Two by two by two

Horse of the Year winner Test Of Faith is further proof horses are best in pairs.

Brett Pelling expressed some surprise that his great filly Test Of Faith was submissive rather than dominant with her constant turnout companion.

He shouldn't have been. Over the years I've come to the realization that there's no correlation between a horse's character on the track and his or her character in the field. This was reinforced in the two breeding seasons when we had Moni Maker here at Walnut Hall. Moni always had her own constant companion, and wherever one of them went, the other went, too.

Moni was a big, stout mare, and on the track I've never seen

her equal. Her pal was a little thing, probably at least a hand shorter than Moni. She almost looked like her great friend's mascot. But anytime the little girl just laid an ear back, Moni Maker was gone to the other side of the paddock.

As a breed, horses are "buddy animals." They naturally align themselves in pairs, in their present, modern incarnation. Volumes have been written about how things worked in the natural state, with one dominant stallion for a band of mares, and the hierarchy of mares within the band.

I'm not going to rehearse any of that, because for our purposes, as breeders in 2022, the fact that mares will naturally "buddy up" is the important point. In actual practice it means that horses should always be turned out in even numbers, so no 'lonely onlies' are created.

Simple, no, but I bet I wouldn't have to go very far to find an uneven number of horses together in the same field. In fact I know I won't, because there are three thoroughbred mares in a field just down the road.

On the subject of equine domination and submission, a fairly hard search found no term that defined this subject. So I've invented my own term for it: pasture personality. It simply means that horses are naturally buddy animals, and one of the two will always be the dominant actor, and one the submissive one.

In a sense this follows with us, human animals. We go in pairs, i.e. one man, one woman, although this has as much or more to do with procreation than anything else. But in human terms, there always is one dominant figure in every group. How that happens is to be found in the history of our evolution, but has nothing to do with you, me, Brett Pelling, or Test Of Faith, whose pedigree is quite interesting.

Test Of Faith is by Art Major, a Hall of Fame stallion, and out of Cannae Cammie, by Cam's Card Shark. Cannae Cammie is a wonderful example of a mare with a speed gene genetic deck that probably starts with a 10 and goes up from there.

From three breedings to three different stallions, this mare has produced the winners of \$1,559,739, \$586,546 and \$282,289.

They comprise three of her five foals of racing age, including a 2-year-old of 2021. This is the kind of mare who will always provide a high speed gene card for her 50 per cent contribution to any mating, and it has nothing to do with her own track earnings of \$538,160. Which I know you and the rest of our little world will scoff at, but it happens to be true.

Strangely enough, the buying public has not really caught on to what a loaded shotgun C.C. is. Only one of her foals topped \$100,000, and that was only by \$10,000. Even Test Of Faith brought only \$92,000. Which just doesn't compute, because with Cannae Cammie's half-a-million in track earnings her progeny should have been in high demand, even though for the wrong reason.

In case you forgot, it's the wrong reason because every horse's phenotype, or living horse which includes racetrack performance, has no correlation with its genotype, or genetic profile, with special emphasis on the speed gene.

Back to C²'s extended pedigree, it brings back some personal memories. C²'s fourth dam is Gidget Lobell, and her fifth dam is GoGo Playmate, both mares bred and owned by Yours Truly. Gidget produced the great horse, No Nukes, who was probably the fastest pacer we'd ever seen in his prime but fate never gave him a chance to prove it.

As a sire, from his first crop, Nukes had both the champion 2-year-old colt, and the champion 2-year-old filly, Jate Lobell and Nadia Lobell, respectively. Their last names tell you where they came from.

Looking further at C²'s pedigree, you see Romola Hanover as the fourth dam of Art Major. This is the great Romola family that's still going great today. But C² also has two crosses to Abercrombie being 2 by 4 to him, and his second dam is a Tar Heel daughter named Hobby Horse Tar. She was bred by a dear friend of mine, Bob O'Donnell, gone much too soon. And Hobby Horse Tar also traces directly to Romola's sister, Nora Adele.

Both mares were out of May Dodge, who from three daughters shaped the breed of the modern American pacer.

There's also Bret's Romance in the last generation, and she has personal significance. She was bred by Earl Teater, the great saddle horse trainer who was the hero of my youth. His best horse was Wing Commander, still the standard that five gaited horses are measured by.

In the fourth generation line there's a mare called Meadow Trick. I owned her twice as a race mare, thanks to claiming races. Then, after she was retired, I sold her to John Stewart, Bob and Tom's brother. He bred the dam of Cam's Card Shark with her.

For those who weren't around then, Cam's Card Shark gave the lie to the belief that, to be successful, as a stallion had be sharp headed. (Full disclosure; I've always had that belief.)

It suddenly occurs to me that Cam's Card Shark may have passed on his plain head to Cannae Cammie, and that may have something to do with the relatively reasonable prices her progeny have brought. And that word, reasonable, evokes the memory of the immortal girl in the bar, the one who, when asked if she was free, replied, "No, but I am reasonable."





