover (the first in eight years) of \$14,376 that served as the catalyst for a total pool of just over \$91,000 after \$76,682 in "new money" was wagered the following Friday. Since the carryover money is "rake free", bettors were actually wagering into a rare "player's advantage". Instead of a takeout, the bettor's edge was 3 percent.

"When the Meadowlands decided to bring back the Pick-6, it had to be a better version that would allow people to participate without waiting weeks for the carryover to build

up," said Settlemoir. "We wanted to go with the traditional no-jackpot format. The 2020 version would lower the minimum to 20 cents and lowered the takeout to 15 percent. It didn't take very long to realize that the new version of the Meadowlands' Pick-6 was a hit."

The popularity of the Pick-6 is continuing to build momentum. The most recent pool was its biggest yet, as \$29,150 was pushed through the windows on Feb. 22.

"So far, the revamped version of the Pick-6 has exceeded all expectations," said Settlemoir. "And the new wagering menu has definitely brought new eyes to the Meadowlands product. The 20-cent Pick-5 (\$75,544 on Feb. 22) and Late 50-cent Pick-4 (\$75,592 on Feb. 21) also established season highs last weekend."

Other wagering highlights from last weekend include:

- All-source total handles of \$2.68 million on both Friday and Saturday
- Average handle per race for the 26-race weekend of \$206,806
 - An Early Pick-4 pool of \$89,159 on Saturday

REMINDER: The Meadowlands races every Friday and Saturday with a first race post time of 6:55 p.m. The live "Racing from the Meadowlands" simulcast show gets underway at 6:22 p.m. Joining Dave Brower this weekend on set will be Tioga and Vernon Downs' TV personality Brett Risi.

The wagering menu includes the 20-cent Pick-5 (race one), which has a guaranteed pool of \$25,000; 20-cent Pick-6 (race four); 50-cent Early Pick-4 (race six), which has a \$50,000 guarantee; and 50-cent Late Pick-4 (race 10). All four wagers offer a low 15 percent takeout.

Free program pages for the Early Pick-4 and Late 20-cent Jackpot Super High-Five are available at **ustrotting.com_**and **playmeadowlands.com**.

PICK-6 CLARIFICATION:Payouts for the Pick-6 are done in this fashion:

- When there are ticket(s) with six winners, all the money in the pool (minus the 15 per cent takeout) is returned to those winners
- When there are no tickets with six winners, 25 per cent of the pool is paid out to those with five winners (a "consolation"). Then, 75 per cent is carried over to the next time the wager is offered.

WISHES IT WAS ALWAYS FEBRUARY:Last year, Yannick Gingras crushed the Meadowlands like Godzilla during February, winning seven races on Feb. 1 followed by a

six-bagger the next night. He finished the month with a ridiculous 33 wins.

While he hasn't been quite as dominant during the second month of 2020, he has been dominant, nonetheless. The 40-year-old pilot ripped it up last weekend, winning five races on both Friday and Saturday, to up his monthly total to 19 with two race cards remaining.

Trainer Ron Burke also excelled last weekend, sending out seven winners, five of which were handled by his go-to driver Gingras.

WHHC QUALIFIER:On Saturday (March 7), the Big M will play host to its March World Harness Handicapping Championship Qualifier. The top two finishers will qualify for the WHHC Final. It's only \$200 to play (\$100 to enter; \$100 bankroll). For complete information, go to playmeadowlands.com.

AGCO rule revisions and revised licensing and administration fees

In preparation for the launch of iAGCO online services for horse racing licensees in March, the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) has:

• Revised the *Rules of Thoroughbred Racing* and the *Rules of Standardbred Racing* to reduce regulatory burden and harmonize processes between breeds where possible. The

rule revisions take effect on March 2, 2020 and reflect a number of process changes that will be implemented once iAGCO online services launch for horse racing licensees.

• Revised the fee schedule for all breeds. While the majority of fees will stay the same, a select few will be amended to reflect a number of process changes that will be implemented once the AGCO launches iAGCO online services for horse racing licensees. Fee changes will take effect on March 2, 2020. In alignment with fee schedule revisions, the AGCOis also introducing multi-breed licensing in select licence categories, which will allow applicants to apply for one licence valid across multiple breeds.

A rambunctious colt from the Muscles Yankee mare ANKLETS AWEIGH 2, 1:57 (\$94,626), was born Feb. 13 at Ruddick Stables in Indiana. Already the dam of three stakes winning, 2:00 2-year-olds (two by Chapter Seven), this foal is a half-brother to Twin B Alibi 1:56.3f (\$111,583).

Enterprise was trained by 2019 Dan Patch Trainer of the Year Marcus Melander and won half of his 12 starts in 2017, including an elimination of the Hambletonian at the Meadowlands, as well as a leg of the New York Sire Stakes at

Vernon, and an elimination of the Goodtimes at Mohawk.

Enterprise finished fourth, placed third in the \$1,000,000 final of the Hambletonian, and has won on all sized tracks, including a 1:55.4h victory against older horses at Yonkers.

She is a Western Hanover daughter of world champion and Hall of Fame mare Eternal Camnation p,1:49.2 (\$3,748,574). The filly was foaled out at Pine Hill Stables of Cohocton, NY.

Standing his second season at Leatherstocking Equine in New York, In The Arsenal's stud fee remains at \$2,500.

Returning breeders from 2019, whose mares produced a live foal in 2020 by In The Arsenal, will be eligible to book the same mare, or another mare, at a discounted rate of \$2,000.

In addition, at the conclusion of the 2020 breeding season, the syndicate will hold a Facebook live drawing to pick one successful breeder where the stud fee will be free for one lucky person, drawn by lot.

In The Arsenal earned \$1,035,898 racing against some of the fastest pacers on the planet, capturing 18 wins lifetime, finding victory in a nearly a third of all his starts.

The following week, In The Arsenal finished second in the Breeders Crown Final, again from post 10, despite being interfered with in the early going.

In The Arsenal was then immersed in one of the toughest group of 3-year-old pacing colts in recent memory. Not only was he born the same year as 2015 Horse of the Year Wiggle It Jiggleit, but In The Arsenal also competed against Freaky Feet Pete, Artspeak, Dude's The Man, Lost For Words, Dealt A Winner and Wakizashi Hanover.

In The Arsenal defeated several of the aforementioned pacing colts winning his elimination of the Meadowlands Pace in 1:49.1, stepping away from the field with an incredible :25.3 last quarter.
