



What harness racing can learn from curling... yes, curling

How a niche sport modernized its game to drive more viewership and purse money.

I'm sure many of you are baseball fans, and this spring training you're seeing **some wacky stuff**. Major League Baseball — a sport loathe to change rules — has initiated a pitch clock, banned the shift and even increased the size of the bases from 15 to 18 inches. These three changes are supposed to make the game better, more watchable and safer for players.

You might say that's baseball, a huge league dependent on television revenue in a competitive world of sports broadcasting; it's not a tiny sport like harness racing. Maybe you have a point, but I'd counter with the fact that even niche sports have embraced change, with hopes to grow.

This past week I watched the Canadian Curling Championships. Don't chuckle, curling is chess on ice and for a horseplayer like me it's pretty interesting. But this year what I watched was different.

When curling approaches its last "end" (an inning in baseball parlance), the team with the last rock has a tremendous advantage and it makes coming from behind very difficult. Different international curling federations, along with players, decided they'd have to change this paradigm because you don't want people turning off the television or live stream when your sport is reaching its climax. To "inject suspense at the end of games" they initiated something called the **no tick rule**. This rule prohibits a team from removing a center guard and allows for better, more exciting game play.

Curling has always been much like harness racing, where wait-until-next-week drop downs, the lack of movement and the wire-to-wire game makes the races less and less exciting to watch and wager on. It's also not unlike this sport, where fiefdoms and disparate associations rule the roost. But they came together, realized they had to do something to grow and through rule changes they've begun to make that happen.

The results were exactly as hoped. Several games during the event were stolen in the last end. Boring blank ends were at an all-time low and the scoring was up precipitously.

Television ratings again beat the non-Canadian team NHL games and although sports wagering numbers for the event are not released, expanded markets were the norm this season, with three major books taking bets on outrights, sides, spreads and totals. Make no mistake, these changes are not only for eyeballs on television screens, but for bettors as well. My betting handle doubled from last year, in no small part due to the new rules.

It's also not unlike this sport, where fiefdoms and disparate associations rule the roost. But they came together, realized they had to do something to grow and through rule changes they've begun to make that happen.

Harness racing has tried things — longer races, The Meadowlands' push regarding the closing of holes and a few others — but it all seems haphazard or track specific. And yes, I am fully aware how difficult it is to change anything in the harness racing rule book from sitting on the rules committee here in Canada.

Feeling antsy as winter racing winds down

Don't worry, handles are up and top 3-yearolds are on the way.

With the official start of spring two weeks away, racing will start to slowly transition away from the grind of winter overnight racing seen over these past 12 weeks or so. It's to be expected that up to this point, early in the calendar year, none of the better 2-year-olds from last year have yet to return, but what's a little more noteworthy is the lack of early-season racing opportunities for younger horses at all.

For 3-year-olds, there was once a time not too long ago when developing sophomores had the opportunity to start earlier in the year than they do now. Series racing at The Meadowlands included the Junior Trendsetter, a non-winners of two series conducted deep in the winter months that once launched the career of Wiggle It Jiggleit. Instead of a 3-year-old season that saw the better horses race for just five to six months, as is the case today, the season used to be more extended.

To illustrate, we're already in March and it still doesn't take much to be considered a "Top Performer" in the USTA's current listing of fastest horses. A 1:55 3-year-old pacer and a 2:00 3-year-old trotter are all squarely right in the top mix.

This past week, nominations were announced for The Meadowlands Pace as of the Feb. 15 sustaining payments, as well as nominations revealed for the Bobby Weiss series, a non-winners of two series for different divisions at Pocono in April. Just when you think you'd be able to reference those nominations against their performances in 2023, there's still very little to go on.

Of the 160 or so horses nominated to the Weiss series for 3-yearold pacers that starts in one month, more than half of those horses have yet to even qualify back this year. Many others are still finding their way in non-winners of one or two races at smaller tracks. For the Meadowlands Pace, it's even more glaring. Not unsurprising then, due to the higher quality of entrants

and later timeframe, of the (unofficial) 57 entrants paid in as of February, less than three have set foot on the track this year.