TALES FROM THE CURMUDGEON

Traveling a long, successful road with the great Gilles Gendron

It was the fall of 1964, and this scribe had been working for les Fermes Miron, then the largest and undoubtedly the best standardbred racing stable in Canada.

The enterprise was owned by the five Miron Brothers who came from abject poverty to build what was then the largest cement company in Canada and one of the largest in all of North America. The brothers, Adrien, Gerard, Raymond, Vincent and Gilbert had all been active in the building of the cement business and the quarry that produced the cement that has been described as the product from which modern Montreal was built.

The business was sold to a giant Belgian firm for many millions of dollars.

The oldest of the Mirons and the company's face Adrien, had always loved horses and horse racing and decided to use some of his new found wealth to build one of North America's great racing stables. In effect, he took his younger four siblings along for the ride. The ownership of the racehorses were raced under the name Adrien & Gerard Miron, but all five brothers had a financial stake in the enterprise. The stable quickly became

one of the best in the North America. It undoubtedly reached the peak of its success when Tie Silk won the 1962 Roosevelt International Trot for trainer/driver Keith Waples. This was undoubtedly the biggest and most important race that they won, but there were many others as well.

Alas, Waples was to be the stable's trainer/driver for only that one year. Keith had decided that roaming throughout North America racing horses from track to track was not for him. The stable then hired a young French Canadian from Lac Megantic by the name of Marcel Dostie to assume those duties.

As I am sometimes prone to do, I am wandering. This story is not about the Mirons and the somewhat short-lived dynasty that they established. To a lesser degree, it is about Dostie and this wonderful man's effect that he had on the life of one of the greatest yet somewhat unrecognized driving talents I have seen, the now 77 year old retiree Gilles Gendron. As somewhat of a footnote, Marcel Dostie also played a big part in any success I've achieved in this sport.

Back to the beginning.

Adrien Miron had once been to the Little Brown Jug. He loved owning good horses. He would often overpay. However, he realized that was what someone sometimes had to do to get quality. He also loved appearing on the world's harness racing stage.

The date was Sept. 19, 1964. Monsieur Adrien (as I and others referred to him), had decided that he wanted to have a horse to race in the next Thursday's Little Brown Jug. I might add that although the Mirons and their racing manager, their nephew Jean Pierre Dion and Marcel Dostie, could get by in English, their primary language was French. They sometimes relied on me to do some of the talking when it came to dealing with English speaking people.

Jean Pierre Dion told me that his uncle needed a Little Brown Jug horse. "He wants you to call the connections of all the entries and see what might be for sale."

Whatever Monsieur Adrien wanted, Monsieur Adrien usually got. I began phoning the owners of the Jug entrants. I believe it was on the third call that I spoke with Jack Baugh, the owner of a Shadow Wave chestnut colt named Red Carpet. He was what I would describe as a "lower middler" of the entrants. If things went absolutely his way, he might have a chance of getting a piece of

the action. Mr. Baugh said that his colt would be for sale if he could realize enough for him. Jean Pierre called his uncle, conveying the price and also my dim view of his chances of his winning the race.

"I don't care" said Adrien. "Call him back and tell him he has a deal."

I think, but I'm not certain that Clarence Martin was training the colt at the time. Adrien wanted the horse in his stable under the stewardship of Dostie, ASAP. Dostie wanted to have his best groom, a young lad of 20 named Gilles Gendron to be the colt's caretaker. There were a few problems, though. Red Carpet was in Delaware, OH. Gilles Gendron was in St Augustin, QC.

In addition, young Mr. Gendron spoke not a single word of English at the time. How would he get to Ohio and how would he manage while there? Enter Murray Brown.

Marcel called me on Sunday, "I want you to drive to Delaware and take Gilles with you. He doesn't drive a car and doesn't speak English, so you will be in charge. As far as taking care of the horse is concerned, he doesn't need any help. This kid is a natural with a horse. He's the best natural horseman I've ever been around. Mark my words, this kid will become a great driver one of these days. He has the best set of hands I've ever seen."

This was said before Gendron had ever participated in a single race, although he had driven many sets of Marcel's pupils in training sessions.

Back to the Fall of 1964.

With my limited knowledge of French, I drove Gendron to Delaware Ohio. I seem to recall us stopping for the evening at a motel in Cleveland.

As for that Jug itself, it was won by the W R Haughton trained and driven Vicar Hanover. As predicted, Red Carpet didn't do well, but his being run into didn't help his cause any. Dostie actually made an objection, the only time I ever saw one in Delaware.

