Luke McCarthy wins record fourth Miracle Mile

Don Hugo held off Leap To Fame in epic battle. by Adam Hamilton



What a family.

Luke McCarthy added another amazing chapter to one of harness racing's greatest families with a record-breaking \$1 million Miracle Mile win at Menangle Saturday night (March 8).

Global fans know so much of the U.S. heroics of younger brothers Andy and Todd, but Luke continues to remind everyone he's as good as any of them.

Luke, 42, became the most successful driver in the history of the great Miracle Mile when a masterly drive landed him a fourth win in the famed race aboard Don Hugo.

It followed his three successive wins aboard King Of Swing in 2020, '21 and '22.

But this one was different. This time it was Luke dethroning a "King" rather than winning on one.

Luke and Don Hugo had to beat Down Under's champion and one of the all-time greats, Leap To Fame, who won the race last year.

And Luke did it with a mix of genius and daring.

It took about 500 meters for the race to settle down, by which time Luke had one of his main dangers, Swayzee, buried three-back on the marker pegs, was leading himself and had the biggest danger, Leap To Fame, racing outside him.

"The race pretty much panned out as I expected with Tact McLeod burning across us at the start, but that was to my advantage because he crossed Swayzee and then when I ran to the lead it put Swayzee three back and needing lots of luck," Luke said. "I knew Leap To Fame would keep working forward and be outside me, but I thought tonight was the time to stand up and take the challenge.

"As great as he is, Leap To Fame, my horse went so well the week before and drew so well, I thought over the mile it was the right time to hold him out and see just where we stood."

As hard as Leap To Fame kept coming, Don Hugo had all the answers and held on to win by 1.3 meters over Leap To Fame with another 3.5 meters away to early leader Tact McLeod in the third spot.

They went a slick but not outrageous 1:48.4sec mile, which was 1.5 seconds outside the race and Australasian record.

Becoming the first driver to win four Miracle Miles hit home with Luke.

"It's such a great race, one you grow up in awe of and wanting to win... to do it four times is just amazing," he said. "To be honest, I didn't feel much pressure going into it. I felt I had the horse and the draw, but all the expectations were around Leap To Fame.

"It was awesome to win it, he's just such a fighter and it's incredible what he's done in the past six months or so."

The "roll" started when Don Hugo won the world's richest harness race, the \$2.1 million TAB Eureka at Menangle on Sept. 7.

He then returned to win an epic Inter Dominion pacing final at the same track on Dec. 14.

And now he's added a Miracle Mile.

"It's such a thrill to share not just this win, but all three big ones, with Tony [Licastro, owner] and all his family," Luke said. "They love it and it makes it extra special."

Luke has driven over 3000 career winners and the Miracle Mile was his 81st at the Group 1 level.

Leap To Fame lost no fans with a fantastic effort for second, while the Kiwi pacer Tact McLeod continued his terrific transition into the big league by fighting on well for third after the early burn.

The hard luck story was champion stayer Swayzee, who had little racing room back on the inside and charged home late for a close fourth, beaten just 4.9 meters.

NEXT BIG THING, ALWAYS HOT, WINS NEW SOUTH WALES DERBY

Unbeaten colt Always Hot snared the "next big thing" tag with his arrogant win in last night's \$200,000 Group 1 New South Wales Derby (2400m).

Trained by Emma Stewart and Clayton Tonkin, the Always B Miki colt made it eight wins from as many starts when he was unextended to beat a strong field by 8.6 meters in a slick 1:53.9 mile rate for 2,400 meters.

Going into the race, Stewart had dared to say the colt could be the stable's "next Ride High."

Ride High won 16 of his 18 starts and looked a champion in the making before injury ended his career.

"He's big like Ride High, but not quite as heavy," Stewart said.

Always Hot started from an outside draw, but worked forward to find the leader after 500 meters and never looked out of second gear.

"I didn't drive him at his first start, but I loved what I saw and he's just kept exciting me and getting better since," driver Greg Sugars said. "He didn't have much idea at 2, but he's starting to know and that's the scary part. He's very, very exciting and he did it easily."

Always Hot ran a :54 half from the 1,200-to-400 meters and still ripped home in :27.4 without Sugars asking him to extend.

Owner/breeder Peter Gleeson has already flagged taking on the 4-year-olds in the \$2.1 million TAB Eureka back at Menangle in September.

"We wouldn't be afraid to do that with him," Gleeson said.

KEAYANG CHUCKY TAKES \$100,000 HAMMERHEAD TROTTERS' MILE

Brilliant trotter Keayang Chucky snared his first Group 1 win and wasn't far off a Down Under record when he led throughout to win the \$100,000 Hammerhead Trotters' Mile last night.

The 6-year-old son of Love You's 1:51.9 mile was just 0.4sec outside Maori Time's Menangle track and Australasian record.

"He so deserved that one," driver Jason Lee said. "He ran second in the Inter Dominion and so well again through the Great Southern Star, but we felt we had him the best we ever have going into this.

"We thought he could lead and if he did it was time to hold the front, unlike the Inter Dominion, and see if he was up to it."

His cause was aided when favorite and star Kiwi Oscar Bonavena galloped away from the pole and the start and lost all chance.

But Keayang Chucky absorbed plenty of mid-race pressure from Inter Dominion winner The Locomotive and just kept rolling to win by six meters over London To A Brick with Arcee Phoenix third. The Locomotive was a fighting fourth.

Blue Pacific is the overachieving broodmare prospect making Seelster Farms proud

The Woodbine Mohawk Park filly and mare preferred pacing division recently lost three stalwarts to the broodmare ranks. Past O'Brien Award winners Silver Label (p, 4, 1:47.3; \$1,345,501) and stablemate Prohibition Legal (p, 4, 1:50s; \$876,394) were formally retired at Mohawk on Dec. 21, 2024, while the connections of Dabarndawgswatchin (p, 5, 1:49s; \$584,746) announced her retirement on Feb. 19.