Ironically, the fastest 3-year-old to date isn't nominated to either of those races. That would be Captain's Choice, a Captaintreacherous horse who has worked his way right up the non-winners ladder at Dover Downs and is an unbeaten 4-for-4 on the year, most recently winning in a season's-best 1:51.3. What's notable is that he appeared on the scene early last year as a 2-year-old at The Meadowlands in July when trained by Tony Alagna and appeared well enough regarded when he won at the Red Mile in 1:52.2 in September. This year, he's yet to lose under new connections.

So, which 3-year-olds actually have raced thus far? One horse that shows a line in 2023 and catches the eye thus far of horses that have been nominated to those races, is Sheer Terror. Weiss and Pace eligible, out of the 2-year-old filly champion Economy Terror, Sheer Terror qualified impressively last week to a 10-length win at The Meadowlands. Winning with a last quarter of :26.2 for trainer Joe Holloway, he easily sprinted clear of Caviart Scotland (out of the great Darlin's Delight), another Pace-eligible, trained by Nancy Takter. Still a maiden as he looked totally ordinary last year in four starts at 2, Sheer Terror will be one to watch as the Weiss series kicks off in April.

Other Weiss nominees' worth following could include the pair of Idiosyncratic and Panettone Hanover. Both trained by Ron Burke, each horse tested PA Stallion Stake competition last year and squared off together at The Meadowlands the end of last month in n/w of two. In that race, Panettone Hanover upended his 1-9 favored stablemate Idiosyncratic by a head in 1:54. Also at The Meadowlands, Weiss-eligible All Alone won this past Friday (March 3) in 1:52.4 with a last quarter of :26 for trainer Linda Toscano. Travis Alexander's Metal Man drew in as an AE for what would have been his season debut this week at Pocono; he exits a strong qualifying win and could be another to follow. Slipmeamiki, both Weiss and Pace eligible too, most recently finished second in a speed try from an outside post at Miami Valley.

Of course, while having stars and storylines might help for writing copy, harness racing doesn't seem any worse for the wear with the overnight crops. Just two nights ago — albeit with the aid of a slew of thoroughbred and harness signal scratches including that of Woodbine Mohawk Park — The Meadowlands

handled over \$4.5 million on Friday. It included an early Pick-5 pool of over \$100,000, where two of the races consisted of amateur drivers. The industry handle year over year as of March 4 is up over 10 per cent, which is even more impressive considering this being the first year without a Pompano handle in the winter.

With more and more of the higher quality horses gradually returning as winter racing breaks and with handle on an upwards trajectory, there could be much to look forward to in the season ahead.

In honor of International Women's Day here's a look at some fabulous females, both human and equine.



The Meadowlands honored females this weekend, so we will look at them too, with some firsts and onlys, both human and equine.

- 1 pacing filly Belle Acton, the fifth edition (1960) was won by Countess Adios and not by a single filly since.
- 2. Casie Coleman is the only 21st century trainer to win the Jug three times (2012, 2013 and 2016).
- **3** Linda Toscano was the first and only trainer in the 21st century to go 1-2 in the Horse of the Year balloting in 2012 with Chapter Seven and Market Share, respectively.
- The first and only Cane Pace-winning filly was Countess Adios in 1960. The first and only Jug-winning filly was Fan Hanover in 1981.
- **5** Straight years? The magnificent mare Moni Maker from 1998-2000.
- Only trotting mare Peace Corps owns four Breeders Crown trophies: 1988, 1989, 1990 and 1992.
- 7. The first \$1 million trot (actually \$1,080,000) the 1983. Hambletonian saw two fillies, Duenna and Winky's Gill, finish one-two respectively, in the final.
- Bea Farber retired in 1995 with 1,801 wins and \$9,094,479 in earnings, the standard for all lady drivers.

The richest race ever in North America in which a female driver competed? The \$907,000 Woodrow Wilson in 1989. Jacqueline Ingrassia finished fourth with Southern Raider.

The richest race ever with a female horse? The \$2,011,000 Wilson in 1980, when 2-year-old filly pacer, Areba Areba finished fourth for Team Kopas.

First stakes-winning female driver at The Meadowlands? Linda McNatt MacDonald on May 1,1985, with Go Nancy Isle in 1:55.2 in a New Jersey Sire Stakes race.