It's now 58 years later. Much as Dostie predicted, Gilles Gendron became a great driver. So good that:

- 1. He has won 7,054 races and his horses in those events have earned \$36,022,373.
- 2. He won 11 consecutive driving championships at Blue Bonnets when his competition among others included Hall of Famers Benoit Cote, Jim Doherty, Herve and Yves Filion, Jacques Hebert, Gilles and Michel Lachance, Keith and Ron Waples, Bill Wellwood and others such as Henri Filion, Robert Samson and of course his mentor Marcel Dostie.
- 3. In 1972, the fairly new Windsor Raceway conducted a North American Drivers Championship won by Gendron over Carmine Abbatiello, Ron Feagan, Herve Filion, Del Insko, Joe Marsh Jr, Lew Williams and Greg Wright. The winner receiving a brand new Chrysler Imperial automobile.
- 4. In addition to his incredible streak at Blue Bonnets, he has also been the leading driver at Freestate and Pompano Park.

You are just a baby at 77, compared to an old fart like me, a newly minted octogenarian. What do you do to keep yourself busy these days?

"I'm pretty much retired. I live in Ste Eustache just north of Montreal, not too far from where the old Miron Farm was. When

it warms up a little, I work a few days at a golf club helping in maintenance. I play a little, but not well at all. I'm still involved in watching racing, all kinds of racing and from just about everywhere. I watched the big thoroughbred race from Saudi Arabia on Saturday. I watch racing from pretty much anywhere I can find it."

Do you find much difference between the racing in your era and what we find today?

"It's very different. The key element in my opinion is the advent of the catch driver. Even though catch drivers were prevalent in my time — heck I was primarily one myself — we always had a few horses that we trained ourselves. The style of racing is so much different today. It's all go, go, go. It's rare that you get a chance to give a horse a breather in a race. I don't blame the drivers, because it's their job to do as well as they can by any means necessary. Chances are that they might not be behind the horse next week that they are behind tonight. I think it's also much harder to be a driver today. The top ones are always on the go — both day and night. They might be flying or driving to race at places in Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Ohio in the afternoon and then have to drive or fly to New York, The Meadowlands and Canada at night. There's a lot of work and a lot of stress involved."

Who were the best horses you've ever sat behind?

"They were both trotters. I drove Grades Singing when she was

Three Year Old Trotter of 1964. I think my all-time favorite was Garland Lobell who as we both know has had such a profound influence on the breed. He was able to make seemingly ordinary mares into world champion producers."

Who were the best drivers you raced against?

"If I had to pick just one it would be Herve Filion. He was just incredible. There was only one like him and we will never see his like again. Then of course, there are others, many others — Michel Lachance, John Campbell, Bill O'Donnell, Lew Williams, Henri Filion. I think one who's name is not mentioned enough is Benoit Cote, not only a great driver, but a great horseman and perhaps most importantly one of the greatest human beings who has ever been involved in our great sport."

You mentioned Mike Lachance. I know that you are still friendly with him and speak with him occasionally. One thing I need to tell you is that he and I generally get together and chat, usually at Harrisburg, each year. Invariably, the conversation turns to drivers. Here is something that he has said to me more than once. "People have asked me how good a driver Gilles Gendron was. I always correct them. I tell them Gilles Gendron wasn't a good driver, Gilles Gendron was a GREAT DRIVER!

"That is very kind of him. We've been friends for a long time. He not only was a great driver and a great horseman, he is also one of the most intelligent people I've known in all my years in the sport."

In addition to still spending a lot of time watching races everywhere, what else do you do to keep yourself busy?

"I'm still a huge hockey fan, although my Habs haven't given me a whole lot to be happy about this year. But they are still young and they've picked up a lot in the last couple of weeks. I'm a friend of Serge Savard who I speak with occasionally. Of course, Serge is also quite active as an owner in harness racing. I was also a good friend of John Ferguson. I look back and think that he probably enjoyed horse racing as much as he did hockey. When I raced at Freestate, I raced some horses for Mark May, one of the famous "Hogs" of the Washington Redskins. He was a really nice guy and loved racing as well."

Tell me something about Gilles Gendron that nobody knows?

"I don't know about nobody, but here is something that very few people know. I and a few friends once owned Cam Fella. There were three of us. We bought three mares in foal, with the goal of raising their foals and selling them as yearlings. One of those mares was Nan Cam, the dam of Cam Fella, who was carrying him when we bought the mares. We kept the mares at Walnut Hall Farm where they had their babies. We sold Cam Fella as a yearling, for as I recall \$21,000. He was bought by Doug Arthur. Doug started him fairly late at 2. I think in November, maybe even December. He made a few starts with him and then sold him to the two Norms, Clements and Faulkner, for as I heard \$100,000. After she had Cam Fella, she never had another notable foal again."

If you were younger, how do you think you'd do on the racetrack today?

"I think I'd do alright. I'm pretty sure that I could hold my own. I do think, though, that I'd have to make some adjustments to my driving style to keep up with the speed of today. I look back upon myself as being more of a finesse type driver, rather than one who puts an emphasis on speed. I think that if you are good, you are good. The same also applies if you are not."