Ironically, it's a 4-year-old broodmare prospect who has quickly reached the top class and helped make up for their absence.

Blue Pacific (p, 2, 1:50.2s; \$362,815) took her lifetime mark as a 2-year-old at Harrah's Hoosier Park, winning the \$210,000 Kentuckiana Stallion Management Pace for freshman fillies. The daughter of Sweet Lou—Miss Jones also won the \$150,000 New Jersey Classic final at The Meadowlands and finished second to Pass Line in her 2023 Breeders Crown elimination. Racing for trainers Joe Holloway and Scott DiDomenico at age 3, Blue Pacific spent half of her dozen starts in conditioned races at Harrah's Philadelphia, failing to hit the board in her only stakes attempts. She was scratched from her Jugette elimination due to being late for the detention barn.

Seelster Farms' reproduction manager Ann Straatman told HRU that the Lucan, ON standardbred nursery had definite plans for Blue Pacific when they purchased her at the 2024 Harrisburg Black Book Mixed Sale.

"Yes, Blue Pacific was purchased as a broodmare prospect; we thought she would be an excellent match for Bulldog Hanover," Straatman said on Thursday (March 6).

Seelster Farms stands Bulldog Hanover (p, 4, 1:45.4m; \$2,419,000), 2022 O'Brien and Dan Patch Horse of the Year and the fastest standardbred of all time.

Blue Pacific was a relative bargain at \$65,000, selling during a short lull between six-figure fillies.

"We had narrowed down our search in the Harrisburg Black Book mixed sale to our 20 favorites by pedigree," Straatman said. "Once my partners, Karen [Favacho] and Tina [Howard], along with assistant farm manager Jackie Prisciak had inspected

It was [Blue Pacific's] trainer, Dave Menary, that said in the winner's circle at the end of January, 'You thought you purchased a broodmare, but you actually got an open mare.

the 20, Blue Pacific was included in the top six mares that we intended to bid on. Seelster has always stuck to an upper limit for purchases, and it turned out Blue Pacific was the only one to fall within it. I'm not sure why, but we were grateful and knew that we had purchased a nice filly."

Breeding the lightly-raced filly was not a unanimous decision for the Seelster Farms team.

"Initially, our plans were to breed Blue Pacific to Bulldog Hanover in February this year," Straatman said. "It was Tina who suggested that we try and race her. I have to admit that I voted to breed her early; and have to give all the credit to my partners for taking a chance at racing, initially until the end of January. That way, we hoped that Blue Pacific could pay her way, hopefully make a little money, we'd have a little fun and could still breed her this season to Bulldog."

Trainer Dave Menary and driver James MacDonald first qualified Blue Pacific at Mohawk on Dec. 13. She beat four other pacers, going away, in 1:56 flat. Although she finished last to Canada's pacing queen So Much More in their first match-up, Dec. 21, she was only three lengths behind the winner at the wire. Blue Pacific broke her Mohawk maiden in her next start, Dec. 28.

Facing So Much More again on Jan. 3, Blue Pacific ended up second by a head in what remains Canada's co-fastest mile (1:52.4s) by a pacing mare so far this year. She went undefeated in four subsequent starts, including her own 1:52.4 victory Jan. 18 for Bob McClure. Back-to-back WMP filly and mare preferred wins Jan. 24 and Feb. 3 made Blue Pacific the 3-5 favorite on Friday (March 7), but she was collared late on the front end by winner Century Jamila and Glenboro. Blue Pacific ended up fourth, behind fast-closing show finisher Lyons Bettorday.

Prior to Friday night's race, the 4-year-old mare's earnings for her new owner had reached \$53,310.

Breeding was clearly no longer on the schedule for Blue Pacific this year.

"Given her success so far, we knew we had to revisit our plans for breeding before Feb. 15 and the decision has been made to continue racing Blue Pacific," Straatman said. The older pacing mare division has produced the 2024 Dan Patch Horse of the Year Twin B Joe Fresh and 2023 O'Brien Horse of the Year Sylvia Hanover in recent years. Both champions are returning to race in 2025, meaning that Blue Pacific will likely encounter them in the Milton Stake and Roses Are Red at Mohawk.

Straatman said it was too early to speculate about her mare's chances in Grand Circuit company this season.

"Twin B Joe Fresh and Sylvia Hanover are certainly to be considered the best of the best older pacing mares," she said. "I don't think we can judge at this time how well Blue Pacific will perform against them, until we actually have the opportunity to try her in the top ranks. We look forward to the competition and may the best mare win."

With the 2025 Breeders Crown at Mohawk on Oct. 18 (elims) and 25 (final), Seelster Farms is nonetheless pointing Blue Pacific toward that long-range objective.

"Absolutely, a Breeders Crown here at Mohawk would be our intended goal," Straatman said. "As long as Blue Pacific is healthy and sound, we are thrilled to be along for the ride.

"It was her trainer, Dave Menary, that said in the winner's circle at the end of January, 'You thought you purchased a broodmare, but you actually got an open mare."

Fate and hard work put Joe McLead's Sugar Valley Farms on the map

Like so many in this business, Joe McLead was, in effect, born into it. His grandfather, Dr. Dale Walters, was a veterinarian who established Sugar Valley Farms, the breeding operation that McLead, together with his uncle Billy Walters, owns and runs.

"Grandpa stood the first stallion to stand here, a horse by the name of Sugar Tree, who was best known as the sire of the great Ohio filly Saccharum," McLead said. "Through the years, the farm passed down to uncle Billy and me.