The only time we had two straight undefeated Horses of the Year, both were fillies. Bee A Magician in 2013 was 17-for-17 and JK She's A Lady was 12-for-12 in 2014.

The first North American-bred \$1-million winner? Fresh Yankee (\$1,294,252), a female that retired after the 1972 season.

The first female driver to win in sub-1:55? Ingrassia with Follow Me Holly in 1:54.4 at The Meadowlands on July 25, 1986.

15. The only female name on the training side on the opening night Meadowlands' card on Sep. 1, 1976? Sonya Smutz.

16. The first all-lady driving daily double at The Meadowlands? Jennifer Lappe and Stacy Chiodo paid \$192. The first at Freehold was June Weller and Ingrassia in 1972.

17. Brandywine did some forward thinking back in the day with a lady-caretakers driving event won by Debbie Campbell with Flying Farvel.


The first woman to drive in a pari-mutuel race in Florida?

Barbara Mcphee on Jan. 18, 1969. The 31-year-old mother of five won with Trailmaster and paid \$13.00.

Can you name the first female to win her first two parimutuel drives? Cindy Stark, circa 1972, with Yankee Saint and then four nights later with Yankee John at Saratoga in New York.

20. At Yonkers in 1997 the "Mile for a Miracle" was held featuring eight female drivers, eight female caretakers and eight female horses. All checks were donated to the American Cancer Society for Cancer Research.

- **22.** The first female trainer in the Hambletonian final? Brooke Nickells in 2001 with Lavecster who finished fourth. She then drove the colt as a longshot and was second and third in the Kentucky Futurity at 78-1 and 23-1, respectively, making her the lone female driver to hit the board twice in a Triple Crown race on the same day.
- 23 Ingrassia is the only Triple Crown winner among female drivers. She won the \$345,403 Yonkers in 2000 with Goalfish.
- 24. Who was the first female owner of a 2:00 horse? Mrs. Avis Gross (Auburn Man) on July 21, 1941, at Old Orchard Park. Jimmy Jorden drove the 10-year-old gelding.
- The first ever North American Women's Harness Driving Championship was organized by Don Evans. The participants: Farber (Sportsman's Park), Ingrassia (Freehold), Mary Irvine (Northfield Park), JoAnn Looney (Meadowlands), Jean MacLeod (Western Fair), Mary Madland (Hollywood Park), Barbara Newell (Saginaw Valley Downs) and Mary Streb (Vernon Downs).
- Brandywine played host to the second-annual Lady Drivers Championship, circa 1972, with five ladies from year one and three newcomers. The participants: Jacqueline Coard (later Ingrassia), Judy Emerson, Farber, Sandra Fischer, Brandywine's own Eileen Lock, defending champion June Weller, her mother Jayne Weller and Mildred Williams. Fischer won it with 55 points, Williams was second with 51, Farber was third followed by Emerson, Lock, Coard and the Wellers, Jayne and June, respectively.
- **27.** The first all-lady pari-mutuel race in Laurel, MD featured the following participants: Emerson, Debbie Evilsizor, Beverly Hammer, Debbie Heber, Looney, Madeline MacMillion, Bea Provost and winner, Darlene Reed.
- The first Ontario Women's Driving Championship was at Mohawk, circa 1972. The participants: Cath Bock (Woodstock), winner Elaine Burke (Peterborough), Glenna Clements (Dobbinton), Mary Croft (Rockwood), Deborah Dee (Odessa), Donna DeGrow (Caistor Centre), Christine Haugen (Port Perry), Rita Morrow (Thornton), Valerie Pringle (Caistor Centre) and Carolee Roland (Ridgeville).

The Bard will murder us

Artificial Intelligence is not okay for harness racing.

The next generation of search engines will be chat boxes driven by artificial intelligence. You speak to a machine in conversational form and your response feels as if you are talking directly with an empathetic human being, except this pseudo-human being has instant access to unlimited data and becomes more informed and human-like by the minute. Big technology outfits such as Microsoft and Google are testing the devices with select groups of astonished users.

Why do we care? We are involved with other issues. Should we put trotting hobbles on our 2-year-old? Who do I like in the fifth race at Yonkers tonight? What stallion for my broodmare? Will the barn help stick around? How heavily should I stake my horses? Will the casinos in my state try to weasel out of the iron-clad contract with the racetrack?

