Tetrick (right, with Louis-Philippe Roy at Woodbine Mohawk Park) compares favorably with the numbers put up by baseball legend Babe Ruth.

Holy cow! He drove and owns (with partners) the Horse of the Year, Shartin N, and he will be enshrined in the Harness Racing Hall of Fame in July. Tim Tetrick's dream year of 2019 has flipped over into 2020. Let's take a look at some numbers that now apply to the most recent driver inducted into the Hall Of Fame.

1. Herve Filion in 1974 was the last driver before Tetrick to own both the earnings and the wins titles all-time, simultaneously. He had 637 wins and \$3,474,315. Tetrick accomplished the feat in 2007 with 1,189 victories and \$18,350,047. He then increased that to \$19,752,066 in 2008, and that record still stands today, as does his wins record from 2007.

2. Tetrack is now 38, and goes into the Hall Of Fame in July. Stanley Dancer was 41 in July, 1969 upon entrance and Billy Haughton 44 the year before that.

3. Tetrack has won a Hambletonian elimination four straight seasons. No driver not named Tetrack has won a Hambletonian elimination three straight years at the Meadowlands in 39 years.

4. These are the margins that Tetrack has led with in driver earnings for each of his nine seasons out in front:

2007 – \$4,982,223 over Ron Pierce

2008 – \$3,084,976 over Brian Sears

2009 – \$3,398,864 over Pierce

2010 – \$3,872,117 over George Brennan

2011 – \$1,316,015 over Brennan

2012 – \$4,785,631 over Yannick Gingras

2013 – \$1,933,346 over Gingras

2018 – \$1,774,771 over Gingras

2019 – \$2,229,590 over Gingras

5. Tetrack remains the only driver to win 1,000 races and capture a million-dollar race in the same year. In 2007, he twice won a seven-figure event with Southwind Lynx, in the Rooney and the Meadowlands Pace.

6. Tetrack's 2007-2008 totals combined, the most ever in the sport's history for a two-year period, was \$38,102,113. By comparison, Billy Haughton's *scareer* total was \$40,160,336.

7. Tetrack's 2,092 combined wins for the 2007-2008 season was the all-time record at the time – 1,189 in 2007 followed by 903 in 2008. Aaron Merriman smashed that mark by recording 2,238 total wins in 2017 and 2018 combined – 1,095 wins in 2017 and 1,143 wins in 2018.

8. Here's a comparison between Babe Ruth and Tim Tetrack:

- At The conclusion of the 2019 dream season with both a HOY and a Hall Of Fame nod, Tetrack had won a race in 22 straight seasons, starting 1/20 in 1998. Ruth played in 22 seasons, starting out in 1914 2 for 10 as a hitter and 2-1 as a pitcher and finishing with the Boston Braves in 1935.

- Ruth set the record in 1920-1921 for home runs in consecutive seasons at 113. Each total was the highest ever single-season number at the time also – 54 in 1920 followed by 59 in 1921. Tetrack in 2007-2008 set the record for earnings in a single season in consecutive seasons in

2007-2008 of \$38,102,113 – \$18,350,047, followed by \$19,752,066. Ruth was 25 and then 26 in 1920 and 1921. Tetrack was 26 and then 27 in 2007-2008

- Ruth's batting average in 1920 and 1921 was .376 and .378 for an average of .377. Tetrack's driving UDRS in 2007 and 2008 was .388 and .355 for an average of .372.

- Each did something several years later to add to their power-packed bio. Ruth in 1927 hit 60 home runs, thus owning the three highest home run totals in baseball history. Tetrack, in 2012, had a \$18,529,676 campaign, thus owning the three highest single-season earnings totals in harness racing history. No baseball player since has owned the top three home run seasons of all time in the 93 years since. No harness driver in the past eight years has approached Tetrack's three seasons and they remain the top three earnings seasons by a driver of all time.

Modernize, not abolish, licensing for fractional ownership

NOTE: The Proposal for Implementation of a Fractional Ownership License created by TheStable.ca in July 2019 and referenced in this column can be [read in its entirety here](#).

I have watched the back and forth with Mr. Pearce and Mr. Gurfein about licensing and I respectfully disagree with both gentlemen ([full story here](#)).