"I started working as a groom in Billy's racing stable. It was alright, but even then, I realized that I was more interested in the lineage of these great horses who I was privileged to take care of. Along the way I was fortunate to meet Patty Thomson, the lovely lady who was to become my wife. As fate would have it, she is a cousin of Joe Thomson who owns Winbak Farms. Joe invited us to visit Winbak. In the course of our visit, he offered me a job. I thanked him, but felt I wasn't quite ready for that adventure. A year later, I felt I was. I joined the team at Winbak."

I'll pick things up at that point. What can you tell us about your time at Winbak?

"I was there for five years, starting as the assistant farm manager and then becoming the farm manager. Knowing Joe Thomson and working for him was one of numerous exceptional breaks that have defined my years in the business. Although life was good under the Winbak umbrella, my wife was lonely and wanted to get closer to her family in Kentucky and mine in Ohio and we both missed living there. They say once a Buckeye, always a Buckeye. There's some truth to that. I received a good offer to go to work for a major pharmaceutical company I and took it."

How long did you do that?

"I was with that company for five years. I was making a good living. But the work required me to be on the road a lot. My son was growing up. I didn't want to miss out on those most

important years of his life. At about the same time there were rumblings that Ohio would be getting slots at the racetracks and that a significant purse upgrade for both overnight racing and especially Ohio Sires Stakes racing might be coming.

"It looked to be a promising time for Ohio racing and breeding. My uncle Billy was slowing down a little and life at the racetrack became less attractive to him. I approached him about the two of us getting together and establishing Sugar Valley Farms as a commercial breeding farm standing stallions primarily for the burgeoning Ohio Sires Stakes."

What can you tell us about Sugar Valley Farms?

"We are comprised of 157 acres and are situated less than a five-minute drive from the Delaware County Fairgrounds, the home of the world famous Little Brown Jug. For all intents and purposes, I would describe us as being primarily a stallion station, although we have about 50 resident mares, some owned by the farms and some by select customers. When we broke camp in 2012, we stood four stallions Pilgrims Taj, Mr Wiggles, I'm Gorgeous and Woodstock. Today we are fortunate enough to be standing six including Ohio's and one of the world's best, Downbytheseaside.

Goshen, NY needs wider Ianes on Main Street

Goshen, NY, is a wonderful, beautiful, quaint town of less than 15,000 residents just about 60 miles north of Yonkers Raceway.

It is the cradle of harness racing and features our magnificent and prestigious Hall of Fame, located on Main Street.

The population of "residents" in the hallowed halls of the museum – both human and equine, past and present – number about 700 with another "Hall" dedicated to those that make our participants look as great as they are, the journalists / communicators.

Yes, the roads get mighty crowded during Hall of Fame weekend, and rightfully so as harness racing enthusiasts, literally, from around the world, converge at 240 Main Street to celebrate the illustrious sport of harness racing and the races that transpire at the iconic half-mile oval in their backyard, with its history dating back to 1838.

First, though, an analogy...

Way back when the automobile first came into vogue, they traveled on uncluttered roads with little in the way of congestion.

There were around 8,000 automobiles on those roads in 1900.

Today, there are almost 300,000,000 on our paved roads and highways, many of which become clogged to a crawl during rush hours, or anytime in New York, D.C. or on I-95.

So, what does that have to do with our sport?

There are clogged roads leading to 240 Main Street in Goshen, NY, just in a different perspective.

As our Hall of Fame began to recognize the accomplishments of our great folk on both sides of the "fence," it was evident and

easy to honor those deserving individuals for their contributions that make our sport the iconic one it is.

Naming just a couple – George Morton Levy and Steve Phillips come to mind – with both having played vital roles in the growth and popularity of our sport.

As time went by, our Hall of Fame enshrined the likes of Billy Haughton, Stanley Dancer, Frank Ervin, Delvin Miller and Thurman Wayne "Curly" Smart; all honored in the 1960's for their greatness next to the hub rails, as that magnificent structure in Goshen emerged from its infancy.

Just as the roads have become clogged with cars going, virtually, nowhere, harness racing has become clogged with stars and the backlog for entrance into our hallowed Halls of Fame is getting worse year-by-year.

Levi Harner, for example, a 1985 HOF inductee, won the dash winning crown one year with 105 wins!

No driver had won as many as 200 races in a season until Bob Farrington did it in 1961 with 201.

When my first writing appeared in the *Horseman and Fair World* in 1964, only one driver had over 2,000 wins and only 25 drivers had over 1,000 trips to the winner's circle.

Of those 25, 18 of them are in the Hall of Fame with Hugh Bell, Tom Winn, Jimmy Jordan, Eddie Cobb, Lou Rapone, Edgar Leonard and Harry Burright – all grand pioneers in our sport – on the outside and looking in forever.

Today, we have 23 drivers with over 10,000 wins; less than half are in the HOF.

Of course, character and history play a big role when the selection committee meets.

That is very understandable and absolutely needed in the screening process but, as time goes by and puts more distance when it comes to memory with others achieving future stardom, many deserving individuals (and horses) will be left at the post!

Yes, the traffic jam to get in our Hall of Fames – for humans, equines and communicators – can't get much better unless the roads are widened a bit to get in, I.e., not limited in number every year.

I have one that belongs in the immortals category.

Remember Bill Wick?

Of course, you DON'T!

During his 19 years on the Grand Circuit, [Bill Wick] shod 19 Hambletonian winners in DuQuoin and 18 Little Brown Jug winners at Delaware, OH.

The click of a camera is silent, but his work speaks loudly in volumes, many of them!

There are so many stuck in traffic, Zeke Parker and Vicky Howard, just a couple of them.

After dropping Moczulski off for her first riding lesson, her mom knew she was hooked.

"I dropped her off at the barn and she never left," Moczulski's mom said with a laugh.

Since that day, Moczulski's entire life has been centered around horses in one way or another.

After relocating to Delaware from her hometown of Toms River, NJ, Moczulski began taking riding lessons and showing horses. From there her love for the magnificent equine grew in leaps and bounds. Her riding instructor, Michelle King, was the person who introduced Moczulski to Standardbreds when she was in her teens.