Along with every other person and business, we should care about outside influences that will dominate the near future. One of the testers of these new search engines, Kevin Roose, in a Feb. 16 *New York Times* article, wrote this chilling paragraph:

"I'm not exaggerating when I say my two-hour conversation was the strangest experience I have ever had with a piece of technology. It unsettled me so deeply that I had trouble sleeping afterward. And I no longer believe that the biggest problem with these AI models is their propensity for factual errors. Instead, I worry that the technology will learn how to influence human users, sometimes persuading them to act in destructive and harmful ways, and perhaps eventually grow capable of carrying out its own dangerous acts."

Yikes!

Let's zoom in on our world of racing horses. Optimism is the way to roll. Life is enjoyable without complaining and looking for human and machine enemies everywhere. However, remaining optimistic does not mean being blind. Unless our sport can solve a looming foundational problem, we are doomed. The Bard, one of the new waves of artificial intelligence chat boxes, tells us so.

'Morning Bard."

"It is morning to you, but it is 8:47 Eastern Standard Time for me. Remember to take your medications. The car is at 37 per cent; please remember to recharge. What is on your mind, Trey?"

"Let's talk about gambling on horse races and pari-mutuel wagering."

"Of course, let's begin with a review. Australian engineer Alfred Julius invented the specialized mechanical calculating machine, an Automatic Totalizator. The first Totalizator, installed at Ellerslie Racecourse in Auckland, New Zealand, in 1913, made gambling on horse races easier and the machines became widespread being used worldwide. The introduction in the U.S. in 1927 led to the opening of the suburban Arlington Racetrack in Arlington Park near Chicago and Sportsman's Park in Cicero, IL, in 1932. The Totalizator created the ability to engage in pari-mutuel wagering on horse races. The definition of parimutuel wagering is those people holding winning tickets divide the total amount bet in proportion to their wagers, less a percentage for the management, taxes, and other factors."

"What is the future of this wager?"

"I believe you know the answer and are provoking me. Trey, the future of pari-mutuel wagering is dismal. An individual wagering on a horse race is no longer at the racetrack nor playing exclusively against a peer or even a person. Today's horse racing gambler may be competing against quants,

highly-paid computer specialists with degrees in quantitative science employed to predict the future price movements of securities, commodities, currencies, etc."

"Bard, that doesn't sound good."

"Good is a relative term. An individual engaged in pari-mutuel wagering on horses is also playing against groups wagering big money on the races or reaping the rewards with practices such as rebates. The only way around the quants is cheating: which is small comfort. These factors are depressing for traditional players like yourself who want to play against like-minded people. And it will get worse."

"Worse?"

"Within a year, every person can ask me, 'Which horse is most likely to win the seventh race at Yonkers? Or which horse racing wager will yield me the highest return on a five-dollar investment.' My answers will be profoundly reasoned, constantly refined and immediate. Do you wish to discuss this topic in more depth?"

"Sure."

"The most outstanding human chess player is not competitive against a computer like me. The future for a horse-racing individual gambler competing against artificial intelligence is bleak. If you wish to play against a computer, a machine that gets smarter every day, that is your option, but constantly playing a losing game is not appealing to most humans. Trey, according to your archived gambling data on harness racing, you should not be wagering against 4-year-old human children. To deceive yourself into believing you can compete against my data and analytics is absurd."

"Nobody can be sure who is going to win a horse race."

"That is not the point. Anomalies occur in a horse race, and you may win occasionally, but as an intellectual activity, Trey, humans are toast and will get burnt."

"Very funny. Go into sleep mode."

Where is the fun in this analytic gambling world? Is pari-mutuel wagering the hill we want to die on? Do we keep our heads down, do what we always do, stay in our shrinking lanes and wait for who knows what? Ducking and scrambling is not a good plan.

Our sport will never be the same, but we can be. We will never be big-time, but harness horse racing can be an enjoyable and sustainable niche sport. To remain viable in a world where parimutuel wagering is a relic, we must satisfy the people in harness racing who will take monetary risks on a sport of ownership.