Plenty of fresh faces part of MGM Borgata Pacing Series nominations

The 2022 free-for-all stakes season officially kicks off in just over two weeks with the first of five preliminary legs for the MGM Borgata Pacing Series on Monday, March 21. Included in the hyper-competitive list of nominations that were announced this week is defending 2021 champion This Is The Plan. Though, returning faces make up a small number of the total list of nominations. Nearly three-quarters of those eligible to the series being Borgata series first-timers.

There were 40 nominations to this year's Borgata, down from 47 last year. And of those 40, only 11 are ones that raced in at least one leg of the series last year. Beginning first with those who competed last year, This Is The Plan leads that group. Motivated by a terrific win from post 8 in last year's Borgata series final, he went on to win over \$800,000 for the season which included an all-time record of 1:47.3 of any half-mile surface. He qualified Saturday (March 5) at the Meadowlands as he works towards his pari-mutuel debut this season.

Other returning contenders include Leonidas A, who won all four preliminary legs that he raced in last year and looked like he would be a finals threat before running up against it with an outside post draw. None Bettor A and American History didn't fire in a few of the legs they tried last year, but the latter remains fast as usual. American History co-owns the track record at Yonkers and is coming off a 1:49.4 win in the preferred at the Meadowlands last week in a race where he narrowly bested fellow Borgataeligible Covered Bridge, as well as Sonny Weaver N.

Of the 29 nominations who are new to the Borgata, Tattoo Artist leads the way. In fact, new nomination or not, he ought to be considered the pre-series favorite of everyone. He makes his 2022 debut this Monday in the Yonkers Open, and it comes on the heels off a strong return qualifying win in 1:50.2 over

another Borgata newcomer, Nandolo N. He crushed open foes at Yonkers twice in November, and in an October win, Tattoo Artist tied an all-age track record of 1:49.3. His mark of 1:47.1 last year came on Hambletonian Day at the Meadowlands. Dexter Dunn has been the regular driver for Tattoo Artist, and he'll look to avenge last year's Borgata, when he went into that series with the presumed overwhelming favorite Let It Ride N, who disappointed.

Next up as another live contender is the 4-year-old Whichwaytothebeach. The Hempt winner, who also finished third in both the Pepsi North America Cup and Little Brown Jug, was a recent \$390,000 sales-topping purchase in January from the Tattersalls 2022 Winter Mixed Sale. Sold to Canadian interests, he qualified two weeks ago at Woodbine Mohawk Park to win by almost a double-digit margin. Also selling from that same sale and nominated to the Borgata is 2020 Little Brown Jug winner Captain Barbossa. He went for \$210,000 from the Winter Mixed Sale and has been racing in the Meadowlands preferreds so far this year.

Among the stronger nominees trained by Jennifer Bongiorno, last year's leading conditioner at Yonkers, are Nicholas Beach and Dragon Said. It'll be worth watching to see how Dragon Said stacks up against Borgata competition. He had a monster year last year under Bongiorno, winning 10 of 22 races en route to a rapid ascension up the class ladder. He took a mark of 1:49.4 last year at Yonkers and just won the open last week over Leonidas A. Barn mate Nicholas Beach was one of the top FFA horses last year and qualified Saturday at the Meadowlands as he gears up for his 6-year-old season. His 1:47.2 mark from last year was taken at the Meadowlands in a Preferred where he bested upcoming competitors This Is The Plan and American History.

One of the unknowns is that of American Dealer N. He raced Saturday at the Meadowlands (after the deadline for this column) so we'll get a better read then. By American Ideal out of a Bettors Delight mare, he sports a strong record from Australia

and looks to have qualified well enough right in behind Tattoo Artist and Nondolo N from that Feb. 26 qualifier. Scott Zeron has the call thus far for trainer Linda Toscano.

As usual, Ron Burke will send out a strong contingent. Fresh Borgata faces from his stable include among others, Elver Hanover and Bee Two Bee. Ohio standout Elver Hanover has proved before he can go with these types, while Bee Two Bee had been competitive in the Yonkers opens in December. Covered Bridge is another Burke trainee that may give the Borgata a shot. He was second to American History at the Meadowlands on 2/26 and won back-to-back preferreds at that track prior.

Other horses that catch the eye is Nandolo N, coming from the barn of Shane Tritton. He makes his first start of the year Saturday at the Meadowlands and the two recent qualifiers look strong. He won a Yonkers open handicap in 1:50 in November. Jacks Legend N has been a winning machine in Delaware and goes for a dangerous barn in Josh Green. No Lou Zing may give the series a chance as a 5-year-old for trainer Nancy Takter, was a solid 3-year-old the year before last.