"I got involved in RUS [Riding Under Saddle], then obtained my trainers license," Moczulski said. "I started jogging and training which carried over to a full-time career racing horses, but was captivated when I learned what monte/RUS is. "My fiancé, Josh Green and I together operated a stable at Dovington in Delaware where we had many good years. We cross-trained a lot of horses so some didn't get hooked to the bike until race day. Getting their miles under saddle on the track is massively beneficial for working the different muscles of the horse and seemed to make them happier. Taking a horse that's 'sour' and starting to ride them changes everything. They love it!"

A couple of years ago, one of Moczulski and Green's owners, Eric Good, asked if the pair would consider changing course by hanging up their training colors to move south to Kentucky to fully submerge themselves in the breeding world.

"Eric is a great guy who enjoys the business and is now the owner of Spring Station Bloodstock," Moczulski said. "Presently, Josh and I co-own broodmares and multiple racehorses. Two of our standardbreds are retired and live on the farm. My 'do it all' gentleman is a horse named Hyway Marcus who is my partner in crime in foxhunting and we've done a multitude of shows. I really enjoy having an entire area to flat and jump right next to our house. Sometimes I have to pinch myself to make sure this is not a dream, but a reality."

Moczulski's favorite horse is Majority Rules, aka Pony, and her fastest is one that many horsemen have heard of, a filly named Its A Love Thing, which is also the horse that brought Moczulski her most exciting times in the sport.

On Sept. 23, 2023, Its A Love Thing was in the prestigious race She's A Great Lady held at Woodbine Mohawk Park. Starting from post 5, driver James MacDonald floated forward and got his filly in the fourth position after a brisk :26.4 first quarter. After the favorite, Caviart Belle, got to the top she remained there through most of the stretch before Its A Love Thing surged up putting pressure on the favorite and took command in the final eighth to win.

Horsemen dream about one day having a horse race in the She's A Great Lady, and Its A Love Thing did not disappoint. But she wasn't done making her team proud for the next year in 2024, 3-year-old Its A Love Thing continued where she left off. The daughter of Betters Delight—Love For Sail, won the Jerry Silverman Memorial, and the Fan Hanover Stakes taking her lifetime mark of 1:48.2, ending the 2024 season with \$843,884.

So, it was no surprise to trainer Dave Menary and owners Eric Good, Thomas Biederman and Green when on Feb. 8, 2025, Its A Love Thing took home the O'Brien Award in the Three-Year-Old Filly Pacer category.

"What a memorable night that was," Moczulski said. "Josh and I were there to support both Legendary Hanover [co-owned by Good] and Its A Love Thing. That night is going to be a hard act to follow but anything's possible."

When asked if there were any females in particular that she looked up to, Moczulski said, "Wow, we have some of the strongest and most intelligent ladies in the business; it would be hard for me to pick just one. From drivers Lauren Tritton to dominating trainers such as Nancy Takter and Linda Toscano, to the neverending caretakers Natasha Steacy, Heather Reese-Marshall, Elizabeth Yontz, Elizabeth Lewis-House and Caroline Vasquez, who are the backbone of the breeding world, to Judy Davis-Wilson who literally keeps all the wheels greased and rolling, I'm just trying to learn from the best as I go to be totally honest.

"I absolutely love to promote standardbreds and the sport and to show the world just how these athletes can do it all. I think that is pivotal for our industry as well."

Moczulski said her future goals and plans include helping to grow Spring Station Bloodstock and to make sure they reach peak performance on all fronts.

Ontario-sired horses claimed seven O'Brien Awards, Part 3

Ontario-sired horses had their hoofprints all over the 2024 O'Brien Awards, claiming seven of the 13 award categories, including the Somebeachsomewhere Horse of the Year (Chantilly).

Making up the Ontario-sired septet are the aforementioned Chantilly (2-Year-Old Filly Pacer, Somebeachsomewhere Horse of the Year), Monalishi (2-Year-Old Filly Trotter), Stonebridge Wizard (2-Year-Old Colt Pacer), Willys Home Run (3-Year-Old Filly Trotter), Logan Park (Older Horse Trotter), Nijinsky (3-Year-Old Colt Pacer), and Its A Love Thing (3-Year-Old Filly Pacer).

All Over Ontario highlighted Monalishi and Stonebridge Wizard in the inaugural edition of this three-part series before featuring the full-sibling duo of Willys Home Run and Logan Park last week in Part 2.

Our commemoration of the finest Ontario-sired stars to grace the racetrack in 2024 makes its final stop this week with the thriving 3-year-old tandem of Nijinsky and Its A Love Thing. Under the tutelage of top trainer Anthony Beaton, Nijinsky made tremendous strides in his sophomore season, finding the winner's circle in 11 of 17 starts (11-4-0; \$1,665,887 banked) en route to the title of 3-Year-Old Pacing Colt of the Year.

It was an impressive uptick in performance for the son of Bettors Delight—Pirouette Hanover, who managed one win across 10 starts as a freshman.

The talent, and speed, specifically, was "always there" according to Beaton. Translating it onto the racetrack, however, needed time.

"He'd make mistakes leaving the gate, but he just wanted to go too fast," said Beaton, reflecting on Nijinsky's rambunctious 2-year-old traits.

"We had to baby him, but as the year went on, he matured some and you could utilize a little bit of speed off the gate. We chose to teach him how to race more than anything."

Despite the learning curve, Nijinsky still showed flashes of his immense potential during his adventurous maiden campaign.

"He showed huge last quarters, but he'd be so far back out of the race that he was a prisoner of the pace," said Beaton. "He always had to make up so much ground down the lane."

Even while playing catch up, Nijinsky netted six top three finishes as a rookie, including a pair of seconds in Ontario Sires Stakes Gold contests.