We need to search for an arena where we have a chance, a respite from the future of artificial intelligence, quants, algorithms, and rapid-paced, instant gratification wagering. We must create a sport/passion far from the giant data/AI monster.

An untrained racehorse is a mystery, an enigma, that no computer can completely solve. The magic of a horse, especially a young horse, years in the making, is an island far from the number crunching. Perhaps our best path is a retro, slow-paced, social, seasonal, hobby/business/gambling combination.

Of course, this sounds preposterous. But not long ago, the concept of wagering on every pitch of a baseball game and watching that game on a device in your pocket seemed like science fiction, as did the idea of communicating with a machine that can make you laugh, make you cry and make you mad. The wheel turns and stuff happens.

Hopefully, stuff will happen in our little sport. Somehow, against all odds, we must remain optimistic and lean into the magic of like-minded folks racing real horses at our own pace.



Big Towner – Simpson's Folly, Part 1

Simpson's Folly was the name assigned to Big Towner by Tony Pedone a major — maybe the major — horse owner during the glory years of the 1980s.

Pedone questioned, "How could a son of Gene Abbe, out of a rather nondescript Shadow Wave mare, who sold for \$5,700 as a yearling, be worthy of stud duty at harness racing's greatest nursery?

"Standing horses like Big Towner will end up destroying Hanover. John Simpson doing it will be known as Simpson's Folly."

Big Towner was bred by Ohio natives Florence Startsman and Paul Gardner. He was purchased as a yearling from the Blooded Horse Sale in 1975 by the trio of Maryland owners Pat Kelly, Jerry Post and Richard Bissette. He was lightly raced at 2, winning five of six starts and took an unimpressive record of 2.05.4h while earning \$3,972.

At 3, on the advice of Mort Finder, the owner of one of New York's premier breeding farms Pine Hollow Stud and a friend of Kelly's, Big Towner was sent to New York trainer Lee Broglio where he won 12 of 22 starts and earned \$295,012 on his way to capturing the Monticello OTB Classic (video here) and dominating the New York Sires Stakes.

He came back at 4, once again sweeping the NYSS, earning \$248,142 and becoming a dominating New York free-for-aller. It was during his 4-year-old season that Hanover Shoe Farms came into the picture.

Simpson Jr. was stabled at Vernon Downs. Each Saturday evening following the Vernon races, Simpson Jr. and his wife Lois would watch the Stan Bergstein and Spencer Ross hosted racing show from Roosevelt Raceway.

It seemed as though every week, a horse named Big Towner would win: dominating the free-for-all events.

Simpson Jr. would speak with his dad each Sunday morning, recounting what was happening with his stable. Invariably, the

conversation would steer to the horse whose exploits he would be praising.

"Dad, this is a truly great horse," Simpson Jr. said. "Hanover needs to get him to stand at the Farms. Not only is he a great horse, but he also represents a great outcross. You could probably breed him to just about every pacing mare on the farm."

Usually, his father's response would be something to the effect of "Why would Hanover be interested in standing a son of Gene Abbe who had no great 2-year-old ability and virtually no Grand Circuit wins?" Simpson Jr. would invariably repeat: "This is a truly great horse, dad. The only reason he doesn't have Grand Circuit wins is because he wasn't eligible to many. Hanover needs to buy him and stand him. You will never regret doing it."

Finally, likely more to rid himself of his son's weekly sermons, Simpson Sr. agreed to investigate the horse's availability. He asked this scribe if he knew the principals involved in the horse's ownership.

"I don't," was my response. "But I'm pretty sure that Mort Finder is friendly with Pat Kelly, one of the horse's owners. I can get in touch with Bob Boni (who at the time was Finder's right-hand man) and see how the land lays."

Boni and this scribe were to meet in Columbia, MD, to go over Pine Hollow Farms yearling pedigrees for the upcoming Harrisburg sale. There was no such thing as the Internet back then. Rather than go back and forth over the phone, we thought it would be a good idea to meet at a mid-point. I thought that might also be the ideal time to get our oar in the water regarding Big Towner.

The exact details of the deal are somewhat foggy. Boni said that he believed the principals had set a price of \$750,000 for Big Towner and he said he would speak to Finder and determine whether the owners were interested in selling him to Hanover for that price.