No one spends more on licensing in North America than thestable.ca and I was the one that lobbied to have the threshold changed in Ontario from 5 per cent to 1 one per cent.

Why would anyone lobby to pay more money? This has nothing to do with what's easy, and everything to do with what's right (and at the same time, reasonable).

Unfortunately, all of us are under the thumb of a government in one way or another. People in Pennsylvania may understand this more now as Ontarians should also from their recent past.

When a bureaucrat decides that money earmarked for the horse racing industry could be spent better elsewhere, there

is a thin line of defense between that transaction taking place and not.

This is an argument that is usually won or lost in the court of public opinion.

Our defense is always in our numbers:

- The economic impact which the government's investment in horse racing has on our communities.
- The spinoff attributed to that investment.
- How big our industry actually is, and how that information is compiled.
- An accurate and measurable level of participation.

If we don't track all our numbers accurately, they will be seen as guessing, and the data will be unusable in the eyes of the government.

When Ontario was under attack, our industry put forth conflicting numbers and the government used their own.

It was the Pearl Harbor of racing and it was one of the scariest times of my life. There will always be people that get angry because horse racing receives public funding in one form or another, but as long as we can show and prove its usefulness in society — at least from an economic stance — we will always have an argument to make.

Pennsylvania has done a great job taking the fight to the governor immediately and hopefully averting his feeble attempt at robbing Peter to pay Paul. This argument could only be stronger though with an accurate depiction of ownership.

You should not take this lightly as this won't be the last time they come for the money and we should be ready, because once it's gone, it's gone for good.

I will also be the first to agree that it needs to be more economical to be an active owner.

From a fractional ownership perspective, New York is one of the most expensive states in which to race. We raced a horse that had 26 fractional owners in New York last year.

Everyone was excited about the year ahead with their young horse. It was a win-win for the industry and our group... until it came time to get licensed.

It was going to cost our clients over \$5,000 collectively to be licensed for that one horse in New York.

Not surprisingly, the ownership group quickly shrank and it became clear that this was a state we would love to race in, but we simply couldn't.

I agree there needs to be a collaborative overhaul of the licensing practices of horse racing in general. That is why we created a fractional ownership licensing proposal in 2019. We floated it to all jurisdictions and had lots of interest in pushing the model from key stakeholders in our industry.

But like a bill in Congress, it's collecting dust.

The purpose of the proposal was to raise awareness of the current complications and barriers that exist with horse ownership licensing; specifically for those entering the industry as fractional owners, and to propose improvements to help the industry flourish.

Our experience has demonstrated that the current licensing model is not sustainable for fractional owners; it is a major

roadblock in our ability to deliver a good experience for our existing clients and hinders our ability to attract new ones.

We are NOT asking to alter or reduce the fee for any existing horse owner license. We are respectfully proposing the implementation of an efficient, modern and proportionate licensing system for fractional ownership across all jurisdictions. We are asking for the implementation of a Fractional Ownership License.

Abolition is not the way forward.

Higher thresholds sure make my job easier, but again they won't help the industry overall.

We need to understand what's at stake, and work to ensure there are multiple avenues and affordable ways to participate in horse racing across the board.

I have spoken at Nauseum about what kind of role fractional ownership can play in helping this industry grow. To do that, we need to start understanding the barriers in front of us and start taking them down. Licensing is a major problem – on that point, I agree with Mr. Pearce and Mr. Gurfein.

How we address it will make all the difference in the world.

Dave Drew's dream drive

Canadian representative wins one race at successful 2020 Amateur World Cup Championship.

The 2020 Amateur World Cup Championship wrapped up Feb. 24, with the driving title awarded to Piet Van Pollaert of Belgium Tuesday night at Pompano Park. He guided trainer Jennifer Petrelli's Young American and Sun Belle Slippery to gate-to-wire victories on the second, all-pacing, night of competition. Van Pollaert's vocal supporters sported identical t-shirts trackside as they raucously cheered "Piet!" home in each of his drives over the two nights.

Monday night's four World Cup races were trotters-only, and included the lone victory posted by Canada's Dave Drew. His first drive of the card was behind Ripped Up, but the mare jumped it off and finished last of seven in race 2, which was won by 19-1 Little Big Rigs and driver Andrea Sallustio of Italy.