Primed for a breakout showing, the enigmatic bay pacer returned for his 3-year-old year a new man.

[Nijinsky's] a fun horse to be around and a special horse to have at the barn. I'm very fortunate that we got him back this year.

"He was like a different horse," said Beaton. "He was so mature and grown up compared to where he was as a 2-year-old, and it showed.

"Leaving the gate, you could push forward with him rather than get away at the back. He showed a huge turn of foot where if he could mature and get away up near the front, he could possibly be a much more valuable horse. He proved that in spades last year."

Nijinsky delivered his foremost of several first-class efforts in the 41st edition of the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup on June 15 at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Competing alongside stablemate, and fellow finalist in the 3-Year-Old Colt Pacer category Legendary Hanover, Nijinsky and driver Louis-Philippe Roy followed their teammate in tow while Beaton, who juggled focus between his two trainees, watched intently from the sidelines.

"I knew Legendary would get us as far as we had to go," said Beaton. "If he couldn't get there himself, he was going to tow Nijinsky right up into it and give us an honest shot.

"We just hoped Louis [Philippe Roy] didn't fall off when he hit three wide, and the rest was history. He paced straight through the wire and won relatively comfortably that night."

A noble fourth from Legendary Hanover paved the way for his old pal Nijinsky to cross the finish line 1½ lengths ahead of 5-2 choice Captains Quarters for the ultimate score.

While the sweat wasn't nearly as intense for Beaton on O'Brien Awards night, the honor was equally as gratifying.

"There's a lot of the behind the scenes work that goes into one of these horses," he said. "We're very fortunate that we have one as talented to be up for a year-end award. The fact we had two was quite a feat to remember."

Looking ahead, Nijinsky — who recently started ramping up and is in great shape mentally and physically, Beaton said — will be tasked with continuing the standard of excellence set by not one but two of his veteran stablemates in Legendary Hanover and Linedrive Hanover. The former, and 2024 Meadowlands Pace champion, went to stud after collecting 12 wins and nearly \$1.5 million in prize money, while the latter retired after 44 starts, 18 wins, and \$806,000-plus in earnings.

A repeat of last year would certainly go a long way in helping that cause, but simply having another year of Nijinsky is a win in itself.

"He's a fun horse to be around and a special horse to have at the barn," said Beaton. "I'm very fortunate that we got him back this year."

Its A Love Thing's path to O'Brien glory also started out slightly bumpy vis-à-vis learning the mechanics of racing.

"She was a little bit hard to get gaited early on," said trainer Dave Menary. "Pacing-wise, she struggled into the middle of November."

But, as Menary continued, "Once she got it, she just really got it. Training down, I thought this is maybe one of the best mares I've ever had."

The veteran conditioner's intuition was on point, as the daughter of Bettors Delight—Love For Sail excelled as a rookie (six wins, including the Shes A Great Lady, from 12 starts) before reaching the top of her class as a sophomore.

Its A Love Thing took home the hardware in the 3-Year-Old Filly Pacer category after finishing as runner-up to her stablemate Pass Line for the same 2-year-old award in 2023.

The bay collected seven wins from 14 starts, landing in the money each time, for a collective earnings figure of \$843,884.

"To have an Ontario-sired filly win the biggest grand circuit race at 2 and 3 [Fan Hanover] is a pretty special honor," said Menary. "She's just been a highlight reel all the way along. She's a once in a lifetime horse and a real franchise player."

The Fan Hanover effort on June 15 was particularly memorable for Menary's star pupil, who demonstrated incredible versatility while recording a lifetime best of 1:48.2, equaling the Canadian division record.

"She did it the hard way," said Menary. "For a big horse like her, the rail wasn't an ideal spot. She made [driver] James [MacDonald] and I look pretty good.

"She came first up and the other top fillies in the race all had good trips; she really earned it. She was on her game that day."

The race, which sparked a subsequent stretch of four straight trips to the winner's circle, also provided a crucial moment of validation for Menary.

"At 3, you always worry if they're going to come back as good," said Menary. "All winter long, I was focused on keeping her healthy and quiet. I didn't train her down as hard as I usually would a top 3-year-old."

Its A Love Thing's determined showing punctuated the rare spirit her conditioner saw in her first start of the season.

"The first time I took her into Mohawk [in 2024], James moved her over and she exploded," said Menary. "I teared up. We waited all winter for that. Adding a touch of inspiration to Its A Love Thing's already splendid story is that she accomplished all this while only having one eye.

Despite what might turn some prospective investors away, Menary was all in on the powerful pacer at the 2022 Lexington Sale.

"I had seen her at Kentuckiana Farms about a week before," said Menary. "The day before she was going to sell, Josh Green [co-owner] phoned me up and said, 'What would you think about a filly with one eye?' I said, 'Are you talking about the Bettors Delight filly from Kentuckiana?' He said, 'Yeah,' and I said, 'I love that filly."

Menary and Its A Love Thing have since made the perfect pair.

Heading into 2025 – their third season together – Menary has high hopes for his hand-picked racehorse, who has answered the bell every step of the way.

"She's going to have to up her game to deal with a horse like Twin B Joe Fresh," he said. "Hopefully, we've come back even bigger and stronger and dance in the big dances and be right on the big days.

Al harness racing experiment proves 'astonishing and terrifying'

Fifteen years ago, I found myself in South Carolina researching a story about a champion golfer who played from 1910 to 1940, a time that paralleled the growth of Myrtle Beach. While leafing through a dusty local library book, I was astounded to learn that in the 1930s, there was a harness racetrack named Washington Park in downtown Myrtle Beach. The racetrack had a nice, albeit short, run until the South Carolina Supreme Court slammed the wagering door.