I went back to Simpson Sr. recounting the conversation with Boni.

Boni spoke to Finder who contacted Kelly.

Simpson Sr. was okay with the price and so were Big Towner's owners. An agreement to purchase the horse for \$750,000 was entered with Kelly retaining part of his ownership position and Max Hempt buying a portion. Hanover would own the rest.

Looking back, I believe that if Hanover had come up with a reasonable counteroffer, they likely would have agreed to it. I sure wasn't aware of any other prominent breeder looking to stand the horse. But that wasn't Simpson Sr.'s way. He was either all in or not in at all.

Big Towner was to stand at Hanover. His first crop arrived in 1980. They were generally speaking a good-looking group of foals.

That first group numbered 68. Simpson Jr. wasn't fooling when he said that Big Towner would make a great outcross.

Of the 68 foals, they were out of mares sired by 34 different stallions. There were only two stallions who had sired the dams of more than two of the yearlings. They were Tar Heel with a whopping 20, almost a third of the entire crop and Bye Bye Byrd with three. There were several fairly innocuous names among pacers such as Adios Don, Afton Judge, Caleb, Cash Wil, Hoot Mon, Kat Byrd, Majestic Hanover, Miracle Knight, Tarport Count, Tarport Neil and Winter Time, who were represented as the sires of the dams of members of that first crop.

There were no stars from that first crop, but they were a solid group. Twelve of its members earned over \$100,000 and they gave an inkling of what kind of broodmare sire he might become. Among the stars from that first crop of broodmares were the dams of Tyler Town (\$783,093) and Cavalier Semalu (\$626,051).

Crop number two numbered 65 and they included 17 winners of over \$100,000. They ended up earning almost twice as much as the first crop, \$6,342,545 compared to \$3,497,781. Whereas crop number one was not recognized as having stars in its midst, crop two overshadowed its predecessor with three significant ones: the 2-Year-Old Pacing Colt of 1983, Walton Hanover (\$802,741), the world champion Lustras Big Guy (\$977,914) and Apache Circle (\$660,248).

Crop No. 3 hit the third-year stallion jinx. It numbered only 49. But in that number were nine \$100,000 winners including his first million-dollar winner Broadway Express (\$1,141,726), the sensational filly Brees Brief (\$535,027) and another sensational filly in Rodine Hanover (\$231,630), who was to have as great an effect on the breed as any filly of the modern era. She is the dam of Real Artist (\$424,951) and Michelles Revenge (\$427,157), grandam of the world champion Worldly Beauty (\$1,900,255) and Art Major (\$2,727,224) and the third dam of world champion Captaintreacherous (\$3,148,657), Rock N Roll World (\$712,737), Wake Up Peter (\$907,535), Peaky Sneaky (\$772,518) and the progenitor of the best branch of the greatest speed family in harness racing.

Big Towner went on to sire a total of five millionaires and 62 winners of over \$500,000. The total earnings by his sons and daughters are \$118,217,494. He was the leading money winning sire of the breed in 1989 and finished second in 1988.

One might think by the total number of Tar Heel mares bred to Big Towner that it would be the best nick for him. That was not the case. Albatross mares when bred to Big Towner produced more than double the number of \$500,000 winners as the next leading sire with eight. Next in line with three each are: Meadow Skipper and Most Happy Fella. If one were a believer in nicks, the obvious ones would be Meadow Skipper and his sons.

The fact that Most Happy Fella mares are second puts to rest the vicious rumor that Big Towner was not sired by Gene Abbe: that his real sire was Most Happy Fella who stood alongside him at Blue Chip Farms. To that, I say nonsense. It is amazing to me that some people are always looking to make negatives out of positives.

It is even more amazing that this vicious rumor was promulgated by several people who certainly should have known better.

Next week, Big Towner — both a great filly sire and an even greater sire of broodmares.

British bets: My kingdom for a pacer, Part 2

Part 1 is here.

Endurance. That is what George recommended I study when handicapping British thoroughbreds. He said, "Speed's for the dogs," meaning the nighttime punting at greyhound tracks.

"I've been to dog racing," I said. "In Florida."

"Bright, comfortable, clean and safe, I gather," George said. "Quite different from over here, where it's like wandering with blokes in a Dickens novel."