Drew took a more aggressive approach in race 3, sending #8 Aquillo in instant pursuit of #6 Pembroke Yoyo (Van Pollaert). The extended battle took its toll, as Aquillo never cleared and ultimately faded from second to seventh. As Drew's trotter was dropping out of contention at the three-quarters, American representative Joe Pennacchio and Glide In The Wind were finally free to chase the leader home. The Wally Hennessey-owned/trained Glide In The Wind emerged a winning favorite at even money.

Aquillo had been walking quietly with Pompano outrider Camilla Olsson and mount Simon before the start. "The outrider, that was recommended by the trainer," said Drew.

"He expends a lot of energy, that horse, so just let him relax and go to the outrider. He trotted very well, just didn't have enough to get there and got parked out. I had to let him back off. The first race, I had a break, but that's just part of racing."

With one race remaining in Monday's Amateur World Cup events, Drew finally had his moment to shine. The Canadian representative took #8 Jurgen Hanover straight to the back of the pack in race 5, letting #2 Security Guard (Lukas Svedin - Sweden) and #3 Santini (Thomas Royer - Austria) battle for the early lead. Three-wide at the opening :28.2 quarter, #6 Stormy Dude (Andrea Fazekas-Hungary) charged around #5 BJAnthony (Miquel Vich Capo-Spain) to duel with Santini on the way to the :57.2 half.

"They're double-tiered – just six lengths front-to-back here," said announcer Gabe Prewitt, making it clear that anyone had a shot to win the last of the Amateur World Cup trot races – even Jurgen Hanover, who was last by about two lengths. The field stacked up four-wide ahead of him at the 1:27.4 three-quarters, but a patient Drew waited until others drifted wide in the stretch before giving Jurgen Hanover a few whip taps. The Gaston Lareau trainee, owned by Fort Lauderdale's Jp Houle Stables LLC, did the rest, powering away by more than 2 lengths to win in 1:58.3.

While Jurgen Hanover paid a generous \$10.10 for his fourth win in five starts this year, the vibrant winner's circle celebration reflected a different kind of payoff.

"A seam opened up there in the stretch, and the horse moved forward very well. He did it all by himself – he just took off," a proud Drew told HRU. "Close to the wire, I knew I had it."

A Canadian flag was held up for the winner's circle photos, as the driver sporting James MacDonald's winning colours design from the (non-amateur) 2017 World Driving Championships led the celebration. "I'm really happy, I look forward to tomorrow," said a smiling Drew. "It's just been an outstanding host group here. The Florida Amateur Driving Club has done an outstanding job in terms of hosting us and taking care of the drivers. [With group visits to] Gulfstream Park Sunday and Sunshine Meadows this morning, it's just fantastic reception and organization by the Florida amateur drivers."

Drew was also grateful for his supporters back in Canada, including the Central Ontario Standardbred Association (COSA). "They sponsored the driving suit. I'm a member and was a founding director, actually, and I'm very pleased that COSA helped support me with this. Bill O'Donnell, who is the president of COSA, is down here. He saw me between my second drive and my third, so maybe he brought me some

magic luck. I hope so."

Drew was officially presented with his driving colours Jan. 16 at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Tuesday evening, Drew had one drive in the four World Amateur Championship races. His horse in race 1, morning

line longshot #6 Best American Chic, was scratched sick, and he was not scheduled to drive in races 3 or 4. In race 2, he led the way with the Mark Major-trained, Michael and Diane Norcross-owned #2 Gemalous, until caught by pocket-sitter #1 Ok Ebury (Andrea Sallustio - Italy) in the race's final strides. An inquiry on the stretch drive did not affect the order of finish for the top two, who were both sent off at identical 6-1 odds. In a slightly ironic twist, the Canadian representative's horse finished second to Ok Ebury, the winning pacer owned and trained by fellow Canadian Luc Loyer of Gatineau, Quebec.