The omnifecta experiment

Fonner Park exclusive bet holds promise for harness tracks.

by Melissa Keith

Fonner Park introduced a new wager on Feb. 19, opening day of the 2022 season. The Nebraska thoroughbred track rolled out the omnifecta, becoming the first venue on this side of the Atlantic to offer it. "Pick two of the top three and win," declared promotions. "Three possible winning combinations. Consult a mutuel teller for info."

The omnifecta/omni bet is a more forgiving version of the quinella. In some markets, it's known as the "swinger" / "tote swinger." At Fonner, it's officially the "show quinella." On self-serve machines, "the button actually says '2 in \$," said Mark Landis, financial analyst/operations assistant at Fonner. "2 in \$" is shorthand for "two in the money," a summary of how the bet works: Hit the board with two horses, any order.

Each winning omni combination has its own payout. The wager is already available to North American ADW bettors playing certain international races (UK, South Africa, Dubai) with at least six starters. If the field is scratched down to 4-5 horses, the omni reverts to a traditional quinella, paying out on the race's top two finishers only.

"Actually, there are four different methods in Nebraska for offering this [wager]. You can make it one pay per race – that's one variation," Landis told HRU. "We rejected that. We wanted the three different payouts, because if you get a longshot, you should be rewarded for that. And the [state racing] commission explicitly praised us for that."

Omnifecta wagering accounts for a considerable proportion of

South African handle. In February, the 2022 World Sports Betting Cape Town Met race meet at Kenilworth drew 650 million South African Rand in wagering (\$42,369,318 U.S.), thanks to eight of 12 races commingling pools with the Hong Kong Jockey Club tote. The most popular wagers? Quinella and omni.

"We didn't have visions of dollar signs floating in our eyes when we set out to do this," said Landis. "We were looking for a bet that caters to our casual fans and our beginner fans... Fonner Park is one of the very few tracks in the country that sells out every Saturday. It feels like you're stepping back to the glory days of the '80s and '90s. It's really fun, but these are not sophisticated bettors. They're not the grinders who are looking for that value and the perfect ticket structure and all that."

It took nearly two years to convince CEO Chris Kotulak that they should try the omni.

"I saw the bet at other tracks, I think Saudi Arabia and Dubai. I thought, 'Man, this is a great bet. We should have this thing,' it's a great beginners' bet," said Landis. The timing wasn't right until this season, but the bet's arrival seemed almost predestined: When he applied to the Nebraska Racing and Gaming Commission, "the omni had actually been approved for Nebraska racing way back in 1985."

Friend and local businessman Pat O'Neill (of O'Neill Wood Resources) liked the omni idea enough to support it.

"So he did a corporate sponsorship and paid for all the tote fees and that stuff, to get the thing set up for us. And sure enough, here we are, up and going with it."

The \$2-minimum omni debuted with Fonner's lowest (15 per cent) takeout rate. "We really think it's a good bet for the casual fan," said the financial analyst. "There's a lot of leeway with this thing. How many times are we walking through our [grand] stands and somebody's [saying] 'Oh, I got two out of three in the exacta?""

On Friday (March 4), the race 7 omni pool (\$1,478) was much

smaller than the exactor pool (\$23,547).

"We're trying to get traction for it," said Landis. "It's doing better than I had hoped it would... I also had dreams and hopes and visions, and it's not getting there yet."

Aqueduct media releases from 2013 suggested the Queens, NY track would be North America's first to offer the omni, in 2014. (It did not.) Now, there are rumours of another track looking to follow Fonner's lead.

"There is very little cost," explained the Nebraska track's spokesman. "I'm not worried about cannibalization from the other pools. It's a great way to get more people involved in the pari-mutuel side of racing." And there's no reason for harness tracks to avoid the omni, which has the advantage (over multi-leg bets) of creating churn: "It's not specific to breed at all."

As on-track promotions go, the omni experiment holds more promise than another t-shirt giveaway, keeping bettors happily cashing more often. "That's the vibe at Fonner Park," said Landis. "That's the way we roll here: Big community involvement, huge fan base, a lot of fun."

Idao de Tillard incorruptible in Prix de Selection

Thierry Duvaldestin trained 4-year-old **Idao de Tillard** (Severino) played with his opponents when the \$265,000 Prix de Selection closed the French winter meeting in Paris on Saturday (March 5) afternoon.

Driver Clément Duvaldestin aimed for the front position and when toughest opponent Hohneck (started 25 meters behind Idao de Tillard) connected on the leader's outside, the Idao de Tillard had the race in his hands. In the last turn, the Thierry Duvaldestin-trained talent left the challengers a couple of lengths behind and the stretch drive wasn't that exciting. Idao de Tillard had everything under control in a 1:55.4 (mile rate) victory and Clément Duvaldestin claimed his biggest win in his career so far.

Idao de Tillard has become one of the most interesting horses in Paris this winter and is not an undeserved winner in this prestigious race. Star trotters have dominated Prix de Selection throughout the years and superstar Face Time Bourbon had claimed the trophy in three consecutive years ahead of the 2022 edition.