I knew that anti-gambling sentiments did, and still do, exist in South Carolina. For some reason, the inability of our sport to establish a beachhead in the Palmetto State, or almost every other warm-weather state, annoys me. Addressing this void of southern horse racing became a bit of a preoccupation. This irritation led to an annual plea for our sport's public or private powers to remedy our lack of a southern hoofprint.

I base part of my pleas on the theory that our old model for harness horse racing is flawed and fading. Restarting our sport in virgin territory will be simpler than fixing the old house of cards. If the northern state subsidies for harness horse racing diminish, the twisted, fragile threads of state funding unravel, and the casinos break free, the south could offer new, improved landing areas.

This year, I tried a new tactic in my quest for southern harness racing outreach by outsourcing questions and possible solutions to artificial intelligence. The subsequent experiment was astonishing and terrifying, and I only scratched the surface.

I began innocently by entering a benign task for a basic artificial intelligence program – Write a short essay about the positive aspects of harness racetracks and harness racing programs in South Carolina.

The AI response was instantaneous and generic. I'll post it, but I suggest that you skip it.

HARNESS HORSE RACING: A BENEFICIAL OPPORTUNITY FOR SOUTH CAROLINA

Harness horse racing, a time-honored sport involving standardbred horses trotting or pacing while pulling a twowheeled cart known as a sulky, offers numerous benefits to states that embrace it. Establishing a harness racing program for South Carolina could be a lucrative and culturally enriching initiative. This essay explores the economic, social, and community advantages that such a program could bring to the state.

First and foremost, harness horse racing can stimulate significant economic growth. The sport's accessibility and emphasis on horsemanship and teamwork also foster an appreciation for animals and rural traditions, resonating with South Carolina's agricultural heritage.

A harness racing program could also provide a new revenue stream for the state government. South Carolina could generate funds to support education, healthcare, and infrastructure projects by regulating and taxing race betting. Several states have successfully allocated proceeds from racing-related activities to public programs, enhancing their appeal to policymakers and constituents alike.

Furthermore, harness horse racing aligns with South Carolina's existing tourism strategy. The state attracts millions of visitors

annually because of its natural beauty and historic charm. Adding harness racing to its roster of attractions could diversify South Carolina's offerings, drawing equine enthusiasts and spectators from around the country. With the proper marketing and investment, racetracks could become iconic landmarks, adding to the state's reputation as a premier destination.

In conclusion, a harness horse racing program holds immense potential for South Carolina. It promises economic growth, bolsters the agricultural and equine industries, strengthens community ties, and generates public revenue. By embracing this initiative, South Carolina could harness the power of tradition and innovation, ensuring benefits for residents and visitors alike.

AI REPLY IS UNSATISFYING

Again, this reply felt boilerplate. It was an unsatisfying word salad without answers. However, the follow-up conversations became fascinating. I continued asking for specific revisions of the original submission. I peppered the program with what I felt were complex tasks and instigated new threads.

- Can state passage of anti-gambling legislation in SC be avoided? How?
- Create a viable harness racing Sires Stakes program in South Carolina.
- Create a seasonal racing schedule, avoiding conflicting competition.
- Create programs with monetary projections from a business POV.
- Explain the SC harness racing economics from a participant's POV.
- List promising geographical and real estate locations for a race program in South Carolina.


Let's use this last question as an example of the power of this technology. In the first response for this thread (approximately three seconds), the program offered three locations with existing infrastructure (Springdale Racecourse in Camden boasts 450 acres of picturesque landscapes for thoroughbred training, two dirt tracks, and miles of turf gallops. McGhees' Mile in Aiken is a family-owned track with three racetracks (a one-mile red clay track, a half-mile red clay track, and a seven-eighths-mile sand track), along with over 250 stalls and ample barn space. Piedmont Interstate Fairgrounds in Spartanburg hasn't held regular races for many years. It still has a visible racing surface and a history of hosting horse trotting and racing events. Followed by a list of new potential locations and reasons harness racing may play (Charleston, Columbia, and Myrtle Beach).

On and on. The device never got tired. AI always listened to my suggestions and, unlike humans, never laughed at my foolishness. Eventually, AI began to show insights that surprised me. As the questions in my experiment continued, the more insightful the

machine became, the more I forgot I was communicating with algorithms. And remember, this was a basic free public AI app from a year ago. New, updated versions of machine learning are popping up like flies on manure.

I saved dozens of pages from my South Carolina harness racing experiment. I will read them carefully, let them marinate, and share a few surprising, provocative ideas about new frontiers for our sport that arrived from this unhuman entity.

Yikes.

Second session of the USTA Board of Directors annual meeting held Saturday

Saturday's (March 8) second day of the U.S. Trotting Association's Board of Directors annual meeting held at the Hilton Columbus at Easton in Columbus, OH got off to an early start at 8 a.m. with the Marketing/ Communications Committee meeting.

USTA executive vice president and CEO Mike Tanner led discussions about USTA website protocols and policies as well as *Hoof Beats* magazine. He also provided the committee with social media analytics for 2024.

Tanner presented the committee with more than a dozen scenarios of stories submitted for posting on the ustrotting.com newsroom and asked for input on whether the committee would have accepted or rejected the stories. He also explained that current *Hoof Beats* monthly issues have fewer pages than past editions largely due to the contraction of print media in general and the decrease in quality writers to contribute to the magazine. In general, the committee expressed support for *Hoof Beats* and the monthly schedule.

Tanner concluded by sharing information and analytics on the USTA's seven social media platforms that include Facebook, X, and Instagram on both USTrotting and HarnessRacing.com as well as USTrotting TikTok. Highlights included more than 31 million Impressions and 7.2 million video views.

The Board of Directors opening session followed at 10 a.m. Two new directors were welcomed to the Board. Marilyn Breuer-Bertera introduced senior vice president of racing for Caesars Entertainment Joe Morris (District 2). Stacy Chiodo (District 12), a New Jersey horsewoman who races primarily at The Meadowlands and was the first female driver to break the 1:50 barrier, was presented by Jeff Gregory.