Best known for his association with 2014 O'Brien Pacing Horse of the Year Modern Legend (p, 6, 1:47.2s; \$958,132), Drew is currently a hands-on fractional racehorse owner with Mark and Shawn Steacy, but no longer trains. In addition to his involvement with amateur driving, which has taken Drew to racetracks across North America for Delvin Miller Harness Drivers Association and CKG Billings Driving Series events, he is an active participant with housing charity Habitat for Humanity. "I do that as a volunteer," he told HRU. "I do some building on the build sites, and also volunteer at the ReStores every week to help them out at their retail stores as well."

While Drew did not win the 2020 Amateur World Cup Championship, his participation was something of a win in its own right. He noted that Canada has not participated in past editions of the competition, making it more of an honor to wear the red maple leaf this February in Florida. Champion Piet Van Pollaert (Belgium), runner-up Andrea Sallustio (Italy), and third-place Andrea Fazekas (Hungary) earned the most points in the tournament. Drew dead-heated with Barbara Aebischer (Switzerland) for fifth overall among the 12 competing countries, behind host Florida Amateur Driving Club member/fourth-place finisher Joe Pennacchio (USA).

Amateur driving tournaments have been promoted as a successful way to improve participation in American harness racing, although organizers would like to see greater interest from contemporary media outlets. "We need more media, for sure," said Taylor Spriggs, daughter of Florida Amateur Driving Club president Dein Spriggs, who helped arrange the 2020 Amateur World Cup Championship at Pompano Park. "I think it helps for Florida to have more harness racing. It helps the harness racing sport, it helps bring newer drivers and amateur drivers into the sport, which helps it stay alive."

She observed that the competitions attract a wide range of non-professional horsepeople who enjoy the opportunity to get directly involved in racing. "A lot of new friends" meet through amateur racing in Florida and abroad, added Spriggs.

"It's definitely competitive, but it's friendly competition. A lot of the drivers, we've travelled with [them] in Europe and seen them internationally; to have them over here is really good for the sport."

The European Trotting Amateur-Drivers Federation (FEGAT) conducts championships for male and female drivers, plus a FEGAT Cup that alternates years with the World Championship Cup. "We're actually going over to Italy with a couple of other Florida Amateur Driving Club members in June," said Spriggs. "We'll be in an Italian tournament, and we're doing a racing series over there. [Dein Spriggs] will be driving there in June; I'm not sure the other American drivers are selected yet."

Although she's not competing, Taylor Spriggs will be among the cheering fans along the fence when her dad takes to the track, and also cheering for the future of amateur harness racing in Florida. "I warm up horses on occasion, so hopefully in the future," the aspiring amateur driver said, a shy smile on her face. "I hope it continues to be as popular as it is right now."

Face Time Bourbon dominates Vincennes, wins Prix de Selection

by Thomas Hedlund

Sébastien Guarato's Prix d'Amérique winner Face Time Bourbon (Ready Cash) was the heavy favorite when the \$217,000 Prix de Selection was held at Vincennes on the last race card of the French winter meeting in Paris on Saturday afternoon.

The race quickly became anti-climactic when the 5-year-old champion trotter, paired with Swedish top driver Björn Goop, hit the early lead.

Still, after an easy, but quick, start, the pace was kept high during the race's first half mile. Face Time Bourbon came to the half mile in :54.2 and when the uphill started, Goop could slow down the pace before he put in the turbo gear again at the end of the last turn.

Enino du Pommereux seemed, for a short moment, to challenge the leader after a perfect pocket trip, but Goop had everything under control and Face Time Bourbon sprinted to safe win in a mile rate of 1:54 over 1.3 miles.

Enino du Pommereux finished second ahead of Frisbee d'Am.

Face Time Bourbon is the indisputable emperor of Vincennes – and European harness racing – this winter and can look back at victories in Prix d'Amérique, Criterium Continental and Prix de Selection together with a stunning runner up performance behind winner Davidson du Pont in Prix de France.

Trainer Sébastien Guarato has earlier announced that Face

Time Bourbon most likely will stay in France during the spring where stud duty is waiting instead of an eventual trip to Solvalla and the Elitloppet.

Big race without spectators next weekend

Sunday March 8 is the date for one of the most prestigious mile races in Europe during the season. The \$220,000 Criterium de Vitesse at Hippodrome de Cagnes-sur-Mer at the French riviera will be raced, but due to the threat of Corona virus, the race card will be held without spectators at the track, according to French media Paris-Turf.