Idao de Tillard possesses all attributes that's required to become the new star in France.

Philippe Allaire trained duo Hohneck and Italiano Vero finished second and third, respectively.

Elie de Beaufour wins Prix du Plateau de Graville

A tough three-wide trip during the race's first kilometer didn't stop Jean-Michel Bazire's top gelding Elie de Beaufour (Royal Dream) in the \$98,500 Prix du Plateau de Graville over 1.3 miles.

Bazire tried to be offensive when the car left the field, but horses on the inside opened quickly and Elie de Beaufour had to travel outside, three wide until Bazire hit the lead midway into the race. When in front, Elie de Beaufour was unstoppable and the 8-year-old gelding claimed his 26th career win in 36 starts. The mile rate in his fourth win this meeting in Paris this winter was 1:55.1 and Elie de Beaufour would obviously be a hot attraction in several big races in Europe this spring and summer. And Jean-Michel Bazire might aim for some of the races in the northern European countries, even if he has stated that none of his horses will compete in Sweden, due to — what Bazire claims —too big differences and in some ways injustices regarding the Swedish regulations in the sport.

Granvillaise Bleue wins Prix des Centaures

The winter meeting's last stakes event for monté trotters came in the \$265,000 Prix des Centaures over 1.3 miles. First choice Granvillaise Bleue (Jag de Bellouet) had 25 meters disadvantage to fight against and when leader Ici C'est Paris's jockey David Thomain opted for a very high pace in front, it seemed to be a long way to victory for Granvillaise Bleue. But jockey Camile Levesque disposed her horse's power well and in the last turn she made serious contact with leader Ici C'est Paris. The 6-year-old mare was strong over the stretch and claimed the trophy in an impressive mile rate of 1:53.2.



Big Gulp drinking in success at Miami Valley for his new trainer Walter Haynes, Jr.

Gelding Big Gulp dominated the Indiana fair circuit at 2 and picked up four wins as a sophomore for trainer Jay Cross. Purchased last November by Brian Carsey and Jeff Fought and sent to Walter Haynes Jr., the Always A Virgin—Astra Destiny 4-year-old has hit the board in six of seven starts this season, winning three times. His most recent victory came March 3 when Sam Widger steered him to a narrow victory over battle tested Rockin Ron at Miami Valley in a time of 1:52.4.

"He's got a really good heart. He has no idea how fast he can go because he's never been pushed to his absolute limit, I don't think," said Haynes. "You never exhaust him or exert him so much that he gets sour. He's never been like that. The other



night he came first up and just sat on the outside and beat some good horses."

Big Gulp was not a project horse when he arrived in Haynes' barn. In fact, quite the opposite. Slugging it out in the ultra-competitive Indiana Sires Stakes program, the gelding's 5-2-5 record in 20 starts last year is not indicative of his ability. Before adding the pacer to his stable late in the season, Haynes had a pair of 3-year-old colts that also competed in the division.

"Oh, they were brutal. There had to be 12-15 horses that could pace in 1:50 or better. They did it every week. It's just so tough here," he said of the division.

Campaigned by Cross for breeder/owner Ben Yoder and Anna Yoder, McKenzie Yoder and Michael Yoder, the then-sophomore



competed in six of seven Indiana Sires Stakes legs. He managed two third-place efforts despite pacing in 1:52.3 or faster each time out, and timed in 1:49.2 in the last leg. Big Gulp did not accumulate the points necessary to make the lucrative Super Final and raced third in the \$25,000 consolation, completing the mile in 1:51.1. He followed that effort by capturing a \$34,000 Circle City division at Harrah's Hoosier Park in a lifetime best 1:49.4 on a track rated sloppy. After a three-length romp one week later, Carsey and Fought purchased the gelding.

"Jay did a great job with him. Jay was the one that never over-drove him and hurt him. So the horse is just in a good frame of mind right now," Haynes said. "He showed so much speed. He showed a lot of speed everywhere. Jay is great to buy off of and great with babies because he never hurts them. He makes great horses."

Haynes made three starts with Big Gulp to close out 2021, capping the trio of races with a victory during Hoosier Park's closing weekend. Whereas Cross had used steel shoes on the pacer's back feet, Haynes opted for aluminum.

"I didn't change a lot on him. I put aluminums on him after his second start for me. I just thought he'd be a lot better-gaited that way. I don't know that he is better-gaited. He's just a little easier on himself."

After a break of just over a month, the gelding qualified at Miami Valley on Jan. 7 and won his seasonal debut five days later, stopping the clock in 1:52. He picked up another win the following week. Over the next four attempts, Big Gulp hit the board three times and raced fourth in the other start. After a runner-up performance Feb. 24, Widger suggested Haynes "open up" the pacer, accustomed to wearing a blind bridle, his next time behind the starting gate.

