Faraldo calls BS on Yonkers cancellation

The president of the SOA of New York said new Yonkers Raceway management MGM Resorts was testing the waters by cancelling and blamed the state's Gaming Commission for not punishing track owners that don't race when programmed without proper justification.

Joe Faraldo calls the cancellation of Saturday's Yonkers Raceway's card "absolutely disgraceful" and places much of the blame on the New York State Gaming Commission for not punishing racetracks for making unilateral decisions to cancel without justification.

Yonkers announced the decision to cancel before 7:30 a.m. Saturday and said the reason live racing and simulcasting was cancelled was "due to the weather." It is the fourth cancellation of live racing at Yonkers in 2019. The casino at the track remained open and live racing went

ahead without a hitch at the Meadowlands across the Hudson River.

Saturday evening in New York, Faraldo, the president of the Standardbred Owners Association of New York (SOA of NY), reported the temperature was 40 degrees in the city.


"The sun came out today. Most of the snow is gone. The roads are passable," Faraldo said. "There's no concern about the welfare and safety of people shipping horses from New Jersey. At Freehold they didn't have any snow. Upstate, they tell me they don't have anything up there. This was a call that was made at 7:23 a.m. to cancel racing."

Faraldo said he believes Yonkers Raceway's new management, MGM Resorts, was "testing the waters" by cancelling because the Gaming Commission in recent years has not punished other track owners in the state for canceling without justification.

"About seven years ago – or within that time period – there was a track operator, my dear good friend at Vernon (Jeff Gural), that cancelled the last two weeks of awarded race days. He was fined a

sum of \$20,000, which I thought was way too little for doing that. Two years ago, he decided, unilaterally, he was not going to open the first two weeks of the week at Vernon. He has not been either fined or suspended for failing to honor his obligation to respect the race dates that were awarded to him and without any regard for the consequences to the horsemen," Faraldo said.

"The Gaming Commission, over the last two years, has been threatening to do something to him, but never does a thing. Now, if I was MGM Grand, I would decide to see how much I could get away with. I think that's what we saw today, a testing of the waters by new management. MGM worldwide organization just a week or 10 days ago – I'm not 100 per cent sure — has issued, basically, an edict that they must cut costs (full press release here). Today was the first evidence of that kind of mentality on the racing side. If they think they can get away with it, they're going to try. It's that simple."

Faraldo said he was "very concerned" about Saturday's Yonkers cancellation, but does not expect it to be precedent setting, particularly since he hopes to put pressure on the Gaming Commission to develop a protocol for dealing with unreasonable cancellations in the future.

"I think I am correct in leveling the criticism at the Gaming Commission, because I think they are, in part, responsible for this kind of attitude. If one of my horsemen violated some rule or regulation that was an obligation imposed upon them — for example, coming to the paddock with poor or improper equipment or equipment not sufficient to avoid the risk of a horse or driver getting hurt in a race — that person gets penalized. Now, if you have an obligation to maintain 234 race dates that you applied for, and you don't fulfill your obligation, how do you escape scot-free?

"The prior New York State Racing and Wagering Board, years ago meted out a \$20,000 penalty for similar conduct. Two years ago, this Gaming Commission did nothing. When they wanted to morph from a racing commission to a gaming commission, I opposed that. People said, 'How can you oppose it? You don't like the racing board.' I said, 'But at least the racing board has more people with expertise that are concerned about one issue — racing and the terms and conditions under which racing is to be conducted. Once you morph into a gaming commission, racing is all the way in the back and gaming becomes paramount and that's not good for this industry. But, nobody listens to Uncle Joe."

Faraldo said cancelling the first Saturday of the month showed ignorance on MGM Resorts' part.

"On the first of every month, everyone's handle goes up because people get their checks — social security, welfare, whatever. They get some subsidy checks on the first of the month," Faraldo said. "Your handle is always higher. It's not a function of how you conduct your business, it's just a function of the accident of the economics of money getting into somebody's pocket who wants to bet. (Friday) night we bet \$948,000 (at Yonkers), which is above what we normally bet. We concluded our card at 10:36 at night, so we didn't drag people out to try to capture the west coast money or anything else. It was a relatively early night and we had a good night. So, if you were picking a night (to cancel), the stupidity of picking a Saturday night when it's that close to the first of the month is an extreme example, to me, of the lack of any understanding about how to conduct this business."

Faraldo said he is hoping the Gaming Commission will set up a protocol to address cancellations in the future. In no way should the

Yonkers Raceway cancelled "due to weather" Saturday, but Faraldo said weather was fine and not an impediment to racing.