Several big sports events around Europe have seen the same destiny the last 10 days and the area around northern Italy, which is close to the French riviera, is a severely affected district regarding the virus.

COSA BENEFITS

The following is a summary of COSA coverage, for specific information please contact the COSA office 905-854-2672.

COSA LIABILITY INSURANCE COVERAGE HORSE RELATED (INCLUDED IN MEMBERSHIP)

COSA offers liability insurance to all standardbred horsepeople on an additional third party basis. The limits of the policy are 2 million per occurrence.

The policy is intended to cover horse-related incidents in which you may become legally liable through a law suit by a third party.

COSA LIABILITY INSURANCE COVERAGE INDIVIDUALS (INCLUDED IN MEMBERSHIP)

This policy provides liability insurance to all standardbred horsepeople participating at a "scheduled" Ontario racetrack for incidents which horsepeople may become legally liable as the result of property damage or bodily injury.

The policy will not cover injury or death to any animal or injury or death to any person participating in training or racing of standardbred horses on the racing surface.

COSA SUPPLEMENTAL DISABILITY (INCLUDED IN MEMBERSHIP)

This policy financially assists COSA members during the recuperation period of a horse-related accident, which took place in Ontario. The policy pays an additional 50% as per the Standardbred Canada guidelines below. Coverage is provided by COSA in full for up to two years. However, the COSA policy only allows members receiving this benefit an opportunity to collect for a maximum of 24 months over a five-year period.

COSA FIRE & TRANSPORTATION (INCLUDED IN MEMBERSHIP)

This program provides fire and transportation insurance to horsepeople who are participating at "scheduled" Ontario racetracks with additional fire and transportation insurance. All horsepeople are covered for losses incurred from a collision or "overturn" of a conveying vehicle while transporting to and from a racetrack where the horse is entered to race. Limits of liability include \$25,000 per horse, \$7,500 per horse two years or older who has not started and \$2,500 for tack per horse. In the event this coverage becomes primary, any loss incurred by this policy is subject to a \$500 deductible per claim. Maximum claims allowed are \$7,500 for tack and \$250,000 total for any single occurrence.

COSA LIFE-HEALTH-DENTAL OPTIONAL

Through your COSA membership Ontario residents are eligible to join the RWAM Insurance Group Benefit Plan. The plan is available to COSA members and their families and covers: Life Insurance \$20,000; Accidental Death and Dismemberment \$30,000; Dependent Life-spouse \$5,000 and each child \$2,500; Healthcare including prescription drugs, paramedical services, private duty nurse, ambulance, plus out-of-country coverage, all covered at 80% and Dental Care which covers 80% of cleaning, scaling, polishing, fluoride treatments, fillings, extraction, denture repairs, etc. plus 50% coverage for removable dentures.

Delving deep into the pedigree of Greenshoe

by Norman Hall

I had a request for me to look at trotter Greenshoe to give my take on his pedigree and see if he was also the result of a maternal build-up of maternal influence like Shartin N ([full story here](#)). His pedigree does, in fact, exhibit many of the same characteristics. Like Shartin N he is, for starters, by far the best performer in his maternal line with very little to show past his third dam in terms of high earnings or speed. I had not looked in depth at his pedigree previously but I am not surprised at what I found.

In my book about maternal lines, *Queen Among Queens*, I devote a chapter to examining the development of some of the most popular and prolific maternal families and show the point at which they suddenly expanded into production of high speed and earnings. I called this the "trigger" effect because it seemed to happen when certain key maternal influences first came together. Those influences are all based on X-factor mares also described in an earlier chapter on the trigger effect. Names such as Adioo, Hatteras, Kathleen, Manette and Oniska and the inbred daughters Margaret Parrish and Helen Hanover, are all key X-factor sources that when combined or doubled up in a pedigree can step up the performance of the individuals that inherit them.

In my research I have determined that the X-factor traces back to England and the so-called Ancestral Mom through the daughters of Diomed, a stallion imported to North America in the late 1700's. His legacy is not restricted to standardbred mares but also is evident in the thoroughbred breed and many of those early North American mares show up in other ways in the maternal lines of standardbreds, in particular through the daughters of American Star and Mambrino Patchen with extensive thoroughbred dams that feature Diomed. That is where the family of Greenshoe begins.