"The last thing Jay told me is, 'Don't open him up because he will absolutely run off. He gets paranoid," Haynes said. "Jay said he jogged him with some half blinds and he ran off with him and he couldn't hardly get him stopped."

Armed with that knowledge, Haynes made a subtle change on Big Gulp's equipment. He opted to switch to a blind bridle that included holes which were covered with velcro. He moved the velcro back so that the 4-year-old could see about a half an inch. The hope was to fix Big Gulp's tendency to lose focus once on the lead. It appears to have worked in the short term as he out-finished favored Rockin Ron by a neck Thursday at Miami Valley after racing first over most of the mile.

"The first two days he was a little scary, boy. He acts like someone is going to kill him," offered the trainer. "Sammy said he was way better. Once he gets beside the horse, and he can still see him, he keeps racing him, instead of getting to the front and slowing down and another horse comes back and passes him."

Big Gulp has quickly banked \$41,750 this winter for his connections. If he continues to win, the pacer will run through the rest of his conditions and move into the invitational ranks. He is proving to be a versatile horse that could compete in Ohio or Indiana, giving Haynes, who lives just north of Hoosier Park in Alexandria, Indiana,

flexibility as the track opens for live racing later this month.

"He's not a bad shipper, by any means. It's easier to ship 15 minutes than three hours to Scioto or a little over an hour to Miami Valley. We can go a lot of ways," he said. "He shows big last quarters at Hoosier Park, but he also shows good last quarters at Miami Valley; :27.4, :27.3, :28, which is good for the wintertime. He's a nice horse. He's beaten some good horses this year and he's paced some big miles. I think he's an invite horse. He won last year in 49.4, so I think he can do that."







Torrential rain postpones the \$1 million Miracle Mile until next Saturday

History awaits champion pacer King Of Swing a little bit longer than expected.

After a fantastic week of build-up to the \$A1 million Miracle Mile at Menangle in NSW, a freak storm forced the postponement of Down Under's richest race, which was to be held Saturday (March 5). It will now be held next Saturday night (March 12).

Eight pacers have won the Miracle Mile twice in its 54-year history, but King Of Swing was a red-hot favourite (\$1.60 for \$1 bet) to become the first three-time winner after drawing the coveted pole position.

Under the rules of the race, the field and barriers will remain the same for next week.

With a good crowd in attendance, things turned ugly and very quickly when torrential rain hit Menangle at 9 p.m. last night, just 40 minutes before the Mile was scheduled to be run.

The rain, accompanied by gale-force winds, hit just as the field

was racing in one of the main support races, the \$A100,000 Ainsworth free-for-all, eventually won by Zeuss Bromac.

Drivers returned from the race saying they'd never competed in worse conditions.

"I've never seen or driven in anything like it. When I crossed the line, I put my arms down straight and the water just poured back out of my driving suit," said Jack Trainor, driver of runner-up Stylish Memphis.

The rain then only got heavier over the next 45 minutes.

Officials moved the Mile back to 10.13 p.m., but as the rain continued, along with lightning and thunder, at 10 p.m., the decision was made to postpone the remainder of the meeting.

"We really had no choice," Menangle racing manager David Wonson said. "The rain hadn't stopped and even when it finally did, we'd have needed a fair bit of time to try and fix the track (surface).

"The rain was so heavy and went for so long, it washed a lot of the surface away. There was also the issue of so much surrounding water running down across the track even if the rain stopped.

"It's so disappointing after the build-up we've had, but it's beyond our control."

King Of Swing's co-trainer and driver, Luke McCarthy, was philosophical after the decision.

"It's no real issue or negative for him," he said. "We just go back home and train him again for next week.

"But it is disappointing because this had become such a big moment for the sport. You just hope we can recapture that again a week later."

Not only is this Miracle Mile a chance for King Of Swing to do what no other horse has done, but there is also a huge chance it will be his last race start.

Senior part-owner Glen Moore said as much in last week's build-up.

"Everyone knows he's retiring to stud this year, but it's just a

matter of when," he said. "If he was to come out and win then it's hard not to think that's the perfect way to go out... with a piece of history.

"Put it this way, for a few weeks now, all we've been focused on is this race. Nothing beyond it."

King Of Swing, a son of Rocknroll Hanover, has raced 81 times for 43 wins, 18 placings and earned \$A2.84 million.

He is already the only horse to win two of Down Under's absolute marquee races, the Miracle Mile and Hunter Cup, twice.

This week also saw the retirement of one of Down Under's champion trotters, Tornado Valley.

The 10-year-old was born and started his career in New Zealand, but it was his sale and subsequent move to join top trainers Andy and Kate Gath in Victoria, Australia which transformed Tornado Valley's career.

He won 39 races – 10 of them at Group 1 level – and topped \$A1 million in career earnings.

Tornado Valley's \$A1,033,977 made him the third-richest Australian-based trotter of all-time behind Sundons Gift (\$1,275,264) and Keystone Del (\$1,063,560).