SOA of New York dictate terms of the protocol, Faraldo said, but, if asked, the association would be happy to be involved in the decisions to cancel.

"Maybe a solution here, which I would advocate, is if any racetrack operator — I don't care who it is — decides unilaterally and without justification or a fact-based decision to cancel racing and they have a casino or racino, they should be required to shut (the casino) down at the same time," Faraldo said.

"I want a dialogue started because I do not want to see this happen under any circumstances again. This is just wrong and I haven't found anybody, yet, who disagrees with me — except, maybe, the Gaming Commission. I don't know."

World class performance on Paris' last winter race card

Sébastien Guarato-trained Face Time Bourbon (Ready Cash) had no problem keeping more merited horses behind him in Vincennes' \$250,000 Prix de Selection on Saturday afternoon.

Swedish top driver Björn Goop, the permanent pilot behind Guarato's 4-year-old, made no mistakes with the dominant trotter. Face Time Bourbon hit the lead at an early stage and Goop didn't make the game easy for the horses that started 25 meters behind. The pace was high and although runner up Davidson du Pont put up a mile rate of 1:52.4 over 1.3 miles, he was never really close to challenging the flying winner. Face Time Bourbon came home in mile rate 1:53.4 (since he started 25 meters ahead of the older horses), which is new track and stakes record for 4-year-olds.

"I have called Face Time Bourbon my new Bold Eagle and you can't say that I'm so wrong in my prediction. His next big objective is Criterium des 4 ans at Vincennes", said trainer Sébastien Guarato after the race.

Falcao de Laurma finished strongly for third place after a fourth inside trip.

Jean-Michel Bazire's Bel Avis (Ganymede) was outstanding in Prix du Plateau de Gravelle (\$100,000) at Vincennes earlier on the race card. Position first over didn't stop Bel Avis, who left his opponents in the last turn and sprinted to safe win in mile rate 1:53,4 over 1.3 miles.

Daniel Redén's trotter has been the runner up in Elitloppet





USTA photographer Mark Hall said he was instantly smitten with harness racing when on his first trip to cover the Little Brown Jug he not only photographed Niatross winning, he got to touch the legendary pacer.

"When I was a little kid I always wanted to touch things, so

The year was 1980 and Hall was working for someone else in those days.

"That was before I started with USTA in 1982," he said. "I was doing a job for somebody else, but got the credentials."

Hall said another legendary horse that won the Jug was instrumental in another Communicators' Hall of Famer's career photographing horses.

"Ironically, my former co-worker Ed Keys, who is in the Hall of Fame, his first assignment was Bret Hanover at Delaware," Hall said of the 1965 Jug champ.

Proving impressive horses have the power to change lives and chart careers.

Speed Dating - The Blacken Stallion (Part 2)

The Real Life Ventures and Adventures of Trey and Batman

I wrestled my Prius into a metered parking space in front of the Cleveland Museum of Art. Before we unbuckled and climbed out into the winter sunshine, my friend from Silicon Valley turned to me and said, "I keep thinking about the story you told me yesterday, about Beau Blacken, the ballplayer that fell through the cracks and never had a true chance at the big leagues" (full story here).

The flag on the meter was red, so I fished six quarters out of the console pocket, "Yeah, every time I breed a horse, bet on a horse, or buy a horse, part of my brain wants to help the underdog. I just can't play the favorite."

He nodded, "We want everything to be fair, which of course it isn't. So steer me back to your stallion selection method."

"Breeding my broodmare is just a fun thing, not a business. I just wanted to try the breeding game and just sort of stumbled into. Honestly, I don't understand all that much about breeding, but I also don't care all that much... so it all works out."

We stepped out of the car as he asked, "But your babies did fine on the track?"

"Yeah, but it's a small sample, probably beginners luck. My thinking is all over the map — personal experience, stubbornness, prejudice, total nonsense, plus a dash of karma."

I slipped the quarters into the slot on the meter. Each coin gave a clunk and whirling sound. I said, "That will give us



two hours, really? I need two minutes."

"All part of the conspiracy to make you a gentleman squire."

"Yeah, good luck with that."

"Where do you start?" He asked.

"Magazines, farm websites, and a lot of time on the Internet. I cross off the stallions that profess they are full and closed. This is fine and dandy because my fiscal situation is usually down and out. Another group I usually cross off are syndicated stallions; to me, syndication sounds like an expensive golf country club with members paying dues to keep out the riffraff. I have country club incidents in my past."

He tapped the roof of my car with his knuckles and said, "Always a rebel."