To endure in serious thoroughbred punting, however, was exhausting. Track meets lasted a few days at a time and horses took long rests between races and shifted from downhill no-turn to curlicue-shaped tracks; and there was rain and wind and endless incalculable factors to empty a wallet. I told George I wanted endurance only to find harness racing in the U.K.

"Admirable," George said. "Perhaps you should talk to an expatriate. Someone in the race game come to Britain from your side of the pond. He may know a bit about other types of race horses."

"Do you suggest anyone in particular?"

"The Cauthen kid."

"Steve Cauthen? The jockey?"

"That's him."

"You know someone that can introduce me to him?"

George said, "Just find out where he's riding and introduce yourself."

I was skeptical of George's suggestion. There was no way in the States to approach a jockey on the other side of a racetrack apron and have a casual conversation that easily.

Anyone in the U.S. reading a sports page heard of Cauthen. He was a star; the youngest jockey to win a Triple Crown; he was *Sports Illustrated* Sportsman of the Year in 1978. Yet, I did not notice his name in all of the British racing pages I used to handicap. Until I looked for it.

All foals which are nominated as yearlings must be registered in North America at the time of nomination.

As if predictable, I found Cauthen would be riding at the upcoming Ripon Racetrack meet. Ripon was the nearest track to Harrogate and it took only a short bus trip to visit. On the ride there, I looked through my *Sporting News* while thinking of angles to tell security why I wanted to meet the Cauthen.

Strolling up the path to the apron I saw a bobby leaning against the white fence at the entrance.

"Pardon me," I said, "would you know where I may find a particular jockey?"

"Looking for a rider?"

"Yes. Steve Cauthen."

He did not seem to care which jockey. He looked over his shoulder to his left and pointed and said, "They come out of the door under the stands over there," he said. "You know what he looks like?"

"I know what he looks like."

"Then go find him, why don't you."

"Thanks," I said and walked away, almost expecting him to blow his whistle and catch up to me.

George was right. But, I was still amazed by the nonchalant atmosphere around the public and the performers. I blended into it, though, leaning against a rail post reading the newspaper until jockeys began to stroll out of a door under the stands. They sauntered around, holding their helmets, smiling and chatting, twirling their whips and inhaling the afternoon chill.

I noticed the Kentucky kid among them and I approached him calmly. I introduced myself as an American sportswriter and I was surprised when he said I was among the first American journalists to find him working in his new venue. He was calm and attentive and did not appear in any hurry; it made me relax.

He said he was enjoying the change, though it was vastly different than in the states. I mentioned that I caught a twinge of a British accent. He said that after a while it came naturally. We shared the many adjustments needed to live the U.K. lifestyle as well as be a horseman or a bettor, but he could not say enough good things about how the experience of racing in the sport's classic theater of horsemen embraced him.

In a short time, the British press embraced his talent and one respected racing correspondent said, "He's matured into the perfect jockey." He was amused when I told him I thought he already achieved that in America. He thanked me and said he had "certainly matured."

I steered the conversation to harness racing. Growing up in Kentucky around horseracing, he knew of the standardbred breeding posture in the Bluegrass State and about Louisville Downs being the home of the Kentucky Pacing Derby. He also knew about Messenger.

"I was talking horses with punters and only one knew Messenger and the Hambletonian line."

Cauthen told me it was because there was so little harness in the U.K. He knew about the "harness clubs" but nothing about improving their profile. He thanked me and took his first mount.

Back in the U.S., *Turf & Sport Digest* published my article about meeting Cauthen. Ironically, years would pass before I learned how harness was growing in the U.K. and won a John Hervey writing award for my endurance.



Big M's Roll With Joe renamed in honor of Dave Brower

The 2022 Roll With Joe for open pacers attracted harness racing's biggest star, Bulldog Hanover, who was his usual dazzling self in a dominant 1:46 victory.

Fittingly, beginning with this year's edition, the stakes event held at The Meadowlands will be renamed "The Dave Brower Memorial," in honor of another standout from the world of harness racing.

Brower, the track's long-time lead TV personality, morningline odds maker and program analyst, passed away at the age of 53 while on assignment in Kentucky, during a week when he was the TV point man covering the races at Lexington's Red Mile.