His maternal family name is Lady Bunker born in 1873. She was by Mambrino Patchen and out of an American Star mare. The second dam is by the thoroughbred Tiger from an unknown mare and whose dam is Jane Hunt, the maternal family of one of the aforementioned trigger mares Kathleen. That combination in itself is a good foundation but there is one key ingredient needed to complete the package and that is an intersection with the legacy of Miss Russell, the Queen Of Queens.

Lady Bunker had two daughters, one of which ended up in Europe. The other one, Welcome Bunker, also had two

daughters by Bobby Macgregor who brought nothing extra to the table but is responsible for Axcharm, the 10th dam of Greenshoe. Two generations of nothing added then we get to Farr (1934) who is notable only for the fact that we will see her later. Her daughter Fardean is the first on the line to inherit a maternal boost as her sire is Dean Hanover whose dam is inbred no fewer than four times to Mambrino Patchen including the trigger mare Hatteras. Still no Miss Russell however.

Fardean was bred to Blaze Hanover who contributes Adioo, the first link to Miss Russell, to the mix and their daughter, Gypsy Blaze, is then bred to Carlisle that makes her a double copy to Adioo maternally. The next step is a big one when Carlisle Blaze meets Speedy Crown who brings both Oniska and another trace to Adioo into the family. Up until now, through 10 generations the family has produced just one performer with more than \$30,000 earned and that is Carlisle Blaze. Her daughter by Speedy Crown is called

Southern Crown, the best of her 14 foals with \$88K made. Of the 14 foals there are just two by Speedy Crown but it was Southern Crown that became the 4th dam of Greenshoe. Her best was by Texas, a double/double pedigree colt that made \$552,000. Her second best was Southern Drawl (\$113k) by Super Bowl and that was the one that really triggered the maternal line since he brings in the legacy of the great Margaret Parrish for the first time. Her full sister Blaze of Fury was not bred to Super Bowl and produced just one winner of \$114K and no fillies of note

Southern Drawl was bred to Balanced Image and produced the third dam of Greenshoe and the first time the Noble Victory line is introduced. Balanced Image brings in maternal support from Adioo, Oniska and Hatteras maternally in X-factor position but more importantly his maternal dam goes back through Farr (1934) to the same source as the maternal line of Greenshoe, the combination of Mambrino Patchen and American Star. We now have a pedigree that combines double copies of every possible X-factor trace to Diomed. Southern Drawl earns \$430,000 and is bred to Yankee Glide, producing Sheer Soul, a TB pattern and DD pattern mare and 2nd dam of Greenshoe. Now we are ready for the final ingredient that produces the explosion in the form of Greenshoe.

Sheer Soul is bred to Donato Hanover whose dam is by Donerail, a carrier of Margaret Parrish and in addition has another Margaret Parrish line maternally through Rodney, the same one as in the dam of Super Bowl. Donato's dam, D Train, is therefore a double copy to the most important maternal influence of the X-factor in the trotting breed. This powerful maternal influence has a downside. however, especially for a budding stallion. It predicates that the stallion will be essentially a producer of great fillies and for Donato Hanover that is very much the case. He has five million dollar winners and the top four are all fillies and all of them have Margaret Parrish maternally and are double copies to the great mare accordingly.

Greenshoe's dam, Designed To Be, is the fifth best filly with \$663K made and he was her first foal. Her second foal is the million dollar yearling Maverick.

Adding lustre to the pedigree of this great colt and stallion prospect is his TB pattern pedigree since he is by a Valley Victory line sire and from a dam that is inbred to the Valley Victory line. He is also a DD pattern through his combination of Noble Victory and Speedster lines maternally that are duplicated in the maternal lines of Father Patrick and his sire Cantab Hall. That Noble Victory line that was picked up

along the way is a crucial element in the profile of the best by Father Patrick. Every one of his top performers has a Noble Victory line in the dam - just another thing to look for in the search for a Champion.

I am sure there are some that say this is all 20-20 hindsight but I am constantly reminded of the words of Marg Neal in an interview with Dean Hoffman for *Hoof Beats* magazine in 2001.