I gave him a power-fist salute, "The rebel without a clue." We began to walk towards the entrance and I continued, "I like stallions that have yet to have a racing crop - but I nix very YOUNG new stallions. A couple of times I booked to immature studs that were shooting blanks. My broodmare is normally reliable, it took a while to find out and it cost me money. I lost a full season one year, and another year I

wound up with a late foal after a Hail Mary switch."

"Anything else?"

I thought for a few steps and said, "For some reason, I think it is cool when a stallion has raced in Europe. I also like horses that have raced at least 30 to 40 times."

A few steps later, I snapped my fingers and said, "I pass on lightly-raced brothers or sisters of



monster champions, and I skip the "two-years of breedings for the price of one." They remind me of my divorce in 2011, I can't imagine having been forced into a second year."

"I recall hearing about that one, the Wrath of Karen Kahn."

"That was epic." I gave a palm slap to my forehead before getting back on track.

"Other than those weird prohibitions, my stallion hunting madness is untethered. I'd breed in Maine or Florida if I could make any sense out of the idea. Heck, with the computer, I'd breed in Norway if I saw a path."

He shook his head, "Your mind is like Walt Disney on acid."

"I hear a different drummer, my man. The thing is, in my little breeding game, I figure, why act desperate, or pay full price, or follow the herd. The market for second-tier stallions is tough. Establishing a new stallion without industry juice is like rock climbing wearing roller skates. If you have a new stallion with only twenty bookings sold in April and I have a mare who throws sires stakes horses – hell, you should pay me. Actually, I saw an idea advertised in Canada where they pay the broodmare owner for a live foal. Those stallions are still on my table."

He opened the museum door, waved me through, and said, "This is an amazing mixture of fact, fiction, and farce."

I nodded. "Stud fees are a weird dance. You have regular stallion owners and syndicates who hold the line at the listed price. I suppose they don't want to deflate the price tag, good for them. They know what they are doing, but normal and an organized structure are not my things, I think there should be variables."

"How so?"

"My thinking is, this is 2019. I just got off a plane last week with 184 seats and none of us paid the same price. We all landed at the same airport. As far as I know, nobody jumped off into the Pacific when they found the person next to them paid half of what they paid."

"No frequent flier miles, no first class seating, and no preferred customer perks for Trey?"

"No, I won't pass security at respectable airports. I don't even know where I'm going until the last minute. Give me a ride for a good price and I'd sit inside a piece of large baggage in the overhead bin if it got me to Tahiti."

He smiled and said, "You have to book something."

I nodded, "My normal shopping starts a few weeks before the scheduled foaling date. I settle on three, maybe four options, and one at a time, I send out emails. Eventually, I make a choice, sign a contract, and bang, we rock and roll."

I added, "There are plenty of ways to book a stallion, online auctions, charitable organizations that have breedings available, traditional farms, swaps, gifts, pity, and blue light specials. So, my idea is this: Market the racing product and also market the advantage of wagering in New Jersey with its lower take our on horizontal wagers. For example, in Pennsylvania the takeout on horizontal wagers of three or more entries is 30 per cent at Harrah's and 32 per cent at Mohegan Sun. This applies to both horizontal wagers of three or more and of course vertical wagers (Tri and Super) Meadowlands take out is only 25 per cent on trifectas, 20 per cent on P3 and a low 15\$ on P4 and P5

Reality replay

At a tipping point for harness racing, we are now reminded of the Dark Side. The scars of the "Pena" years are still visible. Those times were lose-lose for both the tracks and bettors. Bettors declined to wager at the tracks and the tracks lost valuable betting pools from which to draw their profits. Most bettors took notice and did 180-degree turns when Pena's cheap, recently claimed horse improved by 3+ seconds and beat newly imported New Zealand super horse, Auckland Reactor. Most of harness racing sees the issue as testing ineptness in the officials charged with keeping our sport honest.

Fast forward a couple of years and we are seeing history repeat itself at Freehold Raceway and trainer Nick Surick. We see NS dominance at Freehold, but at larger tracks with big dollars for superior testing — NOT SO MUCH. Unfortunately, it appears that we, the betting public are being provided a grade "D" oversight at the smaller B tracks. When tracks knowingly provide an inferior oversight product it may be time to replace some management principals or ask why the NJ Gaming Commission has stood by idly, in my book that makes them enablers.

Here's a brainstorm: let's get the tracks altogether and then they can negotiate a one-price-fits-all testing program that serves the bettors, the tracks and the honest trainers. Come on guys, this isn't rocket science but the fact that you haven't come up with a solution on your own is troubling.