His biggest wins came in the 2018 Melbourne Inter Dominion final along with the 2020 and '21 Great Southern Stars finals. All races were at Melton.

"He gave Norm (Jenkin, owner), Kate (Gath) and I the most amazing four years. He was an absolute delight around the stables as well," Andy Gath said.

"His record probably would've been even better, but he was such an awful traveller we really couldn't take him interstate or over to NZ to race. He just stayed at home," Gath said.

"The two greatest wins for me were that Inter Dominion final where he won all three heats and the final in our backyard along with his win in the heat, more so than the final, of the 2021 Great Southern Star.

"That's the race where he proved himself a champion to me. He was first-up from a spell and we really didn't know where he was at as far as form and fitness going into it. He'd been written-off by plenty, but he came out and won that heat and the final a couple of hours later.

"You have to have champion qualities to come out and do what he did that night."

Readers are reminded that because a person's name appears on the list does not necessarily mean they are guilty of an offense. Many times, cases are not finalized and many of the accused are still entitled to due process.

Also, please note, for context, the first link is to the Association of Racing Commissioners International's classification system of drug penalties to give readers a sense of the difference between a Class 1 and a Class 4 positive.

Working on a whodunit

I was shredding my air guitar, remembering lyrics, and hitting the right notes.

Then the music stopped.

On my dashboard screen was the message,

INCOMING CALL,

SANFORD FLORIDA,

44070468343.

ANSWER or DECLINE.

Usually, I decline. My theory is that the less you answer the phone, the less bad news you hear. However, in my defense, I know many people in Florida, including relatives dear to my heart, and there are horse training centers in the area, including

one where I have a 2-year-old in training. Plus, I have visited the town of Sanford and have had some good times there.

I pushed the answer button on the screen and said, "Hello."

A slightly growly, energetic male voice replied, "How ya doing man?"

I didn't recognize the voice. You have probably experienced this awkward moment in a call where you feel like asking, "Who is this?" But you don't ask because it seems insulting. Besides, you figure you will quickly put the puzzle together.

So, like a fool, I replied with a peppy, "Doing good."

The voice growled a bit faster, excited, "It looks like a go man, first of the month, five hundred per."

An idea for caller identification leaped into my head, "Hey, did you get a new phone? Your name didn't pop up on my screen, just your number."

"Nah, I'm using Ronnie's. Mine is in his truck. So, whaddaya think?"

"Um, interesting," I muttered with surprising enthusiasm.

"Interesting, it's friggin awesome. So, you're in?"

I tried another approach, "Was this the horse thing, or the gambling thing, or was it baseball or football?

"Haha, very funny," the strange voice said with a hint of confusion.

I tried another approach, "So, er, go over the details again."

"Dude, it's your idea. We just talked about it a week ago. It's pretty simple, but very ingenious. Let's roll."

No question about it. Hearing my plan referred to as ingenious felt good. At this point, I heard a beep on our connection.

Then the caller snarled, "Ah hell, Ronnie's wife is calling. Damn good thing she doesn't know what's going on. That lady is a real treat. She's a real fun sponge, ain't she."

I replied, "Yeah." Such is peer pressure or mental insecurity that I just slandered Ronnie's wife, a person who, for all I know, might be the second coming of Mother Teresa.



He said, "I better talk to her. I'll call you back in a few." He hung up.

At our disconnection, Neill Young continued his wailing, "Said the Joker to the Queen." The song was proof that our conversation was less than two minutes.

I turned down the volume. This call was disturbing on many levels.

I pulled into a McDonald's parking lot to wrap my mind around things and do some sleuthing. My first step was to use a reverse directory app to learn who the mystery caller was by using the phone number on my previous call list. The result of this search is the most troubling part of this ongoing saga. The app reported – NO MATCHING NUMBER.

If this was horse racing ownership or gambling related, I was vulnerable. Could this be a cyber ransom case?

As soon as I got home, I placed a hold on my credit card. The procedure only took a simple phone call. While my outstanding credit card balance was breathtaking, there were no additional charges since I purchased the ingredients for my DIY Margarita kit.

Next, I called to notify my horse race wagering platform to freeze my current banking information. The lady on the phone was very nice. She asked if I wanted the balance mailed to my home. Since the total balance of my available horse racing gambling funds was \$4.34, I told her to keep the change, making her laugh.

It has been a month without a follow-up call. I have not been indicted for a crime, received unexpected horse training bills, or been a cyber ransom victim. So far, the strain appears to be mental stress rather than monetary damage. The mystery is still unsolved.

This story does not have a lesson, except perhaps to be careful about answering the phone and maybe be a tad more direct in caller identification. Oh, and if you happen to be in Sanford, FL, and you see a truck driven by a guy named Ronnie arguing with his wife, do not approach the vehicle. Please write down the license number and place it in a cold case file.