Next on the agenda was a presentation by USTA president Russell Williams who discussed some of the major challenges to the harness racing industry, how the USTA has addressed those and the best ways "to advance and promote the industry."

Williams identified animal rights organizations and



activists, state racing commissions, medications and prohibited drugs, and decoupling as some of the major challenges currently facing harness racing.

"Think about the great horses," said Williams in encouraging the directors to take action. "They find a way to win the races. That's what this board has to do."

He explained how the USTA has successfully addressed other issues in the past few years. The organization created Support Our Standardbreds, a program that provides financial assistance for horses that have been abandoned or subject to removal by legal intervention, and was instrumental in the creation and funding of the Standardbred Transition Alliance (STA).

The USTA has opposed and lobbied against the federal Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act, which currently regulates most of thoroughbred racing and has proposed the alternative Racehorse Health and Safety Act. The Harness Racing Medication Collaborative (HRMC) that includes esteemed veterinarians has done extensive research and provided scientific based, peer reviewed recommendation for therapeutic medication thresholds specific to Standardbreds and harness racing.

Williams also noted the formation of the Standardbred Racing Investigative Fund with their investigations and coordination with law enforcement as well as track and safety committees, originally formed by John Campbell, that will present recommended model rules to the USTA Board at its 2026 meeting.

Tanner gave his annual report, then financial officer Dennis Fisher, who with his pending retirement in January 2026, made his final financial report to the Board.

Tanner cited the threat of a recent *New York Times* story that encouraged national decoupling and part of his anti-HISA efforts in a presentation at the RTIP in Arizona. He encouraged horsemen's associations to have better relationships with their state and local political representatives and stated that it was important for the Board to come out of the meetings with initiatives on integrity, budget, philosophy, and member relations.

Industry updates were given by chairperson Joe Faraldo on the HRMC and by Don Marean on the STA.

Faraldo cited the impressive group of veterinarians on the HRMC and their work on recommendations for thresholds for a number of therapeutic medications that differ from the thoroughbred levels.

He was encouraged by new testing equipment that could identify "performance enhancing drugs that we don't have tests for," and also referenced The *New York Times* story as a "hit piece," and wake-up call expressing concern that "we're not getting our message to the public, who are not getting the message to legislators."

Finally, Faraldo announced that the SOA of NY has struck a deal with the New York Racing Association to provide revenues with the implementation of fixed odds wagering in the state.

STA president Marean emphasized that everyone in the room had one thing in common, the horse, and that the industry has an obligation to care for them.

"We recognize the need to provide funding for our horses that fell between the cracks," said Marean.

He stated that in its six-year history, the STA has accredited six aftercare organizations with 13 facilities nationwide and has donated \$725,000 in support to those organizations.

At the annual recognition luncheon, Williams presented Presidents Awards to USTA vice chairman and Hanover Shoe Farms VP Mark Loewe and USTA director of information technology Sherry Antion-Mohr and a 20-Year Service Award to Driver-Trainer Committee chairperson Jeff Gregory.

The Racing Committee was the only one to meet Saturday afternoon.

In the Regulatory Committee update, Faraldo gave a report on the USTA Sulky Standards Committee, which acted and revoked approval of a race bike that failed after initial approval meeting testing standards. USTA COO TC Lane informed the Board that a full 60-hour accreditation course for racing officials will be held June 23-30 at Eldorado Scioto Downs in conjunction with the ROAP.

In the Fairs Committee update, USTA membership enrichment & outreach coordinator Jessica Schroeder reported that the USTA Matching Funds Program has assisted over 150 fairs and county horsemen's associations since 2006.

In the Pari-Mutuel Committee update, Loewe discussed the implementation of Graded Stakes, which is now available in USTA pedigrees for races in the U.S. and Canada.

In the Driver-Trainer Committee update, Mike and Gail McNeely of VanGundy Insurance Agency gave an in-depth overview of the disability income program with accidental death and dismemberment as well as equine liability and mortality written by VanGundy, underwritten by Chubb Insurance and noted that there are no rate changes for 2025.

For the first time at a Board meeting, the USTA communications staff produced a live broadcast of the HarnessRacing.com Preview Show hosted by Wendy Ross, the USTA's social media content manager and on-air talent. The first show aired Friday (March 7).

The second show was broadcast on Saturday at 3 p.m. (and is **available on-demand here**). Saturday's show featured live interviews with STA Administrator Jennifer Daniels and USTA Assistant Registrar Aimee Hock and interviews recorded Friday with Standardbred Racing Investigative Fund counsel Carson Morris and USTA President Williams.

The Saturday agenda concluded with a full board, closed session of the USTA Investigative Subcommittee.

On Friday (March 7), in the Registration Committee meeting, three rule change proposals were discussed.

Rule change proposal #1 to amend existing Rules 4.34 Corresponding Officer and 8.07 Designation of Corresponding Officer and add new Rule 26.33 Ownership Percentages was rejected.

After much discussion on both rule change proposal #18 regarding increasing the cap on the number of total mares bred to a stallion standing in the U.S. from 140 to 160 and rule change proposal #19 regarding the Prohibition of Ovum Pick Up/Intra-cytoplasmic Sperm Injection Procedures were both tabled.

During Friday's HarnessRacing.com Preview Show (available to **watch on demand here**) Ross conducted interviews with key people in the harness racing industry that was livestreamed on USTrotting Facebook, X and YouTube platforms.

Lane discussed the history of the annual meeting and the logistics and coordination required to hold them, along with his many responsibilities at the USTA.

Loewe talked about the work of the **Graded Stakes Committee** that he chaired in creating harness racing's firstever Graded Stakes program that debuts this year.

Tanner talked about the USTA's lobbying efforts in Washington, DC and explained the organization's structure of directors and district meetings.