"We have been conditioned by the restriction of catalogues and advertising to view our horses, at most, as three generation animals. There are many people out there that will tell you there is no reason to look beyond the grandparents of any animal. I thoroughly disagree. It is, however, a handy position to take for those unwilling to do their homework.

"There is a model of breeding that is like a pattern, and the pattern persists over generations, although, of course, the names change. I like to see a mare that is inbred and a sire that is not."

“Let’s say I own a new trotting stallion named Prospective Gold, who stands at beautiful Rolling Acres Farm in New Jersey. He is trying to make his bones in the breeding game. The competition is fierce. A couple of hugely popular stallions will soak up the top mares.”

“New Jersey?”

“Yeah, why not? I’ve never been there, but they have the Meadowlands, and the state racing is improving.”

“So, what’s your latest scheme?”

I said, “I would need to work with a farm for this one. This concept would be a joint venture between Rolling Acres Farm, the owner of Prospective Gold, and me, the innovating salesman.”

Big M to televise three stakes on national sports network

The Meadowlands is excited to announce that three of the top Grand Circuit stakes cards of the 2020 Championship Meet will be televised live across North America on a National Sports network.

Three live races will be broadcast on each program with the Cutler Memorial (Saturday, May 16), Meadowlands Pace elimination (Saturday, July 11) and Meadowlands Pace Final (Saturday, July 18) headlining the chosen nights. Each broadcast is tentatively set to run from 8 to 10 p.m.

While the Meadowlands Pace elimination and final cards are loaded with supporting stakes such as the Graduate finals and Hambletonian Maturity, the Cutler Memorial will be supplemented by two brand new, yet to be named early closers for the older pacing horses and mares.

A break in the schedule between the Blue Chip

Matchmaker and Borgata (Levy) at Yonkers and the Betsy Ross and Commodore Barry at Harrah's Philly affords The Meadowlands a spot to add a new race for those divisions.

The new early closers will use the top 11 money winners in 2019-2020 and have an estimated purse of \$85,000. They will also be considered point-bearing TVG legs, though horses need not be TVG eligible to be nominated to them.

These races will require a nomination payment of \$1,000 due by March 15 and a \$1,000 entry fee. The added money will be \$60,000. Further details and conditions are in development and will be released soon.

"NYRA has been doing a lot of live TV since Saratoga last summer. We feel it's important to try broadcasting some of our big stakes live," said Meadowlands president Jeff Gural. "We have a good product and hope by exposing it to a national audience it will generate more interest in the sport."

TheStable.ca records first international victory

Girl From Oz granted TheStable.ca its first international victory on Feb. 29 when the 2-year-old pacing filly captured her maiden win in the \$50,000 Pink Bonnet Stakes at Club Menangle in Menangle, New South Wales (near Sydney, Australia).

Trainer Darren McCall piloted the daughter of Heston Blue Chip to a rousing half-length win in 1:55.6 at odds of 15-1. It was the filly's second career start after finishing third in her career opener two weeks prior.

TheStable.ca is horse racing's fastest growing fractional ownership operation and the largest harness racing stable in Canada.

Created by Anthony and Amy MacDonald of Guelph, ON in 2015, the award-winning business currently trains 126 standardbreds owned by 800 clients from 12 countries.

Anthony MacDonald purchased pacing fillies Girl From Oz and Rockindownunder at the Australian Pacing Gold Yearling Sale in Sydney, AUS in February 2019 at the tail end of a two-week speaking tour.

Rockindownunder (Warraawee Needy) has also shown early promise and was AE2 for the Pink Bonnet. She is campaigned by Robbie and Kerry Ann Morris of Lucky Lodge and makes her next start on Monday, March 2 at Bathurst Harness Racing Club.

Girl From Oz is owned by 16 people from four countries – including breeders Gwenda Murphy and John Pritchard. Rockindownunder is owned by 21 people from five countries.

The next stakes engagement for Girl From Oz is the Bathurst Gold Tiara (part of the Gold Crown Carnival) at Bathurst Harness Racing Club in late March.