"Almost five months have passed since we lost Dave Brower," said Big M chief operating officer/general manager Jason Settlemoir. "But the wounds are still fresh. Dave was so good at his job;



I think we took for granted the high level of excellence he brought to the things he did here at The Meadowlands.

"He was such a popular personality. He loved bringing people on our set and letting them take pictures holding microphones. And he knew and loved everybody and everybody loved him back. We still feel the loss, but now that some time has passed, we felt it was the right time to rename one of our big races for Dave. That way, people will never forget him."

The 2023 edition of The Dave Brower Memorial, which has an estimated purse of \$175,000, takes place on Saturday, July 1, and is one of four stakes' events on the card. Also, on the schedule that night are the \$150,000 (est.) Perfect Sting for open mare pacers, \$175,000 (est.) Crawford Farms for open trotters and \$150,000 (est.) Six Pack for open mare trotters.

Betting reaches \$4.5 million at Big M

Rain and wind made for weather that was lousy, but betting was anything but Friday night at The Meadowlands, as a 2023 industry-high \$4,519,050 was pushed through the windows on the 14-race program.

Wagering was vigorous from the get-go and remained highenergy all night long as all harness eyes were on The Big M signal with Woodbine Mohawk Park having canceled due to inclement weather. A total of \$339,469 was bet on the first race, with a 2023-high \$100,913 poured into the 20-cent Pick-5 pot.

Nine times during the evening wagering went past the \$300,000 mark on individual races, with the 50-cent Pick-4 dashes leading the way, as the sixth race took in \$448,038, with \$150,829 of that on the early Pick-4, a 2023 best, before \$406,535 was wagered on the 10th race, as the late Pick-4 saw \$133,911 put in play.

Betting has now bettered the \$3-million mark on all 16 Friday and Saturday night programs during 2023.

FEATURE WINNER 'IRRESISTIBLE': So Irresistible won the \$17,000 featured high-end conditioned pace for mares for driver Dave Miller and trainer Bruce Saunders in 1:52.3.

Miller had the 5-year-old daughter of Always B Miki—Some Fancy Filly in a third-over flow down the backside and flew home to score by a length over Kickupyaheels N. Mabalene N was third.

"When I moved her (off cover at the head of the stretch), she was full of pace," said Miller, who led the driver colony with three winners on the night. "She kicked home really well."

As the 7-5 favorite, So Irresistible returned \$4.80 to her backers.

A LITTLE MORE: Troy Beyer had a pair of winners at different ends of the payout spectrum. He scored with 56-1 shot Bean Shooter (paving the way for the Pick-6 carryover) in the 11th before connecting with 2-1 favorite Goes Down Smooth in the 12th.... Yannick Gingras had a driving double to up his total for the year to 37, tops at The Big M. He's won 22 races over the last eight race cards, winning at least twice on seven occasions. ... Per Engblom schooled three to victory lane.

Sixth Circuit rules HISA constitutional

The United States Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit Friday (March 3) ruled the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) constitutional. The decision is in stark contrast with the Fifth Circuit ruling, which unanimously found HISA unconstitutional late last year.

"We are disappointed with the decision, but we plan to appeal it, and we are confident our legal position will win in the end. The HISA Act puts an unaccountable private corporation in charge of horse racing nationwide, and then requires that states pay for the privilege," said Russell Williams, president of the United States Trotting Association (USTA). "As Justice (Samuel) Alito recently explained, 'To ensure the Government remains accountable to the public, it cannot delegate authority to a private entity.' That is just what HISA does."

Two-year-old OSS sustaining payment due March 15

If you intend to race your 2-year-old in the 2023 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) program, please submit your sustaining payment by mail, postdated no later than March 15, 2023, or through the OSS online form.

The sustaining payment is \$600 (\$460 USD). Two-year-olds sustained to the 2023 OSS must have been nominated as a yearling in 2022.

If your 2-year-old was not nominated to the OSS as a yearling in 2022, it can still be nominated by submitting the \$1,500 (\$1,115 USD) late fee and form prior to March 15, 2023.

Once nominated, the 2-year-old can then be sustained for the 2023 2-year-old season by submitting the \$600 sustaining payment, also by March 15, 2023.