The show concluded with USTA director and Eldorado Scioto Downs director of racing Jason Roth, who talked about the rebuilding of the track's grandstand and paddock as well as the recent news that the 2026 Breeders Crown is coming to Eldorado Scioto Downs.

The meetings will conclude today (March 9) with Finance and Rules Committees followed by the Board of Directors Closing Session when the dates and location of the 2026 Annual Board of Directors meeting will be announced.



Paulick Report provides update on those convicted in the federal horse doping case

Today (March 9) marks exactly five years since the first indictments in the federal doping case that led to prison sentences for some in the standardbred and thoroughbred industries. The *Paulick Report's* Natalie Voss has written a detailed article updating what has happened to many of those convicted.

Voss wrote: "Of the defendants who were sentenced to federal prison terms, many have completed their sentences and are now out of prison. Those who were sentenced later or who got longer terms are still behind bars."

Standardbred trainer **Nick Surick** was sentenced to five years and two months in jail. He is currently serving his sentence at Federal Correctional Institution (FCI) Lewisburg (PA). His release is scheduled for September, 2026.

Voss did not provide an update on standardbred trainers **Richard Banca** (30-month sentence) or **Rene Allard** (27-month sentence), but a search of federal records found that both Allard and Banca have served their sentences and were both released in the summer of 2024.

Dr. Seth Fishman was sentenced to 11 years in prison, where he is today. He is currently appealing both his conviction and prison sentence. His release date is currently set for 2030.

Fishman's assistant, **Lisa Giannelli**, was sentenced to three-anda-half years in prison, plus two years of supervised release. She has completed her prison sentence.

Thoroughbred trainer **Jorge Navarro** pleaded guilty and was sentenced to five years in prison. He is still in custody at the lowsecurity FCI Miami. He is due to be released in June of this year.

Thoroughbred trainer **Jason Servis** received a four-year sentence and is still incarcerated at the minimum-security Federal Prison Camp (FPC) in Pensacola, FL. He is scheduled for release in the summer of 2026.

Servis' vet **Dr. Kristian Rhein** pleaded guilty and has already completed his prison sentence. He was released to home confinement in May 2023. His probation was completed in December 2024.

Dr. Alexander Chan pleaded guilty and received a 30-month prison sentence. He is expected to be released sometime this month.

Dr. Louis Grasso is currently in prison after being handed a sentence of a little over four years.

Former Servis assistant **Henry Argueta** pleaded guilty to three of the four charges against him, while one count was dropped. He was sentenced to time served and two years' worth of supervised release in December 2023.

Scott Mangini and **Scott Robinson** have both completed their prison sentences, but have both had further run-ins with the law (see Voss' story for details).

Luke's Bar takes Big M feature

Luke's Bar is a lightly raced 5-year-old who is starting to put it all together. The gelded son of Bar Hopping—Lukes Sophie won for the second time in his last three starts Friday night (March 7) at The Meadowlands, taking the \$17,500 featured high-end conditioned trot in 1:55.2, equaling the lifetime best he established two starts ago.

"Off a helmet or on a helmet, he gives you a good effort," said winning driver Patrick Ryder. "He gave me a good run in the stretch."

Unhurried at the start, Luke's Bar sat fifth to the half after 4-1 third choice Pisces Rising hit the quarter in :28.4 and half in :58.1. Over a track playing to closers, Ryder activated Luke's Bar with a half-mile to go and steadily made his way toward the leader racing uncovered on the rim.

The eventual winner was up to Pisces Rising's wheel at threequarters, which was timed in 1:26.4, and with the entirety of the stretch still to come, Luke's Bar had no trouble wearing down Pisces Rising to win by 1¼ lengths. The pocket-sitting 5-2 second choice Rocket Man Hill outkicked Pisces Rising in the race for place.

"I knew I didn't want to be on the front," said Ryder. "My options were mid-pack or move to the front. I was at the mercy of the pace they were going. I pulled him at the half because I was afraid they were going a little slow. I wanted to keep David [Miller, driving Rocket Man Hill] in the 2-hole."

Luke's Bar, who is trained by Patrick's dad, Chris, returned \$3.60 to win as the 4-5 public choice. He now has four wins from 13 career starts, good for earnings of \$105,523 for owner Anthony Timmins.

A LITTLE MORE: Brett Beckwith tied atop the driver colony with three winners on the program, giving the 22-year-old 2024 Dan

Patch Rising Star Award winner 15 over the last five cards. His 32 victories have him tied atop The Big M standings with Jason Bartlett... In addition to guiding the winner of the feature, Patrick Ryder also made three winner's circle visits, which included 40-1 shot Make It Big in the 14th race... Winning players in the 20-cent Survivor Pick-7 had big smiles on their faces after exchanging their tickets — with six winning selections — for \$5,288.82 after a sequence that saw winner's odds of 11-1, 3-1, 7-2, 9-2, 5-1, 4-5 and 3-1... All-source handle totaled \$2,753,001 on the 14-dash card.

Racing needs a betting lotto

I have commented on this before, but **Bob Duff's article**, maybe there should be a change in betting, I think deserves further discussion. Making bets on things like leader at the quarter pole, I don't think the increase of betting would make much difference besides the adds would be small.

People bet on the lotto for a big payoff. Create a big payoffs type bet. It's done in hockey and football and lottos so it may be worth a shot.

This is just an example. Obviously, anything can be made up.

Create a six-number parlay (six or more is okay). the horse that finishes seventh in race 1, the horse that finishes ninth in race 2. The horse that finishes fourth in race 3, etc. with the last race you must pick the trifecta. Create an odds for this bet (ex. 10,000-1). You can do a carry forward with increasing odds.

This is, obviously, not a bet of talent which is similar to a lotto.

The higher the odds the more betting occurs and from people who don't follow racing. Advertise a betting lotto.