Trente Deo, Royal Heart sit on throne after Game of Claims series championships

The team behind the Captaintreacherous ridgling **Trente Deo** – trainer Bill Adamczyk, owner William Emmons, and driver Jim Morrill Jr. – showed just the right amount of patience with the 4-year-old pacer, and they were rewarded by earning the throne after winning the \$50,000 Championship of their Game Of Claims Series on Saturday night at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono.

Owner Emmons saw the pacer won his first start in the series, then took him out of his second Game Of Claims start, paying \$33,000 (with the 4YO allowance, the base price

slightly elevated through all the GOC prelims), which he also won. Emmons and Adamczyk, knowing the horse had enough points to make the final already, kept him out of the third leg, avoiding losing him to a claim, and their foresight paid off after Morrill gave the winner a second-over trip in the final, making a strong far turn move with him that carried him to a 1:52.3 victory on a northeast Pennsylvania night where the mercury stayed in the mid- to low-20s.

In the \$30,000 Game Of Claims Championship for \$15,000 base-price horses, Team Allard had just the right amount of skill and luck as the Royal Art gelding **Royal Heart** pushed his record to 2-for-2 for them with a 1:53.3 triumph. The Allard barn took the winner out of the second leg for \$17,500, then raced him last week and had double fortune in that he both produced a rallying victory (ensuring his spot in the finale) and was also passed over in the claiming box. In the final, Simon Allard kept Royal Heart in the two-hole behind Horsing Around, the fastest pacer in the elims whom the Allards had lost via claim last week, then out-muscled that rival home here for brother/trainer/owner Rene Allard.

The Allards had the best night at Pocono on Saturday, with Simon winning four races and Rene conditioning three winners.

The \$17,500 pace for fast-class horses saw the two horses handicapped with the outside posts, **Twin B Tuffenuff** and Atta Boy Dan, turn in a fierce stretch battle, with the former nosing out the latter in 1:52.3. Twin B Tuffenuff took early command, got a 29.2 breather on the cold night, then sprinted home in :56 - :27.2 to withstand the unrelenting grind of Atta Boy Dan, last year's Pocono Pacer of the Year. The victorious son of Rock N Roll Heaven was driven by Matt Kakaley for Burke Racing Stable LLC / Weaver BrusceMI LLC and trainer Ron Burke – ironically, the same owner/trainer partnership for whom "Dan" had made consecutive starts in all but one in 115 races, with 41 wins and \$659,026 in earnings, from 2014 until being claimed at Pocono last May.

FINISHING LINES – The Saturday/Sunday action at Pocono goes to its usual 7 p.m. post time starting today (March 1). Monday is added to the 2020 schedule this week, with first post at 4 p.m.

Back in the '60s and '70s every track was booming and attendance was way up. If you wanted a table at Greenwood's dining room you had to call days in advance, Sunday lunch at Orangeville Raceway you had to get there early or you were out of luck, and at Barrie Raceway their dining room was always packed and on a Saturday night forget it. But at the same time the grandstands were filled even in the dead of winter and we horsemen, as they do today, battled the elements and yes we would complain but we loved it.

Then changes started happening and soon tracks were closing and attendance was non-existent as online betting allowed you to sit at home and wager and then the government pulled the slot programs at all the tracks. The industry was scrambling to survive and drugs in racing already part of the game really got rolling when the purses increased because of the slots and with the slots now shutdown the small outfits were forced to get out.

Different groups got together and sat down with the new government and a new program Ontario Racing was brought in for the next 19-20 years. All of us that were having coffee that morning agreed what is going on and what has happened to the industry. Back in the '60s and '70s the game was like an infant and was crawling but racing was great. Then, we were running through the slot years and we did nothing but take until it was taken back. And now with this new saviour in place we're back and running and now doing hurdles, too but the game has not seen the demise of the

small outfits because this new game only is for those who only care about themselves and one day will trip on one of these hurdles because they never learned how to walk before they ran and jumped hurdles.

Twenty years will go by in a blink of an eye and those who think another deal will be reached are in for an awakening and it will be the end of harness racing. All of us having coffee this morning all got out of the game but still live and breathe it and if whomever thinks that by letting the drugs rule the outcome of this new Ontario Racing program without expulsions of those breaking the rules this deal is the last deal and that '60s and '70's infant never grew up and learned how to stand on its own two feet.
